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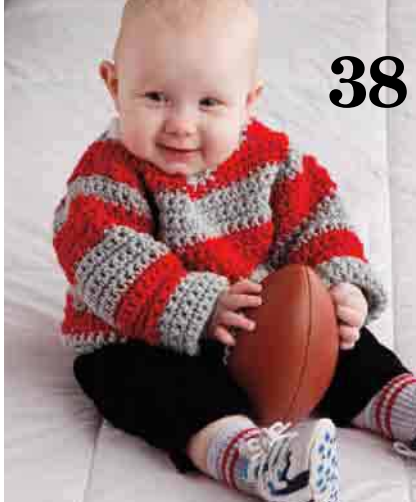

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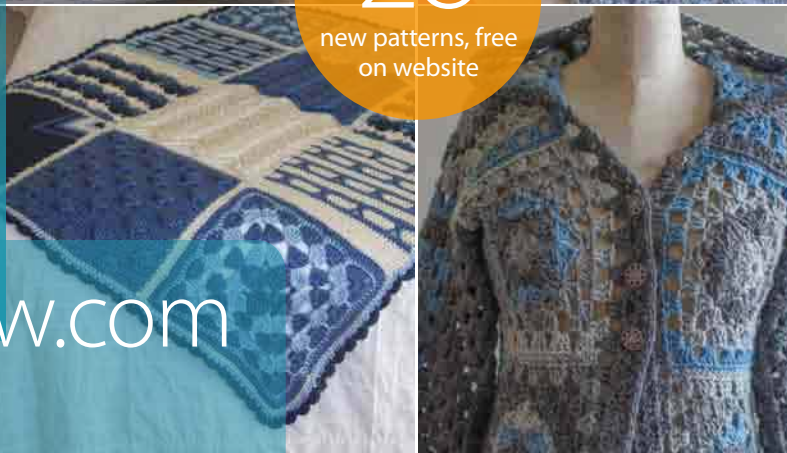
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Thrifty Market Bag

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

24½ inches in diameter x 11½ inches high, excluding wire basket

MATERIALS

- Omega La Espiga #18 crochet nylon (7 oz/197 yds/200g per spool):
3 spools #24 light green
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Wire basket (available at Dollar Tree): 7 inches wide x 10 inches long x 5¼ inches tall
- Pliers

GAUGE

9 sts = 2 inches; 5 rnds = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

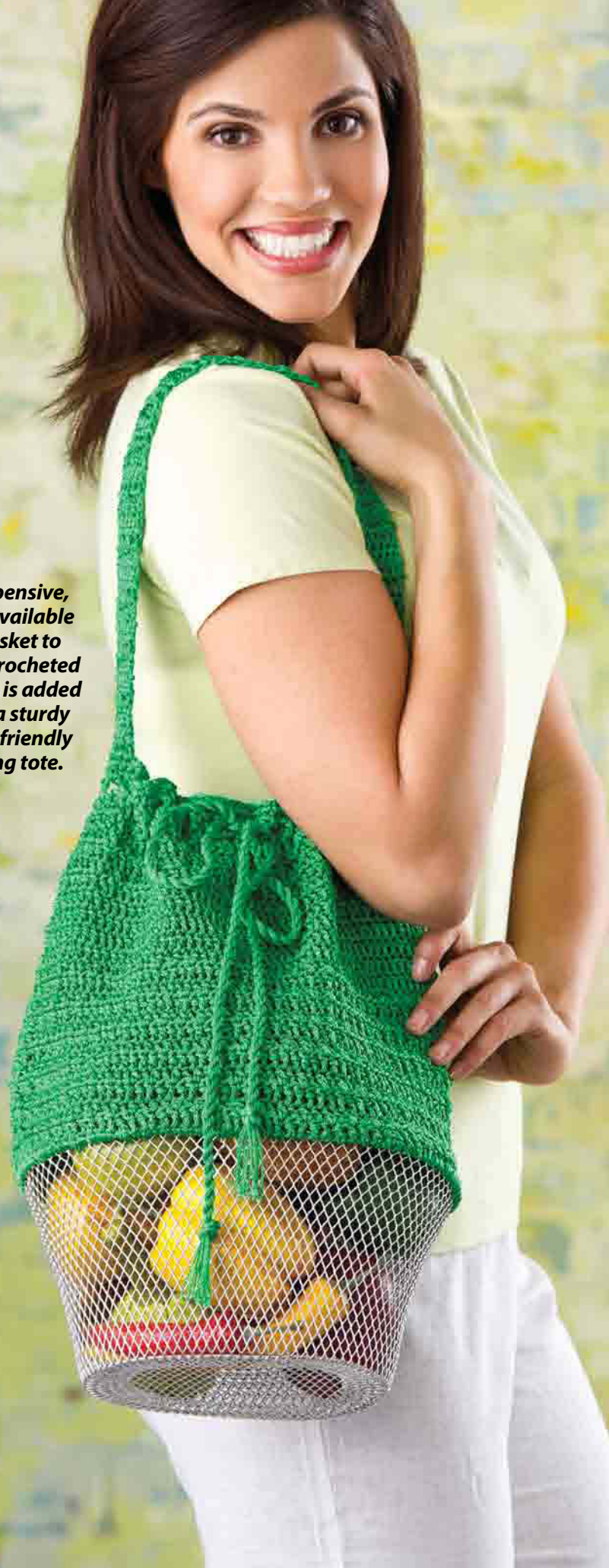
Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

With pliers, remove wire basket handle and bend loops where handle was attached slightly toward inside of basket.

BAG

Rnd 1: Beg at bottom edge of Bag, ch 126, dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc),

An inexpensive, readily available wire basket to which a crocheted nylon top is added creates a sturdy and eco-friendly shopping tote.



dc in each rem ch across, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of first dc. (124 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), **[bpdc]** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc, [dc in next dc, bpdc around next dc] around, join in first dc. (62 bpdc, 62 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in first dc. (124 dc)

Rnds 4 & 5: Rep rnds 2 and 3.

Rnd 6: Rep rnd 2.

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 3, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) 1 st, join in first dc. (123 dc)

Rnd 8: Rep rnd 2, dc dec at st 61. (61 bpdc, 61 dc)

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 7. (121 dc)

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 8, dc dec at st 60. (60 bpdc, 60 dc)

Rnd 11: Rep rnd 7. (119 dc)

Rnd 12: Rep rnd 8, dc dec at st 59. (59 bpdc, 59 dc)

Rnd 13: Rep rnd 7. (117 dc)

Rnds 14–17: Rep rnd 3, dc dec 1 st. (113 dc)

Rnd 18: Rep rnd 2, dc dec at st 56. (56 bpdc, 56 dc)

Rnd 19: Rep rnd 7. (111 dc)

Rnd 20: Rep rnd 2, dc dec at st 55. (55 bpdc, 55 dc)

Rnd 21: Rep rnd 7. (109 dc)

Rnd 22: Rep rnd 2, dc dec at st 54. (54 bpdc, 54 dc)

Rnd 23: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next dc, [dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (54 dc, 54 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 24: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next ch-1 sp, [sc in next dc, sc in next ch-1 sp] around, join in first sc. (108 sc)

Rnd 25: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

HANDLE

Row 1: Ch 8, dc in 4th ch from hook (*sk 3 chs count as first dc*), dc in each of next 4 chs, turn. (6 dc)

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Summer Dreams Place Mat & Coaster

1 2 3 4 5 6 **INTERMEDIATE**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Place Mat: 15 x 20 inches

Coaster: 7 inches square

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (350 yds per ball):
2 balls #226 natural
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Motif = 4½ inches square

Edging = 1½ inches wide; (sc, ch 3,

sc) 5 times = 1½ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Each Motif requires 23 yards of cotton.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning 5-treble crochet cluster (beg 5-tr cl): Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), *yo twice, insert hook in ch sp, yo, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from * 3 times, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

5-treble crochet cluster

(5-tr cl): *Yo twice, insert hook in ch sp, yo, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from * 4 times, yo, draw through all 6 lps on hook.

Increase (inc): (Sc, ch 3) 3 times and sc in indicated ch-3 sp.

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 3, dc) in indicated ch-3 sp.

PLACE MAT

Make 2.

FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 8, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 20 hdc in ring, join in first hdc. (20 hdc)

Rnd 2: Ch 6 (see *Pattern Notes*), [tr in next hdc, ch 2] around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-6. (20 tr, 20 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in same tr as beg ch-1, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, [sc in next tr, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in beg sc. (60 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, ch 4, sk each of next 2 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 4, sk each of next 2 sc] around, join in beg sc. (20 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 5: Sl st in ch-4 sp, **beg 5-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-4 sp, *ch 5, dc in next ch-4 sp**, ch 5, **5-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-4 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 2, join with dc in beg cl. (10 5-tr cls, 10 dc, 20 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, [ch 6, sc in next ch-5 sp]

around, ending with ch 2, join with tr in beg sc. (20 ch-6 sps)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, *ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, (5-tr cl, ch 6) 3 times in next ch-6 sp, dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6**, sc in next ch-6 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (12 5-tr cls, 8 dc, 28 ch-6 sps)

1-SIDED JOINING

Rnds 1–6: Rep rnds 1–6 of First Motif.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, (ch 6, 5-tr cl) twice in next ch-6 sp, holding working Motif to adjacent Motif, ch 3, sl st in ch-6 sp between 2nd and 3rd 5-tr cls, ch 3, 5-tr cl in same ch-6 sp of working Motif as previously 2 5-tr cls (to complete corner),

A. ch 3, sl st in next ch-6 sp on adjacent Motif, ch 3, dc in next ch-6 sp on working Motif, [ch 3, sl st in adjacent ch-6 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-6 sp of working Motif] twice, ch 3, sl st in next ch-6 sp on adjacent Motif, ch 3, dc in next ch-6 sp on working Motif, [ch 3, sc in adjacent ch-6 sp, ch 3, 5-tr cl in ch-6 sp] twice in same corner ch-6 sp, ch 6, 5-tr cl in same ch-6 sp;

B. *ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, [ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp] twice, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, (ch 6, 5-tr cl) 3 times in next ch-6 sp for corner*, rep from * to * once, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

2-SIDED JOINING

Rnds 1–6: Rep rnds 1–6 of First Motif.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp,



*The easy join-as-you-go motif in this pretty set
can be used to create almost any size project.
In yarn, it would make a beautiful throw!*



(ch 6, 5-tr cl) twice in next ch-6 sp, holding working Motif to previous Motif, ch 3, sl st in ch-6 sp between 5-tr cls, ch 3, 5-tr cl in same ch-6 sp of working Motif (*to complete corner*),

A. *ch 3, sl st in next ch-6 sp on previous Motif, ch 3, dc in next ch-6 sp on working Motif, [ch 3, sl st in adjacent ch-6 sp of previous Motif, ch 3, sc in next ch-6 sp of working Motif] twice, ch 3, sl st in next ch-6 sp on previous Motif, ch 3, dc in next ch-6 sp on working Motif, [ch 3, sl st in ch-6 sp of previous Motif, ch 3, 5-tr cl in ch-6 sp of working Motif] twice* (*first side joined*), ch 3, sl st in ch-6 sp between 5-tr cls on next adjacent Motif, ch 3, 5-tr cl in same ch-6 sp on working Motif (*to complete corner*), rep from * to * once;

B. ch 6, 5-tr cl in same ch-6 sp of working Motif (*to complete corner*), ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, [ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp] twice, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, (ch 6, 5-tr cl) 3 times in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Continue to make and join Motifs 3 x 4 for each Place Mat.

