- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/ \(364 \mathrm{yds} / 198 \mathrm{~g}\) per skein):

5 skeins \#0406 medium thyme (A)
2 skeins each \#256 carrot (C) and \#0321 gold (B)
1 skein \#0776 dark orchid (D)
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

\section*{GAUGE}

Flower Motif \(=7 ½\) inches

\section*{PATTERN NOTES}

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

After the first motif is worked, all others are joined while working round 7 .

Motifs are joined in 6 rows of 8 motifs (see Placement Diagram, page 60).

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 3 , sl st in next ch -1 sp , ch 3 , [dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 3 , sl st in next ch- 1 sp , ch 3 ] 7 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch3. Fasten off. ( \(24 d c, 16 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}\) )

Rnd 4: Working in front of rnds 2 and 3 in unworked dc of rnd 1 , join C with sc in any unworked dc, ch 7, [sc in next sk dc, ch 7] 7 times, join in beg sc. ( 8 sc , 8 ch-7 sps)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [(2 sc, 3 dc, 2 sc) in next ch-7 sp (petal made)] 8 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (8 petals)
Rnd 6: Join A in first st of any 3 -dc group of rnd 3, ch 3, 2 dc in same st, dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, ch 1 , sk next 2 ch- 3 sps, [ 3 dc in next st, dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, ch 1 , sk next 2 ch- 3 sps] 7 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( \(56 \mathrm{dc}, 8 \mathrm{ch}-1 \mathrm{sps}\) )
Rnd 7: Ch 3 , dc in next st, sk next st, working in back lps (see Stitch Guide), (dc, ch 1, dc) in 4th st of corresponding petal from rnd 5 and in next st of current round, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch- 1 sp , [dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, working in back lp of 4th st of corresponding petal from rnd 5 and next st of current round, (dc, ch 1, dc), sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, (dc, ch 3 , dc) in next ch- 1 spl 7 times, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. ( \(64 d c\) )

\section*{JOINING FLOWER MOTIF}

Rnds 1-6: Rep rnds 1-6 of First Flower Motif.

Rnd 7 (joining rnd): Ch 3, dc in next st, sk next st, working in
back lps, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 4th st of corresponding petal from rnd 5 and in next st of current round, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, (dc, ch 1, sl st in corresponding ch-3 sp of previous Flower Motif, ch 1, dc) in next ch- 1 sp on current rnd, *dc in each of next 2 sts on current rnd, sk next st, working in back lps, (dc, sl st in corresponding ch- 1 sp of previous Flower Motif, dc) in 4th st of corresponding petal from rnd 5 and next st of current rnd, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts on current rnd, (dc, ch \(1, \mathrm{sl}\) st in corresponding ch-3 sp of previous Flower Motif, ch 1, dc) in next ch-1 sp, rep from * for each side until necessary sides are joined, \({ }^{* *}\) dc in each of next 2 sts on current rnd, sk next st, working in back lps, (dc, ch 1, dc) in 4th st of corresponding petal from rnd 5 and in next st of current rnd, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, (dc, ch \(3, \mathrm{dc}\) ) in next ch- 1 sp , rep from ** around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

\section*{FILLER MOTIF}

Rnd 1: With D, ch 4, join in 4th ch from hook to form ring, ch 3 ,

When a friend first taught my mother to crochet in 1975, I immediately knew this was something I had to learn as well. Being left-handed presented some
 obstacles, but, persistence paid off, and I began to crochet at the age of 10 . The only pattern I knew back then was the basic granny square. I eventually learned to read patterns in my early 20s after having my second daughter and becoming a stay-at-home mom. I used to look at patterns and say to myself, "Why didn't I think of that?"

It wasn't until just three years ago that I took the plunge and started coming up with my own designs. Those first creations were very basic, but, eventually, I started to see how those simple stitches and shapes could work together to create the appearance of something more complex.

I enjoyed bringing this afghan to life and hope that you enjoy making it as much as I did.

