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# Garden Party Chapeau

## SKILL LEVEL



## FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit 20–21-inch circumference head (*adult size small/medium*); changes for 18–19-inch circumference head (*child's size*) and 22–23-inch circumference head (*adult size medium/large*) are in [ ].

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Fashion Crochet size 3 crochet cotton (150 yds per ball):
  - 2 balls #201 white (MC)
  - 1 ball each #175 warm blue (A), #310 copper mist (B), #423 maize (C), #6 scarlet (D), #775 warm rose (E) and #264 lime (F)
- Sizes 1/2.25mm and 0/2.50mm steel crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- 45-inch length (or amount needed based on circumference) semi-stiff nylon line
- Coordinating sewing thread
- Blocking board
- Rustproof pins

## GAUGE

**Size 1 steel crochet hook:**

2 tr rnds = ¾ inch

**Size 0 steel crochet hook:**

Rnds 1–4 = 2 inches in diameter

## PATTERN NOTES

Hat is worked in rounds from the top down in one piece, do not join or turn unless otherwise stated. Change colors in the following sequence: A, B, C, D, E, F.

The edge of the brim is reinforced with nylon line.

The nylon line should lie flat with a circumference of approximately 43–44 inches. If there is a wavy property to the cord lying on a flat surface, heat some water to near boiling in a large pan and soak the line until waviness is gone. Cool the nylon line by placing it in cool water.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

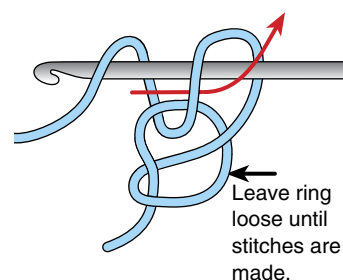
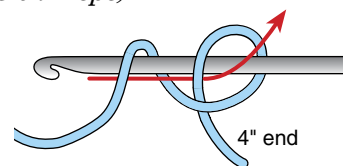
**Treble crochet shell (tr shell):** 7 tr in indicated st or sp.

**Half-double crochet with front post increase:** Yo, insert hook in lps of stitch, yo and pull

through all lps on hook, yo and insert hook around post of same stitch, yo and pull through all lps on hook.

## HAT

**Rnd 1:** Beg at top of crown, with size 0 hook and MC, make **slip ring** (see illustration), ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), (dc, ch 1) 7 times in ring, pull end to close ring, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (8 ch-1 sps)



**Slip Ring**



**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in same sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*hdc in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec just made, ch 1\*\*, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as hdc just made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around to last ch-1 sp, ending last rep at \*\*, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as hdc just made and in same sp as beg ch-3, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (16 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1\*\*, hdc in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec just made, ch 1, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as hdc just made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (24 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*[hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (24 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*[hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice\*\*, hdc in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec just made, ch 1, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as hdc just made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (32 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*[hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times\*\*, hdc in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec just made, ch 1, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as hdc just made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (40 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3 and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, \*[hdc dec in same ch-1 sp as last hdc of hdc dec made and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 4 times\*\*, hdc

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# Rose Lattice Belt

## SKILL LEVEL

BEGINNER

## FINISHED SIZE

1¾ x 32 inches buttoned  
(40 inches unbuttoned)

## MATERIALS

- Pisgah Yarn & Dyeing Co. Peaches & Crème medium (worsted) weight yarn (2 oz/98 yds per ball):  
1 ball #144 strawberry
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread
- ½-inch shank buttons: 2



## GAUGE

4 dc = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet

and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Front post slip stitch (fp sl st):** Working from right to left, insert hook from front to back to front around post of indicated st, yo, draw through lp on hook.

## BELT

**Row 1:** Ch 158, dc in 8th ch from hook (*first 7 chs count as 1 dc, ch 2 and sk 2 chs*), [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch] 50 times, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] 50 times, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in 5th ch of beg ch-7, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 5 (*see Pattern Notes*), sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc] 50 times. Fasten off.

## BAND

**Rnd 1:** Ch 15, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 3, dc in each ch around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (15 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in each dc around. Fasten off.

## ROSE

**Rnd 1:** Leaving a 10-inch length at beg, ch 8, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 3, 3 dc in ring, (ch 1, 4 dc in ring) 4 times, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (5 petals)

**Rnd 2:** Working in front of petals, **fp sl st** (*see Special Stitch*) around next dc, ch 6, [sk next 3 dc, fp sl st around next dc, ch 6] around, join in first ch. (5 ch-6 lps)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in next ch-6 lp, ch 1, (sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc) in each ch-6 sp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Thread rem beg length of Rose on yarn needle, sew Rose to Band opposite from Band joining with care to sew in **back lps** (*see Stitch Guide*) or where color matches. With sewing needle and thread, sew first button to row 2 of Belt 1½ inches from end and 2nd button 6½ inches from same end of Belt (5-inch sp between buttons). Insert each end of Belt through Band overlapping ends 8 inches. Use natural sps between dc of row 2 as buttonholes. Natural buttonholes are adjustable depending on waistline. **CW**



Basic stitches and cotton yarn make this cute belt simple to make and comfortable to wear.

## FINISHED SIZE

Instructions given fit 32–34-inch bust (*small*); changes for 36–38-inch bust (*medium*), 40–42-inch bust (*large*), 44–46-inch bust (*XX-large*), 48–50-inch bust (*2X-large*), 52–54-inch bust (*3X-large*), 56–58-inch bust (*4X-large*), 60–62-inch bust (*5X-large*) and 62–64-inch bust (*6X-large*) are in [ ].

## FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

**Bust (buttoned):** 36 [40, 44, 48, 52, 56, 60, 64, 68] inches

**Length:** 22 [23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30] inches

## MATERIALS

- Omega Yarns size 5 crochet cotton (165 yds per ball):  
6 [8, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, 15, 17] balls #55 pistachio
- Sizes E/4/3.5mm and F/5/3.75mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch markers
- ¾-inch round buttons: 6 [6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7, 7]

## GAUGE

**Size F hook:** 19 sts = 4 inches after blocking; 9 rows = 4 inches after blocking

## PATTERN NOTES

Use size F hook throughout unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of rows or rounds counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

The back will be slightly shorter than the fronts as the full shoulder is shaped on the fronts only.

## CARDIGAN

### BODY

**Row 1:** With size F hook, ch 171 [187, 203, 219, 235, 267, 283, 299, 315], sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 3, sc in next ch, \*sk next 2 chs, 3 dc in next ch, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (22 [24, 26, 28, 30, 34, 36, 38, 40] ch-3 sps)

**Row 2:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (21 [23, 25, 27, 29, 33, 35, 37, 39] ch-3 sps)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (22 [24, 26, 28, 30, 34, 36, 38, 40] ch-3 sps)

**Rows 4–27 [4–29, 4–31, 4–33, 4–35, 4–35, 4–37, 4–39, 4–41]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 12 [13, 14, 15, 16, 16, 17, 18, 19] times.

**Row 28 [30, 32, 34, 36, 36, 38, 40, 42]:** Rep row 2.

## BUST SHAPING

**Row 1:** Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-3 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in last ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-1 sp, turn. (20 [22, 24, 26, 28, 32, 34, 36, 38] ch-3 sps)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (*counts as dc*), \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, dc in last sc, turn. (21 [23, 25, 27, 29, 33, 35, 37, 39] ch-3 sps)

**Row 3:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4 (*counts as tr*), \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp, tr in ch-3 sp, turn. (20 [22, 24, 26, 28, 32, 34, 36, 38] ch-3 sps)

**Note:** While working row 4, mark following ch-1 sps for armholes: 4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8] (for *First Front*), 6 [6, 7, 7, 8, 9, 9, 10, 10] and 13 [15, 16, 18, 19, 22, 24, 25, 27] (for *Back*) and 15 [17, 18, 20, 21, 24, 26, 27, 29] (for *2nd Front*).

**Row 4:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (19 [21, 23, 25, 27, 31, 33, 35, 37] ch-3 sps)



## FIRST FRONT

**Row 1:** Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* to last ch-3 sp before next stitch marker, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, sc in marked ch-1 sp, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 5, 6, 6, 7, 7] ch-3 sps)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (counts as dc), \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp, dc in last sc, turn. (4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8] ch-3 sps)

**Row 3:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4 (counts as tr), \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, tr in last ch-3 sp, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 5, 6, 6, 7, 7] ch-3 sps)

**Row 4:** Rep row 3. (2 [2, 3, 3, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6] ch-3 sps)

## Sizes Large & X-Large Only

**Row [5]:** Rep row 4. ([2, 2] ch-3 sps)

## Sizes 2X-Large–4X-Large Only

**Rows [5 & 6]:** Rep row 4 [2, 2] times. ([2, 3, 3] ch-3 sps)

## Sizes 5X-Large & 6X-Large Only

**Rows [5–7]:** Rep row 4 [3, 3] times. ([3, 3] ch-3 sps)

## SHOULDER

**Row 1:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (1 [1, 1, 1, 1, 2, 2, 2, 2] ch-3 sp(s))

**Row 2:** Ch 1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (2 [2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3, 3] ch-3 sps)

*This pretty spring green sweater has classic good looks and can be made in nine sizes.*





### Sizes Small & Medium Only

**Rows 3–11 [3–11]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 5 times, ending last rep with row 1. Fasten off at end of last row.

### Sizes Large & X-Large Only

**Rows [3–10, 3–10]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [4] times. Fasten off at end of last row.

### Size 2X-Large Only

**Rows [3–9]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [4] times, ending last rep with row 1. Fasten off at end of last row.

### Sizes 3X-Large & 4X-Large Only

**Rows [3–13, 3–13]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [6] times, ending last rep with row 1. Fasten off at end of last row.

### Sizes 5X-Large & 6X-Large Only

**Rows [3–12, 3–12]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [5] times. Fasten off at end of last row.

## BACK

### ARMHOLE SHAPING

#### All Sizes

**Row 1:** Join in first ch-1 sp marked for Back, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-1, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-3 sp before next stitch marker, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp marked for Back, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (6 [8, 8, 10, 10, 12, 14, 14, 16] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 2:** Ch 3, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, dc in last sc, turn. (7 [9, 9, 11, 11, 13, 15, 15, 17] *ch-3 sps*)

#### Sizes Medium–6X-Large Only

**Row [3]:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3

sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, tr in last ch-3 sp, turn. (8 [8, 10, 10, 12, 14, 14, 16] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row [4]:** Rep row 3. (7 [7, 9, 9, 11, 13, 13, 15] *ch-3 sps*)

#### Size 6X-Large Only

**Rows [5 & 6]:** Rep row [4] [2] times. ([13] *ch-3 sps*)

## UPPER BACK

#### All Sizes

**Row 1:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (6 [6, 6, 8, 8, 10, 12, 12, 14] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (7 [7, 7, 9, 9, 11, 13, 13, 15] *ch-3 sps*)

#### Sizes Small & 6X-Large Only

**Rows 3–12 [3–12]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 5 times. Fasten off at end of last row.

#### Sizes Medium, Large, X-Large & 2X-Large Only

**Rows [3–10, 3–10, 3–10, 3–10]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [4] times. Fasten off at end of last row.

#### Sizes 3X-Large, 4X-Large & 5X-Large Only

**Rows [3–14, 3–14, 3–14]:** [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] [6] times. Fasten off at end of last row.

## 2ND FRONT

**Row 1:** Join in ch-1 sp marked for 2nd Front, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-1, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from \*

across to last ch-3 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in last ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-1 sp, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 5, 6, 6, 7, 7] *ch-3 sps*)

**Rows 2–11 [2–11, 2–10, 2–10, 2–9, 2–13, 2–13, 2–12, 2–12]:**

[Rep rows 2–11 [2–11, 2–10, 2–10, 2–9, 2–13, 2–13, 2–12, 2–12] of First Front.

## SLEEVES

### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size F hook, ch 67 [67, 67, 67, 83, 83, 83, 83, 83], sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 3, sc in next ch, \*sk next 2 chs, 3 dc in next ch, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (9 [9, 9, 9, 11, 11, 11, 11, 11] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 2:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (8 [8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (9 [9, 9, 9, 11, 11, 11, 11, 11] *ch-3 sps*)

**Rows 4 & 5:** Rep rows 2 and 3.

**Row 6:** Rep row 2.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-3 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in last ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-1 sp, turn. (7 [7, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9, 9, 9] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 8:** Ch 3, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp, rep from \* to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, dc in last sc, turn. (8 [8, 8, 8, 10, 10, 10, 10, 10] *ch-3 sps*)

**Row 9:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp,



(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, tr in last ch-3 sp, turn. (7 [7, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9, 9, 9] ch-3 sps)

**Row 10:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, 3 dc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-3 sp, turn. (6 [6, 6, 6, 8, 8, 8, 8, 8] ch-3 sps)

**Row 11:** Ch 1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (7 [7, 7, 7, 9, 9, 9, 9, 9] ch-3 sps)

**Next rows:** [Rep rows 9–11 consecutively]  
4 [4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5] times. (4 [4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5, 5, 5] ch-3 sps)

**Next row:** Rep row 9. Fasten off. (3 [3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4] ch-3 sps)

### ASSEMBLY

Sew Shoulder seams. Set Sleeves in Armholes and sew. Sew Sleeve seams.

