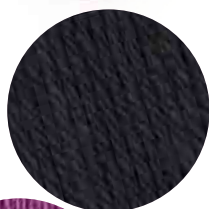
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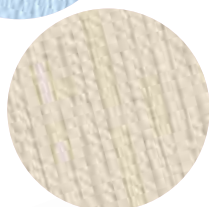

## SKILL LEVEL

## FINISHED SIZE

18 inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Size 10 crochet cotton:  
150 yds each white,  
peach and turquoise
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet  
hook or size needed to  
obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



## GAUGE

Flower = 1½ inches in diameter;  
rnds 1–8 = 3 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet

and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 at beginning of round counts as first double treble crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

### Double treble cluster (dtr cl):

\*Yo hook 3 times, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, (yo, draw through 2 lps on hook) 3 times, rep from \* once, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

### 2-double crochet cluster

(2-dc cl): [Yo, insert hook in next sp, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

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# 3-Ring Circle Necklace

## SKILL LEVEL

■ □ □ □ BEGINNER

## FINISHED SIZES

**Silver necklace:** 19 inches plus 2 inches for 3-ring group

**Gold necklace:** 21 inches plus 2 inches for 3-ring group

**Red necklace:** 22 inches plus 2 inches for 3-ring group

## MATERIALS

- Kreinik Metallics Medium #16 Braid (11 yds per spool):
  - 1 spool each #001HL silver high lustre, #002HL gold high lustre and #061 ruby
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook
- Large-eye sewing needle
- Metal rings:
  - 3 each 1 inch in diameter, 1½ inches in diameter and 2 inches in diameter
- Steam iron
- Pressing cloth

## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

# Sun Sparkler

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ EASY

## FINISHED SIZE

5½ inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Kreinik Metallics Medium #16 Braid (11 yds per spool):  
3 spools #029L dyelectric blue
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Recycled CDs: 2
- Small safety pin

## GAUGE

Rnds 1 and 2 = 1½ inches in diameter

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Place safety pin on first chain space of indicated round as marker. Move marker as work progresses as indicated.

## SPARKLER

### FIRST MOTIF

**Rnd 1:** Ch 13 loosely, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 13th ch from hook to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same ch as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each of next 12 chs, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (26 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] around, join in beg sc. (39 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Ch 5, sk next 2 sc, sl st in next sc] 12 times, **do not join**. (12 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 6, sl st in next ch-5 sp, **place safety pin in first ch-6 sp** (see *Pattern Notes*), [ch 6, sl st in next ch-5 sp] 11 times.

**Rnd 5:** Ch 7, sl st in next ch-6 sp, move safety pin to first ch-7 sp, [ch 7, sl st in next ch-6 sp] 11 times.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 8, sl st in next ch-7 sp, move safety pin to first ch-8 sp, [ch 8, sl st in next ch-7 sp] 11 times.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 9, sl st in next ch-8 sp, move safety pin to first ch-9

sp, [ch 9, sl st in next ch-8 sp] 11 times, ch 9, sl st in first ch of beg ch-9 sp. Fasten off. (13 ch-9 sps)

### 2ND MOTIF

**Rnd 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch of rnd 1 of First Motif, join braid in any ch, ch 3, dc in same ch as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each of next 12 chs, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (26 dc)

**Rnds 2–7:** Rep rnds 2–7 of First Motif.

# Marina Cardigan

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

## FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit 32–34-inch bust (*small*); changes for 36–38-inch bust (*medium*), 40–42-inch bust (*large*), 44–46-inch bust (*X-large*), 48–50-inch bust (*2X-large*) and 52–54-inch bust (*3X-large*) are in [ ].

## FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

**Bust:** 35 [39, 43, 47, 51, 55] inches

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Bamboo size 3 crochet viscose from bamboo (150 yds per ball):  
8 [9, 10, 10, 12, 13] balls #853 marine blue
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Straight pins

## GAUGE

[Shell, picot] twice = 3 inches;  
7 shell rows = 4 inches; 5 sc rows = 1 inch; 8 sc = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated st.

## Beginning shell (beg shell):

(Ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated st.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

## CARDIGAN

### BACK

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 79 [86, 93, 93, 100, 100], **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in 6th ch from hook (*beg 5 sk chs count as first dc, sk 2 chs*), **[picot]** (see *Special Stitches*), sk next 6 chs, shell in next ch] across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn. (11 [12, 13, 13, 14, 14] shells, 10 [11, 12, 12, 13, 13] picots, 2 dc)

**Row 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, [picot, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell] across, ending with dc in last dc, turn. (11 [12, 13, 13, 14, 14] shells, 10 [11, 12, 12, 13, 13] picots, 2 dc)

**Rows 3–35 [3–35, 3–37, 3–37, 3–37, 3–37]:** Rep row 2.

### LEFT FRONT PANEL

**Row 36 [36, 38, 38, 38, 38]:** Ch 3, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, [picot, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell] 2 [2, 3, 3, 3, 3] times, dc in next ch-2 sp of next shell, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 4, 4] shells, 2 [2, 3, 3, 3, 3] picots, 2 dc)

**Rows 37–70 [37–70, 39–74, 39–74, 39–74, 39–74]:** Rep row 36 [36, 38, 38, 38, 38]. At the end of last row, fasten off.

### RIGHT FRONT PANEL

**Row 36 [36, 38, 38, 38, 38]:** Sk next 3 [4, 3, 3, 4, 4] shells of last row of Back for neckline, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) yarn in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 3, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, [picot, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell] 2 [2, 3, 3, 3, 3] times, dc in last dc, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 4, 4] shells, 2 [2, 3, 3, 3, 3] picots, 2 dc)

**Rows 37–70 [37–70, 39–74, 39–74, 39–74, 39–74]:** Rep row 36 [36, 38, 38, 38, 38]. At the end of last row, fasten off.

### UNDERARM SIDE PANEL

#### Make 2.

**Row 1 (RS):** Working from bottom edge toward underarm, join yarn at bottom Front Panel edge, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, work 62 [59, 64, 61, 58, 54] sc evenly sp, turn. (63 [60, 65, 62, 59, 55] sc)

**Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–14 [3–24, 3–25, 3–39, 3–46, 3–56]:** Rep row 2. At end of last row, leaving 24-inch length, fasten off.

Position row 14 [24, 25, 39, 46, 56] of Underarm Side Panel along Back of Cardigan and matching sts, pin in place with straight pins. Thread yarn needle with rem length and sew Underarm Side Panel to Back.

# Diamond Filet Tablecloth

## SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

## FINISHED SIZE

47 inches square

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet Jumbo size 10 crochet cotton (2,730 yds per ball):  
1 ball #226 natural
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



## GAUGE

[Tr, ch 3] 4 times = 1½ inches;  
9 tr = 1 inch; 5 tr rnds = 2 inches  
**Square:** 15 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Filet squares are crocheted from center outward in rounds. Round 1 establishes right side of Square.

Tablecloth can be made to fit

larger table by adding needed squares and purchasing enough crochet cotton.

Each square requires 250 yards crochet cotton.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 3, dc) in tr.

**Corner V-stitch (corner V-st):** (Dc, ch 3) 3 times and dc in corner st.

**Beginning block (beg block):** Ch 4, tr in each of next 4 tr  
**OR** ch 4, 3 tr in next ch sp, tr in next st.

**Block:** Tr in each of next 5 tr  
**OR** tr in next tr, 3 tr in next ch sp, tr in next tr.

**Corner block:** 3 tr in next ch-7 sp, (tr, ch 7, tr) in 4th ch of same ch-7, 3 tr in same ch-7 sp.

**Space (sp):** Ch 3, sk next 3 sts or chs.

**Corner space (corner sp):** Sp, (tr, ch 7, tr) in 4th ch of corner ch-7 sp, sp.

**Beginning space (beg sp):** Ch 7 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next 3 sts.

## TABLECLOTH

### SQUARE

#### Make 9.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 10, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), 4 tr in ring (*beg block*), (ch 7—*corner ch sp*, 5 tr in ring—*block*) 3 times,

ch 7 (*corner ch sp*), join in 4th ch of beg ch-4, **do not turn**. (4 *blocks*, 4 *corner ch-7 sps*)

**Rnd 2: Beg block** (see *Special Stitches*), \***corner block** (see *Special Stitches*)\*, **block** (see *Special Stitches*), rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (4 *blocks*, 4 *corner blocks*)

**Rnd 3:** Beg block, \***sp** (see *Special Stitches*), tr in next st, **corner sp** (see *Special Stitches*), tr in next st, sp\*\*, **block**, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (4 *blocks*, 8 *sps*, 4 *corner sps*, 8 *tr*)

**Rnd 4: Beg sp** (see *Special Stitches*), tr in next st, \*sp, **block**, **corner block**, **block**, sp\*\*, tr in next st, sp, tr in next st, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (8 *blocks*, 4 *corner blocks*, 12 *sps*, 8 *tr*)

**Rnd 5:** Beg sp, [tr in next st, sp] twice, \***block**, **corner block**, **block**\*\*, [sp, tr in next st] 4 times, sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, sp, tr in next st, sp, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (8 *blocks*, 4 *corner blocks*, 20 *sps*, 16 *tr*)

**Rnd 6:** Beg sp, tr in next st, [sp, tr in next st] 4 times, \***corner sp**\*\*, tr in next st, [sp, tr in next st] 9 times, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, [sp, tr in next tr] 4 times, sp, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (40 *tr*, 36 *sps*, 4 *corner sps*)

# Fun Flower Belt

## SKILL LEVEL



## FINISHED SIZE

Approximately 54 inches long, excluding Ties

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein):  
4 oz #334 buff  
2 oz #313 Aran  
1 oz each #322 pale yellow, #722 pretty 'n pink and #363 pale green
- Sizes E/4/3.5mm and G/6/4mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread
- 6mm amber beads: 13



## GAUGE

**Size G hook:** Sc, sk 2 chs, 6 tr, sk 2 chs = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Each increase or decrease in length requires 12 chains for each repeat to add or decrease approximately 3½ inches to Belt. Example: chain 100, 112, 124, 136, 148, 160 and always increase or decrease circles in multiples of 2 to end with an odd number.