BORDER

Rnd 1 (RS):

Join in first ch-6 sp after corner cls, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-6 sp, *[ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-6 sp] in each ch-6 sp around, working at junction of 2 Motifs, ch 6, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-6 sp, rep from * around, ending with ch 3, join in beg sc.

Rnd 2 (RS): Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, working (sc, ch 3, sc) twice in each ch-6 sp at junctions of Motifs and working **inc** (*see Special Stitches*) in each of 4 corner ch-3 sps (*these ch-3 sps are directly above center 5-tr cl*), join in beg sc, turn. (214 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3 (WS): Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join, turn.

Rnd 4 (RS): Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, working inc in center corner ch-3 sp, join, turn. (222 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 5 (WS): Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 6 (RS): Ch 1, sc in ch-3 sp, **V-st** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, [sc in next ch-3 sp, V-st in next ch-3 sp] around, join in beg sc. (111 V-sts, 111 sc)

Rnd 7 (RS):

Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, inc in next ch-3 sp of V-st, [sc in next sc, inc in ch-3 sp of V-st] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

COASTER

Make 2.

Rnds 1–7: Rep rnds 1–7 of First Motif of Place Mat.

BORDER

Rnd 1 (RS): Join in first ch-6 sp after corner cls, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-6 sp, ch 3, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-6 sp, ch 3] rep in each ch-6 sp around, join in beg sc. (56 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 2 (RS): Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, working **inc** (*see Special Stitches*) in each of 4 corner ch-3 sps (*these ch-3 sps are directly above center 5-tr cl*), join in beg sc, turn. (64 ch-3 sps)

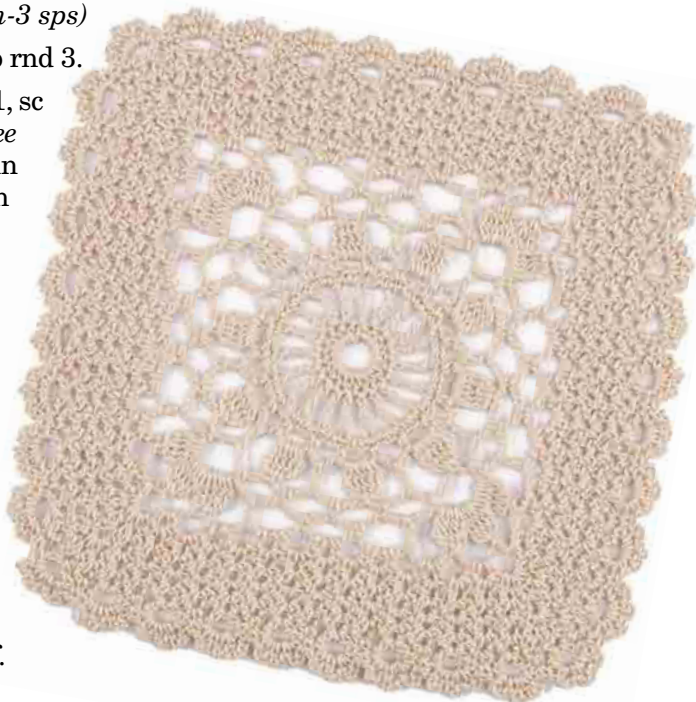
Rnd 3 (WS): Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join, turn.

Rnd 4 (RS): Rep rnd 4 of Place Mat Border. (72 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 5 (WS): Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 6 (RS): Rep rnd 6 of Place Mat Border. (36 V-sts, 36 sc)

Rnd 7 (RS): Rep rnd 7 of Place Mat Border. 



Fun Flowers

1 2 3 4 5 6 **CONFIDENT
BEGINNER**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Earring Flower: 1½ inches in diameter

Necklace Flower: 2 inches in diameter

MATERIALS

- DMC 6-strand embroidery floss (8.7 yds per skein):
2 skeins #3805 cyclamen pink
1 skein each #744 pale yellow, #743 medium yellow and #3838 dark lavender blue
- Sizes 10/1.15mm and 6/1.80mm steel crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Clear seed beads: 18 per flower
- Gold ear wires: 2
- 24-inch-long gold chain
- 10mm gold jump rings: 6
- Craft glue

GAUGE

Size 6 hook with 4 strands embroidery floss: 6 sc = ½ inch;
6 sc rows = ½ inch

Size 10 hook with 2 strands embroidery floss: 6 sc = ¾ inch;
6 sc rows = ¾ inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Before stringing bead on floss, place dab of glue on ends of floss and let dry before stringing. The hardened floss end makes it easy to string beads without a needle.



The options for using these cute flowers are almost limitless, whether creating jewelry, embellishing fashions or dressing up home accents.

Divide embroidery floss in 2 groups as work progresses, the first group has 4 strands and the 2nd group has 2 strands. Use the 4-strand group for larger flower for Necklace and 2-strand group for Earrings.

When instructions call for “Flower color” use cyclamen pink or dark lavender blue.

BASIC FLOWER

CENTER

Rnd 1 (RS): With pale yellow, ch 4, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 9 sc in ring, join in first sc.

Rnd 2 (RS): Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (18 sc)

Rnd 3 (WS): Thread 18 clear seed beads on medium yellow, with WS facing, working in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), join medium yellow with sc, push up bead, ch 1 over bead, [sc in next sc, push up bead, ch 1 over bead] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 4 (RS): Working in rem free lps of rnd 2, join **Flower color** (see *Pattern Notes*) with sc in any st, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] 5 times, join in first sc. (24 sc)

1 2 3 4 5 6 **CONFIDENT BEGINNER**

FINISHED MEASUREMENT

10 inches tall

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein):
 - 1 oz #774 light raspberry
 - ¾ oz #381 light blue
 - ½ oz each #530 orchid, #320 cornmeal, #668 honeydew #373 petal pink, #722 pretty 'n pink and #322 pale yellow
 - 2 yds #312 black
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Fiberfill
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rounds unless otherwise indicated.

Use stitch marker to mark rounds, moving marker as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

TEDDY

HEAD

Rnd 1: Starting at top of Head with light blue, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, **place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*).

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 8: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (40 sc)

Rnds 9–16: Rep rnd 6.

Rnd 17: [Sc in each of next 8 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 18: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and continue to stuff as work progresses.

Rnd 19: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 20: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in next sc. Fasten off. (18 sc)

BODY

Rnd 1: Join cornmeal with sc in ending sl st of Head, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, [sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around, place marker. (24 sc)



We wrap up our patchwork animal series with a darling bear that's just as cute as the puppy that started it all!

Rnd 2: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 5: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (42 sc)

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 4. Fasten off.

Rnd 8: Join light raspberry with sc, sc in each sc around.

Rnds 9–13: Rep rnd 4. At the end of rnd 13, fasten off.

Rnd 14: Join honeydew with sc, sc in each sc around.

Rnds 15–19: Rep rnd 4. Stuff Body with fiberfill and continue to stuff as work progresses.

Rnd 20: [Sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (36 sc)

Rnd 21: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (27 sc)

Rnd 22: [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 23: Rep rnd 22. (12 sc)

Rnd 24: [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join, leaving 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

Weave 8-inch length through rem sts of rnd 24, draw opening closed, secure.

SNOUT

Rnd 1: With petal pink, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [2 sc in each of next 3 sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] twice. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

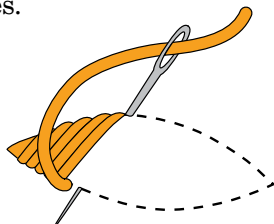
Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (26 sc)

Rnds 6 & 7: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 7, join, leaving 14-inch length, fasten

off. Stuff Snout with fiberfill and sew Snout to Head.

EYES

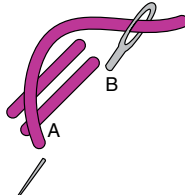
With black, embroider **satin stitch** (see illustration) eyes above Snout with 4 sts between Eyes.



Satin Stitch

NOSE & MOUTH

With black, embroider satin stitch Nose. With black, embroider Mouth with **straight stitches** (see illustration) directly below Nose.



Straight Stitch

INNER EAR

Make 2.

Row 1 (RS): With pretty 'n pink, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, turn. (6 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sc, turn. Fasten off. (8 sc)

Row 3 (RS): Join petal pink with sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 4 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc. Fasten off. (12 sc)

OUTER EAR

Make 2.

Rows 1 & 2: With petal pink, rep rows 1 and 2 of Inner Ear, **do not fasten off**, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 4 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, turn.

Row 4: With WS tog, place Inner Ear on top of Outer Ear, working through **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of both sections, sl st in each st across, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Ears to top of Head.

LEG

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With pretty 'n pink, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around, join. Fasten off. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: Join pale yellow in back lp of previous rnd with sc, sc in each st around. (24 sc)

Rnds 6–16: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 16, join, leaving 14-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body.

ARM

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With pretty 'n pink, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker.


Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (10 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (15 sc)

Rnd 5: Join orchid in back lp of previous rnd with sc, sc in each st around. (20 sc)

Rnds 6–15: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 16, join, leaving 14-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff Arms with fiberfill and sew to Body.

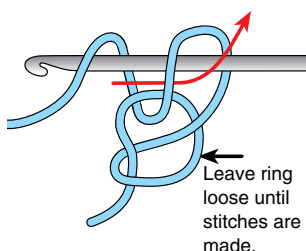
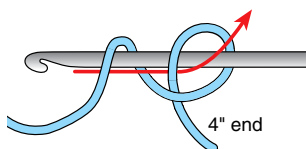

Fasten off.

ROUND POT HOLDER

Rnd 1: Beg at center with blueberry, leaving 4-inch length make **slip ring** (see *illustration below*), ch 1, [sc in slip ring, ch 1] 5 times, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. (5 sc, 5 ch-1 sps)

Rnds 9 & 10: Ch 1, V-st in first ch-2 sp, [V-st in next ch-2 sp] 29 times, join in first sc. (30 V-sts)

Rnd 11: Ch 1, double V-st in first ch-2 sp, V-st in each of next 2 ch-2 sps, [double V-st in next ch-2 sp, V-st in each of next 2 ch-2 sps] 9 times, join in first sc. (10 double V-sts, 20 V-sts)

HANGING LP

Row 14: Now working in rows, ch 1, sc in first ch-2 sp, ch 10, sc in next ch-2 sp, turn. (2 sc, ch-10 lp)

Row 15: Sl st in first ch of ch-10 lp, [ch 1, sl st in next ch] 9 times, sl st in next sc. Fasten off. **CW**

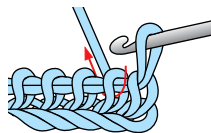

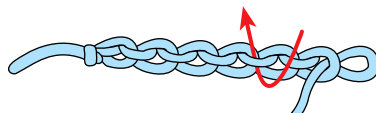

Row 4: Ch 1, EKS (see *Special Stitches*), draw up lp in last back bar, ch 1, yo, draw through first

lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across.

