123456 CONFIDENT BEGINNER

#### FINISHED MEASUREMENT

14 inches in diameter

#### MATERIALS

 Omega Sinfonia light (DK) weight cotton yarn (3½ oz/218 yds/100g per skein):

> 1 skein each #840 green leaf, #820 bright yellow, #801 white, #825 Mexican rose and

#833 deep blue

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- 14-inch-diameter metal ring
- 12 twist ties
- Pinning board
- Straight pins

#### GAUGE

Rnds 1 and 2 = 4 inches in diameter

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Use proper gauge. If project is slightly larger, use a smaller hook so the doily can be stretched to fit the ring. If the doily is too big, it will droop over time.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**Beginning 4-treble crochet cluster (beg 4-tr cl):** Ch 3, [yo hook twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, {yo, draw through 2 lps on hook} twice] 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

**4-treble crochet cluster (4-tr cl):** [Yo hook twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, {yo, draw through 2 lps on hook} twice] 4 times, yo, draw through all 5 lps on hook.

#### 123456 EASY

#### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

**Square:** 11 inches square **Blanket:** 32 inches square

#### MATERIALS

 Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (solids: 7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein; multis: 5 oz/ 236 yds/141g per skein):

- 2 skeins #334 buff 1 skein each #313 Aran, #512 turqua, #324 bright yellow, #3955 wildflower, #3934 day glow, #672 spring
- green, #311 white, #579 pale plum, #254 pumpkin and #718 shocking pink
- Red Heart Classic medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3 oz/146 yds/85g per skein): 1 skein #985 purples
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

#### GAUGE

[3 dc, ch 1] twice = 2 inches

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

#### BLANKET

#### FLIP-FLOP

Make 6 each turqua, yellow, pink, pumpkin & purples.

Make 12 each day glow & wildflower.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 2 chs, sc in last ch, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. (10 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 sc, join in beg sc. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 5 times, 2 sc in next sc, join in beg sc. (*18 sc*)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sc, sl st in each of next 3 sc, sc in next sc, 2 hdc in next sc, 2 dc in next sc, 2 hdc in next sc, 2 dc in next sc, 2 hdc in next sc, sc in next sc, sl st in each of next 3 sts, sc in next st, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (7 sc, 6 sl sts, 4 hdc, 4 dc, 2 tr)

#### **Flip-Flop Strap**

Make 3 each wildflower & pale plum for turqua; 3 each pumpkin & day glow for yellow; 3 each green & day glow for pink; 3 each yellow & day glow for pumpkin; 3 each white & pale plum for purples; 6 each green & pink for day glow; & 6 each turqua & pale plum for wildflower.

**Row 1:** Join yarn with sl st in center sl st of right edge of

Flip-Flop, ch 6, sl st between 2 tr of rnd 4, ch 6, sl st in center sl st on left edge of Flip-Flop. Fasten off.

#### **Flower Center**

For turqua: 1 rnd each turqua, pale plum & wildflower.

For yellow: 1 rnd each yellow, pumpkin & day glow.

For pink: 1 rnd each pink, green & day glow.

For pumpkin: 1 rnd each pumpkin, yellow & day glow.

For purples: 1 rnd each purples, white & pale plum.

For day glow: 1 rnd each day glow, green & pink.

### For wildflower: 1 rnd each wildflower, pale plum & turqua.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 3, join to form ring, ch 1, 8 sc in ring, join in first sc. Fasten off. (8 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Join next color, ch 1, 2 sc in joining, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (*16 sc*)

**Rnd 3:** Join next color, ch 1, 2 sc in joining, 2 sc in each sc around, join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off. (*32 sc*)

#### SQUARE

#### Make 5 buff & 4 Aran.

**Rnd 1:** Ch 5, join to form ring, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, (3 dc in ring, ch 1) 3 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (*12 dc*, 4 *ch*-1 *sps*)

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in next 2 dc and in each ch-1 sp, ch 1, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-1 sp, ch 3] 4 times, join in first sc. (8 ch-3 sps, 8 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in corner ch-3 sp, ch 3, (2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in same sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1] across to next corner ch-3 sp, \*(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-3 sp,





ch 1] across to next corner ch-3 sp, rep from \* twice, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (*36 dc, 12 ch-1 sps*)

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in corner ch-1 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-1 sp, ch 3, [sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3] across to next corner ch-1 sp, \*(sc, ch 3, sc) in corner ch-1 sp, [sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3] across to next corner ch-1 sp, rep from \* around, join in first sc. (16 ch-3 sps, 16 sc)

**Rnds 5–10:** [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] 3 times.

**Rnd 11:** Rep rnd 3. Fasten off. (*132 dc, 44 ch-1 sps*)

Block Squares into shape and press all Flower pieces with warm steam iron, placing double thickness of cloth between iron and square pieces. Allow to dry thoroughly.