## SPECIAL STITCH

### 3-treble cluster (3-tr cl):

\*Yo hook twice, insert hook in ring, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps] twice, rep from \* twice, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

## BELT

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size G hook and buff, ch 160 (see *Pattern Notes*), 5 tr in 4th ch from hook (beg 3 sk chs count as first tr), sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, [6 tr in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 2 chs] across to last ch, work 12 tr in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, [sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, 6 tr in next ch] across, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first tr. Fasten off. (27 tr circles)

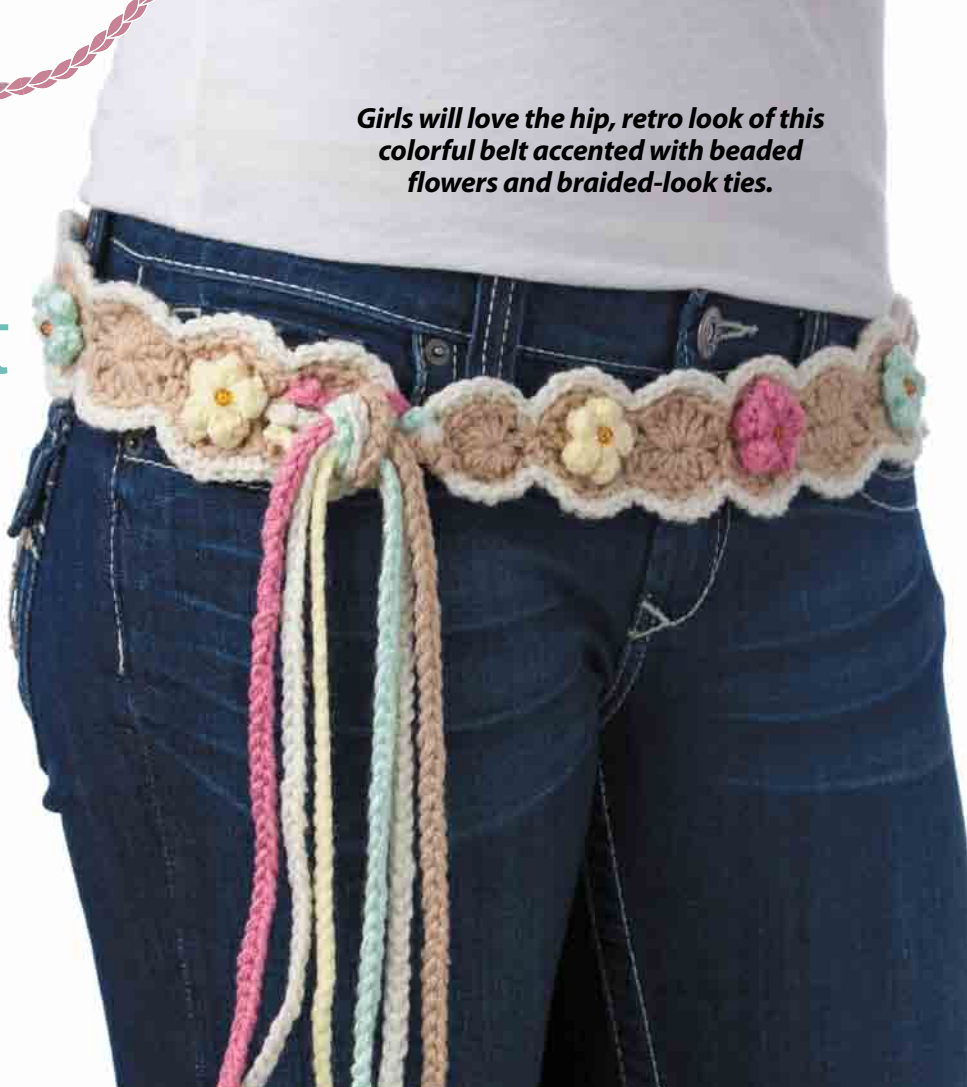
## FLOWERS

**Make 5 pale yellow and 4 each pretty 'n pink and pale green.**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size E hook, leaving 4-inch length of yarn at beg, ch 3, join to form a ring, (ch 3, **3-tr cl**—see *Special Stitch*, ch 3, sl st) 5 times in ring, leaving 4-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

With RS of first section of Belt facing, holding rem lengths of yarn on RS of pale yellow Flower, place RS of Flower on center of 2nd tr circle. Pass ends through to WS of Belt and knot to secure, [sk next tr circle, attach pale green Flower to next tr circle, sk next tr circle, attach pretty 'n pink Flower to next tr circle, sk next tr circle, attach pale yellow Flower to next tr





circle] 3 times. Sew amber bead to the center of each Flower.

### BELT EDGING

**Rnd 2:** With size G hook, working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) only with Flowers facing, join Aran with sc in top of beg tr of Belt, sc in next tr, 2 sc in each of next 2 tr, sc in each of next 2 tr, sl st tightly in next sc, \*sc in each of next 2 tr, 2 sc in each of next 2 tr, sc in each of next 2 tr, sl st tightly in next sc\*, rep from \* to \* across to end circle of 12 tr, sc in each of next 2 tr, 2 sc in each of next 2 tr, sc in each of next 4 tr, 2 sc in each of next 2 tr, sc in each of next 2 tr, sl st tightly in next sc, rep from \* to \* across 2nd edge, ending last rep with sc in each of next 2 tr, 2 sc in each of next 2 tr, sc in each of next 2 tr, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

### TIES

**Row 1:** With size G hook and 2 strands of Aran held tog and RS of Belt facing, join yarn in center back lp of rnd 2 of Belt Edging on left side, ch 50, leaving 2-inch length, fasten off. Rep with pale green 1 st to left of Aran Tie, and with buff to the right of Aran Tie. On opposite end of Belt with RS facing, attach Aran yarn to center st between first and 2nd circles, ch 50, and leaving 2-inch length, fasten off. Rep with pale yellow in st to left of Aran Tie, and with pretty 'n pink in st to right of Aran Tie.

### FINISHING

With care, steam press Belt using care not to flatten Flowers. Place Belt around body slung a bit lower on the hip area. Tie all 6 Ties tog in loose knot. Tr circles on each end will overlap each other. **CW**

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## Travel Buddy Blankie

### SKILL LEVEL



### FINISHED SIZE

18½ inches square

### MATERIALS

- Red Heart With Love medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/370 yds/198g per skein):  
1 skein #1201 daffodil  
10 yds #1252 mango  
1 yd #1012 black
- Size G/6/4mm and J/10/6mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Fiberfill
- Tapestry needle



### GAUGE

With J hook: 3 sts = 1 inch;  
10 rows = 4 inches

### PATTERN NOTES

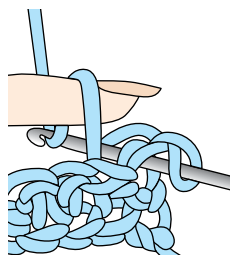
Weave in ends as work progresses.

Join rounds with slip stitch unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCHES

**Picot:** Ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook.

**Loop stitch (lp st):** Insert hook in next st, wind yarn around index finger from back to front, draw up yarn to 2-inch length, insert hook on underside of lp created on finger and draw through st on hook, yo, draw through both lps on hook.

## BLANKIE

### DUCK HEAD SIDE

**Make 2.**

**Row 1:** Beg at bottom neck edge with size G hook and daffodil, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (9 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (11 sc)

**Row 3:** Rep row 2. (13 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. (13 sc)

**Rows 5 & 6:** Rep row 4.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, **sc dec** in last 2 sc, turn. (11 sc)

**Row 8:** Rep row 4. (11 sc)

**Row 9:** Rep row 7. (9 sc)

**Row 10:** Rep row 4. (9 sc)

**Rows 11 & 12:** Rep row 7. Fasten off at end of last row. (5 sc)

### BEAK

**Rnd 1:** With size G hook and mango, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (5 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (10 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, \*2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc. (15 sc)

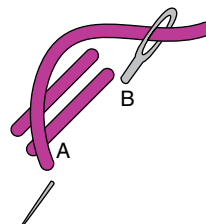
**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, \*2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc, **do not fasten off**. (20 sc)

### BEAK ASSEMBLY

Fold Beak in half forming a half circle. Ch 1, working through both thicknesses, work 9 sl sts evenly sp across outer curve, join in fold on opposite side of Beak. Leaving 18-inch tail, fasten off. Sew fold of Beak to 1 Duck Head Side.

### EYES

With black, work 3 **straight stitches** (see *illustration*) twice above Beak as shown in photo.



Straight Stitch



## DUCK HEAD FINISHING

With RS facing out, hold Duck Head Sides tog, working through both thicknesses with size G hook, join daffodil in rem lp of beg ch, work 9 sc along bottom neck edges, work 15 sc evenly sp across to center top of Duck Head Sides, **lp st** (see *Special Stitches*) in each of next 3 sts, work 15 sc evenly sp across rem side of Duck Head Sides, stuff with fiberfill as firm as desired to form rounded head shape before closing, join in first sc. Fasten off daffodil.

Use hook to pull each lp from each lp st to front of Duck Head Sides, and tie all 3 lps tog to secure on front.

## FIRST WING

### Front/Back

#### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With size G hook and daffodil, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in last 2 sc, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 6:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sk last sc, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 3 sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, turn. (4 sc)

#### Front only

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sc, sl st in next sc. Fasten off. (2 sts)

#### Back only

**Row 8:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sc, sl st in next sc, turn. (2 sts)

Fasten off daffodil. (29 sc)

### BLANKIE

**Row 1:** With size J hook and daffodil, ch 51, sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, \*sc in next ch, dc in next ch, rep from \* across, turn. (50 sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, \*sc in next dc, dc in next sc, rep from \* across, turn. (50 sts)

**Rows 3–22:** Rep row 2. (50 sts)

**Row 23:** Ch 1, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] 10 times, sc in next dc, with WS of assembled Duck Head facing, hold straight edge of bottom of Duck Head tog with next 8 sts of row 22 of Blankie, working through both thicknesses, [dc in next st, sc in next st] 4 times, [dc in next st, sc in next st] 10 times, dc in last st, turn. (50 sts)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice, sc in each of next 12 sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, sc in each of last 12 sts, join in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of first sc. (54 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st around. **Do not join.** Place marker in first st.