### CARDIGAN TRIM

**Rnd 1:** With size E hook, join in end of row 1 of Body, ch 1, sc evenly sp up Front, around neckline, down Front and around hem, join in first st.

**Note:** While working rnd 2, mark 6 [6, 6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7] sc evenly sp on right Front (buttonholes).

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, working with 2 sc in each corner sc, join in first st, **turn**.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, \*sc in each st across to marked st, ch 2, sk next 3 sc, rep from \* 5 [5, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 6] times, sc in each rem st around, join in first sc, **turn**.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, \*sc in each st across to next ch-2 sp, 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, rep from \* 5 [5, 5, 5, 6, 6, 6, 6] times, sc in each rem st around, join in first sc, **turn**.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### SLEEVE TRIM

**Rnd 1:** With size E hook, join in any st at bottom of Sleeve, ch 1, sc evenly sp around Sleeve, join in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st around join in first sc. Fasten off.

Rep Sleeve Trim on rem Sleeve. **CW**

- Size 1/0 snap fasteners: 2



## GAUGE

4 hdc = ⅞ inch; 4 rows = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of rows does not count as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## BELT

**Row 1:** Ch 14, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs do not count as first hdc), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (12 hdc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (12 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 4 sc, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*)

around each of next 4 sts 2 rows below, hdc in each of next 4 sc on working row, turn.

**Row 4:** Rep row 2.

**Row 5:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 3 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 sts 2 rows below, hdc in each of next 2 sts on working row, fpdc around each of next 2 sts 2 rows below, hdc in each of next 3 sts on working row, turn.

**Row 6:** Rep row 2.

**Row 7:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 2 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 sts 2 rows below, hdc in each of next 4 sts on working row, fpdc around each of next 2 sts 2 rows below, hdc in each of next 2 sts on working row, turn.

**Rows 8 & 9:** Rep rows 2 and 7.

**Rows 10 & 11:** Rep rows 2 and 5.

**Rows 12 & 13:** Rep rows 2 and 3.


**Rows 14–213:** [Rep rows 4–13 consecutively] 20 times.

**Row 214:** Rep row 4.

**Rows 215–219:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (7 sts at end of last row)

**Rows 220–222:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last rep, fasten off. (7 sts)

#### ASSEMBLY

Cut 6-inch length of yarn. Separate yarn into strands. Using 1 strand and sewing needle, sew one half of each snap to rows 220 and 221. Using 1 strand and sewing needle, position rem half of each snap over rows 215 and 216 opposite first half. Wrap end through buckle and snap in place.

  - 18 yds each #495 wood violet, #424 light peach and #428 mint
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

## GAUGE

Rnds 1 and 2 = 1¾ inches;  
Motif = 4 inches in diameter;  
Petal Edging = 1¾ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Basic Motif with white requires 17½ yards of crochet cotton. Basic Motif with pastel colors requires 4½ yards pastel color and 13 yards white.

If making all Basic Motifs with white, add 135 yards to total of white cotton.

Chain-3 counts as first treble crochet of beginning 4-treble crochet cluster unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-4 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-10 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain-6 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

### 4-treble crochet cluster

**(4-tr cl):** \*Yo twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* 3 times, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

**Beginning 4-treble crochet cluster (beg 4-tr cl):** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), \*yo twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* twice, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

### 3-treble crochet cluster

**(3-tr cl):** \*Yo twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* twice, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

## FIRST MOTIF

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 4, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, ch 1, (sc, ch 3) 9 times in ring, join in first sc. (9 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, **beg 4-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-3 sp, ch 5, [4-tr cl (see *Special Stitches*) in next

ch-3 sp, ch 5] 8 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 petals, 9 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in 3rd ch of next ch-5, (**ch 6**—see *Pattern Notes*, dc, ch 3, dc) in same ch-5 sp as first sl st, \*([dc, ch 3] twice, dc) in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (18 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in same ch sp as join, (**ch 10**—see *Pattern Notes*, tr) in same ch sp as sl st, \*(tr, ch 6, tr) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-10.


**Rnd 5:** Sl st in same sp as join, ch 1, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in same ch sp as join, (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, \*(3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, rep from \* around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## WHITE 1-SIDE JOIN MOTIF

**Rnds 1–4:** Rep rnds 1–4 of First Motif.

**Rnd 5 (joining rnd):** Sl st in same sp as join, ch 1, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in same ch sp as sl st, (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-5 sp on previous Motif, ch 2, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-5 sp on previous Motif, ch 2, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on current Motif,

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Rep rnds 4 and 5 of White 1-Side Join Motif.

#### WHITE 2-SIDE JOIN MOTIF

**Rnds 1–4:** Rep rnds 1–4 of First Motif.

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in same sp as join, ch 1, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in same ch sp as beg ch-1, (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, [3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-5 sp on previous Motif, ch 2, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on

current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-5 sp on previous Motif, ch 2, 3 sc in same ch-6 sp on current Motif] twice, [(3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in same ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp, (3 sc, ch 5, 3 sc) in next ch-6 sp] 3 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

#### COLOR 2-SIDE JOIN MOTIF

**Rnds 1 & 2:** With color indicated in Assembly Diagram, rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Motif. Fasten off at end of last rnd.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### BIRDHOUSE

**Row 1:** With linen, ch 19, hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (18 hdc)

**Rows 2-9:** Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each hdc across, turn. (18 hdc)

**Rows 10-16:** Ch 2, **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 hdc, hdc in each hdc across to last 2 hdc, hdc dec in last 2 hdc, turn. (4 hdc)

**Row 17:** Ch 2, [yo, insert hook in next hdc, yo, draw up a lp]

3 times, yo, draw through all 7 lps on hook, ch 1 to lock, fasten off.

**Rnd 18:** Now working in rnds, join royal with sl st in peak of Birdhouse, sl st around outer edge with ch 1 at each corner for shaping, fasten off.

**Row 19:** Now working in rows, holding cherry at back of Birdhouse, insert hook between rows 2 and 3 RS to WS, yo, draw a lp to RS, [insert hook in next st, yo, draw up a lp and draw lp through st on hook] across, fasten off. Secure end on WS of Birdhouse.

- Fiberfill



## GAUGE

9 back lp sl sts = 3 inches;  
14 back lp sl st rows = 3 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise stated. Use stitch marker to mark rounds.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With Aran, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place **marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (36 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 8–10:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 11:** Sc in each of next 15 sts, [**sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 3 times, sc in each of next 15 sts. (33 sc)

**Rnd 12:** Sc in each of next 14 sts, 3 sc in each of next 2 sts (*first cheek*), sc in next st, 3 sc in each of next 2 sts (*2nd cheek*), sc in each of next 14 sts. (41 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 14:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, ending with sc in each of last 2 sts. (28 sc)

**Rnd 15:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, ending with sc in last st. (19 sc)

Place eyes between rnds 9 and 10 above cheeks with 2 sts between eyes. Stuff Head shaping cheeks. Continue stuffing as work progresses.

**Rnd 16:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, sc dec in last st and first st. (12 sc)

**Rnd 17:** Rep rnd 7, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to delft blue.

## JACKET

**Rnd 18:** Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

**Rnd 19:** Rep rnd 2. (48 sc)

**Rnd 20:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, sk next 12 sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, sk last 12 sts. (30 sc)

**Rnd 21:** [Sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (36 sc)

**Rnd 22:** [Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (42 sc)

**Rnds 23–30:** Rep rnd 7. At the end of rnd 30, change color to coffee.

## BODY

**Rnd 31:** Working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), [sc in each of next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (36 sc)

**Rnds 32–35:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 36:** Working in back lp, [sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 37:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 38:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (18 sc)

With fiberfill, stuff Body.

**Rnd 39:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 40:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] 6 times. Fasten off. (6 sc)



## JACKET TRIM

**Row 1:** Working in rem free lps of rnd 30, join delft blue with sl st in 33rd st (*center front*), ch 2, hdc in each st around, **do not join**. Fasten off.

## ARM

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Join delft blue in first sk sc of rnd 19 of Jacket with sc, sc in each of next 11 sts. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnds 3–14:** Rep rnd 2. At the end of rnd 14, change color to Aran in back lp.

With fiberfill, stuff Arm lightly.

**Rnd 15:** Working in back lp, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (9 sts)

**Rnd 16:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 17:** Sk first 2 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, sc dec in last st and first st. Fasten off. (3 sts)

## NOSE

**Rnd 1:** With Aran, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Rnds 2 & 3:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 3, sl st in next st, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Nose to front of Head just below eyes and centering between cheeks.

## EAR

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With Aran, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

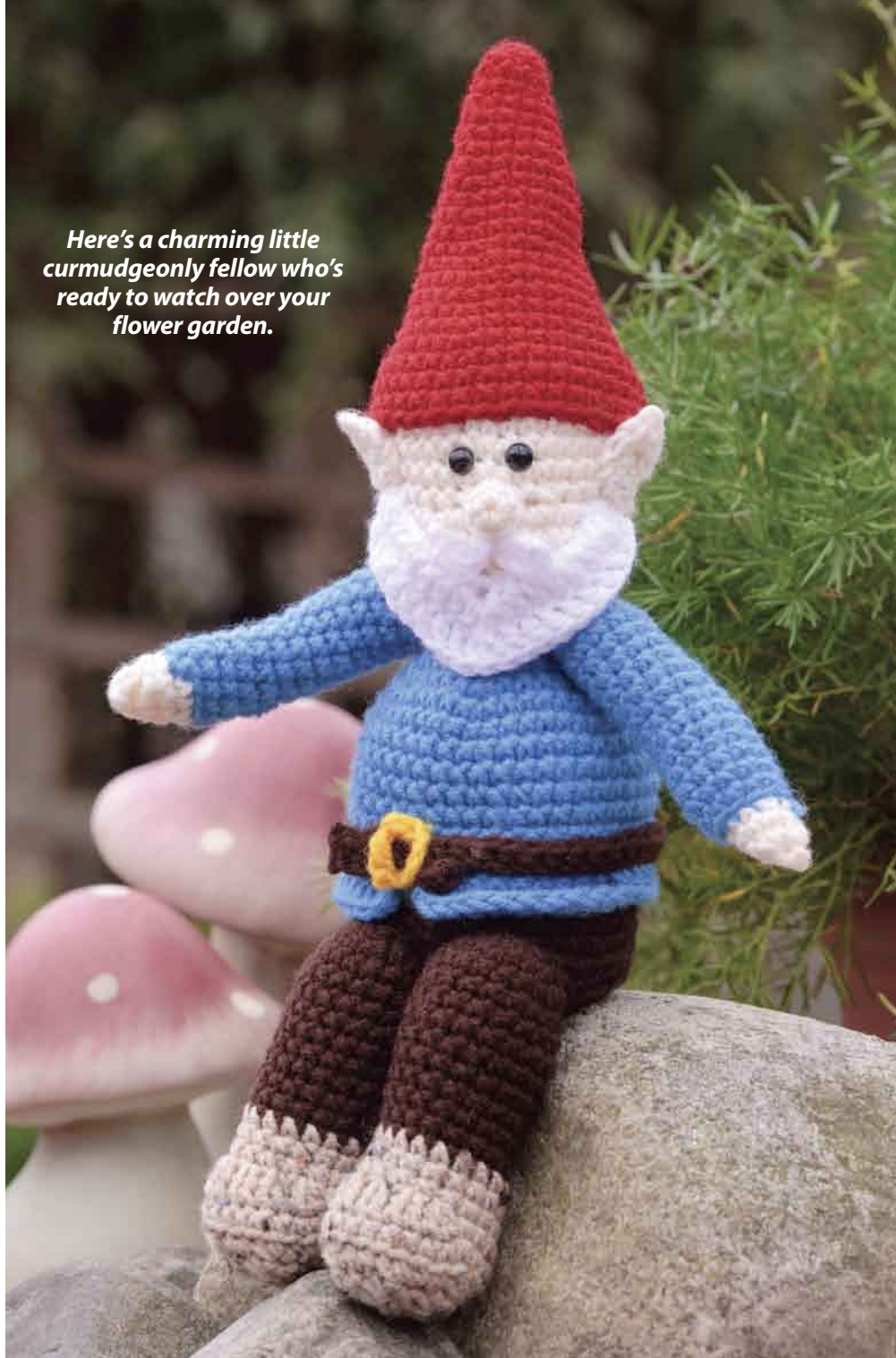
**Rnd 2:** Sc in next st, (hdc, ch 2, sl st, hdc) in next st, sc in next st, sl st, leaving 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off. Sew Ears to sides of Head with bottom of Ears on rnd 10 about 4 sts from eyes.

