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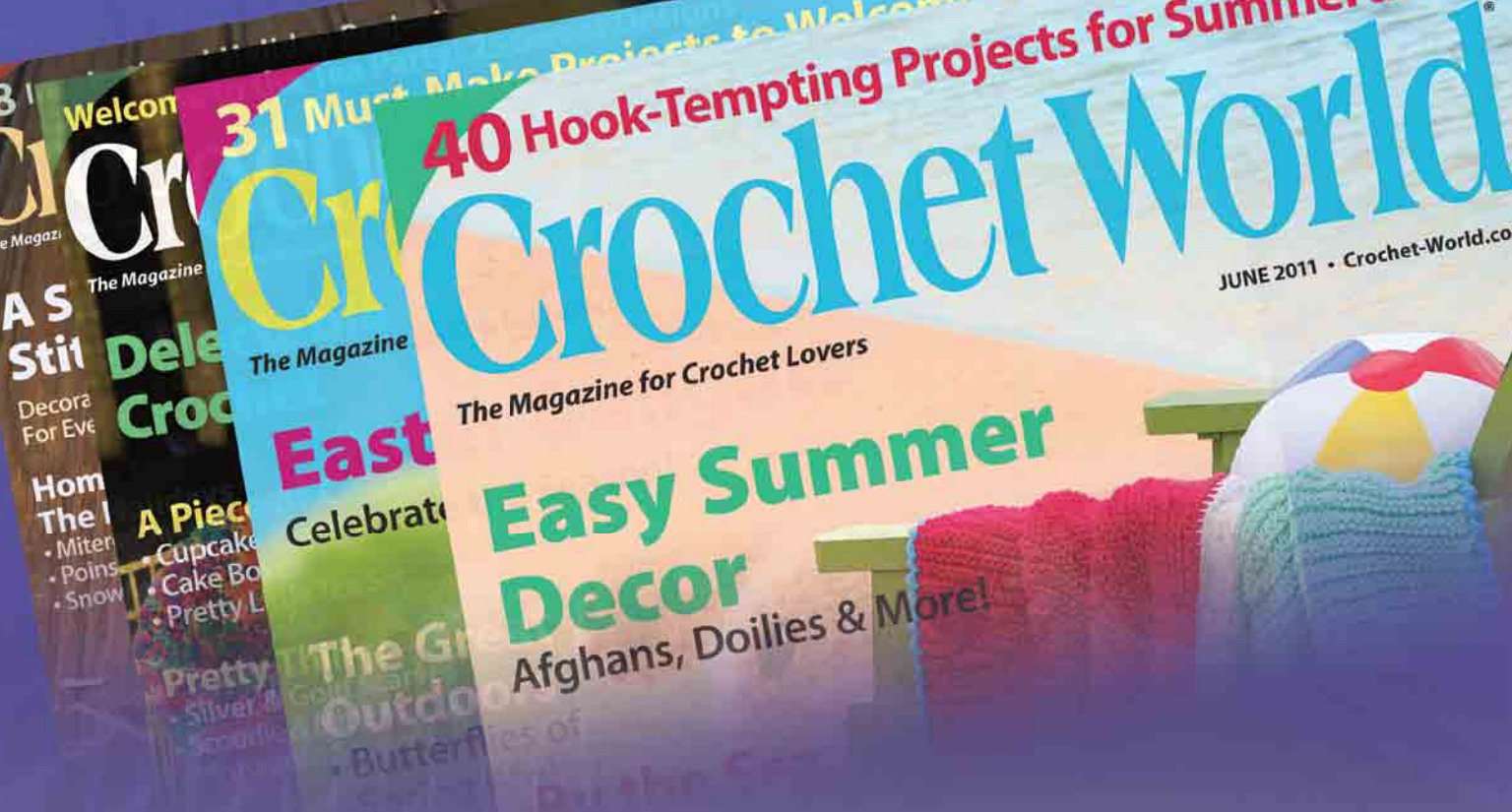
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## All You Need Is Love Table Set

Designs by Debra Arch

### SKILL LEVEL



EASY

### FINISHED SIZES

**Place Mat:** 16½ x 13¾ inches

**Napkin Holder:** 7 x 6⅞ inches

**Coaster:** 5 x 5½ inches  
(fits wineglass bases up to 3⅞ inches diameter)

### MATERIALS

- Tahki Cotton Classic DK weight cotton yarn (1¼ oz/108 yds/50g per skein):
  - 6 skeins # 3488 dark red
  - 1 skein #3003 linen white
  - 1 skein #3002 black
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



### GAUGE

**With 2 strands held tog:** 8 sts = 1 inch; 7 rows = 2 inches

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Backward slip stitch (backward sl st):** \*Slide last lp on hook to within 1 inch of opposite end of crochet hook, insert

wrong end of hook from back to front under both lps of sk sc of previous rnd, draw hook with lp on it completely through top of sc to front, ch 4, rep from \* around.

### PLACE MAT

**Row 1:** With 2 strands dark red held tog, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, [sc in next ch, dc in next ch] twice, turn. (6 sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sc in same st as beg ch-3, [dc in next sc, sc in next dc] twice, (dc, sc) in last st, turn. (8 sts)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, (sc, dc) in same st as beg ch-1, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across to last st, (sc, dc) in last st, turn. (10 sts)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, (sc, dc, sc) in same st as beg ch-1, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last st, (dc, sc, dc) in last st, turn. (14 sts)

**Row 5:** Ch 3, sc in same st as beg ch-3, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last st, (dc, sc) in last st, turn. (16 sts)

**Row 6:** Ch 3, (sc, dc) in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across to last st, (sc, dc, sc) in last st, turn. (20 sts)

**Row 7:** Ch 1, (sc, dc) in same st as beg ch-1, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across to last st, (sc, dc) in last st, turn. (22 sts)

**Rows 8–15:** [Rep rows 4–7 consecutively] twice. (46 sts)

**Rows 16 & 17:** Rep rows 4 and 5, turn. (52 sts)

**Row 18:** Ch 3, [sc in each dc, dc in each sc] across, turn. (52 sts)

**Rows 19 & 20:** Rep row 18.

**Row 21:** Rep row 7, turn. (54 sts)

**Rows 22–29:** Rep row 18. (54 sts)

**Row 30:** Ch 3, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, \*[dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (52 sts)

**Rows 31 & 32:** Rep row 18. (52 sts)

**Row 33:** Ch 1, sc dec in first

2 sts, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last 2 sts, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in last 2 sts, turn. (50 sts)

## FIRST LOBE

**Row 34:** Ch 3, sc dec in next 2 sts, [dc in next st, sc in next st] 9 times, dc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (22 sts)

**Rows 35 & 36:** Rep row 18. (22 sts)

**Row 37:** Rep row 33. (20 sts)

**Rows 38–40:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 3 sts, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, dc dec in last 3 sts, turn. At the end of row 40, fasten off. (8 sts)

## 2ND LOBE

**Rows 34–40:** Sk next 2 sts at center of heart of row 33, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) 2 strands dark red to next st, rep rows 34–40 of First Lobe.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join 1 strand dark red to center sc of heart tip, ch 1, work 3 sc in same st, work 84 sc evenly sp around outer edges of

# Mom & Me Lotus Scarf

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ EASY

## FINISHED SIZE

Smaller size fits most children; where applicable, changes for larger size (*fits most adults*) are in [ ].

## FINISHED MEASUREMENT

**Neck section:** 4¼ inches wide x 14 inches long (*smaller size*) [4½ inches wide x 16 inches long (*larger size*)]

## MATERIALS

- Bernat Satin medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/200 yds/100g per ball);  
1 ball #04007 silk  
1 oz each #04233 lemon grass and #04732 maitai
- Sizes E/4/3.5mm, F/5/3.75mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge



## GAUGE

**Size F hook:** 8 sts = 2 inches;  
16 rows = 4 inches

**Size H hook:** 7 sts = 2 inches;  
14 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

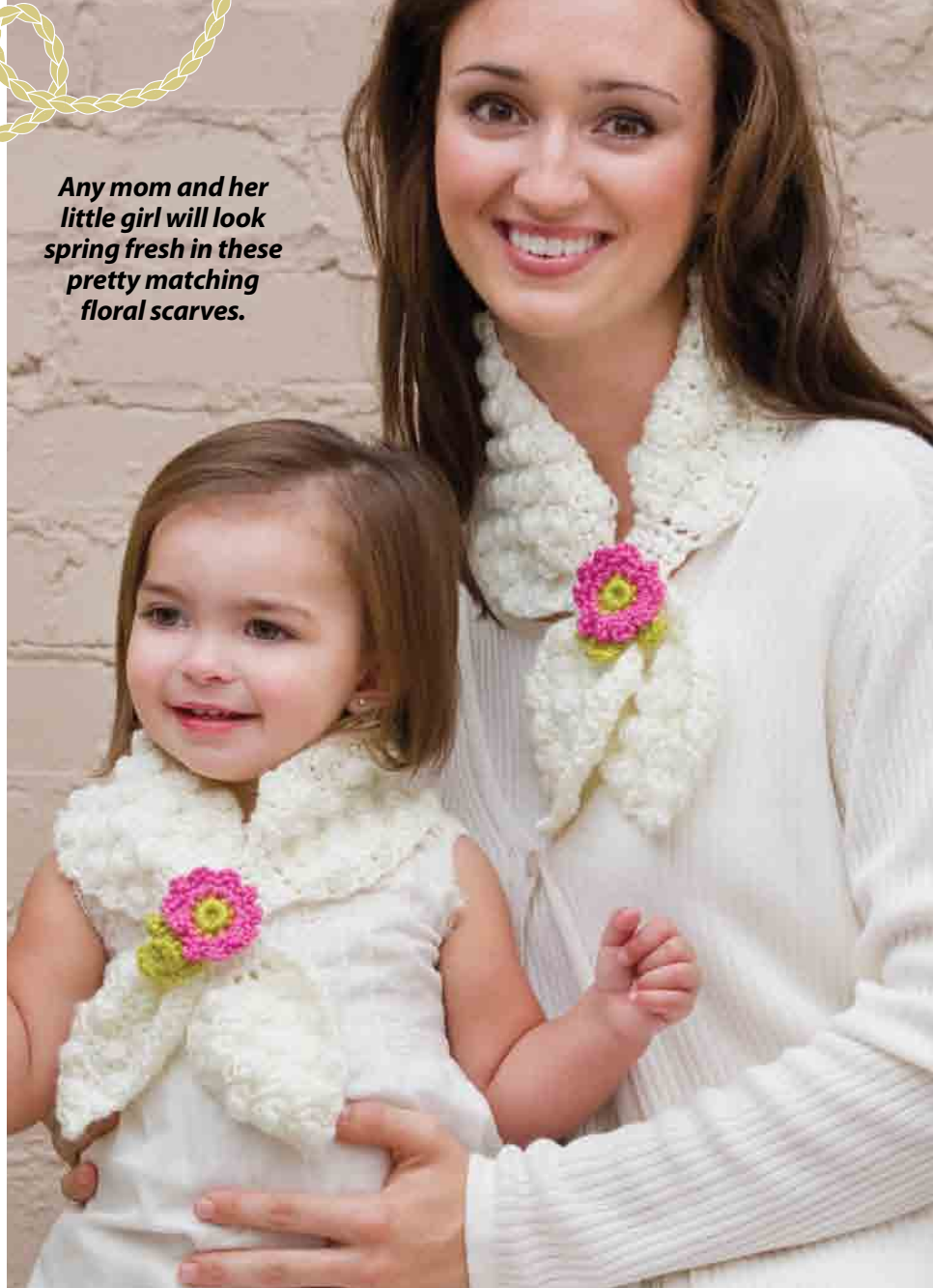
Yarn amounts given will make 1 smaller-size scarf OR 1 larger-size scarf.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Cluster (cl):** [Yo, insert hook in indicated st and pull up lp] 3 times, yo, pull yarn through all 7 lps on hook.

*Any mom and her little girl will look spring fresh in these pretty matching floral scarves.*



## SCARF

### FIRST LEAF

**Row 1:** With size F hook [size H hook] and silk, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 3 sc in first st, turn. (3 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sc, **cl** (*see Special Stitch*) in next st, sc in each of last 2 sc, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc

in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7 sc)

**Row 6:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sc, cl in next st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (9 sts)

**Row 7:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (11 sc)

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in first st, \*[cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sc] twice, cl in next st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 9 sts, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (13 sc)



**Row 10:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sts, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] twice, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 11:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 11 sts, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (15 sc)

**Row 12:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st] 3 times, sc in each of last 3 sc, turn.

**Row 13:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc in first st, cl in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st] 3 times, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 15:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 16:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st] 3 times, sc in each of last 3 sts, turn. (15 sts)

## KEYHOLE

### Front Section

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, [sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 3 sts] 5 times, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 4–10:** Ch 1, working in both lps, sc in each sc across, turn. Fasten off at end of last row.

