SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

Approximately 52 inches from point to point

MATERIALS

- Universal Yarn Classic Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per ball):
5 balls #608 sand (MC)
2 balls #632 leaf green (A)
1 ball #611 cocoa (B)
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

4 dc = 1 inch; rnds 1–4 = 3½ inches in diameter

PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as beginning double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as beginning double crochet and chain-1 or beginning front post double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

AFGHAN

BODY

Rnd 1: With MC, ch 3, 8 hdc in

3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs count as first hdc*), **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in top of beg 2 sk chs. (9 hdc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), **fpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around beg 2 sk chs of previous rnd, [dc in next st, fpdc around same st as last dc worked in] 8 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 dc, 9 fpdc)

Rnd 3: Sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, **ch 4** (*see Pattern Notes*), fpdc around next st, [ch 1, fpdc around next st] around, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (18 fpdc, 18 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 4: Sl st around beg ch-4 of previous rnd, ch 3, [2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, **fptr** (*see Stitch Guide*) around next dc, ch 1, 2 dc

in next ch-1 sp, fpdc around next dc] 8 times, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next dc, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 fpdc, 9 fptr, 36 dc, 18 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 5: Sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, ch 3, [sk next dc, dc in next dc and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 sp and in next dc, sk next dc, fpdc around next dc] 8 times, sk next dc, dc in next dc and in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 sp and in next dc, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 fpdc, 9 fptr, 36 dc, 18 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 6: Sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, ch 3, [sk next dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next



Spokes of post-stitch ridges give a new textural twist to the ever-popular round ripple afghan design.

ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, sk next dc, fpdc around next dc] 8 times, sk next dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 fpdc, 9 fptr, 54 dc, 18 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 7: Sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, ch 3, [sk next dc, dc in each dc across to next ch-1 sp, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in each dc across to last st before next fpdc, sk next dc, fpdc around next dc] 8 times, sk next dc, dc in each dc across to next ch-1 sp, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in each dc across to last st before first fpdc, join in top of beg ch-3. (9 fpdc, 9 fptr, 72 dc, 18 ch-1 sps)

Rnds 8–14: Rep rnd 7. At end of last rnd, fasten off MC.

Rnd 15: With A, sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, ch 3, [sk next dc, dc in each dc across to next ch-1 sp, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in each dc across to last st before next fpdc, sk next dc, fpdc around next dc] 8 times, sk next dc, dc

in each dc across to next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fptr around next fptr, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in each dc across to last st before first fpdc, join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnds 16 & 17: Rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 18–20: With MC, rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 21–23: With B, rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 24–26: With MC, rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 27–29: With A, rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 30–37: With MC, rep rnd 15. At end of last rnd, **do not fasten off.**

Rnds 38 & 39: Sl st around beg ch-3 of previous rnd, ch 3, [sk next dc, sc in each st across to next ch-1 sp, (sc, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fpdc around next st, ch 1, (hdc, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in each st across to last st before next fpdc, sk next st, fpdc around next st] 8 times, sk next st, sc in each st across to next ch-1 sp, (sc, hdc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, fpdc around next st, ch 1, (hdc, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in each st across to last st before first fpdc, join in top of beg ch-3.

SKILL LEVEL



FINISHED SIZE

17 x 46 inches

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (Special Value size) (1,000 yds per ball):
1,200 yds #201 white
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

Snowflake Motif: 4 inches in diameter

Fill-In Motif: 2 inches in diameter

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Each Snowflake Motif requires 19 yards crochet cotton and each Fill-In Motif requires 2½ yards crochet cotton.

RUNNER

SNOWFLAKE MOTIFS

First Motif

Rnd 1: Ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 6th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 16 sc in ring, join in first sc. (16 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same sc as beg ch-1, sk next sc, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next sc, sk next sc] 7 times, join in beg sc. (8 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, 5 sc in each ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc. (40 sc)

Rnd 4: Sl st in 3rd sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, ch 10, [sc in 3rd sc of next 5-sc group, ch 10] 7 times, join in beg sc. (8 ch-10 sps)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, (5 sc, ch 6, 5 sc) in each ch-10 sp around, join in beg sc. (8 ch-6 sps)

Rnd 6: Sl st in each sc across to next ch-6 sp, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 12 dc in same ch-6 sp, 13 dc in each rem ch-6 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (8 groups 13 dc)

Rnd 7: Sl st in 3rd dc, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next dc, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] twice, ch 3, sk next dc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 dc, ch 3, sk next dc**, sc in next dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in first sc. Fasten off.

1-Sided Join Motif

Rnds 1–6: Rep rnds 1–6 of First Motif.

Rnd 7: Sl st in 3rd dc, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next dc, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] twice, ch 3, sk next dc, sc dec in next 2 dc, ch 3, sk next dc**, sc

in next dc*, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sl st in adjacent ch-5 sp of previous Motif, ch 2, sc) in next dc, {ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc} twice, ch 3, sc dec in next 2 dc, ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] twice, rep between * around, ending last rep at **, join in first sc. Fasten off.

2-Sided Join Motif

Rnds 1–6: Rep rnds 1–6 of First Motif.

Rnd 7: Sl st in 3rd dc, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next dc, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] twice, ch 3, sk next dc, sc dec in next 2 dc, ch 3, sk next dc**, sc in next dc*, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sl st in adjacent ch-5 sp of previous Motif, ch 2, sc) in next dc, {ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc} twice, ch 3, sc dec in next 2 dc, ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] 4 times, rep between * around, ending last rep at **, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Remaining Motifs

Work 1-Sided Join Motifs and 2-Sided Join Motifs according to Assembly Diagram to make 11 rows of 4 Motifs.

FILL-IN MOTIFS

Make 30.

Rnd 1: Ch 6, join in 6th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, (sc in ring, ch 3) 8 times, join in first sc. (8 ch-3 sps)

[ch 6, sl st in junction of joining of Snowflake Motifs, ch 6, sl st in next ch-3 sp of Fill-In Motif, ch 6, sl st in next sc dec of Snowflake Motif, ch 6, sl st in next ch-3 sp of Fill-In Motif] 4 times. Fasten off.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Attach cotton in right edge top corner Snowflake Motif in first free ch-5 sp after junction of 2 Snowflake Motifs, ch 1, sc in same ch-5 sp, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, *sc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times*, rep between * twice, {sc in junction of Snowflake Motifs, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, rep between * twice}, rep between { } once, sc in junction of next 2 Snowflake Motifs, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, rep between * 4 times, rep between { } 9 times across side edge, sc in junction, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, rep between *, rep between { } twice, sc in junction, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, rep between * 4 times, rep between { } 9 times, sc in junction of Snowflake Motifs, [ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook] 4 times, join in beg sc.

Note: Ch-4 sps indicated in rnd 2 are created by (ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook).

Rnd 2: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-4 sp, ch 1, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-4 sp, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp as beg ch-1, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 14 times, *ch 4, sc dec in next 2 ch-3 sps, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 10 times*, rep between * once, ch 4, sc dec in next 2 ch-3 sps, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 18 times, rep between * 9 times

across long edge, ch 4, sc dec in next 2 ch-3 sps, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 18 times, rep between * twice, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 18 times, rep between * 9 times, ch 4, sc dec in next 2 ch-3 sps, [ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times,

ch 4, join in beg sc.

