FINISHED MEASUREMENT

12½ inches in diameter

MATERIALS

- DMC Pearl Cotton size 5 crochet cotton (27 yds per skein):
2 skeins #208 purple
1 skein each #554 lavender, #971 orange, #907 green, #312 dark blue and #727 yellow
- Size 1/2.25mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle
- Stitch markers
- Drafting compass (*optional*)
- Fabric-marking pen
- Pressing cloth
- 8-inch-square paper or cardboard
- ⅓ yd purple cotton or polyester fabric

GAUGE

Small circle, 14 dc = ⅞ inch in diameter; 10 tr = 1¼ inches; 3 sc and 1 tr rnds = ¾ inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

It is important to keep crocheted edge flat; add decreases or increases if work begins to ruffle or cup.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

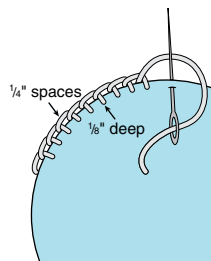
Blanket stitch: Thread needle with 2–3-foot length of green, anchor crochet cotton inside doubled fabric. Bring up needle in seam between layers. *Working left to right, insert needle down through both layers of fabric ¼ inch to right of where needle came up and ⅛ inch deep (*from outside to inside circle*). After pulling crochet cotton part way through, bring needle up under length of crochet cotton coming from point of attachment (*see illustration*). This will catch the crochet cotton and create an L-shaped embroidery stitch. Pull

gently until stitch is snug, rep from * around circle. Fasten off.



Blanket Stitch

MAT

FABRIC CENTER

Cut paper or cardboard circle 7 1/4 inches in diameter for template. (If using a drafting compass, radius of circle is 3 3/8 inches.)

This template is the size of the cloth circle that will be stitched and crocheted around. Double over your fabric, with right sides facing each other. Lay template on fabric and mark edges lightly. Add 1/4-inch seam allowance around circle and cut circles from fabric on outer line. By hand or machine, sew fabric circles tog, following inner marking on fabric circle, leaving about 1 inch unsewn. Notch edges of seam allowance every inch so that when circles are turned right side out piece will rem flat. Turn inside out, so seam allowance is on inside. Use crochet hook to push out edge from inside to get close to stitching line. Folding raw edges of opening inward, sew seam closed.

Work **blanket stitch** (see *Special Stitch*) around outer edge of Fabric Center.

CROCHET EDGING

Rnd 1: With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) green in any blanket st, ch 1, working 2 or 3 sc in each blanket st, work 154 sc sts around, join in first sc, **do not fasten off**.

Rnd 2: Place a st marker every 22 sts around circle (7 markers),

*[sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep from * to st marker, do not work that st, ch 8, sk next 6 sts including marked st, sc in next sc, continue to rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (7 ch-8 sps)

Rnd 3: [Join green 2 sc before ch-8 lp, sc in same sc, sc in next sc, work 15 dc over ch-8 lp, sc in each of next 2 sc. Fasten off] 7 times. (7 dc arches)

Rnd 4: Join lavender in last sc before arch, ch 1, [sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) over sc and first dc of arch, sc in each of next 13 dc of arch, sc dec in next dc and next sc, sc in each sc across to last sc before next arch] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 5: Join yellow anywhere in valley (sp between arches), **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), tr in each st around, working [tr in next st, 2 tr in next st] 3 times over center top of each arch, join in beg ch-4. Fasten off.

TRIADS

Rnd 6: With orange, make 7 triads each of 3 circles. For each circle, leaving 2-inch length at beg, ch 4, 13 dc in first ch of ch-4 (3 sk chs counts as first dc), join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off. (14 dc)

Pull rem beg length to tighten center hole, secure. With a length of orange sew first circle to another. Sew 3rd circle evenly between other 2 circles (see *Diagram A on page 8*). Sew triads to center of each valley.

Rnd 7: Join yellow 2 sts to right of orange triad's point of attachment to yellow tr, sc in next tr, sc around triad, sc inc over top as needed to **keep piece flat** (see *Pattern Notes*), work 1 sc in next yellow tr. Fasten off. Rep rnd 7 over each triad.

Rnd 8: Join lavender in 4th sc on right-side edge of any triad, sc in same st, *continue with sc in each st around triad, inc as

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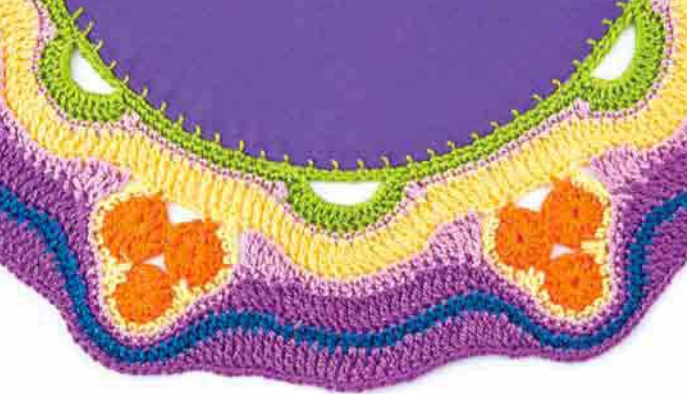
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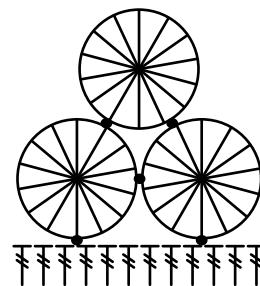


needed over top of point to keep piece flat, continue to sc through 4th sc from left side edge of attachment to match opposite side, sk first yellow tr to left of point of attachment, (see *Diagram B for dec sts*) **dec over next 2 tr as follows: [yo twice, draw up lp from next st, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice (3 lps on hook) [yo, draw through 2 lps] twice, rep from ** once (2 tr-dec made), dc in next tr, hdc in next tr, place st marker in 7th st to right of point of attachment of next triad, continue sc until you come to st marker, hdc in marked st, dc in next st, tr-dec over next 2 sts, tr-dec over next 2 sts, sk last st, sc in 4th sc on right side of triad, rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

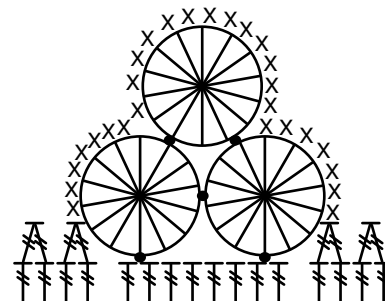
Rnd 9: Join purple at top of triad, sc in each of next 7 sts, *hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, tr in rem sts through tr-dec on right side of next triad, dc in each of next 2 sc, hdc in each of next 2 sc, sc over top and down 7 sts on left side, rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 10: Join dark blue in any st of triad, ch 1, work sc sts over top of each triad and hdc in each rem st between triads, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 11: Working with a slightly tighter tension for a good finished edge, join purple in center of point over any triad, *work 6 sc coming down from top of triad, 2 hdc and 2 dc on side, tr over low places until start of next triad, reverse the order of sts, work 2 dc, 2 hdc on side, sc to top of triad, rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. Steam-block using pressing cloth. Use stiffener and fabric protector if desired. **CW**

Meet the Winner

Diane Lavos

A white cotton “bedspread thread” dress, crocheted by me in 1970 and still in my closet, reminds me how quickly I fell in love with this craft. It was my second or third crochet project, after my first beginner’s vest. I had tried knitting, but found that all the garments I liked in the booming proliferation of needlework magazines were crocheted. If it was loopy, curvy or lacelike, I liked it.

After seeing a pamphlet titled “A Designer’s Way With Crochet,” I began using shapes and forms to make up my own designs. I explored every size hook and thickness of yarn/thread/jute/string, and read *Fiber Arts* magazine. From 1975 to 1985 I sold my crocheted accessories and mandala window hangings through Boulder (Colo.) Arts and Crafts Cooperative—fun but not so profitable for me.

Later, in Massachusetts, I worked as a writer-editor and time for handcrafting was tight. My dreams had to wait in the idea stage. A year ago I took a new look at a wildly colored doily, made of circles and openwork, that I had crocheted years before. It was my prototype for the Fiesta Table Mat.

By refining the design and materials of that early Fiesta project, I made strides toward crochet as an art form that I can teach others. Since joining the Crochet Guild of America and being inspired by published designers, I’m ready to see where my hook and urgent love of design will take me.

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size small; changes for medium and large are in [].