***Note:** From this point on, do not join rnds unless otherwise stated. Move marker as work progresses.*

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 8:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around. (72 sc)

**Rnds 9–11:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 12:** \*Sc in each of next 4 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (60 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 14:** \*Sc in each of next 8 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (54 sc)

**Rnd 15:** \*Sc in each of next 7 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, rep from \* around. (48 sc)

**Row 16:** Now working in rows, sc in each of next 40 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

**Row 17:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, [sc in each of next 6 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 6 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, turn. (34 sc)

**Row 18:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

#### FLAP

**Row 19:** Sl st in each of first 2 sts, ch 1, sc in each of next 8 sts, turn. (8 sc)

**Rows 20–29:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 30:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 31:** Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends. (4 sc)

#### BAG LINING

With A, rep rows 1–5 of Body. Leaving long tail, sew Lining in bottom of Bag.

#### HANDLE

##### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With A, leaving long tail, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each rem ch across, turn. (4 sc)

**Rows 2 & 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, ch 2, join in first sc to form circle.

**Rnd 5:** Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and each rem st and ch around. (6 sc)

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, ch 66, dc in 4th ch from hook (*beg 3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each of next 6 chs, **changing color** (*see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to B in last dc, [dc in each of next 8 chs, changing color to A in last dc, dc in each of next 8 chs, changing color to B in last dc] across to last 8 chs, dc in each of last 8 chs, turn. (32 *white dc*, 32 *black dc*)

**Rows 2 & 3:** Following chart for color changes, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each st across, turn. (64 *dc*)

**Row 4:** Following chart for color changes, **ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in each st across, turn. (64 *hdc*)

**Rows 5–16:** Following chart for color and st changes, work rows 5–16.

**Rows 17–32:** Following chart for color and st changes, rep rows 1–16. At the end of row 32, do not fasten off A, turn.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work 63 sc evenly sp across each edge and 3 sc in each corner st, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off. (264 *sc*)

Fasten off. (84 *V-sts*, 4 *corner V-sts*)

## FIRST POCKET

**Row 1 (RS):** Join C in ch-2 sp of corner V-st located at end of row 1 of Checkerboard, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sc in ch-1 sp

**Note:** When pinned area is reached on Edging, work through both thicknesses to join Toe Strap to Flip-Flop.

**Rnd 1:** Using E hook, attach A to top of first sc of row 27 of Flip-Flop with Toe Strap, ch 1, sc in each sc of row 27, working down right edge of Flip-Flop, work 27 sc evenly sp across ends of rows 27–1, working in rem lps on opposite side of row 1, work 6 sc across, work 27 sc evenly sp across ends of rows 1–27, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. Fasten off A. (64 sc)

### PURSE HANDLE

With size E hook and B, ch 25, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across to last ch, (sc, ch 1, 2 sc, ch 1, sc) in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each rem ch across to first ch, (sc, ch 1, 2 sc, ch 1) in same ch as first sc, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off B. (52 sc)

### PURSE HANDLE ASSEMBLY

Pin 1 short end of Handle to center top of rem Flip-Flop. Pin opposite short end of Handle to center bottom of same Flip-Flop.

### BOTTOM FLIP-FLOP EDGING

**Note:** When pinned area is reached on Edging, work Purse Handle to Flip-Flop.

**Rnd 1:** Rep rnd 1 of Top Flip-Flop Edging. **Do not fasten off.**

**Rnd 1:** With closed zipper facing you and beg at bottom zipper stop, insert size 3 hook into right zipper tape ¼ inch from top edge, with B, ch 1, sc in same sp, ch 1, \*[sc, ch 1] ½ inch to left of last sc made, rep from \* to work 20 sc along right side of zipper tape, turn work to right, ch 1, work 1 sc in same sp as last sc at top end of zipper (corner), ch 1, [sc, ch 1] 4 times across to opposite corner of zipper tape, ch 1, turn work to right and work sc in same sp as last sc (corner), [sc, ch 1] 19 times across left side of zipper tape to bottom left corner, turn work to right, ch 1, work 1 sc in same sp as last sc (corner), [sc, ch 1] twice across bottom to zipper, work 1 sc in same sp as first sc of rnd (corner), ch 1, turn work to right, join in top of first sc of rnd. Fasten off B. (48 sc)

### GUSSET

**Row 1:** With RS facing, with E hook, join B in first sc of Zipper Edging, ch 1, work 5 sc evenly sp across end of Zipper Edging, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (5 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–45:** Rep row 2. At end of last row, **do not fasten off.**

### GUSSET ASSEMBLY

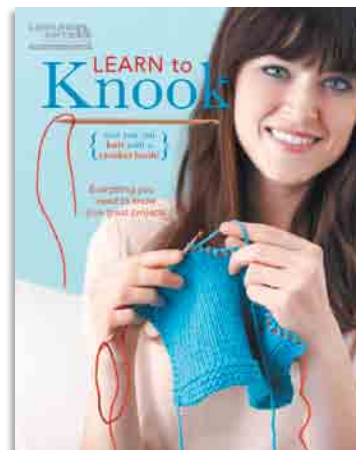

**Size 3 hook:** Medium Flower and Small Pansy: Rnds 1–4 = 1¼ inches

### PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

### LARGE FLOWER

**Rnd 1:** With size 1 hook and olive, loosely ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 12 sc in ring, join in first sc. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** [Ch 8, sk next 2 sc, sl st in next sc] 4 times. (4 ch-8 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, \*(sc, hdc, dc, 10 tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-8 sp (*petal*), sl st in next sl st, rep from \* around. (4 *petals*)

**Rnd 4:** \*Sl st in each of next 3 sts, [ch 2, sl st in next st] 10 times, ch 2, sl st in each of last 3 sts, sl st in sl st between petals, rep from \* around. (44 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 5:** [Ch 14, sl st in 6th ch-2 sp at center top of petal, ch 14, sl st in sl st between petals] 4 times. (8 ch-14 sps)

**Rnd 6:** \*(Sl st, 2 sc, {ch 3, dc, 2 tr, dc, sc} 4 times, sc) in next ch-14 sp, sl st in sl st between petals, rep from \* around. Fasten off.

### MEDIUM FLOWER

**Rnds 1–6:** With size 3 hook and bright pink, rep rnds 1–6 of Large Flower.

### SMALL PANSY

#### BRAIDED STEM

If Braided Stem is desired, leave tails the desired length for Stem and do not weave in. Use 3 sections of 2 tails each for braiding. For CC braid, have 2 strands that are both the lightest color of the variegated crochet cotton, so that they contrast with 4 solid strands; be sure to start variegated crochet cotton (*rnd 3*) with tail that is the lightest color run. If at the end of rnd 3, you are not getting the same lightest color as tail, weave in that

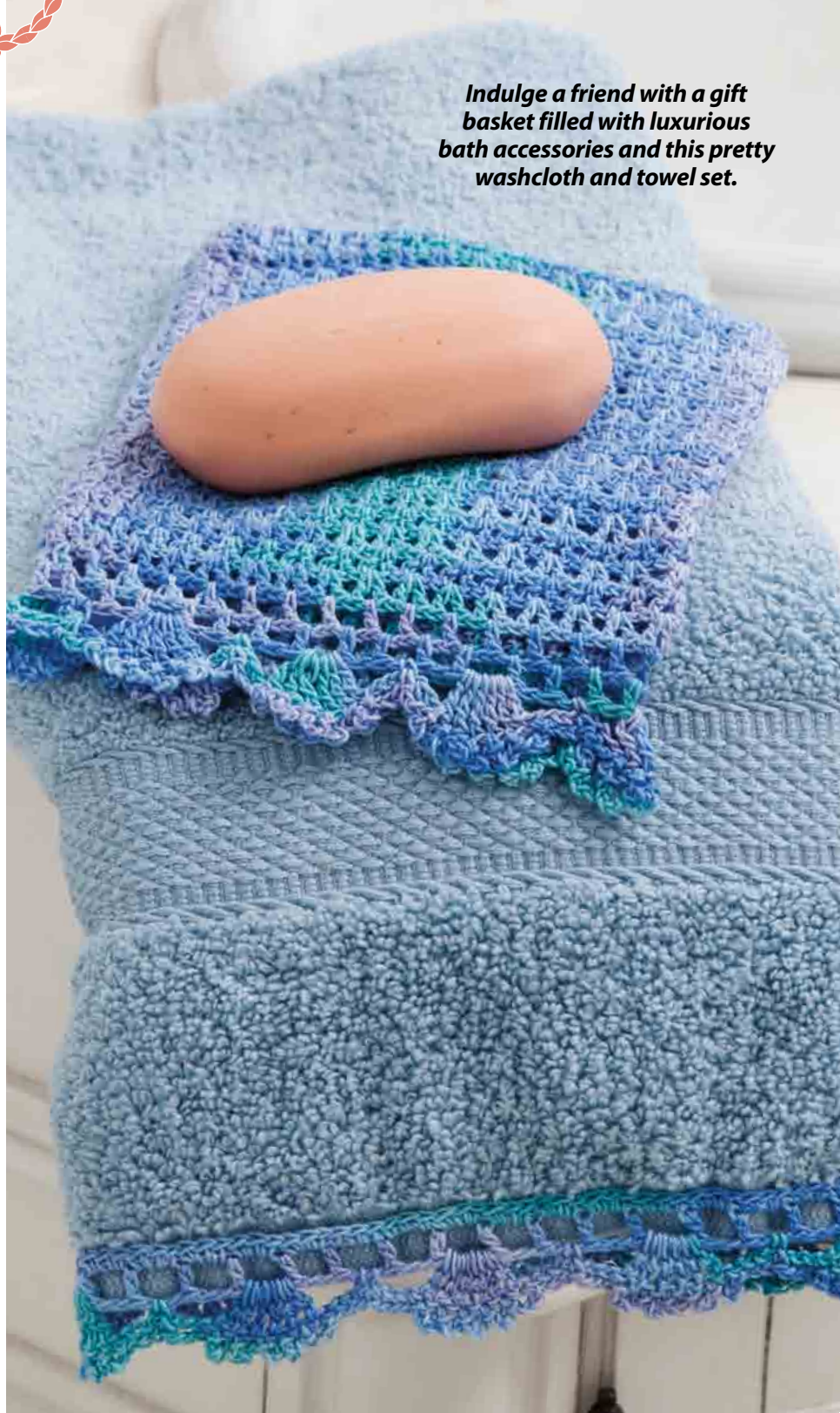

Towel Edging can be made to fit any edge by chaining in multiples of 12 plus 8 for desired length.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

ch from hook (*beg 7 sk chs count as first dc, ch 2, sk 2 chs*), [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch] across, turn. (*42 dc, 41 ch-2 sps*)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in first ch sp, [ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, 6 tr in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-2



sp, sc in next ch-2 sp] across, turn. (10 groups 6 tr, 11 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, \*ch 3, sl st in first tr, [ch 4, sl st in next tr] 5 times, ch 3, sc in next sc, rep from \* across, **do not turn**. (50 ch-4 sps, 11 sc)

**Row 4:** Sl st across side edge of rows to opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, sc in first ch, work 3 sc in each ch-2 sp across, end-ing with sc in last ch. Fasten off. (125 sc)

#### FINISHING

Referring to photo, sew Edging to hand towel.

