**INTERMEDIATE**

45 x 60 inches

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight yarn (solids: 7 oz/ 364 yds/198g per skein; prints: 5 oz/244 yds 141g per skein):
  - 22 oz #886 blue (A)
  - 7 oz #316 soft white (B)
  - 4 oz #324 bright yellow (C)
  - 3 oz #994 banana berry print (D)



- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

Motif rnds 1 and 2 = 4 inches

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch  
unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain 2 unless otherwise stated.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 2, dc) in indicated st.

## MOTIF

### Make 12.

**Rnd 1:** With C, ch 10, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch, ch 1, 24 sc in ring, join in first sc. (24 sc)

**Rnd 2:** \*Ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in next ch, sk next sc, sl st in each of next 2 sc, rep from \* 7 times, sl st to base of first ch-5. Fasten off. (8 sun rays)

**Rnd 3:** Starting at top of any point with A, join with sl st, [ch 5, sl st in top of next point] around. (48 sts)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (48 dc)

**Rnd 5:** Join C with sl st in last dc of previous rnd, sl st in each of next 4 dc, \*ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in next ch, sk next dc of rnd 4\*\*, sl st in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, sl st in first sl st. Fasten off. (8 sun rays, 8 sl-st sections)

**Rnd 6:** Join B with sl st at top of any point, ch 2, working in dc

sts of rnd 4 behind sl sts of rnd 5, tr in each of next 4 sts, \*ch 2, sl st in top of point of rnd 5\*\*, ch 2, working in dc sts of rnd 4 behind sl sts of rnd 5, tr in each of next 4 sts, rep from \* around, ending at \*\*, join in top of beg point. (72 sts)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, \*sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, tr in next st, ch 2, tr in next st, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st (*corner formed*), sc in each of next 10 sts, rep from \* 3 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 8:** Join A with sl st in any corner ch-2 sp, (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, \*dc in each st across to next corner ch-2 sp\*\*, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (96 dc, 4 corner ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 9:** Join D with sl st in any corner ch-2 sp, **ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 2) twice and dc in same sp, sk each of next 2 dc, **V-st** (see *Special Stitch*) in next dc, \*[sk each of next 2 dc, V-st in

## Meet the Winner

### Dee Dee Segal

My name is Dee Dee Segal, and I have been crocheting for approximately 40 years. My mother taught me to crochet as a child, and she never went anywhere without a crochet hook—she still doesn't. I have also recently taught my daughter the art of crochet, so we are now a three-generation family of crochet artisans. I was inspired to create this nautical piece with its yellow suns in the center of each square with a blue moon surrounding them after returning from a Mexican cruise. I hope you enjoy making this piece as much as I did designing and creating it, and that it inspires you as well.



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# Chain-Stitch Dog Leash

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ BEGINNER

## FINISHED SIZE

36 inches long

## MATERIALS

- Pepperell Braiding Co. Amy Cord macramé 2mm braided nylon (25 yds per hank):
  - 1 hank each 3 desired colors (*model used royal, sky and sunshine*)
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- ¾-inch dog-leash spring snap

## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

## LEASH

**Make 1 each color.**

**Row 1:** Leaving long tail at beg, make ch approximately 55 inches long. Fasten off, leaving rem length as long tail.

Tie the 3 beg tails tog in loose knot. Braid ch strands tog until Leash is 46 inches long or 10 inches longer than desired length (*add more ch sts or take away ch sts as needed*).

Fold bottom 7 inches of leash up to form handle and sew in place. Untie beg knot, pull top 3 inches of Leash through spring-snap opening and sew in place. **CW**

# Lucy Shell & Cowl

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ □ INTERMEDIATE

## FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size 32–34-inch bust (*small*); changes for 36–38-inch bust (*medium*), 40–42-inch bust (*large*), 44–46-inch bust (*X-large*) and 48–50-inch bust (*2X-large*) are in [ ].

## FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

**Bust:** 32 [36, 40, 44, 48] inches  
**Waist:** 25 [28, 32, 36, 40] inches  
**Hips:** 35 [38, 42, 46, 52] inches

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart LusterSheen fine (sport) weight (4 oz/ 335 yds/113g per skein): 3 [4, 4, 5, 5] skeins #7 vanilla
- Sizes F/5/3.75 (*Shell*) and G/6/4mm (*Cowl*) crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers



## GAUGE

**Shell:** Size F hook: Double V-st = 1 inch; 4 rows = 1¾ inches; double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st = 1½ inches; 2 pattern rows = 1 inch

Take time to check gauge.

**Cowl:** Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTE

Chain-4 counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Double V-stitch (double V-st):** ([Dc, ch 1] twice, dc) in indicated place.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated place.

## SHELL

### FRONT

**Row 1 (RS):** Beg at bottom edge, ch 92 [104, 116, 122, 134], sc in 2nd ch from hook, \*sk next 2 chs, **double V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 2: Ch 4** (see *Pattern Note*), dc in first sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last sc, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in last sc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*double V-st in next sc\*\*, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

**Rows 4–11 [4–11, 4–13, 4–13, 4–15]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 4 [4, 5, 5, 6] times.

### Waist Shaping

**Row 12 [12, 14, 14, 16]:** Ch 2, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 13 [13, 15, 15, 17]:** Ch 4, sk first dc, dc in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st,

\*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last sc, V-st in last sc, turn.

**Row 14 [14, 16, 16, 18]:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*double V-st in next sc\*\*, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

**Rows 15 & 16 [15 & 16, 17 & 18, 17 & 18, 19 & 20]:** Rep rows 12 and 13 [12 and 13, 14 and 15, 14 and 15, 16 and 17].

**Row 17 [17, 19, 19, 21]:** Rep row 3.

**Row 18 [18, 20, 20, 22]:** Rep row 2.

### Bust Shaping

**Row 19 [19, 21, 21, 23]:** Ch 4, V-st in first sc, \*sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, double V-st in next sc\*\*, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, turn.

**Row 20 [20, 22, 22, 24]:** Ch 4, dc in first st, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last V-st, sc in 2nd dc of next V-st, V-st in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

**Row 21 [21, 23, 23, 25]:** Rep row 3.

**Rows 22 & 23 [22 & 23, 24 & 25, 24 & 25, 26 & 27]:** Rep rows 19 and 20 [19 and 20, 21 and 22, 21 and 22, 23 and 24].

**Row 24 [24, 26, 26, 28]:** Rep row 3.

***A semisolid shell stitch  
and gentle waist shaping  
give this top a relaxed,  
lacy design and smooth,  
flattering lines.  
A removable cowl  
is optional.***





**Rows 25–28 [25–28, 27–30, 27–32, 29–34]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 2 [2, 2, 3, 3] times.

### Armhole Shaping

**Row 29 [29, 31, 33, 35]:** Rep row 12 [12, 14, 14, 16].

**Row 30 [30, 32, 34, 36]:** Ch 2, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last st, dc in last st, turn.

**Row 31 [31, 33, 35, 37]:** Ch 4, dc in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd ch of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, dc and sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Rows 32–37 [32–37, 34–39, 36–41, 38–43]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 [3, 3, 3, 3] times.

### Size Small Only

**Row 38:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of 5th and 9th reps.

### Size Medium Only

**Row [38]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [6th] and [12th] reps.

### Size Large Only

**Row [40]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [7th] and [13th] reps.

### Size X-Large Only

**Row [42]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [7th] and [14th] reps.

### Size 2X-Large Only

**Row [44]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [8th] and [15th] reps.

### Neck & Shoulder Shaping

#### All Sizes

#### First Shoulder

**Note:** Work across the first 5 [5, 6, 6, 7] reps.

**Row 39 [39, 41, 43, 45]:** Rep

row 3, ending with sc in first marked dc, remove marker, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Row 40 [40, 42, 44, 46]:** Ch 2, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last st, V-st in last st, turn.

**Row 41 [41, 43, 45, 47]:** Rep row 3, ending with sc in middle dc of last double V-st, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Row 42 [42, 44, 46, 48]:** Rep row 40 [40, 42, 44, 46].

**Row 43 [43, 45, 47, 49]:** Rep row 3, ending with sc in middle dc of last double V-st, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Rows 44 & 45 [44 & 45, 46 & 47, 48 & 49, 50 & 51]:** Rep rows 2 and 3. Fasten off.

### 2nd Shoulder

**Note:** Work across the last 5 [5, 6, 6, 7] reps.

Turn work so that completed Shoulder is on the right.

**Row 39 [39, 41, 43, 45]:** Join yarn in marked dc on last row of Armhole Shaping, rep row 3.

**Row 40 [40, 42, 44, 46]:** Rep row 2 across, ending with sc in 2nd dc of last double V-st, turn.

**Row 41 [41, 43, 45, 47]:** Ch 2, sc in middle dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc\*\*, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

**Row 42 [42, 44, 46, 48]:** Rep row 2 across, ending with sc in



2nd dc of next double V-st, leave rem sts unworked, turn.

**Row 43 [43, 45, 47, 49]:** Rep row 41 [41, 43, 45, 47].

**Row 44 [44, 46, 48, 50]:** Rep row 2.

**Row 45 [45, 47, 49, 51]:** Rep row 3. Fasten off.

### BACK

**Rows 1–37 [1–37, 1–39, 1–41, 1–43]:** Rep rows 1–37 [1–37, 1–39, 1–41, 1–42] of Front.

**Rows 38–43 [38–43, 40–45, 42–47, 43–49]:** Continue in pattern.

### Size Small Only

**Row 44:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of 4th and 12th reps.

### Size Medium Only

**Row [44]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [4th] and [14th] reps.

### Size Large Only

**Row [46]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [5th] and [15th] reps.

### Size X-Large Only

**Row [48]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [5th] and [16th] reps.

### Size 2X-Large Only

**Row [50]:** Rep row 2, placing marker in 2nd dc of [6th] and [17th] reps.

## Neck & Shoulder Shaping

### All Sizes

#### First Shoulder

**Row 45 [45, 47, 49, 51]:** Rep row 3, ending with sc in marked st. Fasten off.

#### 2nd Shoulder

Turn work so that completed Shoulder is on the right.

**Row 45 [45, 47, 49, 51]:** Join in marked dc, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, continue in st pattern across. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Sew side and Shoulder seams.

### Armhole Edging

With RS facing, join yarn at underarm seam, sc evenly sp around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### Neck Edging

With RS facing you, join yarn at Shoulder seam, sc evenly sp around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### Bottom Edging

With RS facing, join yarn at side seam, sc evenly sp around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## COWL

**Row 1:** Beg at bottom edge, ch 122 [122, 134, 134, 134], sc in 2nd ch from hook, \*sk next 2 chs, **double V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 2: Ch 4** (see *Pattern Note*), dc in first sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across to last sc, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*), turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*double V-st in next sc, sc in 2nd dc of next double V-st, rep from \* across.

**Rows 4 & 5:** Rep rows 2 and 3.

**Rows 6–15:** With size G hook, rep rows 2 and 3. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

## FINISHING

Fold Cowl in half widthwise. Sew ends of rows tog.

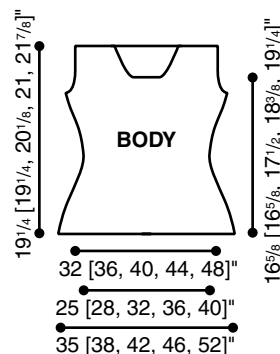
### Bottom Edging

Join yarn at seam, sc evenly sp around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### Top Edging

Join yarn at seam, sl st evenly around, join to first sl st. Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. **cw**



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# Stars!

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ □ □ EASY

## FINISHED SIZE

4¼ inches in diameter from point to point

## MATERIALS

- Omega Nylon Metallic size 3 crochet nylon (196 yds per spool):
  - 1 spool each #61 white-silver, #72 royal-silver and #78 red gold
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook
- Stitch marker

## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Do not join unless otherwise stated.

Place marker at end of each round.

## SPECIAL STITCH

### Long single crochet (lng sc):

Insert hook in designated st or row, pull up long lp, yo, pull through both lps on hook.

## STAR

### Center

**Rnd 1:** Ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (5 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 3 sc in each st around. (15 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 3 sc in next st] 5 times. (25 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] 5 times. (30 sc)

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] 5 times. (35 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st] 5 times. (40 sc)

### First Point

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in each of next 7 sts. Leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 7 sts, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 6 sts, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 5 sts, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 4 sts, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 2 sts, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sk first st, sc in next st, turn.

**Row 9 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in next st, **do not turn**.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, working in ends of rows, sc in end of each row across to Center.