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 18 inches (*small*)
[20 inches (*medium*), 22 inches (*large*)]

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand LB Collection Cotton Bamboo light (light worsted) weight cotton/ rayon from bamboo yarn (3½ oz/245 yds/100g per skein): 1 skein #098 magnolia
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

HEADBAND

Row 1: Ch 64 [70, 76], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 10 [13, 16] chs, [ch 5, sk each of next 5 chs, hdc in next ch] twice, [ch 5, sk each of next 5 chs, dc in next ch] twice, [ch 5, sk each of next 5 chs, hdc in next ch] twice, ch 5, sk each of next 5 chs, sc in each of next 11 [14, 17] chs, turn. (22 [28, 34] sc, 4 hdc, 2 dc, 7 ch-5 sps)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 11 [14, 17] sc, ch 2, hdc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp, ch 5, hdc in 3rd

ch of next ch-5 sp, [ch 5, dc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp] 3 times, [ch 5, hdc in 3rd ch of next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 2, sc in next 11 [14, 17] sc, turn. (22 [28, 34] sc, 4 hdc, 3 dc, 6 ch-5 sps, 2 ch-2 sps)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 11 [14, 17] sc, [ch 5, hdc in 3rd ch of ch-5 sp] twice, [ch 5, dc in 3rd ch of ch-5 sp] twice, [ch 5,

hdc in 3rd ch of ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5, sc in each of next 11 [14, 17] sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (22 [28, 34] sc, 4 hdc, 2 dc, 7 ch-5 sps)

FINISHING

With rem length, sew ends tog overlapping sc sts as needed for perfect fit. **CW**

BEGINNER**

FINISHED MEASUREMENT

19½ inches in diameter

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic size 10 crochet cotton (solids: 350 yds; shaded colors: 300 yds per ball):
1 ball each #930 Monet and #661 frosty green
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Rnds 1–4 = 2¾ inches in diameter;
5 V-st rnds = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning V-stitch (beg V-st):

Sl st in ch-3 sp, **ch 6** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same ch-3 sp.

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 3, dc) in indicated st or sp.

DOILY

CENTER

Rnd 1: With monet, ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 23 dc in ring, join in beg ch-3. (24 dc)

Rnd 2: Beg V-st (see *Special Stitches*) in same dc as joining, sk next dc, [**V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next dc, sk next dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (12 V-sts)

Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, ch 5, [sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5] around, join in beg sc. (12 ch-5 sps, 12 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 3 dc, hdc, sc) in each ch-5 sp around, join in beg sc. (12 scallops)

Rnd 5: Sl st to 2nd dc of next 3-dc group, ch 1, sc in same dc, ch 7, [sc in 2nd dc of next scallop, ch 7] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (12 ch-7 sps)

Rnd 6: Join frosty green in any ch-7 sp, ch 1, (sc, 7 dc, sc) in each ch-7 sp around, join in beg sc. (12 scallops)

Rnd 7: Sl st in each of next 2 dc, beg V-st in same dc as last sl st made, [sk next dc, V-st in next dc] twice, sk next 4 sts, *[V-st in next dc, sk next dc] 3 times, sk next 2 sc and next dc, rep from * around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (36 V-sts)

Rnd 8: Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch sp, V-st in each rem ch-3 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 8.

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 3. Fasten off. (36 ch-5 sps, 36 sc)

Rnd 11: Join monet in any ch-5 sp, ch 1, (sc, 5 dc, sc) in each ch-5 sp around, join in beg sc. (36 scallops)

Rnd 12: Sl st to 2nd dc of next scallop, beg V-st in same dc, sk next dc, V-st in next dc, sk next 4 sts, [V-st in next dc, sk next dc, V-st in next dc, sk next 4 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (72 V-sts)

Rnds 13–15: Rep rnd 8.

Rnd 16: Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch-3 sp, ch 1, [V-st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (72 V-sts, 72 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 17: Rep rnd 16.

Rnd 18: Rep rnd 3. Fasten off.

Rnd 19: Join frosty green in any ch-5 sp, ch 1, (sc, 5 dc, sc) in each ch-5 sp around, join in beg sc. (72 scallops)

Rnd 20: Sl st to 3rd dc of scallop, beg V-st in same dc, ch 2, V-st in 3rd dc of next scallop, ch 2] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (72 V-sts, 72 ch-2 sps)

Rnds 21–24: Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch-3 sp, ch 3, [V-st in

next ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (72 V-sts, 72 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 25: Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch-3 sp, ch 4, [V-st in next ch-3 sp, ch 4] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (72 V-sts, 72 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 26: Rep rnd 25. Fasten off.

Rnd 27: Join monet in any ch-3

sp, (ch 3, dc, ch 5, 2 dc) in same ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-4 sp, [(2 dc, ch 5, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-4 sp] around, join in beg ch-3. (72 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 28: Sl st to next ch-5 sp, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in same ch-5 sp, (ch 3, 2 hdc) 3 times in same ch-5 sp, sc in next sc, [(2 hdc, ch 3) 3 times in

next ch-5 sp, 2 hdc in same ch-5 sp, sc in next sc] around, join in beg ch-2. (576 hdc)

Rnd 29: Sl st to first ch-3 sp, beg in same sp, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in first ch-3 sp, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in 2nd (center) ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in 3rd ch-3 sp] of each group of ch-3 sps around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **CW**

1 2 3 4 5 6 **CONFIDENT
BEGINNER**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

3 x 4¼ inches

MATERIALS

- Omega Metallic Crochet fine (sport) weight thread (.88 oz/ 246 yds/25g per ball): 1 ball #6 pale gold
- Size D/3/3.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- 15mm gold decorative shank button
- 11mm white flat button
- Straight pins
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

[Shell, sc] 2 times = 1½ inches;
9 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: 5 dc in indicated st.

ENVELOPE

Row 1 (RS): Ch 37, 2 dc in 4th

ch from hook (*sk 3 chs count as first dc*), sk each of next 2 chs, sc in next ch, [sk each of next 2 chs, **shell** (*see Special Stitch*) in next ch, sk each of next 2 chs, sc in next ch] 5 times, turn. (*5 shells, 1 half shell, 6 sc*)

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk next 2 dc of shell, sc in next dc, sk next 2 dc, shell in next sc] 5 times, sk next 2 dc, sc in next ch, turn. (*5 shells, 1 half shell, 6 sc*)

Rows 3–32: Rep row 2. At the end of row 32, do not fasten off.

JOINING

Piece will measure 4 inches wide x 6½ inches long.

Join (see *Pattern Notes*)
in side edge of row 10 on
opposite edge of Envelope,
ch 1, working through both
thicknesses, sc evenly sp up
edge, then sc evenly sp across
rows 20–32. Fasten off.
Remove pins.

Place st marker in center st of row 32, join metallic thread in st before marker, ch 7, sl st in st after marker, turn, sl st in each ch and in same st as joining. Fasten off.

FINISHED MEASUREMENT

11 inches tall

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein*):
 - ¾ oz each #672 spring green, #324 bright yellow and #722 pretty 'n pink
 - ½ oz #886 blue, #321 gold, #319 cherry red, #512 turqua, #668 honeydew and #254 pumpkin
 - 1 yd #312 black
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Fiberfill
- Stitch marker

GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise stated. Use stitch marker to mark rounds.

ELEPHANT

HEAD

Rnd 1: Starting at top of Head with spring green, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **place st marker** (see *Pattern Notes*).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 8: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (42 sc)

Rnds 9–17: Rep rnd 6.

Rnd 18: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 19: [Sc in each of next 4 sc,

sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and continue stuffing as work progresses.

Rnd 20: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 21: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 22: [Sc in each of next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around, sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (12 sc)

BODY

Rnds 1–4: With blue, rep Head rnds 1–4. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: *[Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times, sc in each of next 6 sc, rep from * around. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (42 sc)

Rnd 8: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 9: [Sc in each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (48 sc)

Rnds 10–13: Rep rnd 8. At the end of rnd 13, sl st in next st, fasten off.

Rnd 14: Join gold with sc in same sc as sl st, sc in each sc around. (48 sc)

Rnds 15–20: Rep rnd 8. At the end of rnd 20, sl st in next st, fasten off.

Rnd 21: Join cherry red with sc in same sc as sl st, sc in each sc around. (48 sc)

Rnds 22–26: Rep rnd 8.

Rnd 27: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (40 sc)

Rnd 28: [Sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (35 sc)

Rnd 29: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

Stuff Body with fiberfill and continue stuffing as work progresses.

Rnd 30: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 31: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 32: [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (12 sc)

Rnd 33: [Sc dec in next 2 sc] around, sl st in next sc, fasten off. (6 sc)

With rem length, sew Head to rnds 7–15 of Body.

TRUNK

Rnd 1: Starting at tip of Trunk with bright yellow, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around.

Rnds 4 & 5: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (16 sc)

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 3.

Rnds 8–10: Sl st in each of next 7 sts, hdc in each of next 9 sts.