#### WASH MITT

**Row 1 (RS):** Ch 47, **V-st** (see *Special Stitch*) in 4th ch from hook (beg 3 sk chs count as first dc), [sk next 2 chs, V-st in next ch] across to last ch, dc in last ch, turn. (15 V-sts, 2 dc)

**Row 2:** Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), V-st in ch-1 sp of each V-st across, dc in top of beg 3 sk chs, turn.

**Rows 3–45:** Ch 3, V-st in ch-1 sp of each V-st across, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn. At the end of row 45, fasten off.

#### ASSEMBLY

With WS tog, fold row 45 to row 1, with length of ocean, sew across each side edge. Turn RS out.

#### EDGING

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join (see *Pattern Notes*) ocean in first ch-1 sp of row 45, **ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), [dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 2] 16 times, working in rem lps across opposite side of foundation ch, dc in sp before first V-st, [ch 2, dc in next ch-2 sp] 15 times, ch 2, dc in sp after last V-st, ch 2, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (33 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 5, [dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (33 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, 6 tr in next ch-2 sp, ch 3\*\*, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, sk last 2 ch-2 sps, join in beg sc. (8 groups 6 tr, 8 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, \*ch 3, sl st in first tr, [ch 4, sl st in next tr] 5 times, ch 3\*\*, sc in next sc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **cw**

**Picot:** Ch 6, sl st in last st made.

**Large fan (lg fan):** ({Dc, ch 1} 4 times, dc) in indicated st.

**Small fan (sm fan):** ({Dc, ch 1} twice, dc) in indicated st.

## MOTIF

**Rnd 1:** Ch 7, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 7th ch from hook to form ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, (3 dc in

ring, ch 1) 3 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (4 ch sps, 12 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in each of next 2 dc and in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, dc in same sp as beg ch-3, tr in ring between 2 dc groups on rnd 1, 2 dc in same ch sp as last dc made, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, \*2 dc in next ch sp, tr in ring between 2 dc groups on rnd 1, 2 dc in same ch sp as last dc made, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, rep from \* twice, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (20 dc, 4 tr)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in next dc, dc in next tr, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around same tr, dc in same tr,

dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc in next dc, ch 1, \*dc in each of next 2 dc, dc in next tr, fpdc around same tr, dc in same tr, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc in next dc, ch 1, rep from \* twice, join 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (36 dc, 4 fpdc, 8 ch sps)

**Rnd 4:** \***Lg fan** (see *Special Stitches*) in next fpdc, sk next 2 dc, sl st in next dc, **sm fan** (see *Special Stitches*) in center dc of next 3-dc group, sk next dc, sl st in next dc, rep from \* around, join in first sl st. (4 lg fans, 4 sm fans)

- Size D/3/3.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- JHB International ⅞-inch silver shank button: #92344 Viennese
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker

## GAUGE

8 sts = 1½ inches; [rows 5 and 6 alternately] 8 times = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds.  
Do not join or turn unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Cross-stitch (cross-st):** Sk next st, dc in next st, working around dc just made, dc in sk st.

## BRACELET

**Rnd 1:** Leaving 6-inch tail, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), place marker in last st. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each st around, move marker to last st. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 6 times, join with sl st in next st. **Remove marker. Do not fasten off.** (18 sc)

**Row 4:** Now working in rows, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), hdc in

same st as beg ch-2, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, turn. (4 hdc, 4 sc)

**Row 6 (RS):** Ch 3, **cross-st** (see *Special Stitch*) 3 times, dc in last st, turn. (1 ch-3 sp, 3 cross-sts, 1 dc)

**Row 7:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, sc in top of beg ch-3. (8 sc)

**Rows 8–26:** [Rep rows 6 and 7 alternately] 10 times, ending last rep with row 6.

**Row 27:** Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, ch 4, sk next 2 sts, sc in each of last 3 sts.

**Row 28:** (Dc, ch 1) 4 times in ch-4 sp, dc in same ch-4 sp, sl st in last st.

**Row 29:** Sc in first st, [ch 2, sc in ch-1 sp, ch 2, sc in next st] 4 times, sl st in end of row 27. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Using 6-inch tail, with RS facing, sew button to the center of rnd 1. Weave in ends. **CW**

- DMC Pearl Cotton size 3 (16 yds per skein):
  - 1 skein each #317 pewter gray and #3326 light rose
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook
- 2-inch-long tapestry needle
- Embroidery needle
- Small-eye sewing needle
- Fiberfill
- 6mm round beads: 2 black
- White sewing thread
- Safety pin or stitch marker
- Glue (optional)
- Small piece of waxed paper or other nonstick surface (optional)
- Glass-head straight pins (optional)
- "Good fortune" charms (optional)



## GAUGE

Gauge not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds. Do not join or turn unless otherwise stated. Mark beginning of each round.



Give this cute little feng shui-inspired kitty as a good-luck charm for a peaceful and harmonious new home.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Kitty is not intended to be used as a toy.

## KITTY

### UPPER BODY

**Rnd 1:** With MC, leaving long length, make **slip ring** (see illustration), ch 1, 6 sc in ring, pulling length to tighten as you work, **do not join or turn** (see Pattern Notes). (6 sc)

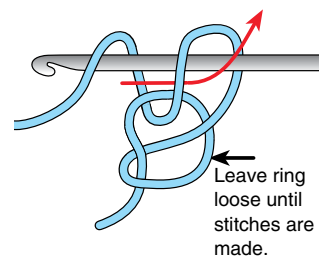
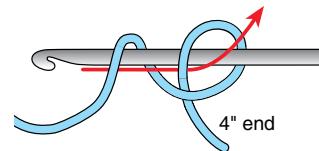
**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

**Rnds 4–6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc around, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc.

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in **back lp** (see Stitch Guide) of each sc around, join in beg sc, place marker.



Slip Ring

**Note:** Do not move marker unless otherwise stated.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 1, \*sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, rep from \* around, **do not join**. (30 sc)

**Rnds 10–14:** Sc in each sc around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

Leaving long length, fasten off. Turn RS out.



## LOWER BODY

**Rnd 1:** With CC, leaving long length, make slip ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring, pulling length to tighten as you work, **do not join or turn.** (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** \*Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, rep from \* around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** \*Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, rep from \* around. (24 sc)

**Rnds 5 & 6:** Sc in each sc around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 7:** \*Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, rep from \* around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 8:** Sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (30 sc)

Leaving long length, fasten off. Turn RS out.

## KITTY BODY ASSEMBLY

Holding Kitty Upper Body and Lower Body tog, and using tapestry needle, whipstitch Upper and Lower Bodies tog. Stuff with fiberfill as you sew. When Kitty reaches desired firmness, finish sewing, fasten off and weave in ends securely.

## COLLAR/BIB

**Rnd 1:** Join CC in rem lp of marked st on rnd 8 of Upper Body, ch 1, working in rem lps, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each rem st around, join in first sc. (24 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in each of next 5 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, dc in each of next 3 sc, 2 dc in each of next 2 dc, dc in each of next 3 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sl st in each rem sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off and weave in ends.

## EAR

### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With CC, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (2 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc across, turn. (4 sc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Leaving long length, fasten off. (4 sc)

Weave in long length from top of Ear. Fasten off.

Using long length, sew Ears to Upper Body as shown in photo.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

## TAIL

**Note:** Number of chs may be modified if longer or shorter Tail is desired.

With 2 strands CC held tog, leaving long length, ch 15. Leaving long length, fasten off.

Tack 1 end of Tail to Lower Body. Arrange Tail as desired and sew in place using long length from beg.

## ARM

### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With MC, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (6 sc)

**Rows 2 & 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 4:** Ch 1, sc in next sc, dc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, dc in next sc, sc in last sc.

Leaving long length, fasten off.

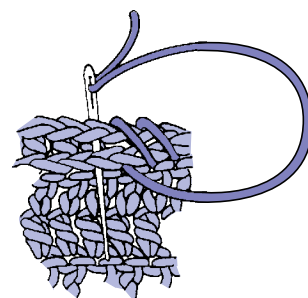
## Arm Placement

**Note:** Arms can be placed in desired position. A raised right Arm welcomes good fortune and abundance. A raised left Arm welcomes good customers and helpful people.

Weave long length through sts of row 4 and gather. Using remainder of long length, whipstitch sides of Arm to row 1.

With tapestry needle, work yarn through the 6 sts of row 4 and gather tog.

Do not cut yarn, **whipstitch** (see illustration) sides of Arm tog across to row 1.



Whipstitch Edges

Work yarn through sts of rnd 1 and sew Arm to side of Body as shown in photo.

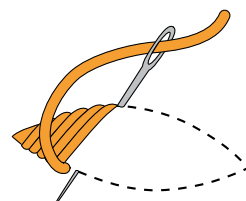

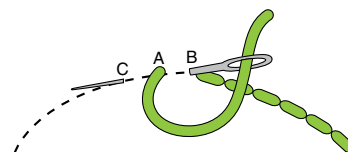
Using embroidery stitches and beads, work face as shown in placement diagram and in photo. Use light rose for nose and pewter gray for mouth and whiskers.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Weave in ends as work progresses.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Picot:** Ch 7, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

**First joining picot:** Ch 5, sl st in indicated picot of previous Daisy Edging, ch 1, sl st in 5th ch of ch-5 just made.