Row 5: Ch 1, EKS across, draw up lp in top of last ch, ch 1.

Rows 6–37: Rep rows 2–5.

BACK SLEEVES

At the end of row 37, ch 58, place lp on safety pin. With separate strand, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) on opposite end of row 37 and ch 58. Fasten off. Pick up lp on safety pin.

Row 1: Draw up lp in back bar of each ch across first Sleeve, TKS across Back, draw up a lp in back bar of each ch across 2nd Sleeve, return. (187 [196, 205, 214, 223, 232] sts)

Row 2: TKS across, return.

Rows 3 & 4: Ch 1, EKS across, return.

Row 5: TKS across, return.

Rows 6–25 [6–25, 6–29, 6–29, 6–33, 6–33]: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] times.

Row 26 [26, 30, 30, 34, 34]: Rep row 2.

Row 27 [27, 31, 31, 35, 35]: Sl st (see *Special Stitches*) across row. Fasten off.

FRONT

Rows 1–37: Rep rows 1–37 of Back.

FRONT SLEEVES

Rows 1–14 [1–14, 1–18, 1–18, 1–22, 1–22]: Rep Back Sleeves rows 1–14 [1–14, 1–18, 1–18, 1–22, 1–22].

This dec section will form Front neckline opening and will prevent a bulky edge.

On left edge of neckline, dec beg on return pass of a row by drawing yarn under 4 lps for the first st creating a 3-st dec. On the next forward pass to complete the dec, make last st by inserting hook under 4 gathered lps and drawing up a lp.

Row 15 [15, 19, 19, 23, 23]: EKS in each st to marker, EKS in marker, yo, draw through 4 lps on hook (3-st dec), [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across. (83 [87, 90, 94, 97, 101] EKS)

Row 16 [16, 20, 20, 24, 24]: EKS in each st across to dec of previous row, EKS under 4 gathered lps of dec on previous row, yo, draw through 4 lps on hook (3-st dec completed), [yo, draw through 2 lps] across. (80 [84, 87, 91, 94, 98] EKS)

Row 17 [17, 21, 21, 25, 25]: TKS in each st across to dec of previous row, TKS under 4 gathered lps of dec on previous row, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps] across. (80 [84, 87, 91, 94, 98] TKS)

Row 18 [18, 22, 22, 26, 26]: TKS across, work last st through 2 lps on last st of row, return.

Rows 19 & 20 [19 & 20, 23 & 24, 23 & 24, 27 & 28, 27 & 28]: Rep rows 4 and 5 of established pattern.

Rows 21–24 [21–24, 25–28,

25–28, 29–32, 29–32]: Rep rows 2–5 of established pattern.

Rows 25 & 26 [25 & 26, 29 & 30, 29 & 30, 33 & 34, 33 & 34]: Rep rows 2 and 3 of established pattern.

Row 27 [27, 31, 31, 35, 35]: TKS across row, return. Fasten off.

Right Shoulder & Sleeve

Row 15 [15, 19, 19, 23, 23]: Join yarn at st marker, draw up a tall lp (counts as first EKS), EKS in each st across, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across to last 4 lps, yo, draw through last 4 lps on hook (3-st dec). (83 [87, 90, 94, 97, 101] EKS)

Row 16 [16, 20, 20, 24, 24]: EKS in each st across, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across to last 4 lps, yo, draw through last 4 lps on hook (3-st dec). (80 [84, 87, 91, 94, 98] EKS)

Rows 17 & 18 [17 & 18, 21 & 22, 21 & 22, 25 & 26, 25 & 26]: TKS in each st across row, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps] across. (80 [84, 87, 91, 94, 98] TKS)

Rows 19 & 20 [19 & 20, 23 & 24, 23 & 24, 27 & 28, 27 & 28]: Rep rows 4 and 5 of established pattern.

Rows 21–24 [21–24, 25–28, 25–28, 29–32, 29–32]: Rep rows 2–5 of established pattern.

Rows 25 & 26 [25 & 26, 29 & 30, 29 & 30, 33 & 34, 33 & 34]:

Rep rows 2 and 3 of established pattern.

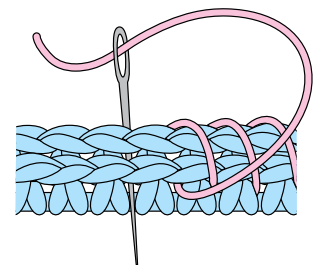
Row 27 [27, 31, 31, 35, 35]: TKS across row, return. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Wet-block and pin pieces to measurements. Do not stretch pieces. Pin any curled edges to remove any curl.

Before sewing, place RS of Front and Back pieces facing each other, and pin garment beg at back neckline, find exact center of garment and using this as center point, measure width of neckline half on either side of center and place marker at each side of the neckline. Pin each Front shoulder to Back shoulder markers.

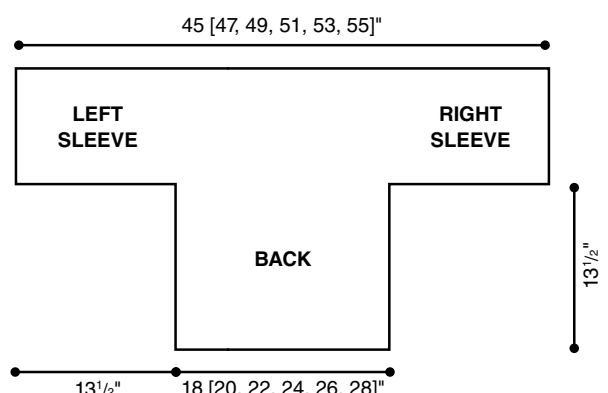
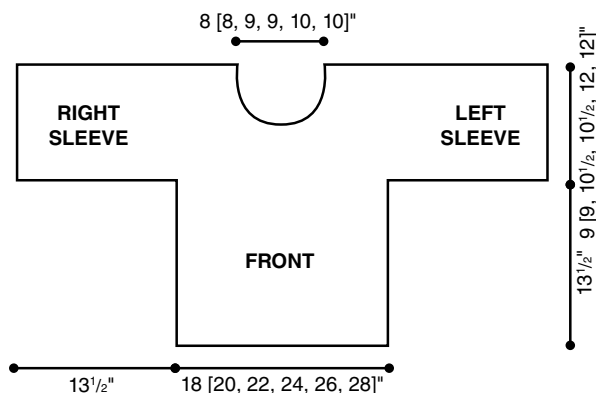

ORGANIZER BACK

Row 1: Beg at bottom, with 2 strands held tog, ch 39, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across, turn. (37 dc)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

Rows 3–25: Rep row 2. At the end of row 25, **do not turn**.

Joining

Rnd 26: Now working in rnds, pin side edges of Upper Pocket to ends of row 13–19 on each side of Organizer Back, pin side edges of Lower Pocket in same manner between rows 1–9.

Working in ends of rows on left side of Organizer Back, ch 2, sl st around post of last dc at end of row 25, [ch 2, sl st around dc at end of next row] 5 times to pinned top edge of Upper Pocket, ch 2, working through both thicknesses, work sl st in same sp as last sl st of Upper Pocket Top Trim and around dc of next row of Organizer Back, [sk next dc of pocket, ch 2, work sl st through next dc of Upper Pocket

and around dc of next row of Organizer Back] 6 times,

A. [ch 2, sl st around dc of next row of Organizer Back] 3 times to Top Trim of Lower Pocket, ch 2, work sl st in same sp as last sl st of Lower Pocket Top Trim and around dc of next row of Organizer Back, ch 2, work sl st through next dc of Lower Pocket side edge and around dc of next row of Organizer Back, [sk next dc of Lower Pocket side edge, ch 2, sl st in next dc of Lower Pocket side edge and around dc of next row of Organizer Back] 7 times;

B. ch 2, sl st into rem dc of Lower Pocket and into first ch of opposite side of foundation ch of Organizer Back row 1, ch 2, sl st in same sp as last sl st to create corner, [sk next ch of Organizer Back Bottom Trim, ch 2, sl st in next ch and around next dc of pocket]

18 times across bottom edge to right bottom corner, turn work to right;

C. ch 2, sl st in same sp as last sl st to create corner, [sk next dc of Lower Pocket side edge, ch 2, sl st into next dc of Lower Pocket side edge and around dc in end of next row of Organizer Back] 9 times;

D. ch 2, sl st into first ch-2 sp at top edge of Upper Pocket and around next dc at end of row of Organizer Back, [ch 2, sl st around next dc of Organizer Back] 3 times, ch 2, sl st in ch at bottom of first dc of Upper Pocket side edge and around next dc of Organizer Back, [sk next ch at bottom of next dc of Upper Pocket side edge, ch 2, sl st into next ch at bottom of next dc of Upper Pocket side edge and around dc at end of next row of Organizer Back] 5 times;

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge

- ½-inch pearl shank button
- Fabric stiffener



Gauge

19 sc = 4 inches; 10 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Cluster (cl): [Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 4 times, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

down side edge, 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch (corner), sc in each ch across, ending with 3 sc in last ch (corner), working in ends of row on opposite edge, work 82 sc evenly sp across, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Row 2 (RS): Now working in rows, join white in center sc of corner group and working across long edge (sc sts worked on side edge of rows), [ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), cl (see Special Stitch) in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sl st in next sc] across side edge. Fasten off. (21 cls)

Row 3 (RS): Working on opposite side edge, join white in center

corner sc, [ch 3, cl in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sl st in next sc] across side edge. Fasten off. (21 cls)

NEEDLE SLEEVE

Row 1: With white, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (12 sc)

Rows 2–7: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 7, leaving a 12-inch length, fasten off.

LACE TRIM

Row 1: With white, ch 4, 11 dc in first ch of ch-4, turn. (12 dc)

Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), [dc in next dc, ch 1] 10 times, dc in next dc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 5 (see *Pattern Notes*), [dc in next dc, ch 2] 10 times, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

Row 4: Ch 4, sc in next ch-2 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, hdc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in hdc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, (hdc, dc, ch 2) in same ch-5 sp, (dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 4 times, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of ch-4, turn.

Rnd 6 (RS): Now working in rnds, [7 sc in next ch-5 sp] 5 times, sc in next 3 sts, 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 3 sts, [7 sc in next ch-5 sp] 5 times, working in ends of rows, work 24 sc evenly sp across, join in first sc, leaving an 18-inch length, fasten off.

Block Lace Trim and saturate with fabric stiffener. Dry on flat surface.