#### ASSEMBLY

Attach 6 Flip-Flops to each Square in a circle with fronts (toe section) pointing outward and centering over rnds 1–8 of Square overlapping heels Continued on page 56

#### 123456 CONFIDENT BEGINNER

#### **FINISHED MEASUREMENT** 10 inches in diameter

#### MATERIALS

 Premier Yarns Home Cotton medium (worsted) weight cotton/ polyester yarn (2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz/140 yds/ 80g per ball): 1 ball each #3801 white

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- and #3804 yellow
  Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

#### GAUGE

 $6 dc = 1\frac{3}{4}$  inches; rnds 1-3 = 4 inches

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-8 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet and chain-6 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.



DAILY FRES

#### **DISHCLOTH**

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With white, ch 3, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in ring, [ch 1, hdc in ring] 4 times, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. (6 hdc, 6 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 2:** (Sl st, sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in first ch-1 sp, sc in next hdc, [(sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in next hdc] 5 times, join in first sc. Fasten off. (*18 sc*, *12 hdc*, 6 *dc*) **Rnd 3:** Join yellow in **back bar of any dc** (*see illustration*), [ch 4, sl st in back bar of next dc] 5 times, ch 4, join in first sl st. (6 ch-4 sps)



**Back Bar of Double Crochet** 

**Rnd 4:** [Sl st, hdc, 2 dc, tr, 2 dc, hdc, sl st] in each ch-4 sp (*petal made*), join in first sl st. Fasten off. (6 petals) **Rnd 5:** Join white in sp between any 2 petals, **ch 8** (*see Pattern Notes*), hdc in sp between next 2 petals, [ch 6, hdc in sp between next 2 petals] 4 times, ch 6, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-8. (6 hdc, 6 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, sc in each ch and each hdc around, join in first sc.  $(42 \ sc)$ 

**Rnd 7: Ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in same sc as beg ch-3, [dc in each of next 6 sc, ch 1, 2 dc in next sc] 5 times, dc in each of last 6 sc, ch 1, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (48 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 8:** Join yellow in first dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1,

dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, ch 1, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of last 6 dc, ch 1, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (54 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 9: Join white in first dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, ch 1, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of last 5 dc, ch 1, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off.  $(61 \, dc, 6 \, ch-1 \, sps)$ 

**Rnd 10:** Join yellow in first dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 3 dc, [2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, ch 1, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 4 dc] twice, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of last 5 dc, ch 1, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (69 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 11:** Join white in first dc, **ch 5** (*see Pattern Notes*), sk next dc, hdc in next dc, [ch 3, sk next dc, hdc in next dc] around, ch 3, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-5. Fasten off. (*34 hdc*, *33 ch-3 sps*)

#### FINISHING

Block lightly to enhance edging.



### Summer Story Scarf

#### 123456 EASY

#### **FINISHED MEASUREMENTS**

4½ inches wide x 60 inches long

#### MATERIALS

 Universal Yarn Little Bird Colors fine (sport) weight acrylic (3½ oz/ 344 yds/100g per ball): 1 ball #204

- summer story • Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

**GAUGE** 7 rows = 4 inches



#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-6 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.


#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

#### First foundation single crochet (first foundation sc):

Ch 2, insert hook into 2nd ch from hook, yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (*ch-1 completed*), yo, pull though 1 lp on hook (*sc completed*) (*see illustration*).

Next foundation single crochet (next foundation sc): [Insert hook in last ch-1 made, yo, pull up lp, ch 1, yo, pull through all lps on hook] as indicated (see illustration).

**Cluster (cl):** Holding back last lp of each dc on hook, 3 dc in place indicated, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.