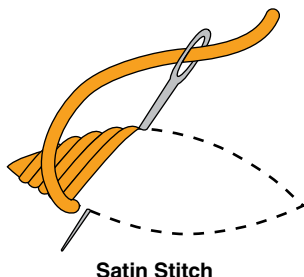

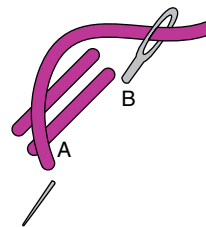

Row 1: With soft ecru, ch 110 (*multiple of 4 sts + 2*), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (109 sc)

Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk first 4 sc, 2 dc in next

sc, [ch 2, sk each of next 3 sc, 2 dc in next sc] across, ending with ch 2, sk each of next 3 sc, hdc in last sc, turn. (26 groups 2-dc, 27 ch-2 sps, 2 hdc)

Row 3: Ch 2, [working over ch-2 sp, work 2 dc 1 row below in 2nd sc of sk sc sts, ch 2, sk each of next 2 dc] across, ending with 2 dc 1 row below in 2nd sc of sk sc, hdc in 2nd ch of ch-4, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to tea rose (*this starts color sequence*), turn. (27 groups 2-dc, 26 ch-2 sps, 2 hdc)

Row 4: Ch 4, [sk each of next 2 dc, working over ch-2 sp, work 2 dc between the 2-dc 1 row below, ch 2] across, ending with hdc in top of ch-2, turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, [working over ch-2 sp, 2 dc between the 2-dc 1 row below, ch 2, sk each of next 2 dc] across, ending with 2 dc over ch-2 sp between the 2 dc 1 row below, hdc in 2nd ch of ch-4, turn. Following color sequence, change color.

Rows 6–209: [Rep rows 4 and 5 alternately] 102 times, maintaining color sequence.

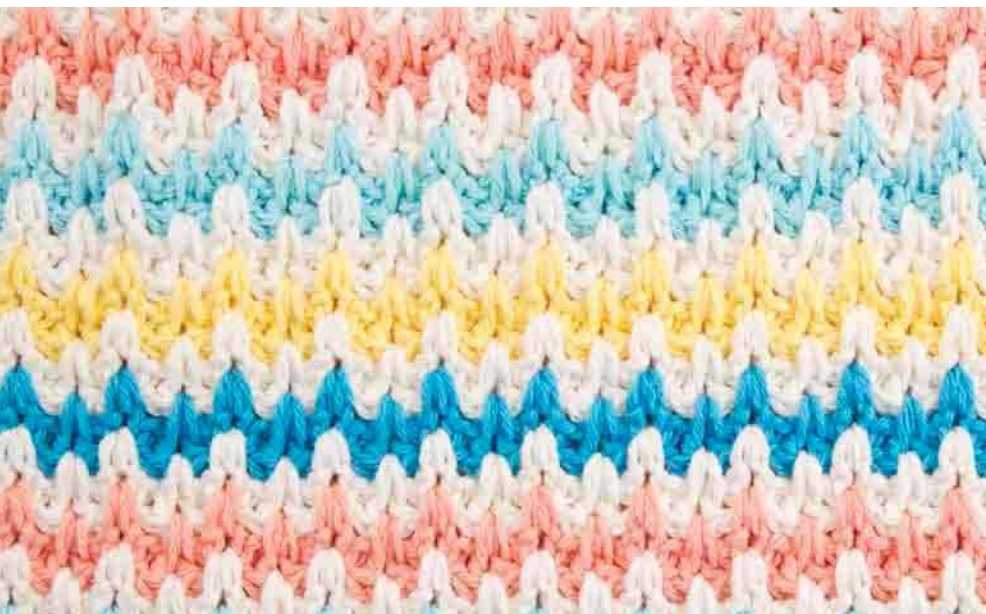
Row 210: Rep row 4.

Row 211: Ch 2, [working over ch-2 sp, work 2 dc between the 2 dc 1 row below, sc in each of next 2 dc] across, ending with sc in 2nd ch of turning ch, do not turn, **do not fasten off**.

Row 2: Sl st in each of next 2 sts, [ch 1, bead ch (see *Special Stitches*), ch 1, sk each of next 3 sts, sl st in next st] 4 times, ch 2, bead ch, ch 2, sk each of next 3 sts, sl st in next st, [ch 2, {bead ch, ch 1} twice, ch 2, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st] twice, [{ch 1, bead ch} 5 times, ch 1, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st] twice, [ch 2, {bead ch, ch 1} twice, ch 2, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st] twice, ch 2, bead ch, ch 2, sk each of next 3 sts, sl st in next st, [ch 1, bead ch, ch 1, sk each of next 3 sts, sl st in next st] 4 times, sl st in each of next 2 sts, ch 6, sl st in bottom of row 1. Fasten off.

Row 3: Thread 23 beads on yarn, working in top of row 1 sts, with WS facing and working behind lps of row 2, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) yarn in 26th st from end, ch 2, [bead ch, ch 1] twice, bead ch, ch 2, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, ch 3, [bead ch, ch 1] twice, bead ch, ch 3, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, [ch 1, bead ch] 3 times, ch 12, slide 5 beads close to hook, yo, draw through lp on hook, [ch 1, bead ch] 3 times, ch 1, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, ch 3, [bead ch, ch 1] twice, bead ch, ch 3, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, ch 2, [bead ch, ch 1] twice, bead ch, ch 2, sk each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With rem beg length, sew button to end of row 1. **cw**

(48 sc, 12 ldc)

Rnds 4–43: Rep rnds 4–43.

TIE

Row 1: With 1 strand each aqua, coral and peach held tog and size E hook, leaving a 1-inch length at beg, ch 80, leaving 1-inch length, fasten off. Knot rem lengths at each end.

Starting at center front, weave Tie through ch-1 sps of rnd 42, tie ends in a bow at center front.

CHAIN

Getting started: Using beading needle, thread all beads on crochet cotton.

Leaving a 2-inch length at beg, ch 1 tightly, draw up lp, remove hook, insert needle threader through half of toggle clasp, thread lp through needle threader, draw back through so that lp is on 1 side of clasp and knot remainder on the other side, with hook, pick up dropped lp and draw lp tightly, ch 1 to secure clasp.

Row 1: Ch 7, [bead ch (see *Special Stitches*), ch 7] 24 times (4 beads rem on crochet cotton), draw up last ch and with needle threader, draw lp through other half of toggle clasp, ch 1, fasten off and weave in ends.

PENDANT

Rnd 1: Leaving 10-inch length at beg, ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 8 sc in ring, join in first sc. (8 sc)

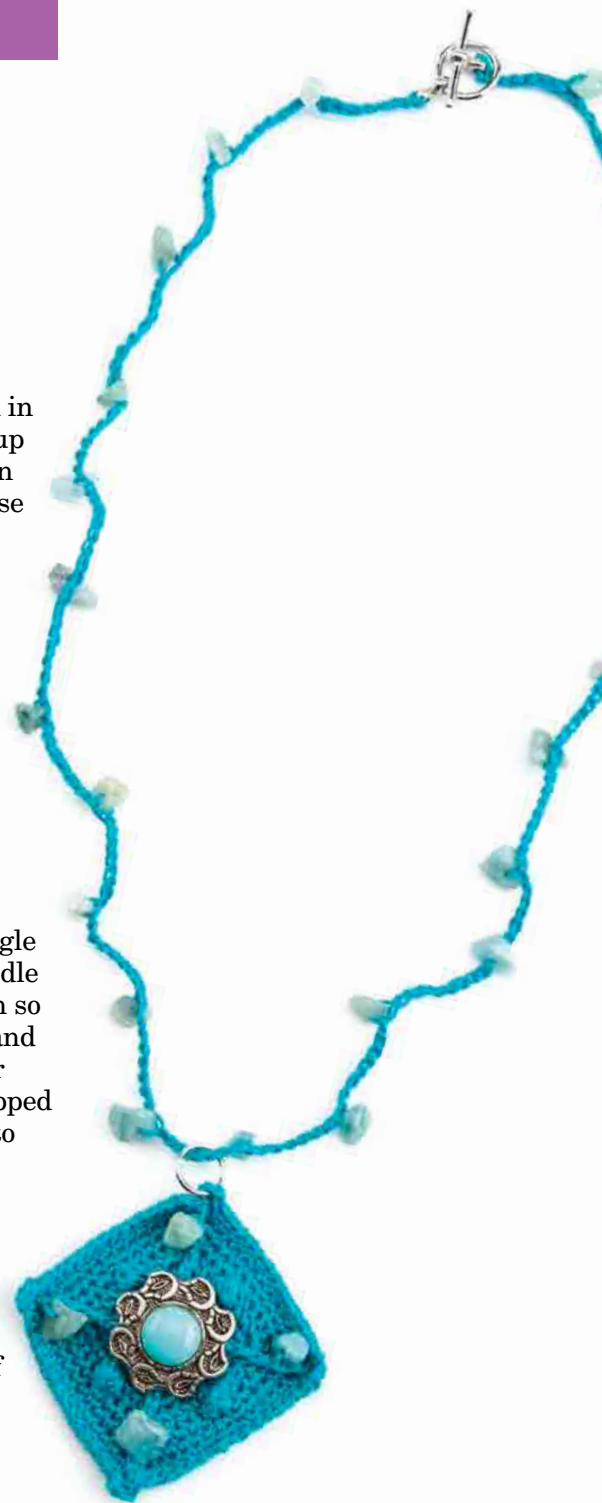

Rnd 5: Ch 2 (does not count as



first hdc), **hdc pc** (see *Special Stitches*) in same st, *hdc in each of next 3 sts, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 3 sts**, hdc pc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in first sc. (36 sc, 4 pc)


Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next 4 sts, 3 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 9 sts, 3 sc in next st] around, ending with sc in next 4 sts, join. (48 sc)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next 5 sts, 3 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 11 sts, 3 sc in next st] around, ending with sc in each of next 5 sts, join. (56 sc)

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each of next 6 sts, (sc, **bead trtr**—see *Special Stitches*, sc) in next st, [sc in next 13 sts, (sc, bead trtr, sc) in next st] around, ending with sc in each of next 6 sts, join. (60 sc, 4 trtr)

Rnd 9: [Sl st in each st to corner bead trtr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in trtr] around, ending with sl st in rem sts, join in first sl st. Fasten off.

Thread rem beg length on needle and sew button in center of Pendant. With needle-nose pliers, open jump ring and insert through any corner ch-2 sp and over center of Necklace Chain, close jump ring with needle-nose pliers.

Mist Pendant with water and pin to pinning board; let dry.

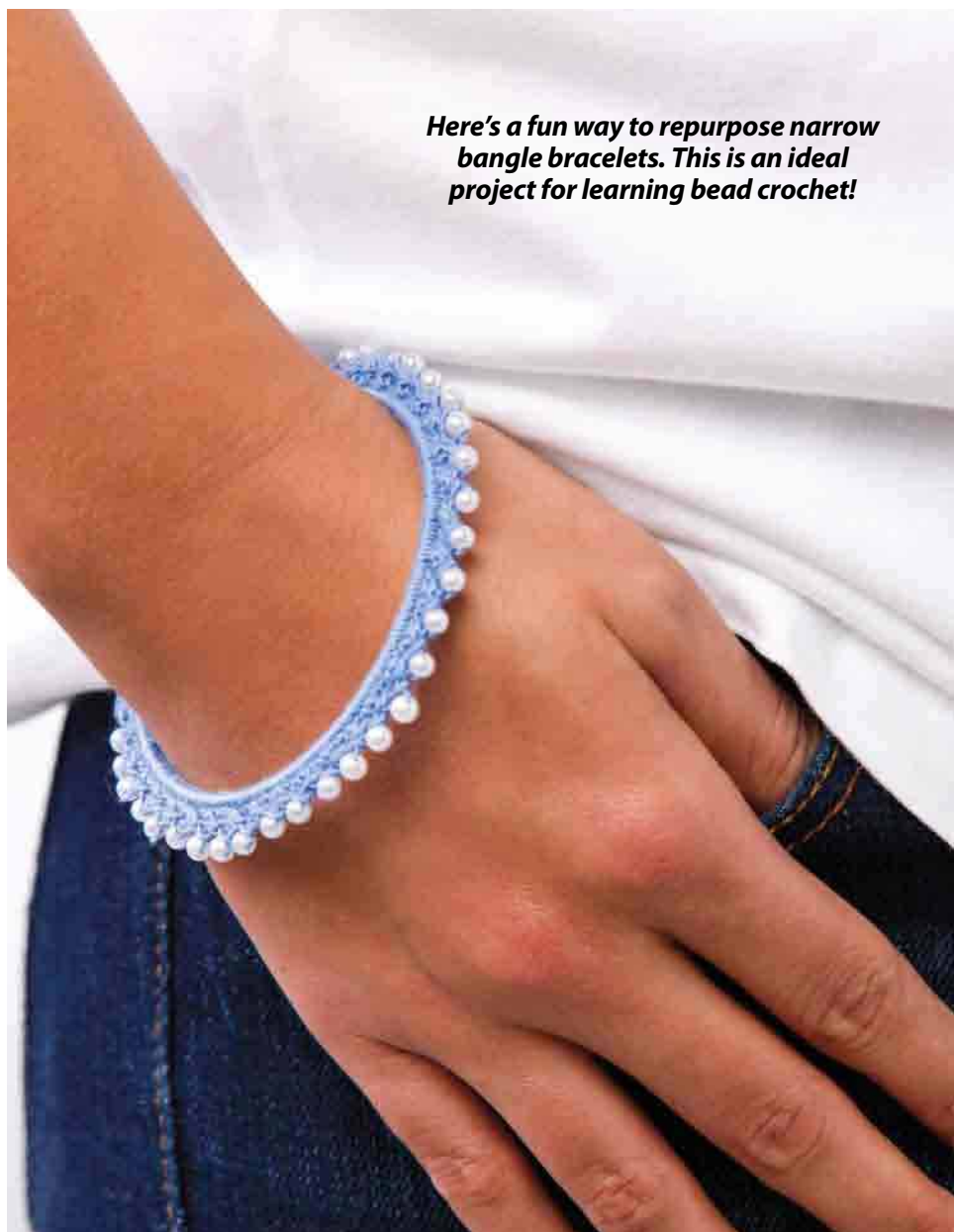

Rnd 1: Join (see *Pattern Notes*) thread on bracelet, work with slightly loose tension enough to allow working in sc sts on rnd 2 with ease, ch 1, work 117 sc over bracelet, join in beg sc. (117 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 1, bead ch, ch 1, sk next 2 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, bead ch, ch 1, sk next 2 sc] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (39 bead chs) **CW**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

40 x 50 inches

MATERIALS

- SMC Catania fine (sport) weight cotton yarn (1¾ oz/137 yds/50g per ball):
10 balls #00100 mimosa
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



GAUGE

Rnds 1–5 of Motif = 5 x 5 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

New Motif is joined to previous Motifs as work progresses.

Refer to Assembly Diagram for placement of Motifs. Working Motif is joined to the adjacent Motif(s) when working round 5. Hold the Motifs with right sides facing and matching stitches.

Single crochet, chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated. Use this stitch whenever the first stitch of round is a double crochet.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Follow Assembly Diagram for Motif placement.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Adjustable ring: Wrap yarn in ring around index finger, ending yarn tail behind working yarn. Remove from finger and grip the ring and tail firmly between middle finger and thumb. Insert hook through center of ring,

with working yarn, yo, draw up lp, work sts of first rnd in ring. After the first rnd of sts has been completed, pull gently, but firmly, on yarn tail to close ring.

Puff stitch (puff st): [Yo, insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw up a lp] 4 times in same st or sp (9 lps on hook), yo, draw through all lps on hook, ch 1 to lock.

Duplicate stitch (duplicate st): Work last st of rnd, leaving 6-inch length, cut yarn. Draw last lp of st still on hook all the way through until tail passes through st, sk next st. With yarn needle, run end of tail under both lps of next st, pull yarn through. Insert needle back through where tail originally came from (*last st made*) and behind work, snug yarn to cover sk st with duplicate st just made. Weave in rem length.

Set up corner: [Puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, ch 10, sl st in top of puff st just made, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st.

Regular corner: [Puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, puff st in top of next puff st] 4 times.

First joining corner: [Puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 2 times, ch 5, insert hook in corresponding ch lp, ch 1 around lp, ch 5, sl st in top of puff st just made, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st.

Joining double crochet (joining dc): Insert hook in

corresponding dc of adjacent Motif, yo, insert hook in st to be worked, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through 2 lps, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

Next joining corner: [Puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, ch 5, insert hook in corresponding ch lp, ch 1 in ch-1 of first join, ch 5, sl st in top of puff st just made, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st.

MOTIF

Base Motif

Rnd 1: Make an **adjustable ring** (see *Special Stitches*), **sc**, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 1, (dc, ch 1) 7 times in adjustable ring, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first dc. (8 dc, 8 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [2 dc in next ch-1 sp, (**puff st**—see *Special Stitches*, ch 1, puff st) in next ch-1 sp] 4 times, join. (8 dc, 8 puff sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [dc in next st, dc in sp between st just worked and next dc, dc in next st, puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, puff st in top of next puff st] 4 times, join in first dc. (12 dc, 12 puff sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, *dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, [cl in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, puff st in top of next puff st, rep from * 3 more times, join in first dc. (16 dc, 16 puff sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, *dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in sp between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, [puff st in top of next puff st, ch 1, puff st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, puff st in top of next puff st, rep from * 3 more times, join with **duplicate st** (see *Special Stitches*). Fasten off.

next 2 sts, work **first joining corner** (see *Special Stitches*), work **joining dc** (see *Special Stitches*) in each of next 5 sts, work regular corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIFS 3–7

Rnds 1–5: Rep Motif 2.

