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Welcome Home Denim Mat

Design by Linda Dean

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ EASY

FINISHED SIZE

14 inches wide x 27½ inches long

MATERIALS

- 2–3 pairs adult denim jeans, cut into approximately ½–¾-inch-wide strips:
- Size N/13/9mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle (*optional*)
- Denim sewing thread (*optional*)

GAUGE

13 sc sts = 8 inches; 6 sc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Not all denim is created equal, so it is a good idea to test-swatch selected fabric. Some fabrics will fray and split easier than others, and these may need to be cut approximately ¾ inch wide.

To create longer strips, when getting to the end of fabric, stop approximately ½ inch from end, turn piece and begin cutting an adjacent strip alongside the one just made. This will leave a “tab” in the strip that can easily be worked along.

When attaching a new strip to the project, either sew strips together, or when reaching the end of a strip, just begin working with the new-strip end, working over tails of both strips; do not tie a knot.

MAT

Row 1: Ch 46, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (45 sc)

Rows 2–22: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 23: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off. **CW**

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ BEGINNER

FINISHED SIZE

5¼ inches wide x 7 inches tall,
including Hair Loops

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Kids medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (solids: 5 oz/290 yds/141g per skein; multi: 4 oz/232 yds/113g per skein):
50 yds #2930 crayon multi
15 yds each #2230 yellow, #2845 blue and #2652 lime
5 yds #2252 orange
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 10mm 4-hole blue buttons: 2
- 16mm 4-hole white buttons: 2
- Fiberfill
- Straight pins



GAUGE

4 hdc = 1 inch; 5 hdc rows =
2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

BIRD

BACK BODY

Row 1: With crayon multi,

ch 15, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (beg 2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (14 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each hdc across to last hdc, 2 hdc in last hdc, turn. (16 hdc)

Row 3: Rep row 2. (18 hdc)

Rows 4–10: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Row 11: Ch 2, **hdc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 hdc, hdc in each hdc across to last 2 hdc, hdc dec in last 2 hdc, turn. (16 hdc)

Rows 12–17: Rep row 11. At the end of row 17, fasten off. (4 hdc)



This cute little goofy bird is a fun way to save a child's tooth for a visit from the Tooth Fairy!

FRONT BODY

Rows 1–7: With blue, rep rows 1–7 of Back Body. At the end of row 7, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to crayon multi in last hdc, turn. Fasten off blue. (18 hdc)

Row 8 (RS): Ch 2, working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), hdc in each st across, turn.

Rows 9 & 10: Ch 2 hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Rows 11–17: Rep rows 11–17 of Back Body. (4 hdc)

BEAK

Row 1: Beg at bottom edge, with orange, **ch 2** (does not count as first hdc), 2 hdc in first ch of ch-2, turn. (2 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2 hdc in same hdc as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in next hdc, turn. (4 hdc)

Row 3: Ch 2 hdc in same hdc as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 2 hdc, 2 hdc in last hdc, turn. (6 hdc)

Rnd 4: Now working in rnds, ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 4 sts, 2 hdc in last st (*top opening*), ch 1, work 6 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 4–1 to bottom edge, ch 1, work 6 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–4, ch 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg ch-2, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. (20 sts)

WING

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With lime, ch 15, 3 hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in each of next 8 chs, sc in each of next 4 chs, ch 1 (*wing tip*), working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 4 chs, hdc in each of next 8 chs, join in beg ch. (28 sts, 1 ch-1 sp)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, working in back lp, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in next st, ch 1, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 8 sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, (sc,



ch 1, sc) in ch-1 sp (*wing tip*), sc in each of next 4 sts, hdc in each of next 8 sts, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (34 sts)

ASSEMBLY

Use photo as a guide. With tapestry needle and rem length of orange, leaving top open, sew Beak between rows 9–13 of Front Body at a slight angle.

Thread tapestry needle with length of yellow, place blue button on top of white button and position them slightly above Beak, maintaining the slight angle to bottom and top of row 15, sew buttons in place through 4 holes with “X.”

Pin 1 Wing to each side of Front Body with ch-1 of bottom tip at bottom edge of Front Body and ch-1 at top of Wing even with row 12. Place WS of Front and Back of Body tog, working through all thicknesses and in back lp only of each Wing, join yellow at bottom right corner with sc, sc evenly sp to center top sc of head, (sc, ch 5, sl st, ch 7, sl st, ch 5, sl st) in center top sc, sc evenly sp to bottom, stuffing lightly with fiberfill before closing and removing straight pins as work progresses, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **cw**

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Retro Wrap

SKILL LEVEL



FINISHED SIZE

22 inches wide x 73 inches long,
excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/170 yds/100g per ball):
3 balls each #174 olive (A),
#125 taupe (B) and
#133 brick (C)
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- 35mm square button



GAUGE

6 dc = 2 inches; 4 dc rows =
2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

WRAP

Row 1 (WS): With A, ch 260, dc in 4th ch from hook (*3 sk chs count as first dc*), *dc in each of next 9 chs, sk next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, 3 dc in next ch, dc in each of next 5 chs, sk next ch, dc in each of next 9 chs**, 3 dc in next ch, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in last ch, turn. (260 dc)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, *dc in each of next 9 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, 3 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 9 dc**, 3 dc in next dc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, *dc in each of next 9 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, 3 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, sk next 2 dc, dc in each of next 9 dc**, 3 dc in next dc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 3. Fasten off.

Rows 5–8: With B, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Rows 9–12: With C, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Rows 13 & 14: With A, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Rows 15 & 16: With B, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Rows 17 & 18: With C, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Rows 19–22: With A, rep row 3. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

FRINGE

Work Fringe in ends of rows, working 6 Fringe in A, B and C on each end of Wrap evenly sp across in rows of coordinating color.

Cut 4 strands of yarn each 10 inches long. Hold strands tog, fold in half forming lp at folded end, draw lp through center of desired row at end of Wrap, draw ends through lp on hook, pull gently to tighten.

Trim ends even to 3½ inches.

BUTTON

With RS facing, sew button to row 32, approximately 25 inches from right edge or as desired. For buttonhole, use natural sp of sk 2 dc on desired row. **CW**

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ □ INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

23¼ inches wide x 28½ inches long

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic size 10 crochet cotton (400 yds per ball):
2 balls #1 white
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



GAUGE

Motif measures 2¾ inches across each edge; rnd 1 = 1¼ inches in diameter; joined 6-motif circle = 6¾ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Follow assembly diagram for placement of Motifs.

SPECIAL STITCHES

3-treble cluster (3-tr cl): *Yo hook twice, insert hook in indicated sp, yo, draw up a lp, [yo draw through 2 lps] twice, rep from * twice, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

Beginning 3-treble cluster (beg 3-tr cl): Ch 3, yo hook twice, insert hook in indicated sp, yo, draw up a lp, [yo draw through 2 lps] twice, rep from * once, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

Cluster shell (cl shell): (3-tr cl, ch 3, 3-tr cl) in same indicated sp.

DOILY

FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1: Ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **beg 3-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3, [3-tr cl (see *Special Stitches*), ch 3, 3-tr cl in ring, ch 3, dc in ring, ch 3] twice, 3-tr cl in ring, dc in top of beg 3-tr cl to position hook for next rnd. (6 tr cls, 3 dc, 9 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 2: Beg 3-tr cl in same ch sp as joining, *ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3**, **cl shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3-tr cl in same ch sp as beg 3-tr cl, dc in top of beg 3-tr cl. (3 cl shells, 9 dc, 12 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: Beg 3-tr cl in same ch sp as joining, *[ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 3**, (3-tr cl, ch 5) twice in next ch-3 sp, 3-tr cl in same ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, (3-tr cl, ch 5) twice in same ch sp as beg 3-tr cl, join in top of beg cl. Fasten off. (15 ch-3 sps, 12 dc, 9 tr cls, 6 ch-5 sps)

1-SIDED JOIN MOTIF

Rnds 1 & 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Motif.