Rnd 4: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in each ch-4 sp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Vintage Lapel Pin

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ EASY

FINISHED SIZE

Pin: 1⅜ inch in diameter

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Fine Crochet Thread size 20 crochet cotton (400 yds per ball):
5 yds #420 cream
- Size 9/1.25mm steel crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- 1 post earring and back

GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

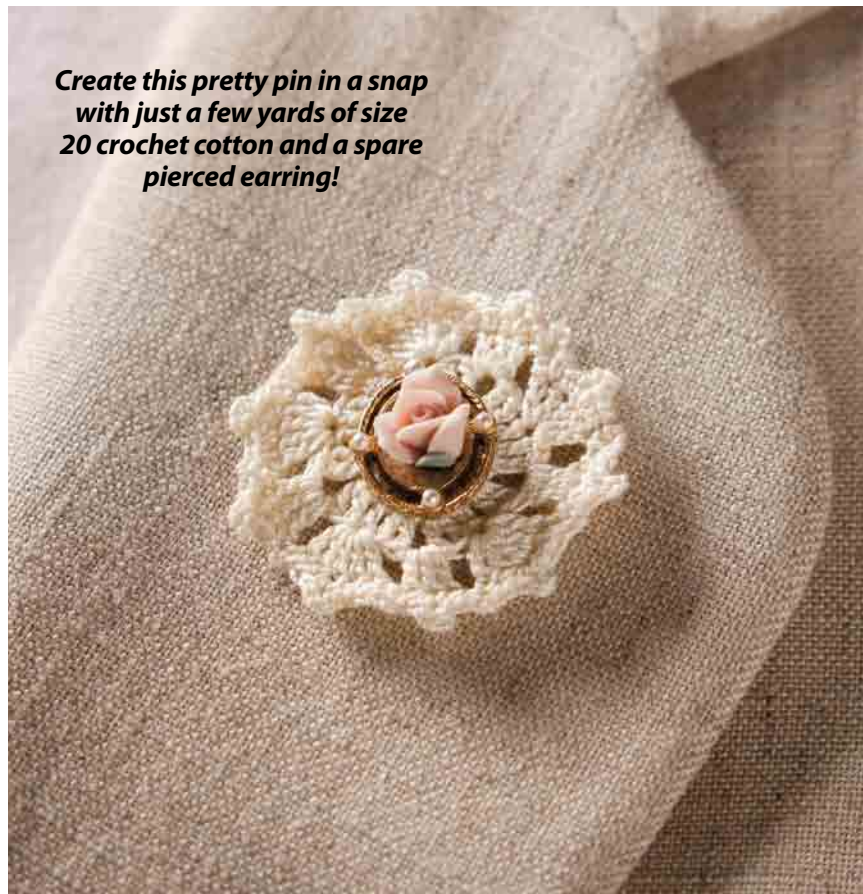
Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

PIN

Rnd 1: Ch 4, 14 dc in 4th ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (15 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, ch 2, [2 dc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, ch 2] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (25 dc, 5 ch-2 sps)



Create this pretty pin in a snap with just a few yards of size 20 crochet cotton and a spare pierced earring!

Rnd 3: Sl st across to center dc of 5-dc group, ch 3, 4 dc in same st as beg ch-3, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, [5 dc in center dc of next 5-dc group, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (40 dc, 10 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next st, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next st, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st, sc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp,

[sc in each of next 2 sts, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next st, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next st, sc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (50 sc, 10 ch-2 sps, 10 ch-3 sps)

FINISHING

Insert earring in center of Medallion, with earring back, fasten to lapel. **CW**

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Rose Diamond Stole

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ □ INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

Approximately 25 x 72 inches, excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Caron One Pound medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (16 oz/812 yds/453g per skein): 3 skeins #517 rose
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



GAUGE

3 sc = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTE

When working front post stitches, skip stitches behind post stitches on current row unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

First cable: Ch 3, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc (*joining sc*), **turn**, sc in each ch of ch-3 just made, sl st in next sc, **turn**, holding worked ch-3 to front, sc in each of next 2 sk sc.

Next cable: *Ch 3, sk next unworked 2 sc, sc in next sc (*joining sc*), **turn**, *sc in each ch of ch-3 just made, sl st in next sc, **turn**, holding worked ch-3 to front, sc in each of next 2 sk sc.

Back treble crochet cross-stitch (back tr cross-st):

Sk next 2 sts, tr in each of next 2 sts, working behind 2 tr just worked, tr in first sk st, tr in next sk st.

Front treble crochet cross-stitch (front tr cross-st):

Sk next 2 sts, tr in each of next 2 sts, working in front of 2 tr just worked, tr in first sk st, tr in next sk st.

PATTERN STITCHES

Low Ridge Front (LRF)

Row 1 (RS): Working in front lp, sl st in next sc and in each rem sc across, sl st in beg ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, working in rem lps of previous sc row, sc in each st across, sc in beg ch, turn.

Cable

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in next sc, **first cable** (*see Special Stitches*), ***next cable** (*see Special Stitches*) rep from * across, sc in beg ch, turn.

Row 2: Sk first sc, *working behind cable, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc, sk joining sc, rep from * across, 2 sc in beg ch, turn.

Reverse Single Crochet (Reverse Sc)

Row 1: Working from left to right, ch 1, sk first st, *reverse sc in front lp of each st across, sl st in beg ch, **do not turn**.

Row 2: Working from right to left in rem lps of previous sc row, ch 1, sc in first sc and in each rem sc across, turn.

Diamond

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.



Row 2: Rep row 1.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, working in front of previous sc rows, **fptr** (*see Stitch Guide*) around 2nd st 4 rows below, *sk next 4 sts 4 rows below, fptr around next st 4 rows below, **sk sts behind fptr on current row** (*see Pattern Note*), sc in each of next 4 sts on current row**, fptr around st 4 rows below directly following previous fptr, sk st behind fptr on current row, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, turn.

Rows 4–6: Rep row 1.

Row 7: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts 4 rows below, *fptr around next st 4 rows below, sk st behind fptr on current row, sc in each of next 4 sts on current row, fptr around st 4 rows below directly following previous fptr, sk st behind fptr on current row**, sk next 4 sts 4 rows below, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 8: Rep row 1.

Shadow Box

Row 1 (RS): With RS of stole facing, dc in next sc, ***back tr cross-st** (*see Special Stitches*), **front tr cross-st** (*see Special Stitches*)**, dc in each of next 2 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc in next st and in beg ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, dc in next dc, *back tr cross-st, front tr cross-st, dc in each of next 2 dc, rep from * across, turn.

STOLE

BODY

Row 1: Ch 213, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (212 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3 & 4: Rep rows 1 and 2 of **LRF** (see *Pattern Stitches*).

Row 5: Rep row 1 of **Cable** (see *Pattern Stitches*). (70 cables)

Row 6: Rep row 2 of **Cable**.

Rows 7 & 8: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each st across, **do not turn**.

Rows 10 & 11: Rep rows 1 and 2 of **Reverse Sc** (see *Pattern Stitches*).

Row 12: Rep row 2.

Rows 13 & 14: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Rows 15 & 16: Rep rows 5 and 6.

Rows 17 & 18: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Rows 19–42: [Rep rows 1–8 of **Diamond** (see *Pattern Stitches*) consecutively] 3 times. (210 sts at end of last row)

Rows 43–48: Rep rows 3–8.

Rows 49 & 50: Rep rows 1 and 2 of **Shadow Box** (see *Pattern Stitches*).

Rows 51 & 52: Rep row 2.

Rows 53–88: Rep rows 13–48.

Rows 89–98: Rep rows 9–18.

Rows 99 & 100: Rep row 2. At end of last row, **do not turn or fasten off**.

BORDER

Rnd 101: Now working in rnds, ch 1, working in ends of rows down short edge of Stole, sc in

end of first row, [ch 1, sk next row, sc in end of next row] across to end of last row, sl st in end of last row, working in rem lps of beg row, sl st in rem lp of next st and in rem lp of each rem st across, ch 1, working in ends of rnds up side of Stole, sc in end of first row, [ch 1, sk next row, sc in end of next row] across to end of last row, sl st in end of last row, ch 1, working across last row of Stole, sl st in each st across, join with sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

FRINGE

Step 1: *Cut five 20-inch strands. Fold strands in half. With RS of Stole facing, push folded end of strands through first ch-1 sp. Place ends of strands through looped end. Pull tight**. Sk next ch-1 sp. Rep from * across short end of Stole.

A post-stitch diamond pattern and other dimensional stitches give luscious texture to this beautiful wrap.

Row 2: Ch 1, *sc in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of next sc, sc in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of next sc, rep from * across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until Scarf measures 60 inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

SCARF NO. 3

Row 1: With C, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, *sc in next ch, dc in next ch, rep from * across, turn. (12 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, *sc in next dc, dc in next sc, rep from * across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until Scarf measures 60 inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

FINISHING

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.

POMPOMS

Make 2.

Note: The fullness of the Pom-pom depends on the number of

wraps, i.e., more wraps produces a fuller Pom-pom.

Wrap B around cardboard as desired. Cut an 8-inch length of B. Gently remove all wraps from cardboard. Tie 8-inch length of B tightly around center of wraps. Cut ends of wraps, avoiding ends of 8-inch length of B. Fluff and trim Pom-pom.