### Back Section

**Row 1:** With RS facing, join silk with sc in rem lp of first st of row 3 of Front Section, sc in each of next 4 sc, turn.

**Rows 2–8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At end of last row, **do not fasten off**.

## NECK SECTION

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, holding Front and Back Sections tog, working through both thicknesses, sc in each of next 5 sc, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 3 sc in each sc across, turn. (15 sc)

**Row 3 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first st, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] 3 times, cl in next st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 5 (RS):** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sc, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] 3 times, turn.

**Next rows:** [Rep rows 3–6 consecutively] until Neck Section measures 14 [16] inches long, ending with row 3 or row 5. (15 sts at end of last row)

## KEYHOLE INSERT SECTION

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 1, [sc dec in next 3 sts] 5 times, turn. (5 sc)

**Rows 2–7 [2–9]:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

## 2ND LEAF

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 1, 3 sc in each st across, turn. (15 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first st, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] 3 times, cl in next st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] 3 times, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 11 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (13 sc)

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sts, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] twice, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 9 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (11 sts)

**Row 10:** Ch 1, sc in first st, [cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] twice, cl in next st, sc in last st, turn.

**Row 11:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 7 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (9 sc)

**Row 12:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, cl in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (7 sts)

**Row 13:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (5 sts)

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, cl in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (3 sts)

**Row 15:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 16:** Ch 1, sc dec in 3 sts. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

## LOTUS FLOWER

### FLOWER

**Rnd 1:** With size E [F] hook and lemon grass, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 4th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 10 sc in ring, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** Join maitai with sc in any sc, ch 3, sc in same sc, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### LEAF

**Row 1:** With size E [F] hook and lemongrass, ch 17, sl st in 7th ch from hook (*first petal made*), ch 10, sl st in same ch as last sl st (*2nd petal made*). Leaving 6-inch length, fasten off.

### ASSEMBLY

Using 6-inch length, sew Leaf to Flower.

Sew assembled Lotus Flower to Front Section of Keyhole. **cw**

# Baby Bunny Basket

## SKILL LEVEL



## FINISHED SIZE

5 x 6 inches, excluding Head and Tail Pompoms

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Kids medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (5 oz/290 yds/141g per skein):
  - 75 yds #2652 lime (CC) **OR**
  - #2734 pink (CC) **OR** #2358 light purple (CC)
- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein):
  - 70 yds #311 white
- Sizes H/8/5mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- ½-lb. plastic deli container
- Darice 10½ x 13½ inch 7-count plastic canvas
- Annie's Choice® 6-inch plastic canvas heart
- ¼-inch hole punch
- Hot-glue gun
- 10mm movable eyes: 2
- 10mm pink plastic bead



## GAUGE

**Size I hook:** 9 dc = 2 inches;  
2 dc rows or rnds = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Materials listed will make 1 basket. If multiple baskets are desired, increase the following materials based on the number of baskets desired: white yarn, plastic canvas, plastic canvas heart, movable eyes and pink plastic bead.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-1 space unless otherwise stated.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## BASKET

### PREPARATION

Use hole punch to punch 20 holes evenly spaced along top and under lip edge of rim of deli container.

Referring to Handle chart, cut a 90 x 4-hole strip from plastic canvas sheet. Use hole punch to remove 22 intersections from Handle where shown on chart in red.

Referring to Ears chart, cut out Ears shape from plastic canvas heart. Use hole punch to remove 9 intersections from Ears where shown on chart in red.

### BASKET

**Rnd 1:** With CC and size I hook, ch 2, 10 dc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first dc. (10 dc)

**Rnd 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each dc around, join in top of beg ch-3. (20 dc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, \*2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, rep from \* around, join in beg ch-3. (30 dc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in same st, dc in each of next 2 dc, \*2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, rep from \* around, join in beg ch-3. (40 dc)

**Rnd 5:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), \*sk next dc, (dc, ch 1) in next dc, rep from \* around, sk next dc, join in beg ch-3. (20 dc)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 4, \*(dc, ch 1) in each ch-1 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (20 dc)

**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 6. Fasten off.

### HANDLE EDGE

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Using size H hook, join CC in first hole at 1 short end of plastic canvas Handle, ch 1, 5 sc in same hole, working across long edge of Handle, 2 sc in each hole across to last hole, 5 sc in last hole, working across rem long edge of Handle, 2 sc in each hole across, join in first sc. **Do not fasten off.** (90 sc)

### HANDLE CENTER

Draw up ¾-inch lp on hook, drop lp from hook, with RS facing, insert hook from front to back in first hole at same end of Handle



(see *A in Handle Center illustration*), place dropped lp on hook and pull lp through hole (see *B in Handle Center illustration*), \*insert hook into next hole of Handle (see *C in Handle Center illustration*), yo, pull lp through hole and through lp on hook (see *D in Handle Center illustration*) creating sl st (see *E in Handle Center illustration*), rep from \* to opposite end of Handle, join in first sc at opposite end of Handle. Fasten off.

## EARS

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join CC to bottom hole in center of plastic canvas Ears and using size H hook, 6 sc in same hole as join, working across bottom of piece, 3 sc in each of next 3 holes (*bottom of right Ear*), 6 sc in hole at tip of Ear, working across top of right Ear, 3 sc in each of next 2 holes, sc in each of next 2 holes, working along top of left Ear, 3 sc in each of next 2 holes, 6 sc in tip of Ear, 3 sc in each of next 3 holes, join in first sc. (50 sc)

## EARS CENTER

Draw up  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch lp on hook, drop lp from hook, with RS facing, working as for Handle, insert hook from front to back in first hole at same end of Ears (see *A in Handle Center illustration*), place dropped lp on hook and pull lp through hole (see *B in Handle Center illustration*), \*insert hook into next hole of Ears (see *C in Handle Center illustration*), yo, pull lp through hole and through lp on hook (see *D in Handle Center illustration*) creating sl st (see *E in Handle Center illustration*), rep from \* once. Leaving 36-inch tail, fasten off. Pull tail end up through sl st just made, thread yarn tail onto tapestry needle and insert needle from front to back through same hole, weave yarn tail end down to first hole at base of Ears, remove needle,

insert hook from front to back through first hole at base of Ears once more, pull up yarn, forming a lp on hook\*, rep between \* twice, pull remainder of yarn tail through last lp, thread onto needle and weave in on back side. Fasten off CC.

## FEET POMPOMS

### Make 4.

Wrap 1 strand each of white and CC around 3 fingers 30 times. Remove from fingers and tie in center with 6-inch piece of white

# Pineapple Plus Doily

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

## FINISHED SIZES

**Doily:** 20 inches in diameter

**Heart:** 1¾ inches tall

**Shamrock:** 2 inches tall

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (white: 400 yds per ball; solids: 350 yds per ball):

1 ball #1 white

70 yds #484 myrtle green

**Heart Colors:** 5 yds each #401 orchid pink, #493 French rose, #431 pumpkin, #421 goldenrod, #428 mint green, #820 river blue, #479 bridal blue, #805 blue Hawaii, #458 purple and #495 wood violet

- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle
- 11mm clear buttons: 20

## GAUGE

3 shell rnds = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

**Beginning shell (beg shell):** (Sl st, **ch 3**—see *Pattern Notes*), dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 3, dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

**Beginning V-stitch (beg V-st):** (Sl st, **ch 6**—see *Pattern Notes*, dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

**Double shell:** ((2 dc, ch 3) twice, 2 dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

**Beginning double shell (beg double shell):** (Sl st, ch 3, dc, (ch 3, 2 dc) twice in indicated ch-3 sp.

## DOILY

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 5th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 10 sc in ring, join in first sc. (10 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in beg sc. (20 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3] around, join in beg sc. (20 sc, 20 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 4:** (Sl st, ch 1, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 5: Beg V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in first ch-3 sp, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in each ch-3 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (20 V-sts)

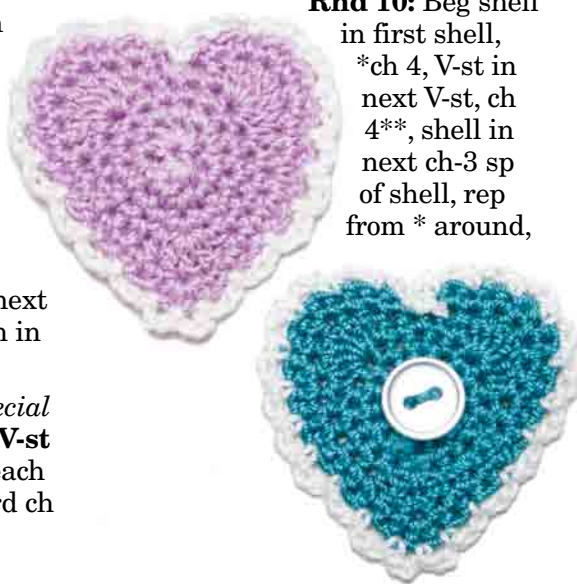
**Rnd 6: Beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in first ch-3 sp, \*ch 2, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2\*\*, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells, 10 dc)

**Rnd 7:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 2, dc in single dc between shells, ch 2\*\*, shell in ch-3 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 8:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 2, V-st in next single dc between shells, ch 2\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells, 10 V-sts)

**Rnd 9:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 3, V-st in next V-st, ch 3\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 10:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, V-st in next V-st, ch 4\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around,





**Optional button-on shamrock or heart motifs give this lovely doily added decorating options.**



ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 11:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next V-st, ch 4\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 14:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp] 8 times, ch 4\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells, 90 sc, 80 ch-3 sps)

shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells, 90 sc, 80 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 15:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 7 times, ch 4\*\*, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 shells, 80 sc, 70 ch-3 sps)

#2753 Agean Sea  
2 [2, 2, 3, 4, 4, 4] skeins  
#2703 barley
- Sizes E/4/3.5mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 20mm buttons: 2



## GAUGE

**Size I hook:** 16 sts = 4 inches;  
20 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Use size I crochet hook unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

### BACK

#### Lower Center Back

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (7 sc)



**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (9 sc)

**Rows 4–32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 56]:** Rep row 3 until there are 67 [75, 81, 89, 97, 105, 115] sc. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

### Left Side Back Inset

**Row 1:** With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) barley in side edge of row 1 at top edge, ch 1, work 32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc evenly sp down side edge of rows, turn. For row 1, place st marker for RS. (32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in last sc, turn. (30 [34, 37, 41, 45, 49, 53] sc)

Rep rows 3 and 4 until 3 sts rem for each size.

### Right Side Back Inset

**Row 1:** With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) barley in side edge of row 32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 56] at right bottom edge, ch 1, work 32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc evenly sp upward in side edge of rows, turn. (32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in last sc, turn. (30 [34, 37, 41, 45, 49, 53] sc)

Rep rows 3 and 4 until 3 sts rem for each size.

### Upper Back

**Row 1:** With RS facing, join Agean Sea in first sc on outside edge on right point of barley section, ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts and ends of rows to point of Agean Sea section, sk 2 sts of Lower Center Back piece (*center*), sc in the next st, then continue working in ends of rows on Left Side Back Inset, turn. (68 [77, 75, 86, 94, 104, 114] sc)

**Rows 2–8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to center 2 sc, sc dec in center 2 sc, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (61 [70, 68, 79, 87, 97, 107] sc)

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc across to center 2 sc, sc dec in center 2 sc, sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in last 2 sc, turn. (59 [67, 65, 76, 84, 94, 104] sc)

Rep rows 8 and 9 until there are 17 [19, 19, 21, 21, 22, 23] sc rem on each side of dec at center.

Fasten off size medium only.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

### Sizes Small & Large Only

[Rep row 10] twice, at the end of last rep, fasten off.

### Sizes 1X–Large, 2X–Large & 4X–Large Only

[Rep row 10] [3] times, at the end of last rep, fasten off.

### Size 3X–Large Only

[Rep row 10] [4] times, at the end of last rep, fasten off.

### FRONTS

#### Lower Left Front

**Row 1:** With Agean Sea, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 2 sc in last ch, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each rem sc, turn. (5 sc)



**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (6 sc)

Rep rows 2 and 3 until there are 34 [36, 39, 42, 45, 49, 50] sc. Fasten off.

#### Lower Right Front

**Row 1:** With Agean Sea, ch 4, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each rem sc, turn. (6 sc)

Rep rows 2 and 3 until there are 34 [36, 39, 42, 45, 49, 50] sc. Fasten off.