Rnd 3: Beg 3-tr cl in same sp as joining, [ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 3;

A. (3-tr cl, ch 5, 3-tr cl) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-5 sp of Motif, pick up dropped lp, draw to RS, ch 2, 3-tr cl in same ch-3 sp;

B. [ch 2, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-3 sp, pick up dropped lp,



draw through to RS, ch 1, dc in next ch-3 sp on working Motif] 4 times;

C. ch 2, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in next ch-3 sp, pick up dropped lp, draw to RS, ch 1, 3-tr cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-5 sp, pick up dropped lp and draw to RS;

D. ch 2, (3-tr cl, ch 5, 3-tr cl) in same ch-5 sp, [ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 3, (3-tr cl, ch 5) twice in next ch-3 sp, join in beg 3-tr cl. Fasten off.

2-SIDED JOIN MOTIF

Rnds 1 & 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Motif.

Rnd 3: Beg 3-tr cl in same sp as joining, [ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 3;

A. (3-tr cl, ch 5, 3-tr cl) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-5 sp of Motif, pick up dropped lp, draw to RS, ch 2, 3-tr cl in same ch-3 sp;

B. *[ch 2, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-3 sp, pick up dropped lp, draw through to RS, ch 1, dc in next ch-3 sp on working Motif] 4 times;

C. ch 2, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in next ch-3 sp, pick up dropped lp, draw to RS, ch 1, 3-tr cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-5 sp,

Triangular motifs are cleverly arranged in a circular pattern to create this beautiful lace doily.



pick up dropped lp and draw to RS, ch 2, 3-tr cl in same ch-5 sp*;

D. ch 3, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS in adjacent ch-5 sp, ch 2, 3-tr cl in same ch-5 sp on working motif, rep from * to * once, ch 5, join in beg 3-tr cl. Fasten off.

CENTER OPENING TRIM

Note: Center opening is created by joining 6 Motifs and consists of 12 ch sps around center of opening.

Rnd 1: Join in ch sp at center, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch sp, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch sp] 11 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (24 sc, 12 ch-3 sps)

OUTER TRIM

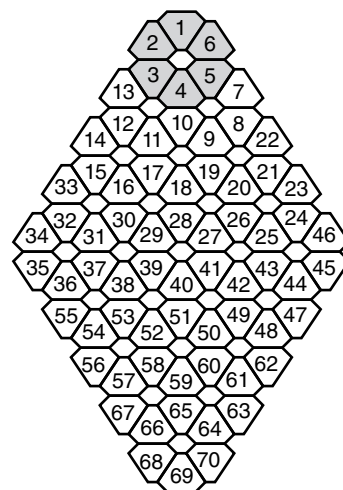
Rnd 1: Join in any ch-5 sp on outer edge, ch 6 (*counts as first double crochet, ch 3*), [dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] around outer edge in each ch-3 sp or ch-5 sp, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

Rnd 2: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, ch 4, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 4] around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-4 sp, *sc dec (*see Stitch Guide*) in same ch-4 sp as last sc and next ch-4 sp**, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-4 sp as last sc dec, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

Seasoned to Perfection

SKILL LEVEL

■ ■ ■ ■ ■ INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

6½ x 72½ inches, excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Fine (sport) weight wool yarn:
 - 4 oz total scraps in a variety of light/dark shades
 - 2 oz sock yarn in denim (or desired background color)
- Size D/3/3.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

9 dc = 1½ inches; Motif = 6½ inches square

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Triple treble crochet (trtr):

Yo hook 4 times, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 5 times

SCARF

ROSETTE MOTIF

Make 5.

Rnd 1: With first-color scrap, ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 3 dc in ring, *ch 1, turn, dc in same st, dc in each of next 3 sts**, ch 2, turn, yo,

insert hook back into ring on left twisting “petal lps” just made, 4 dc in ring, rep from * 7 times, ending last rep at **, ch 2, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (8 petal lps)

Rnd 2: Join 2nd-color scrap in ch-2 sp between petal lps, (ch 3,

dc, ch 10, 2 dc) in same ch-2 sp, [(2 dc, ch 10, 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 7 times, join in beg ch-3, **do not turn**. (8 ch-10 lps)

Rnd 3: [(8 dc, ch 1, 8 dc) in ch-10 lp, sk 2 dc, sc in next sp, sk next 2 dc] 8 times, join in beg dc. Fasten off. (8 ch-1 sps, 8 petals)

You can use lots of scrap colors to create this fun scarf made with rosette and sunflower granny squares.



Rnd 4: Join 3rd-color scrap in sc between petals, **ch 11** (counts as first trtr, ch 5), *(dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-1 sp (corner), ch 5, **trtr** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc between petals, ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 3**, trtr in next sc between petals, ch 5, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 6th ch of beg ch-11 Fasten off. (8 trtr, 4 corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 5: Join 4th-color scrap in ch-5 sp before corner ch-2 sp, (ch 3, 4 dc) in same ch-5 sp, *ch 1, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp, 6 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp**, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 ch-2 sps, 80 dc)

Rnd 6: Join denim in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 3, 1 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same corner sp, *dc in each dc and each ch-1 sp across to next corner

ch-2 sp**, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-3. (112 dc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, working (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (128 dc, 4 ch-2 sps)

SUNFLOWER MOTIF

Make 6.

Rnd 1: With first-color scrap, ch 5, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 3, 17 dc in ring, join in beg ch-3. (18 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 8, sk next dc, [sc in next dc, ch 8, sk next dc] around, join in beg sc, turn. (9 sc, 9 ch-8 lps)

Rnd 3: Sl st in 4 chs to top of ch-8 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-8 lp, ch 5, [sc in next ch-8 lp, ch 5] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (9 ch-5 lps)

Note: Rnd 4 is worked over 2 previous rnds, working in a continuous right-hand turning motion. Think of it as a “roller coaster” that loops upside down.

Rnd 4: Join 2nd-color scrap in ch-5 sp between ch-8 lps, (ch 3, 6 dc) in same ch-5 sp, *6 dc in right-hand ch lp from previous rnd, turning work, jump over to 2nd portion of ch-8 lp, working from bottom toward top, work 6

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust: 36 inches (*small*) [40 inches (*medium*), 44 inches (*large*), 48 inches (*X-large*) and 52 inches (*2X-large*)]

MATERIALS

- Brown Sheep Nature Spun Sport fine (sport) weight wool yarn (1¾ oz/184 yds/50g per skein):
10 [10, 11, 11, 11] skeins #117 winter blue
- Brown Sheep Lanaloft Sport fine (sport) weight wool yarn (1¾ oz/145 yds/59g per skein):
1 skein #LL95 cherry splash
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

11 sts = 2 inches; 4 rows = 1 inch
Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

JACKET

FRONT

Granny Square

Make 34.

Rnd 1: With cherry splash, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*), in first ch to form a ring, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, [3 dc in ring, ch 1] 3 times, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (12 dc)

Rnd 2: Join winter blue in any ch-1 sp, (ch 2, 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in same sp, ch 1, [(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, join in beg ch-2, turn. (24 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 2, 2 dc in same ch sp, *(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, ch 1**, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-2, turn. (36 dc)

Sizes X-Large & 2X-Large Only

Rnd [4, 4]: Ch 2, 2 dc in same ch sp, *(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1**, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-2, turn. ([48] dc)

All Sizes

Rnd 4 [4, 4, 5, 5]: Ch 1, sc in each dc and each ch-1 sp, working 3 sc in each corner ch-1 sp, join in beg sc, do not turn. (56 [56, 56, 72, 72] sc)

Size Large Only

Rnd [5]: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in each center corner sc, join in beg sc, do not turn. ([64] sc)

All Sizes

Rnd 5 [5, 6, 6, 6]: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 1, sk 1 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sk 1 sc] rep around, working 3 sc in each center corner sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Half Granny Square

Make 2.