FINISHING

With WS facing and cl-trimmed edge at top and bottom, fold bottom section up 5½ inches and with length of white, sew tog at left and right side edges.

Thread yarn needle with length of turquoise, and starting at left side and matching rows, seam

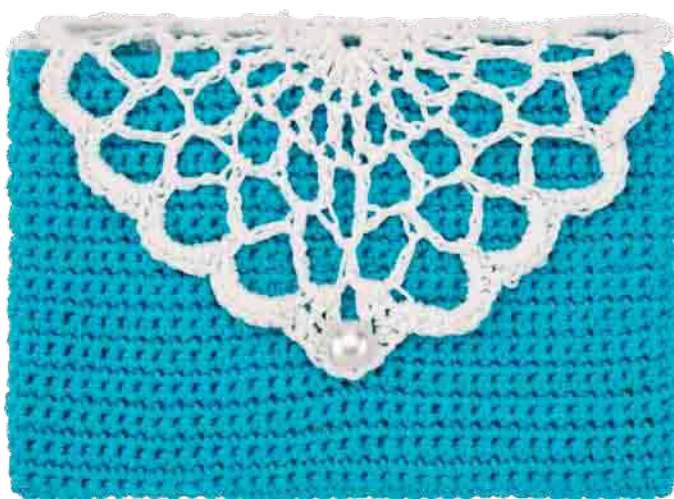
pockets for hooks approximately 4 rows apart from each other making 11 pockets or as many hook pockets as desired.

Seam another pocket 16 rows over for medium-size items. Leave rem section open for large pocket. Attach Needle Sleeve to last, largest right-hand pocket front.

Fold top edge of Case Trim down on Case so that cl edges are

touching. Position Lace Trim to right-hand side edge of opened Case even with bottom, sew the 24 sc of edge to center 24 sc of Case.

To close Case, with top cl edge folded down touching bottom cl pocket sections and Lace Trim to the right. Starting at left, fold Case into thirds, fold Lace Trim over and mark position for pearl button. Sew button to Case. **cw**

TOP/BOTTOM

Make 2.

Row 1: Using 1 strand each rainbow and pink (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 48, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (47 hdc)

Rows 2–21: Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each st across, turn. At the end of row 21, **do not fasten off**.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, turn work to right, ch 1, sc in end of row 21, work 26 sc evenly sp (see *Pattern Notes*) in ends of rows 20–1, turn work to right, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, work 1 sc in each of next 47 chs, turn work to right, ch 1, work 27 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–21, ch 1, turn work to right, sc in top of ch-2, sc in each of rem 46 sts, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (148 sc)

SIDE GUSSET

Row 1: Using 1 strand each rainbow and pink, ch 9, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 hdc)

Rows 2–82: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn. At the end of row 82, **do not turn**.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, turn work to right, ch 1, work 123 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 82–1. Fasten off. (123 sc)

Join 1 strand each rainbow and pink to opposite long edge of Gusset and work 123 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–82. Fasten off. (123 sc)

TOP FLAP

Row 1: Using 1 strand each rainbow and pink, ch 10, hdc in

2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (9 hdc)

Rows 2–23: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn. At the end of row 32, **do not turn**.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, turn work to right, ch 1, sc in end of row 23, work 27 more sc evenly sp in ends of rows 22–1, turn work to right, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, work 1 sc in each of 9 chs, turn work to right, ch 1, turn work to right and work 28 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–23, ch 1, turn work to right, sc in top of ch-2, sc in each of rem 8 sts, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (74 sc)

END GUSSET FLAP

Row 1: Using 1 strand each rainbow and pink, ch 10, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (9 hdc)

Rows 2–37: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn. At the end of row 37, **do not turn**.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, turn work to right, ch 1, sc in end of row 37, work 47 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 36–1, turn work to right, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, work 1 sc in each of 9 chs, turn work to right, ch 1, work 48 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–37, ch 1, turn work to right, sc in top of ch-2, sc in each of rem 8 sts, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (114 sc)

SPOON TAB

Row 1: Using 2 strands of pink, ch 10, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (9 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, **do not turn**.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, turn work to right, ch 1, sc in end of row 2, work 2 more sc evenly sp to end of row 1, turn work to right, ch 1, working in opposite side of foundation ch, work 1 sc in each of 9 chs, turn work to right, ch 1, work 3 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1 and 2, ch 1, turn work to right, sc in top of ch-2, sc in each of rem 8 sts, join in beg sc. (24 sc)

Rnd 2: *[Ch 1, sl st into **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of next sc] 3 times, ch 1, sl st into back lp of ch-1, [ch 1, sl st in back lp of next sc] 9 times, ch 1, sl st in back lp of next ch-1, rep from * once, ch 1, sl st in same sp as beg ch-1. Fasten off. (29 sl sts)

FINISHING

1. Place 1 long edge of Side Gusset along both long edges and bottom short end of Top, with Top facing, join 2 strands pink through back lp of ch-1 sp of Top and first sc of Side Gusset, ch 1, sl st in same sp, [*ch 1, work sl st through both thicknesses in back lp of next sc of Top and Side Gusset**, rep from * to ** to corner, work ch 1, sl st into back lp of next ch at Top corner and next sc of Side Gusset] rep between [] once, rep from * to ** to last



sc before next corner. Fasten off. (123 sl sts)

- With Side Gusset facing, rep, joining Bottom to rem Side Gusset long edge in same manner.
2. With Top Flap facing, join 2 strands pink to back lp of first sc to left of ch-1 at right corner of 1 short end of Top Flap and to back lp of first sc at right end of 1 long side of End Gusset Flap, ch 1, work sl st in same sp, continue to work in same manner as step 1 to last sc of Top Flap to join 1 long edge and both short sides of Top Flap to 1 long side of End Gusset Flap. Fasten off. (48 sl st)

next ch-1 top corner of Side Gusset, sk over pink Edging, **do not ch 1**, sl st in next ch-1 of Flap top corner, [rep from * to ** 7 times, ch 5 (for button lp), sl st in same sp as last sl st] 3 times, rep from * to ** 7 times, ch 1, sl st in ch-1 of Flap top corner, sk over pink Edging, sl st into next ch-1 of End Gusset Flap top corner, rep from * to ** 5 times, ch 5 (button lp), sl st in same sp as last sl st rep from * to ** 4 times, ch 1, sl st in back lp of ch-1 bottom corner sp of End Gusset Flap, rep from * to ** 9 times, lay WS of next 30 sc of End Gusset Flap Edging to top of WS of next ch-1, 28 sc ch-1 of back edge, ch 1, sl st in next sc of End Gusset Flap and next ch-1 of back edge, rep from * to ** 28 times, ch 1, sl st in next sc of End Gusset Flap and next ch-1 of back edge, rep from * to ** 9 times, ch 1, sl st to top of first sl st of rnd. Fasten off. (106 sl sts)

4. Place Spoon Tab where desired and use needle and 1 strand pink to sew orange button in each end of Spoon Tab to top of Carrier. Sew rem buttons to Top and Side Gusset to correspond with button lps on End Gusset Flap. **CW**

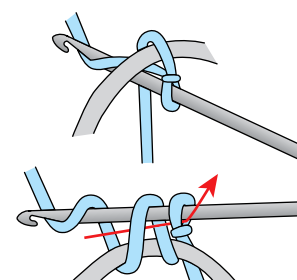
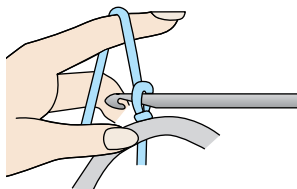

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), tr in same sc as beg ch-4, [dc in next sc, hdc in each of next 6 sc, dc in next sc, 3 tr in next sc] 3 times, dc in next sc, hdc in each of next 6 sc, dc in next sc, tr in same st as beg ch-4, join in beg ch-4, turn. (44 sts)

Row 3: Now working in rows, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each of next 11 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (12 hdc)

Rows 4–16: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 11 hdc, turn. At the end of row 16 fasten off.

LARGE POCKET

Row 1: With size I hook and 1 strand, ch 14, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (13 hdc)

Rows 2–13: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn. At the end of row 13, fasten off. (13 hdc)

6 balls #01116 blue jeans
5 balls each #01699 tangerine and #00082 jute
- Sizes H/8/5mm and K/10½/6.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

Size K hook with 3 strands held tog: 8 sc = 3 inches; 9 rows = 3 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Two methods for beginning these baskets are given—the first method uses the traditional chain and first row of single crochet. The second method uses a foundation single crochet, which creates the chain and first row at the same time. Use either method.

Use 3 strands of yarn held together throughout and size K hook, unless otherwise directed.

Sides of the baskets are worked from the bottom to the top.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Foundation single crochet (foundation sc): Ch 2, insert

hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook (*1 ch*), yo, draw through 2 lps on hook (*foundation sc*), insert hook under 2 lps of ch made in first foundation sc, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 1 lp (*1 ch*), yo, draw through 2 lps. (*2 foundation sc*)

Continue in this manner for number of foundation sc needed.

BASKET #1

BOTTOM

Method 1

Row 1 (RS): With size K hook and 3 strands of jute (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

Row 1 (RS): With size K hook and 3 strands of jute, work 8 **foundation sc** (see *Special Stitch*), turn. (8 foundation sc)

Ch 1, 2 sc in same sp as last sc on row 9, place marker in first of these 2 sc, working along next side in ends of rows, sk row 9, sc in each of next 7 rows, working along next side, 2 sc in bottom of first sc of row 1, place marker in first of these 2 sc, sc in bottom of each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in bottom of last sc, place marker in last of these 2 sc, working along next side in ends of rows, sk row 1, sc in next 8 rows, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc of row 9, place

marker in joining sl st. Fasten off. (35 sc, 1 sl st)

SIDE

Make 4.

Method 1

Row 1 (RS): With size K hook and 3 strands of jute, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

Method 2

Row 1 (RS): With size K hook and 3 strands of jute, work 8 foundation sc, turn. (8 foundation sc)

Both Methods

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Rows 3–11: Rep row 2. At end of row 9, **do not turn**.

EDGING

Ch 1, 2 sc in same sp as last sc on row 11, place marker in first

of these 2 sc, working along next side in ends of rows, sk row 11, sc in each of next 9 rows, working along next side, 2 sc in bottom of first sc of row 1, place marker in first of these 2 sc, sc in bottom of each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in bottom of last sc, place marker in last of these 2 sc, working along next side in ends of rows, sk row 1, sc in each of next 10 rows, join in first sc of row 11, place marker in joining sl st. Fasten off. (39 sc, 1 sl st)

ASSEMBLY

With RS facing, pin Sides tog at marked sts. With size H hook and 1 strand jute, starting at bottom of any 2 Sides, sc in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of corresponding sts across Sides. Fasten off. Rep on rem Sides.