### Points 2–4

**Row 1 (RS):** Sc in each of next 8 sts on Center, turn.

**Rows 2–10:** Rep rows 2–10 of First Point.

### Point 5

**Row 1 (RS):** Rep row 1 of Points 2–4.

**Rows 2–9:** Rep rows 2–9 of First Point.

### Border

**Rnd 1:** Now working in sc and in ends of rows around Points, ch 1, \*sc across to valley between Points, **lng sc** (see *Special Stitch*) in Center ring, sc across to last row of next Point\*\*, ch 1, rep from \* around to last row of last Point, ending last rep at \*\*, ch 10 (*hanging lp*), join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. **CW**

# Sand Dollars

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

## FINISHED SIZE

12 x 31 inches

## MATERIALS

- J. & P. Coats Royale Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (400 yds per ball):  
3 balls #226 natural
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Safety pin

## GAUGE

Motif = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Each Motif requires 34 yards of cotton.

Chain-3 at beginning of rounds counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in indicated sp.

## MOTIF

### Make 19.

**Rnd 1:** Leaving 1-inch length at beg, ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 6th ch from hook to form ring, hold beg length behind ring and working over beg length until gone, ch 1, 12 sc in ring, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc, draw up lp, remove hook. Place safety pin in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of first sc of rnd 2, pick up dropped lp. (24 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 12, sc in each of next 4 sc] 5 times, ch 12, sc in each of next 3 sc, join in beg sc. (6 ch-12 sps, 24 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, [(8 sc, ch 3, 8 sc) in next ch-12 sp, sk next sc of rnd 3, sc in each of next 2 sc, sk next sc of rnd 3] 6 times, join in first sc.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 8 sc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 8 sc, sk next 2 sc] 6 times. Fasten off.

**Rnd 6:** Working in back lps of rnd 2, join cotton in st marked with safety pin, remove pin, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 23 sts, join in beg sc. (24 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3] around, join in beg sc. (24 sc, 24 ch-3 sps)



**Rnd 8:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each rem ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-1, ch 4, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 4] around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 10:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in same ch-4 sp as beg ch-1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in each rem ch-4 sp around, join in beg sc.

**Note:** For ease in joining, if rnd 5 seems twisted slightly, lightly steam-press piece flat.

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, \*holding rnds 5 and 10 tog, working through both thicknesses of ch-3 sp of rnd 5 and ch-4 sp of rnd 10, ch 1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in both sps, ch 2, [working in ch-4 sp of rnd 10 only, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-4 sp, ch 2] 3 times, rep from \* around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 12:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, (**ch 3**—see *Pattern Notes*, dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in same ch-4 sp as first sl st, sc in next ch-2 sp, [**shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

**Note:** Shells are aligned directly above 6 joined points.

## 1-POINT MOTIF JOIN

**Rnds 1–11:** Rep rnds 1–11 of First Motif.

**Rnd 12:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in same ch-4 sp as first sl st, sc in next ch-2

sp, [shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] 3 times, 2 dc in next joining ch-4 sp of rnd 11, ch 1, sl st in adjacent ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 dc in same ch-4 sp on current Motif, sc in next ch-2 sp, [shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

## 2-POINT MOTIF JOIN

**Rnds 1–11:** Rep rnds 1–11 of First Motif.

**Rnd 12:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in same ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, \*[shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] 3 times, 2 dc in next joining ch-4 sp of rnd 11, ch 1, sl st in adjacent ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 dc in same ch-4 sp on working Motif, sc in next ch-2 sp\*, rep from \* to \* once, [shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off.

## 3-POINT MOTIF JOIN

**Rnds 1–11:** Rep rnds 1–11 of First Motif.

**Rnd 12 (joining rnd):** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in same ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, \*[shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] 3 times, 2 dc in next joining ch-4 sp of rnd 11, ch 1, sl st in adjacent ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 dc in same ch-4 sp on working Motif, sc in next ch-2 sp\*, rep from \* to \* twice, [shell in next ch-4 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Work Motifs as shown in Assembly Diagram. When working joining rnd, make sure that joining is worked adjacent to the ch-4 join on previous Motif.

## BORDER

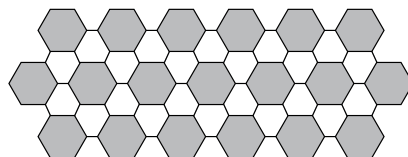
**Rnd 1:** Join cotton in first unworked ch-3 sp on end Motif, ch 1, (sc, ch 5, sc) in same ch-3

- 16 standard-size plastic shopping bags: cut in 1-inch-wide strips, approximately 300 yds
- Sizes G/6/4mm and L/11/8mm crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



### GAUGE

**Size G hook:** 6 rows = 4 inches; 17 sts = 4 inches

**Size L hook:** 6 rnds = 4 inches

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### BASE

**Row 1:** With size L hook and 1 strand each ocean and plastic held tog, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7 sc)

**Rows 3 & 4:** Rep row 2. (11 sc)

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 6 & 7:** Rep row 2. (15 sc)

**Row 8:** Rep row 5.

**Row 9:** Rep row 2. (17 sc)

**Row 10:** Rep row 5.

**Row 11:** Rep row 2. (19 sc)

**Rows 12–20:** Rep row 5.

**Row 21:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, sk next sc, sc in each sc across until 2 sc rem, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (17 sc)

**Row 22:** Rep row 5.

**Rows 23–26:** [Rep rows 21 and 5 alternately] twice. (13 sc)

**Rows 27–30:** Rep row 21. (5 sc)

**Rnd 31:** Now working in rnds, ch 1, work 68 sc sts evenly sp around outer edge of Base, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc.

**Do not fasten off.** (68 sc)

### BODY

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each st around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, sk next sc, 3 dc in next sc, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, sk next sc, 3 dc in next sc, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc. (17 3-dc groups, 17 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, 2 dc

in same sc as beg ch-3, sc in center dc of next 3-dc group, [3 dc in next sc, sc in center dc of next 3-dc group] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in next dc, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, 3 dc in next sc, [sc in center dc of next 3-dc group, 3 dc in next sc] around, join in beg sc.

**Rnds 5–24:** [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] 10 times.

**Rnd 25:** Ch 1, sc in each sc and each dc around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

### POCKET & HANDLE

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size G hook and ocean, ch 32, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [sk next ch, 3 dc in next ch, sk next ch, sc in next ch] 7 times, sk next ch, 2 dc in next ch, turn. (8 sc, 23 dc)

**Rows 2–24:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, sk next dc, [3 dc in next sc, sc in center dc of next 3-dc group] 7 times, 2 dc in last sc, turn.

**Row 25:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 dc, sc in next sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (3 sc)

**Rows 26–160:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sc, turn.

**Rnd 161:** Now working in rnds, work along long side of outer edge of Handle and Pocket, sl st in end of each sc row and 2 sl sts in side of each dc row to bottom of Pocket, sl st in each ch of

  - 50 yds #494 victory red (C)
  - 50 yds #423 maize (D)
  - 20 yds #310 copper mist (E)
  - 10 yds #622 kerry green (F)
- Size 8/1.50mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle
- Green sewing thread
- Spray starch (*optional*)

## GAUGE

9 dc rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Triple treble (tr tr):** Yo 4 times, insert hook in indicated st or sp, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps] 5 times.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in top of last st made.

**Beginning double crochet shell (beg dc shell):** (Ch 5—counts as first dc and ch-2 sp, {dc, ch 2} 4 times) in indicated st or sp.

**Double crochet shell (dc shell):** (Dc, ch 2) 5 times in indicated st or sp.

**Treble crochet shell (tr shell):** (Tr, ch 2) 5 times in indicated st or sp.

**Beginning scallop (beg scallop):** (Ch 8—counts as first dtr and ch-3, {dtr, ch 3} 4 times) in indicated st or sp.

**Scallop:** (Dtr, ch 3) 5 times in indicated st or sp.

**Starfish arm:** Ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, picot, ch 3, sl st in same ch as last dc made, ch 3, sl st in ring.

**Right-hand Sail join:** Ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, with RS of Doily facing, sl st in first ch-3 of Sail Edging at bottom of Sail to right, ch 1, sl st in top of last dc, ch 3, sl st in same ch as last dc made, ch 3, sl st in ring.

**Starfish join:** Ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, with RS of Doily facing, sk bottom 2 Starfish arms, sl st in picot at end of next Starfish arm, ch 1, sl st in top of last dc, ch 3, sl st in same ch as last dc made, ch 3, sl st in ring.

**Left-hand Sail join:** Ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, with RS of Doily

facing, sl st in first ch-3 of Sail Edging at bottom of Sail to left, ch 1, sl st in top of last dc, ch 3, sl st in same ch as last dc made, ch 3, sl st in ring.

**Border scallop:** (Dtr, ch 2) 5 times in indicated st or sp.

## DOILY Center

**Rnd 1:** With E, ch 7, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in 7th ch from hook to form ring, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), 17 dc in ring, join in top of beg ch-3. (18 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 4, [dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 4] 5 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (18 dc, 6 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 3 [dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 3, dc in ch-4 sp, ch 3] 5 times, join in top of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, 2 dc in next dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, [dc in each of next 3 dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, 2 dc in next dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp] 5 times, join in top of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [ch 4, (dtr, **picot**—*see Special Stitches*, dtr) in next dc, ch 4, sc in each of next 10 sc] 5 times, ch 4, (dtr, picot, dtr) in next dc, ch 4, sc in each of last 9 sc, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 6:** Join A in any picot, ch 8 (*counts as first tr and ch-4*), tr in same picot as beg ch-8, [ch 5,

tr in 5th ch from hook] 3 times, \*(tr, ch 4, tr) in next picot, [ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook] 3 times, rep from \* 4 times, join in 4th ch of beg ch-8.

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in next ch-4 sp, **beg dc shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-4 sp as first sl st, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch sp, ch 2, \***dc shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch sp, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.

**Rnd 8:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, next dc and next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp as beg ch-1, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, \***tr shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp of next dc shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp of dc shell, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, **beg scallop** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-3 sp as first sl st, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp of next tr shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp of tr shell, ch 3, \***scallop** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp of next tr shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp of tr shell, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in 5th ch of beg ch-8. Fasten off. (12 scallops)

## Sail 1

**Row 1:** With B, ch 6, join in 6th ch from hook to form ring, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in ring, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc

in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 7 dc, 2 dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, ch 3, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 9 dc, 2 dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 8 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 4, tr in each of next 4 dc, dc in each of next 8 dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of

next 8 dc, tr in each of next 3 dc, 2 tr in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 4, tr in each of first 6 sts, dc in each of next 7 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 7 sts, tr in each of next 5 sts, 2 tr in top of beg ch-4, turn.

**Row 10:** Ch 3, sk first st, dc in each of next 13 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 13 sts and in top of beg ch-4. **Do not join or turn.**

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



## GAUGE

17 sts = 4 inches; 10 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Length of table runner can be customized to fit any table. Measure length of table and add 12 inches for overhang on each end. Adjust number of foundation chains in multiples of 14, plus 2.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Puff stitch (puff st):** [Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp] twice, yo, draw through 4 lps on hook, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook.

**Row 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, dc in each of next 6 sts, 3 dc in next st, \*dc in each of next 6 sts, dc dec next 3 sts tog, dc in each of next 6 sts, 3 dc in next st, rep from \* to last 8 sts, dc in each of next 6 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, change color to A in last st, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 6 sts, 3 sc in next st, \*sc in each of next 6 sts, sc dec next 3 sts tog, sc in next 6 sts, 3 sc in next st, rep from \* to last 8 sts, sc in each of next 6 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, **puff st** (see *Special Stitch*) in first st, [ch 1, sk next 2 sts, puff st in next st] twice, \*ch 1, sk next sc, (puff st, ch 1) twice in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next 2 sts] 4 times, puff st in next sc, rep from \* to last 10 sts, ch 1, sk next sc, (puff st, ch 1) twice in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next sc, ch 1, sk next 2 sc] twice, puff st in last st, turn. (127 puff sts)

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in first puff st, [sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next puff st] 3 times, \*3 sc in next ch-1 sp, [sc in next puff st, sc in next ch-1 sp] 6 times, sc in next puff st, rep from \* to last 4 ch-1 sps, 3 sc in next ch-1 sp, [sc in next puff st, sc in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, sc, change color to C in last puff st, turn. (254 sc)

**Row 6:** Rep row 2.

**Row 7:** Rep row 3.

**Row 8:** Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in each of next 6 sts, 3 dc in next st, \*dc in each of next 3 sts, dc dec next 3 sts tog, dc in each of next 6 sts, 3 dc in next st, rep from \* to last 8 sts, dc in each of next 6 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, turn.

**Row 9:** Rep row 3, change color to B in last st, turn.

**Rows 10–25:** [Rep rows 2–9 consecutively] twice.

**Rows 26–30:** Rep rows 2–6.

**Row 31:** Rep row 7. Fasten off. **cw**

- Size F/5/3.75mm aluminum crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Darice® #6201-13 wood base lamp with bulb
- 5½-inch-tall glass jar with 3-inch mouth
- 4-oz baby-food jar with lid
- Heavy-duty glass glue

### GAUGE

**With braid:** 5 hdc = 1 inch;  
2 hdc rows = ½ inch

**With plastic canvas yarn:** 4 sc = 1 inch; 2 sc rows = ½ inch

### PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Work stitches through both loops of previous round unless otherwise stated.