MOTIF 8

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work first joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, [work regular corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] twice, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIF 9

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work set up corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work **next joining corner** (see *Special Stitches*), work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIF 10

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work set up corner, dc in



each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, [work next joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts] twice, work first joining corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIFS 11–15

Rnds 1–5: Rep Motif 10.

MOTIF 16

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner] twice, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work next joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work next joining corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIF 17

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner] twice, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work next joining corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work set up corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIFS 18–23

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work set up corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work first joining corner, [work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work next joining corner] twice, work next joining corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIF 24

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work first joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work next joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIFS 25–72

[Rep Motifs 9–24 consecutively] 3 times.

MOTIF 73

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner] twice, dc in each of next 2 sts,

dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work next joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

MOTIF 74

Rnds 1–4: Rep rnds 1–4 of Base Motif.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, work regular corner, dc in each of next 2 sts, dc between last st worked and next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, [work next joining corner, work joining dc in each of next 5 sts] twice, work regular corner, join with duplicate st. Fasten off.

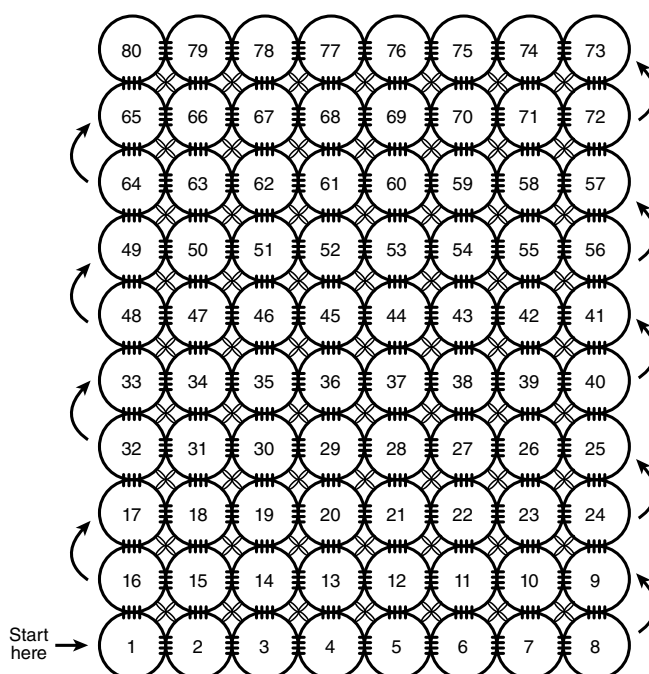

Rnd 3: [Sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (54 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (60 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (66 sc)

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (72 sc)

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (78 sc)

Rnds 8: [Sc in each of next 12 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (84 sc)

Rnds 9–11: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 12: [Sc in each of next

12 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] 6 times. (78 sc)

Rnd 13: [Sc in each of next 11 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (72 sc)

Rnd 14: [Sc in each of next 10 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (66 sc)

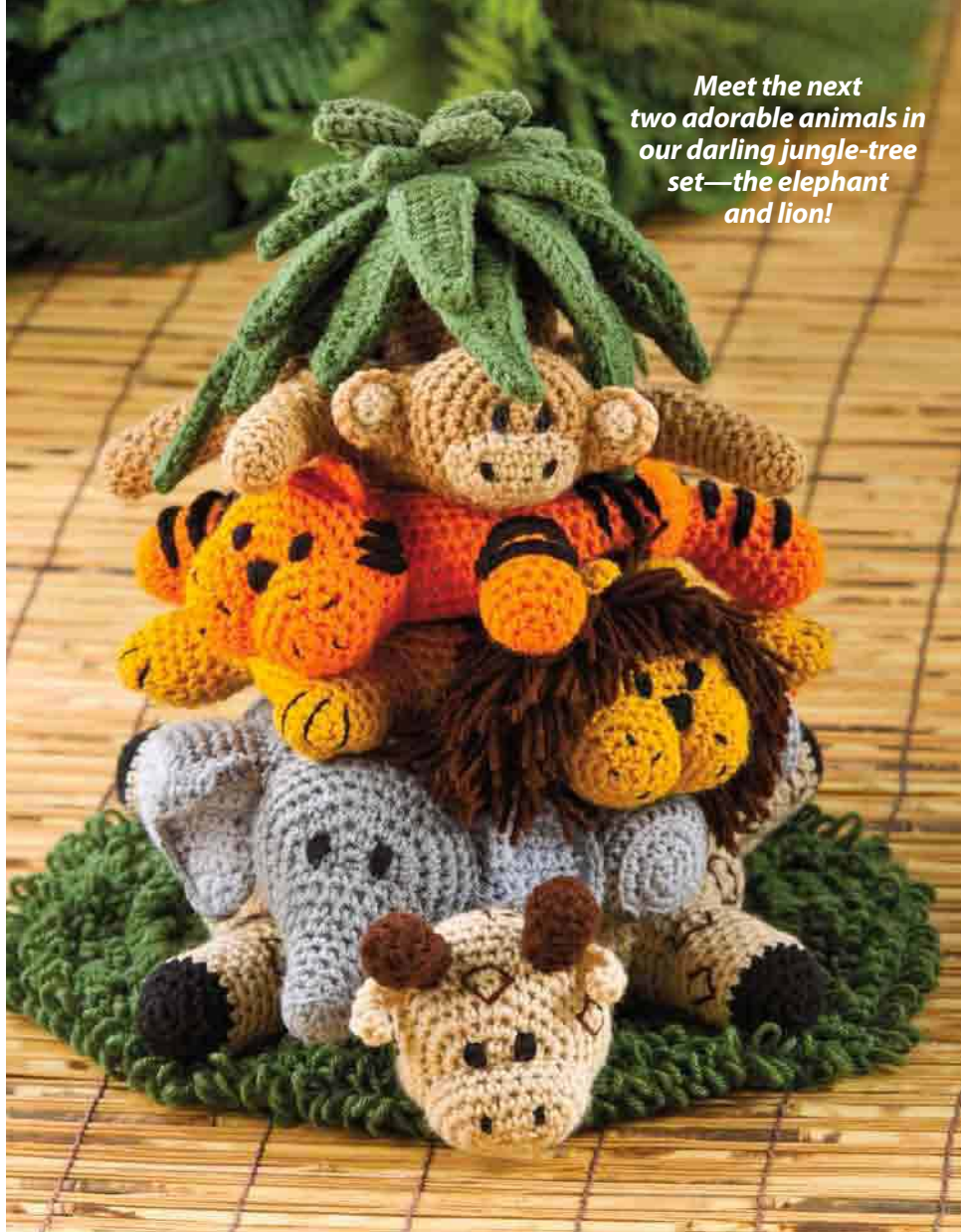
Rnd 15: [Sc in each of next 9 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (60 sc)

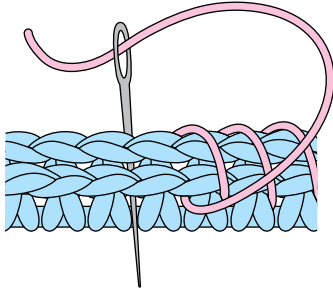

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (30 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (36 sc)

Rnds 6–11: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 12: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (30 sc)

Rnd 13: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (24 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and sew to Body.

LEG

Make 4.

Rnd 1: With light gray, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. Fasten off. (24 sc)

Rnd 4: Working in **back lp** (see

Stitch Guide), join gray heather, sc in each st around.

Rnds 5–9: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 9, leaving length of yarn, fasten off.

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body as indicated in Assembly Diagram.

TRUNK

Rnd 1: With gray heather, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times. (9 sc)

Rnd 3: Working in back lp of sts, sc in each st around.

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 5: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around, inc 3 sc evenly sp around. (12 sc)

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 4.

Rnds 8–11: Rep rnd 6. At the end of rnd 11, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (24 sc)

Stuff Trunk and sew to front of Head.



EARS

Inner Ear

Make 2.

Row 1: With light gray, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (2 sc)

Rows 2–5: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (6 sc)

Rows 6–12: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (4 sc)

Row 14: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice. Fasten off. (2 sc)

Ear Back

Make 2.

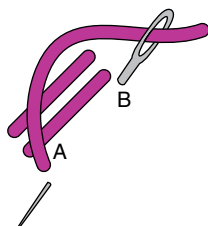
Rows 1–13: With gray heather, rep rows 1–14 of Inner Ear. (4 sc)

Row 14: Rep row 14 of Inner Ear, **do not fasten off.** (2 sc)

Rnd 15: Now working in rnds, holding WS of Inner Ear and Ear Back tog and working through both thicknesses with Inner Ear facing, ch 1, sc around outer edge of Ear, join in beg sc, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. With Inner Ear facing front of Head, sew Ears to each side of Head.