Pin Bottom to bottom edges of Sides. With size H hook and 1

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

PURSE

Rnd 1: Beg at bottom with size F hook and **2 strands of black**

held tog (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 7, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 4 chs, 5 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 4 chs, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. (18 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in same sc as beg ch-1, 2 sc in each of next 4 sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in each of next 5 sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, join in beg sc. (28 sc)

Rnds 3–9: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, inc 3 sc evenly sp at each inc end, join in beg sc. (70 sc)

Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each st around, join in beg sc. (70 sc)

Fold oval in half lengthwise. Place safety pin in center st of each end to mark center side edges. There should be 34 sts between each pin.

Place 3rd safety pin to mark first st of the following rnd.

Rnds 11–20: Ch 1, sc in each st around, inc 1 sc at each center side edge, **do not join rnds**. (90 sc)

Rnds 21–40: Sc in each sc around, **do not join rnds**. Fasten off at end of last rnd.

UPPER PURSE

First Side

Remove safety pins, re-mark center side edges on rnd 40. There should be 44 sts between each pin.

Row 1: With size F hook, join 2 strands of black to 17th sc to the right of 1 center side edge safety pin, ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sts, sc

in each of next 15 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts (*center side*), sc in each of next 15 sc, sc dec in last 2 sc, turn. (33 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 13 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 14 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (30 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 12 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 12 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (27 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 11 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 10 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (24 sc)

Row 5: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 10 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 8 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (21 sc)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 8 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 7 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (18 sc)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (15 sc)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 7 sc, turn. (14 sc)


Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 6 sc, turn. (13 sc)

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 6 sc, turn. (12 sc)

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, turn. (11 sc)

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, turn. (10 sc)

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 4 sc. Fasten off. (9 sc)

TOP OPENING TRIM

Row 1: With size F hook, join 2 strands black to side of last sc of row 13 on RS of Purse, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, work 15 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 12–1, sc in each of rem 9 sc of rnd 40, work 16 sc evenly sp in ends of rows 1–12. Fasten off. (41 sc)

Rep row 1 on opposite side edge of Purse.

ZIPPER EDGING

Rnd 1: Place safety pin 12 inches away from zipper stop to mark top edge of zipper.

With size 3 steel hook, attach 1 strand black to zipper's long side edge at safety pin, approximately ¼ inch from zipper coil, ch 1, sc in same sp, ch 1, [sc, ch 1] 41 times on long edge of zipper tape approximately ⅛ inch apart to end of zipper, ch 1 (*first corner made*), turn zipper to right and sc in same sp again, work [ch 1, sc] 3 times across short end of zipper, ch 1 (*2nd corner made*), turn zipper to right and work 1 sc in same sp as last sc, work [ch 1, sc] 41 times along opposite long edge of zipper, ch 1 (*3rd corner made*), if using a longer zipper, use needle and thread to tack zipper coils tog to permanently close zipper and trim off excess ¼ inch above stitching just made, turn zipper to right and sc in same sp, [sc, ch 1] twice more across end of zipper, ch 1, sc in same sp as first sc of rnd, ch 1 (*4th corner made*), join in beg sc. Fasten off.

PURSE TO ZIPPER JOINING

Row 1: With size F hook, join 2 strands black through top of first sc of Purse opening row 1 at side edge of Purse, ch 1, with

Row 1: Beg at neckline, ch 29, tr in 4th ch from hook (*3 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in same ch, 2 hdc in next ch, (hdc, ch 1, hdc)

in next ch, hdc in each of next 20 chs, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch, 2 hdc in next ch, (dc, tr) in last ch, turn. (*28 hdc, 2 tr, 3 dc, 2 ch-1 sps*)

Row 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), (tr, dc) in first tr, 2 hdc in next dc, [hdc in each hdc across to next ch-1 sp, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch-1 sp] twice, hdc in each of next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next dc, (dc, tr) in last tr, turn. (*28 hdc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 2 ch-1 sps*)

Row 3: Ch 1, (tr, dc) in first tr, 2 hdc in next dc, [hdc in each hdc across to next ch-1 sp, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in ch-1 sp] twice, hdc in each hdc to the dc, 2 hdc in dc, (dc, tr) in last tr, turn. (*40 hdc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 2 ch-1 sps*)

Rows 4–34: Rep row 3. At the end of row 34, ch 1, turn. Each end section inc by 3 hdc sts each

row and the center section will inc by 2 hdc sts per row. (*288 hdc, 2 tr, 2 dc, 2 ch-1 sps*)

Row 35: Sl st in each hdc, dc, tr and in each ch-1 sp across row 34, turn.

Row 36: Beg shell (*see Special Stitches*) in first st, [dc in each of next 5 sts, **shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in next st] rep across row, turn.

Row 37: Ch 3, dc in 2nd dc, dc each dc across to next tr of shell, [shell in tr, dc in each dc across to next tr of shell] across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Rows 38 & 39: Rep row 37.

BORDER

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge of Wrap, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first sc, turn.

Rnd 2: Sl st in each st around outer edge, join in first sl st. Fasten off. **CW**

- Yarn needle



GAUGE

Size 7 hook: 20 sc = 4 inches

Size F hook: 11 sc = 2 inches;

11 sc rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Blanket is crocheted vertically.

SPECIAL STITCH

Popcorn (pc): 4 sc in indicated st, draw up a lp, remove hook,

insert hook in first sc of 4-sc group, pick up dropped lp and draw through st on hook, ch 1.

BLANKET

LEFT PANEL

Row 1 (RS): With size 7 hook, ch 158, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (157 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, with RS facing, working in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), sl st in each st across, sl st in turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, working in rem free lps of row 2, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 3, sk each of next 2 sc, sc in next sc, turn, work 1 sc in each ch of next 3 chs just made, sl st in next sc, turn, work 1 sc in each of 2 sk sc (*cable made*), rep from * across row, ending with sc in last st of row, turn. (52 cables)

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc and in next 2 sc behind cable, *work 2 sc in next sc (*in front of next cable*), sc in next sc (*behind same cable*), sk sc where ch was attached on previous row, rep from * across, ending with sc in last st (*or turning ch depending on st count of project*), turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, with RS facing, working in front lp, sl st in each st across, sl st in turning ch, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, working in rem free lps of row 6, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 9: Change to size H hook, ch 1, sc in first st, ch 1, sk next st, **pc** (see *Special Stitch*) in next st, *sk next st, sc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, pc in next st, rep from * across, ending with sc in last st, turn. (39 pc)

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in top of pc, *ch 1, sc in ch-1 sp of previous row, ch 1, sc in top of pc, rep from * across, ending with sc in last sc of row, turn.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, pc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, ending with ch 1, sc in last sc, turn. (38 pc)

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sc in top of pc, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, sc in last sc, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first sc, *ch 1, pc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, ending sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (39 pc)

Rows 14–45: [Rep rows 10–13 consecutively] 8 times.

Rows 46 & 47: Rep rows 10 and 11.

Note: Completed section is 20 pc rows wide.

Row 48: Change to size 7 hook, ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in each ch-1 sp and in each pc across row, ending with sc in last sc, turn. (157 sc)

Rows 49–54: Rep rows 3–8.

CENTER PANEL

Row 1: Change to size F hook, ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Rows 2–4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each of next 14 sc, beg pc heart working *pc in next sc, sc in next sc, pc in next sc, sc in each of next 15 sc, rep from * across, ending last rep with 14 sc, turn. (8 pc hearts)



Row 6 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each sc and in top of each pc across, turn. (157 sc)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each of next 13 sc, *[pc in next sc, sc in next sc] twice, pc in next sc, sc in each of next 13 sc, rep from * across, ending with 1 sc in each of next 13 sts, turn.

Row 8: Rep row 6.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each of next 12 sc, *[pc in next sc, sc in next sc] 3 times, pc in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sc, rep from * across row, ending with sc in each of next 12 sc, turn.

Row 10: Rep row 6.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each of next 11 sc, *[pc in next sc, sc in next sc] 3 times, pc in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sc, rep from * across, ending with sc in each of last 13 sc, turn.

Row 12: Rep row 6.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in each of next 10 sc, *[pc in next sc, sc in next sc] 3 times, pc in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sc, rep from * across, ending with sc in each of next 14 sc, turn.

Row 14: Rep row 6.

Row 15: Rep row 11.

Row 16: Rep row 6.

Row 17: Rep row 9.

Row 18: Rep row 6.

Row 19: Rep row 7.

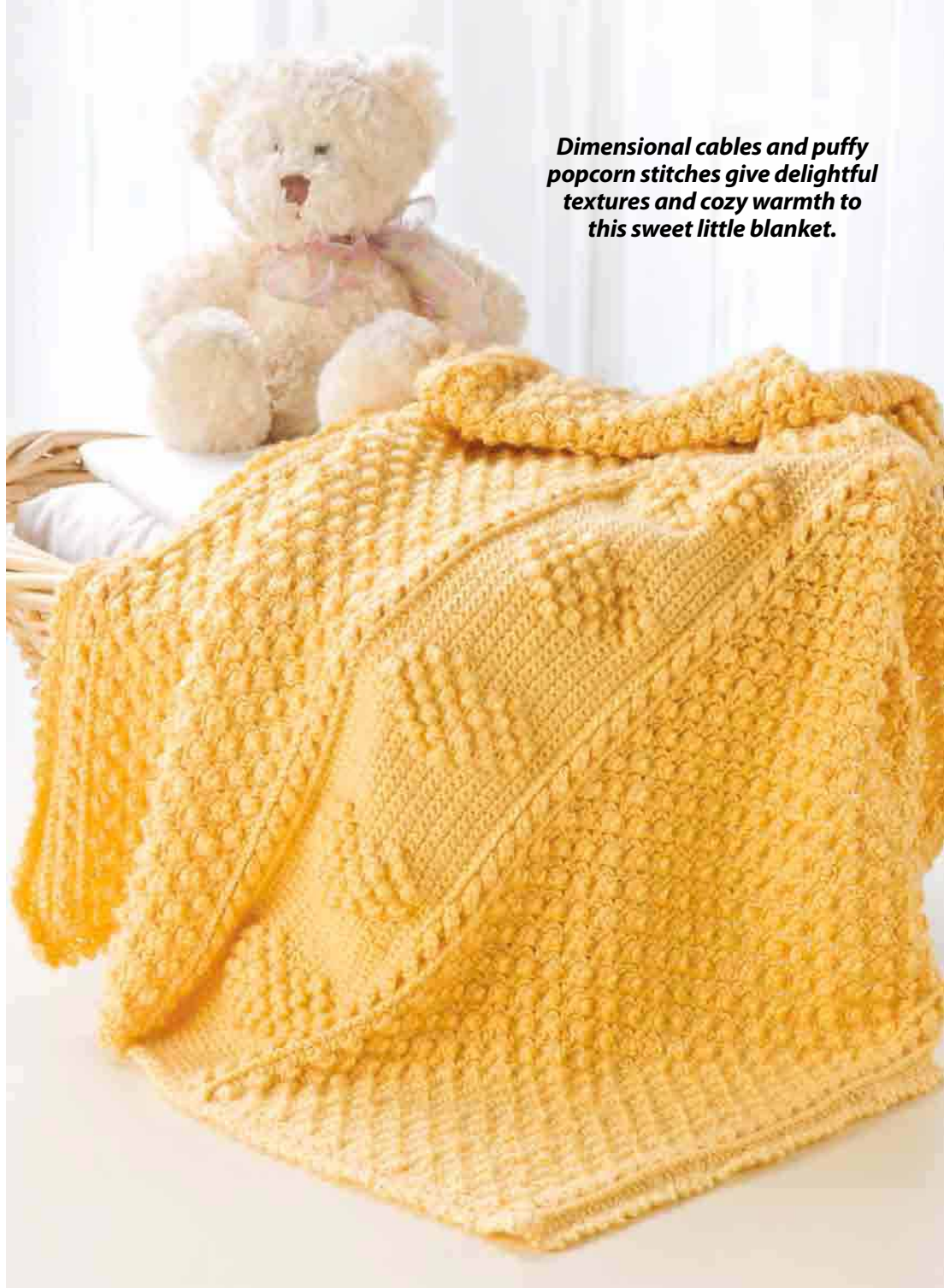

Rows 21–29 [23–31, 27–37]: Rep row 2.