When changing colors, join in same space as join of previous round, unless otherwise stated.

Do not leave lamp unattended when lit.

## LIGHTHOUSE

### BASE

**Rnd 1:** With C, ch 65, being careful not to twist ch, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 65th ch from hook to form ring, ch 2, hdc in each ch around, join in top of beg ch-2. (65 hdc)

**Rnds 2 & 3:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around, join in top of beg ch-2. (65 hdc)

**Rnd 4:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) only, ch 2, \*hdc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 hdc, hdc in each of next 2 hdc, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (49 hdc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, working in back lps only, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, \*hdc dec in next 3 sts, sc in each of next 9 sc, rep from \* around, join in first st. Fasten off C. (41 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Working in back lps only, join A, ch 1, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, join in first sc. (42 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (42 sc)

### FIRST LOWER WINDOW PARTITION

**Row 1:** Now working in rows, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (4 sc)

**Rows 2–5:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off A at end of last row. (4 sc)

### 2ND–6TH LOWER WINDOW PARTITIONS

**Row 1:** Sk next 3 sc on last rnd of Lighthouse Base, join A, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (4 sc)

**Rows 2–5:** Rep rows 2–5 of First Window Partition.

### LIGHTHOUSE CENTER

**Rnd 1:** Join A in first sc of row 5 of First Window Partition, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, ch 3, \*sc in each of next 4 sc of row 5 of next Window Partition, ch 3, rep from \* 3 times, join in first sc. (42 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc and ch around, join in first sc. Fasten off A. (42 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Join C in same st as join of previous rnd, working in back lps only, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off C. (42 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Join B in same st as join of previous rnd, ch 1, working through back lps only, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (42 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, working through both lps, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off B. (42 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Rep rnd 10. (42 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Join A in back lp only of next sc to left of rnd 13 join, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (42 sc)

#### FIRST UPPER WINDOW PARTITION

**Rows 1–4:** Working in rnd 7 of Lighthouse Center, rep rows 1–4 of First Lower Window Partition. Fasten off A at end of last row.

#### 2ND–5TH UPPER WINDOW PARTITIONS

**Rows 1–4:** Working in rnd 7 of Lighthouse Center, rep rows 1–4 of 2nd–6th Upper Window Partitions. Fasten off A at end of last row.

#### 6TH UPPER WINDOW PARTITION

**Rows 1–4:** Working in rnd 7 of Lighthouse Center, rep rows 1–4 of 6th Upper Window Partition. Do not fasten off at end of last row.

#### LIGHTHOUSE BALCONY

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, ch 3, \*sc in each of next 4 sc of row 4 of next Upper Window Partition, ch 3, rep from \* 4 times, join in first sc. (42 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc and ch around, join in first sc. (42 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, working back lps only, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 4 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, \*sc in each of next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off A. (36 sc)

#### RAILING

**Rnd 1:** With 2 strands held tog, join C in front lp of row 3 of Lighthouse Balcony, ch 6,

sk next 2 sc on rnd 3, dc in next sc, \*ch 3, sk next 2 sc, dc in next sc, rep from \* around, ch 3, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. Fasten off C. (15 dc)

#### LIGHT

**Rnd 1:** Join D in front lp of same st as join of previous rnd, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, join in first st. (30 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, working in front lps only, sc in each st around, join in first st. (30 sc)

**Rnds 3–11:** Ch 1, working in both lps, sc in leach sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off D. (30 sc)

## FINISHED SIZE

53 inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Baby medium (worsted) weight yarn (3½ oz/170 yd/100g per skein):  
3 skeins each #169 sweet pea (A), #100 angel white (B), #114 cheery cherry (C) and #157 duckie (D)  
2 skeins of #106 little boy blue (E)
- Size K/10½/6.5mm double-ended cable hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook

## GAUGE

**With cable hook:** 12 Tunisian simple sts = 4 inches; 13 Tunisian simple st rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Throw is made in short-row “wedges” to form a circular piece, then the first row is seamed to the last row, leaving an opening in the center. A 2nd, smaller circle is made in the same manner, and then seamed into the opening.

Turn only where stated.

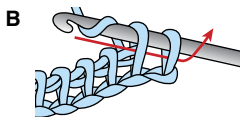
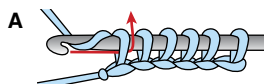
When instructions indicate to “turn,” it is intended that you should turn your work 180 degrees. If you are on the right side, you will be turning your work to the wrong side and vice

versa. Once turned, you will push your loops toward the opposite end of the hook and begin working with the other skein of yarn.

When picking up loops in the last stitch of a short row (as for row 17), insert your hook into the stitch normally, except also insert your hook in the stitch directly below it, yarn over and pull loop through both stitches. This avoids forming a gap when the short rows are worked.

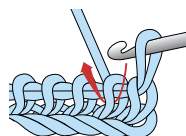
## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Work loops off hook (work lps off hook):** Yo, pull through 1 lp on hook, \*yo, pull through 2 lps on hook across, rep from \* until 1 lp rem on hook (*last lp on hook is first lp of next row—see illustration*).

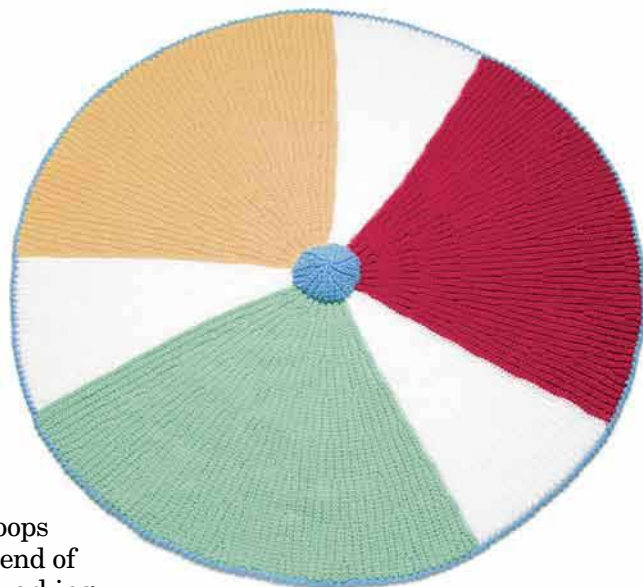


Work Loops Off Hook

**Tunisian simple stitch (Tunisian simple st):** Keeping all lps on hook, insert hook from right to left behind front vertical bar and **into st directly below** (see *Pattern Notes*), yo, pull lp through.

**Bind off:** Insert hook from right to left behind front vertical bar, yo, pull lp through st and through lp on hook.

## OUTER CIRCLE

### Wedge 1

**Row 1 (RS):** With A and cable hook, ch 70, sk first ch, pull up lp in each ch across, turn, join 2nd skein of A, **work lps off hook** (see *Special Stitches*).

**Row 2:** Tunisian simple st (see *Special Stitches*) across, turn, work lps off hook.

**Row 3:** Tunisian simple st in each st across to last 5 sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked, work lps off hook.

**Row 4:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, work lps off hook.

**Row 5:** Tunisian simple st in each st across to last 10 sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked, work lps off hook.

**Row 6:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, work lps off hook.

**Rows 7–16:** [Rep rows 5 and 6 consecutively] 5 times.

**Row 17:** Tunisian simple st across all sts from last row, Tunisian simple st in each unworked st from previous rows, turn, work lps off hook.

**Row 18:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, work lps off hook.

### Wedges 2–8

**Rows 19–114:** [Rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 6 times.

### Wedge 9

**Rows 115–129:** Rep rows 3–17.

**Row 130:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, join B, work lps off hook. Fasten off A.

### Wedges 10–12

**Rows 131–177:** With B, [rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 3 times, ending last rep with row 17.

**Row 178:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, join C, work lps off hook.

### Wedges 13–20

**Rows 179–305:** With C, [rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 8 times, ending last rep with row 17.

**Row 306:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, join B, work lps off hook. Fasten off C.

### Wedges 21–23

**Rows 307–353:** With B, [rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 3 times, ending last rep with row 17.

**Row 354:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, join D, work lps off hook. Fasten off B.

### Wedges 24–31

**Rows 355–481:** With D, [rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 8 times, ending last rep with row 17.

**Row 482:** Tunisian simple st in each st across, turn, join B, work lps off hook. Fasten off D.

### Wedges 32–34

**Rows 483–529:** With B, [rep rows 3–18 consecutively] 3 times, ending last rep with row 17.

**Row 530: Bind off** (see *Special Stitches*) each st across. Fasten off.

### ASSEMBLY

Matching sts, sew row 1 to row 530.

lp in each ch across, turn, join first skein of E, work lps off hook.

**Row 2:** Tunisian simple st across, turn, work lps off hook.

**Row 3:** Tunisian simple st in each st across to last 2 sts, turn, leaving rem sts unworked, work lps off hook.

**Row 4:** Tunisian simple st across, turn, work lps off hook.

Rnds 1-4 = approximately  
1½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

After rounds 11 and 14, push all treble crochet stitches to front.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Triple picot:** Ch 4, sl st into the front lp at the top of the last st made and the front strand of the actual st of the same st, ch 5, sl st into the same st again catching the front lp of the 1st ch-4 lp where you sl st into the top of the st, ch 4, sl st into the same st again catching the front lp of the 1st ch-4 lp and ch-5 lp where you sl st into the top of the st.

**Crossed treble crochet (crossed tr):** Keeping last 3 lps on hook, work tr in next sc, sk

next tr, dc in next sc, work last 3 lps off hook as for tr, ch 1, dc in top of dc just made.

**Double treble crochet cluster (dtr cl):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, 2 dtr in indicated st, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Chain-4 picot (ch-4 picot):** Ch-4, sl st in indicated st.

**Split treble crochet decrease (split tr dec):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, tr in next dc, sk next 7 sts, tr in next dc, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Treble crochet join (tr join):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, tr in next dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-10, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Beginning 4-treble crochet cluster (beg 4-tr cl):** Ch 2 (counts as first tr), keeping last lp of each st on hook, 3 tr, same st as beg ch-2, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**4-treble crochet cluster (4-tr cl):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, 4 tr in indicated st, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Beginning 2-treble crochet cluster (beg 2-tr cl):** Ch 2, tr in same st as beg ch-2.

**2-treble crochet cluster (2-tr cl):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, 2 tr in indicated st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

**2-treble crochet cluster V-stitch (2-tr cl V-st):** (2-tr cl, ch 3, 2-tr cl) in indicated st.

**Chain-3 picot (ch-3 picot):** Ch 3, sl st in indicated st.

**Split double crochet decrease (split dc dec):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, dc in same ch-4 sp as (dc, ch 1) just made, sk 2-tr cl and ch-4 picot, dc in next ch-4 sp, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Star Flower join:** Ch 1, sl st in indicated ch-4 picot on rnd 19 of Center (see Placement Diagram), ch 1.

## DOILY Center

**Rnd 1:** With dark pink, ch 5, join in 5th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 8 sc in ring, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in front lp of first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Working in front lps (see Stitch Guide) only, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 3, \*sc in next sc, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in back lp (see Stitch Guide) of first sc of rnd 1, working in back lps only of rnd 1, ch 1, 2 sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*2 sc in next sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** Join light pink in first sc of rnd 3, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, (sc, ch 3, **dtr cl**—see Special Stitches, **ch-4 picot**—see Special Stitches—in top of dtr cl just made, ch 4, sc) in next sc, \*sc in next sc, (sc, ch 3, dtr cl, ch-4 picot in top of dtr cl just made, ch 4, sc) in next sc, rep

from \* around, join in first sc.  
Fasten off.

**Rnd 5:** Join dusty blue in any ch-4 picot, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 9, \*sc in next ch-4 picot, ch 9, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, (sc, hdc, 3 dc, 3 tr, 3 dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-9 sp, \*sc in next sc, (sc, hdc, 3 dc, 3 tr, 3 dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-9 sp, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in each st around to 2nd dc, ch 10, sk next 2 sts, dc in next tr, ch 7, sk next 2 sts, \***split tr dec** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 7, sk next 2 sts, dc in next tr, ch 7, sk next 2 sts, rep from \* around, **tr join** (see *Special Stitches*).

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in natural sp between sts of tr join just made, 8 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in next dc, 8 sc in next ch-7 sp, \*sc in natural sp between sts of next split tr dec, 8 sc in next ch-7 sp, sc in next dc, 8 sc in next ch-7 sp, rep from \* around, join in back lp of first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 9:** Join dark pink in first sc of previous rnd, **beg 4-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same st as join, ch 10, sk next 8 sc, \***4-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, ch 10, sk next 8 sc, rep from \* around, join in top of first tr cl. Fasten off.

**Rnd 10:** Join dusty blue in top of first cl of previous rnd, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, 11 sc in next ch-10 sp, \*sc in top of next cl, 11 sc in next ch-10 sp, rep from \* around, join in back lp of first sc.

