## FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given for Small Basket; changes for Medium and Large Baskets are in [].
When 1 number is given, it applies to all sizes.

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Small Basket: 4 inches tall $x$ 4 inches in diameter
Medium Basket: 5 inches tall x 5 inches in diameter
Large Basket: 7 inches tall $x$ 6 inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Plymouth Yarn Galway Worsted medium (worsted) weight wool yarn
( $31 / 2 \mathrm{oz} / 210 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):
Large Basket: 2 skeins \#0765 rustic heather
Medium Basket: 1 skein \#0738 lichen heather
Small Basket: 1 skein \#0752
pebble beach heather
- 5/32-inch upholstery cable cord sold at most craft stores: 35 yds
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread
- Locking stitch marker


## GAUGE

The best way to check gauge is to work bottom of the basket, and check to make sure the diameter of the basket is the diameter indicated.

## PATTERN NOTES

These Baskets are worked around upholstery cord. When working with the cord, the sides will become uneven; simply slide the cord gently through stitches, either scrunching the stitches
together or pushing the stitches apart to make sure the single crochet is distributed evenly around the Basket.
Although the Baskets may be worked without molds, some might find it easier to make sure the sides of the Baskets are even by inserting an appropriate-size container (can, jar, plastic tub) in the center of Basket, tightening the cord around the object. The container should be the same circumference as the size of the Basket being crocheted. This will make it easier to make sure each round is even.
Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Move stitch marker each round as work progresses.
All single crochets are worked around the upholstery cord.

## BASKETS

Rnd 1 (RS): Working over upholstery cord, leaving 8-inch length of yarn at beg, form slip ring (see illustration on page 56), ch 2,8 sc in ring, place stitch marker (see Pattern Notes).
Rnd 2: 3 sc in each st around. (24 sc)
Rnd 3: 2 sc in each sc around. (48 sc)
Rnd 4: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc ] around. ( 64 sc )
Rnd 5: [2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc ] around. ( 80 sc )

## (1) 245 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENT
Approximately 21 inches in circumference at ribbing

## MATERIALS

- Universal Yarn Deluxe Worsted medium (worsted) weight wool yarn ( $31 / 2 \mathrm{oz} / 220 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per hank):

1 hank \#12506 azure heather

- Sizes H/8/5mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- 3/8-inch blue beads: 2


## GAUGE

Size H hook: Ribbing rows $1-10=$ 3 inches long $x 2$ inches wide Size I hook: Rnds 1-5 = $11 / 4$ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Large shell (lg shell): 5 dc in indicated st or sp.
Small shell (sm shell): 3 dc in indicated st or sp.

## HAT

## RIBBING

Row 1: Leaving 9-inch length at beg, with size H hook, ch 8, working in back bar of ch (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (7sc)


A variety of fun stitches gives style and texture to this cozy, creative hat. A beaded tie woven through the top makes for quick finishing and adds a decorative touch.


Back Bar of Chain
Rows 2-69: Ch 1, working in back lp (see Stitch Guide), sc in each st across, turn.

At the end of row 69, join (see Pattern Notes) to 7th ch (through 2 lps ) of RS of beg of Ribbing, leaving remainder of Ribbing until completion of Hat.

## CROWN

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, change to size I hook, ch 1, sc
through 2 lps of joining, ch 1 , sk next row, sc in end of row 2 , [ch 1 , sk next row, sc in end of next row] around, ending with ch 1 , sk last row, join in beg sc. (35 sc, 35 ch-1 sps)
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] around, ending with ch 1 , sk last sc, join in beg sc.
Rnds 3-5: Rep rnd 2.
Rnd 6: Ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same sc as joining, sk next ch-1 sp, [(sc, ch $2, \mathrm{sc})$ in next sc, sk next ch-1 sp] around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 7: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 1 , sc in same ch- 2 sp , ch 1 , [sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.
Rnds 8 \& 9: Rep rnds 6 and 7.
Rnds 10-13: Rep rnds 2-5.
Rnd 14: Ch 1, sc in same sc as joining, sk next ch- 1 sp , [sc in next sc, sk next ch-1 sp] around, join in beg sc. (35 sc)
Rnd 15: Ch 1, sc in same sc as joining, sk next sc, lg shell (see Special Stitches) in next sc, [sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next sc, lg shell in next sc] around, join in beg sc. ( 9 lg shells)

## Rnd 16: Ch 3 (see Pattern

Notes), 2 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, sc in center dc of lg shell, [sm shell (see Special Stitches) in next sc, sc in center dc of lg shell] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 9 sm shells)
Rnd 17: Sl st in next dc, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, ch 1 , sk next st, [sc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] around, join in beg sc. (18 sc, 18 ch-1 sps)
Rnd 18: Rep rnd 2.
Rnd 19: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sk ch- 1 sps , join in beg sc. (18 sc)
Rnd 20: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1 , sk next sc] around, join in beg sc. ( 9 sc, 9 ch-1 sps)


Rnd 21: Ch 1, sc in same sc as joining, [sm shell in next ch-1 sp , sc in next sc] 8 times, leaving last ch- 1 sp unworked, join in beg sc. (8 sm shells, 9 sc)
Rnd 22: Sl st in center dc of sm shell, ch 1 , sc in same dc, [lg shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next sm shell] 7 times, lg shell in next sc, join in beg sc. Fasten off. ( 8 lg shells, 8 sc )
Thread rem beg length on yarn needle, working in back lps, sew Ribbing ends tog. Fasten off.