Tie rem ends of length of B tog, about 2½ inches from Pom-pom, forming lp.

Stack Scarves 1 on top of the other. *Using lp on Pom-pom like a needle, thread Pom-pom lp from front to back through all 3 Scarf layers about 2 inches from 1 end of Scarves. Pull lp until Pom-pom is tight against first Scarf. Pass lp over Pom-pom and pull gently to tighten.* Loosely braid the Scarves.

Rep between * to attach rem Pom-pom. **CW**



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Made-to-Fit Mittens

Rnd 2: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 5 sc] twice. (14 sc)

Rnd 4: [2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc] twice. (18 sc)

Rnd 5: Sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in each of

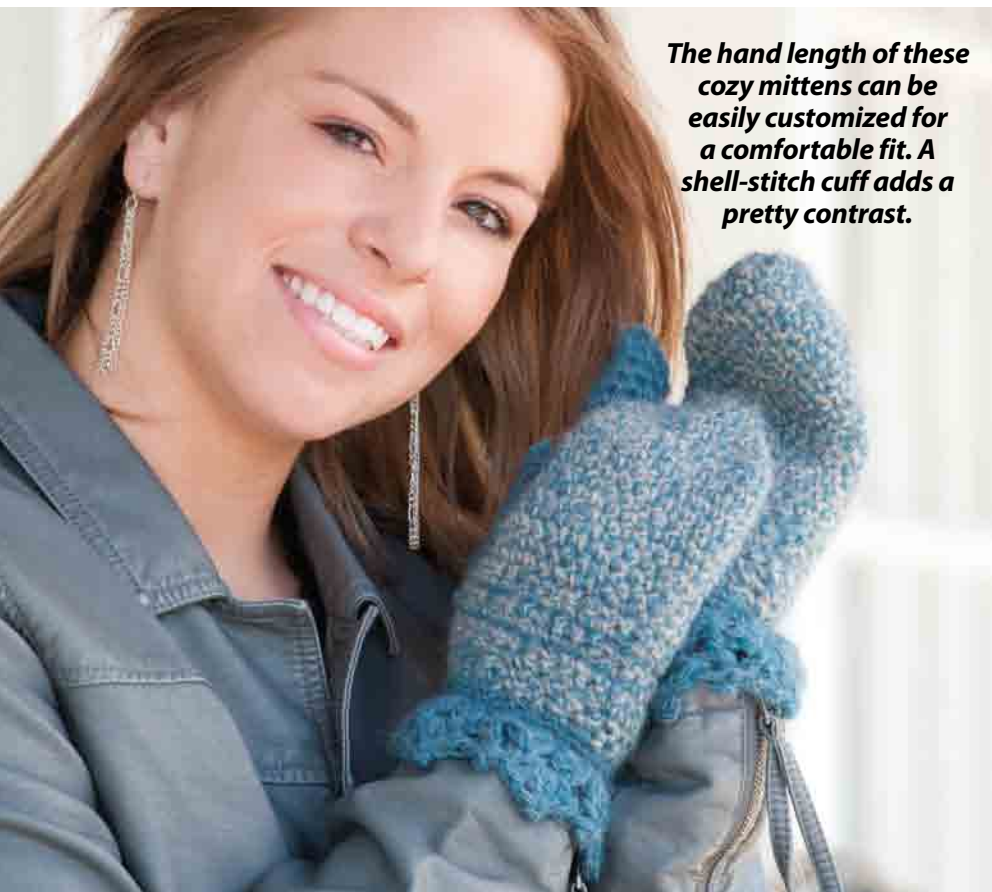

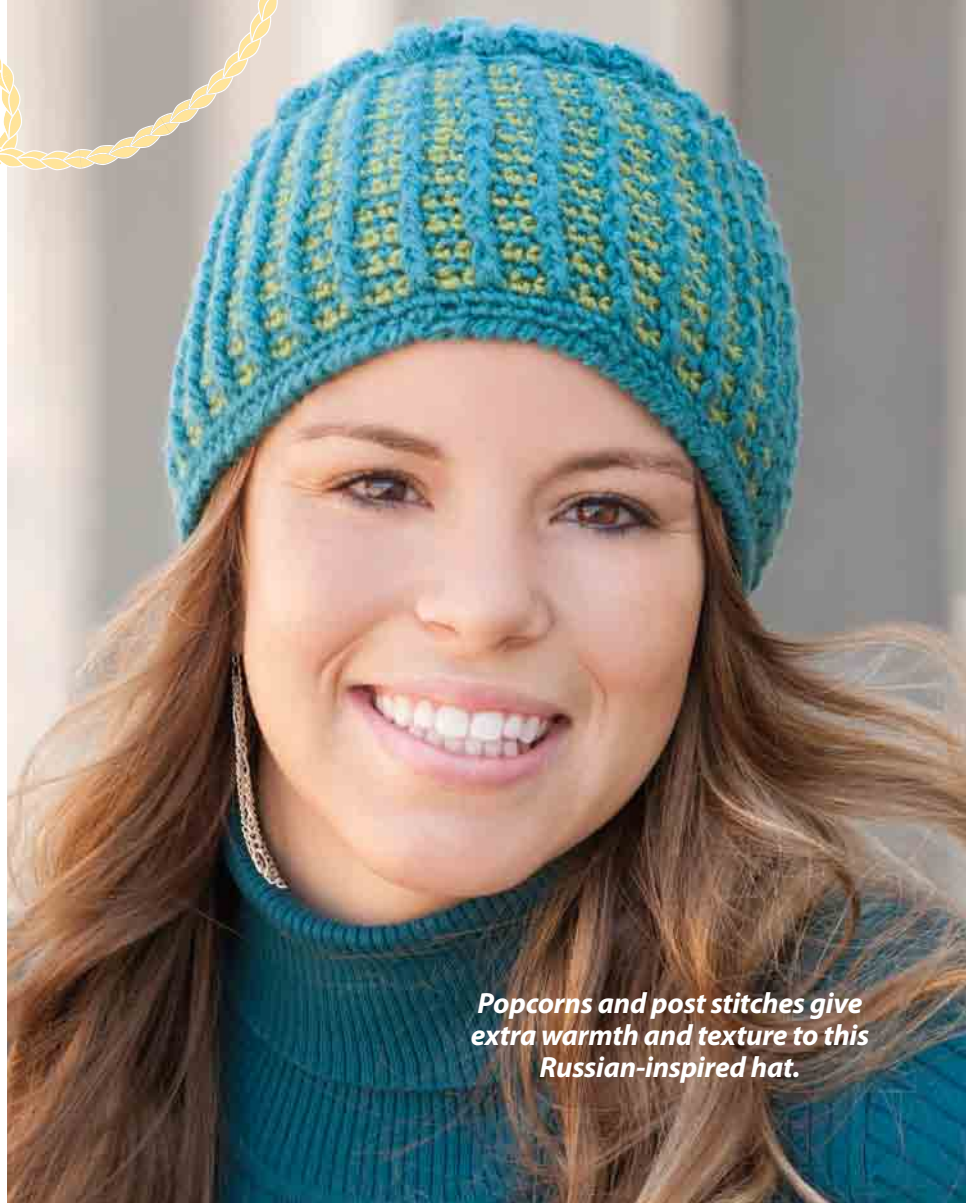

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, **pc** (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts, pc in next st] around, join in beg sc. (20 pc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc. (64 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts, pc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, pc in next st] 20 times, sc in next sc, join in beg sc. (21 pc)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, pc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, pc in next st] around to last st, sc in last st, join in beg sc. (16 pc)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc. (32 sc)

Rnd 8: Beg pc (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, sc in next st [pc in next st, sc in next st] around, join in beg pc. (16 pc)

Rnd 9: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc. (16 sc)

Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in first st, pc in next st, [sc in next st, pc in next st] around, join in beg sc. (8 pc)

Rnd 11: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc,

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, change color to A, drop B to WS, turn. (28 sc)

Rnd 7: Ch 2, fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around beg ch 2 rnds below, sk first 2 sc, dc in next sc, sk next sc, [3 fpdc around next dc 2 rnds below, sk next sc, dc in

next sc, sk next sc] around, fpdc once more around beg ch 2 rnds below (*this positions hook in center of 3 fpdc group to beg following rnd*), join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, change color to B, turn.