**First Foundation Single Crochet** 

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#### SCARF


**Row 1:** Work **first foundation sc** (see Special Stitches), work 24 **next foundation sc** (see Special Stitches), turn. (25 sc)

**Row 2: Ch 6** (see Pattern Notes), **cl** (see Special Stitches) in first sc, \*sk next 3 sc, dc in next sc, ch 2, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 2, sk next sc\*\*, (dc, ch 3, cl) in next sc, rep from \* twice, ending last rep at \*\*, dc in last sc, turn. (3 cls, 7 dc, 3 sc, 6 ch-2 sps, 3 ch-3 sps)

**Row 3:** Ch 6, cl in first dc, \*dc in next dc, ch 2, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2\*\*, (dc, ch 3, cl) in next dc, rep from \* twice, ending last rep at \*\*, dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, turn.

**Next rows:** Rep row 3 until piece measures 60 inches or desired length.

Last row: Ch 1, work 25 sc evenly sp across. Fasten off. (25 sc)



**Next Foundation Single Crochet**

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#### JUST THREADS

### **Pillow Lace Band**

#### **Design by Agnes Russell**

#### 123456 EASY

#### **FINISHED MEASUREMENTS**

2¾ inches wide x 34 inches in diameter

#### MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (350 yds per ball): 1 ball #450 agua
- Size 7/1.65mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Spray starch
- 14-inch pillow

#### GAUGE

1 Scallop (*starched*) =  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches long

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Lace Band can be crocheted to any length. If joining, always end with an even number of Scallops. If piece will not be joined, end with an odd number of Scallops.

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**Beginning 3-double crochet cluster (beg 3-dc cl):** Ch 3, [yo, insert hook in next tr, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

#### **3-double crochet cluster**


(**3-dc cl):** [Yo, insert hook in next tr, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook.

#### **LACE BAND**

#### FIRST SCALLOP

**Row 1:** Ch 10, **join** (see Pattern Notes) to form ring, **ch 4** (see Pattern Notes), 17 tr in ring, turn. (18 tr)

Row 2: Beg 3-dc cl (see Special Stitches), [ch 6, 3-dc cl (see Special Stitches)] 5 times, turn. (6 3-dc cls, 5 ch-6 sps)



**Row 3:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first ch-6 sp, [ch 2, 2 sc] 3 times in same ch-6 sp, [2 sc in next ch-6 sp, {ch 2, 2 sc} 3 times in same ch-6 sp] 4 times, (sl st, ch 10, sl st) in top of last 3-dc cl of previous row (*ring made*), turn.

#### **2ND SCALLOP**

**Row 4:** Ch 4, 17 tr in ring, turn. (*18 tr*)

**Row 5:** Beg 3-dc cl, [ch 6, 3-dc cl] 5 times, sl st in ch-10 sp of previous Scallop, turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first ch-6 sp, [ch 2, 2 sc] 3 times in same ch-6 sp, [2 sc in next ch-6 sp, {ch 2, 2 sc} 3 times in same ch-6 sp] 4 times, (sl st, ch 10, sl st) in top of last 3-dc cl of previous row, turn.

#### **3RD-25TH SCALLOPS**

**Rows 7–75:** [Rep rows 4–6 consecutively] 23 times.

#### **26TH SCALLOP**

**Rows 76 & 77:** Rep rows 4 and 5.

**Row 78:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first ch-6 sp, [ch 2, 2 sc] 3 times in same ch-6 sp, [2 sc in next ch-6 sp, {ch 2, 2 sc} 3 times in same ch-6 sp] 4 times, sl st in top of last 3-dc cl of previous row, leaving 12-inch length, fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Place Lace Band on flat surface; using care that Scallops are not twisted, spray with starch and allow to dry, shaping as pieces dry.

Using care to keep piece flat and using care not to twist, bring last Scallop up to First Scallop. Thread rem length on tapestry needle, sew last 3-dc cl of last Scallop to First Scallop ch-10 sp and last 3-dc cl of First Scallop to ch-10 sp of 26th Scallop.

Place Lace Band over pillow as desired.

#### 123456 INTERMEDIATE

#### **FINISHED SIZES**

Instructions given fit woman's size X-small; changes for small, medium, large, X-large, 2X-large and 3X-large are in [].