## TIE

Cut 2 lengths of yarn each $41 / 2$ yds long. With size I hook, holding both strands tog and leaving 6 -inch tail at beg, ch 90 , leaving 6 -inch tail at end, fasten off.
Beg at back joining seam, weave ch under and over sts of rnd 20 around. Pull ends to close opening and tie ends in a bow to hang down back.
Add a bead to each end of Tie, push up above end of ch. Add 2 more 12 -inch lengths of yarn to end of each ch, fold strands in half, tie in with 6 -inch tails in an overhand knot on the end of each ch. Pull each bead down to knot. Trim tails to $11 / 2$ inches or as desired. cw

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS <br> Doily: 14 inches in diameter <br> Rose: $31 / 2$ inches in diameter <br> Doily Center: $51 / 2$ inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (white: 400 yds per ball; solids: 350 yds per ball):

1 ball each \#494 victory red and \#1 white
50 yds \#484 myrtle green

- Size $7 / 1.65 \mathrm{~mm}$ steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Spray starch


## GAUGE

[Sc, ch 3, sc] 3 times $=1$ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Optional Doily Center Without Rose is included in pattern.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Triple picot (tr picot): Ch 4, sl st in top of last tr , ch 5 , sl st in top of same $\operatorname{tr}$, ch 4, sl st in top of same $t r$.

Triple picot joining (tr picot joining): Ch 4, sl st in top of last tr, ch 2, drop lp from hook, insert hook RS to WS through ch-5 sp of adjacent Rose, pick up dropped lp, draw through, ch 2 , sl st in top of same $\operatorname{tr}$ on
working Rose, ch 4 , sl st in top of same tr.

Shell: (Sc, ch 3, sc) in indicated st or sp.
Triple shell (tr shell): (\{Sc, ch 3\} 3 times, sc) in indicated ch-3 sp.
Picot: (Sl st, ch 3, sl st) in ch-3 sp of shell.

## DOILY

## RING OF ROSES

## First Rose

Rnd 1 (RS): With red, ch 5, join (see Pattern Notes) in first ch to form a ring, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 15 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)
Rnd 2: Ch 1 , sc in same dc as ch-1, ch 5 , sk next dc, [sc in next dc, ch 5, sk next dc] around, join in beg sc. (8 ch-5 sps)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc, $5 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each ch- 5 sp around, join in beg sc. (8 petals)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, working behind petals, [sc around post of sc of rnd 2, ch 7] around, join in beg sc. (8 ch-7 sps)
Rnd 5: Ch 1, (sc, 9 dc, sc) in each ch-7 sp around, join in beg sc. (8 petals)
Rnd 6: Ch 1, working behind petals, [sc around post of sc of rnd 4, ch 7] around, join in beg sc. ( 8 ch-7 sps)
Rnd 7: Ch 1, (sc, 2 dc , 4 tr , $\mathbf{t r}$ picot-see Special Stitches, 3 tr, 2 dc , sc ) in each ch-7 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (8 petals)

## 2nd Rose

Rnds 1-6: Rep rnds 1-6 of First Rose.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, (sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of next $6 \mathrm{ch}-7 \mathrm{sps}$, [(sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot joining-see Special Stitches, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-7 sp] twice, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## 3rd-7th Roses

Note: To join Roses 3-7 to previous Rose leave 1 petal free at center of Ring and 3 petals free on outer edge of Ring. When Ring is completed, 8 petals will rem at center of Ring, and 24 petals will rem at outer edge of Ring.
Rnds 1-6: Rep rnds 1-6 of First Rose.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, (sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$, sc) in each of next $6 \mathrm{ch}-7 \mathrm{sps}$, [(sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot joining, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-7 spl twice, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## 8th Rose

Rnds 1-6: Rep rnds 1-6 of First Rose.
Rnd 7: Ch 1, (sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$, sc) in next ch-7


Doily center without the rose

sp, [(sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot joining, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-7 sp] twice to 7th Rose, (sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of next 3 ch- 7 sps , [(sc, $2 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$, tr picot joining, $3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-7 sp] twice to First Rose. Fasten off.

## DOILY CENTER

Note: If making Doily Center With Rose, rep First Rose and set aside.
Rnd 1: With white, ch 5, join in first ch to form a ring, ch 3,15
dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 16 dc )
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, ch 3 , [sc in next dc, ch 3] around, join in beg sc. ( 16 ch-3 sps)
Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1 , shell (see Special Stitches) in same ch-3 sp, shell in each rem ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc. (16 shells)
Rnd 4: Rep rnd 3.
Rnd 5: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1 , shell in same ch-3 sp, ch 3 , [shell
in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] around, join in beg sc. ( 32 ch-3 sps)
Rnd 6: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1 , shell in same ch- 3 sp , [shell in next ch-3 sp] 31 times, join in beg sc. (32 shells)
Rnd 7: Rep rnd 6.

## Doily Center With Rose

Rnd 8: Sl st in ch-3 sp, holding Rose on top of Doily Center and working through both thicknesses, ch 1, [insert hook through ch-5 sp of picot and ch-3

$351 / 2$ inches wide x $291 / 4$ inches long

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/ 364 yds/198g per skein):

3 skeins \#381 light blue
1 skein each \#312 black, \#311 white, \#254 pumpkin, \#672 spring green and \#722 pretty 'n pink
5 oz each \#3934 day glow and \#3955 wildflower

- Sizes F/5/3.75mm and G/6/4mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Washable fabric glue


## GAUGE

Size G hook: 6 puff st shells = $21 / 2$ inches; 5 puff st shell rows = 3 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet on Rectangles.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Puff stitch shell (puff st shell): *(Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook) twice in same st, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook*, ch 1, rep from * to * once in same st.

Picot: Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

## BLANKET

## PENGUIN BODY

## Make 6.

Row 1: Beg at top of head, with size G hook and black, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (4 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. ( 6 sc )
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 4: Rep row 3.
Rows 5-8: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] twice. (10 sc)
Row 9: Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc , sc in each sc across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ dec in next 2 sc , turn. ( 8 sc )
Row 10: Rep row 9. (6 sc)
Rows 11-14: Rep row 2. (14 sc)
Rows 15-21: Rep row 3.
Rows 22 \& 23: Rep row 9. (10 sc)
Row 24: Rep row 3.
Row 25: Rep row 9. (8 sc)
Row 26: Rep row 3.