Rnd 8: Rep rnd 6.

Rnd 9: Ch 2, sk first 2 sc, 3 fpdc around next dc 2 rnds below (*above single dc 2 rnds below*), sk next sc, [dc in next sc, sk next sc, 3 fpdc around next dc 2 rnds below, sk next sc] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, change color to B, turn.

Rnds 10–29: [Rep rnds 6–9 consecutively] 5 times.

Rnds 30–33: Ch 1, working in front lp, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn. At the end of rnd 33, fasten off.

Block lightly. **CW**




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

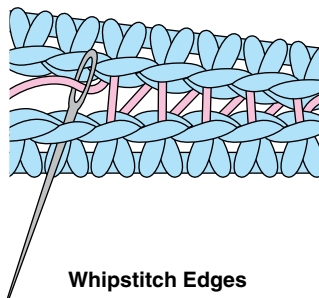

ASSEMBLY

With RS facing, **whipstitch** (see *illustration*) Squares tog in 4 rows of 4 Squares.

EDGING

Rnd 1: With WS facing, join yarn in any st on outer edge, ch 1, lp st in each st around, working 3 lp sts in each corner, join in beg lp st. Fasten off.

Row 1: With A, leaving 12-inch length at beg, ch 75, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Row 2: With B, leaving 12-inch length at beg, sl st in first ch of row 1, sl st in each of next 74 chs, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.



Holding beg lengths tog, tie ends in knot, trim ends to approximately ½ inch. Rep same with opposite end of ending lengths.

POMPOM

Make 2.

Holding 1 strand each A and B tog, wrap around 3-inch sides of heavy cardboard piece (*the more wraps the fuller the finished Pom-pom*). Gently remove wraps from cardboard. Cut an 8-inch length of yarn and tie tightly around center of wraps. Do not cut ends of tie. Cut ends of wraps, fluff and trim Pom-pom. Use ends of tie to sew or tie Pom-pom to center of each Boot Bracelet. With Pom-pom at center front of boot, place Boot Bracelet around boot and tie ends of Bracelet at back. **CW**

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, *2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, rep from * around, join in first sc. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, *2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, rep from * around, join in first sc. (24 sc)

Rnd 5 (partial): Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc. Leaving rem sts unworked, fasten off. (7 sc)

EYES

Make 2.

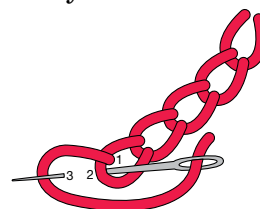
Rnd 1: With black and size 14 hook, leaving a 2-inch tail at beg, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in first sc. Leaving a 2-inch tail, fasten off. (2 sc)

FINISHING

Pull beg and ending tails of 1 Eye from front to back on 1 Face and knot to secure.

Rep to attach rem Eye to same Face.

Using needle and 1 strand black and referring to photo for placement, work **chain stitches** (see *illustration*) between rnds 4 and 5 to embroider mouth under Eyes.

Fasten off.

CENTER & BAND

Make 2.

Rnds 1–3: With white and **size 7 hook** (see *Pattern Notes*), rep rnds 1–3 of Face. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 4 & 5: Join silver in any sc of previous rnd, rep rnds 4 and 5 of Face. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

RUBY

Row 1: Sk first 7 sc to left of last st made in rnd 5 of Center & Band, join red in next sc, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 4 sc, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off red. (7 sc)

Rep Ruby on rem Center & Band.

ASSEMBLY

Place Rings WS tog, working through both thicknesses, join silver in 7th sc to left of Ruby, sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, **changing colors** (see *Stitch Guide*) to red, sc in next sc, work in ends of rows and in sts around Ruby, 3 sc evenly sp up side of Ruby, 4 sc in first corner of Ruby, 3 sc evenly sp across top of Ruby, 4 sc in 2nd corner of Ruby, 3 sc evenly sp down rem side of Ruby, changing colors to silver, sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, insert bookmark blank between layers, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, sl st in top of sc at end of rnd 5, sl st in each rem st across rnd 5, join in first st. Fasten off.

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), sk next 2 dc, [V-st (*see Special Stitch*) in next dc, sk next 2 dc] 15 times, dc in last dc, turn. (15 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in sp before next dc, [dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 15 times, dc in sp before next dc, dc in last dc, turn. (49 dc)

Rows 4–39: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 18 times.

Row 40: Rep row 2. Fasten off.

HANDLE

Make 2.

Row 1: With raspberry, ch 8, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (6 dc)

Rows 2–29: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 29, fasten off.

EDGING

Row 30: Holding the Handles tog and working through both thicknesses, join raspberry in end st and working across long edge only, ch 1, sc evenly sp across. Fasten off. Rep row 30 on opposite long edge of Handle.

Row 31: Join watermelon in last sc of row 30, ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc across row 30. Fasten off. Rep row 31 on opposite edge of row 30.

LARGE FLOWER

Rnd 1: With watermelon, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, (ch 4, sl st in ring) 5 times. (5 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (2 sc, 2 hdc, 2 dc, 2 hdc, 2 sc) in each ch-4 sp around, join in beg sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (5 petals)

MEDIUM FLOWER

Rnd 1: With white, ch 4, join to form a ring, (ch 4, sl st in ring) 5 times. (5 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (2 sc, 2 hdc, 2 sc) in each ch-4 sp around, join in beg sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (5 petals)

SMALL FLOWER

Rnd 1: With light pink, ch 4, join to form a ring, (ch 3, sl st in ring) 5 times. (5 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, (5 sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (5 petals)

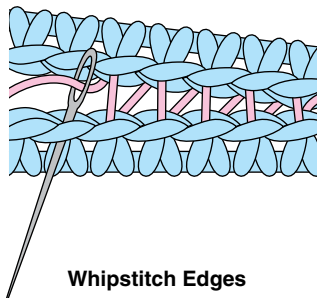
FINISHING

Fold tog top edge of row 40 even with top of row 9, leaving rows 1–9 free to form flap. With yarn needle and length of raspberry, sew sides tog. Make sure that when piece is turned RS out after stitching side seams that RS of row 1 is facing. This forms edge of flap. For flap edging, with RS of flap facing, join raspberry,

sc evenly sp around 3 sides of flap working 3 sc in each of 2 outer corners. Fasten off raspberry and join watermelon in last sc, reverse sc in each sc around flap. Fasten off.

With sewing thread and needle, sew pearl to center of each Flower. With rem length of each Flower, sew Flowers to lower left corner of Case using photo as guide for placement.

Cut a 13 x 18-inch rectangle from lining fabric. Fold lining fabric, RS tog, to make a 13 x 9-inch rectangle. Sew side seams. Do not turn RS out. Fold down top edges of lining seam allowance to the WS. Press edge with warm steam iron. Slip lining into Case. Place small dot of fabric glue between lining and Case at each bottom corner on both front and back of case and press with fingers so that it adheres well. This will help to keep lining in place. Using fabric glue, glue top edge of lining and top edge of Case tog all the way around, making sure it adheres well by pressing with fingers and making sure top edges are even. Let glue dry thoroughly. Using length of yarn and yarn needle, **whipstitch** (see *illustration*) short ends of Handle to back of Case with edges positioned between rows 10 and 11 at outer edges. Make sure you catch both thicknesses of Handle edge.



Whipstitch Edges

Sew this area a couple of times as the Handle will carry the weight of the Netbook Case. Make sure that Handle is not



twisted. Press flap lightly with warm steam iron, placing cloth between iron and flap.