**Rnd 1:** With coffee, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 5–12:** Rep rnd 4. At end of rnd 12, change color to buff fleck, fasten off coffee.

**Rnds 13–15:** Rep rnd 4.

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each of next 6 sts,

2 dc in each of next 6 sts, sc in each of next 6 sts. (24 sts)

**Rnd 17:** Rep rnd 4.

**Rnd 18:** Working in back lp, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (18 sts)

**Rnd 19:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 20:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] around. Fasten off.

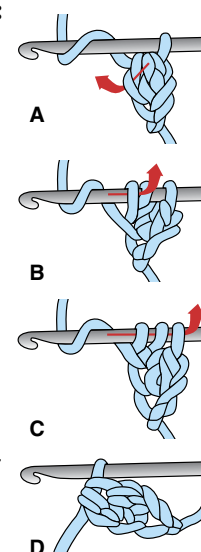

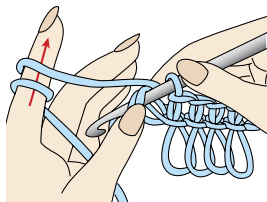

**Row 54 [72, 90]:** Rep row 2.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [insert hook in previously completed sc, yo, draw up lp, insert hook in next st, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] rep around outer edge working 3 sc in each corner st, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off.

## SMALL DAISY

**Make 3.**

**Rnd 1:** Starting at center of Daisy with size H hook and bright yellow, ch 2, 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off. (7 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Join white with sl st in any sc, [using sc from rnd 1 as first base ch, work **next foundation st** (see *Special Stitches*), 3 **next hdc foundation sts** (see *Special Stitches*), 2 next sc

foundation sts, working on opposite side of foundation sts, work 2 sc in bottom of last sc foundation st made, sc in next sc foundation st, hdc in base of each of next 3 hdc foundation sts, sc in bottom of next sc foundation st] 7 times, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first st. Fasten off. (7 petals)

## LARGE DAISY

**Rnd 1:** Starting at center of Daisy with size H hook and bright yellow, ch 3, 9 hdc in first ch of ch-3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg ch-3. (10 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 hdc in each hdc around, join in beg hdc. Fasten off. (20 hdc)

**Rnd 3:** Join white with sl st in any st, [sc in next st, using hdc from rnd 2 as first base ch, work 12 **next hdc foundation sts**

(see *Special Stitches*), 3 hdc in bottom of last hdc foundation st to turn corner, now working on bottom of foundation sts, work 12 hdc sts, sl st in next st] 7 times. (7 petals)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, [sl st in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 3 sts, dc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 3 sts, [2 sc in next st] 3 times, hdc in each of next 3 sts, dc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts] 7 times, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

Position Flowers as desired on Rug. With length of bright yellow, sew center of Flowers to Rug. For additional stability especially on Large Daisy with length of white, tack down ends of petals. **CW**

- Embroidery floss: 18 inches each black and white
- Fiberfill

## GAUGE

**Size J hook and A:** Tail = 2 inches long x 1 inch wide at base

**Size G hook and B:** First 2 rnds of leg = 1⅞ inches across

**Size D hook and C:** Nose = ¾ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

## TAIL

**Row 1:** With size J hook and A, ch 6, sc in 3rd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 2 (RS):** Loosely sl st in first st, sc in each of next 3 sts, 4 dc in sp formed by beg 2 sk chs, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 3 sts, loosely sl st in last st, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (2 sl sts, 6 sc, 4 dc)

## LEG

### Make 4.

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and B, ch 2, working over yarn tail, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, snug rnd with beg tail, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnds 3–7:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 7, join with sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. Turn Leg inside out so WS becomes outside. Stuff firmly with fiberfill.

## EAR

### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size G hook and B, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 2 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts, (sc, hdc) in next st, (hdc, dc) in next st, (hdc, 2 dc) in next st, working on opposite side of foundation ch of row 1, (2 dc, hdc) in next st, (dc, hdc) in next st, (hdc, sc) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (18 sts)

With RS facing forward, fold short end of Ear along long edge to form cup, tack in place with rem length.

## FACE

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and B, ch 2, working over tail, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, snug rnd with beg tail, do not join, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts. (10 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each

### Single crochet, treble crochet decrease (sc, tr dec):

Insert hook in st, yo, draw up lp, yo hook twice, insert hook in next st, yo, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

## HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With ecru, ch 2, 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place **st marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (7 sc)

**Rnd 2:** [(Sc, tr) in next st] 6 times, sc in last st. (13 sts)

**Rnd 3:** [Tr in next st, (sc, tr) in next st, sc in next st, (tr, sc) in next st] 3 times, tr in last st. (19 sts)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in next st, tr in next st, (sc, tr) in next st] 6 times, sc in last st. (25 sts)

**Rnd 5:** [Tr in next st, sc in next st, tr in next st, (sc, tr) in next st, sc in next st, tr in next st, sc in next st, (tr, sc) in next st] 3 times, tr in next st. (31 sts)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in next st, tr in next st] around, sc in last st.

**Rnd 7:** [Tr in next st, sc in next st] around, tr in last st.

**Rnds 8 & 9:** Rep rnds 6 and 7.

**Rnd 10:** [Sc in next st, tr in next st, sc in next st, (**tr, sc dec**—see *Special Stitches*) in next 2 sts, tr in next st, sc in next st, tr in next st, (**sc, tr dec**—see *Special Stitches*) in next 2 sts] 3 times, sc in last st. (25 sts)

**Rnd 11:** [Tr in next st, sc in next st, (tr, sc dec) in next 2 sts, sc in next st, tr in next st, (sc, tr dec) in next 2 sts] 3 times, tr in last st. (19 sts)

**Rnd 12:** [Sc in next st, (tr, sc dec) in next 2 sts, tr in next st, (sc, tr dec) in next 2 sts] 3 times, sc in last st. (13 sts)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and place jingle bells inside.

## HANDLE

**Rnd 13:** [(Sc, tr) in next st] 12 times, sc in last st. (25 sts)

from hook to form ring, ch 1, 3 sc in ring, ch 2, sc in ring, ch 8 (*for Tail*), sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each rem ch across, sc in ring, ch 2, 3 sc in ring, ch 2, sc in ring, ch 10 (*first Antenna*), 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each rem ch, sc in ring, ch 10 (*2nd Antenna*), 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each rem ch, sc in ring, ch 2, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** Join first Butterfly color in ch-2 sp to right of Antenna and keeping Antennas and Tail to front of work, **ch 4** (see Pattern Notes), 3 tr in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, (4 tr, ch 2, 4 tr) in next ch-2



sp, ch 2, for bottom wings (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, 4 tr in first ch-2 sp, hdc in 4th ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** Join 2nd Butterfly color in ch-2 sp to right of Antenna where first color was fastened off, ch 4, 4 tr in same ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp between upper wings, (5 tr, ch 2, 5 tr) in ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp between upper and lower wings, (4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc) in first ch-2 sp of first lower wing, sc in next ch-2 sp between lower wings, (4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc) in next ch-2 sp of lower wing, sc in ch-2 sp of lower and upper wing, 5 tr in same sp as beg of first upper wing, hdc in 4th ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** Join black in corner ch-2 sp of first upper wing to right of Antennas, (hdc, dc, hdc) in each corner ch-2 sp and work 1 sc in each st of each wing and each st between wings.

## SQUARE

**Rnd 5:** Join jewel blue in center corner dc before first Antenna with sc, ch 6, sl st in top of first antenna, ch 3, sl st in top of 2nd Antenna (*twist 2nd Antenna so it points in different direction*), ch 6, sc in center corner dc, ch 7, dc in sc between upper and lower wings, ch 7, sc in center corner dc, ch 7, sc in Tail, ch 7, sc in center corner dc, ch 7, dc in sc between upper and lower wings, ch 7, join in first sc. (15 sts between each corner not counting center corner sts)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, 6 sc in ch-6 sp, sk sl st in Antenna, 3 sc in ch-3 sp, sk next Antenna, 6 sc in next ch-6 sp, 3 sc in corner st, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in next dc, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, 3 sc in corner st, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in Tail, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, 3 sc in corner sc, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in next dc, 7 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in same first corner as beg 2-sc, join. (72 sc)

**Rnd 7: Ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in each sc around, working (dc, ch 3, dc) in center sc of each corner, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (76 dc, 3 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 3, \*[dc in each of next 4 dc, ch 1, sk next dc] 3 times, dc in each of next 4 dc\*\*, (dc, ch 3, dc) in corner ch-3 sp, rep from \*

#### Triple treble crochet (trtr):

Yo hook 4 times, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw lp through, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 4 times.

#### Treble crochet cluster (tr cl):

\*Yo twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* once, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

### DOILY

**Rnd 1:** With C, ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 5th ch from hook, ch 2, 15 dc in ring, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 2:** Join B in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) on any dc on rnd 1, working in front lps around, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, **ch-5 picot** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 2, \*sc in next dc, ch-5 picot, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in first sc. (16 picots)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in rem lp of same st as join, working in rem lps of rnd 1 around, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*sc in next st, rep from \* around, join in front lp of first sc.

**Rnd 4:** Working in front lps, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch-5 picot, ch 2, \*sc in next dc, ch-5

picot, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 5:** Join C in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of any sc on rnd 3, working in back lps around, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, **ch-6 picot** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 3, \*sc in next sc, ch-6 picot, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 6:** Join A in any picot on rnd 5, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 3, \*sc in next picot, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, ch-5 picot twice (picot group and picot group sp formed—see *Pattern Notes*), ch 2, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 8:** Sl st in each st and sp across to first **picot group sp** (see *Pattern Notes*), ch-6 picot, ch-5 picot (picot group formed), ch 3, \*sc in next picot group sp, ch-6 picot, ch-5 picot, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in first sl st.

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in each st and sp across to first picot group sp, **ch-7 picot** (see *Special Stitches*), ch-5 picot (picot group formed), ch 4, \*sc in next picot group sp, ch-7 picot, ch-5 picot, ch 4, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 10:** Join C in any picot group sp, ch 5, dc in same sp as beg ch-5, ch 6, \*(dc, ch 3, dc) in next picot group sp, ch 6, rep

Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 12:** Join A in first ch-3 sp at beg of rnd 11, ch 1, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in same sp as beg ch-1, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in each of next 4 ch-4 sps, \*(2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in each of next 4 ch-4 sps, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 13:** Sl st in each st and sp around to next ch-2 sp, ch 6, tr

in same sp as beg ch-6, ch 3, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, dc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, \*(tr, ch 3, tr) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, dc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

**Rnd 14:** Sl st in same sp as join, ch 1, (2 sc, ch 3, **tr cl**—see *Special Stitches*, tr cl in top of tr cl just made, ch 4, sl st in top of tr cl just made, ch 3, sl st in top of first tr cl made, ch 3, 2 sc) in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-1, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 3 sc in next ch 3 sp] 3 times, \*(2 sc, ch 3, tr cl, tr cl in top of tr cl just made, ch 4, sl st in top of tr cl just made, ch 3, sl st in top of first cluster made, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 3 sc in

next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## BUTTERFLIES

**Note:** Ch-9 at beg of A will be referred to as beg ch-9 throughout.

### First Butterfly

**Rnd 1:** Work Butterfly as follows:

- a. With B, ch 9, dc in 3rd ch from hook, ch 5, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 4 sc around rem chs of ch-5 (*first antenna made*), 2 dc in same ch on **beg ch-9** (see *Note*) as first dc, ch 5, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 4 sc around rem chs of ch-5 (*2nd antenna made*), dc in same ch as first dc worked in beg ch-9, drop lp from



hook, insert hook in first sk ch on beg ch-9, place dropped lp on hook, pull lp through (*Butterfly head made*), ch 2, sl st in same ch as first dc in beg ch-9, sc in each of next 2 chs on beg ch-9;

**b.** ch 9, sl st in 9th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, (5 sc, 2 hdc, dc) in ring, **triple picot** (see *Special Stitches*) in last dc made, [3 dc in ring, **ch-3 picot** (see *Special Stitches*)] twice, (2 hdc, 5 sc) in ring, sl st around base of ring (*first upper wing made*), sc in same ch on beg ch-9 as upper wing ch-9;

**c.** ch 7, sl st in 7th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 3 sc in ring, sl st in 2nd sc of last 5 sc on lower edge of the upper wing, (sc, 2 hdc, {ch-3 picot, 2 dc} twice) in ring, ch 5, sl st in **indicated ch-2 sp** (see *Reference Diagram and Symbol Key on page 65*) on rnd 14 of Doily, 5 sc around rem chs of ch-5, (hdc, 3 sc) in ring, sl st around base of ring (*first lower wing made*), sc in same ch on beg ch-9 as lower wing ch-7;

**d.** sc in next ch on beg ch-9, hdc in each of next 2 chs on beg ch-9, 3 sc in last ch on beg ch-9, working in opposite side of beg ch-9, hdc in rem lp of each of next 2 chs, sc in rem lp of each of next 2 chs (*Butterfly body made*);

**e.** ch 7, sl st in 7th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, (3 sc, hdc) in ring, ch 5, sk next ch-2 sp on rnd 14 of Doily, sl st in next ch-2 sp on rnd 14 of Doily, 5 sc around ch-5, ((2 dc, ch-3 picot) twice, hdc, 4 sc) in ring, sl st around base of ring, sc in same ch on beg ch-9 as

last sc of Butterfly body (*2nd lower wing made*);

**f.** ch 9, sl st in 9th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 3 sc in ring, sl st in first sc of last 4-sc group on 2nd lower wing, (2 sc, 2 hdc, dc, ch-3 picot, 3 dc, ch-3 picot, 3 dc, triple picot in last dc made, 2 hdc, 5 sc) in ring, sl st around base of ring, sc in same ch on beg ch-9 as last sc of 2nd lower wing, sc in next ch on beg ch-9, join in base of Butterfly head. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## 2nd Butterfly

**Rnd 1:** With D, rep rnd 1 of First Butterfly.

## 3rd Butterfly

**Rnd 1:** With B, rep rnd 1 of First Butterfly.

## 4th–8th Butterflies

[Rep 2nd and 3rd Butterflies alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with 2nd Butterfly.