Row 1: With cherry splash, ch 4, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 2, 2 dc in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*), to winter blue, fasten off cherry splash, turn. (6 dc)

Row 2: Ch 2, 2 dc in first dc, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (12 dc)

Row 3: Ch 2, 2 dc in first dc, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in corner ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in last dc, turn. (18 dc)

Sizes X-Large & 2X-Large Only

Row [4, 4]: Ch 2, 2 dc in same dc, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, (3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in corner ch-1 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, 3 dc in last dc, turn. ([24] dc)

All Sizes

Row 4 [4, 4, 5, 5]: Ch 1, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp, working 3 sc in corner ch-1 sp, turn. (25 [25, 25, 33, 33] sc)

Size Large Only

Row [5]: Ch 1, sc in each sc and work 3 sc in center corner sc, turn. ([27] sc)

All Sizes

Row 5 [5, 6, 6, 6]: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] rep across both edges, working 3 sc in each center corner sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Small denim granny squares with cherry red centers give pizzazz to this easygoing jacket.

Assembly

Working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st Granny Squares tog, working 3 Squares horizontally and 6 Squares vertically; place Half Granny Square at center front neckline.

BACK

Row 1: With winter blue, ch 101 [111, 120, 129, 138], 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first dc), *sk next 2 chs, (sc, 2 dc) in next ch, rep from * across, ending with sc in last ch, turn. (99 [109, 118, 127, 136] sts)

Row 2: Ch 2, 2 dc in first sc, *(sc, 2 dc) in next sc, rep from * across, ending with sc, turn.

Rep row 2 until Back measures 17½ [17½, 20½, 23½, 23½] inches.

Neck Shaping

Rep row 2 across 34 [39, 43, 48, 52] sts. Fasten off.

Sk next 31 [31, 32, 31, 32] sts for back neckline.

Attach winter blue in next st, rep as for row 2 across rem 34 [39, 43, 48, 52] sts. Fasten off.

SLEEVE

Make 2.

Row 1: With winter blue, ch 45, 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first dc), *sk next 2 chs, (sc, 2 dc) in next ch, rep from * across, ending with sc in last ch, turn. (43 sts)

Row 2: Ch 2, 2 dc in first sc, *(sc, 2 dc) in next sc, rep from * across, ending with sc, turn.

Row 3: Rep row 2.

Row 4: Rep row 2 and maintaining established pattern, inc 1 st at each end of row. (45 sts)

Rows 5–7: Rep row 2.

Row 8: Rep row 2 and

maintaining established pattern, inc 1 st at each end of row. (47 sts)

Row 9: Rep row 2.

Row 10: Rep row 2 and maintaining established pattern, inc 1 st at each end of row. (49 sts)

Rep rows 9 and 10 until a total of 91 [91, 91, 93, 93] sts is reached.

Rep row 2 until Sleeve measures 17 [17, 17½, 17½, 18] inches or desired length. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY


Sew shoulder seams tog. Sew each Sleeve in opening positioning center top of Sleeve at shoulder seam. Using care to work in back lp on of Granny Squares, sew side and Sleeve seams.

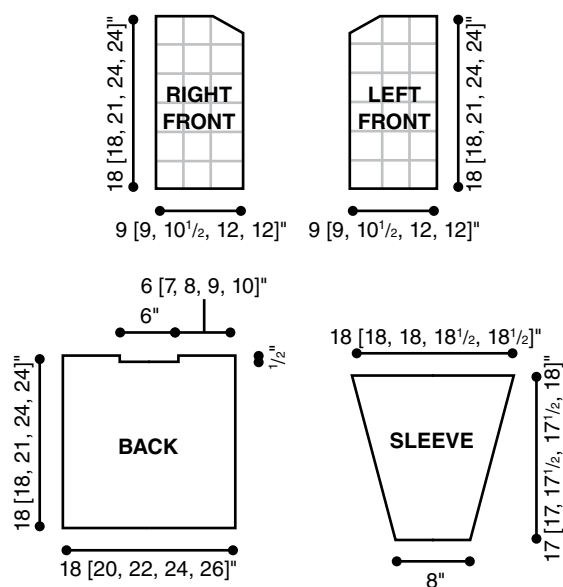
SLEEVE TRIM

Make 2.

Rnd 1 (RS): Join cherry splash in Sleeve seam, ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

JACKET TRIM

Rnd 1 (RS): Join winter blue at center back neckline, ch 1, reverse sc in each st around outer edge of Jacket, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

FINISHED SIZE

35 inches square

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic size 10 crochet cotton (350 yds per ball):
4 balls #310 copper mist
1 ball #423 maize
- Size 6/1.80mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Square = 6¾ inches; rnds 1–3 of Flower = 2¾ inches; 2 shell rnds = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and ch 3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain 3 unless otherwise stated.

Join Center Motifs as work progresses, joining 3 rows of 3 Motifs. Join rem 16 Flower Motifs around outer edge of Center Motifs.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Single crochet shell (sc shell): (3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in indicated st or sp.

Shell: (4 dc, ch 3, 4 dc) in indicated st or sp.

Beginning shell (beg shell): (Ch 6, 4 dc) in indicated st or sp.

Triple shell (tr shell): (2 tr, ch 3, 2 tr) in indicated st or sp.

Beginning triple shell (beg tr shell): (Ch 7, 2 tr) in same st or sp.

3-double crochet cluster (3-dc cl): [Yo hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

Beg 3-double crochet cluster (beg 3-dc cl): Ch 3, [yo hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

4 double crochet cluster (4-dc cl): [Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 4 times, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

Picot: Ch 4, sl st in indicated dc.

TOPPER

CENTER MOTIFS

First Center Motif

Rnd 1 (RS): With copper mist, ch 8, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 23 dc in ring, join in beg ch-3. (24 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 7 (see *Pattern Notes*), [tr in each of next 2 dc, ch 3] 11 times, ending with tr in last dc, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7, sl st in next ch-3 sp. (24 tr, 12 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: Beg tr shell (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-3 sp, [tr shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp] 11 times, ending with tr in beg ch-3 sp, join in 4th

ch of beg ch-7, sl st in next ch-3 sp. (12 tr shells)

Rnd 4: Beg 3-dc cl (see *Special Stitches*), (ch 5, **3-dc cl**—see *Special Stitches*) twice in same ch-3 sp, [(3-dc cl, ch 5) twice, 3-dc cl in next ch-3 sp] 11 times, join in beg 3-dc cl, sl st in next 2 chs. (36 cls, 24 ch sps)

Rnd 5: Ch 6 (see *Pattern Notes*), 4 dc in next ch sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 4 times, ch 5**, 4 dc in next ch sp, ch 3, 4 dc in next ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-6, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, sl st in next 2 chs. (4 ch-3 sps, 32 dc, 20 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 6: Beg shell (see *Special Stitches*) in corner ch-3 sp, *ch 2, **4-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next 4 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] twice, ch 5, dc in next ch sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] twice, ch 5, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, ch 2**, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sp as beg shell, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, sl st in next 2 chs. (8 cls, 24 ch-5 sps, 4 corner shells)

Rnd 7: Beg shell, *ch 2, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] twice, 7 dc in next ch-5 sp, dc in next dc, 7 dc in next ch-5 sp, [sc in next ch sp, ch 5] twice, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, ch 2**, shell in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sp as beg ch-6, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, sl st in next 2 chs. (4 dc fans, 4 corner shells, 16 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 8: Beg shell, *ch 2, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] twice, [ch 5, sk next 3 dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, [ch 5, sc

in next ch sp] twice, ch 5, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, ch 2**, shell in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sp as beg ch-6, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, sl st in next 2 chs. (4 corner shells, 32 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 9: Beg shell, *ch 2, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, [ch 5, sc in next

ch sp] 8 times, ch 5, 4-dc cl in next 4 dc, ch 2**, shell in next corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sp as beg ch-6, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (4 corner shells, 36 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in same st, *sc shell (see *Special Stitches*) in

corner ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 3, sc in each of next 2 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 9 times, ch 5, sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 3**, sc in each of next 2 dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in next sc, join in beg sc.

