# Mirror Lake Throw

1 2 3 4 5 6 **INTERMEDIATE**

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

48 x 60 inches

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Homespun bulky (chunky) weight acrylic/polyester yarn (6 oz/185 yds/170g per skein):
  - 5 skeins each #407 painted desert and #368 Montana sky
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle



## GAUGE

Motif = 9 inches square

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

It is recommended to change colors at the beginning of a new round due to the self-stripping nature of the yarn. If you must

change colors mid-round, pull yarn from the new skein until you reach a section that closely matches the color you ended off with.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

## THROW

### MOTIF 1

**Make 20.**

**Rnd 1:** With painted desert, ch 6, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 15 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

# Star Tablecloth

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

57 x 62 inches

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (1,000 yds per ball):

4 balls #201  
white

- Size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Small safety pins

## GAUGE

Motif point to point = 6¾ inches;  
Motif width = 5¾ inches; 9 dc =  
1 inch; 7 dc rnds = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Each Motif requires 58 yards; make a total of 61 Motifs.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

When joining a Motif to a corner with 2 adjacent Motifs already joined together, here's how to make a smooth joining: Insert hook in first corner chain-3 space, yarn over, draw up a loop (2 loops on hook), insert hook in 2nd chain-3 corner space, yarn over, draw up a loop and draw that loop through the 2 loops on hook.

Once your Tablecloth begins to grow, it will become increasingly difficult to be sure of placement of the next Motif. Here is a simple solution: After joining a Motif, attach a safety pin to round 8 on each edge of Motifs to which the next Motif will be joined. Move pins along as work progresses.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Shell:** (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in ch-3 sp.

**Beginning V-stitch (beg V-st):** Ch 6, dc in same st or sp as beg ch-6.

**V-stitch (V-st):** (Dc, ch 3, dc) in indicated st or sp.

## TABLECLOTH

### FIRST MOTIF

**Make 61.**

**Rnd 1:** Ch 8, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, ch 3, [3 dc in ring, ch 3] 5 times in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (18 dc, 6 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, \*ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3\*\*, dc in each of next 3 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (24 dc, 12 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, \*[ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] twice, ch 3\*\*, dc in each of next 3 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (30 dc, 18 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, \*[ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times, ch 3\*\*, dc in each of next 3 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (36 dc, 24 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 3, dc in each of next

2 dc, \*3 dc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp] twice, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp\*\*, dc in each of next 3 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (66 dc, 18 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, [dc in each of next 9 dc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp] 5 times, dc in each of next 3 dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (96 dc, 12 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 8 dc, [2 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 15 dc] 5 times, 2 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 6 dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (114 dc, 6 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 10 dc, [**shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 19 dc] 5 times, shell in next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 8 dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (150 dc, 6 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in next dc, **beg V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in same dc, [sk each of next 3 dc, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next dc] 3 times, \*V-st in next ch-3 sp, V-st in next dc, [sk each of next 3 dc, V-st in next dc] 6 times, rep from \* 4 times, V-st in next ch-3 sp, [V-st in next dc, sk next 3 dc] 3 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (48 V-sts)

**Rnd 10:** Ch 1, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (24 ch-3 sps, 24 groups of 5 sc)

## 1-SIDED JOINING MOTIF

**Rnds 1–9:** Rep rnds 1–9 of First Motif.

**Rnd 10:** Ch 1, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp,

ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of adjacent motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif, [5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same ch-3 sp on working Motif] 3 times, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif (*1 side joined to adjacent Motif*), 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] around motif, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## 2-SIDED JOINING MOTIF

**Rnds 1–9:** Rep rnd 1–9 of First Motif.

**Rnd 10:** Ch 1, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of adjacent motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif, \*[5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same ch-3 sp on working Motif] 3 times, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif, rep from \* once (*2 sides joined to ad-*

*acent Motifs*), 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] around Motif, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## 3-SIDED JOINING MOTIF

**Rnds 1–9:** Rep rnd 1–9 of First Motif.

**Rnd 10:** Ch 1, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of adjacent motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif, \*[5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in next ch-3 sp on previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same ch-3 sp on working Motif] 3 times, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sl st in corner ch-3 sp of previous Motif, ch 1, 2 sc in same corner ch-3 sp of working Motif, rep from \* twice (*3 sides joined to adjacent Motifs*), 5 sc in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 5 sc in next ch-3 sp] around Motif, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Following Assembly Diagram, join Motifs until all 61 are completed.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1:** Join cotton in corner ch-3 sp as indicated by arrow

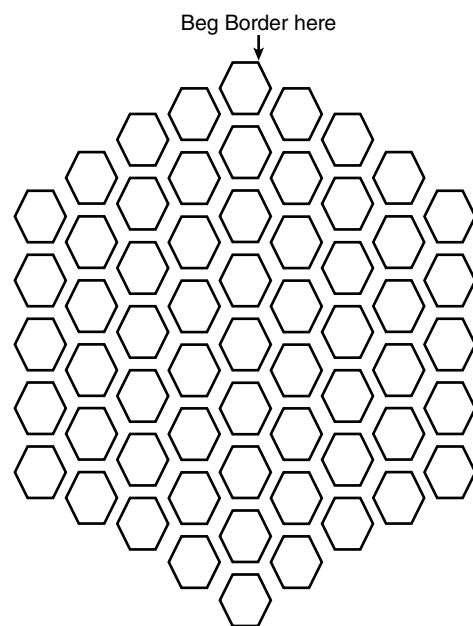
on Assembly Diagram, **ch 6** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 3) twice and dc in same corner ch-3 sp, [V-st in 3rd sc of 5-sc group, V-st in next ch-3 sp] 3 times, V-st in 3rd sc of 5-sc group, working around outer edge, \*(dc, ch 3) 3 times and dc in each outer corner ch-3 sp, V-st in 3rd sc of 5-sc of each 5-sc group, V-st in each ch-3 sp and V-st in junction of 2 Motifs on each inner corner, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch-3 sp, V-st in each ch-3 sp around entire outer edge, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, beg V-st in same ch-3 sp, V-st in each ch-3 sp around, working (dc, ch 3) 3 times and dc in each center corner ch-3 sp, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (*552 ch-3 sps*)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in same ch-3 sp, 4 sc in next ch-3 sp, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp, 4 sc in next ch-3 sp] around outer edge, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Beg at bottom of Body, with green, ch 16, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in each ch around, join in beg ch-2. (16 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around, join in beg ch-2

**Rnds 3–5:** Rep rnd 2. At the end of rnd 5, fasten off.

### Top Trim

**Rnd 6:** Join red in first hdc of rnd 5, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn. (16 dc)

**Rnd 7:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of sts, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (16 hdc)

### Bottom Trim

**Rnd 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch of rnd 1 of Body, join red, ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lp of sts, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (16 hdc)

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** Beg at bottom of Hat, with green, ch 16, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 2, hdc in each ch around, join in beg ch-2. (16 hdc)

**Rnds 2–13:** Ch 2, hdc in each st around, sk beg ch-2 and join in next hdc to create a dec. At the end of rnd 13, leaving an 8-inch length, fasten off. (4 hdc)

## Hat Trim

**Rnd 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch of rnd 1 of Hat, join red, ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lp of sts, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (16 hdc)

## ASSEMBLY

Bend chenille stem in half, insert hot glue in hole of ball knob and insert ends of chenille stem in ball knob to secure.

Fold each Top and Bottom Trims rnd 7 and rnd 2 to RS of Body piece and pull over spool with bottom even with spool and top edge of Top Trim pulled over top of spool. Glue Body to spool where desired. For head, with chenille stem at top of ball knob, glue bottom of ball knob to top of spool.

Using photo as a guide, fold Hat Trim rnd 2 to RS of Hat and pull Hat over chenille stem and down over ball knob. Glue in place leaving only a small area exposed for face. For nose, glue wooden bead to center front of face.

Sew jingle bell to tip of Hat. Bend Hat top downward as desired.

For hanging lp, cut 8-inch length of green and attach to back of Hat.

2 balls 90G gold/gold
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Sewing needle
- White sewing thread
- 13mm round shank black buttons: 2
- Fiberfill
- Stitch marker
- Pencil

3 sc = 1 inch; 3 sc rnds = 1 inch

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

If made for young child, replace button eyes with embroidered eyes.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## BEAR

### BODY

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring, **place marker and move as work progresses** (see *Pattern Notes*). (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (36 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 8–23:** Rep rnd 7. At the end of rnd 23, stuff Body with fiberfill and continue stuffing as work progresses.

**Rnd 24:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 25:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 26:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 27:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 28:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 29:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 30:** [Sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 31:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times, sl st in next st. Fasten off. (6 sc)

### HEAD

**Rnds 1–5:** Rep rnds 1–5 of Body. (30 sc)

**Rnds 6–14:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 15:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 16:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 17:** Sc in each sc around, sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off. Stuff Head with fiberfill and sew to top of Body.