## INNER BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join A in any ch-4 sp on rnd 14 of Doily, ch 1, sc in same ch-4 sp as beg ch-1, work Border as follows:

**a. trtr** (see *Special Stitches*) in **indicated ch-3 picot** (see *Reference Diagram and Symbol Key on page 65*) on lower wing of next Butterfly, ch 4, tr in first ch-3 picot on upper wing of same Butterfly, ch 4, dc in next ch-3 picot on same wing, ch 5, dc in ch-5 sp of triple picot on same wing, ch 7, dc in tip of first antenna, ch 5, dc in tip of next antenna, ch 7, dc in ch-5 sp of triple picot on next upper wing of same Butterfly, ch 5, dc in next ch-3 picot on same wing, ch 4, tr in next ch-3 picot, ch 4, trtr in indicated ch-3 picot on next lower wing of same Butterfly;

**b.** \*sc in next ch-4 sp in rnd 14 of Doily, trtr in indicated ch-3 picot on lower wing of next Butterfly, ch 4, tr in first ch-3 picot on upper wing of same Butterfly, ch 4, dc in next ch-3 picot on same wing, ch 5, dc in ch-5 sp of triple picot on same wing, ch 7, dc in tip of first antenna, ch 5, dc in tip of next antenna, ch 7, dc in ch-5 sp of triple picot on next upper wing of same Butterfly, ch 5, dc in next ch-3 picot on same wing, ch 4, tr in next ch-3 picot, ch 4, trtr in indicated ch-3 picot on next lower wing of same Butterfly;

**c.** rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 3:** Working in back lps of rnd 1, sl st in rem lp of same st as join on rnd 1, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*sc in next dc, rep from \* around, join in front lp of first st on rnd 3.

**Rnd 4:** Working in front lps, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch-5 picot, ch 2, \*sc in next dc, ch-5 picot, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 5:** Join C in back lp of any sc on rnd 3, working in back lps, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch-6 picot, ch 3, [sc in next sc,

ch-6 picot, ch 3] 11 times, sc in next sc, ch 4, sl st in **indicated ch-2 sp** (see *Reference Diagram and Symbol Key* on page 65) on rnd 4 of Inner Border, ch 1, sl st in 3rd ch of ch-4 just made, ch 3, [sc in next sc on rnd 3, ch 4, sl st in next ch-2 sp on Doily, ch 1, sl st in 3rd ch of ch-4 just made, ch 3] 3 times, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

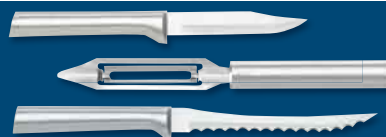

## PATTERN NOTES

Throw is worked with right side facing at all times.

Change colors in the following sequence: E, A, B, C, D.

Work 2 rounds with color before changing colors.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Back post slip stitch (bp sl st):** Working from right to left, insert hook from back to front to back around post of indicated st, yo, draw lp through lp on hook.

**Beginning treble crochet cluster (beg tr cl):** Ch 3, \*yo

twice, insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* twice, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

## Treble crochet cluster

**(tr cl):** \*Yo twice, insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* 3 times, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

## Treble crochet corner

**(tr corner):** 10 tr in indicated place.

## Back post treble crochet

**decrease (bptr dec):** \*Yo twice, insert hook from back to front to back around indicated st, yo,

draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* once, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

## THROW

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With E, ch 12, join (see Pattern Notes) in 12th ch from hook to form ring, **beg tr cl** (see Special Stitches) in ring, \*ch 4, sc in ring\*\*, ch 4, **tr cl** (see Special Stitches), rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, **do not join.**

**Rnd 2:** Sk first ch-4 sp and first tr cl, \***tr corner** (see Special Stitches) in first ch of next ch-4, sc in next sc, sk next ch-4 sp and

next tr, rep from \* around, join in first tr. Fasten off E.

**Rnd 3:** With A, join in **back lp** (see *Special Stitches*) of 8th tr of any tr corner, ch 4, \***bp tr dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next 7 sts, ch 4, sl st in both lps at base of last bp tr made, ch 4, bp tr dec around next 4 tr, ch 4, sl st in both lps at base of last bp tr made, ch 4, rep from \* around, join in top beg ch-4.

**Rnd 4:** Sk next bp tr dec, \*6 tr in first ch of next ch-4, sc in next sl st, sk next ch-4 sp and next bp tr dec, 10 tr in first ch of next ch-4, sc in next sl st, rep from \* around, join in top of first tr. Fasten off.

**Rnds 5 & 6:** With B, rep rnds 3 and 4.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** With C, rep rnds 3 and 4.

**Rnds 9 & 10:** With D, rep rnds 3 and 4.

**Next rnds:** Working in **color sequence** (see *Pattern Notes*), rep rnds 3 and 4 until throw measures 54 inches in diameter, ending last rep with E.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** With B, starting in any corner, **bp sl st** (see *Special Stitches*) around first tr, ch 3 (counts as first dc), **bphdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, **bp sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 sts, ch 3, bp sc around each of next 3 sts, bphdc around next st, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, \*[**bp tr** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next sc, bpdc around next tr, bphdc around next tr, bp sc around each of next 2 tr, bphdc around next tr, bpdc around next tr, bp tr around next sc] across to next corner\*\*, bpdc around next tr, bphdc around next tr, bp sc around each of next 3 tr, ch 3, bp sc around each of next 3 tr, bphdc around next tr, bpdc around next tr, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), \*hdc in each st across to corner ch-3 sp, 3 hdc in corner ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*sc in each st across to 2nd hdc of 3-hdc group, 3 sc in 2nd hdc of 3-hdc group, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-1. Fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** With E, join in any sc, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. **cw**

1 ball each #46 rose pink and #10 yellow
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

8 hdc = 2½ inches; 6 hdc rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## DISHCLOTH

**Row 1:** With spring meadows, ch 36, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (35 sc)

*Stitch a cheery kitchen set to dress up your own decor or to give as a special housewarming gift.*



**Row 2:** Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in first sc, [sk next sc, 2 hdc in next sc] across, turn. (18 2-hdc groups)

**Row 3:** Ch 2, [2 hdc in sp between next 2 2-hdc groups] 17 times, hdc in last hdc, turn. (17 2-hdc groups, 2 hdc)

**Row 4:** Ch 2, hdc in sp between first hdc and next 2-hdc group, [2 hdc in sp between next 2 2-hdc] across ending with 2 hdc in sp between last 2-hdc group and last hdc, turn. (18 2-hdc groups)

**Rows 5–30:** [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 13 times.

**Row 31:** Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Join rose pink with sl st in any corner, [ch 2, sk next st or row, sl st in next st or next row] around, ending with sl st in same st as beg ch-2. Fasten off.

## POT HOLDER

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With spring meadows, ch 5, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), 12 hdc in ring, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (13 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in each hdc around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (26 hdc)



**Rnd 3:** Ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-2, [sk next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (13 2-hdc groups)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 2, 2 hdc in sp between first and last hdc of previous rnd, [3 hdc in next sp between next 2 2-hdc groups] 12 times, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (13 3-hdc groups)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 2, 2 hdc in sp between first and last hdc of previous rnd, [3 hdc in next sp between next 2 3-hdc groups] 12 times, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 2, 2 hdc in sp between first and last hdc of previous rnd, [ch 1, 3 hdc in sp between next 2 3-hdc groups] 12 times, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (13 3-hdc groups, 13 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 2, 3 hdc in sp between first and last hdc of previous rnd, [ch 1, 4 hdc in sp between next 2 3-hdc groups] 12 times, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (13 4-hdc groups, 13 ch-1 sps)

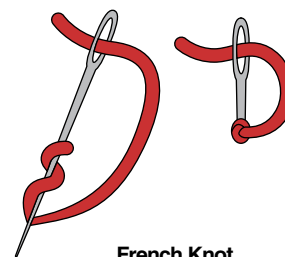
**Rnd 8:** Ch 2, 3 hdc in sp between first and last hdc of previous rnd, [ch 2, 4 hdc in sp between next 2 4-hdc groups] 12 times, ch 2, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off. (13 4-hdc groups, 13 ch-2 sps)

## FLOWER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With rose pink, leaving 3-inch length at beg, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, working over beg length and into ring, (sc, hdc, dc, 2 tr, dc, hdc, sc, sl st) 5 times in ring, join in first sc. Fasten off. Draw rem beg length tight.

Thread yellow on yarn needle, insert needle at center from RS through to WS, embroider **French knot** (see illustration) in center of flower, knot end tog on RS, and trim ends.

Sew Flower with WS facing (*French knot side*) to center of 1 side of Pot Holder.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Holding both Pot Holders tog with Flower facing away and working through both thicknesses of **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of sts, join rose pink with sl st, [ch 2, sl st in next hdc or next ch st] around, join in beg sl st, **do not fasten off**.

For hanging loop, ch 16, sl st in same st as joining, ch 1, work 16 sc in ch-16 sp, ending with sl st in joining sl st. Fasten off. **cw**

## SUNFLOWER

### Make 2.

### CENTER

**Rnd 1:** With fudge brown, ch 3, 12 hdc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in top of first hdc. (12 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), hdc in same st as beg ch-2,

2 hdc in each rem hdc around. Fasten off. (24 hdc)

### FIRST PETAL

**Row 1:** Join golden yellow in **back lp** (see Stitch Guide) of any hdc on rnd 2 of Center, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 hdc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 2:** Ch 3, **dc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 dc, dc dec in rem dc and top of beg ch-3, turn. (3 dc)

**Row 3:** Ch 3, **hdc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 3 sts. Fasten off.

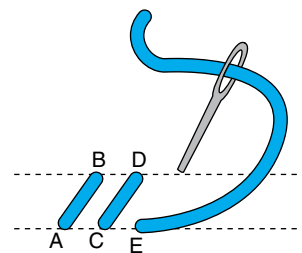

**Row 1 (RS):** With dark sage, ch 166, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (165 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off.

**Row 3:** Join rose garden with sl st in first sc, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in same st as ch-3, [sk next 3 sc, 4 dc in next sc] 40 times, sk next 3 sc, 3 dc in last sc, turn.

**Row 4:** Rep row 2.

**Row 5:** Join dark sage with sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 6:** Rep row 2.

**Row 7:** Rep row 3.

**Row 8:** Rep row 2.

**Row 9:** Rep row 5.

**Row 10:** Rep row 2.

**Row 11:** Join Victorian rose with sl st in first sc, ch 3, 2 dc in same st as ch-3, [sk next 3 sc, 4 dc in next sc] 40 times, sk next 3 sc, 3 dc in last sc, turn.

**Row 12:** Rep row 2.

**Row 13:** Rep row 5.

**Row 14:** Rep row 2.

**Rows 15–38:** [Rep rows 3–14 consecutively] twice.

**Rows 39–46:** [Rep rows 3–10]

once. At the end of row 46, fasten off.