FINISHED SIZE

44 x 55 inches, excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein):
2 skeins each #365 coffee and #332 ranch red
1 skein each #505 Aruba sea and #726 coral
- Red Heart With Love medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/370 yds/198g per skein):
1 skein #1601 lettuce
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

5 sc and 4 ch-1 sps across = 3 inches; rows 1–6 = 3 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Except for repeats of first ranch red row after beginning row, start all color changes with right side facing.

Work pattern on each side of center as indicated.

Always leave a 7-inch length of yarn when beginning and fastening off a row to tie into Fringe.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Shell: 7 dc in indicated st or sp.

Treble crochet decrease (tr dec): Yo hook twice, draw up a lp in each of next 2 ch-1 sps



(5 lps on hook), yo, draw through 3 lps on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice.

THROW

Row 1 (WS): With ranch red, ch 194, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk 1 ch, sc in next ch] across, turn. (193 sts)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next 3 sts, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, sk next 3 sts, sc in next sc] across, turn. (24 shells, 25 sc)

With opposite side of foundation ch facing, draw up a lp of ranch red in first ch, ch 1, sc in same ch as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk 1 ch, sc in next ch] across, turn. (193 sts)

Rep row 2. (24 shells, 25 sc)

Note: From this point on rep each row on each side of center foundation ch as work progresses.

Row 3 (RS): Draw up a lp of Aruba sea in first sc, ch 1, sc in same sc, *ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next center dc of next shell, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, fasten off.

Row 4 (RS): Draw up a lp of lettuce in first ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next ch-1 sp**, ch 1, sk next sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 ch-1 sps, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in last ch-1 sp. Fasten off.

Row 5 (RS): With coral rep row 4.

Row 6 (RS): Draw up lp of coffee in first ch-1 sp, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), *tr in next sc, dc in next ch-1 sp, hdc in next sc, sc in next ch-2 sp, hdc in next sc, dc in next ch-1 sp, tr in next sc, sk center sc, **tr dec** (see *Special Stitches*) in next 2 ch-1 sps, rep from * across, ending with tr in last ch-1 sp. Fasten off.

Row 7 (WS): Draw up lp of ranch red in first tr, ch 1, sc in same tr as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn. (97 sc, 96 ch-1 sps)

Rows 8–43: [Rep rows 2–7 consecutively] 6 times.

Row 44: Rep row 2.

Row 45 (WS): Rep row 3, turn, **do not fasten off.**

Row 46 (RS): Ch 1, sc in first ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next ch-1 sp**, ch 1, sk next sc, sc dec in next 2 ch-1 sps, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in last ch-1 sp. Fasten off.

FRINGE

Cut 14-inch lengths of yarn to match ends of rows. Add 1 length where there is a tail and 2 where there is none. Add lengths of yarn to end of tr rows at top of tr over post of tr and in bottom of tr. Draw lengths through, fold in half and tie in an overhand knot. Trim Fringe to measure 5 inches.

FINISHED SIZE

9 x 27 inches, excluding Twigs

MATERIALS

- Brown Sheep Co. Lamb's Pride bulky (chunky) weight wool/mohair yarn (4 oz/125 yds/13g per skein):
2 skeins M260 cafe au lait (A)
1 skein each #M08 wild oak (B) and #M10 creme (C)
- Size L/11/8mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Long sewing needle
- Brown sewing thread
- Color-catching laundry sheets
- Straight pins

GAUGE

9 sc = 4 inches; 11 sc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Stripe pattern is worked to center and then reversed to mirror first half.

RUNNER

Row 1: With A, ch 23, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (22 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 3, change color to C in last st.

Row 5: Rep row 3.

Row 6: Rep row 3, change color to A in last st.

Rows 7–37: Rep row 3, maintaining stripe color pattern. Row 37 will be worked with A.

Row 38: Continuing with A, rep row 3, change color to C in last st.

Row 39: Rep row 3.

Row 40: Rep row 3, change color to B in last st.

Row 41: Rep row 3.

Row 42: Rep row 3, change color to A in last st, turn.

Row 43: Rep row 3.

Rows 44–74: Rep row 3 maintaining stripe color pattern. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

TWIGS

Make 12 Twigs each with A.

Twig 1: Ch 8, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 2 chs, ch 5, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 7 chs, leaving 1-inch length. Fasten off.

Twig 2: Ch 11, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 2 chs, ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 5 chs, ch 6, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in

each of next 8 chs, leaving 1-inch length. Fasten off.

Twig 3: Ch 10, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 2 chs, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 4 chs, ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 5 chs, leaving 1-inch length. Fasten off.

Twig 4: Ch 11, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 4 chs, ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 5 chs, ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 4 chs, leaving 1-inch length. Fasten off.

Twig 5: Ch 8, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 2 chs, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 2 chs, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next 4 chs, leaving 1-inch length. Fasten off.

FELTING

Beg felting Runner by hand in hot soapy water, changing the water often and using 2 color-catching laundry sheets as there will be some color bleeding at first.

The Runner “relaxes” or grows at first, and then will beg to felt. After it beg to felt, rinse and finish the process in the

washing machine and add another color-catching sheet in the machine.

Beg to felt the Twigs separately by hand since they are all crocheted with A. Once they beg to felt, place them in a large mesh bag and add them to the washing machine with the Runner.

Turn the spin cycle off to avoid creasing the project. Dry the Runner by rolling it in a towel and pressing out excess moisture, then pin to shape and allow to finish drying.

Twigs can be shaped and manipulated while wet. Snip rem ends at an angle.

FINISHING

Using photo as a guide, position Twigs around outer edge and secure with straight pins. With long sewing needle and brown thread, sew Twigs to outer edge of Runner, removing straight pins as work progresses. **CW**

- Sizes F/5/3.75mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 1½-inch dark green buttons: 2

GAUGE

Size H hook: 7 hdc = 2 inches;

5 hdc rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

BABY FRANKIE

HEAD BACK

Row 1: With size H hook and lettuce, ch 36, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (35 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Rows 3–27: Rep row 2. At the end of row 27, fasten off.

HEAD FRONT

Rows 1–25: Rep rows 1–26 of Head Back.

Row 26: Rep row 2 of Head Back, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to black in last hdc, fasten off lettuce, turn.

Hair

Row 27: Rep row 2 of Head Back.

Row 28: *Ch 9, dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), dc in each of next 4 chs, leaving next ch unworked**, sk next 2 hdc of row 27, sl st in front lp (see *Stitch Guide*) of next hdc, rep from * 11 times, ending last rep at **. Fasten off. (12 hair sections)

EYEBROW

Make 2.

Row 1: With size F hook and violet, ch 6, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

NOSE

Row 1: With size F hook and violet, ch 4, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in next ch, turn. (3 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in last hdc, turn. (5 hdc)

Rows 4–6: Rep row 2.