**Next joining picot:** Ch 5, sl st in next picot of previous Daisy Edging, ch 1, sl st in 5th ch of ch-5 just made.

## RUNNER

### DAISY

#### Make 14.

#### Center

With yellow, ch 3, 14 dc in 3rd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first st. Fasten off. (14 dc)

#### Petals

Join white in any dc of Center, \*ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 6 chs, sl st in next dc of Center, rep from \* 13 times, join in same dc as beg join, fasten off. (14 Petals)

### FIRST 7-DAISY STRIP EDGING

#### First Daisy

Join green in tip of any Petal, \***picot** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 4, sl st in tip of next Petal, rep from \* 13 times, fasten off.

#### 2nd Daisy

**Note:** Daisy Edgings are joined in a column worked from bottom to top.

Join green in tip of any Petal of any Daisy, [picot, ch 4, sl st in tip of next Petal] 11 times, **first joining picot** (see *Special Stitches*) in any picot of previous Daisy, ch 4, sl st in tip of next Petal, \***next joining picot** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 4\*\*, sl st in tip of next Petal, rep from \* once, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch at tip of first Petal. Fasten off.

#### 3rd –7th Daisies

Join green in tip of any Petal of any Daisy, [picot, ch 4, sl st in



tip of next Petal] 11 times, first joining picot in picot directly opposite first joining picot on previous Daisy, ch 4, sl st in tip of next petal on current Daisy, \*next joining picot, ch 4\*\*, sl st in tip of next petal, rep from \* once, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch at tip of first Petal. Fasten off.

### 2ND 7-DAISY STRIP EDGING

#### First Daisy

**Note:** Daisy will be joined to right edge of 7th Daisy of First 7-Daisy Strip.

Join green in tip of any Petal of any Daisy, [picot, ch 4, sl st in tip of next Petal] 11 times, first joining picot in 3rd picot to right of last join on last Daisy on First Strip, ch 4, sl st in tip of next Petal, \*next joining picot, ch 4\*\*, sl st in tip of next Petal, rep from \* once, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first ch at tip of first Petal. Fasten off.

#### 2nd Daisy

**Note:** 2nd Daisy and all rem Daisies will be joined to bottom of previous Daisy in 2nd 7-Daisy Strip then to right edge of Daisies in First 7-Daisy Strip.

Join green in tip of any Petal of any Daisy, holding runner with First 7-Daisy Strip at left, work first joining picot in 3rd picot

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

**Picot:** Ch 4, sl st in 4th ch from hook.

## THROW

### ROSE

**Make 9 each soft pink & off-white, 10 each wine country & persimmon, & 11 sunshine.**

**Rnd 1:** Ch 7, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 7th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, 16 sc in ring, join in beg sc. (16 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, \*sc

in next sc, **picot** (see *Special Stitch*)\*\*, sc in next sc, rep from \* 7 times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. (8 *picots*, 16 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, **bpsc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around first sc, [ch 3, sk next sc, bpsc around next sc] 7 times, ch 3, join in beg sc. (8 *bpsc*, 8 *ch-3 sps*)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, 5 hdc, sc) in same ch-3 sp, [(sc, 5 hdc, sc) in next ch-3 sp] 7 times, join in beg sc. (8 *petals*)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, working behind petals of rnd 4, bpsc around first bpsc of rnd 3, [ch 4, bpsc around next bpsc of rnd 3] 7 times, ch 4, join in beg sc. (8 *ch-4 sps*, 8 *bpsc*)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in ch-4 sp, ch 1 (sc, hdc, 4 dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-4 sp, [(sc, hdc, 4 dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-4 sp] 7 times, join in beg sc. (8 *petals*)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, working behind petals of rnd 6, bpsc around first bpsc of rnd 5, [ch 5, bpsc around next bpsc of rnd 5] 7 times, ch 5, join in beg sc. (8 *ch-5 sps*, 8 *bpsc*)

**Rnd 8:** Sl st in ch-5 sp, ch 1 (sc, hdc, 7 dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-5 sp, [(sc, hdc, 7 dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-5 sp] 7 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (8 *petals*)

With sewing needle and off-white sewing thread, sew pearl bead at center of each Rose.

## ASSEMBLY

**Note:** *Assembly of Roses is worked from top down and from left to right in rows. Follow Assembly Diagram for placement.*

## JOINING ROW 1 OF ROSES

### First Rose

**Rnd 1:** Working around post of last sc of petal of rnd 6, join

forest floor, ch 1, (bpsc, ch 3, bpsc) around same sc as beg ch-1, holding petal forward, ch 6 behind petal, [(bpsc, ch 3, bpsc around last sc of next petal of rnd 6, holding petal forward, ch 6 behind petal] 7 times, join in beg sc. (8 *ch-3 sps*, 8 *ch-6 sps*, 16 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, \*(sc, ch 8, sc) in ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in beg sc. (4 *ch-8 sps*, 20 *ch-3 sps*, 24 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in ch-8 sp, ch 1, \*(sc, hdc, 4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-8 sp (*corner leaf*), sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (4 *corner leaves*, 4 *ch-2 sps*, 8 sc, 8 *ch-3 sps*, 16 dc)

## 2nd-7th Roses

**Rnds 1 & 2:** Rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Rose.

**Rnd 3 (1-sided joining):** Sl st in ch-8 sp, ch 1, (sc, hdc, 4 dc, ch 1, sl st in ch-2 sp of corner leaf on previous Rose, ch 1, 4 dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-8 sp on working Rose, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, (2 dc, ch 1, sl st in next ch-2 sp on previous Rose, ch 1, 2 dc) in ch-3 sp on working Rose, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, (sc, hdc, 4 dc, ch 1, sl st in ch-2 sp of next corner leaf on previous Rose, ch 1, 4 dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-8 sp on working Rose, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, \*(sc, hdc, 4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc, hdc, sc)

72 inches wide x 36 inches long

## MATERIALS

- Patons Grace light (light worsted) weight mercerized cotton yarn (1¾ oz/136 yds/50g per skein): 8 skeins #62307 orchid
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



## GAUGE

Sc, large shell, sc = 1½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 2, dc) in indicated ch sp.

**Beginning V-stitch (beg V-st):** (Ch 5—see *Pattern Notes*, dc) in same ch sp.

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated ch sp.

**Beginning shell (beg shell):** (Ch 3—see *Pattern Notes*, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated ch sp.

**Fan shell (fan shell):** 5 dc in indicated ch sp.

**Large shell (lg shell):** (4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc) in indicated ch sp.

## SHAWL

**Row 1 (WS):** Beg at center back neckline, ch 7, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 1) 4 times in ring, turn. (5 ch-1 sps, 6 dc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sl st in first ch-1 sp, **beg V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-1 sp, ch 2, dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 2, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, ch 2, dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 2, V-st in next ch-1 sp, turn. (3 V-sts, 4 ch-2 sps, 1 dc)

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sl st in first ch-2 sp, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, V-st in next dc, ch 1, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-2 sp of next V-st, ch 1, V-st in next dc, ch 1, shell in next ch-2 sp, turn. (3 shells, 2 V-sts)

**Row 4 (RS):** Ch 2, sl st in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, **fan shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-2 sp of next V-st, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell (*center back of Shawl*), ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, fan shell in ch-2 sp of next V-st, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, turn. (3 shells, 2 fan shells)

**Row 5 (WS):** Ch 2, sl st in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in 2nd dc of fan shell, ch 3, sc in 4th dc of fan shell, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell] twice, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 2, sl st in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch sp, \*ch 3,

[sc in next ch-3 sp, fan shell in next ch-3 sp] twice, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* once, turn. (3 shells, 4 fan shells)

**Row 7:** Ch 2, sl st in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch sp, \*ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, [sc in 2nd dc of fan shell, ch 3, sc in 4th dc of same fan shell, ch 3] across fan shells, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of shell, rep from \* across, turn.

**Row 8:** Sl st in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch sp, \*ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, [fan shell in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp] across to next shell, ch 3, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* across, turn.

**Rows 9–60:** [Rep rows 7 and 8 alternately] 26 times with 1 more fan shell on each side of center back of Shawl on each rep of row 8. (58 fan shells, 3 shells)

**Row 61:** Rep row 7. At end of row 61, **do not fasten off**. (122 ch-3 sps, 3 shells)

## BORDER

**Row 62:** Ch 2, sl st in ch-2 sp, beg V-st in same ch-2 sp of shell, \*ch 2, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, [V-st in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2] 30 times\*\*, V-st twice in ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, V-st in last ch-2 sp of shell, turn. (64 V-sts)

**Row 63:** Ch 1, sl st in ch-2 sp of V-st, beg V-st in same ch sp, \*[ch 2, **lg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-2 sp of next V-st, ch 2, V-st in ch-2 sp of next V-st] 15 times\*\*, [ch 2, lg shell in ch-2 sp of next V-st] twice, ch 2, V-st in ch-2 sp of next V-st, rep from \*

- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/170 yds/100g per skein):
  - 3 skeins each #153 black (D), #100 white (E) and #172 kelly green (G)
  - 2 skeins each #141 wild berry (B) and #171 fern (C)
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

4 hdc = 1 inch; 4 hdc rows = 1½ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## THROW

**Row 1 (WS):** With A, ch 178, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs counts as first hdc*), hdc in each of next 5 chs, \*(ch 1, hdc, ch 1) in next ch, hdc in each of next 7 chs\*\*, sk next ch, hdc in next ch, sk next ch, hdc in each of next 7 chs, rep from \* 9 times, ending last rep at \*\*, turn. (159 hdc, 20 ch-1 sps)

**Row 2: Ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in each of next 6 sts, \*(hdc, ch 1) in next ch-1 sp, **fphdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around next hdc, (ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp\*\*, hdc in each of next 7 hdc, fphdc around next hdc, hdc in each of next 7 sts, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, hdc in each of next 6 hdc, sk next hdc, hdc in top of beg ch-2, turn. (160 hdc, 19 fphdc, 20 ch-1 sps)

**Row 3:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 6 hdc, \*(hdc, ch 1) in next ch-1 sp, **bphdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around next fphdc, (ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp\*\*, hdc in each of next 7 hdc, sk next hdc, bphdc around next fphdc, sk next st, hdc in each of next 7 hdc, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, hdc in each of next 6 hdc, sk next hdc,

hdc in top of beg ch-2, turn. (160 hdc, 19 fphdc, 20 ch-1 sps)

**Row 4:** Ch 2, hdc in each of next 6 sts, \*(hdc, ch 1) in next ch-1 sp, fphdc around next bphdc, (ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp\*\*, hdc in each of next 7 hdc, sk next st, fphdc around next bphdc, sk next st, hdc in each of next 7 sts, rep from \* across, ending last rep at \*\*, hdc in each of next 6 hdc, sk next hdc, hdc in top of beg ch-2, turn. (160 hdc, 19 fphdc, 20 ch-1 sps)

**Rows 5–137:** [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 66 times, change color as indicated in Color Order. At the end of row 137, fasten off A.