EYES

Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider Eyes just above Trunk, working 5–6 vertical **straight stitches** (see illustration) for each Eye.

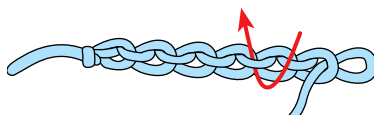

With gray heather, leaving 4-inch length at beg, ch 9,

working in **back bar of ch** (see illustration), sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each rem ch across, leaving 4-inch length, fasten off. With rem length, attach Tail to Body as indicated in Assembly Diagram.

Tail Ends

Cut 4 lengths of gray heather each 3 inches long, fold strands in half, insert hook in end of Tail, draw strands through at fold to form a lp on hook, draw cut ends through lp on hook, pull to secure. Trim ends as desired.

BODY

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 36, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, sc in each ch around. (36 sc)

Rnd 2: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (42 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (48 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (54 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (60 sc)

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (66 sc)

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (72 sc)

Rnd 8: [Sc in each of next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (78 sc)

Rnd 9: Sc in each sc around, inc 3 sc evenly sp around. (81 sc)

Rnd 10: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 11: Sc in each sc around, dec 3 sc evenly sp around. (78 sc)

Rnd 12: [Sc in each of next 11

sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (72 sc)

Rnd 13: [Sc in each of next 10 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (66 sc)

Rnd 14: [Sc in each of next 9 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (60 sc)

Rnd 15: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (54 sc)

Rnd 16: [Sc in each of next 7 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (48 sc)

Rnd 17: [Sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times. (42 sc)

Rnd 18: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, leaving 18-inch length of yarn, fasten off. (36 sc)

Matching sts of rnd 18 to opposite side of foundation ch, **whip-stitch edges** (see illustration on page 45) tog, stuffing firmly with fiberfill as work progresses.

HEAD

Rnds 1–13: With gold, rep rnds 1–13 of Elephant Head. (24 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and sew to Body.

LEGS

Make 4.

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around, inc 3 sc evenly sp around. (15 sc)

Rnds 4–7: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 8: Sc in each sc around, dec 3 sc evenly sp around. (12 sc)

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 3, sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (15 sc)

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body as indicated in Assembly Diagram.

TOES

Thread tapestry needle with black, work 3 straight stitches across end of each foot.

EARS

Inner Ear

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 3, sl st in first ch, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around. Fasten off. (6 sc)

Ear Back

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 3, sl st in first ch, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, **do not fasten off.** (6 sc)

Rnd 2: Place WS of Inner Ear and Ear Back tog and working through both thicknesses, work 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Ears to center top of Head 1 inch apart.

CHEEKS

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 5, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Stuff Cheeks with fiberfill and sew to lower half of front of Head with Cheeks touching at center.

Cheek Spots

Thread tapestry needle with black, work 4–5 short straight stitches sporadically on each Cheek.



EYES

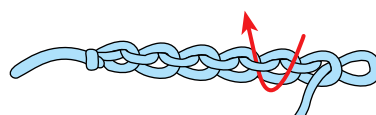
Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider Eyes with $\frac{3}{4}$ inch between just above Cheeks working 5–6 vertical straight stitches for each Eye.

NOSE

Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider Nose center front between Cheeks with straight stitches.

TAIL

With gold, leaving 4-inch length at beg, ch 12, working in **back bar of ch** (see illustration), sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each st across, leaving 4-inch length, fasten off. With rem and ending lengths, attach Tail to Body as indicated in Assembly Diagram.

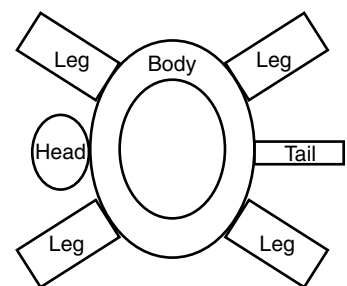

GAUGE

Size H hook: 15 sts = 4 inches;
15 rows = 4 inches

Size J hook: 3 sts = 1 inch; 3 rows = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Back of Sweater is crocheted from shoulders down to underarms, then Fronts are crocheted from shoulders down to under-

arms, and then the Body is crocheted from underarms, working Fronts and Back at the same time.

BLANKET

Foundation row: Starting at center of Blanket with baby multi and size H hook, ch 41, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (40 sc)

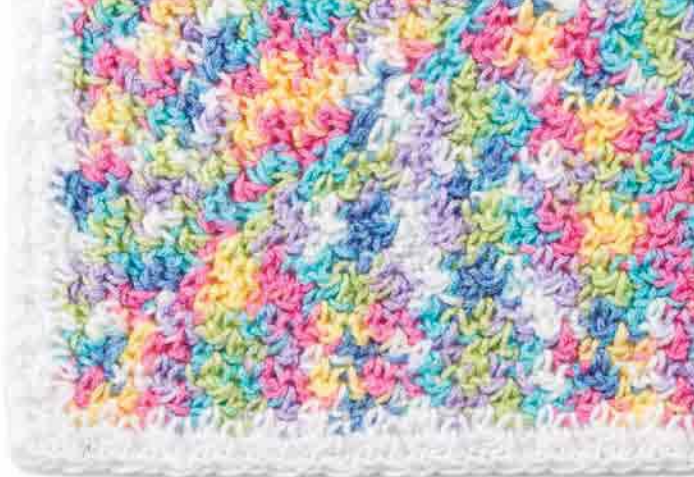

Rnd 55: Rep rnd 3. Fasten off. (516 sts, 4 ch-1 sps)

BORDER

Rnd 56: With size H hook, join white in any dc along side edge, rep rnd 3.

Rnd 57: Rep rnd 4. Fasten off.

SWEATER

BACK

Row 1: Beg at top shoulders with size J hook and baby multi, ch 27 [29, 29, 37] sc in 2nd ch from hook, [dc in next ch, sc in next ch] 12 [13, 13, 17] times, dc in last ch, turn. (26 [28, 28, 36] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Rows 3–5 [3–6, 3–7, 3–8]: Rep row 2.

Row 6 [7, 8, 9]: Ch 1, sc in first st, *dc in next st, sc in next st*, rep from * to * 3 times, (dc, sc, dc) in next st, sc in next st, rep from * to * 2 [3, 3, 7] times, (dc, sc, dc) in next st, sc in next st, rep from * to * 4 times, dc in next st, turn. (30 [32, 32, 40] sts)

Row 7 [8, 9, 10]: Rep row 2.

Row 8 [9, 10, 11]: Ch 1, sc in first st, (dc, sc, dc) in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] rep across until last 2 sts, (sc, dc, sc) in next st, dc in next st, turn. (34 [36, 36, 44] sts)

Rows 9 & 10 [10 & 11, 11 & 12, 12 & 13]: Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

FRONTS

Note: For sizes 0–3 months and 6–12 months work *Right Front* first. For sizes 3–6 months and size 2, work *Left Front* first. The inc point (3 sts in 1 st) are at neckline edge.

Row 8: Rep row 4.

Row 9: Rep row 2.

Row 10: Rep row 6.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] rep across to last 3 sts, (sc, dc, sc) in next st, sc in next st, dc in next st. Fasten off.

Row 8: Rep row 4.

Rows 11 & 12: Rep row 2. Remove st marker.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, (sc, dc, sc) in next st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across, ending with dc in last st, **do not fasten off**.

Left Front

Row 1: With RS of Back row 1 facing and working in opposite side of foundation ch, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) baby multi in 10th st from end of row, ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] 4 times, turn. (10 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Rep row 2.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] rep across to last 2 sts, (sc, dc, sc) in next st (*place st marker in center sc of 3-st group*), dc in last st, turn. (12 sts)

Row 5: Rep row 2. Move st marker.

SIZE 0–3 MONTHS ONLY

Rows 6–9: Rep row 2. Remove st marker.

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st (sc, dc, sc) in next st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] rep across, ending with dc in last st, **do not fasten off**.

SIZE 3–6 MONTHS ONLY

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] rep across

BODY

Row 11 [12, 13, 14]: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] rep across Front, Back and 2nd Front, turn.

Rows 12–20 [13–23, 14–26, 15–29]: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across, turn. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

SLEEVES

Rnd 1: With RS facing and size J hook, join baby multi in side of row at bottom of armhole opening, ch 1, sc in same st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] until 18, [20, 22, 24] sts are completed evenly sp around armhole opening, join in beg sc, turn. (20 [22, 24, 26] sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnds 3–17 [3–19, 3–22, 3–25]:

Rep rnd 2. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Cuff

Rnd 1 (RS): Join white in last rnd of Sleeve, ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

BOTTOM EDGING

Row 1 (RS): Join white in bottom edge of Body, ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across bottom edge, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, turn.