## END TRIM

**Row 1 (RS):** Working across end of rows, join dark sage with sl st, ch 1, work 45 sc evenly sp across ends of rows, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

With RS facing, rep rows 1 and 2 of End Trim on opposite end of Shawl, **do not fasten off**, turn.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc in next st, [sc in next st, (ch 3, sc in same st) 3 times, sc in each of next 3 sts] around, working 2 sc before center corner st, 3 sc in each center corner st and 2 sc after center corner st, sl st to join in beg sc. Fasten off. **cw**

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Cotton-Ease medium (worsted) weight yarn (3½ oz/207 yds/100g per ball):  
4 balls #186 maize  
2 balls #100 snow  
1 ball each #122 taupe and #194 lime
- Sizes G/6/4mm, H/8/5mm and I/9/5.5mm hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge



## GAUGE

**Size H hook:** 3 dc = ¾ inch; 3 dc rows = 1¾ inches

**Size I hook:** 3 dc = 1 inch; 3 dc rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 2, dc) in indicated st or sp.

## Large petal (lg petal):

(Sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in indicated st.

**Medium petal (med petal):** (Sl st, ch 2, hdc, ch 2, sl st) in indicated st.

## Small petal (sm petal):

(Sl st, ch 1, sc, ch 1, sl st) in indicated st.

## DRESS

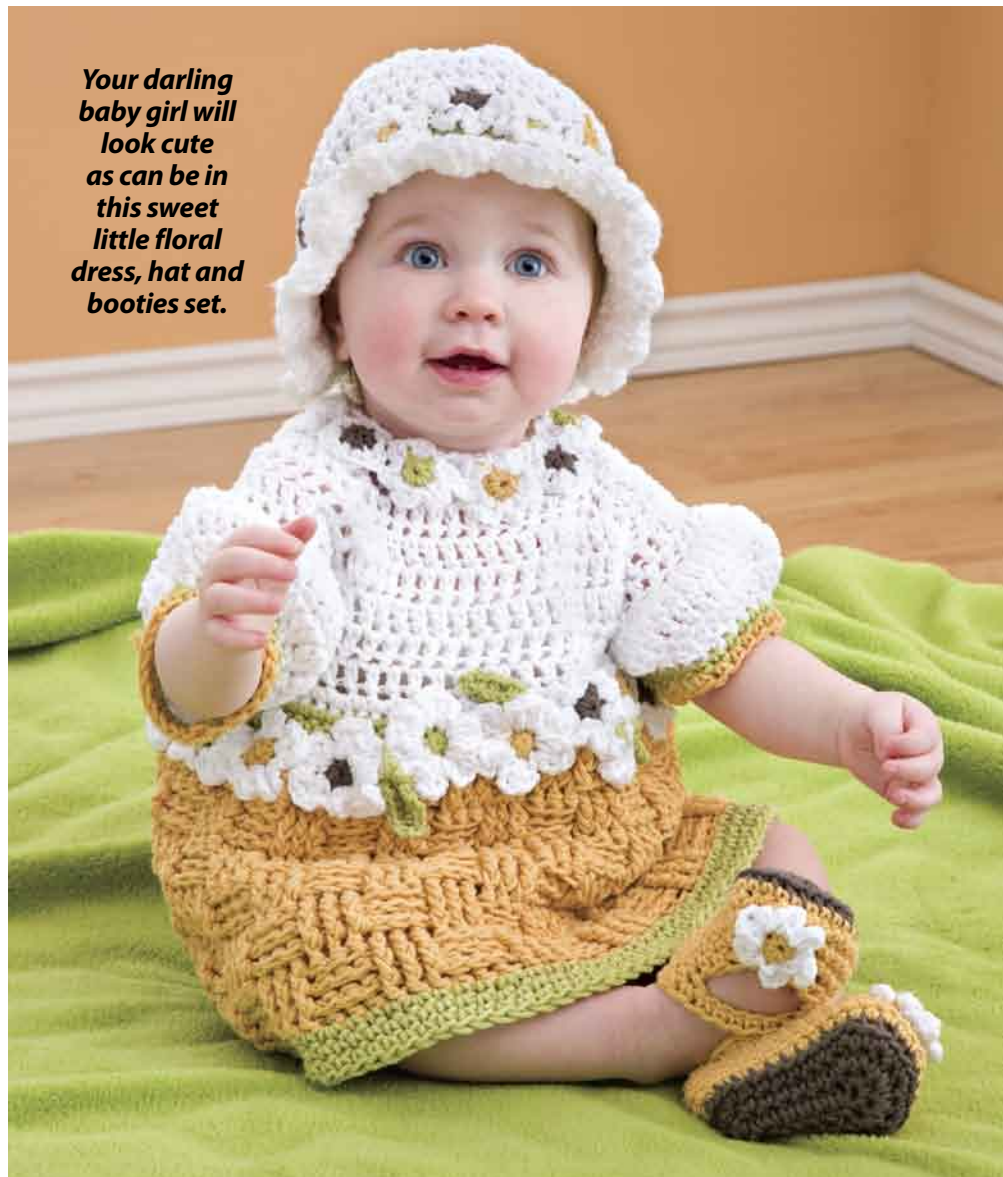

**Row 1:** With size H [I] hook and

snow, ch 36, dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), dc in each of next 3 chs, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, V-st in next ch, dc in each of next 10 chs, V-st in next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, V-st in next ch, dc in each of last 5 chs, turn. (30 dc, 4 V-sts)

**Row 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), \*dc in each dc across to next

**Rnd 1:** Now working in rnds, ch 3, dc in each of next 10 dc, dc in ch sp of next V-st, ch 5, sk next 17 dc (*armhole*), dc in ch sp of next V-st, dc in each of next 22 dc, dc in ch sp of next V-st, ch 5, sk next 17 dc (*armhole*), dc in ch sp of next V-st, dc in each of last 11 dc, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of first dc. (48 dc, 2 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Working in sts and in each ch of each ch-5, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*2 sc in next st or ch\*\*, sc in next st or ch, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. Fasten off white. (87 sc)



**Rnd 3:** With size H [I] hook and lime, join in same place as rnd 2 join, sc in same st as join, sc in each sc around, join in first st. (72 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each sc around, join in first st. Fasten off lime. (72 sc)

**Rnd 5:** With size H [I] hook and maize, join yarn in same place as rnd 3 join, ch 3, sk next st, dc in each rem st around to last st, sk last st, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 dc)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, \*fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of the next 3 dc, bpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 dc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 sts)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 3, \*fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 sts)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 3, \*bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, fpdc around each of the 3 bpdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 sts)

**Rnds 9 & 10:** Ch 3, \*bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 11:** Ch 3, \*fpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 sts)

**Rnds 12 & 13:** Ch 3, \*fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (85 sts)

**Rnds 14–19:** Rep rnds 8–13. (85 sts)



## Size 6–12 Months Only

**Rnds [20–22]:** Rep rnds 8–10. ([85] sts)

## All Sizes

**Rnd 20 [23]:** With size H [I] hook and lime, join yarn in same st as fasten off, sc in same st as join, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, \*sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around to last st, sc in last st, join in first st. (106 sc)

**Rnds 21 & 22 [24 & 25]:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first st. Fasten off at end of last rnd. (106 sc)

Weave in ends.

## SLEEVES

**Rnd 1:** With size H [I] hook and snow, join yarn in bottom of armhole opening, ch 3, dc in each of next 8 sts, 2 dc in each of next 13 dc, dc in each of last 6 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (41 dc)

**Rnds 2 & 3:** Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. (41 dc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, sk same st as beg ch-3, \*dc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (21 dc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in top of beg ch-1. Fasten off. (21 sc)

**Rnd 6:** With size H [I] hook and lime, join in same ch as rnd



5 join, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each sc around, join in top of beg ch-1. Fasten off lime. (21 sc)

**Rnd 7:** With size H [I] hook and maize, join in same ch as rnd 6 join, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in top of beg ch-1. Fasten off. (21 sc)

Weave in ends.

### BUTTON PLACKET

**Row 1:** Working in ends of rows on Yoke, join in end of row 6 of Yoke, ch 1, work 9 sc evenly sp across. **Do not turn or fasten off.** (12 sc)

### NECK TRIM

**Row 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, sc in rem lp of each ch across. Do not turn or fasten off. (34 sc)

### BUTTONHOLE PLACKET

**Row 1:** Working in ends of rows on Yoke, ch 1, sc in end of next row, ch 2, sk end of next row, sc in end of each of next 4 rows, ch 2, sk end of next row, 2 sc in end of last row. Fasten off and weave in ends.

### LARGE DAISY

**Make 3 [3] taupe, 3 [4] maize & 3 [5] lime.**

**Rnd 1:** With size H hook and maize, lime or taupe, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Join snow in any st, (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, sl st) in same st as beg ch-3 (*first lg petal made*), \***lg petal** (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, rep from \* around. Leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off. (6 lg petals)

### MEDIUM DAISY

**Make 1 [3] taupe & 1 [1] each lime & maize.**

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and maize, lime or taupe, ch 2, 6 sc

in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (6 sc) Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** Join snow in any st, ch 2, (hdc, ch 2, sl st) in same st as beg ch-2 (*first med petal made*), \***med petal** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, rep from \* around. Leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off. (6 med petals)

### SMALL DAISY

**Make 1 [1] each lime & maize for Waist Trim.**

**Make 2 [3] each lime & maize for Neck Trim.**

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and maize or lime, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Join snow in any st, ch 1, (sc, ch 1, sl st) in same st as beg ch-1 (*first sm petal made*), \***sm petal** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, rep from \* around. Leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off. (6 sm petals)

### LARGE LEAF

**Make 3 [3].**

**Rnd 1:** With size H hook and lime, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in each of next 3 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, hdc in each of next 3 chs, 3 sc in each of next 4 chs, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Leaving a 6-inch tail, fasten off.

### SMALL LEAF

**Make 3 [3].**

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and lime, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, 3 sc in last ch. Leaving 6-inch tail, fasten off.

### WAIST TRIM

Alternating colors and overlapping as necessary, use rem 6-inch lengths to sew all Large Daisies (9 [12]), all Medium

Daisies (2 [4]) and Small Daisies for Waist Trim over rnds 3 and 4 of Body of Dress.

Attach Large and Small Leaves behind Waist Trim Daisies as desired.

### NECK TRIM

Alternating colors and overlapping as necessary, sew rem Small Daisies around Neck Opening.



### SUNHAT

**Rnd 1:** With size H [I] hook and snow, ch 3, 11 dc in 3rd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first dc. (12 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. (24 dc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. (48 dc)

**Rnds 4–7 [4–9]:** Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off snow. (48 dc)

**Rnd 8 [10]:** With size H [I] hook and lime, join yarn in same place as join at end of rnd 7 [9], ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each rem st around, join in first sc. (48 sc)

1 ball each #0001 snow sparkle (A), #0002 fuchsia sparkle (B), #0003 spring sparkle (C), #0005 royal sparkle (D) and #0006 purple sparkle (E)

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker
- 9mm safety black shank eyes: 2
- Fiberfill

## GAUGE

6 sc rnds = 1 inch; 6 sc = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise stated. Use stitch marker to mark rounds.

Stuff Glitterbug with fiberfill as work progresses.

If making this toy for children under 3 years old, it is recommended that the eyes be embroidered rather than using the plastic eyes.

## HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With A, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **place st marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

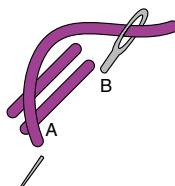

**Rnd 8:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 9–13:** Rep rnd 8.

Using **straight stitch** (see *illustration*), embroider mouth with fuchsia as shown in photo.

**Rnd 18:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnd 19:** Rep rnd 8, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B in last st.

## BODY

**Rnds 20 & 21:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnds 22–37:** Rep rnds 4–19, change color to C in last st.

**Rnds 38 & 39:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnds 40–55:** Rep rnds 4–19, change color to D in last st.

**Rnds 56 & 57:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnds 58–73:** Rep rnds 4–19, change color to E in last st.

**Rnds 74 & 75:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnds 76–89:** Rep rnds 4–17.

**Rnd 90:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in next sc] around. (12 sc)

- Tapestry needle
- 6mm wiggle eyes: 2
- Hot-glue gun
- 1½-inch plastic foam ball
- 2-inch plastic foam ball
- 7mm white pompom (boy)
- Stitch marker



## GAUGE

**Size F hook:** 5 sc = 1 inch

**Size G hook:** 4 sc = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise stated. Use stitch marker to mark rounds.

If making these toys for children under 3 years old, it is recommended that the eyes be embroidered rather than using the plastic wiggle eyes.

## EGG

### BOTTOM

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and MC, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnds 7–10:** Rep rnd 6.

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in each of next 12 sts, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st in each of next 6 sts, working in both lps, sl st in each of rem 12 sts, join with sl st in first sl st, ch 27. Fasten off.

### TOP

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Bottom. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (30 sc)

**Rnds 7–10:** Rep rnd 4.

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in each of next 12 sts, holding Bottom to Top, working in rem **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of Bottom, sl st in each of next 6 sts, working in both lps of rem Top, sl st in each of rem 12 sts, join with sl st in first sl st, ch 27. Fasten off.