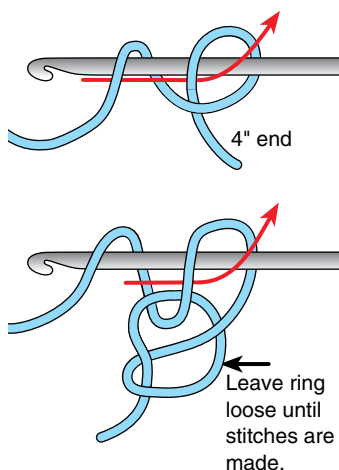

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, **beg shell** (see Special Stitches) in same ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, [shell (see Special Stitches) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, **fpdc** (see Stitch Guide) around next sc of previous rnd, [shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, fpdc around next sc of previous rnd] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 fpdc)

**Rnd 8:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, ch 1, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 1, [shell in ch sp of next shell, ch 1, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 1] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 fpdc, 18 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, ch 2, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 2, [shell in ch sp of next shell, ch 2, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 2] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 fpdc, 18 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 10:** Rep rnd 9.

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, ch 3, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 3, [shell in ch sp of next shell, ch 3, fpdc around next fpdc, ch 3] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 fpdc, 18 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 12:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, 5 dc in next fpdc, sc in next ch-3 sp, [shell in ch sp of next shell, sc in next ch-3 sp, 5 dc in next fpdc, sc in next ch-3 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 shells, 18 groups 5 dc, 36 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, **ch 4** (see Pattern Notes), 8 tr in same ch-2 sp, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in 3rd dc of 5-dc group\*\*, 9 tr in next ch-2 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off. (36 sc, 36 ch-3 sps, 18 groups 9 tr)

**Rnd 14:** Join dark pink in 4th ch of beg ch-4 of rnd 13, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, \*ch 4, sk next tr, sc in next tr, ch 4, sk next tr, (2 dc, ch 4, 2 dc) in next tr, ch 4, sk next tr, sc in next tr, ch 4, sk next tr, sc in next tr, (sc,

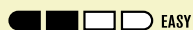

- 20 x 30-inch heavyweight corrugated cardboard sheets: 4
- Utility knife
- Cutting mat
- Paper
- Pencil
- Hot-glue gun



### GAUGE

4 dc = 1 inch; rnds 1 and 2 = 2 inches; Bloom = approximately 11 inches in diameter

### PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

### SPECIAL STITCH

**Long single crochet (lng sc):** Insert hook in indicated ch sp, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through both lps on hook.

## MEMO BOARD

### BLOOM

#### Make 7.

**Rnd 1:** With A, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to top of first sc. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [ch 1, 3 dc in next sc] 5 times, ch 1, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off A. (18 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Join C in any ch-1 sp, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-3, ch 1, \*(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-3. (24 dc, 6 ch-2 sps, 12 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st around to first ch-2 sp, ch 3, 7 dc in same ch-2 sp as beg ch-3, ch 2, [8 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] 5 times, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to A, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off C. (48 dc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 3, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), dc in next st, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 dc, **lng sc** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch sp 2 rnds below, [dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next st] twice, dc in each of next 2 dc, lng sc in next ch sp 2 rnds below] 5 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (66 sts)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, working in both lps, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, **fpsc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next lng sc, [dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 dc, fpsc around next lng sc] 5 times, change color to B, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off A. (78 sts)

**Rnd 7:** Working in back lps, ch 3, dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, tr in next fpsc, [dc in each of next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, tr in next fpsc] 5 times, join in top of beg ch-3. (90 sts)

**Note:** Use safety pins to mark indicated sts.

**Rnd 8:** Ch 3, working through both lps, dc in each of next 5 sts, 2 dc in next st, mark last st made, dc in each of next 7 sts, tr in next tr, mark last st made, \*dc in each of next 6 sts, 2 dc in next st, mark last dc made, dc in each of next 7 sts, tr in next tr, mark last st made, rep from \* 4 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (96 sts)

**Rnd 9:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 7 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, tr in next tr, \*dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 7 dc, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, tr in next tr, rep from

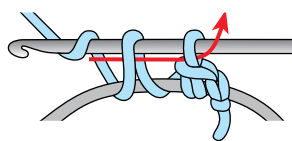
#### RINGS

Make 1 set each silver, gold & red.

**Step 1:** Join braid with **sl st** around **2-inch metal ring** (see illustration), ch 1, **sc** around ring (see illustration) to cover, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.



Slip Stitch Around Ring



Single Crochet Around Band



**Step 2:** Rep step 1 to cover 1½-inch ring.

**Step 3:** Rep step 1 to cover 1-inch ring, join in beg sc, **do not fasten off**.

#### ASSEMBLY

To join all Rings tog, insert hook through sl st join of 1½-inch Ring and through sl st join of 2-inch Ring, yo and draw through lp on hook. Working through all thicknesses, sl st in

next ch on all 3 Rings, **do not fasten off**.

Make an approximate 19-, 21- or 22-inch ch or desired length to allow ch to fit easily over head. Using care not to twist ch, join through all Rings. Leaving 2-inch length of braid, fasten off. With sewing needle, secure rem length at back edge.

With steam iron on wool setting and using pressing cloth, lightly press chain. **CW**

**Rnd 1:** Working through both thicknesses of rnd 7, join braid to center of any ch-9 sp on 1 side of Motif, insert hook under corresponding ch-9 sp and working through both sps, (sc, hdc, dc, ch 2, dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-9 sp, ch 5, \*(sc, hdc, dc, ch 2, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-9 sp, ch 5, rep from \* 11 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

#### HANGING LOOP

Cut 16-inch length of braid, fold in half and knot ends. Pass folded end through any ch-2 sp of rnd 1 of Joining, draw up lp, pass knotted end through lp on hook, pull gently to secure. **CW**

**Shell:** (2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr) in indicated ch sp.

### DOILY

#### CENTER FLOWER

**Rnd 1:** With peach, ch 5, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 5th ch from

hook to form ring, ch 1, 12 sc in ring, join in first sc. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 3, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 3, sk next sc] around, join in first sc. (6 ch-3 sps, 6 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, (sc, 7 dc, sc) in same ch-3 sp (*petal*), [(sc, 7 dc, sc) in next ch-3 sp (*petal*)] 5 times, join in first sc. (6 *petals*)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in same st, [ch 3, sc in next dc] 7 times, ch 3, \*sc in each of next 2 sc, [ch 3, sc in next dc] 7 times, ch 3, rep from \* around, ending with sc in next sc, join in first sc. Fasten off. (48 ch-3 sps)

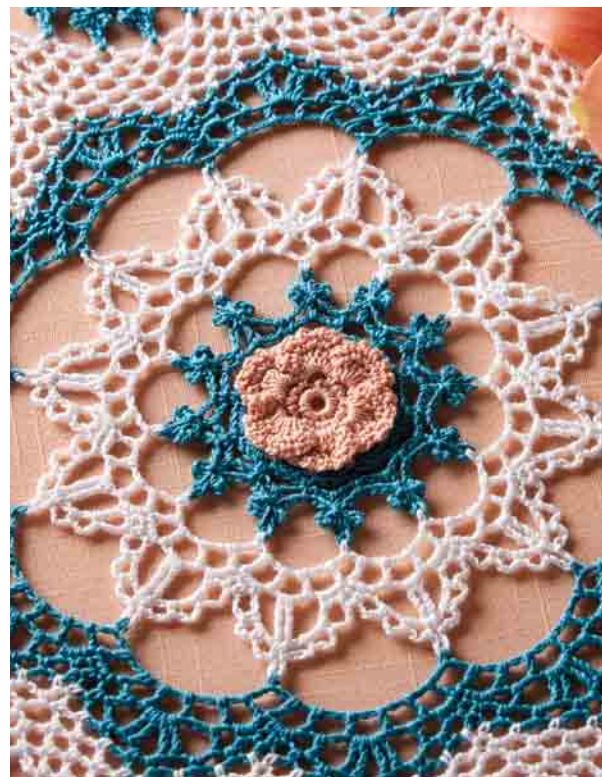
**Rnd 5:** Working behind petals, join peach in any sk sc on rnd 1, **ch 7** (see *Pattern Notes*), **dtr** (see *Stitch Guide*) in same st, ch 3, [(dtr, ch 3, dtr) in next sk sc of rnd 1, ch 3] around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. Fasten off. (12 dtr, 12 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Join turquoise in any ch-3 sp, ch 1, 4 sc in same ch-3 sp, [4 sc in next ch-3 sp] around, join in first sc. (48 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in same st, ch 4, sk next 3 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 4, sk next 3 sc] around, join in first sc. (12 sc, 12 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in same st, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, **tr picot** (see *Special Stitches*) in last dc made, sl st around base of picot, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, tr picot in last dc made, sl st around base of picot, ch 3] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (12 sc, 12 tr picots, 12 dc)

**Rnd 9:** Join white in ch-5 sp of any tr picot (*center sp*), ch 1, sc in same sp, ch 9, [sc in ch-5 sp of next tr picot, ch 9] around, join in first sc. (12 ch-9 sps, 12 sc)



**Rnd 10:** Sl st in 3rd ch of ch-9 sp, **ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 3, dc, ch 2, dc) in same place as beg ch-5, [(dc, ch 2, dc, ch 3, dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-9 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (48 dc, 24 ch-2 sps, 12 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-2 sp, ch 5, **dtr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, \*[3 sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 5, dtr cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, rep from \* around, ending with 3 sc in last ch-2 sp, join in first sc. (12 dtr cls, 24 ch-5 sps, 72 sc)