Rnd 7: Now working in rnds, ch 1, working in ends of rows 6–1, work 7 sc across edge, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, work 3 sc across top of Nose, ch 1, working in ends of rows 1–6, work 7 sc across edge, sl st in top of beg ch-2 of row 6, sl st in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, 2 dc in next st, ch 3, sl st in next st. Fasten off. (23 sts)

FIRST VIOLET EAR

Row 1: With size F hook, join violet to left side of Head Front at end of row 14 with sc, work 6 more sc evenly sp in ends of rows 13–9, turn. (7 sc)

Rows 2–4: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (13 sc)

Rows 5–9: Ch 1, sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*), in first 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. At the end of row 9, fasten off. (5 sc)

2ND VIOLET EAR

Row 1: With size F hook, join violet to right side of Head Front at end of row 9 with sc, work 6 more sc evenly sp in ends of rows 10–14, turn. (7 sc)

Rows 2–9: Rep rows 2–9 of First Violet Ear.

FIRST LETTUCE EAR

Row 1: With size F hook, join lettuce to left side of Head Back at end of row 14 with sc, work 6 more sc evenly sp in ends of rows 13–9, turn. (7 sc)

Rows 2–9: Rep rows 2–9 of First Violet Ear.

2ND LETTUCE EAR

Row 1: With size F hook, join



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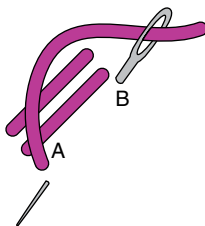


with WS tog (*rem free lp of row 3 on outer edge*), fold handle in half lengthwise, working through both thicknesses, ch 1, work 35 sl sts across first long edge, ch 1, work 3 sc through both thicknesses across short end, ch 1, working in rem free lps of row 2, sl st in each of next 35 sts, ch 1, work 3 sc through both thicknesses across short end, ch 1, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Using photo as a guide, thread tapestry needle with length of black yarn, sew green buttons centered over row 19 of Head Front for eyes.

For forehead scar, embroider a straight line over rows 19–23 and embroider 3 **straight sts** (*see illustration*) sp unevenly across.



Straight Stitch

With white, sew Cheeks to Front Head over rows 15 and 16 with 4¼-inch sp between Cheeks.

Insert an end of Mouth through center of each Cheek and secure Mouth ch on WS of Head Front.

Sew remainder of Mouth to Head Front with center bottom of Mouth on row 6 of Head Front. With length of violet, embroider 3 “X” sts evenly sp. Embroider 2 straight sts between “X” sts.

Sew Nose centered below button eyes. Sew Eyebrows at a slight angle above button eyes.

With length of lettuce, sew a Handle to each Head Front and Back centered at top edge.

lettuce to right side of Head Back at end of row 9 with sc, work 6 more sc evenly sp in ends of rows 10–14, turn. (7 sc)

Rows 2–9: Rep rows 2–9 of First Violet Ear.

MOUTH

Row 1: With size H hook and black, ch 60, leaving 14-inch length, fasten off.

CHEEKS

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With size F hook and white, ch 3, 10 hdc in first ch of beg ch-3, join in top of first hdc, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. (10 hdc)

HANDLE

Make 2.

Row 1: With size H hook and lettuce, ch 36, hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (35 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Row 3: Working in **back lp** (*see Stitch Guide*), ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Rnd 5: Now working in rnds,

JOINING FRONT & BACK

With size H hook, with WS of Head Front and Back tog with Head Front facing and working through both thicknesses, join lettuce at top edge with sc, sc evenly sp to bottom edge, working (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in corner st, sc in each st across bottom edge, (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in corner st, sc evenly sp top edge. Fasten off.

SCAREDY CAT

HEAD BACK

Row 1: With size H hook and black, ch 36, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (35 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in each hdc across, turn.

Rows 3–27: Rep row 2. At the end of row 27, fasten off.

HEAD FRONT

Rows 1–27: Rep rows 1–27 of Head Back.

EAR

Make 2 each black & lilac.

Row 1: Beg at bottom edge with size H hook, ch 8, hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (7 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2, **hdc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 hdc, hdc in each of next 2 hdc, hdc dec in next 2 hdc, turn. (5 hdc)

Row 3: Ch 2, [hdc dec in next 2 hdc] twice, turn. (3 hdc)

Row 4: Ch 2, hdc dec in next 2 hdc. Fasten off. (2 hdc)

Joining

Rnd 1: With size H hook, holding 1 each lilac and black Ears WS tog and working through both thicknesses, join black with sl st in bottom edge, ch 1, work 7 sc evenly sp across bottom edge, ch 1, work 6 sc evenly sp up edge to tip of Ear, (sc, dc, sc)

in tip of Ear, work 6 sc down opposite edge of Ear, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (22 sts)

Rep with rem Ears.

EYE

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With size F hook and white, ch 3, 10 hdc in first ch of beg ch-3, join in top of first hdc, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off. (10 hdc)

NOSE

Row 1: With size F hook and mango, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (4 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, [sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] twice, turn. (2 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, do not turn. (1 sc)

Rnd 4: Now working in rnds,

ch 1, work 3 sc across ends of rows 3–1, ch 1, working on opposite side of foundation ch, work 5 sc, ch 1, work 3 sc across ends of rows 1–3, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (11 sc)

HANDLE

Make 2.

Rows 1–4: With size H hook and black, rep rows 1–4 of Handle of Baby Frankie.

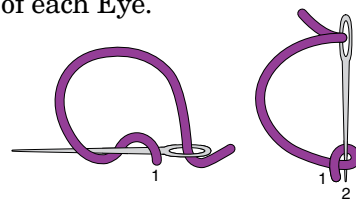
Rnd 5: Rep rnd 5 of Handle of Baby Frankie.

FINISHING

Using photo as a guide, thread tapestry needle with length of black and sew Ears at a slight angle between rows 25–27 of Head Front. Sew a Handle to each Head Front and Back centered at top edge.

Sew Eyes to Head Front over rows 17 and 18 approximately

1¼ inches apart. With length of black, embroider a **French knot** (see illustration) to center of each Eye.

With length of mango, sew Nose below Eyes centered over rows 13–16.

JOINING FRONT & BACK

With size H hook, with WS of Head Front and Back tog with Head Front facing and working through both thicknesses, join black at top edge with sc, sc evenly sp to bottom edge, working (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in corner st, sc in each st across bottom edge, (2 sc, ch 1, 2 sc) in corner st, sc evenly sp to top edge. Fasten off. **cw**

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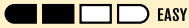

WIG

FOUNDATION

Rnd 1: With A, ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 20 chs, turn, **do not fasten off until indicated.** (40 sc)

FRONT WIG CURLS

Row 2: Now working in rows, sl st in first sc, [ch 15, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, sl st in next sc] rep until 20 curls are completed, ending with sl st in ch-1 sp at end of Foundation.

FIRST SIDE CURL

Row 3: Ch 21, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch

across, sl st in same sp on Foundation, ch 26, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, sl st in next sc.

BACK WIG CURLS

Row 4: [Ch 41, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, sl st in next sc] rep until 20 curls are completed.

2ND SIDE CURL

Row 5: Ch 26, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, sl st in same sp, ch 21, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, sl st in same sp. Fasten off.

HIGHLIGHT CURL

Make 2.

Row 1: With B, ch 41, 2 sc in

2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in each rem ch across, leaving 4-inch length, fasten off.

FINISHING

Thread tapestry needle with length of A, position Foundation of Wig on center top of hat and sew to hat.

Turn brim edge of hat upward 2 inches, working on Front Wig Curls, starting from center and working outward on each side, position first Curls flat on front of hat and sew in place to edge of turned up brim portion of hat, leaving rem of Curl free. Continue until all Front Wig Curls are sewn to hat. Sew First and 2nd Side Curls to hat in same manner.

Do not sew the Back Wig Curls to the hat.