## DUCK

### HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and bright yellow, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 5:** Rep rnd 4.

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in next st, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 4, turn crocheted piece inside out and roll onto 1½-inch plastic foam ball.

**Rnd 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] 6 times, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Weave rem length through sts, draw tight to close opening, knot to secure, fasten off.

### BODY

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and bright yellow, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 6:** Rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 7:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 8:** Rep rnd 5, insert 2-inch plastic foam ball.

**Rnd 9:** [Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 10:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] 6 times, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Weave rem length through sts, draw tight to close opening, knot to secure, fasten off.



### WING

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size G hook and bright yellow, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in each of next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Wings to each side of Body between rnds 3–5.

### FEET

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size G hook and pumpkin, ch 2, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, sc in last st, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] twice, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Sew Feet to bottom of Body.

### BEAK

**Row 1:** With size G hook and pumpkin, ch 7, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 4 chs, 3 sc in last ch (*top*), working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 4 chs, 1 sc in same ch as beg 3-sc (*bottom*), sl st to join in first sc. Fasten off.

Fold Beak in half and glue to center front of Head.

Glue wiggle eyes to Head above Beak as shown in photo.

### TAIL

**Row 1:** With size G hook and

bright yellow, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in each of next 4 chs, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Sew Tail to center back of Body.

## BOY DUCK

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and MC, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 6:** Working in front lps, sc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, 2 dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next st. Fasten off. Glue white pompom to center top of Hat.

### SHIRT

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and MC, ch 13, join with sl st in first ch using care not to twist ch, sc in each ch around. (13 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in next st, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] around. (19 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 5 sts. (25 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each of next 4 sts, sk next 5 sts (*armhole opening*), sc in each of next 7 sts, sk next

## MATERIALS

- J. & P. Coats Royale Extra Fine size 30 crochet cotton (500 yds per ball):  
2 balls #201 white
- Size 10/1.15mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Spray starch

## GAUGE

7 rows = 1 inch; 6 sps = 1 inch

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Block:** [Dc in each of next 2 chs, dc in next st] **OR** dc in each of next 3 sts.

**Space (sp):** [Ch 2, sk next 2 sts or ch sp, dc in next st] **OR** ch 5, dc in first dc at **beg** of row **OR** [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3] at **end** of row.

**Corner shell:** (Hdc, dc, 5 tr, dc, hdc) in indicated st or sp.

**Edge shell:** (Hdc, dc, 3 tr, dc, hdc) in indicated st or sp.

## RUNNER

**Row 1:** Ch 182, dc in 8th ch from hook, \*ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (59 ch-2 sps)

**Row 2: Beg sp** (see *Special Stitches*), **block** (see *Special Stitches*) 57 times, **ending sp** (see *Special Stitches*), turn.

**Rows 3 & 4:** Beg sp, block, sp 55 times, block, ending sp, turn.

**Rows 5–260:** Work according to rows 5–260 on chart. At end of last row, fasten off and weave in ends.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join with sl st in sp at top right hand corner of Runner, working across last row of Runner, **corner shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sp as join, \*[ch 3, sk next sp, **edge shell** (see *Special Stitches*)] across to next corner sp, ch 3\*\*, corner shell in next corner sp,

working down side edge, across beg edge and up rem side edge, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join with sl st in top of first hdc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## FINISHING

Block to finished size. **cw**

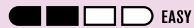

12 inches square

## MATERIALS

- Bernat Satin medium (worsted) weight yarn (3½ oz/200 yds/100g per skein):
  - 4 oz #04420 sea shell
  - 3 oz #04005 snow
  - 2 oz #04423 flamingo
  - 1 oz #04221 soft fern
- Sizes F/5/3.75mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- 12-inch pillow form
- Stitch marker



## GAUGE

**Size I hook:** 5 rows = 1 inch;  
5 sts = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

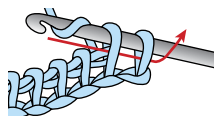
Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise stated. Place stitch marker at end of round.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Work loops off hook (work lps off hook):** Yo, draw through first lp on hook, [yo draw through 2 lps on hook] (see illustration).

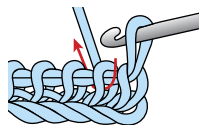


Work Loops Off Hook

**Row 1:** With size I hook, ch 8, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, draw up lp, [insert hook in next ch, yo, draw up a lp] across retaining all lps on hook (8 lps on hook), **work lps off hook** (see *Special Stitches*) across until 1 lp rem on hook, last st counts as first st on next row. (8 sts)

**Rows 2–48:** **Afghan knit st** (see *Special Stitches*) 7 times (8 lps on hook), work lps off hook across until 1 lp rem on hook, last st counts as first st of next row. (8 sts)

At the end of last rep, fasten off.

## CORNER SQUARE

**Make 8.**

**Rows 1–8:** With sea shell, rep rows 1–8 of Panel.

## PANEL SEPARATORS

**Make 12.**

With size I hook and sea shell, ch 49. Fasten off.

## LARGE FLOWER

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and snow, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Working in back lps, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Working in back lps, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. Fasten off. (24 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Working in rem **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) on rnds 2–4, join snow with sl st in first st of rnd 2, [ch 3, sc in next st] around in spiral, continuing to work (ch 3, sc) in both lps of



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each st on outer edge of Flower. Fasten off. (60 sc)

### MEDIUM FLOWER

**Rnds 1–3:** With flamingo, rep rnds 1–3 of Large Flower. Fasten off. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Working in rem front lps on rnds 2 and 3, join flamingo with sl st in first st of rnd 2, [ch 3, sc in next st] around in spiral, continuing to work (ch 3, sc) in both lps of each st on outer edge of Flower. Fasten off. (36 sc)

### LARGE LEAF

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and soft fern, ch 12, dc in 2nd ch from hook, tr in each of next 2 chs, dtr in next ch, tr in next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sc in next ch, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, hdc in each of next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, tr in next ch, dtr in next ch, tr in each of next 2 chs, dc in next ch, join with sl st in first dc. Fasten off. (23 sts)

### MEDIUM LEAF

#### Make 3.

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and soft fern, ch 9, dc in 2nd ch from hook, tr in next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sc in next ch, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, hdc in each of next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, tr in next ch, dc in next ch, join with sl st in first dc. Fasten off. (17 sts)

### SMALL LEAF

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and soft fern, ch 6, dc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next

2 chs, join with sl st in first dc. Fasten off. (11 sts)

### PANEL ASSEMBLY

With size I hook and sea shell, with RS of pieces facing and using photo as a guide for placement, sl st 1 flamingo Panel and 1 Panel Separator tog. Sl st next Panel to Separator. Continue in this manner until all 5 flamingo Panels are assembled.

Rep with snow Panels.

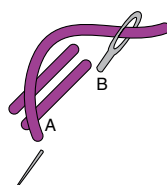
Sl st sea shell Panels on all 4 sides of assembled Pillow Front, working 2 sts in each Panel Separator on both sides.

Sl st Corner Squares in Corners of sea shell border Panels.

Rep to assembled Pillow Back.

### LETTERING

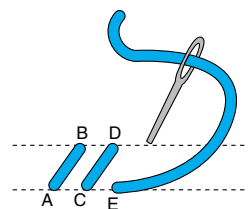
With yarn needle and single strand of yarn, using graph and photo as a guide, **straight stitch** (see illustration) words across Panels, using snow on flamingo Panels for Pillow Front and flamingo on snow Panels for Pillow Back.

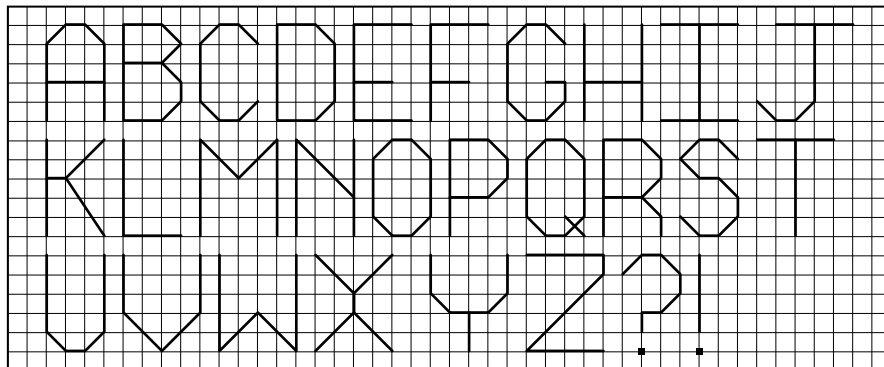

### PILLOW ASSEMBLY

With RS of Pillow Front and Pillow Back facing, with size I hook and sea shell, sl st top and sides of assembled Pillow Front to corresponding sides of assembled Pillow Back, leaving bottom side open.

Insert pillow form into assembled pillow. With yarn needle and sea shell, **whipstitch** (see illustration) bottom of pillow closed. **CW**

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, sc in each of next 6 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 3 times. (24 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] 6 times, sl st loosely in next st. Fasten off, draw tail through and leave marker in place. (30 sc, 1 sl st)

### EMBROIDER FACE

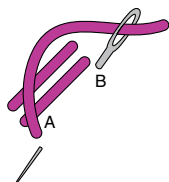
#### Nose

**Row 1 (RS):** With size D hook and C, leaving 24-inch length, ch 2, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

Stitch marker indicates top center of Face. Place Nose RS facing out with beg tail pointing downward on rnd 1 of WS of face. Using beg tail, stitch around edge of Nose attaching to face. Using remainder of tail and **straight stitch** (see illustration), embroider snout line and mouth.



Straight Stitch

Place ½-inch circles of black felt to sides and above Nose/snout on rnds 4–5 of face. Using black embroidery thread and straight stitch, embroider 2 X's across felt to attach firmly to Face.

Trim felt afterward as desired.

With white embroidery thread, make small st between center and outer edge on right side of each black circle.

Bring all loose ends to back of face and weave in or knot to secure.

### BODY

**Note:** Body is worked off last rnd of Face.

**Rnd 1:** With size J hook and A, hold Face with WS (embroidered side) facing, attach yarn to bottom of Face (chin), opposite side from marker, ch 1, working over yarn end, sc in each st around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in each of next 9 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times. (33 sc)

**Rnds 4–8:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 9:** [Sc in each of next 9 sts, sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 3 times. (30 sc)

**Rnd 10:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 11:** [Sc in each of next 8 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times. (27 sc)

**Rnd 12:** [Sc in each of next 7 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times. (24 sc)

Sew Legs and Ears to Body. Ears evenly spaced from top center of rnd 3 of Body. Legs evenly spaced on bottom of Body between rnds 5–7 and rnds 9–11.

**Rnd 13:** [Sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next sts] 4 times. (20 sc)

**Rnd 14:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times. (16 sc)

Stuff Body firmly to create round ball.

**Rnd 15:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times. (12 sc)

**Rnd 16:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times, sc dec in next 3 sts, join with sl st in last st, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Weave rem length through sts of last rnd and tighten snugly. Weave in end.

### FINISHING

Place Tail RS down on back end of Body with base along top of rnd 14, sew in place. **CW**

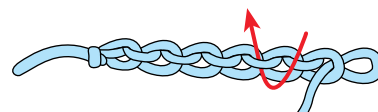

**Rnd 28 [25, 29]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around next fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (144 [136, 152] sts)

**Rnd 29 [26, 30]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as

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last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 2 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (152 [144, 160] sts)

(168 [160, 176] sts)

**Rnd 32 [29, 33]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 5 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (176 [168, 184] sts)

**Rnd 33 [30, 34]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 6 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times,



ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (184 [176, 192] sts)

**Rnd 34 [31, 35]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 7 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (192 [184, 200] sts)

**Rnd 35 [32, 36]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 8 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (200 [192, 208] sts)

**Rnd 36 [33, 37]:** Ch 1, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*[hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st] 15 [14, 16] times, hdc with fp inc in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made, fphdc around each of next 9 fphdc\*\*, hdc dec in same st as last st and

in next st, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-1. (208 [200, 216] sts)

**Rnd 37 [34, 38]:** Ch 1, hdc in each st around, join in top of beg ch-1. Do not fasten off. Draw up long lp, drop lp from hook.

### BRIM EDGING

Flatten Brim and pin to blocking board to measure circumference. Cut the nylon line to circumference plus 1 inch. Make circle with the nylon line, overlap ends 1 inch. Tape ends together with fabric tape or wrap with sewing thread to hold in position. Place nylon line circle over rnd 37 of Brim.

**Rnd 1:** Place lp on hook, ch 1, working over nylon line, hdc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*hdc dec in same st as last hdc of hdc dec just made and in next st, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-1.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st in each st around, join in both lps of beg ch-1. Fasten off and weave in ends.