### LEG

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 3, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 6 sc in ring, place marker and move as work progresses. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 5:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 6:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 6 times (*top of foot*), sc in each of next 18 sc. (24 sc)

**Rnds 7–11:** Rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 12:** [Sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times. (27 sc)

**Rnd 13:** Rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 14:** [Sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times. (30 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Rep rnd 5, sl st in next sc, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff each Leg with fiberfill and sew to Body 2–3 inches apart with bottom of Leg on surface level with dec sts of rnd 6 on the top.

### ARM

#### Make 2.

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Body. (18 sc)



**Rnd 4:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 5–14:** Rep rnd 4.

At the end of rnd 14, stuff Arm with fiberfill.

**Row 15:** Now working in rows, fold Arm flat across, working through both thicknesses, work 9 sc across, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Sew each Arm to side of Body on a slight angle so Arms will come tog at center front of Body.

#### EAR

**Make 2.**

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Body. (18 sc)

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Sc in each sc around.

**Row 6:** Now working in rows, fold Ear in half, working through both thicknesses, sc in each of next 9 sc, leaving 12-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

With RS of row 6 facing forward, sew each Ear to Head leaving 1½ inches between Ears.

#### MUZZLE

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of Body. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnd 6:** Sc in each sc around, sl st in next st, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

Stuff Muzzle with fiberfill and sew to center front between rnds 11–16.

#### SKIRT

**Rnd 1:** With top of Head facing, join white around post of sc at center back of Body, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc around post of each sc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (72 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc]

**Row 1:** With white, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (2 sc)

**Rnd 34:** Rep rnd 2, in last sc, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to white.

**Row 2:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 4:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 9 sts, sc in

**Row 5:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 3, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 6:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 13 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 4, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 7:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 15 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 5, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 8:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 17 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 6, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 9:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 19 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 7, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 10:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 21 sts, sc in same st as sl st of row 8, sc in next st, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 11:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 21 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 12:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 19 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 13:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 17 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 14:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 15 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 15:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 13 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 16:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sts, sl st in next st, turn.

**Row 17:** Sk sl st, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 11 sts, hdc in sl st of row 15, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 13, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 11, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 9,



change color to light blue, sc in next 23 sts, change color to white, hdc in sl st of row 10, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 12, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 14, sc in next st, hdc in sl st of row 16, sc in first sl st, change color to light blue.

## FOOT

**Rnd 1:** Now working in rnds, with light blue, [sc in front lp of next st, sc in back lp of next st] around.

**Rnd 2:** [Sc in back lp of next st, sc in front lp of next st] around.

**Rnds 3–20:** [Rep rnds 1 and 2 alternately] 9 times.

**Rnd 21:** Rep rnd 1. At the end of rnd 21, change color to white.

## Toe

**Rnd 22:** With white, sc in each sc around. (49 sc)

**Rnd 23:** [Sc in each of next 5 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) over next 2 sc] around. (42 sc)

**Rnd 24:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 25:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc] around. (35 sc)

**Rnd 26:** Rep rnd 24.

**Rnd 27:** [Sc in next 3 sts, sc next 2 sts tog] around. (28 sc)

**Rnd 28:** Rep rnd 24.

**Rnd 29:** [Sc in next 2 sts, sc next 2 sts tog] around. (21 sc)

**Rnd 30:** Rep rnd 24.

**Rnd 31:** [Sc in next st, sc next 2 sts tog] around. (14 sts)

**Rnd 32:** [Sc dec next 2 sts tog] around. Leaving an 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

## CUFF

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 49, join to form a ring, sc in same st as sl st, [sk next 2 chs, 5 dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch] 8 times, join in first sc. (9 sc, 8 groups 5-dc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 1, sc in same st as

sl st, [5 dc in next dc, sc in next sc] 8 times, join in first sc.

**Rnds 6–8:** Rep rnds 2–4.

**Rnd 9:** Ch 1, sc in same st as sl st, [(2 dc, **picot**—see *Special Stitch*, 2 dc) in next dc, sc in next sc] 8 times, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## JOINING

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Place Cuff over Stocking, matching opposite side

- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker
- 1 jingle bell each size: ½ inch, ⅝ inch and ¾ inch



## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for these projects.

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Use size hook and crochet cotton or yarn for desired size as indicated in instructions.

Do not join unless otherwise stated, mark rounds with stitch marker.

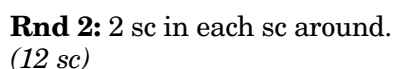

**Rnds 6–9:** Rep rnd 5.

**Rnd 10:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next st] 4 times. (25 sc)

**Rnd 11:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next st] 5 times, sl st in next sc, turn. (30 sc)

**Rnd 12 (WS):** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, **3-dc cl** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, [sc in next sc, cl in next sc] 14 times, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (15 cls, 15 sc)

## CLAPPER

Using same hook and color as for Bell, leaving 6-inch length at beg, ch 5, remove hook from lp, pass lp through hanger of jingle bell, pick up dropped lp, ch 6, leaving 6-inch length, fasten off.

## FINISHING

Pull gently on rem beg length to close beg slip ring, pass rem length through sts of rnd 1 of Bell and back through center top of Bell for hanging lp.

Bring tails of Clapper through center top of Bell on inside, secure ends and weave in ends. Fasten off. **CW**

**Large shell (lg shell):** (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in indicated st.

## THROW

### MOTIF 1 SNOWFLAKE

**Make 18.**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With white, ch 10, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 31 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (32 dc)

**Rnd 2: Beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same dc as joining, ch 5, sk each of next 3 dc, [shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next dc, ch 5, sk each of next 3 dc] 7 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (8 shells)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, beg shell in ch-2 sp, ch 5, [shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 5] 7 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, beg shell in ch-2 sp, ch 3, insert hook under next 2 ch-5 sps of rnds 2 and 3, complete sc st, ch 3, [shell in ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 3, insert hook under next 2 ch-5 sps of rnds 2 and 3, complete sc st, ch 3] 7 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. Set aside.

### Border

**Rnd 5:** Draw up lp of holly berry in any ch-2 sp of shell, **beg corner shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, **V-st** (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sc, ch 2, [corner shell (see *Special*

*Stitches*) in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sc, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sc, ch 2] 3 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (4 corner shells, 8 V-sts)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in next 2 dc, ch 1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in same dc, \*(sc, ch 6, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next dc, ch 2, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 2 (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next 2 dc\*\*, (sc, ch 4, sc) in next dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

### MOTIF 2 SNOWFLAKE

**Make 17.**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With white, ch 5, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 3, 15 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, hdc in same st as joining, sl st in next dc, [(hdc, ch 4, hdc) in next dc, sl st in next dc] 7 times, hdc in same dc as first hdc, ch 2, hdc in first hdc forming last ch-4 sp and position hook in center of ch sp, turn. (8 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 3 (WS):** Ch 1, sc in same ch sp as joining, ch 5, [sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5] 7 times, join in beg sc, turn. (8 ch-5 sps, 8 sc)

**Rnd 4 (RS): Beg lg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sc as joining, sl st in next ch-5 sp, [lg shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next sc, sl st in next ch-5 sp] 7 times, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. Set aside. (8 lg shells)

### Border

**Rnd 5:** Draw up lp of holly berry in any ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, sl st in next

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. (21 sc)

**Rows 3–17:** Rep row 2.

**Row 18:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (22 sc)

**Row 19:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (23 sc)

*This cute little boot-style stocking offers a fun decorating change from the more traditional-style stockings.*

**Rows 20–23:** [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately] twice. (27 sc)

**Row 24:** Rep row 2.

**Row 25:** Ch 5, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each rem sc across, turn. (32 sc)

**Rows 26–30:** Rep row 2.

**Row 31:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc, turn. (31 sc)

**Row 32:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (29 sc)

**Row 33:** Rep row 32. (27 sc)

**Row 34:** Rep row 32. Fasten off. (25 sc)

With RS facing and length of wine, leaving foundation ch unsewn, sew around edge of Boot. Turn RS out.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Beginning 3-double crochet cluster (beg 3-dc cl):** Ch 3, [yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

**3-double crochet cluster (3-dc cl):** [Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

**Beginning 2-double crochet cluster (beg 2-dc cl):** Ch 3, dc in same st or sp as beg ch-3.

## 2-double crochet cluster

**(2-dc cl):** [Yo, insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice in same st or sp, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

**Beginning shell (beg shell):** (Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated st.

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated st.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in first ch of ch-3.