\section*{GAUGE}

4 sc , dc sts \(=1\) inch; 10 rows of sc, \(\mathrm{dc}=3\) inches

\section*{PATTERN NOTES}

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

\section*{PATTERN STITCH}

Single crochet in next double crochet; double crochet in next single crochet.

\section*{TOWEL}

Row 1: Ch 55, sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, [sc in
next ch, dc in next ch] across, turn. (54 sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, turn. ( 54 sts )

Rows 3-40: Rep row 2. At the end of row 40 , do not fasten off.

\section*{TOPPER}

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), pattern st across 9 sts (back), dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, pattern st across next 25 sts (front), sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 11 sts (back), join (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of ch-3. (50 sts)
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same sp as joining, pattern st across 9 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across next 23 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 9 sts , join in top of first sc. (46 sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, pattern st for 8 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across next 21 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 8 sts, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. (42 sts)
Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sc in same st as beg ch-1, pattern st across 7 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across next 19 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 7 sts, join in beg sc. ( 38 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, pattern st across 6 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec
in next 2 sts, pattern st across 17 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 6 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (34 sts)
Rnd 6: Ch 1 , sc in same st as beg ch-1, pattern st in next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across 16 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 4 sts, join in beg sc. (30 sts)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, pattern st in next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across 13 sts , sc dec in next 2 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 3 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (26 sts)
Rnd 8: Ch 1 , sc in same st as beg ch-1, pattern st in next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across 10 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across rem 2 sts, join in beg sc. ( 22 sts)

Rnd 9: Ch 3, pattern st in next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across 8 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st in rem st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 sts)
Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, pattern st in next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, pattern st across 10 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts, join in beg sc. (14 sts)
Rnd 11: Ch 3, pattern st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (14 sts)

Rnd 12: Ch 1, pattern st around, join in beg sc. (14 sts)
Rnds 13-18: Rep rnds 11 and 12.
Rnd 19: Rep rnd 11.

\section*{BUTTON LOOP}

Row 1: Press rnd 19 flat across, working through both thicknesses, ch 1 , work 7 sc across, turn. (7sc)
Row 2: Ch 6, sk next 5 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, work 2 sc in each ch across. Fasten off. (12 sc)

\section*{ASSEMBLY}

Fold Button Loop down as desired on Topper section, sew button to center of Topper and button.

\section*{DISHCLOTH}

Row 1: Ch 31, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (30 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, dc in next sc, pattern st across, turn. (30 sts)
Rows 3-26: Rep row 2. At the end of row 26, do not turn.

\section*{EDGING}

Rnd 1: Ch 1, *(sc, ch 1 , sc) in corner sp, ch 1, [sc, ch 1] evenly sp \(1 / 2\) inch apart across edge. Rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. cw

Instructions fit 32-34-inch bust (small), 36-38-inch bust (medium), 40-42-inch bust (large), 44-46-inch bust (X-large), 48-50-inch bust (2X-large) and 52-54-inch bust (3X-large).

\section*{FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS}

Bust (buttoned): 36 [40, 44, 48, 52, 56] inches
Length: \(24[25,26,27,28,29]\) inches

\section*{MATERIALS}
- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3 oz/145 yds/ 85 g per skein):
\(10[11,12,13,14,15]\) skeins \#300 denim mist
- Size F/5/3.75mm [G/6/4mm, H/8/5mm, I/9/5.5mm, J/10/6mm, \(\mathrm{K} / 101 / 2 / 6.5 \mathrm{~mm}\) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

\section*{PATTERN NOTES}

Jacket sizes are determined by hook sizes. The hooded jacket is worked in one piece in the following order: yoke, body, sleeves and hood. The pattern is extremely adjustable for those whose size is not quite standard. If possible, try on the jacket during construction, especially after the yoke has been completed, to ensure a proper fit or place the work over a garment that does fit well, especially if the person is not available for fittings.
- Tapestry needle
- 4 stitch markers
- 3/4-inch 2 -holed buttons: 7