First Shoulder

Row 30 [32, 38]: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in each of next 3 [3, 4] sc, leaving rem sc unworked, turn. (4 [4, 5] sc)

Row 31 [33, 39]: Rep row 2. Fasten off.

2nd Shoulder

Row 30 [32, 38]: Sk next 12 [14, 18] sc (for neck opening), **join** (see Pattern Notes) in next sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 [3, 4] sc, turn. (4 [4, 5] sc)

Row 31 [33, 39]: Rep row 2. Fasten off.

FRONT

First Neck & Shoulder

Row 28 [28, 32]: Ch 1, sc in each of next 8 [8, 9] sc, leaving rem sc unworked, turn. (8 [8, 9] sc)

Row 29 [29, 33]: Sl st across 2 sc, ch 1, sc in each of next 6 [6, 7] sc, turn. (6 [6, 7] sc)

Row 30 [30, 34]: Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 [4, 5] sc, leaving rem sc unworked, turn. (4 [4, 5] sc)

Row(s) 31 [31–33, 35–39]: Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

2nd Neck & Shoulder

Row 28 [28, 32]: Sk next 4 [6, 8] sc (for Front neckline opening), join in next sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 7 [7, 8] sc, turn. (8 [8, 9] sc)

(22 [24, 28] sc)

Rows 16–22 [22–24, 28–34]: Rep row 2.

Row 23 [25, 35]: Ch 1, sk first sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sk next sc, sc in last sc, turn. (22 [24, 28] sc)

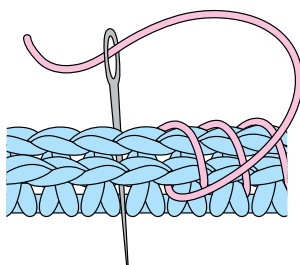

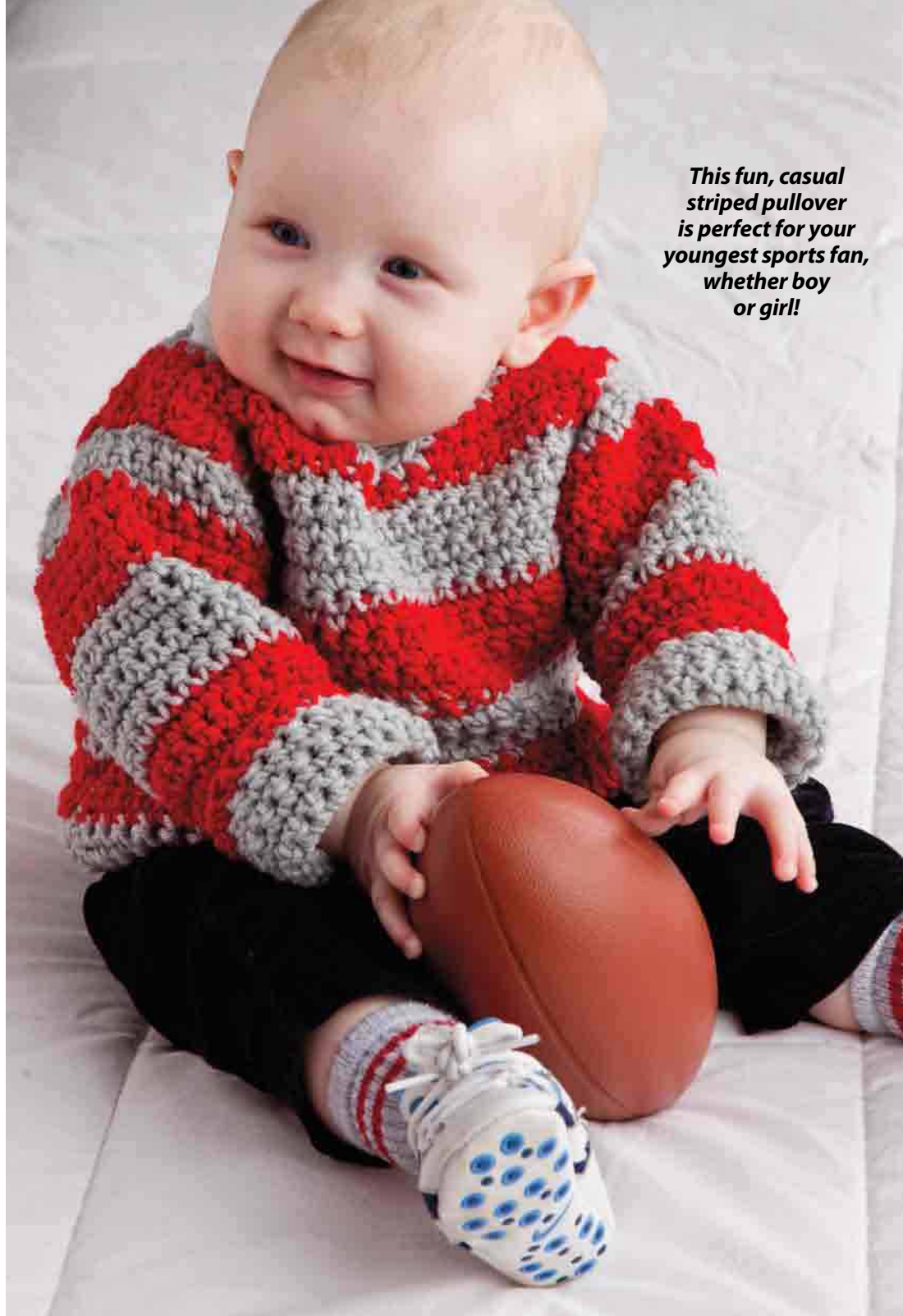

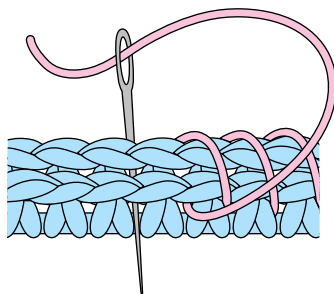

Rnd 13: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (24 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and sew to Body.

CHEEK

Make 2.

Rnd 1: With pumpkin, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (24 sc)

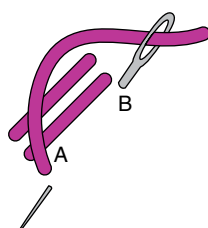

Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider Nose to center front of Head between Cheeks with straight stitches.

Make 4.

Rnd 1: With pumpkin, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around, inc 3 sc evenly sp around. (15 sc)

Rnds 4–7: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 8: Sc in each sc around, dec 3 sc evenly sp around. (12 sc)

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 3, sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (15 sc)

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body as indicated on Assembly Diagram.

EAR

Make 2.

Row 1: With pumpkin, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, turn. (3 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in next st, turn. (2 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Sew Ears to top of Head.

TAIL

Rnd 1: With pumpkin, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring, join in first sc. (6 sc)

Rnds 2–21: Ch 1, sc in each of next 6 sc, join in first sc, at the end of last rep, leaving 10-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff Tail with fiberfill, sew centered to back of Body.

STRIPES

Make 3 on each Leg, each side of Head, each side of Body and 2 groups of 3 on Tail (30 total).

Join black yarn with sl st around sc post of designated area, sc around posts of sts to desired length of stripe is achieved. Fasten off.

MONKEY

BODY

Rnd 1: With warm brown, ch 30, join (see Pattern Notes) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, sc in each ch around. (30 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (36 sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (42 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (54 sc)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (60 sc)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (66 sc)

Rnds 8–10: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 11: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 9 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (60 sc)

Rnd 12: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 8 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (54 sc)

Rnd 13: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 7 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnd 14: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 6 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (42 sc)

Rnd 15: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (36 sc)

Rnd 16: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, join in beg sc. (30 sc)

Leaving 14-inch length, fasten off. Matching sts of rnd 16 and opposite side of foundation ch, whipstitch tog, stuffing firmly with fiberfill as work progresses.

HEAD

Rnd 1: With warm brown, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, **place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (6 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times. (30 sc)

Rnds 5–9: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 10: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. (24 sc)

Stuff Head with fiberfill and sew to Body.

MUZZLE

Rnd 1: With buff, ch 5, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, 4 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 2 chs,



2 sc in same ch as beg 2-sc, place st marker. (12 sc)

Rnd 2: Sc in next sc, [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc] 3 times, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc. (16 sc)

Rnds 3 & 4: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 4, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. Sew Muzzle to front lower half of Head.

LEG

Make 4.

Rnd 1: With warm brown, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around, place st marker. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times. (9 sc)

Rnds 3–17: Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 17, leaving 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body as indicated on Assembly Diagram.

TAIL

With warm brown, leaving 4-inch

length at beg, ch 25, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [2 sc in next ch, sc in next ch] across, leaving 4-inch length, fasten off.

With rem lengths, sew Tail to center back of Body.

EAR

Make 2.

Inner Ear

Rnd 1: With buff, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 3 times, sl st in next st, fasten off. (9 sc)

Outer Ear

Rnd 1: With warm brown, ch 3, sl st in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring. (6 sc)

Rnd 2: [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 3 times. (9 sc)

Rnd 3: Place WS of Inner Ear and Outer Ear tog and working through both thicknesses, [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc] 3 times, sl st in next st, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (12 sc)

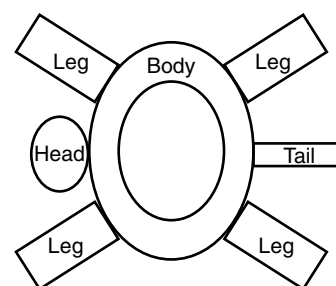
With Inner Ear facing forward, sew an Ear to each side of Head.

EYES

Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider Eyes, with ½ inch in between, just above Muzzle working 5–6 vertical straight stitches for each Eye.