## Border

Rnd 27: Now working in rnds, ch 1 , sc in end of each row or in end of each st around Body, to define neckline, sl st between rows 10 and 11 on each side, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

## FACE \& BELLY

## Make 6.

Row 1: Beg with Face, with white and size G hook, ch 7,
sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (6 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. $(8 \mathrm{sc})$
Row 4: Rep row 2.
Rows 5 \& 6: Ch 1 , sc dec in next 2 sc , sc in each sc across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ dec in next 2 sc , turn. (4 sc)
Rows 7 \& 8: Rep row 2.
Rows 9-11: Rep row 3. (10 sc)
Rows 12-16: Rep row 2.
Row 17: Rep row 5. (8 sc)
Row 18: Rep row 2.
Rows 19 \& 20: Rep rows 17 and 18. At the end of row 20 , fasten off and do not turn.
Row 21: Join white in first st of row $1,4 \mathrm{sc}$ in next st, sl st in each of next $2 \mathrm{sts}, 4 \mathrm{sc}$ in next st, sl st in last st. Fasten off. This will be the RS of Face.

## BEAK

## Make 6.

Row 1: With pumpkin and size F hook, ch 3, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, turn. (2 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc , do not turn.
Rnd 3: Now working in rnds, ch 2 , sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in end of each row down side of square, ch 2 , sl st in 2 nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch on opposite side of foundation ch of row 1 , ch $2, \mathrm{sl}$ st in 2 nd ch from hook, sl st in ends of rows, ch 2 , sl st in 2 nd ch from hook, sl st in each st of row 2 , join in first st. Fasten off.

## EYE

Make 12.
Rnd 1: With black and size F hook, leaving 2 inches at beg, ch $2,3 \mathrm{sc}$ in 2 nd ch from hook,

join in first sc. Fasten off. Pull rem beg length to close opening.

## FOOT

## Make 12.

Row 1 (WS): With pumpkin and size G hook, ch $6,2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next ch, 3 hdc in next ch, sl st in next ch, 2 hdc in last ch, ch 2 , sl st in same ch. Fasten off.

## WING

## Make 12.

Row 1: With black and size G hook, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in sc, turn. (2 sc)
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 3.
Row 5: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc across, turn. (4 sc)
Rows 6-11: Rep row 3.
Row 12: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc] twice. Fasten off. (2 sc)

## SCARF

Make 3.
Row 1: With day glow and size G hook, ch 6, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across, turn. (4dc)

Rows 2-9: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each dc across, turn. At the end of row 9 , fasten off.
Row 10: Join pretty ' $n$ pink in first st, ch 7, sl st in same st, [sl st in next st, ch 7, sl st in same st] 3 times. Fasten off.
Working on opposite side of foundation ch of row 1 of Scarf, rep row 10.

## TOBOGGAN HAT

## Make 3.

Row 1: With day glow and size G hook, ch 3, 4 dc in 3rd ch from hook, turn. (5dc)


Row 2: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 2, 2 dc in each of next 4 dc , turn. ( 9 dc )
Row 4: Ch 2, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each dc across to last dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. Fasten off. (11 dc)

## Brim

Row 5: Working in back lp (see Stitch Guide) of sts, join pretty ' n pink, ch 2 , dc in each st across. Fasten off. Fold row 5 upward.

## Pompom

Row 1: With pretty ' $n$ pink and size G hook, ch 4, *yo twice, insert hook in 4th ch from hook, yo, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, rep from * 5 times, yo, draw through all 7 lps on hook. Fasten off.

## STOCKING CAP

## Make 3.

Row 1: With wildflower and size G hook, ch 2, sc in 2 nd ch from hook, turn. ( 1 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in sc, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1,2 sc in next sc, turn. (2 sc)
Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc across, turn. (4 sc)
Rows 6-14: Rep row 2.
Row 15: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. ( 6 sc )
Rows 16-20: Rep row 2.
Row 21: Rep row 15. (8 sc)
Row 22: Rep row 2.
Row 23: Rep row 15. (10 sc)
Rows 24-28: Rep row 2. At the end of row 28 , fasten off.

## Brim \& Pompom

With green and size G hook, rep Brim and Pompom of Toboggan Hat.

## RECTANGLE

Make 6.
Row 1 (RS): With blue and size G hook, ch 40 , puff st shell (see Special Stitches) in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), [sk next 2 chs, puff st shell in next ch] 11 times, sk next 2 chs, dc in last ch, turn. (12 puff st shells, $2 d c$ )
Rows 2-21: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), [puff st shell in next ch-1 sp of puff st shell] 12 times, dc in last dc, turn. At the end of row 21 , fasten off.

## Border

Rnd 22: Now working in rnds, with green and size G hook, join with sc in any corner, 2 sc in same sp , sc evenly sp around, working 3 sc in each rem corner, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Using photo as guide for placement, with yarn needle and length of matching yarn, sew Eyes and Beak to Face with running stitch (see illustration).


Running Stitch

Attach only centers of each Beak so that points are left free to stand up.
So pieces stay in position, instead of using pins, use a dab of washable fabric glue to attach pieces before sewing. This makes the process much easier.
Center Face and Belly piece to Body.
Attach Body to each Rectangle making sure that when Hats and Feet are attached, the whole Penguin is centered.
Attach Wings at a slight angle, leaving sp above Wings to attach Scarves to 3 Penguins.
Attach Pompom to top of each Toboggan Hat and bottom of each Stocking Cap. Referring to photo, fold Stocking Cap over and sew it down. Tie Scarf and tack at center. Lay out Rectangles left to right as follows:
First row: Penguin with Toboggan Hat/Scarf, Penguin with Stocking Cap and Penguin with Toboggan Hat/Scarf.
2nd row: Penguin with Stocking Cap, Penguin with Toboggan Hat/Scarf and Penguin with Stocking Cap.

## MATERIALS

- Red Heart Boutique Unforgettable medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn ( $31 / 2$ oz/270 yds/100g per skein):
$6[6,7,7,8,8]$ skeins \#3950 petunia
- Sizes G/6/4mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle


## GAUGE

Size H hook: 13 rows = 4 inches; 14 sts $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## PATTERN STITCH

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Rep row 1.
Row 3: Ch 1, [sc in next st, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, sk next st] across, ending with sc in last st, turn
Row 4: Rep row 3.