#### **FINISHED MEASUREMENTS**

**Bust:** 30 inches (*X-small*) [34 inches (*small*), 38 inches (*medium*), 42 inches (*large*), 46 inches (*X-large*), 50 inches (*2X-large*), 54 inches (*3X-large*)] **Length:** 19½ inches (*X-small*), [20½ inches (*small and medium*), 21½ inches (*large and X-large*), 22½ inches (*2X-large and 3X-large*)]

#### MATERIALS

 Omega Sinfonia light (DK) weight cotton yarn (3½ oz/218 yds/ 100g per skein):

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2 [2, 2, 3, 3, 4, 4] skeins #801 white

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- Stitch markers: 4

#### GAUGE

[Dc, ch 3] 3 times = 3 inches; 4 rnds = 2 inches

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated. Open and lacy, this top can be worn over a brightly colored tank or T-shirt, or under a jacket with a cami for a different look.

> Sized to **3X**

Carefree Cotton Top length is written as tank top length and can be easily adjusted to halter length or a swimsuit cover length by removing or adding repeats of rounds 3 and 4, ending all sizes with round 4.

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

#### First foundation single crochet (first foundation sc):

Ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo, draw lp through, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook (*base ch completed*), yo, draw through 2 lps on hook.

#### Next foundation single crochet (next foundation sc):

[Insert hook in base ch just completed, yo, draw lp through, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook (base ch completed), yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] until indicated number of sts has been completed.

#### TOP


Rnd 1 (RS): Beg at bodice edge of Top, work first foundation sc (see Special Stitches), work 111 [119, 127, 135, 143, 151, 159] next foundation sc (see Special Stitches), join (see Pattern Notes) in first foundation sc. (112 [120, 128, 136, 144, 152, 160] foundation sc)

**Rnd 2: Ch 6** (see Pattern Notes), [sk next 3 foundation sc, dc in next foundation sc, ch 3] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (28 [30, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40] ch-3 sps)


**Rnd 3: Ch 5** (see Pattern Notes), sc in center ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 2, [dc in next dc, ch 2, sc in center ch of next ch-3 sp, ch 2] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.

**Rnd 4:** Ch 6, sk next ch-2 sp, sc and next ch-2 sp, [dc in next dc, ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, sc and next ch-2 sp] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6.

**Rnds 5–32 [5–34, 5–34, 5–36, 5–36, 5–36, 5–38, 5–38]:** [Rep rnds 3

Rnd 34 [36, 36, 38, 38, 40, 40]: Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sk next sc, 3 dc in next sc, sk next sc, [sc in next sc, sk next sc, 3 dc in next sc, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

#### **NECKLINE & SHOULDER STRAPS**

With joining of rnd 1 at center back, position stitch markers so there are 34 [36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46] sts across each front and back, leaving 22 [24, 26, 28, 30, 32, 34] sts free for each underarm.


**Rnd 1:** Starting at center back, join yarn at center back and working in opposite side of foundation sc sts, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 16 [17, 18, 19, 10, 21, 22] sc, ch 28 [30, 30, 32, 32, 34, 34] *(first Shoulder Strap)*, sc in each of next 34 [36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46] sts across front, ch 28 [30, 30, 32, 32, 34, 34] *(2nd Shoulder Strap)*, sc in each of next 17 [18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23] sts across back, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 17 [18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23] sts across back, working in **back bar of ch** (*see illustration*), sc in each of next 28 [30, 30, 32, 32, 34, 34] chs across first Shoulder Strap, sc in each of next 34 [36, 38, 40, 42, 44, 46] across front, working in back bar of ch, sc in each of next 28 [30, 30, 32, 32, 34, 34] chs across 2nd Shoulder Strap, sc in each of next 17 [18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23] sts across back, join in beg sc. (124 [132, 136, 144, 148, 156, 160] sc)

Rnds 3 & 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc. At the end of rnd 4, fasten off.

**GAUGE** Rnds 1 and 2 = 1% inches in diameter

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-6 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**Roll stitch (roll st):** Yo hook 20 times, insert hook in indicated st or sp, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through all lps on hook.

**Roll-stitch shell (roll-st shell):** Work 6 roll sts in indicated st or sp.

#### BONNET

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With pink, ch 7, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **ch 6** (*see Pattern Notes*), [dc in ring, ch 3] 5 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-6. (6 ch-3 sps)



Welcome a special baby into the world with this beautiful thread masterpiece. For a timeless look, crochet it all in white to complement a christening dress.