**Rnd 11:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) only, ch 1, sc

in same st as beg ch-1, tr in next sc, \*sc in next sc, tr in next sc, rep from \* around, join in first st. Fasten off.

**Rnd 12:** Join light pink in first sc of previous rnd, ch 2, sk next tr, dc in next sc, ch 3, dc in top of beg ch-2, ch 1, sk next tr, \***crossed tr** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, sk next tr, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of first ch-3. Fasten off.

**Rnd 13:** Join dusty blue in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, 2 sc in same sp as beg ch-1, \*2 sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* around, join in back lp of first sc.

**Rnd 14:** Working in back lps only, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, tr in next sc, \*sc in next sc, tr in next sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 15:** **Beg 2-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sc as join, ch 3, **2-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sc as beg 2-tr cl, sk next 3 sts, \***2-tr cl V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, sk next 3 sts, rep from \* around, join in beg 2-tr cl.

**Rnd 16:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, 4 sc in same sp as beg ch-1, (3 sc, **triple picot** (see *Special Stitches*) in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, \*4 sc in each of next 2 ch-3 sps, (3 sc, triple picot in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around to last ch-3 sp, 4 sc in last ch-3 sp, join in first sc.

**Rnd 17:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, ch 12, sk next 7 sts, \*sc in each of next 6 sc, ch 12, sk next 7 sts, rep from \* around to last 3 sc, sc in each of last 3 sc, join in first sc.

**Rnd 18:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, (ch 1, dc) 8 times in next ch-12 sp, ch 1, sk next 2 sc,

\*sc in each of next 2 sc, (ch 1, dc) 8 times in next ch-12 sp, ch 1, sk next 2 sc, rep from \* around to last sc, sc in last sc, join in first sc.

**Rnd 19:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, 2 sc in same sp as beg ch-1, [(sc, **ch-3 picot**—see *Special Stitches*, in last sc made, sc) in next ch-1 sp], 3 times, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-1 sp, [(sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, \*(2 sc in each of next 2 ch-1 sps, [(sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-1 sp, [(sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, rep from \* around to last ch-1 sp, 2 sc in last ch-1 sp, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## STAR FLOWER

**Rnd 1:** With dark pink, ch 5, join in 5th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 10 sc in ring, join in front lp of first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

**Rnd 2:** Join light pink in back lp of first st of previous rnd, working in back lps only, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, 2-tr cl, ch-4 picot in top of 2-tr cl just made, ch 3, sc) in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next st, [(sc, ch 2, 2-tr cl, ch-4 picot in top of 2-tr cl just made, ch 3, sc) in next st, sc in next st] twice, [(sc, ch 2, 2-tr cl, **Star Flower join**—see *Special Stitches*, sl st in top of 2-tr cl just made, ch 3, sc) in next sc on Star Flower, sc in next sc on Star Flower] twice, join in first sc of rnd 2 of Star Flower. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Rep Star Flower around.

## ARCHES

**Rnd 1:** Join dusty blue in **indicated ch-4 picot on rnd 2 of Star Flower** (see *Placement Diagram*), ch 1, sc in same st, [ch 8, sc in next ch-4 picot]

twice, ch 4, 4-tr cl, in next ch-4 sp on rnd 19 of Center, ch-3 picot in top of 4-tr cl just made, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-4 picot on next Star Flower, [ch 8, sc in next ch-4 picot] twice, ch 4, 4-tr cl in next ch-4 sp on rnd 19 of Center, ch-3 picot in top of last 4-tr cl made, rep from \* around, ch 2, join with dc in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3 (*counts as dc and ch-1*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, \*[(ch 1, dc) 6 times in next ch-8 sp] twice, ch 1, (dc, ch 1) in next ch-4 sp\*\*, **split dc dec**, ch 1, (ch 1, dc) in same ch-4 sp as last dc of split dc dec, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 3:** Work as follows:

**A.** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, 2 sc in same sp as beg ch-1, (sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch-1 sps, 2 sc in each of next 2 ch-1 sps, 3 sc in next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, **turn**;

**B.** sk next 3 sc, (dc, ch 4, dc) in next sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, ch 1, **turn**;

**C.** (2 sc, ch-3 picot in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 4 sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, **turn**;

**D.** sk next sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, ch 1, **turn**;

**E.** (3 sc, triple picot in last sc made, 3 sc) in next ch-4 sp, (sc, ch-3 picot in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-1 sp used on previous rnd, (sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch-1 sps, \*2 sc in each of next 2 ch-1 sps, (sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch-1 sps, 2 sc in each of next 2 ch-1 sps, 3 sc in next ch-1 sp, 2 sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, **turn**;

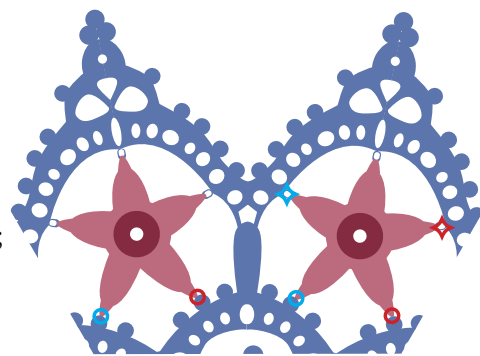
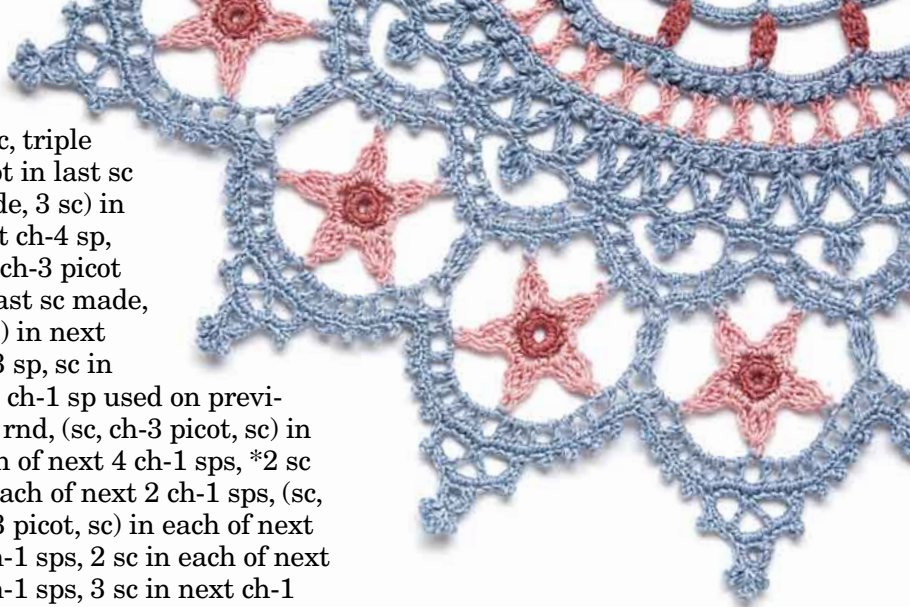
**F.** sk next 3 sc, (dc, ch-4, dc) in next sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, ch 1, **turn**;

**G.** (2 sc, ch-3 picot in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 4 sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, **turn**;

**H.** sk next sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, ch 1, **turn**;

**I.** (3 sc, triple picot in last sc made, 3 sc) in next ch-4 sp, (sc, ch-3 picot in last sc made, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in last ch-1 sp used on previous rnd, (sc, ch-3 picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch-1 sps, rep from \* around to last ch-1 sp, 2 sc in last ch-1 sp, join in first sc.

Fasten off, and weave in ends. Block. **cw**

**Each pillow:** 2 balls each #26 light blue and #90 beige

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 14 x 14-inch pillow form: 2

## GAUGE

4 sc and ch = 2 inches;  
8 rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as (single crochet, chain-2) unless otherwise stated.

## SQUARE PILLOW

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With beige, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), (sc in ring, ch 2) 3 times, join in first ch. (4 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, sc in corner sp, ch 1, [(sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp,

ch 1] 3 times, join in first ch of ch-3, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to light blue, fasten off beige. (2 sc each side of square)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, sc in corner sp, \*ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1\*\*, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch of ch-3. (3 sc each side of square)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, sc in corner sp, \*[ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp] across to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1\*\*, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch of ch-3, change color to beige, fasten off light blue. (4 sc each side of square)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 3, sc in corner sp, \*[ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp] across to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1\*\*, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch of ch-3. (5 sc each side of square)

**Rnds 6 & 7:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 7, change color to light blue, fasten off beige. (7 sc each side of square)

**Rnds 8–10:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 10, change color to beige, fasten off light blue. (10 sc each side of square)

**Rnds 11–15:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 15, change color to light blue, fasten off beige. (15 sc each side of square)

**Rnds 16–18:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 18, change color to beige, fasten off light blue. (18 sc each side of square)

**Rnd 19–21:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 21, change color to light blue, fasten off beige. (21 sc each side of square)

**Rnds 22 & 23:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 23, change color to beige, fasten off light blue. (23 sc each side of square)

**Rnd 24 & 25:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 25, fasten off. (25 sc each side of square)

## ASSEMBLY

**Rnd 1:** Holding WS of Square Pillow sections tog and working through both thicknesses, join light blue with sc in any corner, (ch 2, sc) in same corner sp, ch 1, \*[sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] across to next corner ch-2 sp\*\*, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around 3 sides, insert pillow form, continue across last side edge, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next ch sp, ch 2, [reverse sc in next ch sp, ch 2] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## DIAGONAL PILLOW

### PILLOW FRONT

**Note:** Start Front with 6 rows beige, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*), then alternate [3 rows light blue and 3 rows beige] 10 times, ending with 6 rows light blue.

**Row 1:** Ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, (sc, ch 1, sc) in next sc, turn. (2 sc, 1 ch-1 sp)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp] across, ending with ch 1, sc in last sc, turn. (4 sc, 3 ch-1 sps)

**Rows 5–36:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp] across, ending with ch 1, sc in last sc, turn. (36 sc, 35 ch-1 sps)

**Row 37:** Do not inc or dec on this row, ch 1, sc in ch-1 sp, [ch 1, sc in next sc] across, turn.

**Row 38:** Ch 1, [sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] across to last ch-1 sp, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next ch-1 sp and last sc, turn. (35 sc, 34 ch-1 sps)

**Rows 39–72:** Rep row 38 until 1 sc rem. Fasten off.

#### BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join beige with sl st in any corner, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner sp, [ch 1, sk 1 row, sc in next row] across to next corner, ch 1, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

#### PILLOW BACK

**Note:** Start Back with 2 rows light blue, 2 rows beige, 3 rows each light blue and beige, 5 rows light blue, 3 rows each beige and light blue, 2 rows each beige and light blue, 3 rows each beige and light blue, 5 rows each beige and light blue, 3 rows each beige and light blue, 2 rows each beige and light blue, 3 rows each beige and light blue, 5 rows beige, 3 rows each light blue and beige, 2 rows each light blue and beige.

**Rows 1–72:** Rep rows 1–72 of Pillow Front.

#### BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join beige with sl st in any corner, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner sp, [ch 1, sk 1 row, sc in next row] across to next corner, ch 1, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

#### ASSEMBLY

**Rnd 1:** Holding WS of Diagonal Pillow sections tog and working through both thicknesses, join light blue with sc in any corner, ch 2, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next ch sp, ch 2, [reverse sc in next ch sp, ch 2] around 3 sides, insert pillow form and continue pattern across rem side, join in first sc. Fasten off. **cw**

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight yarn (6 oz/315 yds/170g per skein):
  - 4 skeins each #9710 country blue (E) and #9711 dark country blue (F)
  - 2 skeins each #9703 bone (G) and #9750 chocolate (H)
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker



## GAUGE

Block = 8½ x 8½ inches; 8 sc = 2½ inches; 8 sc rows = 2½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Each Block is worked in 9 sections: a center section and 8 corner stripes. The corner stripes are worked around the center section, one after the

other, covering only 2 sides of the center section.

Take care when beginning a new corner stripe to join yarn with right side facing.