## PULLOVER

## BACK

Row 1 (WS): With size H hook, ch 66 [70, 78, 86, 94, 102], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (65 [69, 77, 85, 93, 101] sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 3: Work row 3 of Pattern
Stitch. (16 [17, 19, 21, 23, 25]
3 -dc groups, 17 [18, 20, 22, 24, 26] sc)
Row 4: Rep row 3 of Pattern Stitch.

Rep rows 1-4 of Pattern Stitch consecutively until Back measures $12^{1 ⁄ 2}[13,131 / 2,14,141 / 2,15]$ inches or desired length.

## Armhole Shaping

Sl st across first 4 sts, ch 1 , continue in Pattern Stitch across, leaving last 4 sts unworked, turn. ( 57 [61, 69, 77, 85, 93] sts)
Continue in Pattern Stitch until Armhole Shaping measures $81 / 2$ [ $9,9,91 / 2,91 / 2,10$ ] inches, ending with sc row. Fasten off.

## FRONT

Work as for Back until Armhole Shaping measures $31 / 2[4,4,41 / 2$, $41 / 2,5]$ inches.

## First Neck Shaping

Ch 1, work in Pattern Stitch
across $21[23,27,31,35,38]$ sts, turn.

## Sizes Small \& Medium Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec
1 st at neck edge every 4th row 4 times. ( 17 [19] sts)

## Sizes Large, X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec 1 st at neck edge every row twice, and then every 3rd row 4 times. ([21, 25, 32] sts)

## Size 2X-Large Only

Continue in Pattern Stitch, dec 1 st at neck edge every row 3 times, and then every 3 rd row 4 times. ([28] sts)

## All Sizes

Work until Armhole Shaping measures $8^{1 ⁄ 2} 2[9,9,91 / 2,91 / 2,10]$ inches, ending with sc row. Fasten off.

## 2nd Neck Shaping

Sk center 15 [15, 15, 15, 15, 17] sts (for Neck opening) join (see Pattern Notes) in next st and rep as for First Neck Shaping.

## SLEEVE

## Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 32 [32, 32, 34, 34, $34]$, sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (31 [31, 31, 33, 33, 33] sc)

Continue in Pattern Stitch and inc 1 st each side edge of Sleeve 14 [15, 15, 17, 17, 18] times every 3 rd row until $59[61,61,67$, 67, 69] sts.
Work even in Pattern Stitch until Sleeve measures 14 [14, 14, $141 / 2,141 / 2,15$ ] inches or desired length, ending with sc row.

## Armhole Shaping

Sl st across first 4 sts, ch 1 , continue in Pattern Stitch

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 63, join (see Pattern Notes) to form a ring, ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3 , sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, *dc in next ch, ch 3 , sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3 , sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, rep from * around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-6, do not turn. (18 dc, 9 sc, 18 ch-3 sps)

- Sewing needle
- $1 / 4$-inch black hook-and-loop tape
- Black sewing thread


## GAUGE

$4 \mathrm{sc}=1$ inch; 4 sc rows $=1$ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## PENGUIN

## FIRST BODY

Row 1: Beg at bottom of Body with black, ch 9 , sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. ( 8 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (10 sc)
Row 3: Rep row 2. (12 sc)
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Rows 6-9: Rep row 4.
Row 10: Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc , sc in each sc across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ dec in next 2 sc, turn. (10 sc)

Row 11: Rep row 10. (8 sc)
Rows 12-15: Rep row 4.
Row 16: Rep row 2. (10 sc)
Rows 17-20: Rep row 4.
Row 21: Rep row 10. (8 sc)
Row 22: Rep row 10. (6 sc)
Row 23: Rep row 10. Fasten off. (4 sc)

## 2ND BODY

Rows 1-23: Rep rows 1-23 of First Body.

## FIRST WING

Row 1: With RS of First Body facing, join (see Pattern Notes) black in side edge of row 15 , ch 1 , sc in row 15 , sc in end of each of next 3 rows (rows 14,13 and 12), turn. (4 sc)

Rows 2-11: Ch 1, sc in each of next 4 sc , turn.
Row 12: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sc ] twice, turn. (2 sc)

Row 13: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc . Fasten off. (1 sc)

## 2ND WING

Row 1: With RS of First Body facing, join black in side edge of row 12 , ch 1 , sc in row 12 , sc in end of each of next 3 rows (rows 13, 14 and 15), turn.
Rows 2-13: Rep rows 2-13 of First Wing.
Rep First and 2nd Wings on 2nd Body.

## FRONT POCKET

Row 1: With black, ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. ( 8 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (10 sc)
Row 3: Rep row 2. (12 sc)
Rows 4-7: Ch 1 , sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 7, fasten off.

## FACE

Rnd 1: With white, ch 2, 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in beg sc. ( $8 s c$ )


Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around, join in beg sc. (12 sc)
Rnd 4: Ch 1, [sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc$]$ around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (16 sc)

## BEAK

With carrot, ch 3, sc dec in 2nd and 3rd ch. Fasten off.
Sew top edge of Beak to bottom of rnd 1 of Face.

## ASSEMBLY

With yarn needle and length of black, embroider straight stitch (see illustration) eyes on Face, leaving $1 / 4$-inch sp between eyes and referring to photo for placement.


Sew Face centered over rows 16-23 of First Body.