#### Left Front Inset

**Row 1:** With RS facing, join barley in side edge at left bottom outer edge (*side seam*), ch 1, work 32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc evenly sp up side edge of rows, turn. (32 [36, 39, 43, 47, 51, 55] sc)

1 skein each #100-07 really red (B) and #100-10 aubergine (C)
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker
- 18-inch square slipcovered pillow form with zipper on seam



### GAUGE

Rows 1–17 of Heart = 4 inches;  
4 sc = 1 inch; 4 sc rows = 1 inch

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Pillow is made by sewing 4 edged Hearts together for front and back, and then edging front and back with snow white to develop shaping for pillow form.

### SPECIAL STITCHES

**Open fan stitch (open fan st):** ([Dc, ch 1] twice, dc) in indicated st or sp.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated st or sp.

### PILLOW

#### HEART

**Make 4 each B & C.**

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 2, (sc, ch 1, sc) in 2nd ch from hook, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first st, (sc, ch 1, sc) in ch-1 sp, sc in last st, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 1, sc) in ch-1 sp, sc in each sc to end of row, turn. (6 sc)

**Rows 4–17:** Rep row 3. (34 sc)

#### First Lobe

**Row 18:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 3 sc, 5 dc in next st, sc dec in next 3 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, turn. (17 sts)

**Row 19:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 3 sts, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, sc dec in next 3 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (17 sts)

**Row 20:** Ch 1, sc in next st, sc dec in next 3 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc in next st] twice, 3 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] twice, sc dec in next 3 sts, sc in next st, turn. (19 sts)

**Row 21:** Sl st in first st, sk next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 3 times, dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] 3 times, dc in next st, sk 1 st, sl st to last st. Fasten off. (23 dc)

#### 2nd Lobe

**Row 18:** With WS facing, sk center ch-1 sp, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) same-color yarn in first unworked sc of row 17, rep row 18 of First Lobe.

**Rows 19–21:** [Rep rows 19–21 of First Lobe.

#### HEART EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Now working in rnds, with RS facing, join same color at bottom point of Heart, ch 1, 2 sc in side of first row, sc in side of each of next 19 rows, sc in



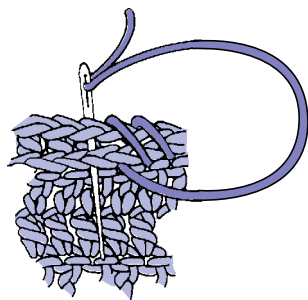


each of next 23 dc, sc in side of next 3 rows, sl st in ch-1 sp, sc in side of next 3 rows, sc in each of next 23 dc, sc in side of each of next 19 rows, 2 sc in side of first row, ch 1, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (94 sc, 1 ch-1 sp, 2 sl sts)

**Rnd 2:** With RS facing, join A at bottom point of Heart in ch-1 sp, ch 1 (sc, ch 1, sc) in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 22 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 8 sts] twice, 2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 5 sts, using ch-1 sp of row 17 as center st of dec, sc dec in next (sc, ch 1, sc) sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 8 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice, sc in each of next 22 sts, sl st to first sc of rnd, leaving 16-inch length of yarn, fasten off. (101 sc, 1 ch-1 sp)

#### HEART ASSEMBLY

Lay 4 Hearts RS facing upward with 4 points touching at center. **Whipstitch** (see illustration) tog using the long tails along the flat edges from the point ch-1 sp for 24 sts toward the Lobes. (55 sts rem open seam to seam on top of each Heart)

#### BACK OUTER EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing attach C at 12th st to left of inner point between Lobes of 1 Heart, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each of next 11 sts, \*hdc in next st, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next st and first st in top of seam, dc dec in opposite top seam st and next st, hdc in next st, sc in each of next 22 sts, 2 hdc in next st, dc dec

next 2 sts, dc dec in previous st and next st, 2 hdc in next st\*\*, sc in each of next 22 sts\*, rep from \* to \* twice, rep from \* to \*\*, sc in each st to beg of rnd, join in beg sc. (176 sc, 24 hdc, 32 dc dec)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 9 sts, \*hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 15 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc and hdc in next st, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts\*\*, sc in each of next 15 sts\*, rep from \* to \* twice, rep from \* to \*\*, sc in each of next 6 sts, join in beg sc, fasten off. (120 sc, 64 hdc, 24 dc, 16 dc dec)

#### FRONT OUTER EDGING & LACE

**Rnds 1 & 2:** Rep rnds 1 and 2 of Back Outer Edging, **do not fasten off**.

**Rnd 3:** Holding front and back tog with WS facing and matching same-color Hearts to one another, ch 1, \*sc through both thicknesses of next st\*, rep from \* to \* 169 times, fit pillow form into stitched side of pillow (open the zipper to shift the fiberfill to fit the pillow contours), crochet to close seam around pillow form, continue to rep from \* to \* around, join in beg sc. (224 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 3, sk 3 sts, sc in next st] 55 times, ch 3, join in beg sc. (56 sc, 56 ch-3 sps)

## GAUGE

Each finished Heart measures approximately 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds. Use stitch marker to mark rounds as work progresses unless otherwise stated.

## HEART

**Make 1 each A, B, C & E, & 2 D.**

### FIRST LOBE

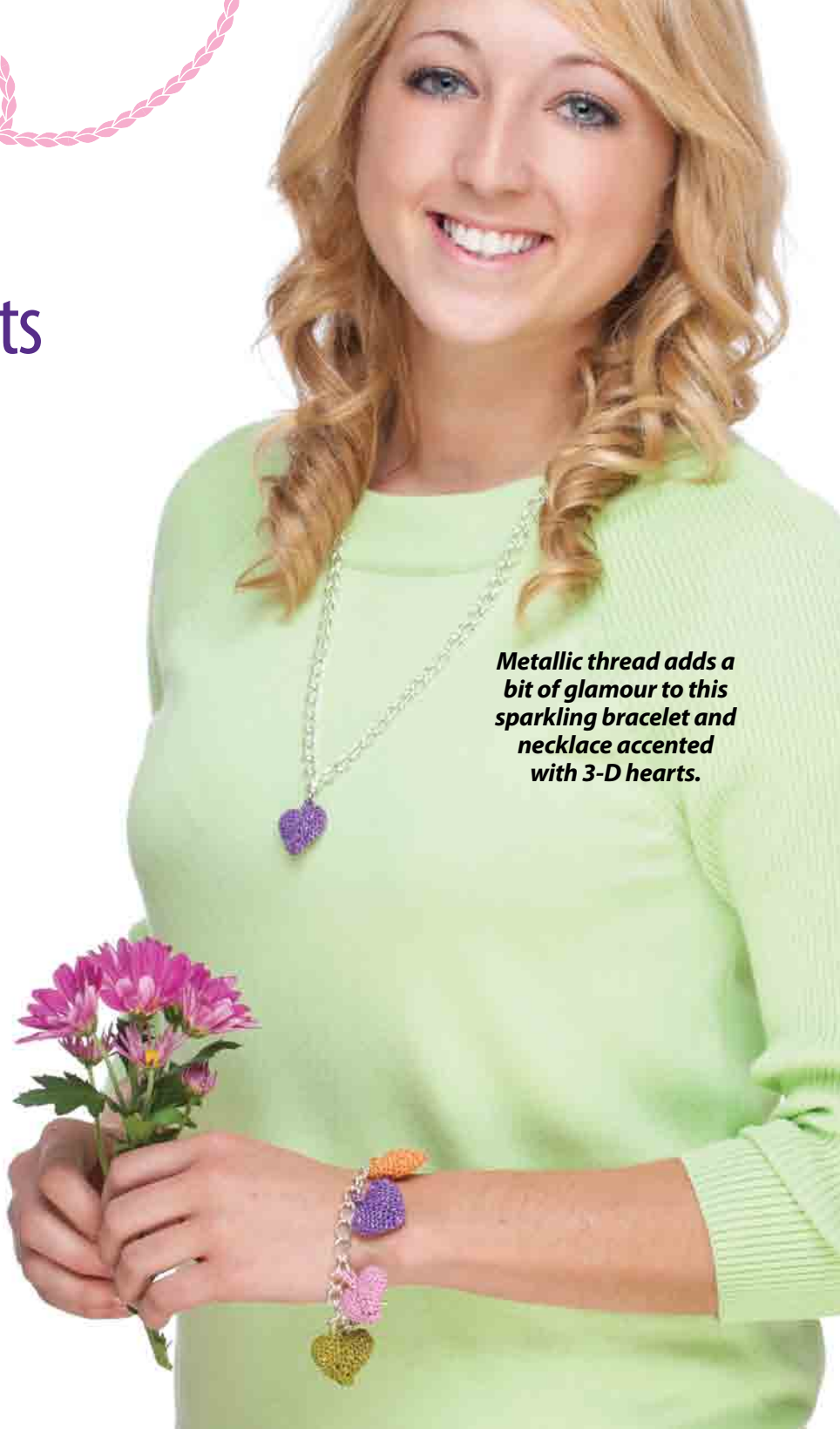
**Rnd 1:** Leaving 3-inch length at beg, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from

hook, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), place marker, pull beg length to close opening. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 5:** Pick up First Lobe, sc in each of next 12 sc, sc in each sc of 2nd Lobe. (24 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each of next 22 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc. (23 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 8 sc, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice, sc in each of next 9 sc. (20 sc)

**Rnd 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] twice, sc in each of next 2 sc, [sc dec in next 2 sc] 4 times, sc in each of next 2 sc, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice. (12 sc)

**Rnd 9:** Sc in each of next 12 sc.

**Rnd 10:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, leaving 14-inch length, fasten off. (6 sc)

## FINISHING

Weave rem length through sts of rnd 10 and draw tightly to close opening. Insert hook from top center between Lobes of Heart and out bottom next to Heart point; draw rem length through Heart and out top, ch 6. Thread crocheted ch through desired ch of bracelet, secure at top of Heart and weave rem length into Heart as desired. Attach 1 color of each Heart to bracelet. Attach purple Heart to necklace in same manner. **CW**

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Popcorn (pc):** 5 dc in indicated st, draw up lp, drop lp from hook, insert hook in first dc of 5-dc group, pick up dropped lp and draw through st on hook.

**Beginning popcorn (beg pc):** Ch 3, 4 dc in same st as beg ch-3, draw up lp, drop lp from hook, insert hook in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, pick up dropped lp and draw through st on hook.

**Shell:** (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in indicated st.

**Beginning shell (beg shell):** (Ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in indicated st.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 3, dc) in indicated st.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in top of last st made.

**Split treble (split tr):** \*Yo hook twice, insert hook in next ch-3 sp, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice\*, yo hook twice, insert hook in 3rd ch of ch-5 sp, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep between \* once, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

## DOILY

**Rnd 1:** With goldenrod, ch 4, 13 dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (14 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sk next dc, [sc in next dc, sk next dc] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (7 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Join wood violet with sc in any sc, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3] 6 times, join in beg sc. (7 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, 3 tr, ch 2, sc) in same ch-3 sp (*petal*), (sc, ch 2, 3 tr, ch 2, sc) (*petal*) in each rem ch-3 sp around, **do not join**. (7 petals)

**Rnd 5:** Working behind petals, ch 1, sc around sc of rnd 3, ch 3,

[sc around next sc on rnd 3, ch 3] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (7 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Join white in any ch-3 sp of rnd 5, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), work 3 dc in same sp as beg ch-3, ch 2, [4 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2] 6 times, join in 3rd ch of ch-3. (28 dc, 7 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in each of next 3 dc, sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-2 sp, ch 4, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 4] 6 times, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 8:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, **beg shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in same ch-3 sp, ch 2, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, [**shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2] 6 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (7 shells)

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of beg shell, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp, ch 10, [sc in ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 10] 6 times, join in beg sc. (7 ch-10 sps)

**Rnd 10:** Sl st in next ch-10 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3) 4 times in same ch-10 sp as beg ch-1, \*(sc, ch 3) 4 times in next ch-10 sp, rep from \* around, join in beg sc. (28 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, (ch 3, 2 dc) in same ch-3 sp, shell in next ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, \*3 dc in next ch-3 sp, shell in next ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

sc in next ch-4 sp, shell in next V-st, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, rep from \* around, join in top of beg pc. Fasten off. (7 pc, 7 shells)

**Rnd 14:** Join white in ch-2 sp of any shell, beg shell in same shell sp, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sc in top of pc, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5\*\*, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 15:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp of shell, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice,

ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5\*\*, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 16:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp of shell, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, shell in ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5\*\*, shell in next ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 17:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp of

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Beginning 4-double crochet cluster (beg 4-dc cl):** Ch 3, keeping last lp of each dc on hook, dc in each of next 3 dc, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

**4-double crochet cluster (4-dc cl):** Keeping last lp of each dc on hook, dc in each of

## RUNNER

### COLUMN 1

#### Motif 1

**Rnd 1:** With burgundy, ch 7, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 7th ch from hook to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 3 dc in ring, [ch 3, 4 dc in ring] 5 times, ch 3, join in top of beg ch-3. (24 dc, 6 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 2: Beg 4-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*), [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, **4-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*)] 5 times, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, join in top of beg dc cl. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** Join ecru in any ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, [ch 5, sc in next sp] 11 times, ch 5, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, [6 sc in next ch-5 sp] 12 times. Fasten off.