## PLACE MAT

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 6, join (see *Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 23 dc in ring, join in beg ch-3. (24 dc)

**Rnd 2: Beg 3-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next 3 dc, ch 3, [3-dc cl (see *Special Stitches*) in next 3 dc, ch 3] 7 times, join in beg cl. (8 ch-3 cls, 8 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 4 dc in next ch-3 sp, [2 dc in top of next cl, 4 dc in next ch-3 sp] 7 times, join in beg ch-3. (48 dc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 1, [dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1] 23 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (48 dc, 24 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in ch-1 sp, **beg 2-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-1 sp, ch 2, [2-dc cl (see *Special Stitches*), ch 2] 23 times, join in beg ch-3. (24 2-dc cl, 24 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, [3 dc in next ch-2

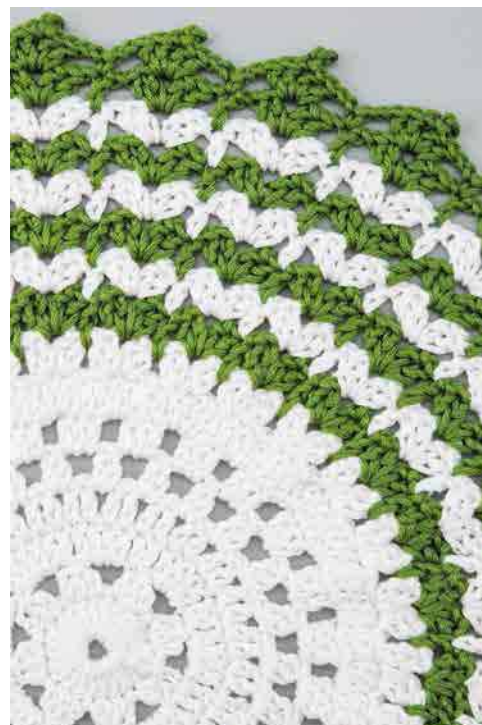
sp, ch 2] 23 times, join in beg ch-3. (72 dc, 24 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc, work 4 dc in next ch-2 sp only, [dc in each of next 3 dc, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp] 23 times, join in beg ch-3. (145 dc)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 3, dc in same dc as beg ch-3, ch 2, 2 dc in next dc, sk next 3 dc, (2 dc in next dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next dc, sk each of next 3 dc) around, join in beg ch-3. (58 2-dc groups, 29 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in next dc, drop white to WS, insert hook ch-2 sp, draw up a lp of deep leaf green, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch-2 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in sp, sk next 2 dc, [shell (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-2 sp, sk next 2 dc, dc in sp between dc sts, sk next 2 dc] around, join in beg ch-3. (29 shells, 29 single dc between shells)

**Rnd 10:** Sl st in next dc, drop deep leaf green to WS, insert hook ch-2 sp, draw up a lp of white, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, dc in single dc between shells,

[shell in next ch-2 sp, dc in single dc between shells] around, join in beg ch 3.

**Rnd 11:** Sl st in next dc, drop white to WS, insert hook in ch-2 sp, draw up a lp of deep leaf green, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in single dc between shells, ch 1, [shell in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in single dc between shells] around, join in beg ch-3.

**Rnds 12 & 13:** Rep rnds 10 and 11.

**Rnd 14:** Rep rnd 10.

**Rnd 15:** Sl st in next dc, drop white to WS, insert hook in ch-2 sp, draw up a lp of deep leaf green, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in single dc between shells, ch 1, [shell in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in single dc between shells] around, join in beg ch-3.

**Rnd 16:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc in same ch-2 sp of shell, **picot** (see *Special Stitches*), 2 dc in same ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, sc in single dc between shells, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp of shell, picot, 2 dc in same ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, sc in single dc between shells, ch 2] around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. **cw**

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

10 inches high x 12 inches wide,  
excluding Handles

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver Chunky bulky (chunky) weight acrylic yarn (6 oz/ 207 yds/170g per skein):
  - 2 skeins #319 cherry red
  - 3 oz #311 white
- Sizes G/6/4mm and J/10/6mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- White paper twist cord: 44 inches
- Pencil
- Pinning board
- Straight pins

## GAUGE

**Size J hook:** 6 sc = 2 inches;  
6 sc rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Offset half double crochet (offset hdc):** Work hdc in sp between sts of previous rnd, do not work in top of sts.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in first ch of ch-3.

## BAG

### BASE

**Row 1:** With size J hook and cherry red, ch 12, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (11 sc)

**Rows 2–36:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 36, **do not fasten off**.

### Base Edging

**Rnd 1:** Working around outer edge of Base, ch 1, [work 11 sc across end, 36 sc across side edge] twice, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (94 sc)

### BAG SIDES

**Rnd 1:** With size J hook, join cherry red in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of center sc on long edge of Base Edging, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), hdc in back lp of each st around, ending with insert hook under beg ch-2, draw up a lp and complete as sl st to join. (94 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in same sp as join, work **offset hdc** (see *Special Stitches*) around, insert hook under beg ch-2, draw up a lp and complete as sl st to join. (93 hdc)

**Rnds 3–24:** Rep rnd 2. Do not fasten off.

### Top Edging

**Rnd 25:** [Ch 1, sl st in next hdc] around, join in first sl st. Fasten off.

### BOTTOM EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, with size J hook, join cherry red in rem **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of first sc of rnd 1 of Base Edging, [ch 1, sl st in next front lp]

around, ch 1, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## SNOWFLAKE

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size J hook and white, ch 2, 11 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in beg ch. (12 sc)

**Rnd 2:** [Ch 8, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in next ch (*first prong*), ch 5, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in next ch (*2nd prong*), sl st around last sl st of first prong, ch 5, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in last ch (*3rd prong*), hdc in rem 3 chs of beg ch-8, sl st in same sc at base of ch-8, sl st in next sc, **picot** (see *Special Stitches*) in same sc of rnd 1, sl st in next sc of rnd 1] 6 times. Fasten off. (6 spokes)

Pin Snowflake to measure 8¾ inches on pinning board and steam-block. Allow to dry.

Pin Snowflake to center of front of Bag, and with tapestry needle and length of white, sew to Bag.

## HANDLES

### Make 2.

Cut paper twist cord in 2 equal lengths. With a pencil, mark 3 inches in from each end of paper twist cord. Use tapestry needle to make a hole ¼ inch in from each end. Thread needle with beg strand from cherry red skein, overlap twist ends, draw 4-inch yarn tail through hole, tighten and knot ends to secure handle ends tog.

Place G hook under Handle ends, draw up a lp, yo and draw through lp on hook to create sl st, \*[ch 1, sc over Handle] 8 times to pencil mark, turn work 180 degrees, working along opposite side of Handle, ch 1, insert hook in first ch-1 sp, draw up a lp and complete as sc, [ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp] 7 times, rep from \* once, ch 1, join in first sc.

Fasten off. With WS facing, join white to ch-1 sp on left end of Handle cherry red sts, [ch 1, sc over handle] 34 times, ch 1, sl st to first ch-1 sp on right end of Handle cherry red sts, ch 1, turn work 180 degrees, working along opposite area of Handle, sl st to end of cherry red sts, [ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp of white sts] 35 times, sl st in end of cherry red sts. Fasten off.

Center cherry red area of Handle to WS of Bag front and use cherry red and tapestry needle to sew top and bottom edges of cherry red sts to Bag.

#### **POMPOM**

##### **Make 2.**

With size J hook and white, make a chain 9 inches long. Holding 2 strands white tog, wrap 25 times around 3 fingers.

Remove from fingers and tightly tie in center with 8-inch length of white. Trim pompom to desired size and attach to end of ch. Holding pompoms tog, with ch folded in half place ch around front left side of Bag Handle, pass pompoms through lp formed by folded ch, pull pompoms gently to secure. **CW**

- 4mm pearl bead

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

**Beginning shell (beg shell):** (Ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated sp.

**Shell:** (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in indicated sp.

**Picot shell:** (3 dc, ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, 3 dc) in same ch sp.

**Triple picot (tr picot):** (Ch 4, sl st in 4th ch from hook) 3 times.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in last sc.

## ORNAMENT A

### GRANNY SQUARE

#### Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With dusty rose, ch 8, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 1, **[shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 1] 3 times, join in beg ch-3. (4 shells)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, **[shell** in next ch-2 sp of next shell, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, join in beg ch-3. (4 shells, 4 3-dc groups)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice\*\*, shell in next ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3. (4 shells, 8 3-dc groups)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times\*\*, shell in next ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3. (4 shells, 12 3-dc groups)

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1]

4 times\*\*, shell in next ch-2 sp of next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 shells, 16 3-dc groups)

## Edging

**Rnd 1:** Holding Granny Squares tog with WS facing, join white/silver in ch-1 sp before any corner shell, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp, \***picot shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-2 sp of next shell, [sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in center dc of 3-dc group, ch 1, shell in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in center dc of 3-dc group, ch 1] twice\*\*, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first sc. Fasten off. (4 picot shells, 8 shells, 28 sc)

## SNOWFLAKE

**Rnd 1:** With delft, leaving length for sewing, ch 5, join to form a ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in ring, ch 2, [2 dc, ch 2] 5 times in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (12 dc, 6 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 2:** [Ch 8, sl st in 4th ch from hook, (ch 4, sl st in same ch as last sl st) twice, ch 4, sl st in next dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sl st in next dc] around, join last sl st in first sl st. Fasten off.

Thread tapestry needle with beg length, sew Snowflake to center RS of Ornament A. Sew pearl bead to center of Snowflake.