## Joining

Matching rows, place Front Pocket on top of First Body. Hold 2nd Body at back of First Body. With RS facing, join black at bottom corner and working through all thicknesses across foundation ch, ch 1 , work 8 sc across foundation, 9 sc along side of Body to Wing, sc dec in 2 sts at Wing base, 10 sc across underside of Wing, 3 sc at tip of Wing, 10 sc across top of Wing, sc dec in next 2 sts at neck, work 18 sc evenly around head, sc dec in 2 sts at neck, sc 10 across top of Wing, 3 sc at tip of Wing, 10 sc across underside of Wingto Wing base, sc dec in next 2 sc, work 9 sc along side of Body, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (94 sc)

## FIRST FOOT

Row 1: With RS facing, working on 8 sc across Joining of bottom, join carrot in first sc, ch 1 , sc in same sc as beg ch- 1 , sc in next sc, turn. (2 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc . Fasten off. (4 sc)

## 2ND FOOT

Row 1: With RS facing, sk next 4 sc of Joining of bottom, join carrot in next sc, ch 1 , sc in
same sc as beg ch- 1 , sc in next sc, turn. (2 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc. Fasten off. (4 sc)

## FINISHING

Cross Wings in front of Body to hold gift card. Secure hook-andloop tape to row 13 of each Wing and with sewing needle and black thread, secure hook-andloop tape in place.

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), (dc, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in same st, ch 3, sk next 2 sts, *( 2 dc, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next st, ch 3 , sk next 2 sts, rep from * around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 3: Sl st in next st, sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 1 , sc in same sp, picot (see Special Stitch), ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5 , sc in next ch-2 sp, picot, ch 5 , sc in next ch-3 sp**, ch 5, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ in beg sc to form last ch-5 sp and position hook in center of last ch sp .
Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, ch 7, [sc in next ch sp, ch 7] around, join in beg sc. (12 ch sps)
Rnd 5: Sl st in each of first 2 chs of next ch-7, ch 7 (see Pattern Notes), (tr, ch 3) in each of next 4 chs, 3 sc in next ch sp,
ch 3 , * $\operatorname{tr}$ in 2 nd ch of next ch-7, ch 3 , $(\operatorname{tr}, \operatorname{ch} 3)$ in each of next 4 chs, 3 sc in next ch sp, ch 3, rep from * around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-7.

A. (for extension) ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in top of last dc made, dc in same tr as last dc;
B. ch 9 , sl st in 2 nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in top of last dc made, dc in same tr as last dc;
C. ch $11, \mathrm{sl}$ st in 2 nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in top of last dc made, dc in same tr as last dc;
D. ch 9 , sl st in 2 nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in top of last dc made, dc in same tr as last dc;
E. ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in top of last dc made, sc in next ch- $3 \mathrm{sp}, 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in next tr, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next tr, ch $3, \mathrm{sl}$ st in center sc of next 3 -sc group;

## FINISHING

Apply fabric stiffener according to manufacturer's instructions.

Rnd 3: Sl st in each of first 2 chs of next ch- 11 sp , ch 1 , sc in same ch as last sl st, *sc in each of next 4 chs, ch 3 , sc in same ch as last sc, sc in each of next 4 chs, ch $3^{* *}$, sc in 2 nd ch of next ch- 11 sp , rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.
Rnd 4: *Sl st in each st across to next ch-3 sp, (sl st, ch 10, sl st)
in 5th ch from hook, ch 5, sl st in next ch, (sl st, ch 11, sl st) in 5th ch from hook, ch 6, sl st in next ch, (sl st, ch $10, \mathrm{sl}$ st) in 5 th ch from hook, ch 5, sl st in next ch, sl st in each st across to next ch sp , (for extension) (sc, ch 22, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sc) in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Apply fabric stiffener according to manufacturer's instructions. Pin to plastic wrap-covered pinning board, shape and let dry.

shell (see Special Stitches) in next st] twice, sk next st, sc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in each of next 7 sts , turn.
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 sts, fpdc (see Stitch Guide) around next dc, [shell in next $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next dc, dc in each of next 6 sts, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc , bpdc (see Stitch Guide) around next post st, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1, bpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 6 dc , turn.
Rows 5 \& 6: Rep rows 3 and 4.
Row 7: Ch 3, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, dc in each of next 3 dc , fpdc around next post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 4 sts, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (23 sts)
Row 8: Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 sts, bpdc around next post st, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1 , bpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 5 dc , turn.
Row 9: Ch 3, dc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around next post st, ch 1 , [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 5 dc , turn.
Row 10: Ch 3, dc dec in each of next 2 dc , dc in each of next 2 dc, bpdc around next post st, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice,
sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1 , bpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 3 dc , dc dec in next 2 dc , turn. ( 21 sts)
Row 11: Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 dc , fpdc around next post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 4 dc , turn.
Row 12: Ch 3, dc in each of next 3 dc , bpdc around next post, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1, bpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 4 sts, turn.
Row 13: Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in next dc, fpdc around next post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 2 dc , dc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (19 sts)
Row 14: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc , bpdc around next post st, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1, bpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 3 sts, turn.
Row 15: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc , fpdc around post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 3 sts, turn.
Row 16: Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, bpdc around next post st, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1 , bpdc around next post st, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (17 sts)
Row 17: Ch 3, dc in next st, fpdc around next post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.


Row 18: Ch 3, dc in next st, bpdc around next post st, ch 1, [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, bpdc around post st, dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.
Row 19: Ch 3, dc in next st, fpdc around next post st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, fpdc around next post st, dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.
Row 20: Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, ch 1 , [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] twice, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1 , dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (15 sts)
Row 21: Ch 3, dc in next st, [shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell] twice, shell in next sc, dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.
Row 22: Ch 3, dc dec in next dc and center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, dc dec in center dc of shell and next to last dc, dc in last st, turn. (11 sts)

Row 23: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 1 , sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, ch 1 , dc in 2 sts, turn.
Row 24: Ch 3, dc in next st, shell in sc, sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, dc in last 2 sts, turn.
Row 25: Ch 3, sc in next center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, dc in last st, turn. (7 sts)
Row 26: Ch 3, shell in next sc , sc in center dc of next shell, shell in sc, dc in last st, turn.
Row 27: Ch 3, sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, dc in last st, turn.
Row 28: Ch 3, dc in next sc, sc in center dc of next shell, dc in next sc, dc in last st, turn.
Row 29: Ch 1, sc in first st, shell in next sc, sc in last st, turn.
Row 30: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, sc in center dc of next shell, 2 dc in last st, turn.
Row 31: Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 sts, do not turn.