CELLPHONE CASE

CASE

Row 1 (RS): With watermelon, ch 18, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (16 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next 2 dc, [**V-st** (see *Special Stitch*) in next dc, sk next 2 dc] 4 times, dc in last dc, turn. (4 V-sts, 2 dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in sp before next dc, [dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 4 times, dc in sp before next dc, dc in last dc, turn. (16 dc)

Row 1: With watermelon, ch 6, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch, turn. (4 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in each of next 9 dc, *dc dec in next 2 sts, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 3 times, ch 5, dc dec in next 2 sts**, dc in each of next 25 dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, dc in each of next 15 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (324 dc, 48 ch-5 sps, 36 sc)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 8 dc, *dc dec in next 2 sts, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 4 times, ch 5, dc dec in next 2 sts**, dc in each of next 23 dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, dc in each of next 14 dc, join in top of beg ch-3. (300 dc, 60 ch-5 sps, 48 sc)

Row 17: With 2 strands of burgundy held tog, join in first sc of row 16, ch 1, sc in each sc of next 5 puff sc sts, work 4 sc evenly sp across Face, sc in each of next 5 sc of puff, turn. (14 sc)

Rows 18–38: Rep rows 18–38 of Pillow Back. (1 sc)

NOSE

Rnd 1: With size G hook and eggshell, ch 2, 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (4 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in beg sc. (8 sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc] 4 times, join in beg sc, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. (4 sc)

MUSTACHE

Make 2.

Row 1: With size K hook and puff, ch 4, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 2 sc in last ch, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, turn. (7 sc)

Row 3: Ch 3, sl st in first sc, sl st in next 3 sc, hdc in next sc, dc in next sc, ch 2, sl st in last sc. Fasten off.

HATBAND

Row 1: With size F hook and buff, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (7 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to burgundy in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, change color to black in last sc, turn.

Rows 4–6: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 6, change color to burgundy, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, change color to buff in last sc, turn.

Rows 8 & 9: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 9, change color to burgundy, turn.

Rows 10–14: Rep rows 3–7.

Rows 15–70: [Rep rows 8–14 consecutively] 8 times.

Rows 71–73: Rep rows 8–10. At the end of row 73, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

1. With tapestry needle, sew Nose to center bottom of Face. Sew button eyes centered just above Nose. Sew Mustache to Face.
2. Referring to photo as guide, with 1 strand burgundy, weave a horizontal line along center of Hatband length, working 1 long st over each set of black and buff rows and 1 long st under all burgundy rows. Create 2 more burgundy horizontal weaves parallel to center weave in same manner, spacing top weave 2 st widths above center weave and bottom weave 2 st widths below center weave.
3. With buff, in same manner, create 2 horizontal weaves, 1 each between the 3 burgundy horizontal weaves. With buff, create $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch-long st that crosses vertically over center of all buff horizontal weaves.
4. With WS of Pillow tog and beg at bottom edge, with size K hook, using corresponding color and working through both thicknesses, sc around

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Do not turn at ends of rounds unless otherwise stated.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same dc as beg ch-3, [dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc] around to last 2 sts, dc in next dc, 2 dc in last dc, join in top of beg ch-3. (25 dc)

Rnd 3: **Beg shell** (see Special Stitches) in same st as join, sk next dc, **shell** (see Special Stitches) in next dc, [sk next 2 dc, shell in next dc, sk next dc, shell in next dc] around to last 2 dc, sk last 2 dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells)

Rnd 4: Sl st across to ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, ch 4, [sc in ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 4] around, join in first sc. (10 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 5: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 3, 4 dc in same sp as beg ch-4, *5 dc in next ch sp, rep from * around, join in top of beg ch-3. (50 dc)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in same dc as beg ch-3, [dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc] around to last st, 2 dc in last st, join in top of beg ch-3. (68 dc)

Rnd 7: Beg shell in same st as join, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [sk next dc, shell in next dc, sk next dc, dc in next dc] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (17 shells, 17 dc)

Rnd 8: Sl st across to ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, [ch 5, sc in ch-2 sp of next shell] around, join in first sc. (17 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 9: Sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, 5 dc in same ch-5 sp as beg ch-3, *6 dc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, join in top of beg ch-3. (102 dc)

Rnd 10: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. (102 dc)

Rnd 11: Beg shell in same st as join, *[sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc] twice, sk next 2 dc, shell in next dc, rep from * around to last 2 sts, sk last 2 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (12 shells, 22 dc)

Rnd 12: Rep rnd 8. (12 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 13: Sl st in next ch sp, ch 3, 4 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-3, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, 6 dc in next ch-5 sp, *5 dc in each of next 2 ch-5 sps, 6 dc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, join in top of beg ch-3. (64 dc)

Rnd 14: Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [sk next dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, sk next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc] around to last 4 sts, sk next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, sk next dc, join in top of beg ch-3. (52 dc)

Rnd 15: Beg shell in same st as join, [sk next 3 dc, shell in next dc] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (13 shells)

Rnd 16: Sl st in center ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, [ch 3, sc in ch-2 sp of next shell] around, join in first sc. (13 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 17: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-3, [2 dc in next ch sp, 3 dc in next ch sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (32 dc)

Rnd 18: Ch 3, [sk next dc, dc in next dc, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 dc, dc in next dc] around, dc dec in last 2 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (20 dc)

Rnd 19: Ch 2, **dc dec spread** (see *Special Stitches*). Pull thread tight to close opening. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

ROSE

Rnd 1: With burgundy, ch 6, join in 6th ch from hook to form ring, ch 6 (counts as first dc and ch-3), [dc in ring, ch 3] 5 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (6 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 2: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, 3 dc, sc—*petal*) in same sp as beg ch-1, *(sc, 3 dc, sc—*petal*) next ch sp, rep from * around, join in first sc. (6 petals)

Rnd 3: Working behind petals, ch 1, **fp sl st** (see *Stitch Guide*) around beg ch-3 in rnd 1, [ch 5, fp sl st around next dc from rnd 1] around, join in first sl st. (6 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 4: Sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 1, (sc, 5 dc, sc—*petal*) in same ch-5 sp as beg ch-1, *(sc, 5 dc, sc—*petal*) in next ch sp, rep from * around, join in first sc. (6 petals)

Rnd 5: Working behind petals, ch 1, fp sl st around beg fp sl st from rnd 3, [ch 7, fp sl st around next fp sl st from rnd 3] around, join in first sl st. (6 ch-7 sps)

Rnd 6: Sl st in next ch-7 sp, ch 1, (sc, 7 dc, sc—*petal*) in same ch-7 sp as beg ch-1, *(sc, 7 dc, sc—*petal*) in next ch-7 sp, rep from * around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends. (6 petals)

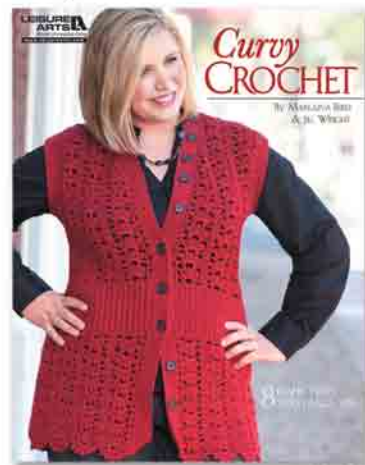

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning cluster (beg cl):

Ch 3, (yo, insert hook in same st as beg ch-3, yo, pull lp through, yo, pull through 2 lps on hook) 3 times, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Long double crochet (long dc): Yo, insert hook in indicated

Make 48.

Rnd 1 (RS): With C and size H hook, ch 2, 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. (8 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in same st as beg ch-1 and in next sc, ch 1, [sc dec in same st as current st and in next sc, ch 1] 7 times, join in beg ch-1 sp. Fasten off. (8 sc dec, 8 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 3: Join A in any ch-1 sp, ch 3, **beg cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, [**cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, ch 3] 7 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (8 cls, 8 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 4: Sl st in next st, (sl st, beg cl, ch 2, cl) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, [(cl, ch 2, cl) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2] 7 times, join in top of beg cl. Fasten off. (16 cls, 16 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 5: Join B in any ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-2 sp as beg ch-1, sc dec in same ch sp as 3-sc group just made and in next ch sp, [3 sc in same ch-2 sp as 2nd sc or sc dec just made, sc dec in current ch-2 sp and in next ch-2 sp] 15 times, join in beg sc. (64 sc)

Rnd 6: [Ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next st] twice, *[ch 2, sk next sc, sc in next st] 5 times**, [ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next st] 3 times, rep from * 4 times, ending last rep at **, ch 3, sk next sc, join in sc at base of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (12 ch-3 sps, 20 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 7: Join MC in sp created by beg ch-3 from previous rnd, (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in same sp as join (*corner*), *2 hdc in each of next 2 ch sps, 2 sc in each of

next 3 ch-2 sps, 2 hdc in each of next 2 ch sps**, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from * 3 times, ending last rep at **, join in top of beg ch-3. (24 dc, 32 hdc, 24 sc, 4 corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 8: Ch 2 (*counts as hdc*), hdc in each st around, working (3 hdc, ch 2, 3 hdc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in top of beg ch-2. Fasten off. (104 hdc, 4 corner ch-2 sps)

ASSEMBLY

With WS facing, place Motifs in 8 rows of 6.