Sew the Highlight Curls to right edge of Foundation approximately 1 inch up from edge. **CW**



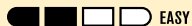

Row 1: Leaving a 10-inch length at beg, ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (20 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1 (see Pattern Notes), working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st for remainder of Scarf, sc in each of next 7 sts, turn. (8 sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 7 sts, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sts, turn. (6 sts)

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sts, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (4 sts)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in next 19 sts as follows: sc in next 3 sts,

[stair-step down 1 row, sc in next 2 sts] twice, sc in rem 12 sts across, turn. (20 sts)

Rep rows 2–8 until Scarf measures 44 inches. Leaving a 10-inch length, fasten off.

With rem beg length, sew ends tog to form a closed U-shaped seam. Sew ends tog on opposite end of Scarf in same manner. **CW**

Rnd 22: [Fpdc around next fpdc, bpdc around next bpdc] around. (26 sts)

Rnd 23: Rep rnd 22, sl st to join in first fpdc. Fasten off. (26 sts)

Rnds 1 & 2: With size F hook and 1 strand red-violet, rep rnds 1 and 2 of Her Cozy. (10 sc)



Rnd 3: [Ch 5, sk next sc, sl st in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of next sc] 5 times, ending last sl st in front lp at base of first ch-5. Fasten off. (5 ch lps)

Rnd 4: Join 1 strand of white with sl st in back lp of first ch-5 lp of rnd 3, [ch 5, sl st in back lp of next st] 10 times. Fasten off. (10 ch-5 lps)

LEAF

Rnd 1: With size H hook and 1 strand of dark leaf green, ch 2, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **do not join rnds**. (3 sc)

Rnd 2: [Sc, ch 3, sc] in each sc around. (6 sc, 3 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3: [(Sc, hdc, dc, 2 tr, ch 2, 2 tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-3 spl] twice, sc in last ch-3 sp. Fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Thread tapestry needle with length of white, center Flower over Leaf and button centered on top of Flower. Position on rnd 18 or as desired and sew through button to attach to

Cozy. Secure ends at back. Fasten off.

Rnds 1–13: With size H hook and dark royal blue, **holding 2 strands tog** (see *Pattern Notes*), rep rnds 1–13 of Her Cozy, at the end of rnd 13, change color to white. (25 sts)

Rnd 15: Rep rnd 7 of Her Cozy, change color to white.

Rnds 16 & 17: Rep rnds 14 and 15. At the end of rnd 17, change color to dark royal blue.

Rnd 18: Rep rnd 14, change color to white.

Rnd 19: Rep rnd 15, change color to dark royal blue. Fasten off white.

Rnd 20: Rep rnd 14, fasten off 1 strand dark royal blue.

Rnds 21–23: Rep rnds 21–23 of Her Cozy. **cw**

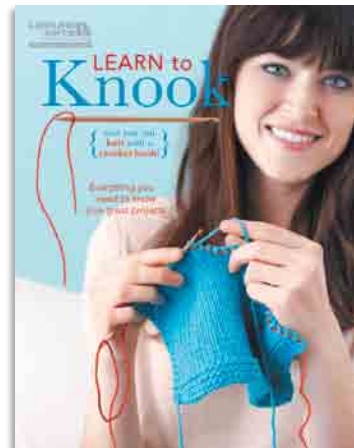

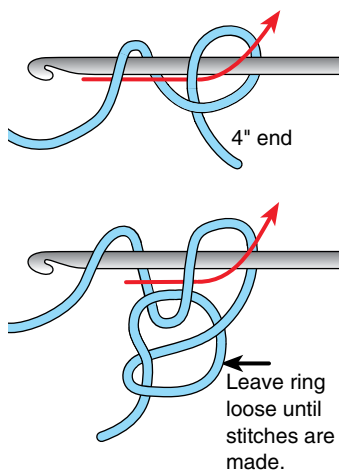

Rnd 9: Ch 1, [hdc in each of next 7 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] around, join in beg hdc. (72 hdc)

Rnd [10]: Ch 1, [hdc in each of next 8 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] around, join in beg hdc. ([80] hdc)

Rnds 10–26 [11–27, 12–28]: Ch 1, hdc in each of next 72 [80, 88] hdc, join in beg hdc. At the end of last rep **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B. Fasten off A.

Rnd 27 [28, 29]: With B, ch 1, working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) for this rnd only, hdc in each st around, join in beg hdc. (72 [80, 88] hdc)

Rnds 28–43 [29–44, 30–45]: Ch 1, hdc in each hdc around, join in beg hdc.

Rnd 44 [45, 46]: Ch 1, [hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9] hdc, **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 hdc] around, join in beg hdc. (64 [72, 80] hdc)

Rnd 45 [46, 47]: Ch 1, [hdc in each of next 6 [7, 8] hdc, hdc dec in next 2 hdc] around, join in beg hdc. (56 [64, 72] hdc)

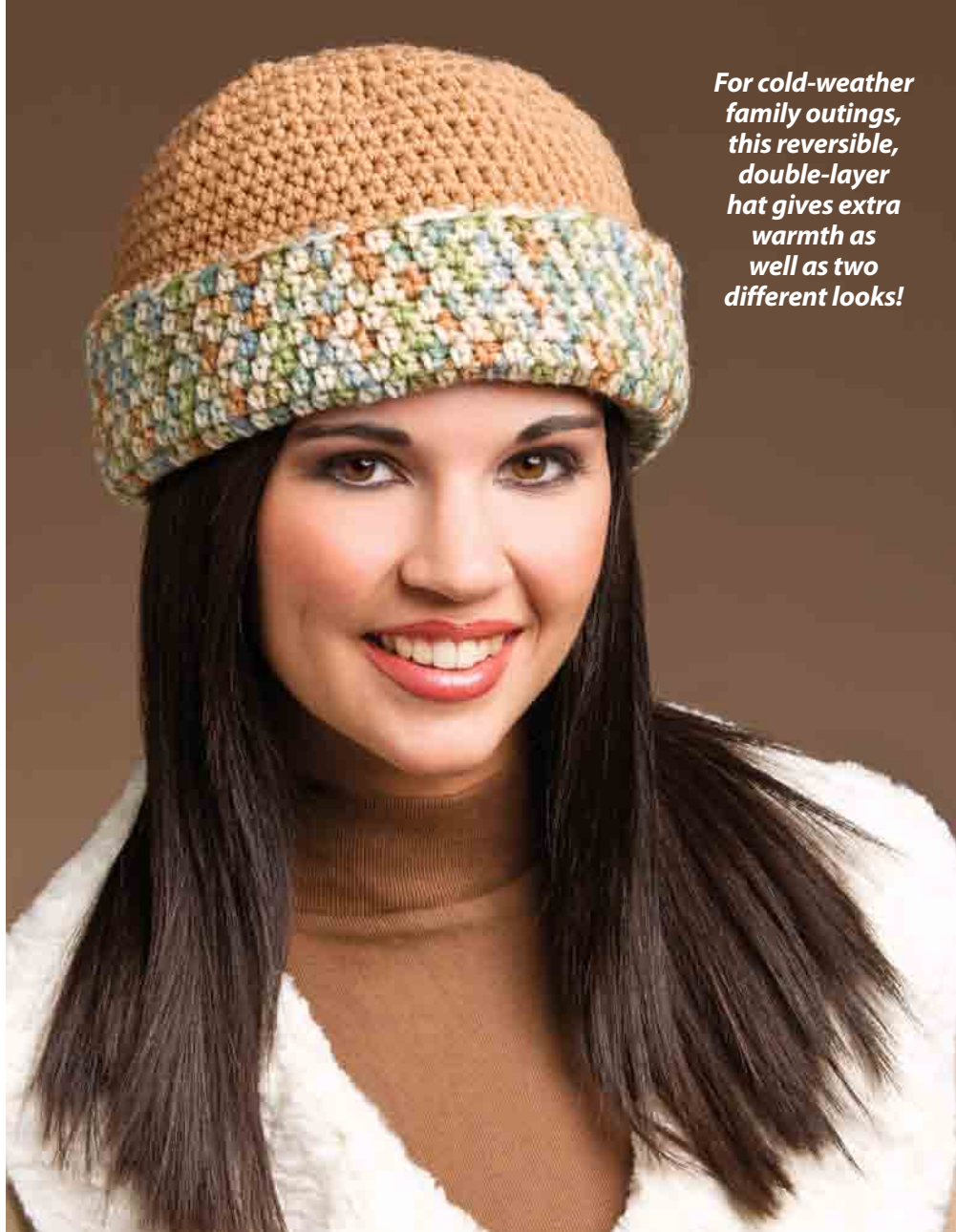
Rnd 46 [47, 48]: Ch 1, [hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7] hdc, hdc dec in next 2 hdc] around, join in beg hdc. (48 [56, 64] hdc)