NOSTRILS

Thread tapestry needle with black and embroider 2 straight stitches at a slight angle, with ¾ inch in between, for Nostrils at bottom edge, and with 1 inch in between, for Nostrils at top edge. **CW**

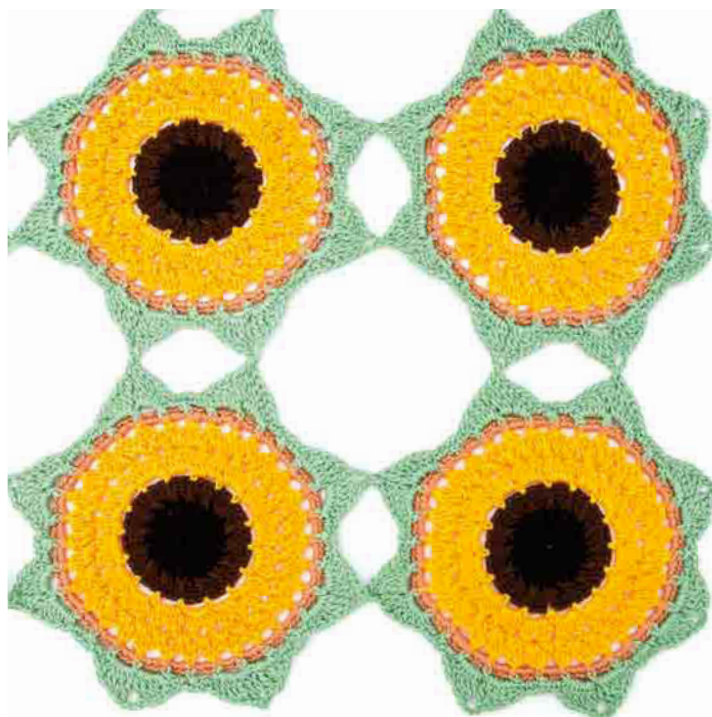

Rnd 4: With goldenrod, [sc in top of fpdc, ch 3, sk each of next 2 dc] around, join in first sc. (16 sc, 16 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 5: [Dc cl V-st (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join in first dc. (16 dc cl V-st, 16 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 6: Working in ch-3 sps, [work **split dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join with duplicate st. Fasten off. (32 split dc cls, 32 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 7: Join copper mist with sc in any ch-3 sp, work 2 sc in same ch-3 sp, **fphdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around top of next split dc cl, [3 sc in next ch-3 sp, fphdc around top of next split dc cl] around, join with duplicate st. (96 sc, 32 fphdc)

Rnd 8: Join sage with **fpssc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around fphdc,

ch 3, [fpssc around next fphdc, ch 3] around, join in first sc. (32 fpssc, 32 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 9: Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, *(2 dc, 2 edc—see *Special Stitches*, 2 tr) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3 (center

of leaf point), (2 tr, 2 edc, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3**, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join with duplicate st. (8 leaf points)

Rnd 3 (RS): Draw up a lp of white in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same sp, *ch 1, sk next 2 sc, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next sc, ch 1, sk next 2 sc**, sc in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around ending last rep at **, join in first sc, turn. (24 dc, 4 sc, 4 ch-2 sps, 8 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 4 (WS): Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc**, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in first sc, turn. (24 sc)

Rnd 5 (RS): Ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in each sc and each ch-1 sp around, working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in first sc. Fasten off. (52 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 6 (RS): Draw up a lp of buff in first sc to the left of any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same sc, *sk 2 sc, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc, rep from * around, working at each corner, shell in corner ch-2 sp, sc in next sc, join in first sc. Fasten off. (12 shells)

Rnd 7 (RS): Draw up a lp of Aran in dc to the left of center dc of any corner shell, ch 1, sc in same dc, *shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, rep

from * around, working at each corner, shell in next sc, sc in dc to the right of center dc of corner shell, shell in next dc, sc in next dc, join in first sc. Fasten off. (16 shells)

Rnd 8 (RS): Draw up a lp of white in center dc of any corner shell, ch 1, sc in same dc, *[ch 2, dc in next sc, ch 2, sc in center dc of next shell] 3 times, ch 2, dc in next sc, ch 2**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in center dc of next corner shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, (sc, ch 2) in center dc of same corner shell as beg sc, join in first sc. (36 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 9 (RS): Ch 3, 2 dc in each ch-2 sp, dc in each dc and each sc, (dc, ch 2, dc) in each corner ch-2 sp around, join in first dc. (108 dc, 4 ch-2 sps)

Rnd 10 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each dc around working (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch-2 sp, join in first sc. Fasten off. (116 sc, 4 ch-2 sps)

JOINING SQUARES

Note: At end of rnd 10, work rnds 11 and 12 around first Square. Join rem Squares in 4 rows of 5 Squares while working rnd 12. Join at corner ch-4 sps and at ch-2 sps on 1 or 2 sides as necessary:

A. Continuing in pattern st, join ch-4 sps by ch 2, drop lp from hook, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-4 sp, ch 2 and continue to join ch-2 sps, ch 1, drop lp from hook, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-2-sp, ch 1;

B. continue to join where 4 corners meet, ch-2, drop lp from hook, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-4 sp, ch 1, drop lp from hook, sk next ch-4 sp, draw lp under to over through next ch-4 sp, ch 2 and continue. When all Squares are joined, work Border.

rep from * around, working at each corner, ch 3, (sc, ch 4, sc) in corner ch-4 sp, join in beg sc, sl st in next ch-2 sp.

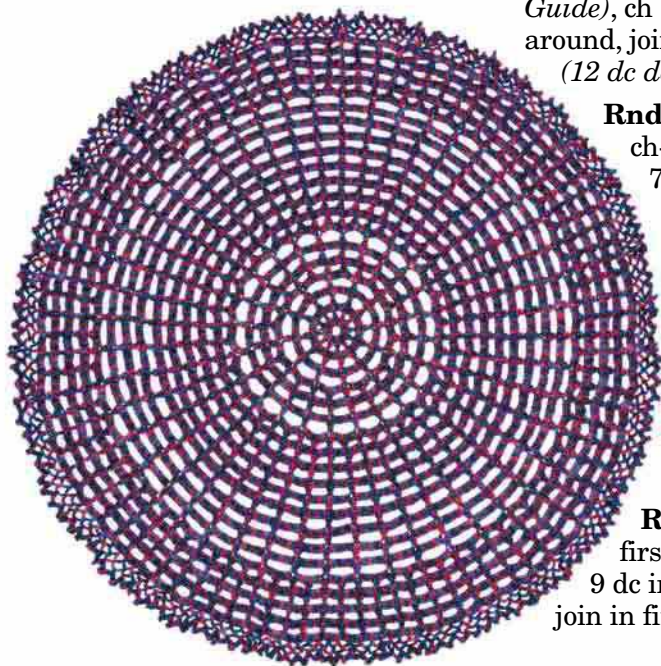

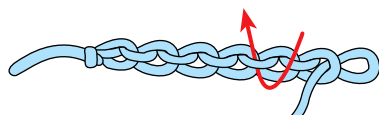

Rnd 2 (RS): Ch 1, *(sc, ch 1, dc) in marked ch-1 sp, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across edge next marked corner ch-1 sp, rep from * around, join in first sc, turn. (14 sc, 14 dc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

Rnd 3 (WS): Ch 1, *[sc in each dc, dc in each sc] across edge next marked corner ch-1 sp, (dc, ch 1, sc) in marked corner ch-1 sp, rep from * around, join in first sc, turn. (18 sc, 18 dc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

Rnd 4 (RS): Ch 1 *[sc in each dc, dc in each sc] across edge next marked corner ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 1, dc) in marked corner ch-1 sp, rep from * around, join in first sc, turn. (22 sc, 22 dc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

Rnds 5–8: [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] twice. At the end of rnd 8, fasten off. (38 sc, 38 dc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

Rnd 9 (RS): Join woodsman in any st, ch 1, [sc in each st across

edge to corner ch-1 sp, (sc, ch 1, sc) in corner ch-1 sp] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (84 sc, 4 corner ch-1 sps)

Note: St count between st markers should be 24 sts each long edge and 18 sts each short edge.

JOINING

Blocks are joined tog in 5 strips of 5 blocks each. Holding WS tog of first Block and 2nd Block with first Block facing, join yarn in corner ch-1 sp at right on top long side of Block, ch 1, sc in same st as joining, on 2nd Block, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next st, on first Block, sk next st, sc in next st, continue alternating sc in each Block's edging to corner ch-1 sp on 2nd Block. Fasten off.

Join rem Blocks for strip, joining 3rd Block to opposite edge of 2nd Block, 4th Block to opposite edge of 3rd Block, and 5th Block to opposite edge of 4th Block.


Join strips of 5 blocks tog following same instructions except working in short ends of Blocks and in ch sps and ends of joining rows as needed to maintain pattern of joining. Fasten off at end of each strip.

EDGING

Note: Place stitch marker in each of the 4 corner ch-1 sps.