## TASSEL

Cut 10 strands white/silver and 5 strands dusty rose each 6 inches long. Fold strands in half, insert hook in any corner ch sp, draw strands through at fold to form a lp on hook, draw cut ends through lp on hook, pull gently to secure.

## ORNAMENT B

### GRANNY SQUARE

**Make 2.**

**Rnd 1:** With white/silver, ch 8, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **beg shell** (see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 1, [**shell**

(see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 1] 3 times, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 shells)

**Rnds 2 & 3:** With delft, rep rnds 2 and 3 of Ornament A Granny Square. At the end of rnd 3, fasten off. (4 shells, 8 3-dc groups)

**Rnd 4:** Join dusty rose in ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 4 of Ornament A Granny Square. Fasten off.

**Rnd 5:** Join frosty green in ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 5 of Ornament A Granny Square.

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next dc, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 3 dc, draw up lp of white in last step of 3rd dc, with white, dc in each of next 4 dc, [draw up a lp of blue Hawaii in last step of 4th dc, with blue Hawaii dc in each of next 4 dc, draw up a lp of white in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of the next 4 dc] 10 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch. (11 groups 4-dc blue Hawaii, 11 groups 4-dc white)

**Rnd 3:** With white, ch 3, dc in each of the next 3 dc, draw up a lp of blue Hawaii in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, [draw up a lp of white in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of the next 4 dc, draw up a lp of blue Hawaii in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of next 4 dc] 10 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (11 groups 4-dc blue Hawaii, 11 groups 4-dc white)

**Rnd 4:** With blue Hawaii, ch 3, dc in each of the next 3 dc, draw up a lp of white in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, [draw up a lp of blue Hawaii in last step of 4th dc, dc in each of the next 4 dc, draw up a lp of white in last step of 4th dc, dc in

each of next 4 dc] 10 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (11 groups 4-dc blue Hawaii, 11 groups 4-dc white)

**Rnds 5–32:** [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] 14 times.

**Rnd 33:** Rep rnd 3. At the end of rnd 33, fasten off white, turn.

## FLAP

**Row 1 (WS):** Ch 3, working in front lp (see Stitch Guide) of each st, dc in each of next 41 sts, turn. (42 dc)

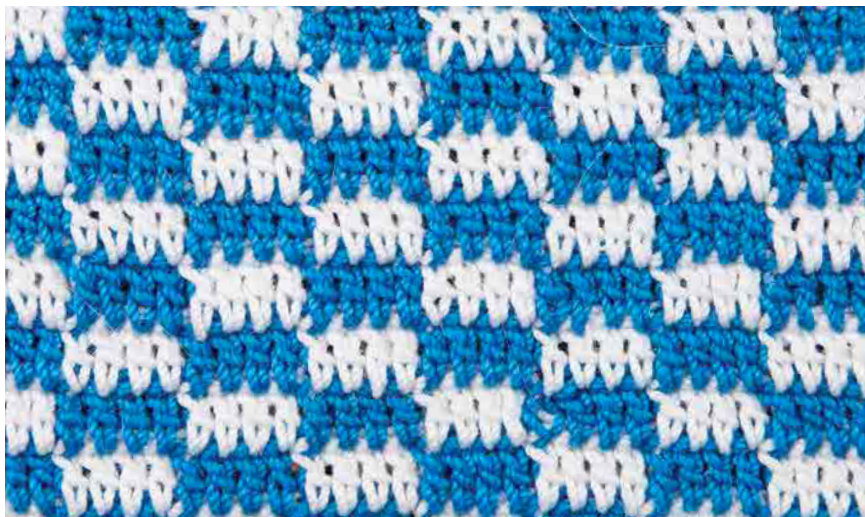
**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

**Row 3:** Rep row 2.

**Row 4:** Ch 2, **dc dec** (see Stitch Guide) over next 2 dc (2 st dec), dc in each of next 36 dc, dc dec over next 3 dc, turn. (38 dc)

**Row 5:** Ch 2, dc dec over next 2 dc, dc in each of next 14 dc, ch 3, sk next 3 dc, dc in each of next 15 mdc, dc dec over next 3 dc, turn. (31 dc, ch-3 sp)

**Row 6:** Ch 2, dc dec over next 2 dc, dc in each of next 13 dc, dc in each of next 3 chs, dc in each of next 12 dc, dc dec over next 3 dc, turn. (30 dc)

4 dc = 1 inch; [1 dc, 1 sc rnd] twice = 1½ inches

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## HAT

### RIBBING

**Row 1:** With white, leaving a 6-inch length at beg, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (8 sc)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of sts, sc in each st across, turn.

**Rows 3–66 [78]:** Rep row 2.  
**Do not fasten off.**

With rem beg length, sew opposite side of foundation ch and last row of Ribbing tog.

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** With WS of Ribbing facing, ch 1, work 66 [78] sc evenly sp around Ribbing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) of sts, sc in each st around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 3:** **Ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, join in beg ch-2.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc.

**Rnds 5 & 6:** Rep rnds 3 and 4.

**Rnd 7:** Ch 2, dc in each st around, join in beg ch-2.

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in each st, joining in first sc (*not in ch-1*), ch 2, remove from hook and place pin marker in lp, drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 9:** Join hot rose in same st as joining, ch 2, dc in each st around, working a st in joining lp at the base of white ch-2 in rnd 8 to get 66 [78] sts, join in first dc (*not in ch-2*), ch 1, remove hot rose from hook, insert pin marker, drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 10:** Insert hook in same st as joining, pick up white lp from WS and draw lp through, ch 1, sc in next st, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around first st in rnd 8, sk next 4 sts in rnd 8, fpdc around 6th st in rnd 8, in rnd 10, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around 7th st in rnd 8 (*beside previous fpdc*), \*sk next 4 sts of rnd 8, fpdc around next, in rnd 10, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around next st

in rnd 8 (*beside previous fpdc*)\*, rep from \* to \* around, ending with fpdc around last st in rnd 8, sk 2 sts, sc in last st in rnd 10, sc in joining lp at the base of hot rose, ch 1 in rnd 9, join in first sc, ch 2, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 11:** Pick up dropped lp of hot rose, ch 2, dc in each st around, working a st in joining lp at base of white ch-2 in rnd 10, join in first dc, ch 1, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 12:** Insert hook in white lp, work fpdc around 3rd st in rnd 10, in rnd 12, sc in first st (*joining st*) and sc in each of next 3 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 10, \*sk next 4 sts in rnd 10, fpdc around next st, in rnd 12, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 10, rep from \* around, sk last st in rnd 12, join first sc of rnd 12, ch 2, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 13:** Rep rnd 11.

**Rnd 14:** Insert hook in same st as joining, draw up dropped lp of white, ch 1, fpdc around first st in rnd 12, sk each of next 4 sts in rnd 12, fpdc around 6th st in rnd 12, in rnd 10, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around 7th st in rnd 12 (*beside previous fpdc*), \*sk next 4 sts in rnd 12, fpdc around the next, in rnd 10, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 12 (*beside previous fpdc*), rep from \* around, sk 2 sts, sc in last 2 sts in rnd 14, sc in joining lp at base of hot rose ch-1 in rnd 13, join in first fpdc, ch 2, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS.

**Rnd 15:** Rep rnd 11. At the end of rnd 15 **child's size only**, fasten off hot rose.

**Rnd 16:** Pick up dropped lp of



white, fpdc around first fpdc st in rnd 14, in rnd 16, sc in joining st and next 2 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 14, \*sk next 4 sts in rnd 14, fpdc around next st, in rnd 16, sk 2 sts behind fpdc sts, sc in next st, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, sc in next st, fpdc around next st of rnd 14\*, rep from \* to \* 9 [11] times, join in first fpdc, ch 2, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS. (55 [65] sts)

### Child's Size Only

**Rnd 17:** Dc in same st as joining, dc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. (56 sts)

**Rnd 18:** Ch 2, [dc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts] 27 times, dc in last st, join in beg dc. (29 sts)

**Rnd 19:** Ch 2, [dc dec over next 2 sts] 14 times, join in beg ch-2. (15 sts)

**Rnd 20:** Ch 2, [dc dec over next 2 sts] 7 times, join in beg ch-2. Leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (8 sts)

Weave rem length through sts, draw opening closed, knot to secure and weave in loose end, fasten off.