\section*{GAUGE}

Size \(\mathbf{F}\) hook (small): Shell, sc, shell \(=3\) inches; 3 rows \(=\) approximately \(1 \frac{1}{2}\) inches
Size G hook (medium): Shell, sc, shell \(=3118\) inches; 3 rows = approximately \(13 / 4\) inches
Size H hook (large): Shell, sc, shell \(=31 / 4\) inches; 3 rows \(=\) approximately 2 inches
Size I hook (X-large): Shell, sc, shell \(=33 / 8\) inches; 3 rows = approximately \(2 \frac{1}{4}\) inches
Size J hook (2X-large): Shell, sc, shell \(=31 / 2\) inches; 3 rows \(=\) approximately \(2 \frac{1}{4}\) inches
Size K hook (3X-large): Shell, sc, shell \(=35 / 8\) inches; 3 rows = approximately \(21 / 4\) inches

\section*{SPECIAL STITCHES}

Shell: 5 dc in indicated st.
Increase (inc): (Sc, ch 1, sc) in indicated st.
Slip ring: Make large lp by drawing yarn tail behind the working yarn, leaving a few inches, insert hook in ring, draw through lp of yarn, work the required sts. At the end, gently pull yarn tail to close ring (see illustration).

\section*{CAR COAT}

\section*{YOKE}

Row 1: Starting at neck, ch 58, 2 dc in 4th ch from hook, *sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, shell (see Special Stitches) in next ch, rep from * across to last 6 chs, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, 3 dc in last ch, turn. (8 shells)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, rep from * across, sc in the top of the beg ch, turn. (9 shells)
Note: Place marker in ch sp between 2 sc of inc.
Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, sc in center of next shell, *[shell in next sc, inc (see Special Stitches) in center of next shell] twice*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, rep from * to * once, shell in next sc, sc in
center of last shell, 3 dc in last st, turn. (8 shells)
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, *[shell in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, rep between * once, shell in last sc, sc in top of the beg ch-3, turn. (13 shells)

Row 5: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, *sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc, rep from * across to last st, 3 dc in last st, turn. (12 shells)
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc, *inc in center of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 4 times, shell in next sc, rep between * once, shell in next sc, sc in center of last shell, shell in last sc, sc in beg ch-3, turn. (13 shells)

Row 7: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in next ch- 1 sp , [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice,


shell in next sc, sc in next ch 1 sp , [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 5 times, *shell in next sc, sc in next ch- 1 sp , shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell, rep from * across to last st, 3 dc in last st, turn. (16 shells)
Row 8: Rep row 2. (17 shells)
Row 9: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, *inc in center of next shell, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 5 times, shell in next sc, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, 3 dc in last st, turn.
Row 10: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, *shell in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, shell in next sc , sc in next ch-1 sp \({ }^{*}\), [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 6 times, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, shell in last sc, sc in last st, turn. (21 shells)
Row 11: Rep row 5. (20 shells)
Row 12: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, *inc in center of next shell, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 6 times, shell in next sc, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] twice, shell in last sc, sc in last st, turn. (21 shells)
Row 13: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] 3 times, *sc in next ch- 1 sp , [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 4 times, shell in next sc, sc in next
ch-1 sp*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 7 times, shell in next sc, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, 3 dc in last st, turn. (24 shells)
Row 14: Rep row 2. (25 shells)
Row 15: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] 3 times, *inc in center of next shell, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 4 times, shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 7 times, shell in next sc, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, 3 dc in last st, turn. (24 shells)
Row 16: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, *shell in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 5 times, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-1 \(\mathrm{sp}^{*}\), [shell in next sc , sc in center of next shell] 8 times, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, shell in last sc, sc in last st, turn. (29 shells)

Row 17: Rep row 5. (28 shells)
Row 18: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [(shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, *shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 5 times, shell in next sc, inc in center of next shell*, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 8 times, rep between * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 3 times, shell in last sc, sc in last st, turn. (29 shells)

Row 19: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] 4 times, *sc in next ch- 1 sp , [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 6 times, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp*, [shell in next sc, sc in
center of next shell] 9 times, shell in next sc, rep from * to * once, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 4 times, 3 dc in last st, turn. (32 shells)
Next rows: Rep rnds 2-7 until piece measures \(10[101 / 2,11\), \(11^{1 / 2}, 12,12^{1 / 2}\) ] inches or desired length from neck to bottom of underarm.