#### Motif 2

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Motif 1.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, 6 sc in next ch-5 sp, 3 sc in next ch-5 sp, sl st in 3rd sc of any 6-sc group on previous Motif, 3 sc in same ch-5 sp on current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-5 sp, sl st in 3rd sc of next 6-sc group on previous Motif, 3 sc in same ch-5 sp on current Motif, [6 sc in next ch-5 sp] 9 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

#### Next Motif

**Make 17.**

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Motif 2.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, 6 sc in next ch-5 sp, 3 sc in next ch-5 sp, sl st in 3rd sc of 6-sc group opposite first Motif join on previous

Motif, 3 sc in same ch-5 sp on current Motif, 3 sc in next ch-5 sp, sl st in 3rd sc of next 6-sc group on previous Motif, 3 sc in same ch-5 sp on current Motif, [6 sc in next ch-5 sp] 9 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

### COLUMNS 2–5

#### Motif 1

**Rnds 1–3:** Work the same as for Motif 1 for row 1.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, 6 sc in next ch-5 sp, 3 sc in next ch-5 sp, sk one 6-sc group to right of adjacent Motif, join on previous row (see *Joining Diagram*), sl st in 3rd sc of next 6-sc group on adjacent Motif, 3 sc in same ch-5 sp on

## MATERIALS

- TLC Essentials medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/312 yds/170g per skein):

5 skeins #2772 light country rose

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

14 dc across = 4 inches; first 4 rows = 2½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Block:** Dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch sp **OR** dc in each of next 3 dc.

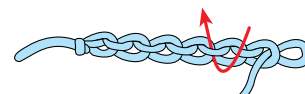


*A delicate filet pattern more commonly associated with fine thread pieces transforms beautifully into a lacy afghan.*

**Space (sp):** Dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next 2 sts **OR** dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp.

## AFGHAN

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 151, working in **back bar of chain** (see illustration), dc in 4th ch from hook (beg 3 sk chs count as first dc), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (148 dc)



Back Bar of Chain

**Row 2 (WS): Ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), **block** (see Special Stitches), \*sp (see Special Stitches) 11 times, block, rep from \* 3 times, turn. (44 sps, 5 blocks)



**Row 3:** Ch 3, block, \*sp 3 times, block 3 times, sp, block, sp 3 times, block, rep from \* 3 times, turn. (28 sps, 21 blocks)

**Rows 4–37:** Follow chart rows 4–37.

**Rows 38–109:** [Rep rows 2–37 consecutively] twice.

### LEFT EDGE BORDER

**Row 1 (RS):** Working across Left Edge of Afghan, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in top of next dc on Edge, [ch 1, dc in top of next dc] across Edge, ending with ch 1, dc in bottom corner ch, turn.

**Row 2 (WS):** Ch 4, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] across, ending with ch 1, sk last ch-1 sp, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

**Row 3 (RS):** Ch 3, dc in next ch-1 sp, [dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp] across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off.

### RIGHT EDGE BORDER

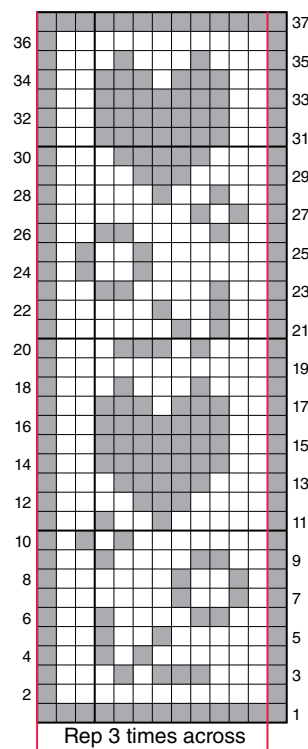
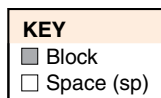
**Row 1 (RS):** Working across Right Edge of Afghan, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) yarn in opposite side of foundation ch, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in top of next dc on Edge, [ch 1, dc in top of next dc] across Edge, ending with dc in top of last dc, turn.

**Rows 2 & 3:** Rep rows 2 and 3 of Left Edge Border. At end of row 3, **do not fasten off or turn**.

### BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Now working in rnds, ch 1, working across top of Afghan, (sc, ch 3, sc) in top of last dc (*corner No. 1*), (sc, ch 2, sc) around post of next 2 dc and in top of corner dc, [ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next dc] across, ending with (sc, ch 2, sc) around post of next 2 dc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last dc (*corner No. 2*), working down side to bottom, [sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next dc] across, ending with (sc, ch 3, sc) in last dc (*corner No. 3*),

working across opposite side of foundation ch and working through 2 lps, (sc, ch 2, sc) around post of next 2 dc and in top of corner dc, [ch 1, sk next 2 chs, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch] across, ending with (sc, ch 2, sc) around post of next 2 dc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in last dc (*corner No. 4*), [ch 1, sk next 2 dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next dc] across, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Crochet designs are made using Kreinik fine metallic thread, sizes 3 and 10 crochet cotton and bulky-weight yarn.

The 13 crochet patterns found in the pattern book are designed around the stones. It's a new way of inserting

glass into crochet that's never been done! The basic technique for embedding glass in crochet designs involves covering two rings (metal or plastic) with single crochet and chain stitches, and then joining the rings together to a certain point; then the crocheter inserts or embeds a glass stone between the rings. The crochet pattern evolves around the embedded glass after that. It's a fun technique that adds interest and glitz to your crochet projects.

### FINISHED SIZE

18 x 57 inches, including Hood and Ribbing

### MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Tweed Stripes bulky (chunky) weight acrylic yarn (3 oz/144 yds/85g per ball):  
3 balls #205 Caribbean
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 6-inch cardboard square



### GAUGE

4 V-sts = approximately 3½ inches;  
4 V-st rows = approximately 3 inches

### PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

V-stitch in chain-1 space of indicated V-stitch unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 1, dc) in indicated st or sp.

*Gorgeous hand-painted-look yarn does all the work in creating the rich colorway in this cozy head and neck warmer.*





## HOODED SCARF

### HOOD

**Row 1:** Ch 63, **V-st** (see *Special Stitch*) in 5th ch from hook, \*sk next ch, V-st in next ch, rep from \* across to last 2 chs, sk next ch, dc in last ch, turn. (29 V-sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next dc, **V-st in next V-st** (see *Pattern Notes*), V-st in each rem V-st across, dc in 3rd ch of beg 4 sk chs, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, sk next dc, V-st in next V-st and in each rem V-st across, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rows 4–11:** Rep row 3. At end of last row, leaving 20-inch length, fasten off.

### Ribbing

**Row 1:** With RS facing, leaving 6-inch length, join yarn in opposite side of beg ch, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, sl st in ch at base of next V-st, turn.

**Note:** Work rem rows in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), unless otherwise stated.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Note*), sk sl st, sc in back lp of each of next 8 sc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, sl st in ch at base of next V-st, turn.

**Next rows:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 consecutively] across. At end of last row, leaving 20-inch length, fasten off.

### Finishing

Using tapestry needle, weave 6-inch end through row 1 of Ribbing, pull tight to gather, fasten off.

Using tapestry needle, weave 20-inch length across opposite end of Ribbing, pull tight to gather, fasten firmly but **do not fasten off**. Fold Ribbing over Hood, using rem 20-inch length, working from current end across to opposite end, tack Ribbing to Hood in several places across Hood, fasten off at opposite end of Hood. Turn Hood WS out, fold in half, working across opening opposite Ribbing, sew 3-inch seam, secure end of seam, weave yarn around rem opening, pull tight to gather, fasten off.

### SCARF

**Row 1:** Ch 23, V-st in 5th ch from hook, \*sk next ch, V-st in next ch, rep from \* across to last 2 chs, sk next ch, dc in last ch, turn. (9 V-sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next dc, **V-st in next V-st** (see *Pattern Notes*), V-st in each rem V-st across, dc in 3rd ch of beg 4 sk chs, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, sk next dc, V-st in next V-st and in each rem V-st across, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rows 4–80:** Rep row 3. At end of last row, **do not fasten off**.

### Ribbing

**Row 1:** Ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, working across end of Scarf, sl st in next ch-1 sp, turn.

**Note:** Work rem rows in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), unless otherwise stated.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Note*) only, sk sl st, sc in back lp of each of next 8 sc, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, sl st in ch at base of next V-st, turn.

**Next rows:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 consecutively] across. At end of last row, leaving 20-inch length, fasten off.

### ASSEMBLY

Align seam on back of Hood with center of RS of Scarf. Sew tog.

### TASSEL

Wrap yarn around cardboard square 45 times. Tie separate strand tightly around all lps at 1 end (*fold formed*), leaving ends long for tying. Remove Tassel from cardboard. Wrap another strand around all lps 1 inch from fold. Cut lps apart at end of Tassel opposite fold. Trim ends even.

Use rem length to sew Tassel to center back of Hood. **CW**

## FINISHED SIZE

32 x 34 inches

## MATERIALS

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/ 315 yds/170g per skein):  
2 skeins #9701 white (A)  
1 skein each #9719 soft pink (B) and #9739 soft green (C)
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

7 hdc = 2 inches; 5 hdc rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

When changing color, do not fasten off color not in use. Carry color along top of previous row and work stitches over color not in use until pattern indicates use of color.

Chart is provided for those preferring to work pattern from a Chart (see page 61).

Each square on chart equals 1 half double crochet, except for first row of each color C stripe. This first row of each color C is worked in single crochet.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Surface slip stitch (surface sl st):** With C, make slip knot on hook and hold on WS of piece. Insert hook from RS to WS between sts of rnd 3, place slip knot on hook, draw lp to RS, ch 1, \*sk next 2 sts, insert hook from RS to WS between sts, yo, draw lp to RS and through lp on hook (*surface sl st made*), ch 1, rep from \* around.

## BLANKET

**Row 1:** Beg at bottom edge of Blanket, with A, ch 102, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (*2 sk chs counts as first hdc*), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (*101 hdc*)

**Row 2:** Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each hdc across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 2, hdc in each of first 7 sts, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to B, hdc in next st (*base of small heart*), [change color to A, hdc in each of next 11 sts, change color to B, hdc in next st (*base of small heart*)] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 8 sts, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 6 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 3 sts, [change color

to A, hdc in each of next 9 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 3 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 7 sts, turn.

**Row 5:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 5 sts, [change color to A, hdc in each of next 7 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 5 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 6 sts, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 4 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 7 sts, [change color to A, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 7 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 5 sts, turn.

**Rows 7 & 8:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 9 sts, [change color to A, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 9 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 4 sts, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 4 sts, change color to A, hdc in next st, change color to B, hdc in each of next 4 sts, [change color to A, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 4 sts, change color to A, hdc in next st, change color to B, hdc in each of next 4 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 4 sts, turn.



**Row 10:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 4 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 2 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [change color to A, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 2 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 2 sts] 7 times, change color to A, hdc in each of last 5 sts, turn.

**Rows 11 & 12:** Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn. At the end of row 12, change color to C, turn.

**Row 13:** Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 14:** Ch 2, working in front lps, hdc in each st across, change color to A in last st, turn.

**Row 15:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

**Rows 16–28:** Rep rows 2–14.

**Rows 29 & 30:** Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

**Row 31:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 49 sts, change color to B, hdc in next st (*base of large heart*), change color to A, hdc in each of last 50 sts, turn.

**Row 32:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 48 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 49 sts, turn.

**Row 33:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 47 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 48 sts, turn.

**Row 34:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 46 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 7 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 47 sts, turn.

**Row 35:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 45 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 9 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 46 sts, turn.



*Simple color changes create the rows of pretty pink hearts in this darling, easy-to-make blanket.*

**Row 36:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 44 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 11 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 45 sts, turn.

**Row 37:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 43 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 13 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 44 sts, turn.

**Row 38:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 42 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 15 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 43 sts, turn.

**Rows 39–43:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 41 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 17 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 42 sts, turn.

48 x 62 inches

## MATERIALS

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/ 315 yds/170g per skein):  
4 skeins each #0008 autumn maize (A), #0010 cypress (B) and #0002 harvest rose (C)
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

14 sts = 4 inches; 18 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

At end of row, do not fasten off yarn; carry unused colors loosely up edge of Throw.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Double crochet cluster will enclose chain-1 spaces on previous rows.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Double crochet cluster (dc cl):** Keeping last lp of each dc on hook, work 2 dc in **sk st 3 rows below** (see *Pattern Notes*), yo, draw through rem 3 lps on hook.

## THROW

**Foundation row 1 (WS):** With A, ch 160, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (159 sc)

**Foundation row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sc, [ch 1, sk next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] 39 times, turn.