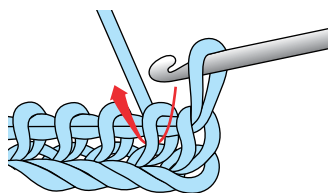

Rnd 3: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, (5 dc, ch 5, 5 dc) in next ch-3 sp (corner shell)***, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (4 corner shell ch-5 sps, 8 ch-5 sps)

1-SIDED JOINING MOTIF

Rnds 1 & 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Motif.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, (5 dc, ch 5, 5 dc) in next ch-3 sp*, sc in next ch-3 sp [ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, 5 dc in next corner shell, ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp of adjacent corner shell ch-5 sp, ch 2, 5 dc in same ch-5 sp of working Motif, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp of adjacent Motif, ch 2, sc in next ch-5 sp on working Motif] twice, 5 dc in next corner shell, ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp of adjacent corner shell ch-5 sp, ch 2, 5 dc in same ch-5 sp of working Motif, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * to *, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

2-SIDED JOINING MOTIF

Rnds 1 & 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of First Motif.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, (5 dc, ch 5, 5 dc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp [ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, *5 dc in next corner shell, ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp of adjacent corner shell ch-5 sp, ch 2, 5 dc in same ch-5 sp of working Motif**, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 2, sl st in ch-5 sp of adjacent Motif, ch 2, sc in next ch-5 sp on working Motif] twice, rep from *, ending rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Continue making Motifs, joining as work progresses joining in 7 rows of 9 Motifs. **CW**

Row 3: Ch 1 loosely, 3 dc in first dc, *ch 2, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, ch 1**, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in 3rd dc of 3-dc group, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1 loosely, 3 dc in first dc, *ch 3, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] twice**, shell in ch-1 sp of next shell, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in 3rd dc of 3-dc group, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first dc, *ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next ch-3 sp, (ch 1, dc) 4 times in same ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp**, sc in ch-1 sp of shell, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in 3rd dc of 3-dc group, turn.

Rows 6–49: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 11 times.

Row 50: Rep row 2, **do not turn.**

Row 51: Ch 1, working in sc evenly sp across 3 edges only, sc evenly sp in side edge of rows to opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each ch across opposite side of foundation ch, sc evenly sp in side edge of rows to top edge of row 50, ending with sl st to join in first dc. Fasten off.

Rows 11 & 12: Rep row 2.

Row 13: Rep row 3, change color to A in last st.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts] 15 times, change color to C in last st, turn. (91 sts)

Row 15: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next st] 14 times, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, 3 dc in next st, change color to B in last dc, turn. (14 shells, 15 sc, 2 groups 3-dc)

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] 15 times, change color to C in last st, turn. (15 shells, 16 sc)

Row 17: Rep row 15, change color to A in last st.

Row 18: Rep row 14, change color to MC in last st.

Rows 19–25: Rep rows 7–13. At the end of row 13, fasten off.

BASE

Rnd 1 (RS): With MC, ch 36, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 33 chs, 5 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 34 chs, 5 sc in same sc as beg sc, **do not join rnd.** (78 sc)

Rnd 2: Place st marker before first sc, [sc in each sc across working 3 sc in 3rd sc of 5-sc group] twice, sc in rem sc of rnd to st marker. (82 sc)

Rnd 3: Place st marker before first sc, [sc in each sc across to 3-sc group, work 3 sc in center sc] twice, sc in each rem sc to st marker. (86 sc)

Rnd 4: Rep rnd 3. (90 sc)

Rnds 5 & 6: Sc in each sc around. (90)

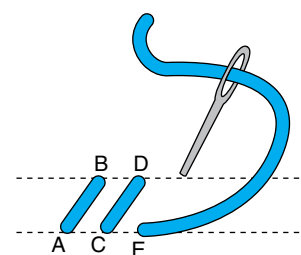
Rnd 1: Attach MC with sl st in any st of row 25 of Body, ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each sc around, join. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Working in opposite side of foundation ch of Body, join MC with sl st, ch 1, reverse sc in each st around, join. Fasten off.

ATTACH HANDLES

Position first wooden handle on

center front of Body over rows 19 and 20. With length of MC, sew ends of handle with **whipstitch** (see *illustration*) to Body. Sew 2nd wooden handle on back of Body in same manner. **CW**

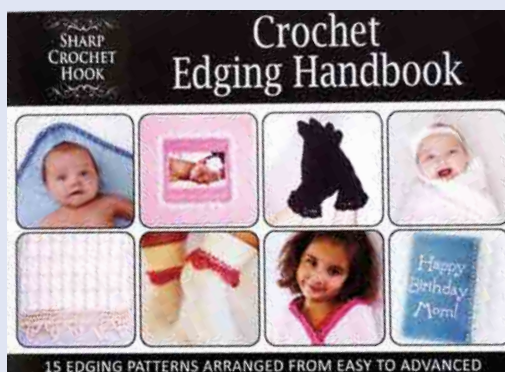

Rnd 5: Join 3rd-color scrap at top of petal lp, ch 6 (*counts as first dc, ch 3*), *sk next 3 dc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in 4th dc of 7-dc group (*corner*), ch 3, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in top of lp, ch 5, sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in top of lp, ch 3, rep from * around, ending with sk next 6 dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. Fasten off. (4 corner ch-2 sps, 8 ch-3 sps, 4 ch-5 sps, 24 dc)

Rnd 6: Join 3rd-color scrap in corner ch-2 sp, ch 5 (*counts as beg dc, ch 2*) dc in same corner ch-2 sp, *ch 4, sk 3 chs, sk next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp between dc, 8 dc in next ch-5 sp, sk next dc, dc in ch-1 sp, ch 4**, sk next 3 chs, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. Fasten off.

Rnd 7: Join 4th-color scrap in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same corner ch-2 sp, *dc

in next dc, 4 dc in next ch-4 sp, dc in each of next 10 dc, 4 dc in next ch-4 sp, dc in next dc**, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (96 dc, 4 ch-2 corner sps)

Rnd 8: Join denim in corner ch-2 sp, (ch 3, 1 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same corner sp, *dc in each dc across to next corner ch-2 sp**, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg ch-3. (112 dc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 9: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, working (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (128 dc, 4 ch-2 sps)

JOINING

With RS facing, alternating Motifs and working through both thicknesses, join denim in corner ch-2 sp, sl st Motifs tog across edge, ending with last sl st in next corner ch-2 sp. Fasten off. Continue joining until all 11 Motifs are joined tog in a strip.