Yoke is now completed. Pin the first and 2nd markers tog to form one sleeve, and the 3rd and 4th markers to form rem sleeve. Try on for size. If too loose, tear back 3 rows or so, if too tight, work another 3 rows or so until comfortable.

\section*{DIVIDE FOR BODY/FORM BOTTOM OF ARMHOLES}

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [shell in next sc, sc in center of next shell] 4 times, 3 dc in next sc, sk next 7 shells (sleeve), 2 dc in next sc, [sc in next shell, shell in next sc] 9 times, sc in center of next shell, 2 dc in next sc, sk next 7 shells (sleeve), 3 dc in next sc, [sc in center of next shell, shell in next sc] 4 times, sc in last st, turn. (19 shells)

(18 shells)
Rows 22-42: [Rep rows 2 and 5 alternately] 10 times, ending with row 2 , or until 1 inch less than the desired finished length.
Row 43: Sk next sc, dc in next dc, hdc in next dc, *sc in top of shell, hdc in next dc, dc in next dc , dc in sc, dc in next dc, hdc in next dc*, rep between * across bottom, ending with a sc. Leaving long tail, fasten off.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 28 sts, 3 sc in next st (corner), [sc in each of next \(39 \mathrm{sts}, 3 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st (corner)] 3 times, sc in each of next 10 sts, join in beg sc. (168 sc)
Rnd 9: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same sc as beg ch-1, sk next 2 sc , [(sc,

5. Use single strand of neon orange and needle to create long straight stitch X's over Mouth as shown in picture, knot to secure and conceal knots between Head and can.
6. Wrap one strand white around 3 fingers 5 times, forming ring; remove from fingers. Cut 4-inch length of white to create tie. Insert tie through center of ring and knot. Cut loops of yarn on opposite side of tied end of ring and glue to right of Head along top edge to create hair tuft. Trim ends as desired.

Rnd 12: Ch 2, [hdc dec (see Stitch Guide) over next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each of next 16 sts, [hdc dec over next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each of next 15 sts, join in beg ch-2. ( 36 hdc )
Rnd 13: Rep rnd 7.
Rnd 14: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 1 , [sk next st, sc in next st, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 15: Ch 1, 2 sc in each ch-1 sp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

\section*{TIE}

\section*{Make 2.}

With size J hook and yellow, ch 65. Fasten off.
Weave Tie through ch- 1 sps of rnd 14 so that ends of first Tie are on right edge and ends of 2nd Tie are on left edge. Knot ends of Ties tog at each side. To close Bag, hold knotted section at each side and pull gently.

\section*{BAT}

Rnd 1: With size G hook and black yarn, ch 7, 3 hdc in 3rd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, 8 hdc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next \(3 \mathrm{chs}, 4 \mathrm{hdc}\) in same st as beg 3 -hdc, join in beg ch-2. (22 sts)
Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in same st as beg ch-1, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 9 , dc in 4 th ch from hook, dc in each of next 5 chs (first wing), sk next sc on rnd 1 , sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in each of next 5 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 9 , dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each of next 5 chs (2nd wing), sk next sc on rnd 1 , sc in each of next \(2 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in last of next 3 sts.
Rnd 3: Sl st in each of next 2 sts,
(sl st, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, sl st) all in same st (first ear), sl st in each of next 5 sts, sl st in each of next 9 chs of wing, (hdc, dc, ch 1 , sl st in top of \(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}\) ) in next st of wing, sl st in each of next 2 sts, (hdc, dc, ch 1, sl st in top of dc, dc, hdc) in next st of wing, sl st in each of last 2 sts of wing, sl st in each of next 13 sts of body, sl st in each of first 2 chs of next wing, (hdc, dc, ch 1 , sl st in top of dc, dc, hdc) in next st of wing, sl st in each of next 2 sts, (hdc, dc, ch 1 , sl st in top of dc, \(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc})\) in next st, sl st in each of next 3 sts, sl st in each of next 6 dc of wing, sl st in each of next 6 sts of head, (sl st, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, ch \(1, \mathrm{sl}\) st) in next st (2nd ear), sl st in each of last 2 sts, leaving 8-inch length of black, fasten off. Sew Bat at a slight angle to center front of Bag.