**Foundation row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in each of next 3 sc] across, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to B in last st, turn.

**Row 1:** With B, ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, [**dc cl** (see *Special Stitch*), sc in next sc on current row, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc] across, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in each of next 3 sts] across to last 2 sts, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in last sc, change color to C, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [dc cl 3 rows below, sc in next sc on

current row, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc] across to last 2 sts, dc cl in next st 3 rows below, sc in last st on current row, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in each of next 3 sts] across, change color to A in last st, turn.

**Rows 5 & 6:** With A, rep rows 1 and 2.

**Rows 7 & 8:** With B, rep rows 3 and 4.

**Rows 9 & 10:** With C, rep rows 1 and 2.

**Rows 11 & 12:** With A, rep rows 3 and 4.

**Rows 13–252:** [Rep rows 1–12 consecutively] 20 times.

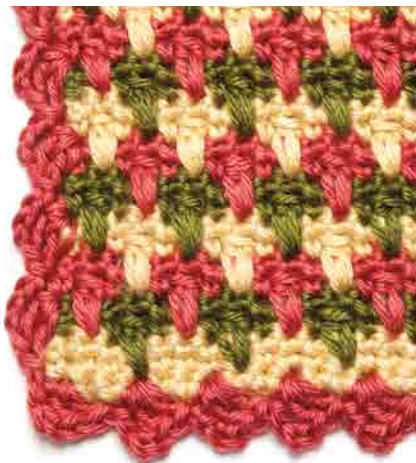
**Rows 253–262:** Rep rows 1–10 once.

**Row 263:** With A, ch 1, sc in first sc, dc cl in next st 3 rows below, [sc in each of next 3 sts on current row, dc cl in next st 3 rows below] across, sc in last sc, turn.

**Row 264:** Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join C with sc in lower right-hand corner, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in same st, [\*sk next 3 rows, (sc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next row, rep from \* to corner, (sc, ch 3, 2 dc) in corner sc, \*\*sk 2 sc, (sc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next st, rep from \*\* across], ending with (sc, ch 2, 3 dc) in last sc, rep between [ ] once, join with sl st in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Wrap is worked in 2 sections, starting from the center and working out to the fringe.

**Curl:** Ch 20, 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook, 3 dc in each of next 16 chs, dc in last ch.

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 128, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sk next 2 chs, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, \*sk next 2 chs, shell in next ch, sk

## SCARF

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 33, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in 6th ch from hook, \*sk next 5 chs, shell in next ch, rep from \* across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn. (5 shells)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 3, dc in ch-2 sp of first shell, \*ch 3, sc in sp between next 2 shells, ch 3, dc in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* across, ch 3, sc in 4th ch of beg 5 sk chs, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 4 (see *Pattern Note*), sk first ch-3 sp, shell in next dc,

\*sk next 2 ch-3 sps, shell in next dc, rep from \* across to last ch-3 sp, sk last ch-3 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

**Rows 4–103:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 50 times. **Do not fasten off.**

## EDGING

**Row 104:** Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 5, sc in ch-2 sp of first shell, \*ch 5, sc in sp between next 2 shells, ch 5, sc in ch-2 sp of next shell,

rep from \* across, ch 5, sc in top of beg ch-4. Fasten off.

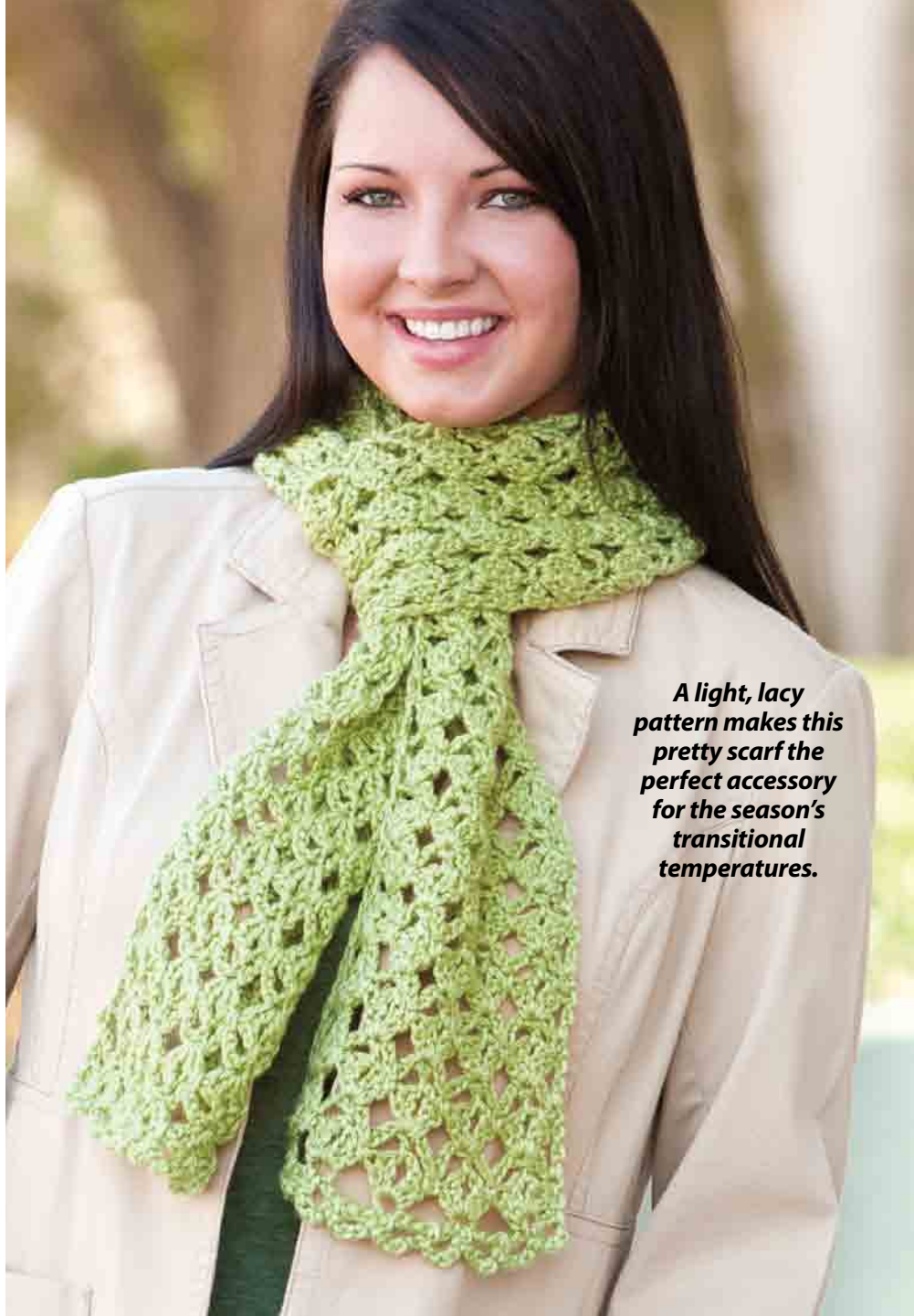
## FIRST ROW EDGING

With RS facing and working in rem lps across opposite side of foundation ch, join yarn with sc in first ch, ch 5, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, \*ch 5, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, rep from \* across. Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. **CW**

  - 1 skein each #860-173 dusty green (C), #860-125 taupe (D) and #860-110 navy (E)
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



## GAUGE

**Size H hook:** 16 sts = 4 inches;  
18 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## AFGHAN

**Row 1 (RS):** Starting at short edge with B, ch 127, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each of next 3 chs, [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs] twice, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, \*[ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs] twice, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, rep from \* 3 times, turn. (94 dc, 31 ch-1 sps)

**Row 2: Ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each of next 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*[ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* 3 times. Fasten off.

**Row 3 (RS): Join** (*see Pattern Notes*) A in first dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*[ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* 3 times, turn. (94 dc, 31 ch-1 sps)

**Rows 4–6:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*[ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* 3 times, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

**Row 7 (RS):** Join B in first dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*[ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* 3 times, turn. (94 dc, 31 ch-1 sps)





**Row 8:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*[ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] 3 times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, ch 1, sk next ch sp, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from \* 3 times. Fasten off.

**Rows 9–98:** [Rep rows 3–8 consecutively] 15 times.

### WEAVING STRIPS

Add 12 inches to length of Afghan to get Weaving Strip length. Cut 24 Weaving Strips of C, 57 Weaving Strips of D and 12 Weaving Strips of E.

#### First Weave

Using 3 strands of D held tog, leaving approximately 5-inch length, tie knot around first sk ch on starting ch, beg with row 2, working vertically, weave through ch-1 sps across to top of Afghan, tie knot around ch-1 sp in last row. Leaving approximately 5-inch length, fasten off.

#### 2nd Weave

Using 3 strands of D held tog, leaving approximately 5-inch length, tie knot around 2nd sk ch on starting ch, beg with row 1, working vertically, weave through opposite ch-1 sps of First Weave across to top of Afghan, tie knot around ch-1 sp in last row. Leaving approximately 5-inch length, fasten off.

#### 3rd Weave

Rep First Weave in 3rd sk ch on starting ch.

#### Remaining Weaves

\*Alternating between First and 2nd Weave, work next 7 Weaves in following color sequence: C, E, D, C, D, D, D. Rep from \* in rem ch sps across Afghan.



*A horizontal striping pattern laced with vertical strands of yarn creates a subtle plaid effect in this cozy throw.*

### FRINGE

**Note:** Do not place Fringe in ch sps.

Cut 376 11-inch strands B. \*With WS of Afghan facing, insert hook between 2 sts on 1 short end of Afghan, fold 2 strands in half, place fold on hook and pull fold to WS of Afghan, draw Fringe

lengths through lp on hook. Pull knot tight.

Rep from \* across both short ends of Afghan.

Trim ends even.

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, ch 113, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, **cl** (see *Special Stitch*) in each of next 4 chs, [sc in each of next 4 chs, cl in each

of next 4 chs] 13 times, turn. (56 sc, 56 cls)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 4 cls, cl in each of next 4 sc] 14 times, turn.

**Rows 3 & 4:** Rep row 2. At the end of row 4, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B.

**Row 5:** Rep row 2, change color to A.

**Rows 6 & 7:** Rep row 2. At the end of row 7, change color to C.

**Row 8:** Rep row 2, change color to A.

- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers
- Fiberfill
- Drill
- 16-inch-diameter craft ring



## GAUGE

14 sc = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Craft ring can be purchased or a ring can be cut from lightweight wood or very heavy cardboard. If you choose to make your own ring, do not make it until after the Ring Cover is crocheted. Then make the ring slightly larger than the Cover, so that the Cover will fit snugly.

Chain-3 at beginning of round does not count as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Drill 8 holes evenly spaced around craft ring.

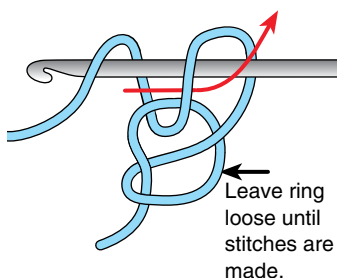
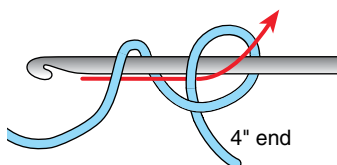
## SPECIAL STITCHES

### Looped single crochet (lp sc):

Sc in indicated st, ch 5, sl st in side of sc just made. In later rnds push the ch-5 lp to the RS and work in the sc only.

**Puff stitch (puff st):** Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, insert hook in same st, yo, draw up lp] 4 times, yo, draw through all 11 lps on hook.

**Slip ring:** Wrap yarn in ring, ensuring the yarn tail falls behind working yarn. Grip ring and tail firmly between middle finger and thumb. Insert hook through center of ring, yo (*with working yarn*) and draw up lp, work sts of first rnd in ring. After the first rnd of sts is worked, pull gently, but firmly, on yarn tail to tighten ring.

## MOBILE

### BALLOON I

#### Make 3.

**Note:** Balloon is made from 6 Panels each worked separately.

## Panel

### Make 1 each B, C, D, E, F & G.

**Row 1:** Ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (3 sc)

**Rows 2–6:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (5 sc)

**Rows 10–13:** Rep rows 6–9. (7 sc)

**Rows 14–19:** Rep row 8.

**Rows 20–24:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (2 sc at end of last row)

**Row 25:** Ch 1, sc dec in 2 sc. Leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (1 sc)

## Assembly

Sew side edges of 6 Panels tog to form Balloon. Weave strand of yarn through edges of top of Balloon and pull gently to gather. Secure and weave in end. Panels are arranged F, C, E, G, B, D or arrange as desired.