**Rnd 12:** Sl st in next sc, ch 1, sc in same st, (ch 3, sc) twice in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 4, sc) in top of dtr cl, (ch 3, sc) twice in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, \*sc in next sc, (ch 3, sc) twice in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 4, sc) in top of dtr cl, (ch 3, sc) twice in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (12 ch-4 sps, 72 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in same st, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, tr picot in last dc made, sl st around base of picot, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3, dc in ch-4 sp, tr picot in last dc made, sl st around base of picot, ch 3] 6 times, sc in next sc, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, sl st in top of same dc, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch-3 sp after any ch-5 sp on rnd 21 that will have you working toward the next ch-5 sp on Center Flower, ch 2, sl st in top of same dc on current Flower Motif, ch 4, sl st in top of same dc, ch 3, [sc in next sc, ch 3, dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, sl st in top of last dc made, ch 2, sk 1 ch-3 sp, sc in the next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sl st in top of same dc, ch 4, sl st in top of same dc, ch 3] 4 times, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## 2ND–12TH FLOWER MOTIFS

**Rnd 1–8:** Rep rnds 1–8 of First Flower Motif, attaching Flowers in ch-3 sps between ch-5 sps.

## WHITE BORDER

**Rnd 22:** Join white in center ch-5 sp of first tr picot on any Flower Motif and working across Flower Motif, ch 1, sc in same ch-5 sp, [ch 9, sc in next center ch-5 sp on next tr picot] 6 times, ch 4, sc in ch-5 sp on rnd 21, ch 4, \*sc in next center ch-5 sp on next tr picot, [ch 9, sc in center ch-5



sp on next tr picot] 6 times, ch 4, sc in ch-5 sp on rnd 21, ch 4, rep from \* around, join in first sc. (72 ch-9 sps, 24 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 23:** Sl st in 3rd ch of ch-9 sp, ch 5, (dc, ch 3, dc, ch 2, dc) in same sp as beg ch-5, \*(dc, ch 2, dc, ch 3, dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-9 sp, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (288 dc)

**Rnd 24:** Sl st in ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, ch 3, **2-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, [3 sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 5, dtr cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 5] 4 times, \*[3 sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, 2-dc cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, [sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, 2-dc cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, [3 sc in next ch-2

sp] twice, ch 5, 2-dtr cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 5] 4 times, rep from \* around, ending with [3 sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, 2-dc cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, join in first sc.


**Rnd 25:** Sl st in top of 2-dc cl, ch 1, work rem rnd as follows:

- A.** Sc in top of 2-dc cl, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc;
- B.** [ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 4, sc) in tip of dtr cl, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc] 4 times;

**C.** ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in top of next 2-dc cl, ch 3, \*sc in top of next 2-dc cl, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc, ch 3;

**D.** [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 4, sc) in tip of dtr cl, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc] 4 times;

**E.** ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in top of next 2-dc cl, ch 3, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join yarn in Underarm Side Panel, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same st, picot [shell, picot] 11 [11, 12, 12, 13, 13] times evenly sp around armhole opening, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn. (12 [12, 13, 13, 14, 14] each shells and picots)

**Rnds 2–12:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, picot, [shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, picot] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn. At the end of rnd 12, **do not fasten off.**

### SLEEVE RIBBING

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 1, work 48 [48, 52, 52, 56, 56] sc evenly sp in rnd 12 of Sleeve, join in first sc, **do not turn rnds.**

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, [fp<sup>sc</sup> (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 2 sc, bp<sup>sc</sup> (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 2 sc] around, join in first fp<sup>sc</sup>.

**Rnds 3 & 4:** Ch 1, [fp<sup>sc</sup> around each of next 2 fp<sup>sc</sup>, bp<sup>sc</sup> around each of next 2 bp<sup>sc</sup>] around, join in first fp<sup>sc</sup>. At the end of rnd 4, fasten off.

### TRIM

**Row 1 (RS):** Join yarn to bottom Front Panel corner, ch 1, then work 188 [192, 208, 208, 224, 224] sc evenly sp up first Front Panel edge, around neckline and down opposite Front Panel edge to corner, turn.

**Rows 2–6:** Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each st, turn. (188 [192, 208, 208, 224, 224] sc)


### RIBBING

**Rnd 7 (RS):** Working around outer edge of Cardigan, ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc (*corner*), sc in each of next 184 [188, 204, 204, 220, 220] sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc (*corner*), working across bottom edge of Cardigan, work 138 [146, 154, 162, 166, 192] sc across, join in first sc. (330 [342, 366, 374, 394, 420] sc)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, [fp<sup>sc</sup> around each



of next 2 sc, bp<sup>sc</sup> around each of next 2 sc] around, join in first fp<sup>sc</sup>.

**Rnds 9 & 10:** Ch 1, [fp<sup>sc</sup> around each of next 2 fp<sup>sc</sup>, bp<sup>sc</sup> around each of next 2 bp<sup>sc</sup>] around, join in first fp<sup>sc</sup>. At end of rnd 10, fasten off.

**Rnd 8:** Beg sp, block, \*[sp, tr in next st] 3 times, sp, block, corner block, block, [sp, tr in next st] 3 times, sp\*\*, block, sp, block, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, tr in next st, 3 tr in next ch sp, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7. (16 blocks, 4 corner blocks, 36 sps, 24 tr)

**Rnds 9–18:** Following chart, work as established. At end of rnd 18, fasten off. (16 blocks, 4 corner sp, 116 sps, 104 tr at end of last rnd)

## ASSEMBLY

With RS of 2 Squares facing and working through both thicknesses, join natural in 4th ch of corner ch-7 sp, \*[ch 3, sk next ch sp, sl st in next tr] 11 times, sl st in each of next 4 tr, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sl st in each of next 5 tr, [ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sl st in next tr] 9 times, sl st in each of next 4 tr, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp,

sl st in each of next 5 tr, [ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sl st in next tr] 10 times, ch 3, sk next 3 chs of corner, sl st in 4th ch of corner ch-7 sp, rep from \* to join 3 rows of 3 Squares and then join rows of Squares tog to form 3 x 3 center.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Join natural in any tr on side edge, (**ch 6**—see *Pattern Notes*, dc) in same st as join, [sk next 3 sts, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next tr] around outer edge, working V-st in junction of Squares and working **corner V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in each of the 4 corners, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.


**Rnd 2:** Sl st in ch sp of V-st, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same sp as beg ch-1, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in ch-3 sp of









each V-st across to corner, ((sc, ch 3) 3 times, sc) in center corner ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in beg sc.

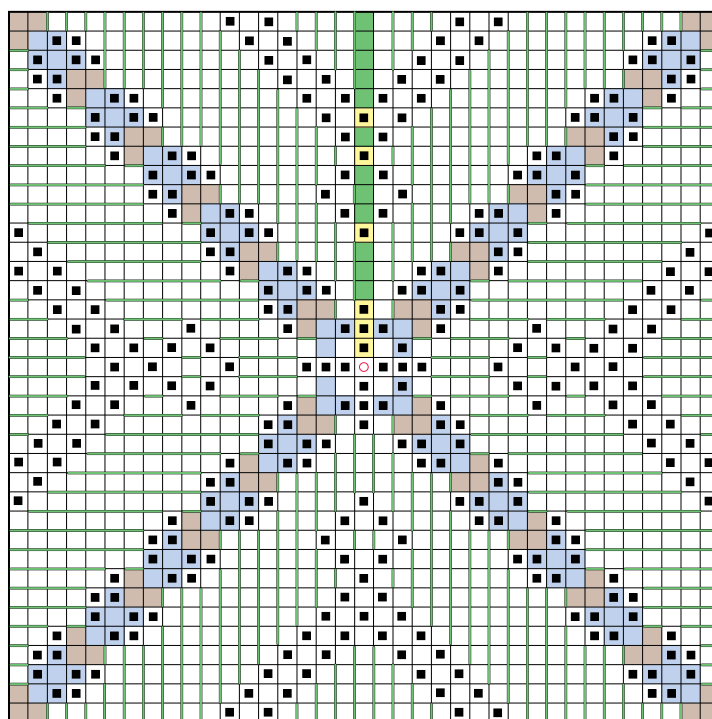
**Rnd 3:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc.

With size G hook and mango, work 12-inch-long chain. Fasten off. Working around 2 center sts of bottom of Duck Head, place 1 end of Necktie from front to back to front, pull through until ends are even. Tie ends into bow and knot securely. **CW**

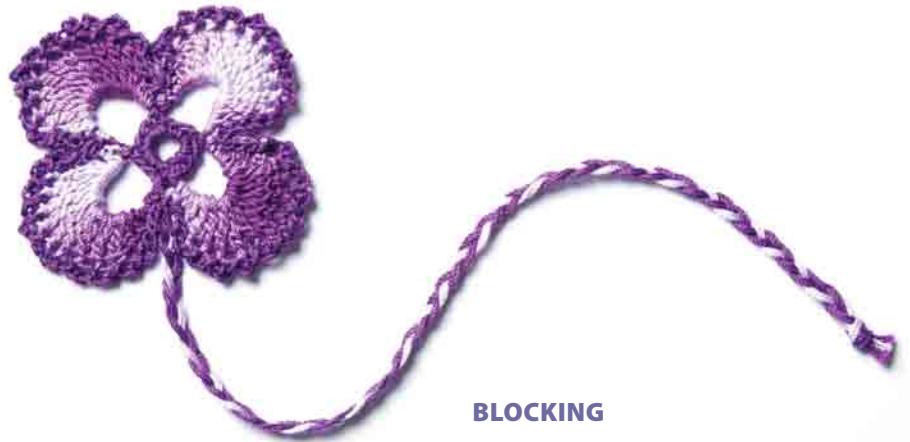

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in first ch-7 sp, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), (4 dc, tr, 4 dc, hdc) in same ch-7 sp as beg ch-2, \*(hdc, 4 dc, tr, 4 dc, hdc) in each of next 2 ch-7 sps, (hdc, dc, tr, ch 1, tr, **picot**—see *Special Stitches*, ch 1, tr, dc, hdc) in corner ch-7 sp\*\*, (hdc, 4 dc, tr, 4 dc, hdc) in next ch-7 sp, rep from \* 3

times, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off. (104 dc, 32 hdc, 24 tr, 4 picots)

### TIE

Join yarn in any picot, \*ch long enough to snugly fit pillow at desired tightness, wrap ch

around pillow, join in opposite picot. Fasten off.

Join yarn in any rem picot, rep from \* once.