## Trim

Row 32: Working on 3 sides of Panel, ch 1, work 58 sc evenly sp down side edge of Panel, working across opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in first ch, sc in each of next 23 chs, 3 sc in last ch, work 58 sc evenly sp up opposite edge of Panel. Fasten off. (145 sts)

## BOTTOM SCALLOP EDGING

Row 1: Join (see Pattern Notes) burgundy in center sc of 3 -sc group in corner, ch 1 , sc in same sc as beg ch- 1 , sc in next sc, hdc in each of next 2 sc , dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next sc , dc in each of next 2 sc , hdc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in each of next 2 sc , sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc , hdc in each of next 2 sc , dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next sc , dc in each of next 2 sc , hdc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in each of next 2 sc, turn. (31 sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, *sc in each of next 2 sts , hdc in each of next 2 sts , dc in each of next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 3 \mathrm{tr}$ in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts**, sl st in next st, rep from * once, ending last rep at **, turn. (35 sts)
Row 3: Ch 1, *sc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 4 sts, 3 tr in next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts , sc in each of next 2 sts $^{* *}$, sl st in next st, rep from * once, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$. Fasten off. (39 sts)

## CABLE EDGING

Row 1: Join white in top corner of Panel in row 32 of Trim, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch- 1 , *ch 3 , sk next 2 sc , sc in next sc, turn, sc in each of next 3 chs just made, sl st in next sc, turn, sc in each of 2 sk sc (cable completed), rep from * across, ending with sc in last st of row, turn. (19 cables)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc behind
cable, *work 2 sc in next st, sc in next sc behind next cable, rep from * across, ending with sc in last st, leaving 36 -inch length for sewing, fasten off.
Note: The last Panel is the only Panel for which Cable Edging is worked on both edges.

## ASSEMBLY

With tapestry needle and length of white, alternating color of Panels, whipstitch (see illustration) Panels tog, do not sew first and last Panels tog.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, [sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc , sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}]$ across, turn. ( 65 sc )
Row 3: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 sc , sc dec in next 2 sc ] 13 times, turn. ( 52 sc )
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [picot (see Special Stitches), ch 1 , sk next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc$] 17$ times. Fasten off. ( 17 picots, 35 sc)

## BOTTOM EDGING

Row 1 (RS): Join white in top of Cable Edging, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next Cable Edging row, [sc in each of next

2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 5 sts, 5 tr in next st, dc in each of next 5 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, sl st in next sl st, sc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 5 sts, 5 tr in next st, dc in each of next 5 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts of Cable Edging] 12 times. ( 590 sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts, [picot, ch $1, \mathrm{sc}$ in each of next 2 sts] across. Fasten off. (294 picots)

## SNOWFLAKE

Make 24.
Rnd 1: With white, ch 2,6 sc in 2 nd ch from hook, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 5 , sl st in same st, [(sl st, ch $5, \mathrm{sl} \mathrm{st})$ in next sc] around, sl st in base of beg ch-5, leaving length of yarn, fasten off.
Sew 2 Snowflakes to each Panel centered over row 1 of each side of Bottom Scallop Edging.

## STOCKING

## TOP

Row 1: With white, ch 48 , sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. ( 47 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *ch 3 , sk next 2 sc, sc in next sc, turn, sc in each of next 3 chs just made, sl st in next sc, turn, sc in each of 2 sk sc (cable completed), rep from * across, ending with sc in last st, turn. (15 cables)


Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc behind cable, *work 2 sc in next st, sc in next sc behind next cable, rep from * across, ending with sc in last st. Fasten off.
Row 4: Join (see Pattern Notes burgundy in first st, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st (half shell), [sk next st, sc in next st, sk next st, shell (see Special Stitches) in next st] across, ending with sc in last st, turn. (11 shells, 1 half shell, 12 sc)
Row 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sc in center dc of next shell, shell in next sc] across, ending with, sk next dc, sc in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Rows 6-9: Rep row 5. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

Triple picot (tr picot): Ch 5 , sl st in first ch of ch-5, ch 7, sl st in first ch of ch-7, ch 5, sl st in first ch of ch-5.


## SCARF

## FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1 (RS): With 2 strands held tog (see Pattern Notes) and using slip ring (see illustration), ch $1,6 \mathrm{sc}$ in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. Pull beg length to close slip ring. ( 6 sc )

## 2ND-9TH MOTIFS

Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sc in same st as joining, *sk next dc, [2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next dc] twice, (2 sc, ch $3,2 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-3 sp, [sc in next dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, sk next dc**, sc in next dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. (102 sc)
Rnd 5: Ch 8 (see Pattern Notes) sk next 4 sc , ${ }^{*}$ dc in next sc , ch 3 , sk next $3 \mathrm{sc},(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3, \mathrm{dc})$ in ch-3 sp, ch 3 , sk 3 sc , dc in next sc, ch 3, sk 4 sc**, dtr (see Stitch Guide) in next sc, ch 3 , sk next 4 sc , rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 5th ch of beg ch-8. (30 ch-3 sps)
Rnd 6: Sl st in next sp, ch 3, 2 dc in same $\mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next sp , *(3 dc, ch $3,3 \mathrm{dc})$ in next $\mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 4 sps , rep from * 4 times, ( 3 dc , ch 3, 3 dc ) in next $\mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 2 sps , join in beg ch-3. (108 dc)
Rnd 7: Sl st in each of next 2 dc , [sc between previous and next $\mathrm{dc}, \operatorname{ch} 3$, sk 3 dc twice, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3 , sk 3 dc , *[sc between previous and next dc, ch 3 , sk 3 dc] 5 times, (sc, ch 3 , sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 3 , sk 3 dc, rep from * 4 times, [sc between previous and next dc, ch 3 , sk 3 dc$] 3$ times, join in first sc, fasten off.