With MC and size I hook, with 2 Motifs held tog, working through both thicknesses, sl st in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st across rnd 8 to join Motifs.

BORDER

Rnd 1: With RS facing and using size H hook, join MC in any corner, ch 1, *[sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] across to last st before next corner, sc dec in st just before corner and in corner, sc in corner, sc dec in corner and in next st] rep from * around, join to beg sc, **do not turn**.

Rnd 2: With size I hook, ch 1, sc in each st around, working 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc, turn. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: With WS facing, join B in any corner, ch 1, *[sc in next sc, dc in next sc] across to next corner, (**long sc**—see *Special Stitches*, **long dc**—see *Special Stitches*, long sc) in corner sp 2 rows below, rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: With RS facing, join MC in any corner, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, **do not turn**.

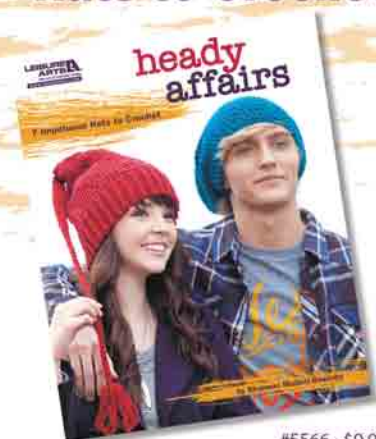

2 (2, 2, 3, 3) skeins
#9759 ocean
- Sizes G/6/4mm and H/8/5mm hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



GAUGE

Size H hook: 16 sts = 4 inches;
18 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Post stitches are worked around indicated stitch 2 rows below unless otherwise stated.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ***fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *sc in next fpdc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 2 [2, 2, 3, 3] times.

Body

Row 1: With H hook, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), sk first sc, dc in each sc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 1 until piece measures 9 [9, 11, 12, 14] inches from beg.

Shape Armholes

Row 1: Ch 1, sl st in each of first 2 [2, 4, 4, 4] sts, ch 3, dc in each dc across to last 2 [2, 4, 4, 4] dc, leave last 2 [2, 4, 4, 4] sts unworked, turn. (43 [47, 49, 51, 55] dc)

Row 2: Ch 2, sk first dc, dc in each dc across to last 2 dc, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in last 2 sts, turn. (41 [45, 47, 49, 53] dc)

Sizes 4, 6 & 8 Years Only

Row [3, 3, 3]: Rep row 2 [1, 1, 1] time. ([43, 45, 47] dc)

Size 10 Years Only

Rows [3 & 4]: Rep row 2 [twice]. ([49] dc)

All Sizes

Row 3 [4, 4, 4, 5]: Ch 3, sk first sc, dc in each sc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 3 [4, 4, 4, 5] until Armhole measures 6 [6½, 6½, 7, 7½] inches.

Shape First Shoulder

Row 1: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in each of next 13 [14, 14, 14, 14] dc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (14 [15, 15, 15, 15] dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in each dc across. Fasten off.

Shape 2nd Shoulder

Row 1: Sk next 13 [13, 15, 17, 19] unworked sts following First Shoulder, join yarn with sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each rem dc across, turn. (14 [15, 15, 15, 15] dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, sk first dc, dc in each dc across. Fasten off.

FRONT

Ribbing

Rows 1–4: Rep rows 1–4 of Back Ribbing.

Next rows: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 2 [2, 2, 3, 3] times. (47 [51, 57, 59, 63] sc at end of last row)

Body

Row 1: With H hook, ch 1, 1 [2, 1, 2, 1] sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across to last sc, 1 [2, 1, 2, 1] sc in last sc, turn. (47 [53, 57, 61, 63] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 [1, 3, 1, 2] sc, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of

next 3 sc (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in next sc, ***3-fpdc cable** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in next sc, fpdc around each of next 3 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across to last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, sc in each of last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, turn. (6 [7, 7, 8, 8] 3-fpdc groups, 5 [6, 6, 7, 7] cables)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 [1, 3, 1, 2] sc, cable, sc in next sc, *fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, sc in next sc, cable, sc in next sc, rep from * across to last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, sc each of in last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, turn. (6 [7, 7, 8, 8] cables and 5 [6, 6, 7, 7] 3-fpdc groups)

Row 6: Rep row 4.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 [1, 3, 1, 2] sc, fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, sc in next sc, *sk next sc, cable, sc in next sc, fpdc around each of next 3 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across to last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, sc in each of last 1 [0, 2, 0, 1] sc, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 4–7 consecutively] until piece measures 9 [9, 11, 12, 14] inches from beg, ending last rep with row 5 or row 7.

Shape Armholes

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sl st in each of first 2 [2, 4, 4, 4], sc in each sc across to last 2 [2, 4, 4, 4] sts, leaving rem 2 [2, 4, 4, 4] sts unworked, turn. (43 [47, 49, 51, 55] sc)

Note: When working row 2 of Shape Armholes, if last rep of Body ended with row 5, beg cable pattern with row 7. If last rep of Body ended with row 7, beg cable pattern with row 5.

Row 2: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body (see Note).

Row 3: Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, sc in each st

Drop A and D. (18 5-dc shells, 72 dc dec)

Rnd 2: With B, changing colors to C in last st of shell, beg half 5-dc shell in same st as join, *with C, [dc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, changing colors to B in last st, dc dec in next 2 sts**, with B, changing colors to C in last st of shell, 5-dc shell in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, end half 5-dc shell in same st as beg half 5-dc shell, join with A in top of beg ch-3. Drop B and C.

Rnd 3: With A, changing colors to D in last st of shell, beg half 5-dc shell in same st as join, *with D, [dc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, changing colors to A in

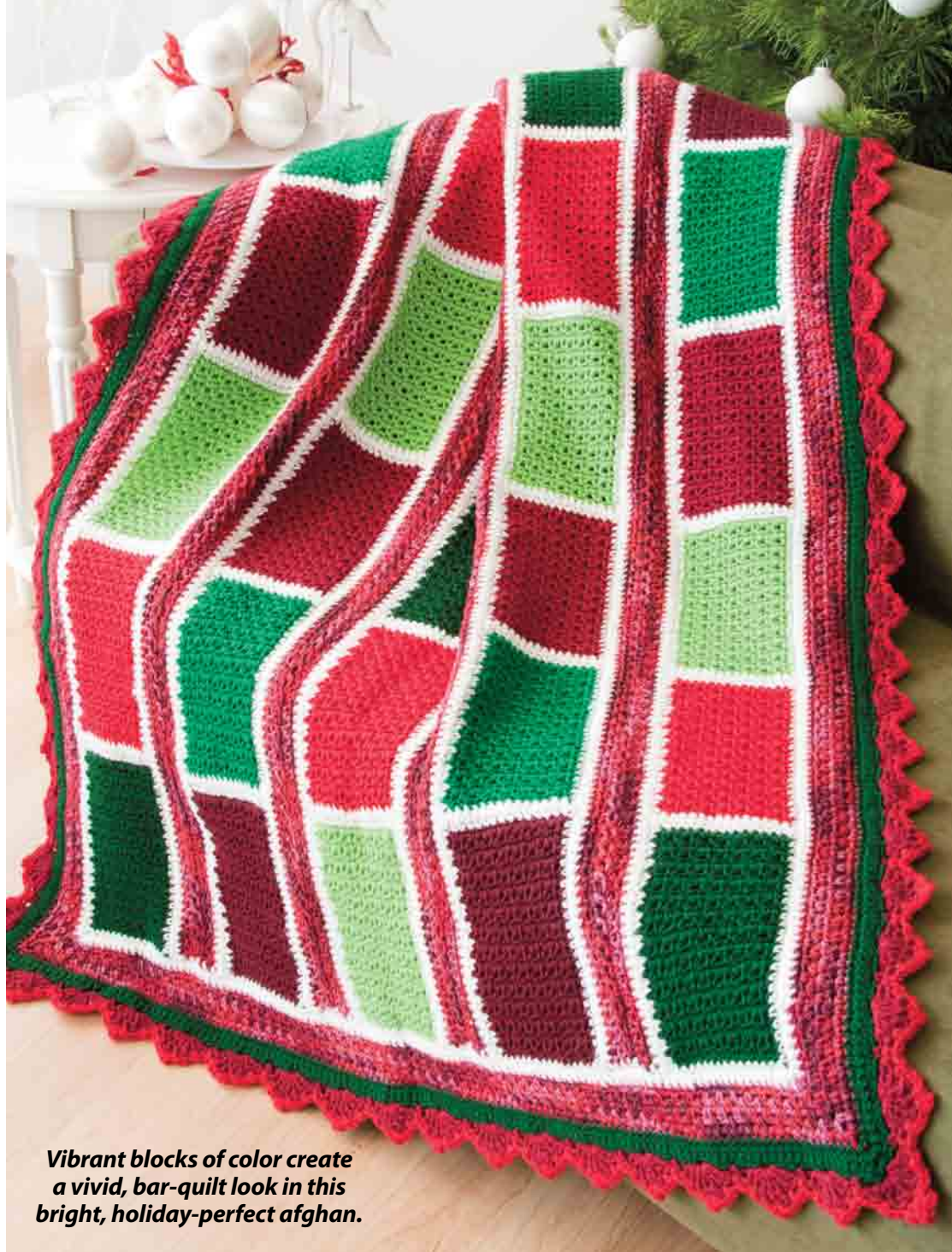
Row 132: With burgundy, rep row 1 of Panel 1.