FRINGE

Fringe is worked on each end of Scarf, working 1 in each of 2 corner ch-2 sps and 11 evenly



sp across end, [cut 3 lengths of denim each 12 inches long, fold 3 strands in half, insert hook in st and draw strands through at fold to form a lp on hook, draw cut ends through lp on hook, pull gently to secure] rep across each end of Scarf. Trim ends even. **CW**

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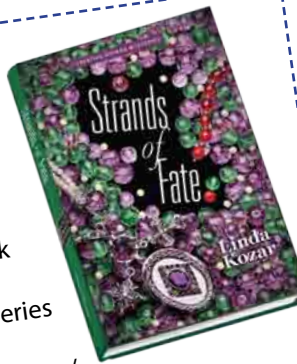

Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in same st, 3 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in adjacent ch-3 corner sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same corner ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, sc in adjacent ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in each of next 2 dc, [ch 2, sc in adjacent ch-5 sp, ch 2, sc in next ch-5 sp on working Motif] 9 times, ch 2, sc in next ch-5 sp on adjacent Motif, ch 2, sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, sc in adjacent ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in each of next 2 dc, 3 sc in next corner sp, ch 1, sc in adjacent corner sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same corner sp (1-sided joining), *sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 3, sc in each of next 2 dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 9 times, ch 5, sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 3**, sc

in each of next 2 dc, sc shell in corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in next sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Note: When joining 2 sides of Motif to adjacent Motifs, simply rep the joining section twice.

FLOWER MOTIFS

Rnd 4: Join copper mist with sl st in any ch-4 sp of picot, [(3-dc cl, ch 5) twice, 3-dc cl in picot] 12 times, join in beg 3-dc cl, sl st in next 2 chs. (36 cls, 24 ch-5 sps)



Rnds 5–9: Rep rnds 5–9 of First Center Motif.

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 10 of 1-Sided Joining.

2nd–16th Flower Motifs

Rnds 1–10: Rep rnds 1–10 of First Flower Motif.

EDGING

Rnd 1 (RS): Join copper mist in any corner ch-3 sp of sc shell, ch 1, sc shell in same corner ch-3 sp, *ch 3, sc shell in next ch sp, ch 2, [sc shell in next ch-5 sp] 10 times, ch 2, sc shell in next ch sp, ch 3, sc shell in junctions of Motifs, rep from * around, working sc shell in each of the rem 3 corner ch sps, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **cw**

Row 3 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc

and each ch-1 sp across. Fasten off. (49 sc)

Rows 4 & 5: With mallard, rep rows 4 and 5 of Side Stripes.

Rows 6 & 7: With khaki, rep rows 6 and 7 of Side Stripes.

Rows 8–10: With lettuce, rep rows 8–10 of Side Stripes.

Rows 11 & 12: With mallard, rep rows 11 and 12 of Side Stripes.

Working on opposite edge of Center Square and each end of Side Stripes, rep rows 1–12 of Top and Bottom Stripes.

PILLOW FORM COVER

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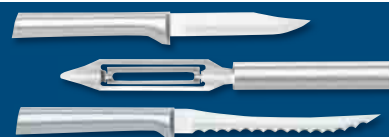

Rnd 4: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), *hdc in next dc, sc in each of next 2 dc, hdc in next hdc, dc in next sc, hdc in next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, hdc in next dc, dc in next sc, hdc in next dc, sc in each of next 2 dc, hdc in next dc, dc in next dc (dc, tr, ch 2, tr, dc) in next sc, hdc in next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, hdc in next dc, (dc, tr, ch 2, tr, dc) in next sc**, dc in next sc, rep from *, ending rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (56 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 1 sc in each st around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc, turn, sl st in next sc.

Rnd 6 (WS): Ch 1, sc in sc, ch 1, sk 1 sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, *ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * around, working at each rem 3 corners ch 1, sk 1 sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Top & Bottom Stripes

Row 1 (RS): Draw up a lp of clover in corner ch-2 sp of Center Rectangle, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across, ending with sc in next corner ch-2 sp, turn. (27 sc)

Row 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 3 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across. Fasten off. (27 sc)

Row 4 (RS): Draw up a lp of mallard in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5 (WS): Rep row 2. Fasten off.

Row 6 (RS): Draw up a lp of khaki in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across, turn.

Row 7 (WS): Rep row 2. Fasten off.

Row 8 (RS): Draw up a lp of clover in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across, turn.

Row 9 (WS): Rep row 2.

Row 10 (RS): Rep row 3. Fasten off.

Row 11 (RS): Draw up a lp of mallard in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 12 (WS): Rep row 2. Fasten off.

Working on opposite edge of Center Rectangle, rep rows 1–12.

Side Stripes

Row 1 (RS): Draw up a lp of

lettuce in end of row 12 on either Top or Bottom Stripe, ch 1, sc in each of rows 12–1, sc in corner ch-2 sp, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across Center Rectangle, sc in next corner ch-2 sp, sc in each of rows 1–12, turn. (39 sc)

Row 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 3 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp across. Fasten off. (39 sc)

Rows 4 & 5: With boysenberry, rep rows 4 and 5 of Top & Bottom Stripes.

Rows 6 & 7: With khaki, rep rows 6 and 7 of Top & Bottom Stripes.

Rows 8–10: With lettuce, rep rows 8–10 of Top & Bottom Stripes.

Rows 11 & 12: With boysenberry, rep rows 11 and 12 of Top & Bottom Stripes.

Working on opposite edge of Center Rectangle and each end of Top and Bottom Stripes, rep rows 1–12 of Side Stripes.

PILLOW FORM COVER

With sewing machine or by hand, sew 13 x 17-inch squares of felt tog on 3 sides, insert pillow form and sew across rem edge.

BORDER

Rnd 1: Draw up a lp of khaki in any corner st of 1 Pillow Side, ch 1, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in corner st, sc in each st across edge, rep from * around outer edge, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rep rnd 1 on 2nd Pillow Side, do not fasten off.

Rnd 2: Holding WS of Pillow Sides tog and working through both thicknesses, ch 1, *(sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, sc in each sc across edge, rep from * around, inserting covered pillow form before closing. Fasten off. **CW**

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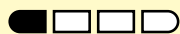
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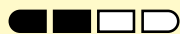

Rnd 11: With A, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnds 12–17: Rep rnds 1–6 of Checkerboard.

Rnd 18: With A, rep rnd 4.

Rnd 19: With C, rep rnd 4.

Rnd 20: With D, rep rnd 4.

SIZING

Note: A good estimate on the foot area is where the sock size is determined. Work more rnds for long foot or less rows for smaller foot. A good estimate is to stop when the sock reaches $\frac{1}{2}$ inch short of the base of the toes, remembering that socks fit with negative ease, which means that they stretch when put on.

Rnds 21–28: Join B, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 29: Join D, rep rnd 4.

TOES

Rnd 30: Center joining seam on bottom of foot, fold Sock so that 18 sts are on top and 18 sts are on the bottom. Place a st marker at these points. Join C at marker on right, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc, turn. (36 sc)

Rnd 31: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each sc to next marker, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each rem sc around, join in beg sc, turn. (34 sc)

Rnd 32–40: Rep rnd 31. At the end of rnd 40 a total of 16 sc rem, 8 on top and 8 on bottom. Leaving 12-inch length of C, fasten off.

Turn Sock inside out, matching sts, sew Toe seam tog. Turn Sock right side out. **CW**

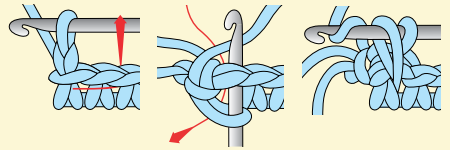
Treble crochet

decrease (tr dec): Holding back last lp of each st, tr in each of the sts indicated, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

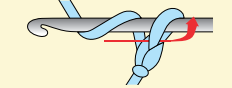