FRONT EDGINGS

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, working up Front button edge, [sc in next st, dc in next st] up Front edge, around neckline and down Front to bottom edge, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in each of next 4 sts] 3 [3, 4, 4] times, ch 1, sk next st, sc in each rem st up front, around neckline and down opposite Front, turn.

Place a st marker in 18th [18th, 20th, 20th] st from bottom edge on both edges of each Front.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, *[sc in next st, dc in next st] rep on Front to st marker, 2 sts in marked st, sc in next st, 2 sts in next st, rep from * once, [sc in next st, dc in next st] to bottom edge of Front. Fasten off. **CW**

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein): 5 skeins #505 Aruba sea
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Motif = 6 inches square

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Motifs are joined 8 wide x 10 long.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Adjustable ring: Wrap yarn around index finger to form a ring, making sure that the tail falls behind working yarn. Holding ring and tail, insert hook through center of ring, yo with working yarn and draw up a lp. Work sts of first rnd in the ring. After the first rnd of sts is worked, pull on beg tail to close ring.

AFGHAN

FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1: Form **adjustable ring** (see *Special Stitch*), ch 2, tr in

ring, (hdc, tr) 7 times in ring, sl st to top of beg ch-2, tighten ring. (16 sts)

Rnd 2: [Ch 7, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 7 times, ch 7, sc dec over next st and base of beg ch. (8 ch-7 lps)

Rnd 3: Sl st in each of next 3 chs of ch-7 lp, ch 4, tr in ch-7 lp behind working st, ch 7, *tr in next unworked ch-7 lp, tr in ch-7 lp behind working st, ch 2, tr in next unworked ch-7 lp, tr in ch-7 lp behind working st, ch 7*, rep from * to * 2 more times, tr in next ch-7 lp (*lp with first tr worked in rnd*), tr in ch lp behind working st, ch 2, sl st to top of beg ch 4, make sure ch is behind first tr. (4 ch-7 lps, 4 ch-2 lps)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next tr, *(3 sc, ch 3, 3 sc) in ch-7 sp, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp**, sc in each of next 2 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnd 5: Sl st in next st, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in st behind working st, sk next st, dc in next st, dc in sk st, *sk next st, dc in ch-3 sp, dc in sk st, ch 3, dc in next st, dc in ch-3 sp, [sk next st, dc in next st, dc in sk st] 5 times, rep from * around, sl st in beg ch-3 make sure ch is behind first dc. Fasten off.

MOTIFS 2-80

Rnds 1-4: Rep rnds 1-4 of First Motif.

Rnd 5: Work the same as First Motif, except when joining to adjacent Motif, remove hook from working lp after work-

ing dc in sk st, insert hook in completed Motif, between set of cross-dc sts, insert in dropped lp and draw through adjacent Motif, completing the sts on the working row. At corners, ch 1, remove hook from working lp, insert in ch-3 corner of adjacent Motif, pick up dropped lp and draw through corner, ch 2 and continue joining process.

Note: When working in corner with 3 completed Motifs, insert hook into both ch-3 corners adjacent to Motif and complete process.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Join to any ch-3 corner of Afghan, ch 3, dc in st behind working st, ch 3, dc in next st, dc in ch-3 sp, *[sk next st, dc in next st, dc in sk st] rep until next joined corner of Motif, dc in corner ch, dc in sk st, dc in next corner ch, dc in previous corner ch, dc in next st, dc in nearest corner ch *, rep from * to * across until reaching corner of Afghan, ch 3 in corner and rep process around join in beg ch, make sure ch is behind first dc.

Rnds 2 & 3: Ch 3, dc in st behind working st, *[sk next st, dc in next st, dc in sk st] across to corner ch-3, dc in ch sp, dc in sk st, ch 3, dc in next st, dc in corner ch-3 sp, rep from * around, join in beg ch and make sure ch is behind first dc. At the end of rnd 3, fasten off.

Block as needed. **CW**

Neckline Trim

Row 1: Ch 1, sc evenly sp in ends of rows across top edge. Fasten off.

For Neckline opening measure center 9 [9½, 9½, 10, 10, 10] inches at center and place st marker at each edge.

ASSEMBLY

Work **decorative seaming** (see *Special Stitches*) to join shoulder seams, leaving neckline opening between st markers.

Working around neckline opening, sl st in back lp of each st around. Fasten off.

For underarm edging with RS facing, join with sc to underarm, sc evenly sp in end of rows. Fasten off. Rep edging on rem 3 underarm sections.

For side and underarm seams, with RS facing and beg at bottom edge, working in decorative seaming, join Front and Back tog up side seams and out to end of Sleeves, do not fasten off. Working around Sleeves, sl st in each st around, fasten off.

HEM

Row 1: With RS facing, join with sc at side seam, sc evenly sp in ends of rows 180 [200, 220, 240, 240, 280] around bottom edge, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to first sc.



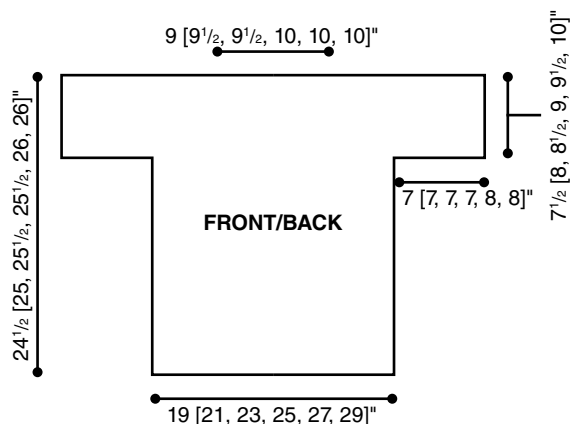
Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next 2 sts, [dc, ch 1, sk next st] around, join to 3rd ch of beg ch-4.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sk next 3 sts, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next st, sk next 3 sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next st, sk next 3 sts] around to last 2 sts, sc in last 2 sts, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

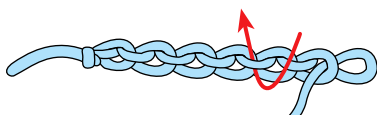

in **back bar of ch** (see *illustration*), (dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), ch 5, sk next 6 chs, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch, ch 5, sk next 6 chs, **shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in last ch, turn.



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in ch-2 sp of shell, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-2 sp, ch 3, 7 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, turn. (2 shells, 7 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, join in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, dc in first dc of 7-dc group, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 6 times, ch 2, shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, turn. (2 shells, 7 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

Row 4: Ch 1, join in ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, dc in first dc of 7-dc group, [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 6 times, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, turn. (2 shells, 13 dc)

Rows 6–37: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 8 times.

Rows 38–40: [Rep rows 2–4 consecutively] once.

Row 41 (WS): Ch 1, join in ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp of shell, ch 3, sk 2 dc of shell, sc in first dc of fan, [ch 2, sk next dc, sc in next dc] twice, ch 2, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next dc, [ch 2, sk next dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sc in ch-2 sp of shell, turn.

Row 42 (RS): Ch 1, sc in ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp] 3 times, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, [sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 3] 3 times, sc in next ch-3 sp. Fasten off.



2ND HALF

Row 1: With WS facing, draw up a lp in first ch, beg shell in same ch, ch 5, sk next 6 chs, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next ch, ch 5, sk next 6 chs, shell in last ch, turn.

Rows 2–42: Rep rows 2–42 of First Half.

Row 31: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 6 fan sts across, dc in top of last dc, turn.

Row 32: Sl st in first 3 dc, ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 5 fan sts, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (5 fan sts, 33 sts)

Row 33: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 5 fan sts across, (2 dc,

ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, leaving 18-inch length, fasten off. (5 fan sts, 33 sts)

Size X-Large Right Front

Row 23: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 9 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (9 fan sts, 53 sts)

Row 24: Sl st in first 3 dc, ch 2, work 9 fan sts, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (9 fan sts, 50 sts)

Row 25: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 8 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (8 fan sts, 48 sts)

Row 26: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 8 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn.

Row 27: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 8 fan sts across, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, turn. (8 fan sts, 45 sts)

Row 28: Ch 2, work 8 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (8 fan sts, 45 sts)

Row 29: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 7 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (7 fan sts, 43 sts)

Row 30: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 8 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn.

Row 31: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 7 fan sts across, sk next 2 dc, dc in next dc, turn. (7 fan sts, 40 sts)

Row 32: Ch 2, work 7 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn.

Row 33: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 6 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, turn. (6 fan sts, 38 sts)

Row 34: Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 sp, work 6 fan sts across, (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in last ch-1 sp, leaving 18-inch length, fasten off. (6 fan sts, 38 sts)

With rem lengths of Fronts, matching sts,

sew Left and Right Fronts to Back.