### FINISHING

Block Brim if desired. **CW**

### ROOF

#### Make 4.

**Row 1:** With royal, ch 7, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (5 dc)

**Row 2: Ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in same dc as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 dc, leaving last dc unworked, turn. (5 dc)

**Row 3:** Sl st in 2nd dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (5 dc)

**Row 4:** Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 dc, leaving last dc unworked, turn. (6 dc)

**Row 5:** Sl st in 2nd dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, leaving last dc unworked turn. (5 dc)

**Row 6:** Rep row 4. (6 dc)

**Row 7:** Rep row 3. (5 dc)

**Row 8:** Rep row 4. Fasten off. (6 dc)

### HEART

**Rnd 1:** With cherry, ch 4, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in 4th ch

from hook to form ring, ch 3, 2 dc in ring, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1) 3 times in ring, join in 3rd ch of ch-3. (12 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next dc, ch 3, 5 dc in same dc as beg ch-3, sc in next dc, sl st in next ch-1 sp (*center top of Heart between lobes*), sc in next dc, 6 dc in next dc, sc in next dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in each of next 3 dc, 3 sc in next ch-1 sp (*center bottom tip of Heart*), sc in each of next 3 dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

### HANGING LOOP

**Row 1:** With royal, ch 10, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 dc)

**Rows 2–7:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. (8 dc)

**Row 8:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, turn. (6 dc)

**Row 9:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, turn. (6 dc)

**Row 10:** Ch 3, [yo, insert hook in next dc, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 5 times, yo, draw through all 6 lps on hook, ch 1 to lock, fasten off.

### FINISHING

**Note:** *Roof pieces and Heart can be sewn or glued in place.*

Place Roof pieces over peak on Birdhouse so that the 2 pieces bend inward toward center. Make sure they fit down over Birdhouse approximately ¼-inch. Overlap tops slightly so that they are the width of the hanging lp when overlapped. Rep process on back of Birdhouse and glue pieces tog with Birdhouse sandwiched between the 2 sets of Roof pieces. Leave top area across top open for sewing Hanging Loop to top of Birdhouse. With RS facing, glue Heart to center of the Birdhouse.

Sew opposite side of foundation ch of Hanging Loop to top of Roof. Sew button centered on front of row 2 of Hanging Loop. With pinking shears, cut kitchen towel in half. Fold raw edge under ¼ inch and press in place. With sewing needle and thread, sew along pressed edge. Gather along hemmed edge so that edge is same width as bottom of the Birdhouse. Sew towel to bottom edge of Birdhouse. **cw**

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 5 & 6:** Sc in each st around. At the end of rnd 6, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. Sew Muzzle to front of Head

stuffing with fiberfill as work progresses.

### EAR

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With black, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

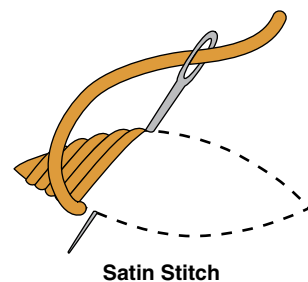
**Rnd 2:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (9 sc)

**Row 2: Ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), **fphdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 7 sts, 3 fpdc around next st, fpdc around each of next 7 sts, fphdc around each of last 2 sts, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (21 sts)

Sew Beard to face with ends under each Ear.

### MUSTACHE

With white, [ch 4, dc in 4th ch from hook] twice. Fasten off. Sew center of Mustache just below Nose.

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** With cherry red, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (9 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (15 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 8:** [Sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 9:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 10:** [Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (21 sc)

**Rnd 11:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 12:** [Sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 14:** [Sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (27 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 16:** [Sc in each of next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 17:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 18:** [Sc in each of next 9 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (33 sc)

**Rnd 19:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 20:** [Sc in each of next 10 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (36 sc)

**Rnds 21–23:** Rep rnd 3. At the end of rnd 23, sl st in next st, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Hat to top of Head.

### BELT

With coffee, ch 50, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across. Fasten off.

### BUCKLE

With gold, ch 5, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in last ch. Fasten off. Place Belt around Body just above Jacket Trim. Weave each end of Belt through gold buckle. **CW**

### BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join blue jewel in any center corner sc on outer edge, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), work 115 hdc across top and bottom of afghan and 170 hdc on each side counting the (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in each center corner sc in the total, join in beg ch-2.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, work (dc, ch 3, dc) in each corner ch-2 sp, [dc in each of next 4 hdc, ch 1, sk next hdc] around (do not ch-1 before and after each corner), adjust as needed before and after each corner to reach the corner you may need more or fewer than 4 to reach the corner, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, (dc, ch 3, dc) in each corner ch-3 sp, dc in each dc and each ch-1 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 dc, **picot** (see *Special Stitch*)] around, adjusting to work picot in each corner ch-3 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

**Rnd 2:** Join snow in any st, ch 2, (hdc, ch 2, sl st) in same st as beg ch-2, \***med petal** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, rep from \* around. Leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off. (6 med petals)

### SMALL DAISY

**Make 1 [2] each taupe, lime & maize.**

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and maize or lime, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Join snow in any st, ch 1, (sc, ch 1, sl st) in same st as beg ch-1, \*sm petal in next st, rep from \* around. Leaving a 6-inch length, fasten off. (6 sm petals)

### HAT BAND TRIM

Alternating colors and overlapping as necessary, sew Medium and Small Daisies over rnds 8–10 [10–14] of Sunhat.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in top of first sc. (34 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same st beg ch-1, sc in each of next 12 sc, \***sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, sc in next sc, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of next 9 sc, join in first sc. (30 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of the next

11 sc, \*sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in next sc, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of the next 6 sc, join in first sc. (26 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 11 sc, \*sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* twice, sc in each of next 5 sc, join in first sc. (23 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, sc in the same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 10 sc, ch 5, sk next 7 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, join in first sc.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in same st beg ch-1, sc in each of next 10 sc, sc in each of next 5 chs, sc in each of next 5 sc, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends. (21 sc)

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and maize, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Join black with sc in same st as joining, ch 2, sk next st, [sc in next st, ch 2, sk next st] around, join in first st. (18 sc, 18 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in same ch-2 sp, (sc, hdc) in next ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp (*first corner*), (hdc, 2 sc) in next ch-2 sp, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, (sc, hdc, dc) in next ch-2 sp, (2 tr, ch 3, 2 tr) in next ch-2 sp (*2nd corner*), (dc, hdc) in next ch-2 sp, (hdc, sc) in next ch-2 sp, (sc, hdc) in next ch-2 sp, (hdc, dc) in next ch-2 sp, (2 tr, ch 3, 2 tr)

## ASSEMBLY

With black, using care that all hearts are placed in the same direction, working through **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of rnd 7, sew Motifs tog forming 11 vertical strips of 14 Motifs, sew strips tog.



## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join black with sc in center sc of corner at top left, 2 sc in same st, sc in each st across top edge, [3 sc in center corner sc, sc in each st across edge] 3 times, join in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in same sc as joining, **picot** (see *Special Stitches*), sk next sc, [sc in next sc, picot, sk next sc] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. **cw**

**Rnd 3:** Join white in 3rd ch of any ch-5 sp, (**ch 6**—see *Pattern Notes*, dc, ch 3, dc) in same ch-5 sp as first sl st, \*({dc, ch 3} twice, dc) in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (18 ch-3 sps)

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Rep rnds 4 and 5 of White 3-Side Join Motif.

## ASSEMBLY

Work Motifs as shown in **Assembly Diagram** (see illustration).

## PETAL EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Join white in first ch sp of 9 ch sps on Corner Motif, **ch 6** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 3, dc) in same ch sp as beg ch-6, \*[(dc, ch 3} twice, dc) in next ch sp] 8 times, [tr in next Motif join, ({dc, ch 3} twice, dc) in each of next 6 ch sps] 6 times, tr in next Motif join\*\*, ({dc, ch 3} twice, dc) in next ch sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (540 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in same ch sp as join, ch 6, dc in same ch sp as beg ch-6, (dc, ch 3, dc) in each ch-3 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

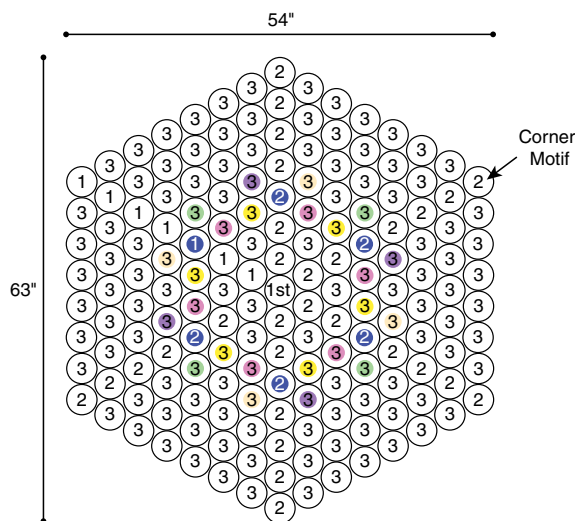
**Rnd 3:** Sl st in same ch sp as join, **ch 7** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same ch sp as beg ch-7, (dc, ch 4, dc) in each ch-3 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-7.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in same ch sp as join, ch 1, sc in same ch sp as join, ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp, \*({3-tr cl—see *Special Stitches*,



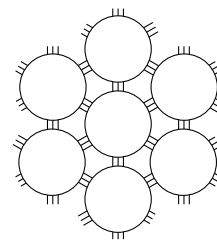

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in first ch-4 sp, \*(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in first ch-4 sp on next Petal, (sc, ch 3, sc, ch 5, sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-4 sp on same Petal, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in 3rd ch-4 sp of same Petal\*\*, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in each of next 3 ch-4 sps, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in each of next 2 ch-4 sps, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Joining Diagram