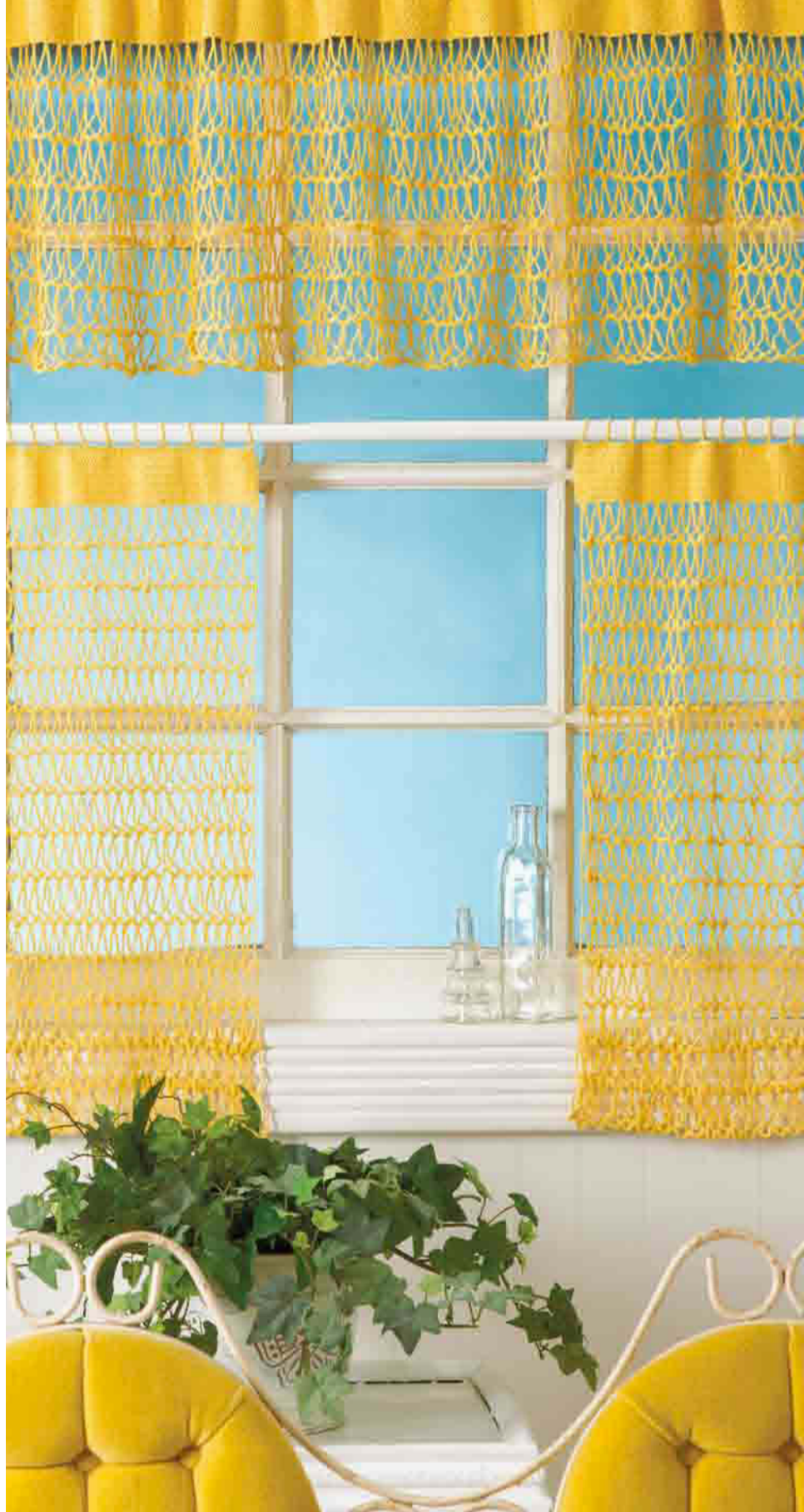

(25 ch lps)

Row 15: Ch 10 (see *Pattern Notes*), work 9 sc in each lp across the row, ch 1, **oct tr** (see *Special Stitches*) in last st, turn.

Row 16: Ch 1, sc in each of the first 2 sts, sl st in the **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of next 4 sts, ch 1, sc in next st (*5th sc in lp*), *ch 18, sc around ch of 18 (*fold top of ch back to meet itself and sc through lp created by the fold, release the top, now completed*

is a sc worked around the ch of sts), ch 9, sc in 5th st in lp, rep from * to last lp, sc in 5th st of last lp, sl st in front lp only on the next 4 sts, sc in the 10th and 9th ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 17: Ch 13 (see *Pattern Notes*), 9 sc in each lp across row, ch 1, **und tr** (see *Special Stitches*) in last st, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, ch 20, sc around ch-20, ch 9, sc in 5th st in lp, *ch 18, sc around ch-18, ch 9, sc in 5th st in lp, rep from * to last lp, ch 18, sc around ch-18, ch 11, sc in 13th and 12th ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 19: Ch 13, 9 sc in each lp across row, ch 1, und tr in last st, turn.

Rows 20–43: [Rep rows 16–19 consecutively] 6 times. At the end of row 43, fasten off.

ROD LPS

Row 1: Join (see *Pattern Notes*) cotton in upper right corner of Panel, ch 18, sc in first st, [sc in each of next 6 sts, sc in next st, ch 18, sc in next st] 13 times. Fasten off. (14 ch-18 lps)

VALANCE

Row 1: Ch 386, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (385 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, [sc in each dc, dc in each sc] across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each dc, dc in each sc across, turn.

Rows 5–12: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 4 times.

Row 13: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in next st, sc in each rem st across to last 2 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. (384 sc)

Row 14: Rep row 14 of Panel. (95 ch lps)


Row 15: Rep row 15 of Panel.

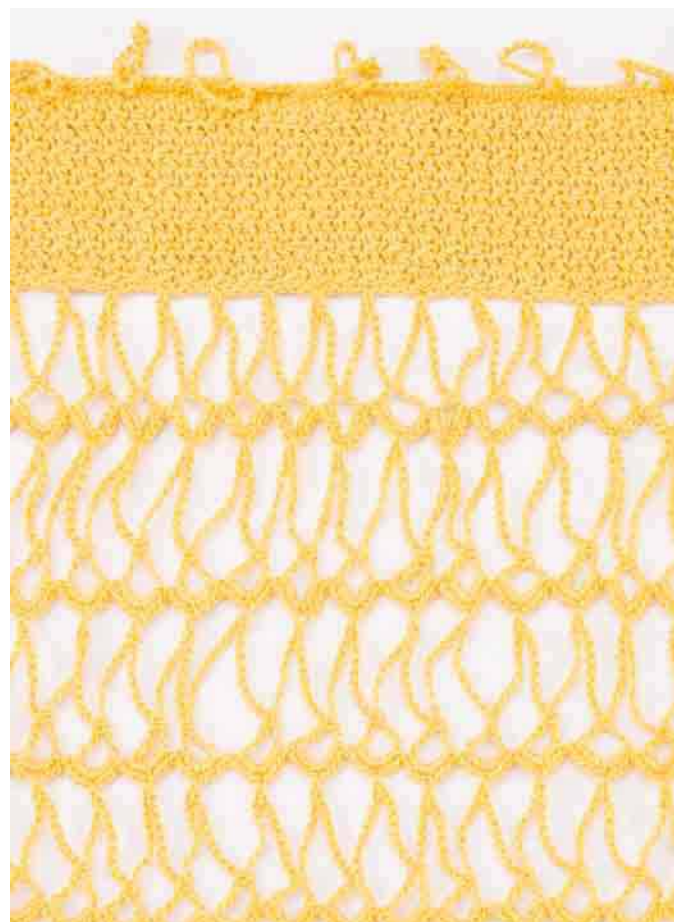

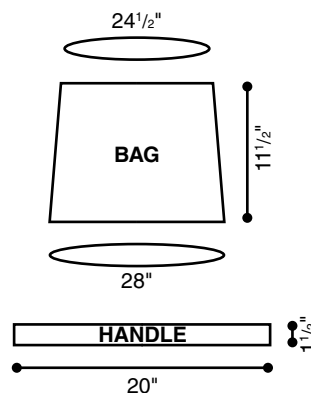
TWISTED CORD

Holding the pieces tog, place 1 end around something stationary, like a doorknob, or have another person hold it. Now twist the other end (*Tip: Use battery operated drill at medium speed*) until the yarn beg to fold in on itself. Now pinch at the center point and bring ends tog. Release the center and allow the

yarn to twist tog. Smooth and tie knots at each end to secure.

Starting at center front (*between ends of Handle*), weave through ch-1 sps of rnd 23, pull ends to close opening, tie end in a bow. **CW**

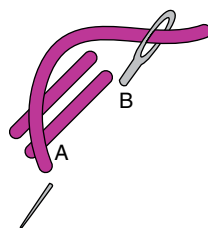

ASSEMBLY

Thread 1 strand through tapestry needle and use **straight**

and Lower Pockets to create smaller sections to hold items.

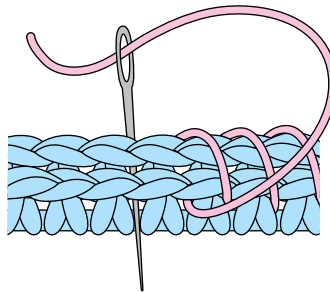

Fasten off.

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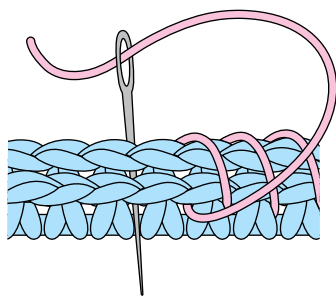

long edge of zipper RS up and along Purse opening and working through both thicknesses, 1 sc in same sp in row 1 and in corner ch-1 of zipper, work 41 sc through sc sts of Purse top opening row 1 and ch 1 sp on long edge of zipper to opposite end of Purse opening. Fasten off. Rep row 1 to attach opposite side of zipper and Purse opening tog.

With needle and 1 strand black **whipstitch** (see illustration) tops of last 3 sc of zipper just made to adjacent 3 sc of zipper on opposite side of zipper, knot to secure. Whipstitch on opposite side of zipper.



Whipstitch Edges

FIRST STRAP

Row 1: On side end of Purse, press sc sts of zipper short end and rem sc sts of row 13 of Purse tog forming double thickness 2 inches wide to attach Strap. Attach 2 strands black to right edge, ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in same st, work 6 sc evenly sp to opposite side, turn. (7 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (5 sc)

Rows 3–72: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 72, fasten off.

Rep rows 1 and 2 on opposite end of Purse. At the end of row 2, leaving a 10-inch length, fasten off.

Assembly

Thread tapestry needle with rem length from row 2 of Strap, whipstitch edges of row 2 to opposite side of row 72 of Strap, secure. Fasten off.

Edging

With size F hook, join 1 strand black in side edge of row 1 of Strap, *ch 1, sc evenly sp along side edge of Strap to row 1 at opposite end. Fasten off. With size F hook, attach 1 strand of black on opposite edge of Strap in side edge of row 1, rep from * once.

POLKA DOTS

Note: Make Polka Dots in the following colors and sizes:

Pale lemon yellow: 2 Dots rnds 1–6 and 2 Dots rnds 1–5.

Sky blue: 2 Dots rnds 1–6 and 2 Dots rnds 1–4.

Brick: 2 Dots rnds 1–5 and 2 Dots rnds 1–3.

Titanium: 2 Dots rnds 1–7 and 2 Dots rnds 1–3.

Linen white: 2 Dots rnds 1–4 and 3 Dots rnds 1–3.

Rnd 1: With size B hook and 1 strand yarn, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join rnds, place stitch marker and move as work progresses. (5 sc)

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (10 sc)

Rnd 3: [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 5 times. (15 sc)

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc] 5 times. (20 sc)

Rnd 5: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc] 5 times. (25 sc)

Rnd 6: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc] 5 times. (30 sc)

Rnd 7: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc] 5 times, sl st in next st, leaving a length of yarn for sewing, fasten off. (35 sc)

Sew Dots to Purse as shown in photo or as desired.



2ND STRAP

Row 1: Use tapestry needle and 1 strand of black to whipstitch tops of end sc of Purse top opening tog. Press end of Purse top opening and center side edge tog, with size F hook, attach 2 strands of black, ch 1, work 5 sc through both thicknesses across edge, turn. (5 sc)

Rows 2–72: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 72, fasten off.

Rep row 1 on opposite end of Purse, leaving a length, fasten off. Sew row 72 of 2nd Strap to row 1.

With size F hook, join 1 strand black in side edge of row 1 of Strap, *ch 1, sc evenly sp along side edge of Strap to row 1 at opposite end. Fasten off. With size F hook, attach 1 strand of black on opposite edge of Strap in side edge of row 1, rep from * once.

SNAP FASTENER CLOSURE

If desired, with sewing needle and black thread, sew 4 snap fasteners evenly sp across Top Opening Trim edge. **CW**