Rows 133–155: Rep rows 3–25 consecutively.

PANEL VERTICAL TRIM

Note: Panel Vertical Trim is worked on right edge only of Panel 1, right and left edges of Panels 2–4 and left edge only of Panel 5.

Vibrant blocks of color create a vivid, bar-quilt look in this bright, holiday-perfect afghan.



Row 1: With RS facing, draw up lp of soft white through 2 lps of ch at bottom edge of Panel, ch 1, sc in ch sp, sc in end of each row to top edge, turn.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Row 3 (RS): Draw up lp of lipstick, ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 4 (WS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 5 (RS): Ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp, sl st in next sc, [ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp, sl st in next sc] across. Fasten off.

After right edge of Panel 1 is completed, rep rows 1–4, then work joining row 5 on left edge of working Panel to join to previous Panel on right edge.

Row 5 (joining): Ch 1, drop lp, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st in next sc, [ch 1, drop lp, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st in next sc] across. Fasten off.

BORDER

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join soft white in row 6 bottom right edge of hunter green rectangle, ch 1, sc in each row to top edge, (sc, ch 2, sc) in top right corner sc, working across top, sc in each sc across and in end of each row between rectangles to end sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in top left corner sc, sc in each row to bottom edge corner, (sc, ch 2, sc) in bottom left

corner, working through both lps across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each st across, ending with (sc, ch 2, sc) in last corner, sc up right edge in each rem row, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc, turn. (115 sc top and bottom, 161 sc each side)

Rnd 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (117 sc top and bottom, 163 sc each side)

Rnd 3 (RS): Draw up lp of lipstick in 10th sc to left of top left corner, ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 4 (WS): Ch 1, sc in next sc, [ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc] around, working at each corner, ch 1, sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, join last ch-1 in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 5 (RS): Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp] around, working at each corner, ch 1, sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, join last ch-1 sp to beg sc, turn.

Rnd 6 (WS): Rep rnd 5.

Rnd 7 (RS): Rep rnd 5. **Do not turn.**

Rnd 8 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc and sc in each ch-1 sp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 9 (RS): Draw up lp of hunter green in 10th sc to left of top left corner, ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in

each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 10 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc.

Rnd 11 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (135 sc top and bottom, 181 sc each side)

Rnd 12 (RS): Draw up lp of burgundy in 3rd sc to the left of bottom right corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, working across length to top, sc in same sc, [sk next 3 sc, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc] across working at corners 1 and 3, [ch 1, sk next 2 sc, shell in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next 3 sc, sc in next sc] and working at corners 2 and 4, [ch 1, sk next 3 sc, shell in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc], ending with ch 1, sk last 2 sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 13 (RS): Draw up lp of cherry red in sc between 2 shells near center of any side, ch 1, sc in same sc, [ch 1, sk 1 dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, sk next tr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in center tr, ch 2, sk next tr, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next sc] around, working at each corner, [ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp and next dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, sk next tr, (sc, ch 2, sc, ch 3, sc, ch 2, sc) in center tr, ch 2, sk next tr, sc in next dc, ch 2, sk next dc and ch-1 sp, sc in next sc], ending rnd with ch 1, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Rnd 18: Ch 8, sc in next ch sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 15 times, *ch 5**, dc dec in next 3 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 16 times, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, **end 2-dc dec** (see *Special Stitches*). (12 dc, 204 ch-5 sps, 192 sc)

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2, join in first sc.

Rnd 4: Beg shell (see *Special Stitches*) in same st as join, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc, [shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc] around, join in beg ch-3. (5 shells, 5 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 4 sc] twice. (10 sc)

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rnds 7 & 8: Rep rnd 6.

Note: Try on Mitten at this point. If Thumb needs to be longer, rep rnd 6 to add length. If Thumb needs to be shorter, pull out rows to desired length.

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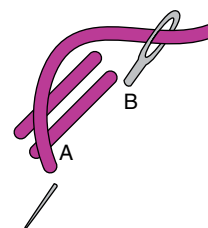

Fasten off.

Make 2.

Row 1: With size F double-ended hook and moss, ch 40, work in **back bar of ch** (see *illustration*), draw up lp in 2nd ch from hook, [draw up lp in next ch] across, slide all sts to opposite end of hook, turn. (40 lps on hook)

Row 2: Place candy marl on hook with **slip knot** (see *illustration*), working from left to right, draw slip knot through first lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps] across until 1 lp rem on hook, **do not turn**.

Row 3: With candy marl, ch 1, sk first 2 vertical bars, draw up lp under 3rd vertical bar, draw up lp under 2nd sk vertical bar, *sk next vertical bar, draw up lp under next vertical bar, go back and draw up lp under sk vertical bar, rep from * across, draw up lp under final vertical bar. Slide all sts to opposite end of hook, turn. (40 lps on hook)

Row 6: With candy marl, rep row 4.

Rows 7–60: [Rep rows 3–6 consecutively] 14 times, ending last rep with row 4.

Row 61 (bind off): With moss, ch 1, sk first 2 vertical bars, draw up lp under 3rd vertical bar, yo, draw through both lps on hook, draw up lp under 2nd sk vertical bar, yo, draw through both lps on hook, *sk next vertical bar, draw up lp under next vertical bar, yo, draw through both lps on hook, go back and draw up lp under sk vertical bar, yo, draw through both lps on hook, rep from * across, draw up lp under final vertical bar, yo, draw through both lps on hook, fasten off candy marl, transfer final lp of moss to size E hook for Edging and hanging lp.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc evenly sp around, placing 3 sc in each corner, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 15, sl st in same st as joining (*hanging lp*), sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in each center sc of each corner, until back at hanging lp, work 15 sc over ch-15, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (350 yds per ball):

Rnd 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of First Flower Petals. At end of last rnd, **do not fasten off.**

For hair tuft, wrap cafe 8 times around 3 fingers. Remove from fingers and tie another length around center. Cut ends of lps, trim as desired and glue to top of head between Antlers.

To secure Antlers, bend head forward and glue back side of head to twisted ends of chenille stems.

Form circle with green garland and twist ends together. Wrap

red bead and gold star wire garlands around green garland, trim ends and glue to garland. Place garland over head and glue to center top of head just behind Antlers.

Using matching-color yarn and yarn needle, sew long edges of Leg and hoof.