### FINISHING

Weave in all ends. **CW**

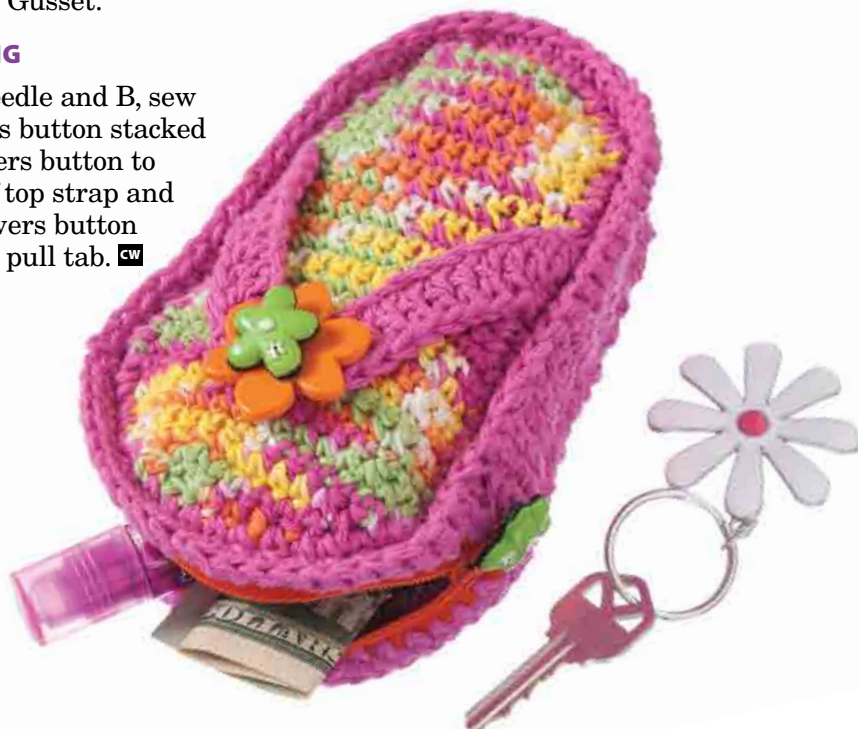

Rep First Pocket Assembly.

## EDGING

**Row 1 (RS):** Working in ends of rows through both thicknesses of Pocket, [ch 3, sc in edge of Pocket] 6 times, now working across Checkerboard, ch 3, sc in corner V-st, [ch 3, sc in next V-st] across edge to corner V-st, ch 3, sc in corner V-st, now working in ends of rows through both thicknesses of rem Pocket, [ch 3, sc in edge of Pocket] 6 times. Fasten off.

Rep Edging on opposite side of Pockets and Checkerboard.

To section off Pocket, with yarn needle and length of C, tack row



11 to row 2 3 times evenly sp across edge. Rep on rem Pocket.

## CHECKERS

**Make 12 each D & E.**

## FINISHING

**For first Tie,** with WS of Checkerboard facing and with C, ch 80, catching 1 strand of yarn of Checkerboard, sl st in 17th dc of row 17, ch 80. Fasten off.

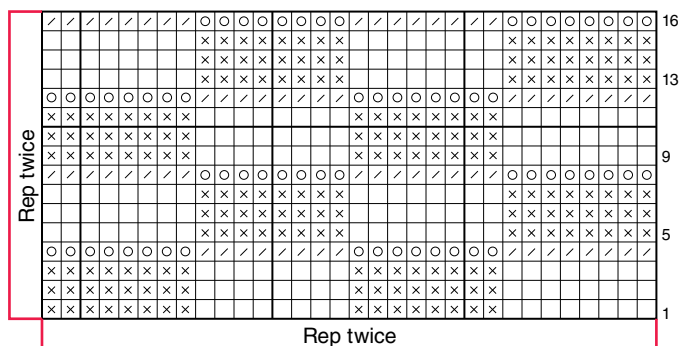

(125 sts)

**Row 2:** Rep row 6 of Front/Back. (125 sts)

On paper, trace 1 Front/Back piece twice to use as pattern for Lining.

### SIDES

**Row 1:** With cornflower, ch 124, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (123 sts)

**Row 2:** Rep row 6 of Front/Back. **Do not fasten off.**

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Rep row 2. Fasten off.

**Row 5:** With peacock, rep row 5 of Front/Back.

**Row 6:** Rep row 2.

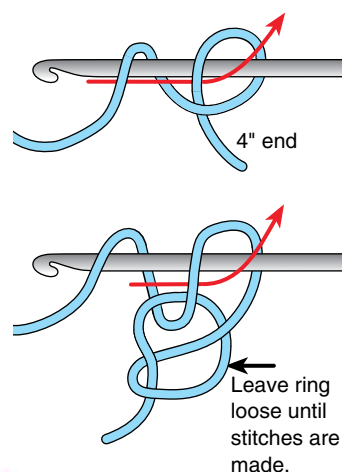

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in first ch-3 sp, ch 2, (2-dc cl, ch 3, 3-dc cl) in same sp as beg ch-2, (ch 3, 3-dc cl) twice in each ch-3 sp around, ch 3, join in top of first cl. Fasten off. (12 cls)

**Rnd 3:** Join peacock in first ch-3 sp, ch 2, (2-dc cl, ch 3, 3-dc cl) in same sp as beg ch-2, \*(ch 3, 3-dc cl) in next ch-3 sp, (ch 3, 3-dc cl) twice in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around to last ch-3 sp, ch 3, 3-dc cl in last ch-3 sp, ch 3, join in top of first cl st. Fasten off. (18 cls)

**Rnd 4:** Join cornflower in first ch-3 sp, ch 2, (2-dc cl, ch 3, 3-dc





cl) in same sp as beg ch-2, \*ch 1, 3 dc in each of next 2 ch-3 sps\*\*, (3-dc cl, ch 3, 3 dc cl) in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in top of first cl. Fasten off. (12 cls, 6 ch-3 sps, 6 ch-1 sps, 12 groups of 3 dc)

**Rnd 5: Working in back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), join sand in top of first cl, ch 1, hdc in same cl as beg ch-1, \*3 dc in next ch-3 sp, hdc in next cl, sk next ch-1 sp, hdc in each of next 6 dc\*\*, hdc in next cl, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first hdc. Fasten off. (6 groups 3 dc, 48 hdc)

Sew the Motif to center of 1 Front/Back.

### CROCHET BAG ASSEMBLY

With WS tog, sew the Sides to Front (*piece with Motif*). Rep for Sides and Back.

### TOP EDGE

With RS facing, join cornflower with sc in any corner junction at top of Bag, working in ends of rows, sc evenly sp across Side, sc in next corner junction, sc in each st across next Front/Back, sc in next corner junction, working in ends of rows, sc evenly sp across Side, sc in next corner junction, sc in each st across rem Front/Back, join in first st. Fasten off.

### STRAP

**Row 1:** Ch 116, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn. (115 sts)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, working in beg ch around sts from previous row, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each st across, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, working in sts 2 rows below around sts from previous row, sc in same st as beg ch-1 and in each st across, turn.

**Rows 5–10:** [Rep rows 3 and 4

alternately] 3 times. Fasten off at end of last row.

Sew each end of Strap to Top Edge sts worked across Sides.

Weave in ends.

### LINING

Iron interfacing to wrong side of lining fabric. Cut out front and back Lining pieces allowing for 5/8-inch seams all around including the top edge. Measure 3 1/4-inch x approximately 36-inch piece of lining fabric for Sides Lining. Machine- or hand-sew Front and Back Linings to sides Lining. Turn top edge under and press.

Attach purse magnets through lining fabric so prong ends are on wrong side of fabric. Fold down prongs. Cut 4 more pieces of Lining just large enough

to cover the prongs of the magnets. Sew in place to prevent prongs from working through crocheted Bag.

Place Lining inside Bag. Using sewing needle and matching thread, sew Lining and Bag tog along top edges just below the last row of crochet sts. **cw**

(120 sts)

**Rnd 11:** Working in back lps, ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, [dc in each of next 8 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts] 11 times, dc in each of rem 5 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. (108 sts)

**Rnd 12:** Working in back lps, ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, dc dec in next 2 sts, [dc in each of next 6 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts] 12 times, dc in each of last 4 sts, join in top of beg ch-3, turn. (95 sts)

**Rnd 13:** Working through both lps, ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc, dc dec in next 2 sts, [dc in each of next 5 dc, dc dec in next 2 sts] 12 times, dc in each of last 4 sts, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off A. (82 sts)

### FINISHING

Trace one 10 $\frac{7}{8}$ -inch-diameter circle on paper, cut out and use as template to trace and cut 7

circles from foam core board using utility knife for circle fronts.

Cut 7 circles from either corrugated cardboard or foam core board for circle backs.

Using hot-glue gun, glue 1 circle front to 1 circle back.

\*Stretch 1 Bloom over front, positioning unused lp of rnd 10 along perimeter edge of front, rnd 11 around side edge of circle and rnds 12 and 13 on back side of circle. Glue last 2 rnds to circle back. Rep from \* for rem 6 Blooms.

### ASSEMBLY

With WS facing, arrange Blooms on a flat surface in the shape of large flower as shown in photo. Using needle and A, sew Blooms tog on wrong side through 4 adjacent front lps of rnd 11, creating approximately 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch seam.

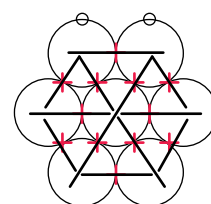

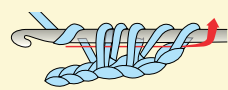

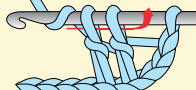

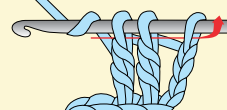

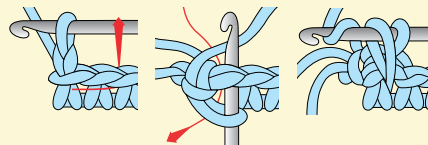

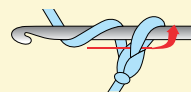

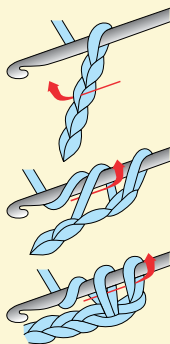