For ease in following pattern, mark row 1 as wrong side.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## BLOCK

### Make 35.

## CENTER SECTION

**Row 1 (WS):** With A, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

**Rows 2–8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off.

## FIRST CORNER STRIPE

**Row 9 (RS):** Join G with sl st in first st of row 8, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each of next 7 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, working in ends of rows, dc in edge of last dc made and each sc row of Center Section, turn. (17 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 10:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 9 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in each of last 8 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (19 sc)

## 2ND CORNER STRIPE

**Row 11 (RS):** Join D with sl st in end of marked row (remove marker), ch 3, 3 dc evenly sp across end of row 9, working across opposite side of

foundation ch, dc in each of next 8 chs, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, working in ends of rows, dc in edge of last dc made and each sc row of Center Section, work 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 9, dc in end of row 10, turn. (24 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 12:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 12 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in each of last 12 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (26 sc)

## 3RD CORNER STRIPE

**Row 13 (RS):** Join C with sl st in end of marked row (remove marker), ch 3, 2 dc evenly sp across end of row 11, dc in next 10 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, 2 dc evenly sp in edge of last dc made, dc in next 9 sc, 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 11, dc in end of row 12, turn. (27 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 14 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in last 13 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (29 sc)

## 4TH CORNER STRIPE

**Row 15 (RS):** Join H with sl st in end of marked row (remove marker), ch 3, 2 dc evenly sp across end of row 13, dc in next 14 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, 2 dc evenly sp in edge of last dc made, dc in next 12 sc, 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 13, dc in end of row 14, turn. (24 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 17 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc

in last 17 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (36 sc)

#### 5TH CORNER STRIPE

**Row 17 (RS):** Join A with sl st in end of marked row (*remove marker*), ch 3, 2 dc evenly sp across end of row 15, dc in next 15 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, 2 dc evenly sp in edge of last dc made, dc in next 14 sc, 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 15, dc in end of row 16, turn. (37 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 18:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 19 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in last 18 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (39 sc)

#### 6TH CORNER STRIPE

**Row 19 (RS):** Join B with sl st in end of marked row (*remove marker*), ch 3, 2 dc evenly sp across end of row 17, dc in next 19 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, 2 dc evenly sp in edge of last dc made, dc in next 17 sc, 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 17, dc in end of row 18, turn. (44 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 20:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 22 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in last 22 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (46 sc)

#### 7TH CORNER STRIPE

**Row 21 (RS):** Join E with sl st in end of marked row (*remove marker*), ch 3, 2 dc evenly sp across end of row 19, dc in next 20 sc, ch 2, rotate Block quarter turn, 2 dc evenly sp in edge of last dc made, dc in next 19 sc, 2 dc evenly sp across beg ch-3 of row 19, dc in end of row 20, turn. (47 dc, corner ch-2 sp)

**Row 22:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 24 dc, 2 sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in last 23 dc, place marker at beg of this row. Fasten off. (49 sc)

#### 8TH CORNER STRIPE

**Row 23 (RS):** Join F with sl st in end of marked row (*remove*

- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Straight pins
- Sewing machine (optional)
- Sewing thread
- 18-inch zipper
- 1½ x ¾-inch coordinating button
- 9 x 30-inch length coordinating fabric
- Iron
- Ironing board



## GAUGE

Rnds 1 and 2 = 2½ inches;  
5 dc = 1½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Front post treble crochet cluster (fp<sub>tr</sub> cl):** \*Yo hook twice, insert hook around vertical post of indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from \* once, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated st.

## BAG SIDE

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 4th ch from hook, **ch 3**

(see *Pattern Notes*), 11 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (12 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (24 dc)

**Row 3:** Now working in rows, ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 6 times, dc in each of next 2 sts, leaving rem 7 sts unworked, turn. (24 dc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, [fp<sub>tr</sub> cl (see *Special*

*Stitches*) around next dc 2 rows below, 2 dc in next st on current row] across, turn. (16 dc, 7 fptr cl)

**Row 6:** Rep row 4.

**Row 7:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next st, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st] across, turn. (31 sts)

**Row 8:** Rep row 4.

**Row 9:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 sts, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] across, turn. (39 sts)

**Row 10:** Rep row 4.

**Row 11:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 sts, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts] across, turn. (47 sts)

**Row 12:** Rep row 4.

**Row 13:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 4 sts, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 4 sts] across, turn. (55 sts)

**Row 14:** Rep row 4.

**Row 15:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 5 sts, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 5 sts] across, turn. (63 sts)

**Row 16:** Rep row 4.

**Row 17:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 6 sts, [fptr cl around next fptr cl, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 6 sts] across, turn. (71 sts)

**Row 18:** Ch 1, working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 19:** Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next st, \*sl st in next st, sk next st, 3 dc in next st\*\*, sk next st, sl st in next st, fptr cl around next fptr cl, sl st in next st, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, sk next st, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*. Fasten off.

## STRAP

**Rnd 1:** Ch 240, (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), ch 2, sk next 3 chs, [shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, sk next 3 chs, ch 2] across to last ch, (shell, ch 2) twice in last ch, now working on opposite side of foundation ch, [shell in opposite side of ch in same ch as shell on opposite edge, ch 2] across, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 2 (joining):** Join Strap to Bag as follows:

- A.** With WS facing, center Strap along side and bottom edge of 1 Bag Side and pin in place;
- B.** ch 1, sc in each st and sp across to side of Bag Side;
- C.** working through both thicknesses in sts and sps along Bag Side rows and rnds, and rnd 1 of Strap, sc evenly sp across to opposite edge of Bag;
- D.** working in rnd 1 of Strap only, sc in each st and sp across to end of Strap, draw up long lp, do not turn or fasten off;
- E.** rep B and C;
- F.** working in rnd 1 of Strap only, sc in each st and sp across to end of Strap, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## LINING FOUNDATION

Join with sc in rem lp of first sc of row 18, sc in rem lp of each st across. Fasten off. Rep on rem Side.

## LINING

**Note:** Use ½-inch seam allowances throughout. Lining may be basted and sewn with machine or by hand.

Cut 2 Lining pieces from fabric using Bag Side as pattern and adding ½ inch for seam allowances to all sides.

With RS tog, baste curved edge tog; press seam open. With WS

of zipper facing fabric, center zipper on basted seam and pin in place to seam allowance only. Folding Lining out of the way, sew along zipper edges, catching only the seam allowance in stitching. Remove basting. Sew bottom edge; sew side edges, ending seams at zipper. Do not turn RS out.

## ASSEMBLY

Place Lining inside Bag and open zipper. Sew zipper seam allowance to Lining Foundation on each Bag Side.

With yarn, sew 4th and 5th 3-dc groups on 1 end of Bag Side to 4th and 5th unattached shells on Strap. Rep on opposite end of same Bag Side.

Sew button to Strap at joining of rnd 1. To modify Strap length, button in any ch-2 space between shells at opposite end of Strap. **cw**

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker
- ¾-inch-wide light blue grosgrain ribbon: 18 inches
- 1 oz fiberfill



### GAUGE

5 dc = 1 inch; 5 dc rows = 2 inches

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Bear is crocheted in pieces and then sewn together to complete front and back.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### HEAD

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 4, join (see Pattern

Notes) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), 11 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (12 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (24 dc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (36 dc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (48 dc)

### BODY

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** Beg at neck, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (10 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each dc across to last dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (12 dc)

**Row 4:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each dc across to last dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (14 dc)

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

**Rows 6–11:** Rep rows 4 and 5. (20 dc)

**Row 12:** Rep row 5. Fasten off.

### ARM

#### Make 4.

**Row 1:** Ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each sc across, turn.



*This sweet little bear is just the right size to take on trips. He fits easily in a travel bag and in a child's hands.*

**Rows 3–6:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 6, fasten off.

## LEG

### Make 4.

**Row 1:** Ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (10 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–8:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 8, fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Assemble 1 side of Teddy Bear at a time. Sew Head to Row 1 of Body. Sew row 6 of Arm to rows 3–7 of Body. Sew each Leg to bottom of Body.

## TRIM

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join yarn with sl st to bottom of either Leg, ch 1, sc evenly sp around outer edge of Bear, join in beg sc. Fasten off. Rep rnd 1 of Trim on rem side of Bear.

With WS of both sides facing, and working through both thicknesses of rnd 1 of Trim, with yarn needle and length of yarn, sew Bear around outer edge, stuffing lightly with fiberfill as work progresses.

## EAR

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join rnds**, place marker and move marker each rnd as work progresses. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 6 times. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc] 6 times. (24 sc)

**Rnds 5 & 6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 7:** [Sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each of

next 6 sc] 3 times, sl st in next sc. Fasten off.

Fold Ear in half and sew in place on top of Head over sewn seam with approximately 1½ inches between Ears.

## MUZZLE

**Rnds 1–5:** Rep rnds 1–5 of Ear. At the end of rnd 5, fasten off.

Sew Muzzle in place just below center of front Head, stuffing with fiberfill lightly before closing.

## FACIAL FEATURES

With black and yarn needle, embroider eyes to each side of muzzle approximately 1 inch apart. Embroider nose just below the center of Muzzle and mouth directly below nose.

Tie ribbon in a bow around neck of Teddy Bear, trim ends as desired. **CW**



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# Sleeping Bag & Tote

## SKILL LEVEL



## FINISHED SIZE

**Sleeping Bag:** 27 inches wide x 54 inches long (54 inches wide x 54 inches long when open flat)

**Tote:** 21½ inches high x 22½ inches wide x 8 inches deep

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight yarn (solid: 7 oz/364 yds/198g; multi: 5 oz/244 yds/141g per skein):  
11 skeins each #964 primary and #312 black
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size 4/2.00mm steel crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Coats & Clark black 100-inch/254cm sleeping-bag zipper
- 2 safety pins
- Chalk pencil
- Ruler



## GAUGE

**Size I hook and 2 strands yarn:**  
3 hdc = 1 inch; 2 hdc rows = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Use 2 strands yarn held together throughout unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SLEEPING BAG

**Row 1:** With size I hook and 1 strand each color held tog (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 153, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (152 hdc)

**Rows 2–126: Ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each hdc across, turn. At the end of row 126, fasten off.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With size I hook, join 2 strands black in any st, ch 2, hdc evenly sp around outer edge, working 5 hdc in each corner st, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

**1.** Fold crocheted piece in half vertically to create Sleeping Bag. With zipper bottom ½ inch in from bottom center fold of sleeping bag, lay zipper along bottom and up long side edge to determine desired end of zipper placement. Place a safety pin to mark desired end of zipper in sleeping bag and also in zipper.

**Note:** Purchased sleeping bag zipper is longer than needed for this application. Zipper in sample ends 10 inches from top edge.

**2.** Use chalk pencil and ruler to mark line ¼ inch away from zipper coil, beg 2 inches above pin to beg bottom of zipper. Rep to mark line on opposite side of zipper.

**Note:** Tapestry needle can be used to create holes in zipper tape if needed.

**3.** With zipper right side up, beg zipper edging starting at bottom edge using size 4 steel hook and 1 strand black, insert hook through zipper tape on marked line, sc loosely, ch 1, rep ¼-inch away from last sc, continue working in this manner along 1 side of zipper until 2 inches past pin. Fasten off.

**4.** With WS facing and beg ½ inch in from folded center bottom edge, with size I hook and 1 strand black, sc zipper edging to 1 side of Sleeping Bag along bottom and side edge, inserting hook under ch-1 on zipper tape and through top lps of sc on sleeping bag, stop 2 inches away from pin. Recheck distance of zipper pin from top edge of Sleeping Bag, making sure it is still 10 inches from top edge or desired opening length, and adjust pin placement if necessary.

**Note:** Joining zipper to Sleeping Bag may have changed opening length.

**5.** Create zipper stop on coil edge of zipper at pin marking by overcasting edge 8–10 times with 1 strand of black and needle. Remove pin. Cut across zipper tape 1 inch above zipper stop just made and trim away coil only from rem 1-inch tab. Fold down ½ inch of tab to back side of zipper, and then fold down once more, creating a hemmed top edge. Use needle and black to overcast top edge of fold over entire hem to secure.

**6.** Continue in same manner as step 4 to finish attaching zipper to Sleeping Bag. Fasten off.

**7.** Rep step 3 on opposite side of zipper.

**8.** Rep step 5 using same ending point of first side of zipper.

**9.** Rep step 4 to attach zipper edging to opposite side of Sleeping Bag.

## TOTE

### BOTTOM

**Row 1:** With size I hook and **2 strands black held tog** (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 61, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (60 hdc)

**Rows 2–18: Ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each hdc across, turn.

### BODY

**Rnd 1:** Working around outer edge of Bottom, ch 2, hdc in each of next 59 hdc of row 18, work 18 hdc along ends of rows, 60 hdc on opposite edge and 18 hdc in ends of rows at opposite end, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (156 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (156 hdc)

**Rnds 3–6:** Rep rnd 2. At the end of rnd 6, fasten off.

**Rnd 7:** With 1 strand each black and primary, ch 2, hdc in each hdc around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

**Rnds 8–36:** Rep rnd 2. At the end of rnd 36, fasten off.

### HANDLE OPENINGS

With RS facing, mark center of Tote by placing a safety pin between the 2 center sts along Body top edges.

#### First Opening

**Row 1:** Sk first 10 hdc to left of safety pin and attach 1 strand each primary and black in top

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc and each ch around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

**Rnds 3 & 4:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, **do not fasten off.**

#### DOUBLE-STITCH BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Sl st in each hdc around. (156 sl sts)

**Rnd 2:** Working in sts of rnd 4

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 4:** Rep row 3.