### Woman's Size Only

**Rnd [17]:** Pick up dropped lp of hot rose, ch 2, dc in each of next 3 sts, [dc dec over next 2 sts, dc in each of next 3 sts] 12 times, dc in each of next 2 sts (*last st and joining st at base of white ch-2 in rnd 16*), join in first dc, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS. ([54 sts])

**Rnd [18]:** Pick up dropped lp of white, ch 1, fpdc around first st in rnd 16, sk next 3 sts in rnd 16, fpdc around next st, in rnd 18, sk 2 sts behind fpdc, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in next st, fpdc around next st in rnd 16, \*sk next 3 sts in rnd 16, fpdc around next st, in rnd 18, sk

30 and in next ch of opposite side of foundation ch of row 1] across to join ends of Cuff. (15 ribbing ridges)

### RIGHT MITTEN

**Rnd 1:** With size K hook, working in edge of Cuff rows, ch 1, 2 sc in same sp as beg ch-1, \*[sk next ridge, sc in next sp between ridges] twice, sk next ridge, 2 sc in next sp between ridges, rep from \* 4 times, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (22 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lps, join highland in same st as joining of

rnd 1, ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (23 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, **do not join, place marker** (see *Pattern Notes*). (23 sc)

**Rnds 4–13:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 13, turn Mitten to RS.

**Rnd 14:** Sc in each of next 17 sc, ch 3, sk next 6 sc (*Thumb opening*). (17 sc)

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each of next 17 sc, sc in each of next 3 chs. (20 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 17:** Sc in each of next 6 sc, working in back lp, sc in each of next 10 sc (*top of hand where Mitten Top will be sewn*), sc in both lps of rem 4 sc. (20 sc)

**Rnds 18–21:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 21, sl st in next sc, fasten off.

#### RIGHT THUMB

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size K hook, join highland to same sp as last sc of rnd 14 was worked, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc in same sp as first sc of rnd 15, sc in opposite side of each of next 3 chs. (11 sc)

**Rnds 2–6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** [Sc dec (see *Stitch Guide*) over next 2 sc] around. At the end of rnd 8, sl st in next sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (3 sc)

#### LEFT CUFF

**Rows 1–31:** Rep rows 1–31 of Right Cuff.

#### LEFT MITTEN

**Rnds 1–13:** Rep rnds 1–13 of Right Mitten. (23 sc)

**Rnd 14:** Ch 3, sk each of next 6 sc (*Thumb opening*), sc in each of next 17 sc.

**Rnd 15:** Sc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 17 sc. (20 sc)

**Rnd 16:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 17:** Sc in each of next 4 sc, working in back lp, sc in each of next 10 sc (*top of hand where Mitten Top will be sewn*), sc in both lps of rem 6 sc. (20 sc)

**Rnds 18–21:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 21, sl st in next sc, fasten off.

#### LEFT THUMB

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size K hook, join highland to same sp as last sc of rnd 14 was worked, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 6 sc, sc in same sp as first sc of rnd 14, sc in opposite side of each of next 3 chs. (11 sc)

**Rnds 2–6:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 7 & 8:** [Sc dec over next 2 sc] around. At the end of rnd 8, sl st in next sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (3 sc)

#### MITTEN TOP

**Make 2.**

**Rnd 1:** With size M hook and sassy, ch 4, join in first ch to form a ring, 6 sc in ring.

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, 2 sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in next sc, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] around, join in first sc. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc around, inc 2 sc evenly sp around, join in first sc. (20 sc)

**Rnds 5–12:**

Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc.

#### ATTACH RIGHT MITTEN

**Rnd 13:** With Right Mitten upside down and Thumb on right, with size M hook, position next sc of Mitten Top to rem **front lp**

(see *Stitch Guide*) of rnd 16 of Right Mitten (*to left of Thumb*), [insert hook through front lp of Mitten and front lp of next sc of Mitten Top, draw up lp and complete a sl st] 10 times, sc in each of next 10 sc of Mitten Top, join in first sc. Fasten off. (10 sl sts, 10 sc)

#### ATTACH LEFT MITTEN

**Rnd 3:** With Left Mitten upside down and Thumb on left, with size M hook, position next sc of rem Mitten Top behind 10th rem front lp of rnd 16 (*to left of Thumb*), [insert hook through front lp of Mitten and front lp of next sc of Mitten Top, draw up lp and complete a sl st] 10 times, sc in each of next 10 sc of Mitten Top, join in first sc. Fasten off. (10 sl sts, 10 sc)

#### FINISHING

Turn Thumb to WS, thread tapestry needle with rem length of yarn, weave through rem sts, gather closed, knot to secure. Fasten off. Turn Thumb to RS; rep for 2nd Thumb.

Fold Cuff to RS of Mitten. With tapestry needle and strand of highland, sew button to center of Cuff on back of Mitten; rep for 2nd Mitten. **CW**

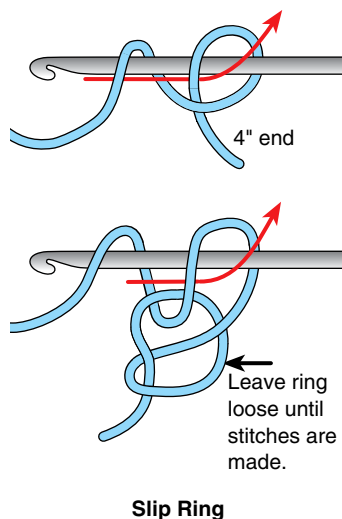

**Rnd 3:** Join Montana sky in any dc of previous rnd, ch 3, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-1 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (48 dc)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in same place, \*ch 5, sl st in 5th ch from hook, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 2, sk next 2 dc\*\*, sc in next dc, rep



from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first sc. (16 sc, 8 ch-2 sps, 4 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, (4 dc, ch 3, 5 dc) in same ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, 5 dc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, \*(5 dc, ch 3, 5 dc) in next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, 5 dc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp, rep from \* twice, join to top of ch-3. Fasten off. (4 corner ch-3 sps, 8 sc, 60 dc)

**Rnd 6:** Join painted desert in any corner ch-3 sp between 5-dc groups, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-3 sp, ch 5, dc in next sc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, dc in next sc, ch 5, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, dc in next sc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, sc in next dc, ch 3, sk next 2 dc, dc in next sc, ch 5, rep from \* twice, join in first sc. (4 corner ch-3 sps, 20 sc, 8 ch-3 sps, 8 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 3, (2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in same corner ch-3 sp, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, 3 dc in each of next 2 ch-3 sps, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, 3 dc in each of next 2 ch-3 sps, 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* twice, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (88 dc, 4 corner ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Join Montana sky in any dc, ch 1, sc in each dc around, working 3 sc in each ch-2 corner sp, join in first sc. Fasten off. (100 sc)

### MOTIF 2

#### Make 12.

**Rnd 1:** With Montana sky, rep rnd 1 of Motif 1.

**Rnd 2:** Rep rnd 2 of Motif 1.

**Rnd 3:** With painted desert, rep rnd 3 of Motif 1.

**Rnds 4 & 5:** Rep rnds 4 and 5 of Motif 1.

**Rnd 6:** With Montana sky, rep rnd 6 of Motif 1.


**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 7 of Motif 1.

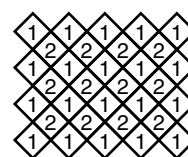

where desired. For head, with chenille stem at top of ball knob, glue bottom of ball knob to top of spool.

Using photo as a guide, pull Hat over chenille stem and down over ball knob; Glue in place leaving only a small area exposed for face. For nose, glue wooden bead to center front of face.

Wrap 1 strand of white bulky 10 times around 2 fingers, remove from fingers and tie in center with 12-inch strand of white. Use scissors to trim ends of pompom as desired. Using tapestry needle and tie ends, sew pompom to Hat tip. Bend Hat top as desired.

## WINTER GNOME

### BODY

**Rnds 1–5:** Rep rnds 1–5 of Elf Body, to create stripes, work rnds 1, 3 and 5 with white and rnds 2 and 4 blue. (16 hdc)



### Top Trim

**Rnds 6 & 7:** With blue, rep rnds 6 and 7 of Elf Top Trim.

### Bottom Trim

**Rnd 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch of rnd 1 of Body, join blue, ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lps of sts, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (16 hdc)

### HAT

**Rnd 1:** Beg at bottom of Hat, with blue, ch 16, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 2, hdc in each ch around, join in beg ch-2. (16 hdc)

**Rnds 2–13:** Rep rnds 2–13 of Elf Hat. (4 hdc)

### Hat Trim

**Rnd 1:** Working in opposite side of foundation ch of rnd 1 of Hat, join white, ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2:** Working in back lps of sts, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off. (16 hdc)

### ASSEMBLY

Bend chenille stem in half, insert hot glue in hole of ball knob and insert ends of chenille stem in ball knob to secure.

Fold each Top and Bottom Trims rnd 7 and rnd 2 to RS of Body piece and pull over spool, with bottom even with spool and top edge of Top Trim pulled over top of spool. Glue Body to spool where desired. For head, with chenille stem at top of ball knob, glue bottom of ball knob to top of spool.

Using photo as a guide, fold Hat Trim rnd 2 to RS of Hat and pull Hat over chenille stem and down over ball knob. Glue in place leaving only a small area exposed for face. For nose, glue wooden bead to center front of face.

Wrap 1 strand of white 20 times around 2 fingers, remove from fingers and tie in center with 12-inch strand of white. Use scissors to trim ends of pompom as desired. Using tapestry needle and tie ends, sew pompom to Hat tip. Bend Hat top as desired.