\section*{PUMPKIN BAG}

\section*{PATTERN NOTES}

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

\section*{BAG}

Rnd 1: With size J hook and pumpkin, ch 9, sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 6 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 6 chs, 2 sc in same ch as beg sc, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (18 sc)
Rnds 2-15: Rep rnds 2-15 of Bat Bag.

TIE
Make 2.
With size J hook and pumpkin, ch 65. Fasten off.
Weave Tie through ch-1 sps of
rnd 14 so that ends of first Tie are on right edge and ends of 2nd Tie are on left edge. Knot ends of Ties tog at each side. To close Bag, hold knotted section at each side and pull gently.

\section*{EYE}

Make 2.
With size J hook and black, ch 3, sc in 2 nd ch from hook, ch 2 , sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in last ch of beg ch-3, leaving 6 -inch length, fasten off.
Sew Eyes evenly sp centered on Bag over rnds 10 and 11.

\section*{MOUTH}

With size J hook and black, ch 10 , sl st in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, 3 tr in next ch, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, sl st in last ch, leaving 12 -inch length of yarn, fasten off.
Sew Mouth centered under Eyes between rnds 4-7.

Picot: Ch 2, sl st in top of last st made.

\section*{BATTY}

\section*{HEAD \& BODY}

Rnd 1: Starting at top of Head, with light purple, ch 4 (beg \(3 s k\) chs counts as first dc), 11 dc in 4th ch from hook, join (see Pattern Notes) in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (12 dc)
Rnd 2: (Ch 3-see Pattern Notes, dc) in first st, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (24 dc)

Rnds 3-7: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnds \(\mathbf{8}\) \& 9: Ch 2 (not counted or used as a st), dc in next st, [dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] around, join in first dc. At the end of rnd 9 , fasten off. ( \(6 d c\) )

Stuff and sew opening closed.

\section*{LEFT WING}

Row 1: With light purple, ch 9, sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in each st across, turn. (16 sc)
Rows 4 \& 5: Rep row 2 .
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, *dc in next st, tr in next st, 2 dtr (see Stitch Guide) in next st, picot (see Special Stitch), 2 dtr in next
st, tr in next st, dc in next st*, sc in each of next 2 sts, rep from * to *, sc in last st, do not turn.
Row 7: Sl st in end of each row across, picot, working across foundation ch, sl st in each ch across, sl st in end of each row across to first st of last row. Fasten off.

\section*{RIGHT WING}

Rows 1-6: Rep rows 1-6 of Left Wing.
Row 7: Sl st in end of each row across, working across foundation ch, sl st in each ch across, picot, sl st in end of each row to first st of last row. Fasten off.
Sew Wings to rnds 4-6 on each side of Body.

\section*{EAR}

Make 2.
With light purple, ch 4, (tr, picot, \(\mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 3, \mathrm{sl} \mathrm{st}\) ) in 4th ch from hook.

Fasten off.
Sew to rnd 2 on each side of Body.

\section*{FACIAL FEATURES}

For mouth, cut 1 strand black yarn 3 inches long and 2 strands each \(1 / 2\) inch long. Glue to rnds 4 and 5 on front of Head and Body.
For fangs, cut 2 pieces of white felt in \(1 / 2\)-inch triangles. Glue Fangs to Mouth.