**Row 5:** Rep row 2. (6 sc)

**Rows 7 & 8:** Rep row 3.

**Row 9:** Rep row 2. (4 sc)

**Rows 10 & 11:** Rep row 3.

**Row 12:** Rep row 2. (2 sc)

**Rows 13 & 14:** Rep row 3.

**Row 15:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (1 sc)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc in sc, **do not fasten off**.

#### EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, turn work to right and work sc evenly sp around outer edge, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in end corners of row 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Beg at row 1, roll piece to tip. Use needle and length of copper mist to tack tip of Croissant to secure.

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Croissant and secure to magnet.

### FRENCH BREAD

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With size 8 hook and copper mist, ch 20, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in each of next 11 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, 6 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in each of next 11 chs, sc in each of next 4 chs, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off.

#### EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Align loaves tog and with copper mist, sl st in each st around outer edge. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of French Bread and secure to magnet.

### CHEF'S HAT

**Row 1:** With size 8 hook and white, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (10 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–6:** Rep row 2.

**Row 7:** Working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] 4 times, turn. (15 sc)

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next sc, turn. (21 sc)

**Rows 9 & 10:** Rep row 2.

**Rows 11–15:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (11 sc)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice, sc in each of next 3 sc, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice. Fasten off. (7 sc)

#### FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Chef's Hat and secure to magnet.

### BLACK BERET

**Row 1:** With size 7 hook and black, ch 12, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs, tr in next ch, (tr, ch 3, sl st in first ch, tr) in next ch, tr in next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in each of next 2 chs. Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Beret and secure to magnet.

### BLACK & WHITE SWEATER

**Row 1:** With size 7 hook and black, ch 12, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to white, drop black, turn. (11 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 3:** Rep row 2, change color to black, drop white, turn.

**Row 4:** Rep row 2.

**Row 5:** Rep row 2, change color to white, drop black.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (9 sc)

**Row 7:** Rep row 3.

**Row 8:** Rep row 6. (7 sc)

**Row 9:** Rep row 5.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (9 sc)

**Row 11:** Rep row 3.

**Row 12:** Rep row 10. (11 sc)

**Row 13:** Rep row 5.

**Row 14:** Rep row 2.

#### FIRST SHOULDER

**Row 15:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, turn. (3 sts)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in next st. Fasten off. (2 sc)

#### 2ND SHOULDER

**Row 15:** Working on RS, attach white to top of first sc of row 14, ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, turn. (3 sts)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in next st. Fasten off. (2 sc)

## FIRST SLEEVE

**Row 1:** Join black to side of last sc of row 16, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each end of rows 15 and 14, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, change color to white, drop black, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, change color to black, drop white, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 5:** Rep row 3.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, change color to white, drop black, turn. (3 sc)

**Rows 7 & 8:** Rep rows 3 and 4.

**Row 9:** Rep row 3. Fasten off.

## 2ND SLEEVE

**Row 1:** With RS facing, join black to sc of row 14, work 1 sc in each end of rows 15 and 16, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 2:** Rep row 2 of First Sleeve.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, 2 sc in first sc, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, 2 sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, change color to black, drop white, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 5:** Rep row 3.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, 2 sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, change color to white, drop black, turn. (3 sc)

**Rows 7 & 8:** Rep rows 3 and 4.

**Row 9:** Rep row 3. Fasten off.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Join black in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, sc evenly sp around outer edge, working 2 sc in end corners of Sleeves and bottom edge, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Black

& White Sweater and secure to magnet.

## IFFEL TOWER

**Row 1:** With size 10 hook and gun metal braid, ch 4, dc in first ch of ch-4 (3 sk chs count as first dc), turn. (2 dc)

**Row 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 3:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

**Rows 4–8:** Rep row 3.

**Row 9:** Ch 3, dc in same st, dc in each st across to last dc, 2 dc in last st, turn. (6 dc)

**Row 10 (leg section):** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts. Fasten off.

**Row 10 (opposite leg section):** Join braid to next unworked dc on row 9, ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, turn. (3 dc)

**Row 11:** Ch 3, dc in same st, dc dec in next 2 dc, ch 2, dc dec in next 2 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (6 dc)

**Row 12:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 dc, dc in each of next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (10 dc)

**Row 13 (leg section):** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, dc dec in next 2 dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 14:** Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 15:** Rep row 13. Fasten off.

**Row 13 (opposite leg section):** Sk next 2 unworked dc of row 12, join braid to next dc, ch 3, dc dec in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 14:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, dc dec in last 2 dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 15:** Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (4 dc)

**Row 16:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 6, dc in each of next 3 dc of row 13 of leg section, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (10 dc)

**Row 17:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 4 dc, dc in each of next 6 chs, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (18 dc)

**Row 18:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 4 dc, sc in each of next 2 dc, sl st in each of next 4 dc, sc in each of next 2 dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (20 sts)

**Row 19 (leg section):** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 3 dc, dc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (6 sts)

**Row 20:** Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, turn. (6 dc)

**Rows 21 & 22:** Rep rows 19 and 20. At the end of row 22, fasten off. (6 dc)

**Rows 19–22 (opposite leg section):** Join braid to top of beg ch-3 of row 18 and rep rows 19–22.

## FINISHING

Cut 2 thin magnetic strips in slightly smaller shape of Eiffel Tower legs and secure to magnet.

## FRENCH FLAG

**Row 1:** With size 8 hook and silver ribbon, ch 15, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across. Fasten off. (14 sc)

**Row 2:** Join dark royal to **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of 6th sc of row 1, ch 1, sc in each of next 8 sc, turn. (8 sc)

**Rnd 9:** Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, [sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times, sc in each of next 4 sc. (36 sc)

**Rnd 10:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 11–13:** Rep rnd 10.

**Rnd 14:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec, [sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 5 times, sc in next sc. (24 sc)

**Rnd 16:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 17 & 18:** Rep rnd 10.

**Rnd 19:** [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (12 sc)

**Rnds 20–22:** Rep rnd 10. Fasten off.

**Rnd 23:** Join royal blue with sc in rnd 22, sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnds 24 & 25:** Rep rnd 10. Fasten off.

**Rnd 26:** Join light gray with sc in rnd 25, sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 27:** Rep rnd 10. Stuff Head and neck firmly.

## BODY

**Note:** *Stuff Body with fiberfill as work progresses.*

**Rnd 28:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 29:** Rep rnd 10.

**Rnd 41:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 42:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 43:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 44:** [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 45:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] around. Fasten off. (6 sc)

## BEAK

**Rnd 1:** With bright yellow, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 8 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 9 chs, place marker. (21 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 3–9:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 10:** Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 9 sc. (23 sc)

**Rnds 11–13:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 14:** Sc in next sc, hdc in each of next 4 sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, **do not fasten off**, turn. (6 sc)

#### FIRST CHEEK

**Row 15:** Ch 1, sc in next sc, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in same sp as sl st in row 14, turn. (8 sts)

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st of rnd 14, turn. (10 sts)

**Row 17:** Ch 1, sc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in each of next 4 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn. (14 sts)

**Row 18:** Ch 1, sc in next st, hdc in each of next 12 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st. Fasten off. (14 sts)

#### 2ND CHEEK

**Row 14:** Join bright yellow in 5th st from First Cheek, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, hdc in each of next 4 sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, turn. (6 sc)

**Rows 15–18:** Rep rows 15–18 of First Cheek.

Do not stuff rnds 1–9 of Beak, stuff rows 10–14 of Beak and Cheeks firmly.

Sew Beak and Cheeks to Head between rnds 9–15 of Head.

#### LEG

##### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With light gray, ch 12, sl st to join in first ch, sc in each ch around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 3:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 4:** Working in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), [sc in next st, (dc, tr, dc) in next st, sc in next st] 4 times. Fasten off.

**Rnd 5:** Working in rem **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of rnd 3, join bright yellow with sc, sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnds 6–15:** Sc in each st around. At the end of rnd 15, fasten off.

Stuff Legs firmly and sew to bottom of Body.

#### FOOT

##### Make 4.

**Rnd 1:** With bright yellow, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 3 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 3 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

*With a bit of devilish attitude and cuteness in spades, this sassy little character is hard to resist.*





**Row 5:** Now working in rows, sc in each of next 7 sc, turn. (7 sc)

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 10 sts, turn. (10 sc)

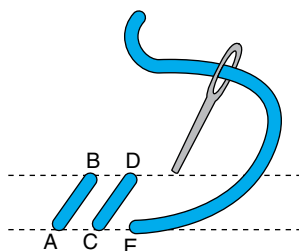

**Row 8:** Ch 1, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc, turn. (12 sc)

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 12 sc, turn.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, sc in next st] 3 times (*for toes*). Fasten off.

With WS facing, holding 2 Foot sections tog, **whipstitch** (see illustration) pieces tog, stuffing with fiberfill before closing.

Sew Leg to each Foot, positioning Leg over rnds 1 and 2 of Foot.

### TAIL FEATHERS

**Rnd 1:** With light gray, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 5:** 2 sc in each of next 6 sc, sc in each of next 6 sc, leaving rem 6 sts unworked.

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each of next 10 sc, turn.

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each of next 9 sc, turn.

**Rnd 8:** Sc in each of next 8 sc. Fasten off.

Sew Tail Feathers between rnds 35–41 of Body with rnds 6–8 at bottom edge and stuffing with fiberfill before closing.

### FIRST ARM

**Rnd 1:** With light gray, ch 11, sl st to join in first ch, sc in each ch around. (11 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 3–6:** Rep rnd 2.

**Row 7:** Working in rows, sc in each of next 5 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around. (11 sc)

**Rnd 10:** Now working in rnds, sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 11–13:** Rep rnd 2. **Do not fasten off.**

### Hand

**Rnd 14:** Sc in each of next 7 sts, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of rem 4 sts. (15 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each of next 7 sc, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each of next 4 chs, sc in each of next 8 sc. (19 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 17:** Sc in each of next 7 sts, sk next 9 sts (*for thumb*), sc in each of next 3 sts. (10 sc)

**Rnds 18–21:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 22:** Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in last st. Fasten off. (8 sc)

### 2ND ARM

**Rnds 1–13:** Rep rnds 1–13 of First Arm.

### Hand

**Rnd 14:** Sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of rem 10 sts. (15 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in next sc, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each of next 4 chs, sc in each of next 14 sc. (19 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 17:** Sc in next sc, sk next 9 sts (*for thumb*), sc in each of next 9 sts. (10 sc)

**Rnds 18–21:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 22:** Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in last st. Fasten off. (8 sc)

Sew thumb and fingertips closed. Stuff Arms and Hands firmly. With thumbs pointing inward, sew Arms to Body between rnds 27–30. Bending Arm slightly, tack back of Hand to Body.

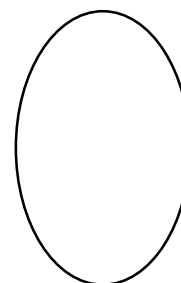

From white felt cut 2 Eyes. Glue Eyes to Head between Cheeks on face.

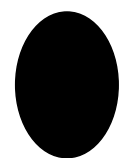

**Double crochet cluster (dc cl):** Keeping last lp of each st on hook, dc in each of next 9 sts (10 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

- Stitch marker



## GAUGE

7 sc = 1½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Do not join at end of each round unless otherwise stated.

Place marker at end of each round.

When told to join, join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Double crochets worked in each bottom half circle will be wrong side facing.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

### Double crochet cluster (dc cl):

Keeping last lp of each st on hook, 2 dc in indicated st, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

### Cluster V-stitch

(cl V-st): (Dc cl—see *Special Stitches*, ch 3, dc cl) in next st.

### Beginning cluster V-stitch (beg cl V-st):

(Ch 2, sc, ch 3, dc cl) in next st.

### Corner bottom half circle:

Ch 16, sl st in 12th ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 2 chs on ch-16, sc in next ch, 6 dc in ch-12 ring, sk next 3 sts on previous rnd, sc in corner ch-3 sp on previous rnd, 8 dc in ch-12 ring.

### Valley bottom half circle:

Ch 16, sl st in 12th ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 2 chs on ch-16, sc in next ch, 6 dc in ch-12 ring, sk next 3sts on previous rnd, sc in next ch-1 sp on previous rnd, 8 dc in ch-12 ring.

**Picot:** Ch 6, sc in 5th ch from hook.

### Cluster V-stitch picot

(cl V-st picot): (Dc cl, **picot**—see *Special Stitches*, ch 1, dc cl) in indicated st.

**Bottom half circle:** Ch 16, sl st in 12th ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 2 chs on ch-16, sc in next ch, 6 dc in ch-12 ring, sk next 3 sts on previous rnd, sc in

next st on previous rnd, 8 dc in ch-12 ring.

**Top half circle:** Working opposite bottom half circle, 16 dc in next ch-12 ring.

## AFGHAN

**Rnd 1:** Ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 5th ch from hook to form ring, [ch 6, sc in ring] 5 times, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*).