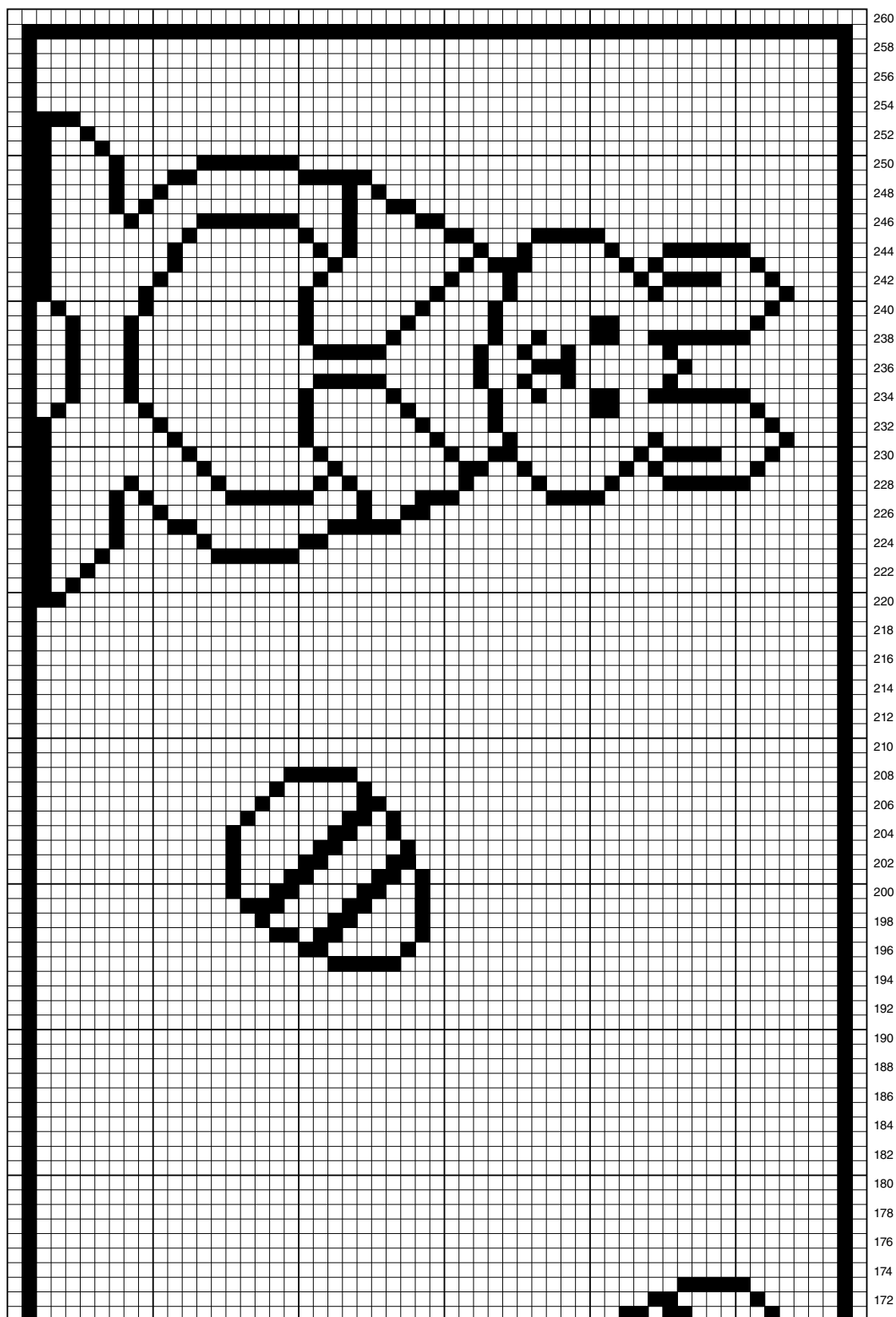

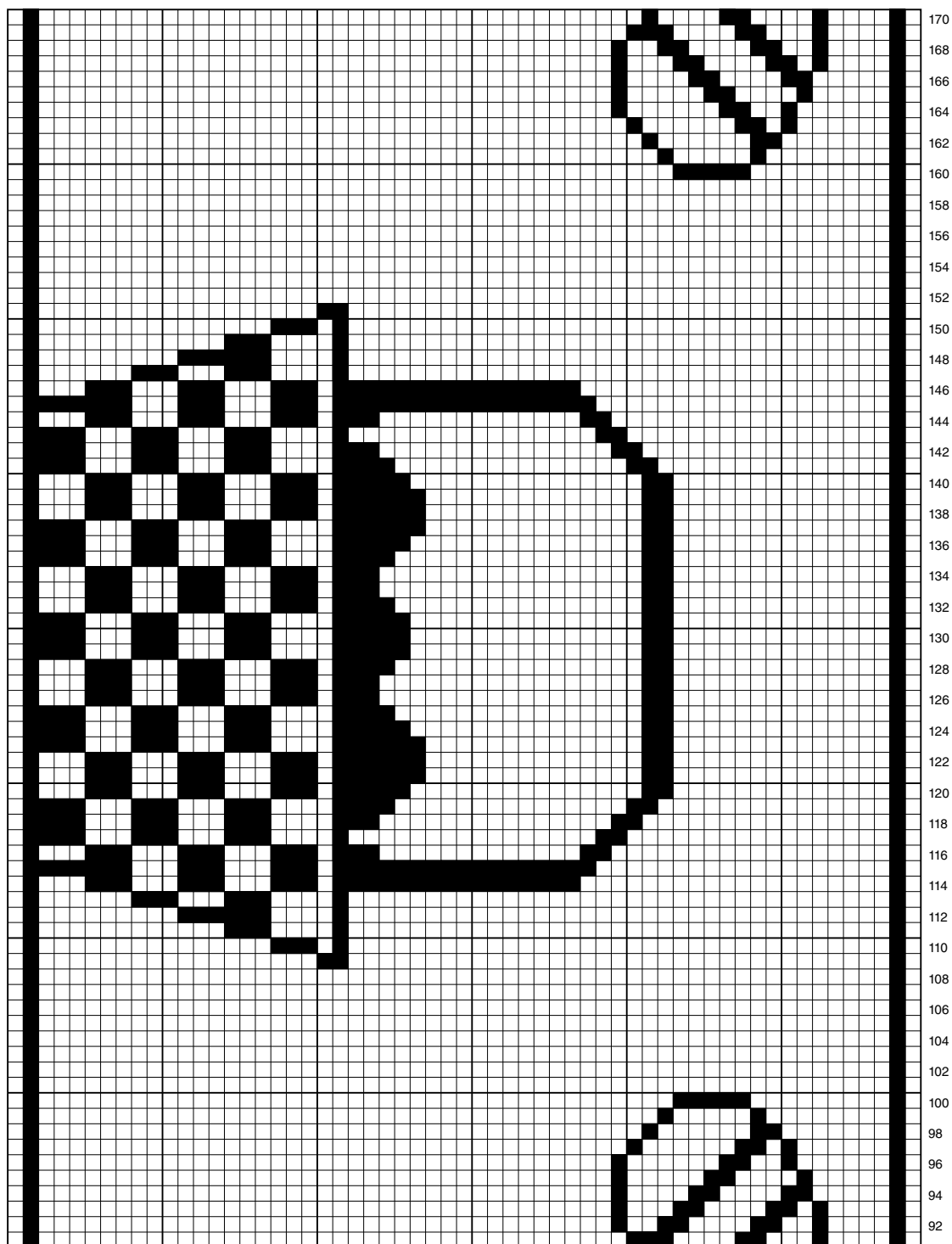

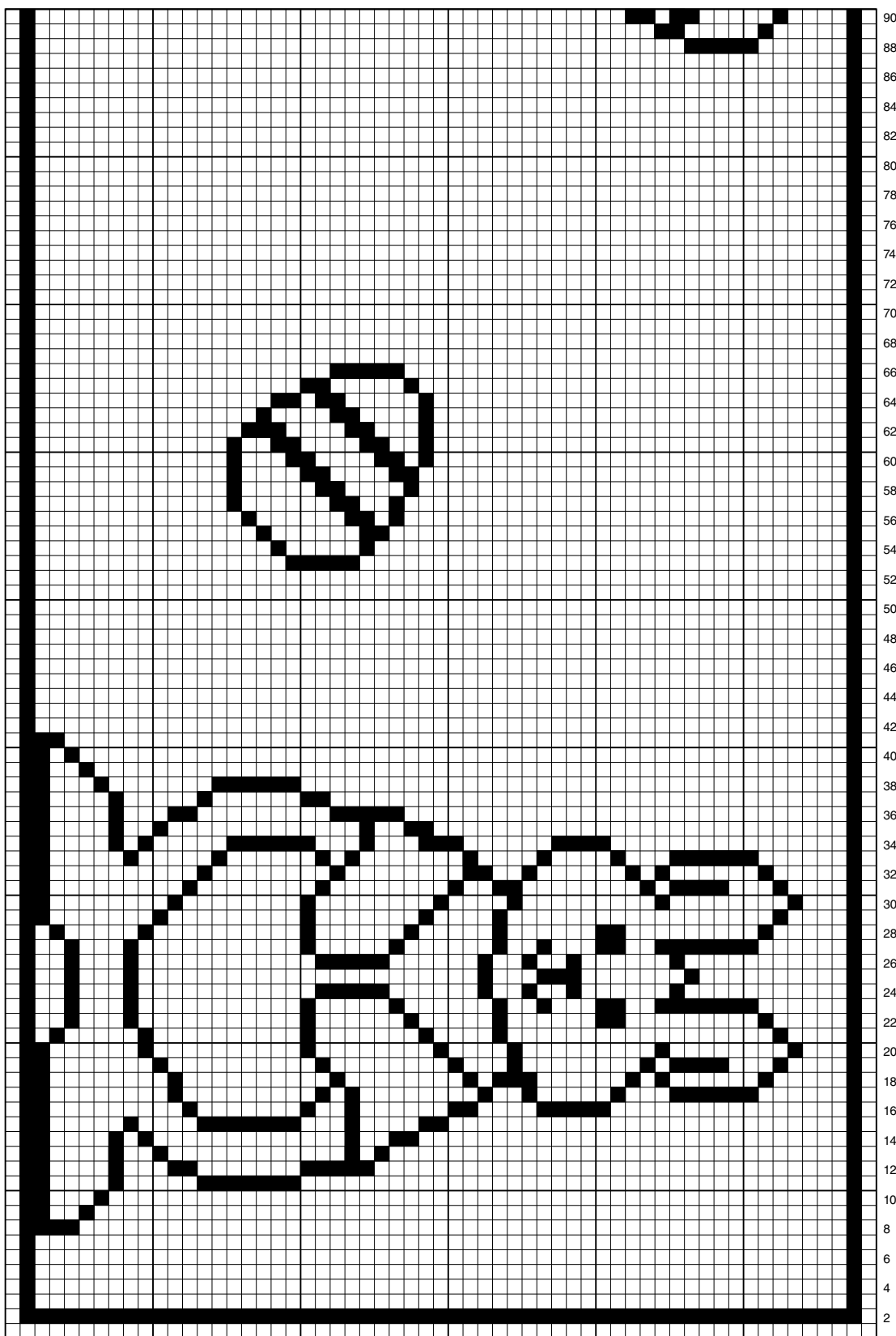

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. Fasten off. (29 sc)

Place outfit on Boy Duck. Insert duck in Egg, tie ends in a bow at center front.

## GIRL DUCK

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and MC, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place st marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 5:** Rep rnd 4, sl st in next sc.

**Rnd 6:** [Ch 3, sl st in next st] around, ending with sl st in base of beg ch-3.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sl st in next ch-3 sp] around, ending with sl st in same st as beg ch-3. At the end of rnd 8, fasten off.

Starting at center back, weave length of white through sc of rnd 4, tie ends in a bow.

### SKIRT

**Rnd 1:** Beg at waistline with size F hook and MC, ch 27, sl st to join in first ch, taking care not to twist ch, sc in each ch around. (27 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in next sc, [ch 3, sl st in next sc] around. Fasten off.

### BIB

**Row 1:** With size F hook, join MC at center front of Skirt in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, sc in same ch, sc in each of next 6 chs, turn. (7 sc)

**Rows 2 & 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, ch 13, sl st in first st of row 4. Fasten off.

Beg at center front of Skirt, weave length of white through sts of rnd 1, tie in a bow at center front.

Place outfit on Girl Duck. Insert duck in Egg, tie ends in a bow at center front. **CW**

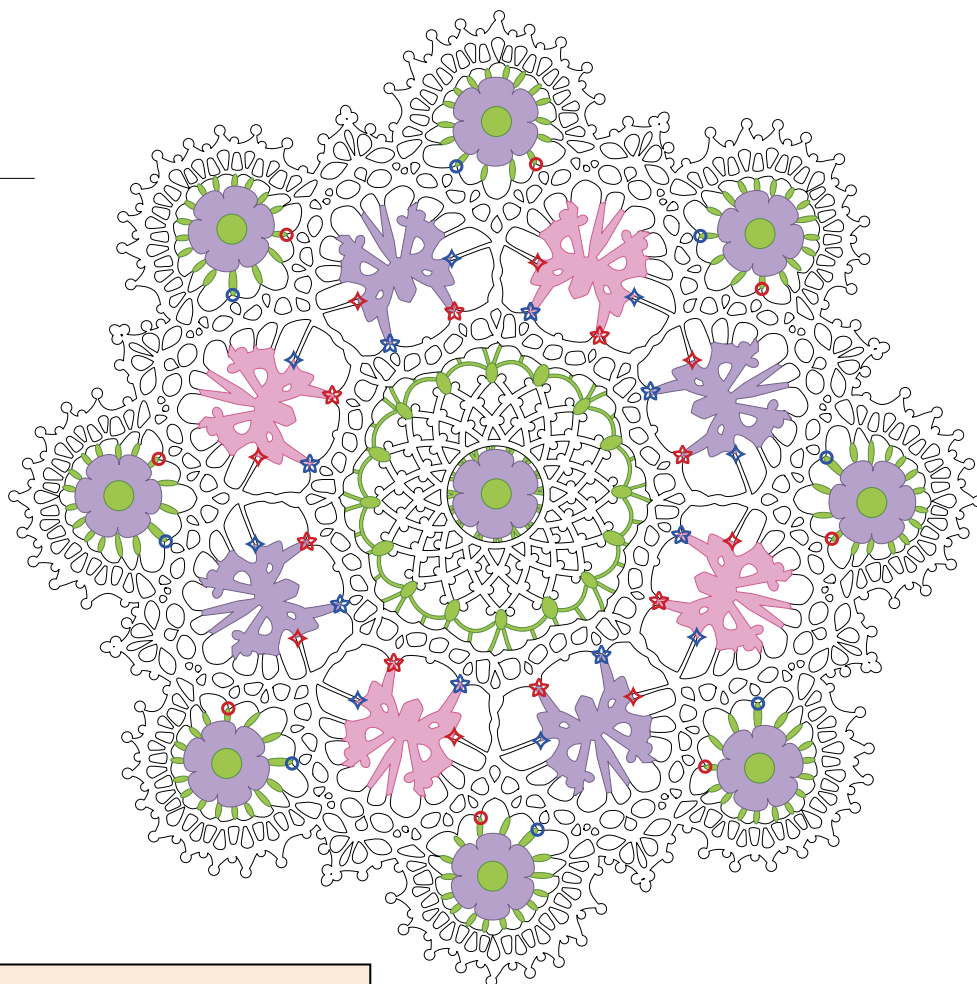

ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, [(2 sc, ch-3 picot, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp] twice, (3 sc, triple picot, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch-3 picot, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp] twice, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

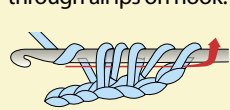

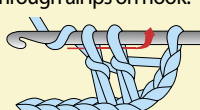

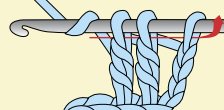