For hanging lp, cut 8-inch length of blue and attach to back of Hat. **CW**

**Rows [2 & 3]:** Rep rows 2 and 3 of Left Front

**Rows [4–29, 4–37]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] [13, 17] times.

**Row [30, 38]:** Rep row 2. Fasten off.

### RIGHT FRONT

**Row [1]:** With WS facing, from Left Front, sk next [3] fpdc and [2] unworked dc, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) magenta in the next dc, ch 3, [fan st in next fpdc, dc in next dc] across, turn. ([3] fan sts, [4] dc)

**Rows [2 & 3]:** Rep rows 2 and 3 of Right Front.

**Rows [4–29, 4–37]:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] [13, 17] times.



**Row [30, 38]:** Rep row 2. Fasten off.

### All Sizes

Leaving 7 [7½, 8, 8½, 9] inches for armhole opening, sew side seams closed.

### BORDER

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join magenta at left side seam, ch 1, sc evenly around entire outer edge of Vest, working (sc, ch 1, sc) in each front lower corner of Vest, join in first sc, turn.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to first Front lower corner, (sc, ch 1) in first ch-1 sp, sc in each sc to next Front lower corner, (ch 1, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in each rem sc, join in first sc, turn.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc to first Front lower corner (ch 1, sc) in first ch-1 sp, sc in each sc to next Front lower corner, (sc, ch 1) in next ch-1 sp, sc in each rem sc, join in first sc, turn.

Rep rnds 2 and 3 until Border measures 1½ [2, 2¼, 2½, 2¾] inches.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sk both corner ch-1 sps, join in first sc, turn.

Rep rnd 4 until Border measures 2 [2½, 2¾, 3, 3½] inches, ending on RS. Fasten off.

### ARMHOLE EDGING

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, join magenta at underarm seam, ch 1, sc in seam, work 2 sc in side edge of each dc around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### FLOWER BROOCH

#### Make 3.

Stretch out a length of plum preserves, tie a knot at the raw edge and roll up 5–6 inches. Insert hook through top of roll with solid edge at bottom, join magenta, ch 1, sc in top of roll, [insert hook through each of next 4 lps on plum preserves, work sc] 8 times, leaving a 5–6-inch length of plum preserves from hook, cut off and tie knot in the raw edge and roll up to hook, sc through roll. Leaving a 15-inch length, fasten off.

Roll up sc end tightly, with sewing needle threaded with long length of sewing thread, sew rose in a coil, sew to pin back.

### FINISHING

Block Vest. Position and secure each pin of each Flower Brooch to Left Front as desired. With WS facing, sew hooks and eyes 1½ inches apart at bottom edge of Right and Left Front opening. **CW**

**Rnd 1:** With white, ch 8, join in first ch to form ring, ch 1, 18 sc in ring, join in first sc. (18 sc)

**Rnd 2: Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in next st, [ch 7, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] 5 times, ch 7, sk last st, join in beg ch-3. (12 dc, 6 ch-7 sps)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, \*ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next dc, (4 sc, ch 3, 4 sc) in next ch-7 sp\*\*, sc in next dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in first sc. Leaving a 10-inch length, fasten off. Sew Snowflake Appliqué to center of Leg. **CW**

**Rnds 2–4 [2–5, 2–6]:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 5 [6, 7]: Ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each sc around, working 2 [2, 3] dc in last sc, join in first dc. (18 [20, 21] dc)

**Rnd 6 [7, 8]:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 17 [19, 20] dc, 3 dc in last dc, join in first dc. (21 [23, 24] dc)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, sc in each dc

around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### Size 2 Only

**Rnd [8]:** Ch 2, dc in each of next 22 dc, 3 dc in last dc, join in first dc. Fasten off. [25 dc]

**Rnd 6 [7, 9]:** [Sc dec (*see Stitch Guide*) over next 2 sc, sc in next sc] 3 [4, 5] times, sc dec in next 2 sc. (7 [9, 11] sc)

**Rnd 7 [8, 10]:** [Sc dec in next 2 sc] 3 [4, 5] times, sc in next sc, pinch rnd flat and sl st through any st of rnd to close, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Thread yarn needle with rem length, sew Thumb Opening closed, secure. Fasten off. **cw**

**Row 113:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 dc, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] 19 times, dc in each of next 2 dc, dc in beg ch-3, turn.

### EDGING

**Rnd 1 (WS):** Ch 1, sc in first

dc, \*ch 2, sk each of next 2 dc, sc in next dc\*, rep from \* to \* across to last 3 dc, ch 2, sk each of next 2 dc, sc in beg ch-3, working down side edge, \*\*ch 2, sc in top of next row\*\*, rep from \*\* to \*\* across to opposite side of foundation chain, ch 2, sc in ch at base of first st on Row 1, working across bottom edge, rep from \* to \* across, working up opposite side edge, rep from \*\* to \*\* across to first sc, ch 2, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first sc, turn.

**Rnd 2 (RS):** Ch 3, dc in same sc as beg ch-3, ch 2, shell in next ch-2 sp, \*sc in next ch-2 sp, shell in next ch-2 sp, rep from \* across to next corner, ch 2\*\*, 2 dc in next sc, ch 2, shell in next ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, **do not turn**.

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in sp before next dc,



**beg shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in same sp, \*ch 1, shell in ch-2 sp of each shell across to next corner, ch 1\*\*, shell in sp between 2 dc in corner, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

### FINISHING

Carefully wash and block to finished measurements. **cw**

hunter green through end st, drop soft white, with hunter green, yo, draw through first lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across until 1 lp rem, do not turn.

**Rows 4–107:** [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 52 times. At the end of row 107, do not change to hunter green.

**Row 108:** With soft white, insert afghan hook in 2nd vertical bar, yo, draw up a lp and draw through st on hook, [insert hook in next vertical bar, yo, draw up a lp and draw through st on hook] across. Fasten off.

## END PANELS

### Make 2.

**Row 1:** With afghan hook and soft white, ch 173, beg in 2nd ch from hook, [insert hook in next

ch, yo, draw up a lp, retaining all lps on hook] rep across, yo, draw through first lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] rep across until 1 lp rem on hook, do not turn.

**Row 2:** Insert hook in 2nd vertical bar, yo, draw up a lp, retaining all lps on hook, [insert hook in next vertical bar, yo, draw up a lp] across to last st, draw up a lp through front and back bar of last st to give a firm edge, yo, draw through first lp on hook, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] across until 1 lp rem on hook, do not turn.

**Rows 3–8:** Rep row 2 until 2 lps rem on row 8, pick up hunter

green, yo, draw through rem 2 lps on hook, drop soft white.

**Row 9:** With hunter green, rep row 2, until 2 lps rem on hook, pick up soft white, yo, draw through rem 2 lps on hook, fasten off hunter green.

**Rows 10–30:** With soft white, rep row 2 until 2 lps rem at the end of row 30, pick up hunter green and draw through rem 2 lps, drop soft white.

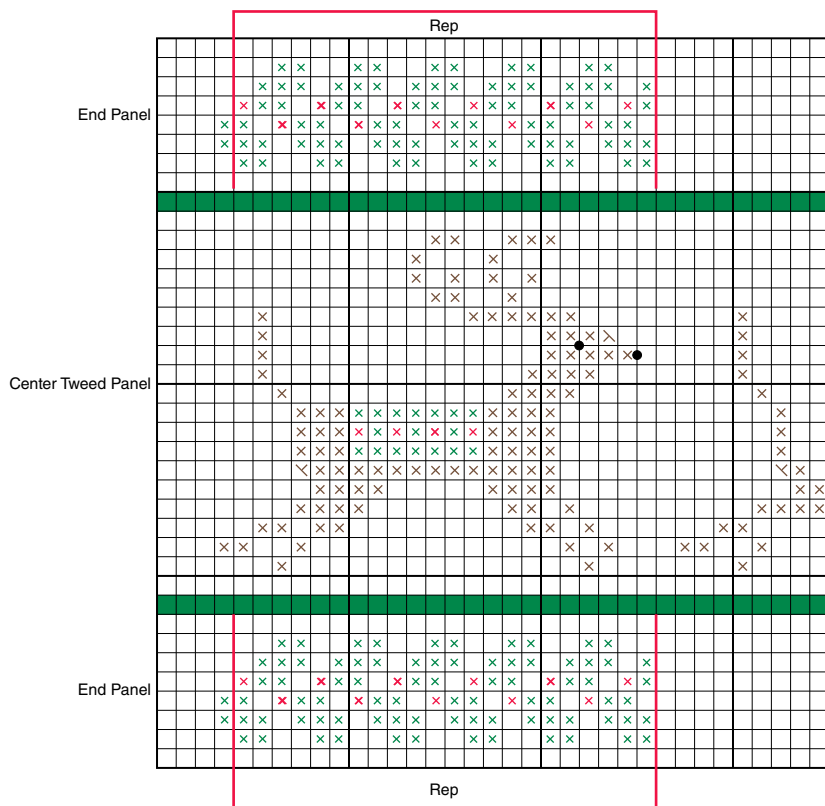
**Row 31:** Rep row 9.