**Rnd 2:** Sl st in first sp, ch 6, beg in same sp, 4 **roll sts** (*see Special Stitches*) in each sp around, join in top of beg roll st. (24 roll sts)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st between same roll st and next roll st, [ch 5, sl st between next 2 roll sts] around, ending with ch 2, dc in beg sl st to form last ch-5 sp. (24 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 4:** [Ch 5, sl st in next ch-5 sp] around, ending with (ch 2, dc) in top of last dc of last rnd to form last ch-5 sp. (24 ch-5 sps)

**Rnd 5:** \*Ch 9, sl st in 5th ch from hook, tr in next ch-5 sp, (ch 7, sl st—*ch-7 picot made*, ch 4, sl st) in top of tr just made, ch 4, sl st in next ch-5 sp, rep from \* around. Fasten off. (12 ch-7 picots)

**Rnd 6 (RS):** Join pink in any ch-7 picot, ch 9, [sl st in next ch-7 picot, ch 9] around, join in beg sl st. (*12 ch-9 sps*)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 1, beg in same st as joining, sc in each sl st and ch around, join in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) only of beg sc. (120 sc)

**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, working in back lp for this rnd only, sc in each sc around, join in back lp of beg sc. (*120 sc*)

**Rnd 9:** Rep rnd 8, ending with join in both lps of beg sc. (120 sc)



**Rnd 5:** Ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, \*ch 2, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, rep from \* around, ch 2, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (40 dc, 10 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, \*ch 2, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, rep from \* around, ch 2, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (60 dc, 10 ch-2 sps)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 dc, \*ch 2, dc in each



of next 6 dc, rep from \* around, ch 2, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (60 dc, 10 ch-2 sps)

**Rnds 8–10: Ch 4** (see Pattern Notes), sk next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc, \*ch 2, dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc, rep from \* around, ch 2, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (40 dc, 20 ch-1 sps, 10 ch-2 sps)

#### Rnds 11-15 [11-18]:

Ch 4, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in next dc, \*ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in next dc, rep from \* around, ch 3, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (40 dc, 20 ch-1 sps, 10 ch-3 sps)

#### **CHILD SIZE ONLY**

**Rnd 16:** Ch 1, sc in first dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next dc, sc in next ch-3 sp, \*sc in next dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc dec in next 2 dc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next dc, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from \* around, join in first sc. (60 sc)

#### **ADULT SIZE ONLY**

[**Rnd 19]:** Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch sp around, join in first sc. (70 sc)

#### **BOTH SIZES**

Rnds 17–20 [20–24]: Ch 1, working in back lp (see Stitch Guide), sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (60 [70] sc)

- 1 ball each #02751 white, #02762 cardinal, #02941 school bus yellow, #08628 hot orange, #08416 hot pink and #08417 peony pink
- Size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

#### GAUGE

1 Posy = 1¼ inches in diameter

#### **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

First chain in chain-3 of Posy Petal is the Petal tip. Insert needle into this chain when sewing Petals together.

To enlarge Cozy to fit bigger phone or electronic device, work additional Posies and rows as needed to fit around device.

#### **SPECIAL STITCH**

**Bobble:** Yo, insert hook in indicated st and pull up a lp, [yo, insert hook in same st and pull up a lp] 4 times, yo and draw through 11 loops on hook. Cute puffy flowers in vibrant summertime colors not only make you smile, but they also create a plush case to keep your smartphone safe and secure.



#### **POSY CENTER**

Make 31.

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With white, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd

COLOR KEY
Peony pink
Cardinal
Hot orange
Hot pink
School bus yellow



Puffy Posy Phone Cozy Assembly Diagram ch from hook, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. Fasten off. (6 sc)

#### **POSY PETALS**

#### Make 8 peony pink, 7 yellow, 6 orange, & 5 each cardinal & hot pink.

**Rnd 2:** With WS of Posy Center facing, join 2nd color to any sc, ch 2, **bobble** (*see Special Stitch*) in same sc (*Petal made*), [ch 3, sl st in next sc, ch 2, bobble in same sc] 5 times, ch 3, join in first ch of first Petal. Fasten off. (6 Petals)

#### ASSEMBLY

Set aside 1 yellow Posy for closure. Sew all Petals tog from WS.

Using Assembly Diagram as a guide, arrange Posies in 5 rows of 6 Posies each. Thread tapestry needle with a 5-inch strand of any color and insert needle through **first chs of adjacent B-Petal tips** (*see Pattern Notes*), knot strand securely, and weave in tails. Rep to join C-Petal tips of same Posies tog. Rep in same manner to join Posies tog in each row.

Align long edges of rows as shown in Assembly Diagram. Sew B-Petal joins to A-Petal tips directly above and C-Petal joins to A-Petal tips directly below.