**Rnd 2:** \*Ch 6, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, rep from \* 4 times.

**Rnd 3:** \*Ch 6, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, rep from \* 4 times.

**Rnd 4:** \*Ch 6, 3 sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in each st across to st before next ch-6 sp, sk next st, rep from \* 4 times.

**Rnds 5–25:** Rep rnd 4. (5 ch sps, 245 sc at end of last rnd)

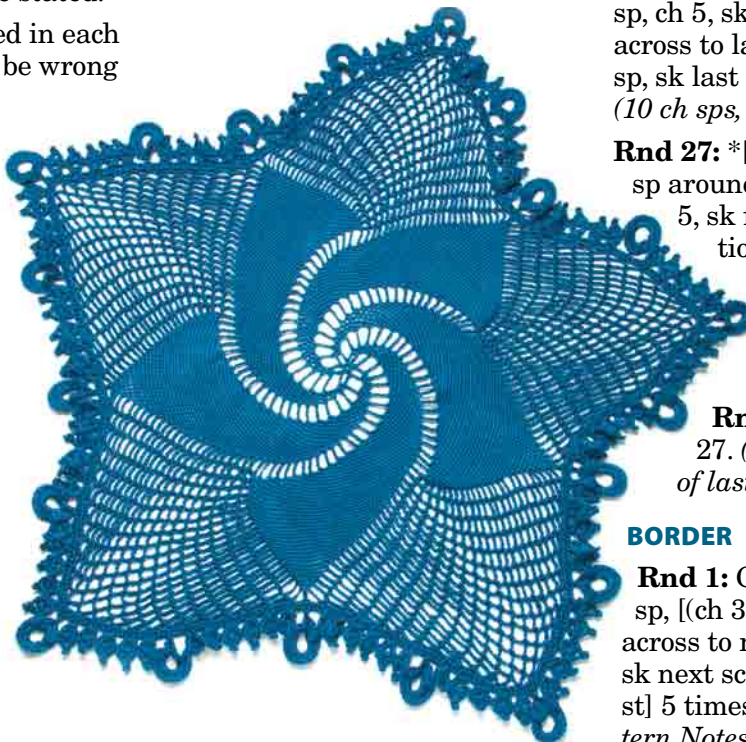
**Rnd 26:** \*Ch 5, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 5, sk next sc, sc in each st across to last st before next ch-6 sp, sk last st, rep from \* 4 times. (10 ch sps, 235 sc)

**Rnd 27:** \*[Ch 5, sc] in each ch-5 sp around to next sc section, ch 5, sk first sc of next sc section, sc in each st across to st before next ch-5 sp, sk next st, rep from \* 4 times. (15 ch sps, 225 sc)

**Rnds 28–48:** Rep rnd 27. (120 ch sps, 5 sc at end of last rnd)

## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, [(ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp) across to next sc section, ch 3, sk next sc, dc in next sc, sk next st] 5 times, ch 3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, hdc in same st as beg ch-1, 3 hdc in next ch-3 sp, [hdc in next sc, 3 hdc in next ch-3 sp] 11 times, \*(3 hdc, ch 3, 3 hdc) in next ch-3 sp (*corner*), [hdc in next st, 3 hdc in next ch-3 sp] 12 times, ch 1\*\*, [hdc in next st, 3 hdc in next ch-3 sp] 12 times, rep from\* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first st.

**Rnd 3: Beg cl V-st** (*see Special Stitches*) in same st as join, [ch 1, sk next 3 sts, **cl V-st** (*see Special Stitches*) in next st] 5 times, **bottom half circle** (*see Special Stitches and Pattern Notes*), \*[ch 1, sk next 3 sts, cl V-st] 5 times, **corner bottom half circle** (*see Special Stitches*), [ch 1, sk next 3 sts, cl V-st] 5 times, bottom half circle, [ch 1, sk next 3 sts, cl V-st]

6 times, **valley bottom half circle** (*see Special Stitches*)\*\*, [ch 1, sk next 3 sts, cl V-st] 6 times, bottom half circle, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, join with sc in top of first cl V-st. (110 cl V-sts, 20 bottom half circles)

**Rnd 4: Cl V-st picot** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc cl, sc in next ch-1 sp, [sc in next dc cl, cl V-st picot in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc cl, sc in next ch-1 sp] 5 times, **top half circle** (*see Special Stitches*), sc in next ch-1 sp, \*[[sc in next dc cl, cl V-st picot in next ch-3 sp, sc in next dc cl, sc in ch-1 sp] 5 times, top half circle, sc in next ch-1 sp] twice, [[sc in next dc cl, cl V-st picot in next

ch-3 sp, sc in top of next dc cl, sc in next ch-1 sp] 6 times, top half circle, sc in next ch-1 sp] twice, rep from \* around, join in first st. Fasten off. (110 cl V-st picots, 20 top half circles)

Weave in ends. **CW**

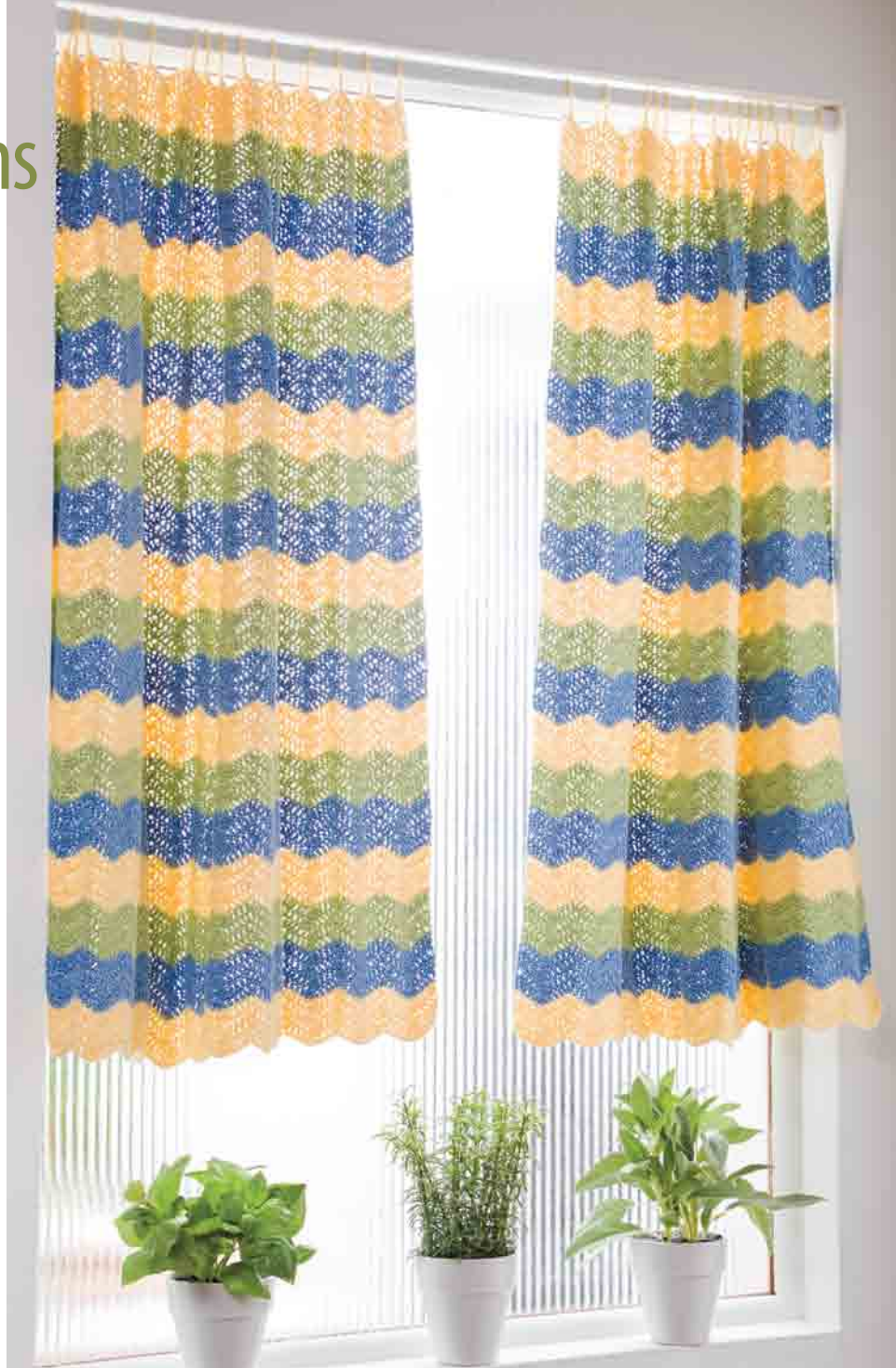

**Row 2:** Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each dc across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, dc in next 9 dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, [dc in each of next 10 dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc]

twice, dc in each of next 10 dc, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 6 dc, [ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 4 dc] 3 times, dc in each of next 3 dc, turn. (28 dc, 9 ch-2 sps)

**Row 6:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 6 dc, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 4 dc] 3 times, dc in each of next 3 dc, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 2, dc in each dc across and 2 dc in each ch-2 sp, turn. (46 dc)

**Rows 8–19:** [Rep rows 2–7 consecutively] twice.

**Rows 20 & 21:** [Rep rows 2 and 3]. Fasten off at end of last row.

## BACK

**Row 1:** With maize, ch 47, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across, turn. (46 dc)

**Rows 2–21:** Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 21, fasten off.

## STRIPES

**Make 1 each scarlet and navy & 4 victory red/mexicana.**

**Row 1:** Ch 48, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across. Fasten off.

## JOINING

**Rnd 1:** Holding Front and Back tog and working through both thicknesses, join maize in row 21 top right corner with sc, \*(ch 3, sc) in same corner st as beg sc, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across with last sc



in corner, (ch 3, sc) in same corner sp, working down side edge, [ch 2, sc in top of next dc or 2nd ch of ch-2 at end of row] across with sc in corner, rep from \* around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Weave stripes through open squares of Front, weaving

verticals first, [under 2 ch-2 sps] 3 times with victory red/mexicana, navy and victory red/mexicana. Weave horizontal stripes under 2 dc of rows 5, 11 and 17, weaving victory red/mexicana, scarlet and victory red/mexicana.

**Rnd 2:** Join scarlet in any corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, \*(sc, hdc, 3 dc,

hdc, sc) in corner ch-3 sp, [(sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in each of next 3 ch-2 sps, working in end st of stripe and ch-2 sp, (sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc)] 3 times, [(sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times, rep from \* around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

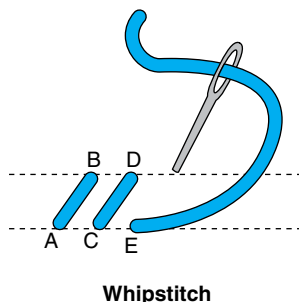

Fasten off. (14 hanging lps)

### CLIP-ON EDGING

**Row 77:** With A, ch 1, 2 sc in

first dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) 3 dc tog, sc in each of next 3 dc, \*3 sc in next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, sc dec 3 dc tog, sc in each of next 3 dc, rep from \* across to turning ch, 2 sc in top of turning ch. Fasten off.

Each Curtain Panel uses 14 clip-on curtain rings across row 77.

Block to finished measurements. **CW**

### NAPKIN POCKET

**Row 1:** Position Body vertically and, working in Body Trim, join azure in 23rd sc from left edge, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 20 sc, turn. (21 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] 9 times, turn. (11 dc, 10 ch-1 sps)

**Row 3:** Ch 4, dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] across, turn.

**Rows 4–11:** Rep row 3.

**Row 12:** Ch 1, sc in each dc and each ch-1 sp across, working through both thicknesses down side edge of rows and in **rem lps** (see *Pattern Notes*) of sc on corresponding row of Body, sl st evenly sp down to bottom edge. Fasten off.

**Row 13:** Join azure in side edge of row 1 of Napkin Pocket and working through both thicknesses up side edge of rows and in rem lps of sc on corresponding row of Body, sl st evenly sp to top edge of row 12. Fasten off.

### UTENSIL POCKET

**Make 3.**

**Row 1:** Sk next dc row, next sc row and next dc row, attach azure in rem lp of first sc at


bottom of Body and working over bottom portion of sc, sc in rem lp of each of next 23 sts, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 4, sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] 10 times, turn. (12 dc, 11 ch-1 sps)

**Rows 3 & 4:** Rep row 2.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, working through both thicknesses of each st of row 4 and in rem lps of sc on corresponding row of Body, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

### TIES

Fold top edge down 3 inches. Beg at right-hand side, fold Utensil Pockets over each other and over Napkin Pocket. Fold left side matching edge to sc row before cl sts. Pin in place. \*Attach azure in bar between 2nd and 3rd dc of edge, ch 40. Fasten off. Tie knot in end of ch. Sk 4 inches and rep from \* twice. Tie all 3 Ties in bows to close securely.

Fasten off.