**Rows 32–39:** With soft white, rep row 2. At the end of row 39, fasten off.

## CROSS-STITCH

Following chart, cross-stitch design across each End Panel.

Each cross-stitch is worked between 2 vertical bars as follows (*see illustration*): With single strand of yarn and tapes-try needle, from WS insert needle at top right, draw through to



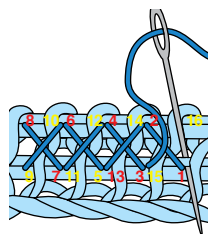
Prancing Reindeer Afghan

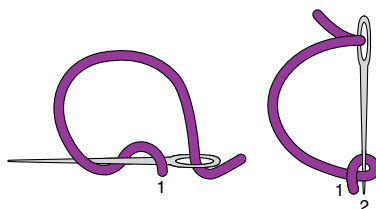

**Rnd 1:** With standard crochet hook size H, join hunter green in any corner, ch 1, [3 sc in corner st, sc evenly sp across edge to next corner] around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 2:** [Ch 2, sk next sc, sl st in next sc] around entire outer edge. Fasten off. **cw**

**Row 13:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, sc dec in each of next 2 sc, turn. (6 sc)

**Row 14:** Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc dec in each of next 2 sc. Fasten off. (4 sc)

## Side 2

**Rows 1–13:** Rep rows 1–13 of Side 1. (6 sc)

**Row 14:** Rep row 14 of Side 1, **do not fasten off**.

**Rnd 15:** Now working in rnds, holding both Wing Sides WS tog and matching shapes, sc

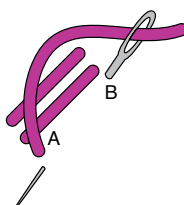
evenly sp around, working 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch of row 1, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 16:** With 2 strands of gold/ gold held tog, draw up a lp in first sc of rnd 15, ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 2, [sc in next sc, ch 2] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Thread yarn needle with length of white, with tip of each Wing pointing downward, sew center of row 12 of each Wing to rnd 24 of back of Body side by side.

## NOSE

Thread yarn needle with black, work **straight sts** (see *illustration*) in triangular shape on top of Muzzle over rnds 3–5.



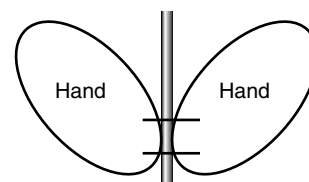

With yarn needle and length of white, position pencil between hands, tack hands tog as indicated in Figure 1, knot to secure, remove pencil.

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in ch-2 sp of shell, beg corner shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 2, V-st in next sl st, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sl st, ch 2, [corner shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sl st, ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, V-st in next sl st, ch 2] 3 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (4 corner shells, 8 V-sts)

**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 6 of Motif 1.

### JOINING MOTIFS

Complete Motif 1 through rnd 5 and Motif 2 through rnd 6.

Join Motifs tog in 5 rows of 7 Motifs beg at top left with Motif 1 and alternating them down and across. Continuing in pattern st of rnd 6 for Motif 1 and rnd 7 for Motif 2 for final rnd (both rnds are the same; they simply have different rnd numbers), join on 1 or 2 sides as necessary at ch-4 and ch-6 sps.

**1-sided joining:** To join on 1 side, join corners by ch 3, drop lp, draw lp under to over

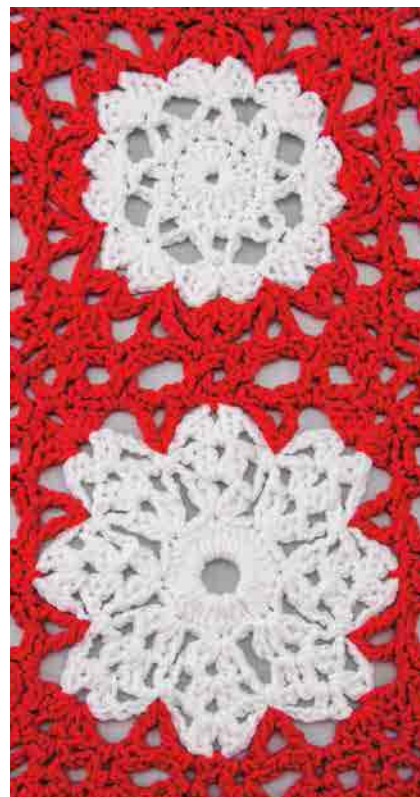
through opposite ch-6 sp, ch 3 and continue. To join at ch-4 sps, ch 2, drop lp, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-4 sp, ch 2 and continue.

**2-sided joining:** To join on 2 sides, join ch-4 sps as on 1-sided joining, but where 4 corners meet, ch 3, drop lp, draw lp under to over through opposite ch-6 sp, ch 1, drop lp, sk next ch-6 sp, draw lp under to over through next ch-6 sp, ch 3 and continue.


### OUTER BORDER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Draw up lp of holly berry in first ch-4 sp to left of any corner ch-6 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same ch-4 sp, \*[ch 2, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch 4 sp] twice, ch 2 (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-4 sp\*\*, ch 2, sc in sp to right of joining seam, ch 2, sk joining seam, sc in sp left of joining seam, ch 2 (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-4 sp, rep from \* around, working at each corner rep from \* to \*\*, then ch 2, (sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-6 sp, ch 2, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-4 sp, ending rnd after working in corner sp, hdc in beg sc to join to form last ch-2 sp.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch-1, \*shell in next ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-2 sp (or next ch-4



sp, whichever comes next), rep from \* around working corner shell in each corner ch-3 sp. At end of rnd, join last corner shell to beg sc.

**Rnd 3:** \*Ch 2, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch 2-sp of shell, ch 2, sl st in next sc, rep from \* around working at each corner, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, sl st in next sc, ending by joining last ch 3 in same sc as beg ch-2. Fasten off. With WS facing, block lightly.

st] around in rem lps of rnds 3–5. Fasten off.

### FLOWER ASSEMBLY

Center Flower on Bag Side. Using a single strand dark teal cotton thread and sewing needle, sew 33 beads through both layers of Flower Center and Bag Side. Using photo as a guide, sew 11 beads to upper right of Flower for top leaf. Sew 2 more

11-bead leaves to lower left of Flower.


### BAG ASSEMBLY

**Row 1 (RS):** With Flower facing and holding 2nd Bag Side behind front and working through both thicknesses, join black yarn in first sc of row 24, turn work to right, ch 1, work 51 sc evenly sp along sides and bottom edges of Bag to top right corner edge of Bag. Fasten off. (51 sc)

**Row 2:** Join black yarn in first sc of previous row, sk first sc,

shell (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, [sk next sc, sl st in next sc, sk next sc, 5 dc in next sc] rep across, ending with sk last sc, sl st in same sp as last sc of last row. Fasten off. (13 shells)

### FINISHING

Thread sewing needle with black cotton thread, sew 1 bead in center of each shell around outer edge of Bag. Sew snap fastener to inside of Bag at center top edge.

### CUFF

**Rnd 1:** With RS facing, working in opposite side of foundation ch, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) dark leaf in joining seam at back edge of Boot, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 21 chs, sc in seam, sc in each of next 21 chs, join in first sc, turn. (44 sc)

**Rnd 2 (WS):** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc, do not turn.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, do not join, do not turn.

**Rnds 4–10:** Sc in each sc around, do not join.

**Rnd 11:** Sc in each sc around, join in next sc, turn.

**Rnd 12:** Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, ch 2, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 2, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc, turn.

**Rnd 13:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sl st in next ch-2 sp] around. Fasten off.



Fold rnds 2–13 of Cuff down onto Boot.

### CORD WEAVE

Beg at center back (*above seamed edge of Boot*), weave gold cord in and out of ch-2 sps of rnd 12 of Cuff. Adjust ends even, pass first strand through center back st of rnd 2 in line with weave ending, pass 2nd strand through st just below rnd 2 and through row 1 of wine Boot section. Tie ends in a single overhand lp; 5 inches from overhand lp, tie ends tog in overhand knot.

### TASSEL

Cut 2 lengths, each 8 inches, of dark leaf and set aside. Wind

dark leaf around 4-inch piece of cardboard 24 times. Pass first 8-inch length under top edge of bundle and tie ends in knot at center top. Remove bundle from cardboard. Holding gold cord ends tog, 5 inches from overhand knot, place dark leaf 8-inch tie on top of gold cord and tie all ends tog in overhand knot.

Separate plies of gold cord within Tassel. Holding all strands tog, wrap 2nd 8-inch length around bundle several times 1 inch down from top. Knot ends tog and pass ends into Tassel to secure.