With RS tog, fold Cozy widthwise and sew Petal tips tog at ends of rows in same manner.

Hold sides of Cozy tog at bottom, positioning Posies so that 2 pairs are centered. Sew each pair of A-Petal tips tog. On each side of Cozy, fold A-Petal tip of Posy over adjacent B-Petals and sew to B-Petal joins. Turn cozy RS out.

Place center of rem yellow Posy over B-Petal join of center 2 Posies at top front and with strand of white, sew in place.

#### FINISHING

#### **Closing Lp**

With peony pink and leaving a 6-inch tail, ch 45, sl st in 45th ch from hook. Fasten off, leaving a 6-inch tail. Pull yarn tails through sp between B- and C-Petal joins of top 2 Posies centered at back of Cozy. Sew tails through WS and secure.

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Draw up yarn on bobbles for Hot Pad to ¾-inch height; draw up yarn on bobbles for Coaster to ½-inch height.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**Bobble:** Yo, insert hook in indicated sp and pull up a lp, [yo, insert hook in same st and pull up a lp] 3 times, yo and draw through 9 lps on hook.


**Single crochet join (sc join):** Place a slip knot on hook, insert hook in indicated st, yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through both lps on hook.

**Picot:** Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

#### HOT PAD

#### FRONT

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With size H hook and blue, form a **slip ring** (see *illustration*), **ch 2** (see Pattern Notes), 15 dc in ring, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg ch-2. (16 dc)

**Rnd 2: Ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), hdc in next dc, \*ch 1, hdc in next dc, rep from \* around, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (16 hdc, 16 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 3:** With RS facing, join happy go lucky in any ch-1 sp,

working to **¾-inch height**, (see Pattern Notes), **bobble** (see Special Stitches) in same sp, (ch 3, bobble) in each ch-1 sp around, ch 3, join in top of first bobble. Fasten off. (16 bobbles, 16 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 4:** With RS facing, join blue in any ch-3 sp, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), (dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in same sp, ch 1, [2 dc, ch 1] twice in each ch-3 sp around, join in top of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (64 dc, 32 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 5:** Rep rnd 3. (32 bobbles, 32 ch-3 sps)

#### BACK

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With blue, form a slip ring, **ch 2** (see Pattern Notes), 11 hdc in ring, join in top of beg ch-2. Pull gently on beg tail to tighten ring. (12 hdc)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in each rem st around, join in top of beg ch-2. (24 hdc)

**Rnd 3:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in next st, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (*36 hdc*)

**Rnd 4:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 2 sts, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (48 hdc)

**Rnd 5:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 3 sts, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 3 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (60 hdc)

**Rnd 6:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 4 sts, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (72 hdc)

**Rnd 7:** Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 5 sts, \*2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 5 sts, rep from \* around, join in top of beg ch-2. (84 hdc)



**Rnd 8:** Ch 1, sc in first 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, \*sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (*96 sc*)

Joining rnd: Holding Front and Back with WS tog and working through both thicknesses, sc join (see Special Stitches) blue in any ch-3 sp of Front and any sc of Back, picot (see Special Stitches), sk next sc of Back, sc in same ch-3 sp of Front and next sc of Back, \*sc in next ch-3 sp of Front and in next sc of Back, picot, sk next sc of Back, sc in same ch-3 sp of Front and in next sc of Back, rep from \* around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

#### COASTER

Rnds 1-3: With G hook, work

same as rnds 1–3 of Hot Pad, working bobble to ¼**-inch height** (see Pattern Notes). Fasten off.

**Rnd 4:** With RS facing, **sc join** (*see Special Stitches*) blue in any ch-3 sp, picot, sc in same ch-3 sp, (sc, picot, sc) in each ch-3 sp around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

**Row 3:** Sl st in each of first 6 sts (2 hdc, 2 dc, ch-1 and next dc), **ch 4** (see Pattern Notes), dc in same dc as ch-4, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 3 times, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next dc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (7 dc, 6 ch-1 sps)

**Row 4: Ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as ch-3, ch 1, 2 dc in next dc, [ch 1, 2 tr in next dc] 3 times, ch 1, 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next ch, 2 dc in 3rd ch of ch-4, turn. (6 tr, 8 dc, 6 ch-1 sps) **Row 5:** Ch 2, hdc in next dc, ch 1, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, dc in next tr, 2 dc in next tr, ch 1, dc in next 2 tr, ch 1, 2 dc in next tr, dc in next tr, ch 1, dc in each of next 2 dc, ch 1, hdc in each of next 2 dc, turn. **Row 7:** Ch 2, hdc in next hdc, ch 1, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1, dc in next tr, 2 dc in next tr, dc in next tr, ch 1, dc in each of next 4 tr, ch 1, dc in next tr, 2 dc in next tr, dc in next tr, ch 1, dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 1, hdc in each of next 2 hdc, turn. Position Shell as desired on linen napkin. With length of matching sewing thread, sew Shell to napkin.