## REM MOTIFS

Make 15.
Note: If instructed to join to previously joined corner, work sc in joining sc rather than in ch-3 corner sp.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in each of next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] around, join in beg sc. (45 sc)

## Side

Rnd 6: Ch 1, working in back lp (see Stitch Guide) of sts, [sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next sc, sc in back lp of next sc] 22 times, ch 1 , join in beg sc. (23 sc, 23 ch-1 sps)
Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same sc as joining, ch 1, [sc in next sc, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.

Row 12: Rep row 2, change color to red.
Row 13: Rep row 2, change color to hunter green.
Row 14: Rep row 2, change color to soft white.
Rows 15-19: Rep row 2. At the end of row 19 , change color to paddy green.
Row 20: Rep row 2, change color to hunter green.
Rows 21 \& 22: Rep row 2. At the end of row 22 , change color to red.

Row 23: Rep row 2, change color to soft white.
Row 24: Rep row 2, change color to paddy green.
[Rep row 2, rep color sequence for rows 1-24] 4 times.
Rep row 2 , rep color sequence for rows 1-11.

## Topstitching

Row 1: With crochet hook, beg at top left, sk 5 vertical bars from left edge, join hunter green in 6th vertical bar, sl st in each vertical bar to bottom, ch 1, leaving 3 -inch length, fasten off.
Row 2: Beg at top, sk 6 vertical bars from hunter green, join red in 7th bar, sl st in each vertical bar to bottom, ch 1, leaving 3-inch length, fasten off.
Row 3: Beg at top, sk 7 vertical bars from red, join soft white in 8th bar, sl st in each vertical bar to bottom, ch 1 , leaving 3 -inch length, fasten off.
Rep rows 1-3 of Topstitching across to right edge of Plaid Panel.

## Panel Border

Rnd 1: With crochet hook, join hunter green in any st, ch 1 , sc evenly sp around outer edge, working 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## JOINING PANELS

With crochet hook, with WS facing, hold top edge of first Santa \& Tree Panel to bottom edge of Plaid Panel, matching sts, insert hook in center corner sc of Santa \& Tree Panel, holding hunter green strand between Panels, draw lp through

( $28 \mathrm{fpdc}, 28 \mathrm{sc}$ )
Row 17 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc},{ }^{*}$ fpdc around each of next 4 fpdc , sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc} * *$, 4-dc cl (see Special Stitch) in next sc, sc in next sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, turn. (28 fpdc, $22 s c, 64-d c c l s$ )

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, *sk first 2 fpdc, fpdc around next 2 fpdc ( 3 rd and 4 th fpdc $s t s$ ), working in front of fpdc sts, fpdc around 2 sk fpdc sts (first and $2 n d$ fpdc sts ${ }^{* *}$, sc in each of next 4 sts (2 sc, 4-dc cl and sc), rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in each of next 2 sc , turn.
Row 21: Rep row 19.
Row 22: Rep row 18.
Row 23: Rep row 19.
Row 24: Rep row 20.
Row 25: Rep row 19.
Row 26: Rep row 18.
Row 27: Rep row 19.
Row 28: Rep row 20.
Rows 29 \& 30: Rep row 19. At the end of row 30 , fasten off.

7 inches wide x 64 inches long

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (solids: $6 \mathrm{oz} / 315 \mathrm{yds} /$ 170 g ; heathers: 5 oz/250 yds/142g per skein):

2 skeins \#9762 burgundy
1 skein \#9509 grey heather

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to

- Tapestry needle
- Stitch holder


## GAUGE

[Sc, ch 2, 5 dc, ch 2] twice = 3 inches; 6 rows $=3$ inches
Pocket: 6 inches wide x $61 / 4$ inches long

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SCARF

Row 1 (RS): With burgundy, ch 34,2 dc in 4th ch from hook ( 3 sk chs count as first dc), *sk 2 chs, sc in next ch, sk 2 chs, 5 dc in next ch, rep from * across, ending with 3 dc in last ch, slip
lp from hook and place on stitch holder, do not turn. (4 5-dc groups, 2 3-dc groups, 5 sc)
Row 2 (RS): Return to beg of previous row, join (see Pattern Notes) grey in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), *5 dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 5 sts ( $2 d c, 1$ sc and $2 d c$ ), ch 2 , sc in center dc of next 5 -dc group, ch 2 , rep from * across, ending with sc in 3rd dc of 3-dc group, work last step of this sc with lp of burgundy from stitch holder, turn, do not fasten off grey.
Row 3: With burgundy, ch 3, 2 dc in first sc, *sk next ch-2 sp, sc in center of 5 -dc dec, sk next ch-2 sp, 5 dc in next sc, rep from * across, ending with 3 dc in first ch of ch-3, slip lp from hook on stitch holder, do not turn.
Row 4: Rep row 2.
Rep rows 2 and 3 until Scarf measures 64 inches or desired length, ending with row 3. Fasten off.

## POCKET

## Make 2.

Row 1 (RS): Beg at bottom of Pocket with burgundy, ch 27 loosely, sl st loosely in 3rd ch from hook, [hdc in next ch, sl st loosely in next ch] across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sk first sl st, [sl st loosely in next hdc, hdc in next sl st] across to last st, sl st loosely in top of turning ch, turn.
Rep row 2 until Pocket measures $61 / 4$ inches long. Fasten off.

Rnd 1: Join white in joining between 2 Roses, ch 1, sc in same sp as beg ch- $1, *$ [ch 9 , shell in ch- 5 sp of next $\operatorname{tr}$ picot] 3 times, ch $9^{* *}$, sc in joining between Roses, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. ( 32 ch-9 sps, 24 shells, 8 sc)
Rnd 2: Sl st in next 2 chs of ch -9 , ch 1 , shell in same ch as beg ch-1, [sk next ch, shell in next ch] 3 times, *shell in ch-3 sp of next shell, [sk next ch, shell in next ch] 4 times, rep from * twice, sk next ch, next sc and next ch
(3 sts total)**, shell in next ch, [sk next ch, shell in next ch] 3 times, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc.
Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 sp, *shell in each of next 17 ch- 3 sps of shells**, sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in next ch-3 sp, join in beg sc. (136 shells)
Rnd 4: Sl st in next ch-3 sp of shell, ch 1 , shell in same ch-3 sp , shell in each rem ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. Rnd 5: Join green with picot
(see Special Stitches) in ch-3 sp of any shell, *ch 2 , sl st in sp between shells ( $s p$ between 2 sc sts), ch 2**, picot in ch-3 sp of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Do not iron Doily. Place on flat surface. Spray lightly with starch; press with fingers to shape Border and petals of Roses. Continue to shape as Doily dries and add starch if needed. Leave overnight to dry completely.