For eyes, glue beads to rnd 3 centered above mouth.
For nose, glue pompom centered below eyes.
For Hanging loop, tie desired length light purple cotton to center top of Head.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Slip ring: Make large lp by drawing yarn tail behind the working yarn, leaving a few inches, insert hook in ring, draw
through lp of yarn, work the required sts. At the end, gently pull yarn tail to close ring.

Rnd 1: With size K hook, make slip ring (see Special Stitch), ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 11 dc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg ch-3. (12 dc)
Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in beg ch-3. ( 24 dc )

Rnd 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] around, join in beg ch-3. (36 dc)
Rnds 4-8: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in beg ch-3. At the end of rnd 8, do not fasten off.

\section*{FIRST EARFLAP}

Row 1: With size J hook, ch 3, dc in each of next 7 sts , turn. (8dc)
Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each of next 6 sts, leaving last st unworked, turn. ( 7 dc )
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 sts, leaving last st unworked, turn. ( 6 dc )
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 sts, leaving last st unworked, turn. (5 dc)
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, hdc in next st, dc in next st. Fasten off.

\section*{2ND EARFLAP}

Row 1: Sk next 12 sts from last st of row 1 of First Earflap, with size J hook, attach yarn with sl st in next st, ch 3, dc in each of next 7 sts, turn. ( \(8 d c\) )
Rows 2-5: Rep rows 2-5 of First Earflap.

\section*{TRIM}

Rnd 1: With size J hook, join yarn with sl st at back of Hat, ch 1 , sc evenly sp across back of Hat, around outer edge of First Earflap, across front of Hat, 2nd Earflap and across rem of back, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

\section*{TIE}

\section*{Make 2.}

Cut strand of yarn 60 inches long. Fold strand in half, insert hook at center bottom of Earflap, draw strand through at fold to form lp on hook, ch 12 , dc in 3rd ch from hook. Fasten off.

\section*{EAR}

Make 2.
Row 1: With size J hook, make adjustable ring, ch \(3,9 \mathrm{dc}\) in ring, turn. (10 dc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, ( \(2 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}\) ) in next st, hdc in
each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, turn. ( 14 sts)
Rnd 3: Sl st in each of next 6 sts, (2 sc, ch 1, sc) in next tr, sl st in each of next 7 sts. Fasten off.
Sew Ears to each side of Hat between rnds 3 and 4 .

\section*{EYE}

Make 2.
For Eye, cut 2 pieces of yellow felt each in cat's eye shape \(2^{3} / 8\) inches long x \(11 / 2\) inches wide. For pupil, cut 2 pieces black felt each \(1^{3 / 8}\) inches long \(x 1 / 2\) inch wide.

Position Eyes between rnds 5 and 6 with \(7 / 8\)-inch sp between Eyes at bottom of Eyes and Pupils on top of Eyes. Place felting mat inside Hat, hold the felt pieces lightly with fingers and punch straight down with
needle, felting until Eye and pupils are attached.
If not familiar with felting technique, use sewing needle and matching thread to sew Eyes and pupils to Hat.

Picot: Ch 3, sl st in indicated st.

Rnd 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), tr in same st as beg ch-3, [tr in next st, 2 tr in next st] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (36 tr)
Rnd 4: Ch 3 , tr in same st as beg ch-3, [tr in each of next 2 tr , 2 tr in next tr] around, join in top of beg ch-3. ( 48 tr )
Rnd 5: Ch 3 , tr in same st as beg ch-3, [tr in each of next 3 tr , 2 tr in next tr] around, join in top of beg ch-3. ( 60 tr )