SLEEVES

Row 1: Ch 74 [79, 89, 94], fan st in 6th ch from hook, [sk next 4 chs, fan st in next ch] across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn. (14 [15, 17, 18] fan sts)

Row 2: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, fan st in each ch-1 sp across, ending with (2 dc, ch 1, dc) in top of last dc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 2, fan st in first ch-1 sp, fan st in each of next 14 [15, 17, 18] ch-1 sps across, fan st in last ch-1 sp, dc in last dc, turn. (16 [17, 19, 20] fan sts)

Rows 4–6 [4–6, 4–8, 4–8]: Ch 2, fan st in each of next 16 [17, 19, 20] ch-1 sps across, dc in first dc, turn. At the end of last rep, leaving 24-inch length, fasten off.

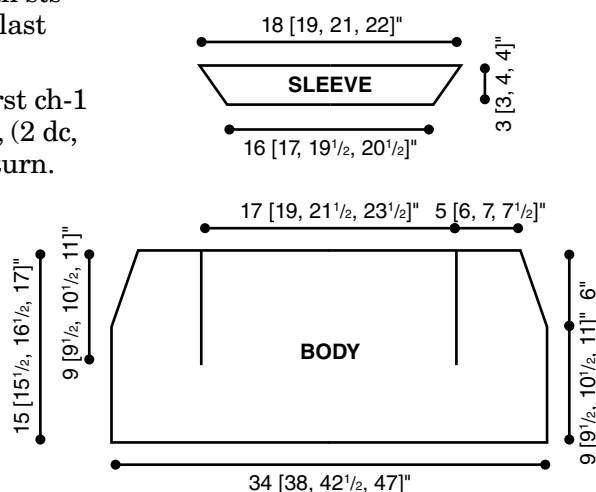
Sew last row of each Sleeve to armhole opening and sew underarm seam.

MAT RIGHT-HAND BORDER

Row 1: With RS facing, working along opposite side of beg ch of row 1 of Flip-Flops, join 2 strands jute in back lp of first ch, ch 2, hdc in next ch, sc in each of next 6 chs, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 8 chs, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sc in each of next 10 chs, 2 hdc in last ch, turn. (31 sts)

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in next st, dc in each of next 23 sts, hdc in each of next 6 sts, turn.

Rows 3–5: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn. Fasten off after row 5.

MAT TOP BORDER

Row 1: Join 2 strands of jute to side of last dc of row 5 of Right-Hand Border, **ch 4** (see *Pattern Notes*), 5 tr in ends of rows 5–1 of Right-Hand Border, [tr in back lp of sl st of next Flip-Flop Top Edge, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, sl st in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next st, tr in sl st] rep 4 times, work 6 tr across ends of rows 1–5 of Left-Hand Border, turn. (71 sts)

Rows 2–12: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn. At the end of row 12, fasten off.

Lightly steam-block Mat to 23 inches wide x 17 inches from Heel Edge to top of row of Top Border and let dry thoroughly, then continue, adding Outer Edge.

OUTER EDGE

Row 1: With RS facing, join 2 strands jute to side of beg ch-2 of row 1 of Right-Hand Border at bottom edge of Mat, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, work 4 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 2–4,

sc in top of beg ch-2 of row 5, ch 1 to turn corner;

A. sc in same sp as last st, sc in each of next 30 sts of row 5, work 20 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–12 of Top Border to right top corner, ch 1 to turn corner;

B. sc in same sp as last sc, sc in each of next 70 sts of Top Border row 12, ch 1 to turn corner;

C. sc in same sp as last sc, work 19 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 12–1 of Top Border, sc in each of next 31 sts of Left-Hand Border to corner, ch 1 to turn corner;

D. sc in same sp as last sc, work 5 sc evenly spaced in ends of rows 5–1 of Left-Hand Border, sl st in same sp as last sc. Fasten off. (185 sc)

Row 2: Join 2 strands jute to same sp as previous row, ch 1, sl st in first sc of previous row, [ch 1, sl st in next sc] rep across row 1, working ch 1, sl st in ch-1 sp at corners and ending with sl st in same sp as last sl st of previous row. (186 sl sts)

TOE STRAP & EDGING

Make 1 each using red for row 1 & hot pink for Edging rnd, sunshine for row 1 & hot green for Edging rnd, hot green for row 1 and sunshine for Edging rnd, hot blue for row 1 & robin's egg for Edging rnd, & hot pink for row 1 & hot orange for Edging rnd.

Row 1: Beg on RS with 1 strand, ch 32, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 14 chs, 3 sc in next ch, sc in each of next 14 chs, sl st in last ch. Fasten off. (33 sts)




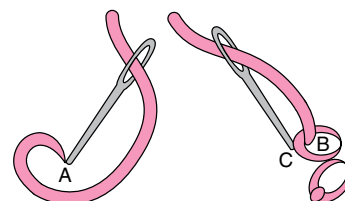
Rnd 2: Now working in rnds, join 1 strand Edging color to first sl st of previous row, working in back lps only, ch 1, sl st in same sp, sl st in each of next 16 sts, ch 1, sl st in same st, sl st in each of rem 16 sts, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, sl st in each of next 15 chs, sk next ch, sl st in each of rem 15 chains, ch 1, sl st to first sl st of rnd. Fasten off. (65 sl sts)

ASSEMBLY

Using same color as Edging rnd of Toe Strap & Edging and tapestry needle, sew top Straps RS up on each Flip-Flop as shown in photo or where desired, making 1 long st at center top of each Strap.

The word “WELCOME” is embroidered in lazy-daisy stitches with 3-inch letters centered over upper edge of Mat. Using photo as a guide and working with water-soluble marking pen, print letters centered across upper portion of Mat.

Working with 2 strands hot blue and tapestry needle, embroider over each drawn letter in **lazy-daisy stitch** (see illustration).

inner edge, work 18 sc evenly sp across to row 16, sc in each of next 20 sc, work 18 sc evenly sp across opposite edge of ends of rows, ch 45 (*back of headband*), sc in first sc at opposite corner of Visor, do not join.

Rnd 18: Sc in each sc across inner curve of Visor, sc in each of next 45 chs, do not join. (101 sc)



Rnd 19: Sc in each sc around.

Rnds 20–31: Sc in each sc

around. At the end of rnd 31, draw up a lp, remove hook.

Fold elastic to form a circle, overlapping ends by ½ inch, with sewing needle and white thread, sew ends tog.

With elastic encased in center, fold Band in half over elastic, pick up dropped lp.

Rnd 32: Working through both thicknesses of sc of rnd 31 and sts of rnd 18, sl st in each st around. Fasten off. **CW**

Row 5: Ch 3, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-1 sp, [**picot** (see *Special Stitches*), V-st in next ch-1 sp] across, ending with dc in last sc. Fasten off.

2ND SIDE EDGING

Row 4: Sl st in opposite edge of foundation ch of row 1, ch 1, sc in same ch as beg ch-1, [sk next 3 sts, shell in next st] 5 times, sk next 3 sts, sc in last st, turn. (5 shells, 2 sc)

Row 5: Rep row 5 of First Side Edging.

JOINING

String beads onto crochet cotton (use 5 beads per Flower Strip).

Wrapping dc rows around the straps of flip-flop (rows 1–3) and working in sk dc sts from row 3 below shells and base of dc sts of row 1, sl st in first dc, dc sts of opposite rows tog, sl st until just before shells, insert hook in next sts to be slip stitched, and slide bead down crochet cotton next to Strip, complete sl st and continue until next shell, rep across Strip. Fasten off. Continue until all 4 Strips are attached to flip-flops. **CW**

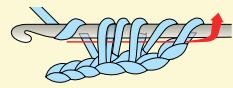

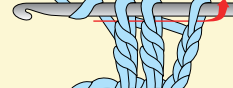

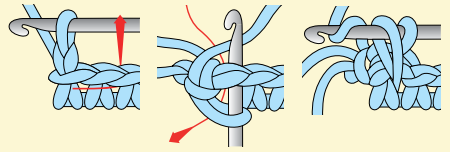
Treble crochet

decrease (tr dec): Holding back last lp of each st, tr in each of the sts indicated, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

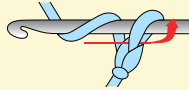


Example of 2-tr dec

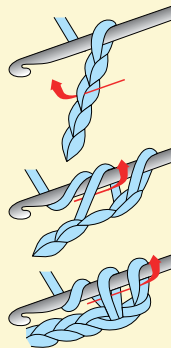


Chain (ch): Yo, pull through lp on hook.



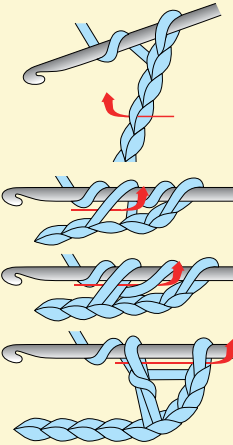