Fold Leg flat with seam at center back. With black, sew across bottom of hoof; lightly stuff hoof only. With cafe, sew across top edge of Leg. Rep sewing for 2nd Leg and hoof. Glue tops of Legs (row 14) slightly under bottom edges of neck garland. Glue garland over top edges of Legs. **CW**

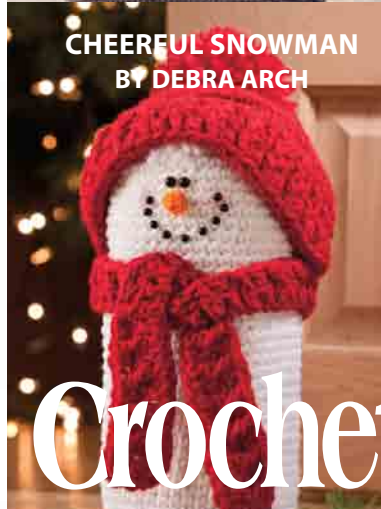

Rows 2–14: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 14, fasten off.

Holding both Handles tog, thread yarn needle with length of watermelon and whipstitch tog around outer edge.


BUTTON LOOPS

Attach watermelon with sl st in short end of Handle (4 dc end),

ch 7, sl st in opposite side of same end of Handle. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Fold Case in half so that top edge of row 24 is even with top of row 7. With yarn needle and length of watermelon, whipstitch sides tog making sure that RS of row 1 is facing when flap is folded over. Flap itself will be folded between rows 6 and 7. For flap edging, with RS of flap facing join watermelon, sc evenly sp around 3 sides of flap working 3 sc in each of 2 outer corners. Fasten off watermelon

and join raspberry in last sc, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc around flap. Fasten off. Work Medium Flower with raspberry, attach pearl and sew Flower to center of row 3 of flap. Using sewing needle and thread, sew buttons to row 8 on back of Cellphone Case at outer edges. Make sure that buttons are securely fastened. Slip Button Loops over buttons. Strap can be unbuttoned on 1 side to attach to Netbook Case Handle or removed completely if desired to carry in a handbag.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, rep from * once, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of last 2 sc, do not turn. (18 sc)

Rnd 7 (joining rnd): Ch 1, sc evenly sp across ends of rows (straight top edge), then holding pocket and ornament tog, matching centers and bottom edges, and working through all thicknesses, sl st in each st around bottom edge to join pocket to ornament. Fasten off.

STAR

Rnd 1: With size F hook and silver, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in first sc. (5 sc)

Rnds 2–5: Rep rnds 2–5 of Ornament. At end of last rnd, fasten off. (25 sc)

First Star Point

Row 1: Join silver in any sc of last rnd, sc in same st as join and in each of next 4 sc, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in last 2 sc, turn. (3 sc)

Row 3: Rep row 9 of Tree.

Row 4: Ch 1, sk first sc, sc dec in last 2 sc, turn. (2 sc)

Row 5: Ch 1, sc dec in 2 sc. Fasten off. (1 sc)

Remaining 4 Star Points

Rnd 1: Join silver in next sc to left of last Point made, sc in same st as join and in each of next 4 sc, turn. (5 sc)

Rows 2–4: Rep rows 2–4 of First Star Point.

Star Edge

Rnd 1: With F hook, join silver between any 2 Star Points, ch 1, *sc evenly sp up side of Point, (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in tip of Point, sc evenly sp down side of Point, sl st in st between points, rep from * around Star, join in first sl st. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Using G hook, join F to side of first st of row 1 of Trunk, sc evenly sp around Trunk. Fasten off.

Use marker to number 15 paillettes 11 through 25. Referring to photo for Ornament color placement, sew numbered paillettes to front Pocket of corresponding Ornaments


using sewing needle and 1 ply of corresponding yarn color.

Optional: Apply double-sided adhesive tape to back of each paillette, and press paillette against Pocket front to keep numbers hanging vertically straight.

Place Pocket on top of Ornament aligning center bottom edges. Working through both thicknesses with G hook and corresponding yarn color, sl st in each st along bottom edge of Ornament and Ornament Pocket.

Referring to photo, sew assembled Ornaments and Star to Tree. Use 1 strand silver to make 3 long horizontal sts to secure each Ornament Top to Tree.

Lay completed Tree on cardboard and trace around perimeter to create cardboard backing. Cut out shape approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ – $\frac{1}{2}$ inch inside of traced line. Lay Tree on top of cardboard and tack Tree perimeter to cardboard using MC and tapestry needle.

Sew 1-inch ring to top center edge of Tree for hanging.

across, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (41 [45, 47, 49, 53] dc)

Row 4: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body.

Sizes 4, 6 & 8 Years Only

Rows [5 & 6, 5 & 6, 5 & 6]: Rep rows 3 and 4. ([43, 45, 47] dc)

Size 10 Years Only

Rows [5–8]: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] [twice]. ([49] dc)

Shape Neck & First Shoulder

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each of first 18 [19, 20, 21, 22] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (18 [19, 20, 21, 22] sc)

Row 2: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sc, turn. (17 [18, 19, 20, 21] sc)

Rows 2–7 [2–7, 2–9, 2–11, 2–13]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 [3, 4, 5, 6] times. (14 [15, 15, 15, 15] sc at end of last row)

Row 8 [8, 10, 12, 14]: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body.

Row 9 [9, 11, 13, 15]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 8 and 9 [8 and 9, 10 and 11, 12 and 13, 14 and 15] alternately last 2 rows until piece measures same as Back at end of First Shoulder Shaping. At end of last row, fasten off.

Shape Neck & 2nd Shoulder

Row 1 (WS): Sk next 5 unworked sts following First Shoulder, join yarn with sc in next st, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (18 [19, 20, 21, 22] sc)

Row 2: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (17 [18, 19, 20, 21] sc)

Rows 2–7 [2–7, 2–9, 2–11, 2–13]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 [3, 4, 5, 6] times. (14 [15, 15, 15, 15] sc at end of last row)

Row 8 [8, 10, 12, 14]: Rep row 5 or 7 of Body.

Row 9 [9, 11, 13, 15]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 8 and 9 [8 and 9, 10 and 11, 12 and 13, 14 and 15] alternately last 2 rows until piece measures same as Back at end of First Shoulder Shaping. At end of last row, fasten off.

FINISHING

Block pieces lightly, if desired. Sew shoulder seams.

Neck Edging

With RS facing and size G hook, join yarn with sc in center back neck, sc evenly spaced around neck, working [sc dec in next 2 sts, sc, sc dec in next 2 sts] in 5 unworked sts at center front neck, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Sew side seams.

Armhole Edging

With RS facing and size G hook, join yarn with sc in underarm seam, sc evenly sp around armhole, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends. **CW**

outer edge, stuffing with fiberfill before closing, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

5. Wrap Hatband around Pillow Front just above eyes, bring

ends to back and overlap ends. Tack Hatband to Hat around edges.

6. With cotton swab, lightly apply blush to cheek area and tip of nose.

7. Wrap 2 strands of eggshell 30 times around 3 fingers.

Remove from fingers and tie in center with 6-inch strand of eggshell. Cut lps at ends, fluff and trim to create pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to tip of hat. Bend tip of hat forward and tack in place. **CW**

FINISHING

Felting

Felt the bag in hot water with much agitation. If using a washing machine, more than 1 cycle

may be necessary. Stop the cycle and check the bag often to achieve the desired result. Allow the bag to air dry completely.

Zipper

Pin zipper in place. With sewing needle and matching thread,

sew the zipper into place using an overhand stitch or whipstitch.

Handles

With sewing needle and matching thread, position handles as shown and sew handles onto felted bag. **CW**

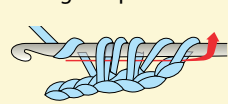

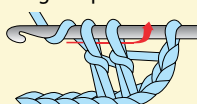

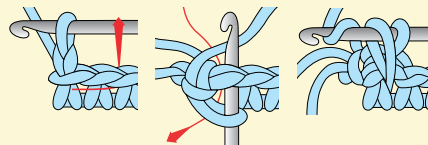

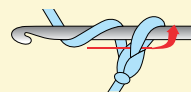

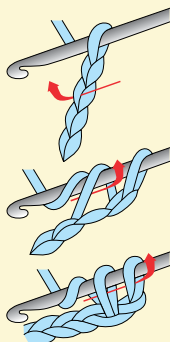

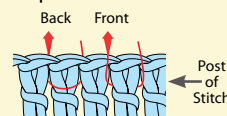