## BALLOON II

### Make 3.

**Rnd 1:** With F, ch 18, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form ring, ch 1, sc in each of first 3 chs, **change color** (*see Stitch Guide*) to C, sc in each of next 3 chs, change color to E, sc in each of next 3 chs, change color to G, sc in each of next 3 chs, change color to B, sc in each of next 3 chs, change color to D, sc in each of next 3 chs join in beg sc, turn. (18 sc)



**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, with D, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to B, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to G, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to E, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to C, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to F, sc in each of next 3 sc, join in beg sc, turn.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, with F, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to C, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to E, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to G, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to B, sc in each of next 3 sc, change to D, sc in each of next 3 sc, join in beg sc, turn.

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Rep rnds 2 and 3.

**Rnd 6:** Rep rnd 2.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc to next color section, \*change to next color, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc to next color section, rep from \* around, join in beg sc, turn. (24 sc)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to next color section, \*change to next color, sc in each sc to next color section, rep from \* around, join in beg sc, turn.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to 1 sc before next color section, \*2 sc in next sc, change to next color, sc in each sc to 1 sc before next color section, rep from \* around, join in beg sc, turn. (30 sc)

**Rnd 10:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnd 11:** Rep rnd 7. (36 sc)

**Rnds 12 & 13:** Rep rnds 8 and 9. (42 sc)

**Rnds 14–19:** Rep rnd 8.

**Rnds 20–24:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each sc to next color section, \*change to next color, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each sc to next color section, rep from \* around, join in beg sc, turn. (12 sc)

**Rnd 25:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, \*change to next color, sc dec in next 2 sc, rep from \* around, join in beg sc, turn. (6 sc)

Leaving 12-inch length, fasten

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around, sl st in next st. (36 sc)

**Rnd 7 (RS):** Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 8: Ch 2** (does not count as st), \*fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 sts, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2, turn.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 2, \*bpdc around each of next 3 sts, fpdc around each of next 3 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2, turn.

**Rnds 10 & 11:** Rep rnds 8 and 9, do not turn at the end of rnd 11.

**Rnd 12:** Ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each st around.



## ELEPHANT

### Body

**Rnd 1:** With F, make slip ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring, **do not join**, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

**Note:** While working rnd 5, place markers in the ch-sps for Arms, Legs and Neck. Use different-color marker for the neck opening than for Arm and Leg openings.

**Rnd 5: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next 3 sts (arm opening), sc in each of next 2 sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sts (leg opening), sc in each of next 3 sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sts (leg opening), sc in each of next 2 sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sc (arm opening), sc in next sc, ch 3, sk next 3 sc (neck opening), sc in last sc. (9 sc and 5 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each ch and sc around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 8:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 9:** [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 10:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] around. Leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (6 sc)

### Arm & Leg

#### Make 2 each.

**Rnd 1:** Join F with sc in arm or leg opening, work 9 more sc evenly sp around opening. (10 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in next sc, ch 1, working in back lps and beg in same sc as last sl st made, [sc dec in next 2 sc] around, join in beg dec, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Weave yarn tail through sts of last rnd and pull gently to gather. Secure and weave in end.

### Head

**Rnd 1:** Join F with sc anywhere in neck opening, work 9 more sc evenly sp around. (10 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (20 sc)

**Rnds 3–6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] around. At the end of rnd 8, leaving 12-inch length, fasten

off. Weave yarn tail through sts of last rnd and pull gently to gather. (5 sc)

### Trunk

**Rnd 1:** With F, make slip ring, work 6 sc in ring, **do not join**. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lps, sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 3–10:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 11:** [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] around. (9 sc)

**Rnds 12 & 13:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 13, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

### Ears

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With F, make **slip ring** (see *Special Stitches*), work 4 sc in ring, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sc, dc in last sc, turn. (7 sts)

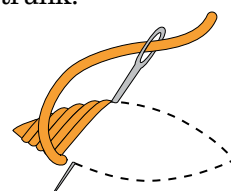
**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (6 sts)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, 2 hdc in next st, 2 dc in last st, turn. (6 sts)

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of last 4 sts, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (5 sts)

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head with fiberfill. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather. Secure and weave in end. Sew Trunk to front of Head. Sew an Ear to each side of Head. With H, using **satin stitch** (see *illustration*), embroider eyes above trunk.

## MOUSE

### Body

With A, work same as Elephant Body.

### Arm & Leg

**Make 2 each.**

**Rnd 1:** Join A with sc in arm or leg opening, work 9 more sc evenly sp around. (10 sc)

**Rnds 2 & 3:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in next sc, ch 1, working in back lps and beg in same sc as last sl st made, [sc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in first sc dec, leaving 12-inch length of yarn, fasten off. Weave yarn tail through sts of last rnd and draw gently to gather.

### Head

**Rnds 1–3:** With A, rep rnds 1–3 of Elephant Head through rnd 3, place marker in center front sc of Head. (20 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each sc to marked sc, 3 hdc in marked sc, place marker in center hdc of 3-hdc group, sc in each rem sc around. (22 sts)

**Note:** If desired, in rnd 5, change color to E before puff st and back to A after puff st for tip of nose.

**Rnd 5:** Sc in each st to marked hdc, **puff st** (see *Special Stitches*) in marked hdc, place marker in puff st, sc in each rem sc around.

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each sc to 1 st before marked puff st, sc dec in next 3 sts, move marker to dec just made, sc in each rem sc around. (20 sts)

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc to marker, remove marker, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each rem sc around. (19 sts)

**Rnd 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 9 times, sc in last sc. (10 sts)

**Rnd 9:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 5 times. Fasten off. (5 sts)

### Ear

**Make 2.**

**Row 1:** With A, make **slip ring** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, (sc, 3 hdc, sc) in ring, turn. (5 sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, 2 hdc in each of next 3 hdc, 2 sc in last sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (10 sts)

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather. Secure and weave in end. Sew an Ear to each side of Head.

For Tail, join A in back of Body, ch 15. Fasten off.

With E, embroider over puff st at tip of nose.

With H, using **satin stitch** (see *illustration on page 42*) embroider eyes above nose.

Cut 3 lengths each 4 inches long of H, and thread through nose, just below tip, for whiskers. Weave in all ends.

## TEDDY BEAR

### Body

With C, work same as Elephant Body.

### Arm & Leg

**Make 2 each.**

With C, work same as Mouse Arm and Leg.



### Head

**Rnds 1–3:** With C, work same as Elephant Head rnds 1–3, place marker in center front sc of Head. (20 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each sc to 1 sc before marker, 2 hdc in each of next 3 sc, move marker to last hdc made, sc in each rem sc around. (23 sts)

**Rnd 5:** Sc in each st to 5 sts before marked hdc, [hdc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 3 times, remove marker, sc in each rem sc around. (20 sts)

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (5 sts)

At the end of rnd 8, fasten off.

### Ears

**Make 2.**

**Row 1:** With C, make **slip ring** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, (sc, 3 hdc, sc) in ring, turn. (5 sts)

Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off.

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather. Secure and weave in end.

Sew an Ear to each side of Head. With E, embroider nose on face. With H, using **satin stitch**

(see illustration on page 42) embroider eyes above nose. Weave in all ends.



## BUNNY

### Body

With E, work same as Elephant Body.

### Arm & Leg

With E, work same as Mouse Arm and Leg.

### Head

With E, work same as Teddy Bear Head.

### Ears

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With E, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in last ch, ch 3, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 2 chs, leaving 10-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather. Sew an Ear to each side of Head. With D, using **satin stitch** (see illustration on page 42) embroider nose on face. With H, using satin stitch, embroider eyes above nose.



## HIPPO

### Body

With D, work same as Elephant Body.

### Arm & Leg

#### Make 2 each.

With D, work same as Mouse Arm and Leg.

### Head

With D, work same as Teddy Bear Head.

### Nose

**Rnd 1:** With D, ch 3, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 4 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, 2 sc in next ch, **do not join**. (8 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc. (12 sc)

**Rnds 3 & 4:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (8 sts)

**Rnd 6:** 2 sc in each sc around, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. (16 sc)

### Ears

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With D, make slip ring, 5 sc in ring, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off.

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather. Sew Nose to

front of Head. Sew Ear to each side of Head. With H, using **satin stitch** (see illustration on page 42) embroider smile, 2 nostrils and eyes.



## LION

### Body

With G, work same as Elephant Body.

### Arm & Leg

#### Make 2.

With G, work same as Mouse Arm and Leg.

### Head

**Rnd 1:** Join G with sc in neck opening, work 8 more sc evenly sp around. (9 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 3–6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 7:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] around. (9 sc)

**Rnd 8:** [Sc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times, sc in last st, leaving 12-inch length of yarn, fasten off. (5 sc)

Weave length through sts of last rnd and draw gently to gather.

### Muzzle

**Rnd 1:** With G, ch 3, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 4 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, 2 sc in next ch, **do not join**. (8 sc)



**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each sc around, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

### Mane

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With F, make slip ring, [lp sc (see *Special Stitches*) in ring] 6 times, **do not join**. (6 sc, 6 ch-5 lps)

**Note:** Push all ch-5 lps to the RS and work in sc only.

**Rnd 2:** Work 2 lp sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnds 3 & 4:** Lp sc in each sc around, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

### Finishing

Stuff Body, Arms, Legs and Head. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd of Body and draw gently to gather.

Sew Muzzle to front of Head. With E, using **satin stitch** (see illustration on page 42) embroider nose on Muzzle. With H, using satin stitch embroider eyes above Muzzle. Weave in all ends.

### Tail

**Rnd 1:** With F, make **slip ring** (see *Special Stitches*), beg at tip, with F, make slip ring, work 4 lp sc in ring, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Join G in base of tip, ch 10, sl st in back of Body, sl st in each ch of the ch-10, sl st in base of tip again. Fasten off.

### RING COVER

**Rnd 1:** With G, ch 114, join in first ch to form ring, taking care not to twist ch, sc in each ch around. (114 sc)

**Rnd 2:** [Sc in each of next 18 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around, change color to F. (120 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 19 sc,

2 sc in next sc] around, change color to E. (126 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Rep rnd 3.

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 20 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. Fasten off. (132 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Join B with sc in any ch on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each rem ch around. (114 sc)

**Rnds 8–12:** Rep rnds 2–6, working 1 more rnd with B, 2 rnds with C and 2 rnds with D. Leaving 1-yd length, fasten off.

With foundation ch at inside edge of craft ring, wrap Cover over craft ring and sew outer edges tog. Ring Cover should fit snugly over craft ring.

### FINISHING

Lightly stuff Balloons, leaving approximately 1 inch of bottom part unstuffed. The bottom edge of the Balloons will be left open.

**Note:** Use care not to allow child to play with open-ended Balloons.

### Balloon Ropes

**Note:** Balloon Ropes are worked on each Balloon and are worked around Balloons for decoration and to hang a Basket below the Balloon.

**Rnd 1:** Join A between any 2 color sections of Balloon at rnd or row 17, \*ch 6, sl st between next 2 color sections, rep from \* 5 times, working last sl st in same sp as beg sl st.

**Rnd 2:** \*Ch 12, sl st in next sl st, ch 25, sl st in top of a Basket (between two 3-post st groups), sl st in each ch of ch-25, sl st in same st at beg of ch-25, ch 12, sl st in next sl st, rep from \* around, sk 12 sts on top of Basket each rep and working last sl st in same sp as beg sl st. Fasten off.

### ASSEMBLE MOBILE

**Hanging strands:** Cut 60-inch strand of A and thread doubled

onto yarn needle (*doubled strand should be approximately 30 inches long*). Tie an overhand knot at end of doubled strand. Insert needle from bottom to top through 1 hole on craft ring and down through center of craft ring, and then between strands of doubled yarn (*near the knot*). Draw yarn tight, drawing the knot snugly against the craft ring. Take needle, from top to bottom through opposite hole on craft ring, up through center of craft ring and then tie an overhand knot around the doubled strands (*near ring*). Attach another hanging strand, at right angle to the first hanging strand, in same manner. Form a hanging lp by grasping both hanging strands at center and tying an overhand knot.

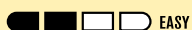
Best to wait until all Balloons are attached before tying hanging lp. This will allow you to adjust the final height of the Mobile and balance the Mobile with careful placement of the knot.

**Attach Balloons:** Cut long strand of A and thread onto needle. Exact length of strand depends on how low Balloon will hang. Beg with longer strand than needed and remember that strand will be doubled (*so the initial length should be twice as long as desired final length*). The height of Balloon can be adjusted as tied to the craft ring. Draw yarn through top of Balloon and draw through until both ends are even. Tie square knot. Thread 2 ends onto needle and insert, from bottom to top, through hole on craft ring (*this can be the same hole as 1 used for a hanging strand*). Pass needle down through center of ring and tie an overhand knot around the strands (*underneath the ring*). Trim any excess yarn. Rep in same manner to attach rem Balloons. Place an animal in each Basket.