Trim all ends 2 inches below 2nd wrapped strand. **CW**

**bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 3 fptr, [**bead bpdc** (see *Special Stitch*) around next fptr] twice, bpdc around each of next 3 fptr, hdc in last dc, turn. (2 hdc, 8 bpdc)

**Rows 9–26:** [Rep rows 7 and 8 alternately] 9 times.

### CLOSURE END

**Row 27:** Ch 1, sk first hdc, sc in each of next 9 sts, turn. (9 sc)

**Row 28:** Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) over next 2 sc, sc in each of next 5 sc, sc dec over next 2 sc, turn. (7 sc)

**Row 29:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, ch 3, sk each of next 3 sc (*buttonhole*), sc in each of next 2 sc, turn. (4 sc, ch-3 sp)

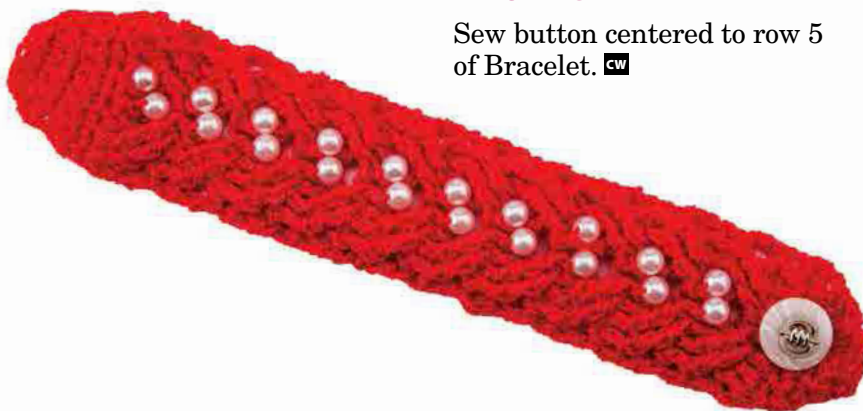
**Row 30:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of next 3 chs, sc in each of next 2 sc, turn. (7 sc)

**Rnd 20:** Sc in each of next 86 sc, sl st in each of next 2 sc. (88 sts)

**Rnd 21:** Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) for this rnd only, sc in each st around. (88 sts)

**Rnds 22–35:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 36:** Rep rnd 20. (88 sts)

### BRIM

**Rnd 37:** Working in front lps for this rnd only, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (132 sc)

**Rnds 38–52:** Rep rnd 7.

**Rnd 53:** [Sc in next sc, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each of

next 2 sc] around, leaving a long length, fasten off. (88 sc)

Thread yarn needle with rem length, fold rnd 53 to rem free lps of rnd 36, **whipstitch** (see *illustration*) edges tog, knot to secure, fasten off.

### OUTER CROWN TRIM

**Rnd 1: Join** (see *Pattern Notes*) grey beard in rem free lp of rnd 20 of Crown, sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

### INSIDE CROWN TRIM

**Rnd 1:** Turn Hat inside out, join grey beard in rem free lp of rnd 16 of Crown, sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. Turn Hat RS out.

### HATBAND

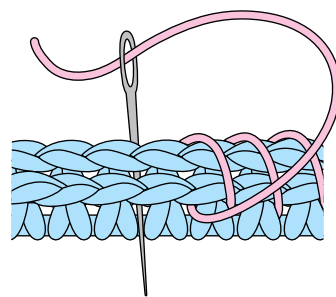
**Row 1:** Thread all beads on black and push along yarn until needed, ch 97, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (96 sc)

**Row 2 (RS):** Ch 1, [push bead

Fasten off.

## ORNAMENT C

### GRANNY SQUARE

**Make 2.**

**Rnd 1:** With dusty rose, rep rnd 1 of Ornament A Granny Square. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** Join delft in any ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 2 of Ornament A Granny Square. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** Join frosty green in any ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 3 of Ornament A Granny Square. Fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** Join forest green in any ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 4 of Ornament A Granny Square.

**Rnd 5:** Join dusty rose in any ch-2 sp of shell, rep rnd 5 of Ornament A Granny Square. Fasten off.

### Edging

**Rnd 1:** Holding Granny Squares tog with WS facing, join white/silver in any corner ch-2 sp, (**ch 2**—see *Pattern Notes*, 2 dc, ch 4, dc in 4th ch from hook, 2 dc, hdc) in same ch-2 sp of shell, sc in next ch-1 sp, \*ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, [(dc, ch 1) 3 times, dc] in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp\*\*, (hdc, 2 dc, ch 4, dc in 4th ch from hook, 2 dc, hdc) in corner ch-2 sp of shell, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-2. Fasten off.

### TASSEL

Cut 15 strands white/silver each 6 inches long. Fold strands in half, insert hook in any corner ch sp, draw strands through at fold to form lp on hook, draw cut ends through lp on hook, pull gently to secure. **CW**

1 st behind fpdc, sc dec over next 2 sts, sc in next st, fpdc around next st in rnd 16\*, rep from \* to \* 10 times, sk next 3 sts in rnd 16, fpdc around last st in rnd, in rnd 18, sk 1 st behind fpdc, sc dec over next 2 sts, sc in last st (*base of hot rose ch-1 in rnd 17*), join in first fpdc in row, place lp on safety pin and drop yarn to WS. ([53 sts])

**Rnd [19]:** Pick up dropped lp of hot rose, ch 2, dc in first 3 sts, [dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts] 12 times, dc in next st at base of white ch-2, join in first dc, fasten off hot rose. ([41 sts])

**Rnd [20]:** Pick up dropped lp of white, work fpdc around first fpdc st in rnd 18, in rnd 20, sk joining st, sc dec over next 2 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 18,

[sk next 2 sts in rnd 18, fpdc around next st, in rnd 20, sk 1 st, sc dec in next 2 sts, fpdc around next st in rnd 18] 12 times, join in first fpdc. ([39 sts])

**Rnd [21]:** Ch 1, sc in next st, [sc dec over next 2 sts, sc in next] 12 times, sc in last 2 sts, join in beg ch-1. ([27 sts])

**Rnd [22]:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, sc dec over next 2 sts] 8 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, join in beg sc. ([19 sts])

**Rnd [23]:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, sc dec over next 2 sts] 6 times, sc in next st, join in beg sc. ([13 sts])

**Rnd [24]:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, sc dec over next 2 sts] 4 times, sc in next st, join in beg sc. ([9 sts])

**Rnd [25]:** Ch 1, [sc in next st, sc dec over next 2 sts] 3 times, join in beg sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. ([6 sts])

### TASSEL

Cut two 12-inch lengths of white



yarn, set aside. With 1 strand each color, wrap as many times desired around 2½-inch cardboard. Fold a 12-inch length in half, pass under top of strands, knot to secure. Wrap rem 12-inch length around top end, near fold to hold strands tog, and tie off ends. Cut opposite ends of wrapped strands, fluff and attach top center top of Hat. **CW**

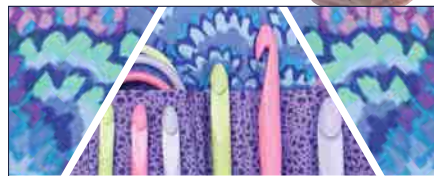

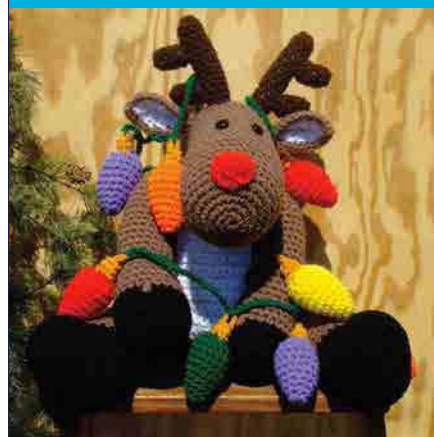

Projects for new crocheters who are comfortable with the beginner basic stitches and are ready to combine them into short pattern sequences. Skills include simple increasing, decreasing and minimal color changes.

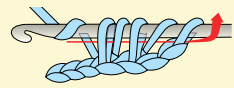

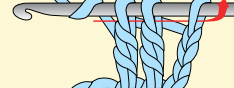

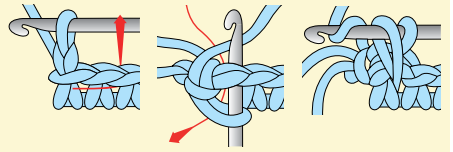

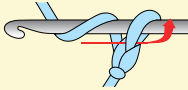

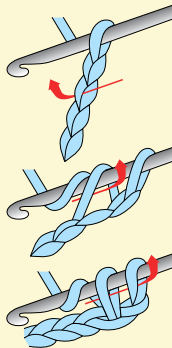

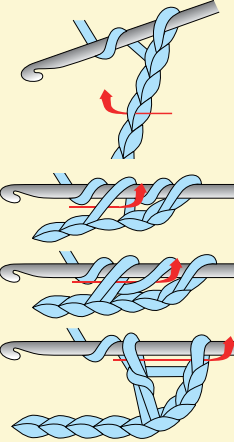

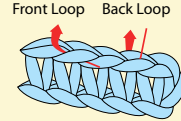

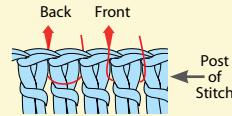