Rnd 6: Ch 3 , tr in same st as joining, [tr in each of next \(4 \mathrm{tr}, 2\) tr in next tr] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (72 tr)
Rnd 7: Ch 3 , tr in same st as beg ch-3, [tr in each of next 5 tr , 2 tr in next tr] around, join in top of beg ch-3. ( 84 tr )
Rnd 8: Rep rnd 4. (112 tr)
Rnd 9: Beg 3-tr shell (see Special Stitches) in same place as join, [ch 6, sk next 4 tr, dc in
next tr, ch 6 , sk next 5 tr , dc in next tr, ch 6 , sk next 4 tr , \(\mathbf{3 - t r}\) shell (see Special Stitches) in next tr] around, ch 6 , join in top of beg ch-3. (7 3-tr shells, 21 ch-6 sps)
Rnd 10: Beg 5-tr shell (see Special Stitches), [ch 6, sk next ch-6 sp and next dc, sc in center of next ch-6 sp, ch 6 , sk next dc and next ch-6 sp, 5-tr shell (see Special Stitches) in next 3-tr shell] around, ch 6, sk next ch-6 sp and next dc, sc in center of next ch- 6 sp , ch 6 , sk next dc and next ch-6 sp, join in top of beg ch-3. (75-tr shells, 14 ch-6 sps)
Rnd 11: Ch 3 , tr in each of next 4 tr , [ch \(2,3-\mathrm{tr}\) shell in next tr, ch \(2, \operatorname{tr}\) in each of next \(5 \mathrm{tr}, \operatorname{ch} 4\), 3 -tr shell in next sc, ch 4, tr in each of next 5 tr ] around, ch 4, join in top of beg ch-3. (14 3-tr shells, 70 tr, 14 ch- 6 sps)

Rnd 12: Beg 5-tr cl (see Special Stitches), [ch 2, 5 -tr shell in next 3 -tr shell, ch \(2,5-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}\) in next 5 tr] around, ch 2 , join in top of beg ch-3. (14 5-tr cl, \(145-\operatorname{tr}\) shell)
Rnd 13: Sl st across to first tr, ch \(3, \operatorname{tr}\) in each of next 4 tr , [ch \(2,3-\operatorname{tr}\) shell in next tr, ch 2 , \(\operatorname{tr}\) in each of next 5 tr , ch 2 , sk next \(5-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}, \mathrm{tr}\) in each of next 5 tr\(]\) around, ch 2 , join in top of beg ch-3. (140 tr, 143 -tr shell)
Rnd 14: Beg 5-tr cl, [ch 2, 5-tr shell in next 3 -tr shell, ch 2 , \(5-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}\) in next 5 tr , ch 2, \(5-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}\) in next 5 tr ] around, ch 2 , join in top of beg ch-3. ( \(285-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}, 14\) 5-tr shell)

Rnd 2: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, [ 2 sc in next st, sc in next st] twice, 2 sc in next st, rep from * once.

Rnd 3: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from * once.

Rnd 4: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next \(2 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st, sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * once.
Rnd 5: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in
each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next \(3 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st, rep from * once.
Rnd 6: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next \(8 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st, sc in each of next \(4 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st, rep from * once.
Rnd 7: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next \(10 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next
st, sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * once.
Rnd 8: *Sc in each of next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next \(12 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}\) in next st, sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from * once.
Rnds 9-20: Sc in each sc around, join in first sc. At end of last rnd, fasten off. Weave in ends.

\section*{CUSHION}

Place finished Bed on brown wrapping paper. Trace around bottom of bed. Cut pattern out of paper.
Pin pattern to fabric. Using pattern, cut 2.
With RS facing, pin and stitch, leaving a 4 -inch opening. Turn Cushion RS out and stuff. Turn opening edges under and stitch closed.

(8 shells)
Rows 2-24: Ch 1, sc in the same sp as beg ch- 1 , shell in next sc, work in pattern until Hood measures \(14 \frac{1}{2}\) inches or desired height.

\section*{BUTTONS}

Rnd 1: Make a slip ring (see Special Stitches, page 10), ch 1, 8 sc in ring, join in beg ch-1, turn. ( 8 sc )

across back edge of Body, [sc in each of next 2 sts, position next Leg between sc sts, do not sk