34 yds #431 pumpkin

4 yds #420 cream

- Size 6/1.80mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Embroidery floss: 1 yd black
- Sewing thread: 12 inches
- Polyester fiberfill
- Fabric stiffener
- Large-eye sewing needle

## GAUGE

9 sc = 1 inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds.

Do not join or turn unless otherwise stated.

## MOUSIE

### HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With white, starting at top of Head, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*).

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** \*Sc in next st. 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (24 sc)



*Kids can always have a fun little friend around with these easy-to-take-along, pocket-size animal pals.*



**Rnd 5:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 6:** \*Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (28 sc)

**Rnds 7–11:** Sc in each st around. At end of rnd 11, stuff Head.

## BODY

**Rnd 12:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (21 sts)

**Rnd 13:** \*Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (14 sts)

**Rnd 14:** \*Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (21 sc)

**Rnd 15:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (28 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 17:** \*Sc in each of next 13 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (30 sc)

**Rnds 18–24:** Sc in each st around. At end of rnd 24, stuff Body.

**Rnd 25:** \*Sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 26:** \*Sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (16 sc)

**Rnds 27 & 28:** \*Sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. At end of last rnd, fasten off. (4 sc at end of last rnd)

## LEGS

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Starting at bottom of Legs, with white, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

**Rnd 2:** \*Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (9 sc)

**Rnds 3–5:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each st around, join with sl st in first sc. Leaving 10-inch tail, fasten off.



Stuff Legs, poking in small bits of stuffing with needle. Sew Legs to front of Body between rnds 23–25.

## ARMS

### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** Starting at bottom of Arms, with white, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

**Rnd 2:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (8 sc)

**Rnds 3–5:** Sc in each st around. Stuff Arms. Sew to sides of Body between rnds 15–17.

## TAIL

With white, ch 18, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 8 chs, hdc in each of next 5 chs. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Tail to back of Body.

## EARS

### Make 2.

**Rnds 1 & 2:** With orchid pink, rep rnds 1 and 2 of Head. (12 sc at end of last rnd)

**Rnd 3:** Rep rnd 3 of Head, join with sl st in first st. Fasten off. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Join white with sc in joining sl st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, \*sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. (24 sts)

Sew Ears to top of Head.

## MUZZLE

**Rnd 1:** With white, starting at tip, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

**Rnd 2:** \*Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (9 sc)

**Rnd 3:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (12 sc)

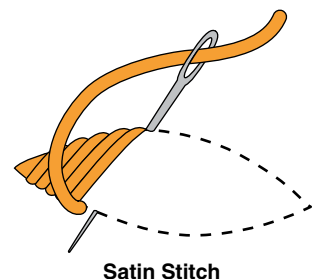
Stuff Muzzle. Sew to lower part of front of Head.

## WHISKERS

Cut sewing thread into 4 pieces, each approximately 3 inches long. Holding all 3-inch pieces tog, thread needle and run needle behind st at top of Muzzle. Knot strands tog twice. Saturate threads with fabric stiffener, separate strands and let dry. Trim Whiskers to desired length. Using black floss and **satin stitch** (see *illustration*), make a few sts over Whisker knots.

## EYES

Separate black floss into two 3-ply lengths. Using satin stitch, embroider Eyes above Muzzle.

### HEAD

**Rnds 1–11:** With natural, rep rnds 1–11 of Mousie Head.

### BODY

**Rnds 12–28:** With natural, rep rnds 12–28 of Mousie Body.

### LEGS

#### Make 2.

**Rnds 1–6:** With natural, rep rnds 1–6 of Mousie Legs. Stuff and sew to Body as for Mousie.

### ARMS

#### Make 2.

**Rnds 1–5:** With natural, rep rnds 1–5 of Mousie Arms. Stuff and sew to Body as for Mousie.

### MUZZLE

**Rnd 1:** With natural, starting at tip, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** \*Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (14 sc)

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Sc in each st around. Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off at end of rnd 5.

Stuff Muzzle. Sew to lower part of Head.

### EARS

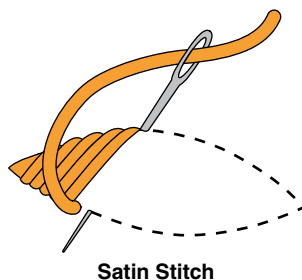
#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With fudge brown, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in each of next 3 chs, 3 dc in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, 2 dc in first ch, hdc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, **do not join**, turn. (17 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 8 sts, 3 hdc in next st, sc in each of next 8 sts, join with sl st in first st. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. Sew Ears to Head.

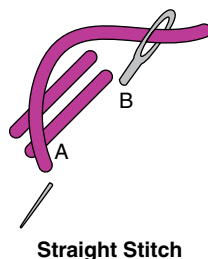
### FEATURES

Separate black floss into two 3-ply lengths. With 1 length, using **satin stitch** (see illustration), embroider Eyes above Muzzle.

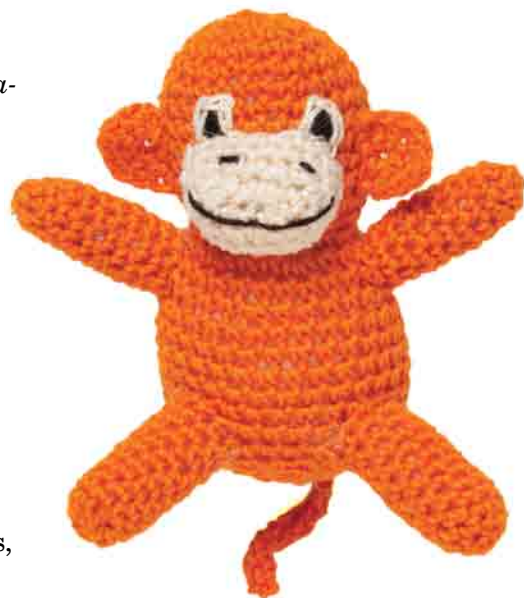

2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, working on opposite side of ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in each of next 3 chs. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** \*2 sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from \* around. (18 sc)

**Rnds 3 & 4:** Sc in each st around. Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off at end of rnd 4.

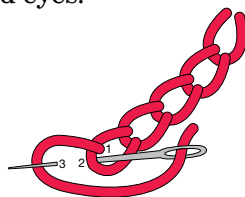
Stuff Muzzle, sew to front of Head.

## FEATURES

With 3-ply length of black floss, using **satin stitch** (see *illustration*), embroider Eyes above Muzzle.

**Rnd 2:** \*Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (9 sc)

**Rnds 3–10:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 11:** Sc in each st around, join with sl st in first st. Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff Legs and sew to front of Body.

## ARMS

**Make 2.**

**Rnd 1:** With pumpkin, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

**Rnd 2:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (8 sc)

**Rnds 3–9:** Sc in each st around.

**Rnd 10:** Sc in each st around, join in first st. Leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. Stuff Arms and sew to sides of Body.

## TAIL

With pumpkin, ch 15, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Tail to back of Body. **CW**

right Lobe of heart to the 2 sk sts of row 33 at heart center between Lobes, dc dec in sk center sts, work 84 sc evenly sp around rem of heart to tip, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (172 sts)

**Rnd 2:** Join white in center sc of 3-sc group at tip of heart tip on previous rnd, ch 1, 2 sc in same st, sk next sc, [ch 1, 2 sc in next st, sk next sc] around, ending with ch 1, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (172 sc)

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**Rnd 3:** Join black in both lps of first sk sc of white border, work **backward sl st** (see *Special Stitch*) around heart, after last ch-4 is made, draw last lp through same st as beg joining of black, join to first ch of beg ch-4 of rnd. Fasten off. (86 backward sl sts)

## NAPKIN HOLDER

**Row 2:** Ch 1, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, turn. (40 sts)

**Rows 3–17:** Rep row 2. At the end of row 17, fasten off. (40 sts)  
Fold Napkin Holder RS tog and with 1 strand of dark red and needle, sew short ends tog to create center back seam. Fold Napkin Holder in half with seam at center back and sew bottom edges of holder tog, turn RS out.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1: Join** (see *Pattern Notes*) white to first st of row 17 at center back seam, ch 1, 2 sc in same sp, ch 1, [sk next st, 2 sc in next st, ch 1] around, join in beg sc. (40 sc)

**Row 6:** Ch 3, [sc in next st, dc in next st] twice, (sc, dc, sc) in next st, turn. (8 sts)

**Rows 7–11:** Ch 3, [sc in dc, dc in sc] across, turn. (8 sts)

## SLEEVE

**Rows 3–11:** Ch 1, sc in first 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, ending with sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

**Row 12:** Ch 1, sc in each sc, sc in each ch-1 sp across. Fasten off.

## RIGHT FRONT EDGING

## NECK YOKE EDGING

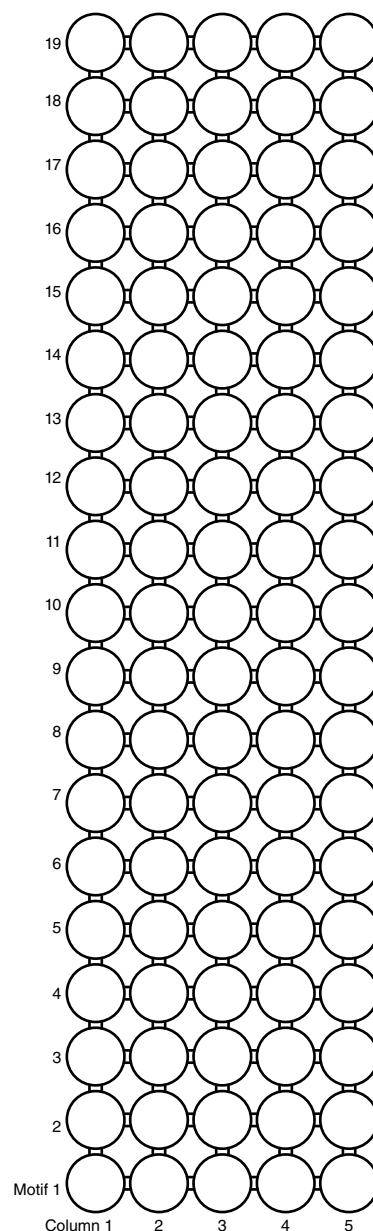

**Rnd 24:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 7 times, ch 4, shell in next shell, ch 3, V-st in next V-st, ch 3\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (20 shells, 10 V-sts, 80 sc, 90 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 25:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 6 times, ch 4, shell in next shell, ch 4, shell in next V-st, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (30 shells, 70 sc, 60 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 26:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 5 times, ch 4, shell in next shell, ch 4, double shell in next shell, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (20 shells, 10 double shells, 60 sc, 50 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 27:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, [ch 4, shell in next shell] twice, ch 2 (center of fan to button pieces),

shell in next shell, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (40 shells, 50 sc, 40 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 28:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times, [ch 4, shell in next shell] twice, ch 2, dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, shell in next shell, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (40 shells, 10 dc, 40 sc, 30 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 29:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, [ch 4, shell in next shell] twice, ch 3, V-st in next single dc between shells, ch 3, shell in next shell, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (40 shells, 10 V-sts, 30 sc, 20 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 30:** Beg shell in first shell, \*ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 4, shell in next shell] twice, ch 4, shell in next V-st, ch 4, shell in next shell, ch 4\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (50 shells, 20 sc, 10 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 31:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 4, sc in first ch of ch-4, 2 dc) in same ch-3 sp, \*ch 4, sc in rem ch-3 sp, ch 4, [(2 dc, ch 4, sc in first ch of ch-4, 2 dc) in ch-3 sp of next shell, ch 3, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in ch-4 sp, ch 3] 4 times\*\*, (2 dc, ch 4, sc in first ch of ch-4, 2 dc) in ch-3 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (160 dc, 10 sc, 64 sl sts)

## HEART

### Make 1 each Heart color.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With Heart color, ch 2, 10 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in beg sc. (10 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, [2 sc in next sc,



sc in next sc] 5 times, join in beg sc. (15 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times, join in beg sc. (20 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, hdc in next sc, 3 dc in next sc (*center bottom*), hdc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, hdc in next sc, 5 dc in next sc (*first lobe*), hdc in next sc, sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, 5 dc in next sc (*2nd lobe*), hdc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, join in beg sc. (30 sts)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 sts, 3 sc in next st (*center bottom*), sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 4 times (*first lobe*), sl st in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next

st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 4 times (*2nd lobe*), join in beg sc. Fasten off. (42 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Join white with sl st in center sl st between lobes, ch 3, sk next sl st, sl st in next sc, [ch 3, sk next sc, sl st in next sc] 9 times, [ch 3, sl st in next sc] twice, [ch 3, sk next sc, sl st in next sc] 9 times, ch 3, sk next sl st, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## SHAMROCK

### Make 10.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With myrtle green, ch 2, join in first ch of ch-2, (ch 10, sl st in same ch as previous sl st) 3 times. (3 ch-10 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, (sc, hdc, dc, 5 tr, dc, hdc, dc, 5 tr, dc, hdc, sc) in each ch-10 sp around, join in beg sc.