### Boat 1

**Row 1:** With RS of Doily facing up, join C to first dc on last row of Sail, ch 9 (*counts as first dc and ch-6*), sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, [6 dc in next ch-6 sp, dc in next dc] 3 times, 6 dc in last ch sp, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-9, turn. (29 sts)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in first 2 dc, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last st and beg ch-3, turn. (27 sts)

**Row 4:** Ch 3, sk first sc, **dc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 3 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (25 sts)

**Row 5:** Rep row 3. Fasten off.

### Boats 2–6

**Row 1:** With RS of Doily facing up, join C to first dc on last row of next Sail, ch 9 (*counts as first dc and ch-6*), sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 6, sk next 6 dc, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn.

**Rows 2–5:** Rep rows 2–5 of Boat 1.

### Starfish 1

Ch 5, join D in 5th ch from hook to form ring, **Starfish arm** (*see Special Stitches*) twice, **Right-hand Sail join** (*see Special Stitches*), Starfish arm twice. Fasten off.

### Starfish 2

Ch 5, join D in 5th ch from hook to form ring, Starfish arm twice, **Starfish join** (*see Special Stitches*), Starfish arm once, **Left-hand Sail join** (*see Special Stitches*). Fasten off.

Work Starfish 1 and Starfish 2 between rem Sails.

### Fill-In Background

**Row 1:** With RS of Doily facing, join A in 4th ch-3 sp to left of Sail join on rnd 9 of Center, ch 4 (*counts as first tr*), sk first ch-3 sp on Sail Edging to right, tr in next ch-3 sp of same Sail Edging, ch 2, (tr, ch 2) 4 times in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-4, sc in 2nd ch-3 sp of next scallop on Center, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp on same scallop, sk next 2 ch-3 sps on rnd 9 of Center, tr shell in next ch-3 sp, sk first ch-3 at top on Sail Edging to left, tr in next ch-3 sp of same Sail Edging, ch 3, sk next 2 ch-3 sps on same Sail Edging, dtr in next ch-3 sp on Sail Edging, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp on first tr shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, scallop in next ch-3 sp, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp on next tr shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp,

ch 3, sk next 2 ch-3 sps on Sail Edging, dtr in next ch-3 sp on same Sail Edging, ch 3, sk next 2 ch-3 sps on same Sail Edging, **tr tr** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp on same Sail Edging, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in 2nd ch-3 sp of next scallop, ch 2, (tr, ch 3, sl st in picot on top arm of first Starfish, ch 3, tr) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, (tr, ch 3, sl st in picot on top arm of next Starfish, ch 3, tr) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next 2 ch-3 sps on Sail Edging, tr tr in next ch-3 sp on same Sail Edging. Fasten off.

Rep Fill-In Background around.

### Border

**Rnd 1:** With RS of Doily facing, join A in first st of row 5 of any Boat, ch 6 (*counts as first dc and ch-3*), sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, [ch 3, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st] twice, [ch 3, sk next st, dc in next st] twice, [ch 3, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st] 3 times, \*ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook, dc in first free arm of Starfish, ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook, dc in next arm of Starfish, ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook, dtr in Starfish join, [ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook, dc in next Starfish arm] twice, (ch 5, tr in 5th ch from hook) twice\*\*, dc in first st of next boat, [ch 3, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st] 3 times, [ch 3, sk next st, dc in next st] twice, [ch 3, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st] 3 times, rep from \* 6 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in first ch-3 sp, ch 6 (*counts as first tr and ch-2*), (tr, ch 2) 4 times in same sp as beg ch-6, sk next ch-3 sp, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp, tr shell in next ch-3 sp, ch 2] twice, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sk next ch-3 sp, \*[ch 2, tr shell in next ch-5 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-5 sp] 4 times,

ch 2\*\*, [tr shell in next ch-3 sp, sk next ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sk next ch-3 sp] twice, rep from \* 5 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 4th ch of beg ch-6. (36 tr shells)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in each ch st and sp across to next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, \*ch 2, **border scallop** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk 2 ch-2 sps, sc in 2nd ch-2 sp of next tr shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp of same tr shell, rep from \* around, ch 2, join in first sc.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, sk next ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in first dtr of next scallop, [ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dtr of scallop] 4 times, \*sc in next ch-3 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in first dtr of next scallop, [ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next dtr of scallop] 4 times, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 5:** Join B with sc in first ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp] 8 times, \*ch 3, sk next 3 sts, [sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3] 8 times, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## Flag

### Make 6.

With F, ch 10, hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in next ch, dc in each of next 3 chs, tr in each of last 3 chs. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Using sewing needle and sewing thread, sew 1 Flag to top of each Sail as shown in photo.

### BLANKET

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 180, 4 dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*) (*counts as first half shell*), \*sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 3 chs, \*\* **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, rep from \* across to last ch, ending last rep at \*\*, 5 dc in last ch, turn.

**Row 2 (RS):** Work row 2 as follows:

**A.** Ch 1, \*sc in next st, pull up lp in each of next 6 sts (7 lps on hook), **work lps off hook** (see *Special Stitches*);

**B.** [sk first vertical bar, **Tunisian simple st** (see *Special Stitches*) in each of next 5 sts, pull up lp in next st, work lps off hook] 3 times; (1 *Tunisian square*);

**C.** ch 1, sk first vertical bar, **bind off** (see *Special Stitches*) each of next 5 sts; (1 *Tunisian square*);

**D.** rep from \* consecutively 20 times, turn after last 5 bound-off sts. (21 *Tunisian squares* at end of last row)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, \*sc in each of next 5 sts across top of Tunisian square, sc in end of each row along side of Tunisian square, sc in next sc, rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 4, **dc half cl** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 4, sc in next st, \*ch 4, **dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 4, sc in next sc, rep from \* across to last 4 sc, dc half cl, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, 4 dc in first ch of beg ch-3 just made, sc in next sc, \*shell in center of next cl, sc in next sc, rep from \* across to half cl, 5 dc in center of half cl.

**Rows 6–81:** [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 19 times.

**Rows 82–84:** Rep rows 2–4 once. At the end of last row, do not fasten off.


### Border

**Rnd 1:** Ch 3 (*counts as first dc*), 4 dc in center st of last dc half cl of last row, sc in point of next Tunisian square, \*[shell in center st created by both rows 3 and 4, sc in point of next Tunisian square] across to next corner, shell in corner, rep from \* around to beg dc half cl, work 4 dc in starting corner, join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.



**Note:** From this point on, all sts will be worked in natural sps between dc.

**Rnd 2:** Sl st **between** (see *Note*) the 5th and 6th dc, ch 6, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (*counts as first dc and picot*), [dc between next 2 dc, **picot** (see *Special Stitches*)] twice, ch 1, \*[dc between 2nd and 3rd dc, picot] 5 times, ch 1, rep from \* for all rem 9-dc shells around to starting shell, dc between 2nd and 3rd dc, picot, [dc between the next 2 dc, picot] twice, join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

Some blocking may be necessary.

**Rnd 12:** Join C in back lp of same st as join of previous rnd, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first st. (30 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Working in back lps only, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (30 sc)

**Rnd 14:** Ch 1, working in both lps, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sts, \*sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of last 5 sts, join in first st. (26 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sts, \*sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of last 5 sts, join in first st. (22 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sts, \*sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of last 4 sts, join in first st. (18 sc)

**Rnd 17:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sts, \*sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, sc in each of last 2 sts, join in first st. (14 sc)

**Rnd 18:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, \*sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, sc in last st, join in first st. (10 sc)

**Rnd 19:** Ch 1, sc dec in same st as beg ch-1 and in next st, \*sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* 3 times, join in first st. Leaving 6-inch tail, fasten off C. (5 sc)

### RIM

**Rnd 1:** Join C in front lp of rnd 12, ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2 and in each of next 4 sts, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st, rep

from \* around, join to top of beg ch-2. Fasten off C. (36 hdc)

### FINISHING

Thread tail from rnd 19 of Light through needle and weave through rem 5 sc, pull tight to gather. Pull tail to WS and knot to secure. Trim ends as necessary.

Tighten lid on baby-food jar and center bottom of jar on outside bottom of larger jar and glue in place. Allow to completely dry.

Place open end of large jar over lamp base. Slide Lighthouse over assembled glass jars, adjusting to fit.

## MIDSUMMER'S EVE

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 counts as first treble crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Any recycled glass jar that has a 3-inch top opening and is at least 5½ inches high can be used as long as the top opening will fit base of lamp.

Do not leave lamp unattended when lit.

### LAMP COVER

**Rnd 1:** Ch 10, (counts as first tr and ch-5), tr in 10th ch from hook to form ring, \*ch 5, tr in same ch as first tr, rep from \* 3 times, ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 4th chain of beg ch-10. (6 tr)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 7 (see *Pattern Notes*), \*(tr, ch 3, tr) in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, tr in next tr, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (18 tr)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 7, \*(tr, ch 3) in each of next 3 ch-5 sps, ch 3, tr in next tr, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (24 tr)

## MIDSUMMER'S EVE

### SKILL LEVEL

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (400 yds per ball):

- 5½-inch-tall glass jar with 3-inch mouth
- Large-eye sewing needle
- Wood paint or stain (*optional*)
- Paintbrush (*optional*)

### GAUGE

[(Tr, ch 3) twice, tr] = 1 inch;  
2 tr mesh rows = 1 inch

**Rnds 4–12:** Ch 7, \*tr in next tr, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch 7. (24 tr)

**Rnd 13:** Ch 6 (counts as tr and ch-2), \*tr in next tr, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-6. Place jar inside Lamp Cover. (24 tr)

**Rnd 14:** Ch 5 (counts as first tr and ch-1), \*tr in next tr, ch 2, rep from \* around, join in 4th ch of beg ch 6. Leaving an 18-inch tail, fasten off. (24 tr)

### ASSEMBLY

Weave thread tail through top of last rnd and gather up to fit snugly around threads of jar neck. Knot to secure, weave in and trim ends.

Optional: Paint or stain base, if desired, and allow to dry completely.

Place jar on lamp base. **cw**

### Wedges 2–7

**Rows 11–58:** [Rep rows 3–10 consecutively] 6 times.

### Wedge 8

**Rows 59–65:** Rep rows 3–9.

**Row 66:** Bind off each st across. Fasten off.

### ASSEMBLY

Weave length of E through ends of rows at center of Inner Circle, pull tight, sew row 1 to row 66.

Sew ends of rows at outside of Inner Circle to ends of rows at center of Outer Circle.

### TRIM

With size K hook and 2 strands E held tog, join with sl st in end of any row at outside of Outer Circle, ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) evenly sp around, join with sl st in first st. Fasten off. **CW**

**Row 3:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, turn. Fasten off. (8 sc)

**Row 5:** Join white in back lp of first sc, rep row 3. (8 sc)

**Row 6:** Rep row 4.

**Row 7:** Rep row 3.

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off. (8 sc)

**Row 9:** Join victory red in back lp of first sc, ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, turn. (8 sc)

**Rows 10 & 11:** Rep rows 3 and 4. (8 sc)

**Row 12:** Rep row 3. Fasten off.

### FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Flag and secure to magnet.

### WINE BOTTLE

**Row 1:** With size 8 hook and purple, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–9:** Rep row 2.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (4 sc)

**Rows 11 & 12:** Rep row 2.

**Row 13:** Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice, turn. (2 sc)

**Rows 14–19:** Rep row 2. At the end of row 19, **do not fasten off**.

### EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, sc evenly sp around outer edge, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each bottom corner of neck of bottle, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### LABEL

**Row 1:** With white, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn. (4 sc)

**Rows 2–4:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 4, fasten off.

Center Label on Wine Bottle and with length of black, stitch around just inside outer edge.

### FINISHING

Cut magnetic sheeting in slightly smaller shape of Bottle and secure to magnet. **CW**

(same sts as sl sts worked in rnd 1), ch 1, encasing sl sts of rnd 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

### HANDLE EDGE DOUBLE-STITCH BORDER

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join 2 strands of black in any st along

inside edge of Handle Opening, sl st in each st around, join in first sl st.

**Rnd 2:** Working in same sts of Handle Opening as rnd 1, ch 1, encasing sl sts of rnd 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Fold Sleeping Bag and insert into Tote. **CW**

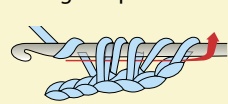

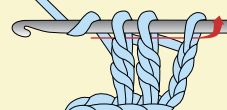

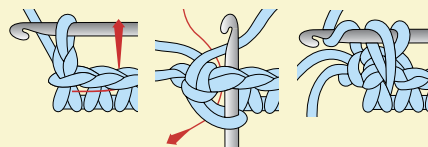

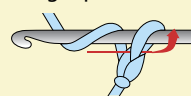

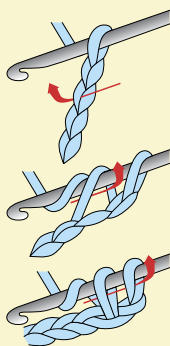