Rnd 2 (RS): Ch 1, working in back lp (see Stitch Guide) only, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn. (72 sc)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, [shell in center corner sc, sk next 2 sts] around, join in beg ch 1. ( 24 shells)
Rnd 4: Ch 1, [shell in ch-1 sp of shell] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnds 5-12: Rep rnd 4.
Rnd 13: Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 ch- 1 sps, *[shell in next ch $-1 \mathrm{sp}] 6$ times, sc dec in next $2 \mathrm{ch}-1 \mathrm{sps}$, [shell in next ch- 1 sp] twice**, sc dec in next 2 ch- 1 sps, rep from *, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc dec, turn. ( 16 shells, 4 dec )
Rnd 14: Ch 1, * [sc dec in next $2 \mathrm{ch}-1 \mathrm{sps}]$ twice, shell in each of next 6 shells (side of Handbag), rep from * once, join in beg sc, turn. (12 shells, 4 dec )
Rnd 15: Ch 1, working across side edge of Handbag, [work 11 sc evenly sp across, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts (center sts on end of Handbag), sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Thread yarn needle with long double strand of yarn. Center first handle over

7 sc on side edge of Handbag, working through sc sts and over straight edge of handle, sew handle to Handbag, secure. Fasten off.

With 2nd handle, rep same as first handle on opposite side of Handbag.

Rnd 2: Sl st in ch-3 sp of corner picot, ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), **[(ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next picot) 6 times, *ch 3, (dc, ch 3 , dc) in next corner picot, (ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next picot) 5 times, ch 3, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) over next 2 picots, (ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next picot) 5 times, rep from * twice, (dc, ch 3, dc) in corner picot], rep between [] once, (ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next picot) 6 times, ch 3 , (dc, ch 3 , dc) in next corner picot, rep from ** ending join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.
Rnd 3: **[7 sc in corner ch-3 sp, 4 sc in each of next $7 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, *7 sc in next corner ch-3 sp, 4 sc in each of next $12 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, rep from * twice], rep between [], 7 sc in corner ch- $3 \mathrm{sp}, 4 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of next $7 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$, rep from ** around, ending with join in beg sc. Fasten off.


FINISHING
Dampen and block to finished measurements.

Rows 10 \& 11: Join white in first st, ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn. ( 47 sc )
Rows 12 \& 13: Rep rows 2 and 3.
Row 14: Join green, rep row 4.
Rows 15-18: Rep row 5.
Rows 19-22: Rep rows 10-13.
Row 23: Join burgundy, rep row 4.

Rows 24-26: Rep row 5.
Rows 27-30: Rep rows 10-13.
At the end of last rep, fasten off.

## TOE

Rnd 1: With green, ch 4, 11 dc in first ch of beg ch-4 (3 sk chs count as first dc), join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (12 dc)
Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each rem dc around, join in beg ch-3. (24 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, [dc in each of next $3 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc] around, join in beg ch-3. (30 dc)
Rnds 4-7: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in beg ch-3.
Row 8: Now working in rows, ch 3 , dc in each of next 29 dc , turn. (30 dc)
Row 9: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

Row 10: Ch 3, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 24 dc , dc dec in next 2 dc , dc in last dc, turn. ( 28 dc )
Rows 11-16: Rep row 9. At the end of row 16 , leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.
Fold row 16 in half, whipstitch (see illustration on page 29) back heel seam. Whipstitch rows $8-16$ of Toe to row 30 of Top. Using matching colors, whipstitch Stocking seam closed.

## TOP EDGING

Rnd 1: Join white in opposite side of foundation ch at joining
of back seam, ch 1 , [sc in each of next 3 chs, picot (see Special Stitches)] 15 times, sc in each of next 2 chs, sc in joining seam, picot, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (16 picots)

## HANGING LOOP

Row 1: With white, ch 20, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (19 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 2 , sk $1 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc] 9 times, sl st across bottom of row 1 to opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1 , sc in first ch, [ch 2 , sk 1 ch, sc in next ch] 9 times, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.
Sew Hanging Loop to inside edge of row 3 of Stocking Top.

## SNOWFLAKE

Make 3.
Rnds 1 \& 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of Snowflakes for Tree Skirt on page 29. Sew 1 Snowflake to each of the shell section of Top of Stocking.

across 1 inch. Sew white button to correspond to button lp.

For eyes, glue 26 mm black halfround beads to rnd 1 of Head, referring to photo for placement. Apply rose blush to each cheek. For mouth, glue 75 mm black half-round beads below eyes, centered between rnds 1 and 2 , again referring to photo for placement.
Glue Earmuff Band to top of Head and a Pompom to each end of Earmuff Band. Button Back Closure.

## COASTER

Rnd 1 (RS): Form slip ring (see illustration), ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), work 15 dc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (16 dc)


Slip Ring
Rnd 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), [dc in next dc, ch 1] around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-4. ( 16 dc , 16 ch-1 sps)
Rnd 3: Sl st in ch-1 sp, beg dc cl (see Special Stitches) in same ch-1 sp, [ch 3, dc cl (see Special Stitches) in next ch-1 sp] around, ending with ch 1, hdc in beg dc cl to form last ch-3 sp. (16 dc cl, 16 ch-3 sps)
Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sc in same sp ch sp, ch 5 , [sc in next ch- 3 sp , ch 5] 15 times, join in beg sc. Fasten off. cw