## Stem

**Row 3:** Now working in rows, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in each of next 6 chs, sl st in joining of rnd 2. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

With length of matching crochet cotton, sew 1 button to center back of each Heart and each Shamrock.

Button Hearts or Shamrocks to Doily in ch-2 sp between shells at center of fan on rnd 27. Leave Doily plain between holidays. **CW**

next 2 chs, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (21 shells)

**Row 2: Ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in first ch-1 sp, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-1 sp, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn. (20 ch-5 sps, 2 ch-2 sps)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* across, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn. (21 ch-5 sps)

**Row 4:** Ch 5, sc in first ch-5 sp, \*ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* across to last ch-5 sp, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn. (20 ch-5 sps, 2 ch-2 sps)

**Row 5:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, \*shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* across, sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn. (21 shells)

**Rows 6–88:** [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 21 times, ending last rep with row 4.

**Row 89:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, \*(2 sc, curl—see *Special Stitches*, 2 sc) in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* across, 3 sc in last ch-5 sp. Fasten off. (20 curls)

### 2ND SIDE

**Row 1:** With RS facing and working in rem lps across opposite side of beg ch, join yarn with sc in first ch, sk next 2 chs, shell in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, \*sk next 2 chs, shell in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (21 shells)

**Rows 2–89:** Rep rows 2–89 of First Side. At end of last row, fasten off and weave in ends.

### FINISHING

Block to finished size. **CW**

**Row 44:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 42 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 7 sts, change color to A, hdc in next st, change color to B, hdc in each of next 7 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 43 sts, turn.

**Row 45:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 43 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 44 sts, turn.

**Row 46:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 44 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next

3 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of next 5 sts, change color to B, hdc in each of next 3 sts, change color to A, hdc in each of last 45 sts, turn.



**Rows 47–51:** Rep rows 11–15.

**Rows 52–65:** Rep rows 2–15.

**Rows 66–76:** Rep rows 2–12. At the end of row 12, fasten off.

### EDGING

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join A with sc in edge of Blanket, sc evenly sp around outer edge, working 3 sc in each corner, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, working 3 sc in each corner, join in first sc.

**Rnd 3: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, work 3 dc in each corner, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 4:** Rep rnd 3. Fasten off.

**Rnd 5:** Work **surface sl st** (see *Special Stitch*) around edge. Fasten off. **CW**

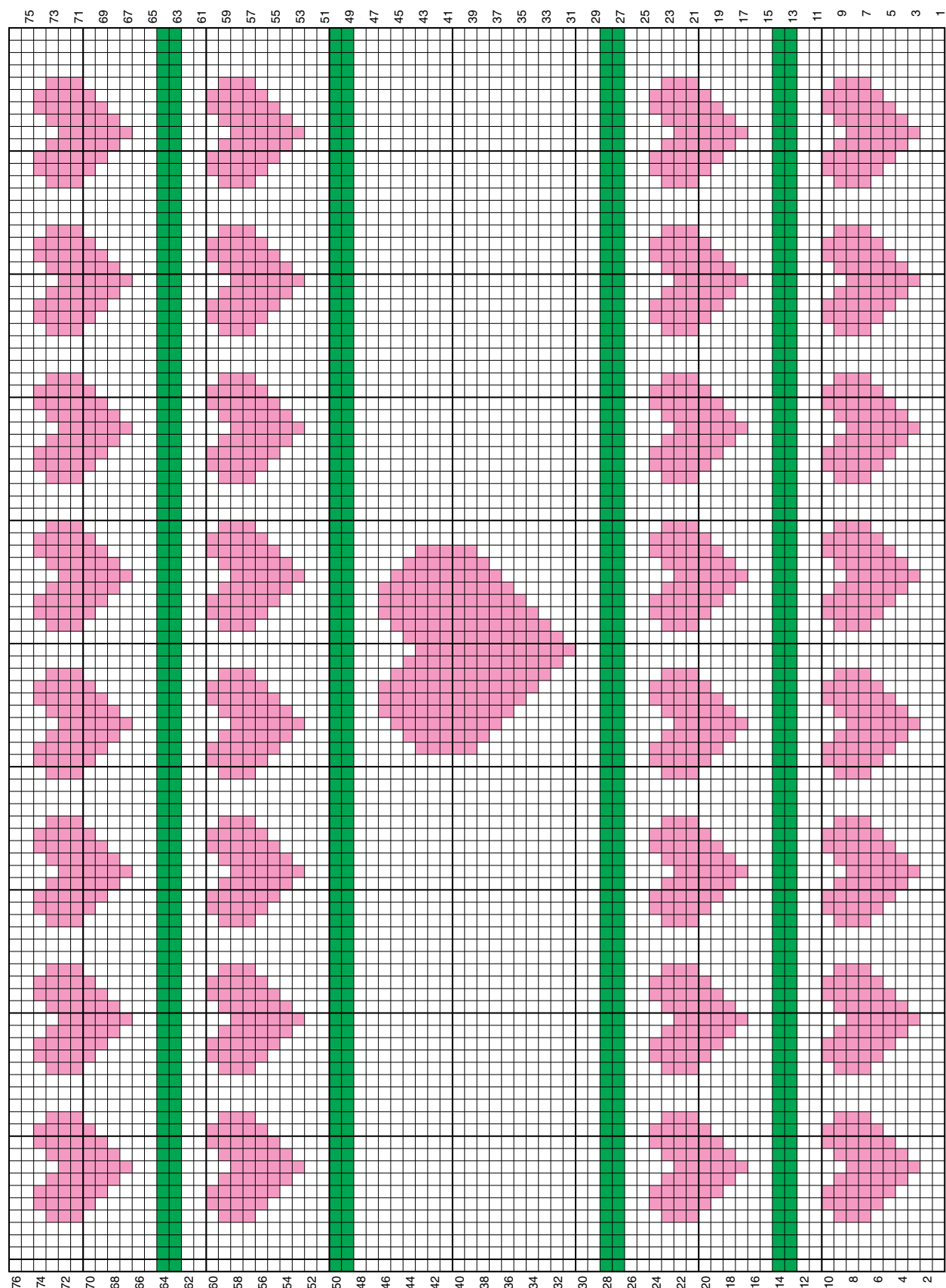

### FRONT

#### Make 2.

**Foundation row:** With A, ch 18 [22, 24, 26], sc in 2nd ch from hook (*beg sk ch counts as beg ch-1*), \*ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (9 [11, 12, 13] sc, 9 [11, 12, 13] ch-1 sps)

**Next rows:** Work in Seed st pattern until piece measures 6 [6½, 7, 7½] inches from beg. Place marker in first st of first Front and in last st of 2nd Front.

**Next rows:** Work in Seed st pattern until piece measures 9 [10, 11, 12] inches from beg. At end of last row, turn, do not fasten off.

### Shape Neck

**Row 1 (dec):** Sl st in first sc, sl st in next ch-1 sp, [sl st in next sc, sl st in next ch-1] 1 [1, 2, 2] time(s), ch 1, \*sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc, rep from \* across to beg ch-1 sp, sc in beg ch-1, turn. (7 [9, 9, 10] sc, 7 [9, 9, 10] ch-1 sps)

**Row 2 (dec):** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last 2 [2, 2, 3] sc, leaving rem 2 [2, 2, 3] sc and 2 [2, 2, 3] ch-1 sps unworked, turn. (5 [7, 7, 7] sc, 5 [7, 7, 7] ch-1 sps)

**Next rows:** Work even in Seed st pattern until piece measures same as Back. At end of last row, fasten off.

### SLEEVES

#### Make 2.

**Foundation row:** With A, ch 28 [30, 34, 36], sc in 2nd ch from hook (*beg sk ch counts as beg ch-1*), \*ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn.

(14 [15, 17, 18] sc, 14 [15, 17, 18] ch-1 sps)

**Rows 1–3:** Work in Seed st pattern for 3 rows.

**Row 4 (inc):** Ch 2 (*inc*), sk first sc, \*sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc, rep from \* across to beg ch-1 sp, 2 sc in beg ch-1 sp (*inc*), turn. (15 [16, 18, 19] sc, 15 [16, 18, 19] ch-1 sps)

**Row 5:** Ch 2, sk first 2 sc, \*sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc, rep from \* across to beg ch-2, 2 sc in beg ch-2, turn.

**Rows 6–10 [6–10, 6–11, 6–11]:** Rep row 5.

**Row 11 [11, 12, 12] (inc):** Ch 1, sc in first sc (*inc*), \*ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* across to last sc, ch 1, sk last sc, (sc, ch 1, sc) in beg ch-2 sp (*inc*), turn. (16 [17, 19, 20] sc, 16 [17, 19, 20] ch-1 sps)

**Rows 12–17 [12–17, 13–19, 13–19]:** Work in Seed st pattern for 6 [6, 7, 7] rows.

**Next rows:** Rep rows 4–17 [4–17, 4–19, 4–19] once. (18 [19, 21, 22] sc, 18 [19, 21, 22] ch-1 sps)

### Size 6 Months Only

**Next rows:** Work even in Seed st pattern until piece measures 8 inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

### Sizes 12 Months, 18 Months & 24 Months only

**Next row:** Rep row 4. ([20, 22, 23] sc, [20, 22, 23] ch-1 sps)

**Next rows:** Rep row 5 until piece measures [9, 10, 11] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

### ASSEMBLY

Block all pieces to schematic measurements. Fronts are reversible. Before seaming, arrange Fronts so that 1 is the mirror image of the other, and the Sleeve placement markers are on the outer edges.



Sew shoulder seams. Sew tops of Sleeves between markers. Sew side and Sleeve seams.

### HOOD

**Row 1 (RS):** With RS facing, join A with sl st in right front neck edge, ch 1, work 42 [46, 50, 54] sc evenly sp across to left front neck edge, turn.

**Row 2 (inc):** Ch 1, [sc in each of next 2 [2, 2, 2] sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 [2, 3, 3] sc, 2 sc in next sc] 7 times, sc in each of last 0 [4, 8, 12] sts, turn. (56 [60, 64, 68] sc)

**Row 3 (set-up row for Seed st pattern):** Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in next sc, \*ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, rep from \* across, turn. (28 [30, 32, 34] sc and 28 [30, 32, 34] ch-1 sps)

**Next rows:** Work even in Seed st pattern until Hood measures 8½ [8½, 9, 10] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

Fold last row in half and sew halves tog for top seam. Block Hood lightly, if desired.

### FINISHING

Place 3 [3, 4, 4] markers evenly sp up right front for button lp placement, placing first marker about 2 [2½, 2, 2½] inches below neck edge, 2nd marker about 2 [2½, 2, 2½] inches above lower edge and rem 1 [1, 2, 2] marker(s) evenly sp between the first 2 markers.



## BODY EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join C with sl st in lower edge at side seam, working across lower edge, ch 1, sc in same sp as join, work sc evenly sp across lower edge to lower front corner, work 3 sc in corner, work sc evenly sp up Front edge, around Hood edge, and down other Front edge to lower front corner, work 3 sc in corner, work sc evenly sp across rem lower edge, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** With RS facing, join B with sc in first sc of rnd 1, work sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in center sc of each 3-sc corner; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** With RS facing, join C with sl st in last sc of rnd 2, ch 1, [reverse sc (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc around to next button lp marker, ch 2] 3 times, reverse sc in each rem sc around, join with sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

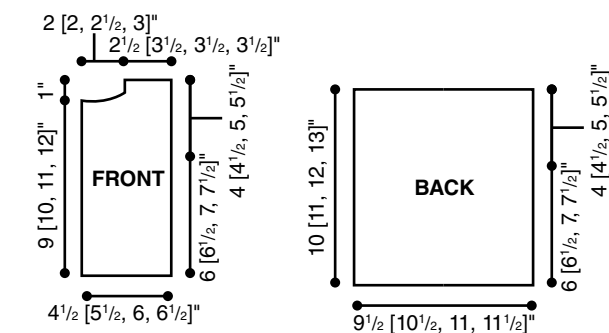
## SLEEVE EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join C with sl st in lower edge of sleeve seam, ch 1, sc in same sp as join, work sc evenly sp around sleeve edge, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

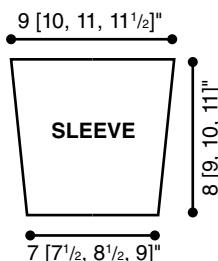
**Rnd 2:** With RS facing, join B with sc in first sc of rnd 1, work sc in each sc around, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** With RS facing, join C with sl st in last sc of rnd 2, ch 1, reverse sc in each sc around, join with sl st in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends. **CW**



**Note:** Make 2, reverse 1 during assembly