For swag, cut ribbon in 4 pieces each 6 inches long and 2 pieces each 12 inches long. With RS facing, lay cream and linen Shells in a row alternating colors, with edges touching. Insert the shorter ribbon pieces in edge of 2 adjacent Shells, and then tie ribbon into a bow. Rep with shorter ribbon pieces across until all 5 Shells are joined. Insert the longer ribbon pieces in rem edge at left and right of assembled Shells, and then tie ribbon in a bow at end of ribbon. Lp other end of ribbon around back and glue to back of bow to form hanging lps. Trim ribbon ends. Glue bows to hold in place.





Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times. (32 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times. (40 sc)

**Rnds 6 & 7:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 7, sl st in next sc. Fasten off.

## **OUTER COVER**

**Note:** Beg with black, work Outer Cover alternating 4 rnds black and 4 rnds white throughout, ending with black.

**Rnd 1:** Beg at top of Pole with black, ch 3, join, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch, do not join, place marker. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

**Rnd 3:** Sc around, **inc** (see Stitch Guide) 2 sc evenly sp. (14 sc)

Rnd 4: Rep rnd 3. (16 sc)

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 6: Rep rnd 3. (18 sc)

**Rnd 7:** Rep rnd 5.

Rnd 8: Rep rnd 3. (20 sc)

Rnds 9 & 10: Rep rnd 5.

**Rnds 11–34:** [Rep rnds 8–10 consecutively] 8 times. (*36 sc*)

Rnd 35: Rep rnd 3. (38 sc)

Rnds 36–38: Rep rnd 5.

Rnd 39: Rep rnd 3. (40 sc)

**Rnds 40–44:** Rep rnd 5. At the end of rnd 44, **do not** fasten off.



Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in next sp between dc sts, 2 dc in next sp, [dc in next 2 sps, 2 dc in next sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3.  $(80 \, dc)$ 



Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next 6 sps, 2 dc in next sp, [dc in each of next 7 sps, 2 dc in next sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (90 dc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in each of next 7 sps, 2 dc in next sp, [dc in each of next 8 sps, 2 dc in next sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (100 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in each of next 8 sps, 2 dc in next sp, [dc in each of next 9 sps, 2 dc in next sp] around, join top of beg ch-3. (110 dc)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 8 sts, 2 dc in next sp, [dc in each of next 10 sps, 2 dc in next sp] around, join in top of beg ch-3,

the end of rnd 11 join in beg

Rnd 1: With black, ch 3, join to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch

Rnds 4–8: Sc in each sc around.

## **Bottom of Cone**

Rnd 9: Sl st in next st, turn piece so RS is on the inside of Cone, ch 1, working in back lps (see Stitch Guide) only, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next stl around. (24 sc)

## **Outer Cone**

**Rnd 10:** Sl st in first st, ch 1, working in back lps only, sc in each st around. (24 sc)

Rnds 11-13: Sc in each st around. At the end of rnd 13, change color (see Stitch Guide) to white.

Rnds 14-17: Sc in each st around. At the end of rnd 17, change color to black.

Rnds 18 & 19: Sc in each sc around.

Inner Cone is rnds 1–8 of Topper and rnds 10–19 is the Outer Cone of Topper; rnd 9 is Bottom of Cone. Push Inner Cone into Outer Cone and stuff lightly with fiberfill between layers.

Rnd 20: [Sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc] around.  $(12 \ sc)$ 

**Rnd 21:** Rep rnd 20. (6 sc)

Rnd 22: [Sl st in every other st] 3 times. Fasten off.

## SIGN

## **Sign Front**

Row 1: With size I hook and white, ch 18, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (17 sc)

Rows 2–7: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of last row, change color (see Stitch Guide) to black.

Rnd 8: Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc evenly sp around outer edge, working 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Letters

## Make 3.

Each letter is crocheted the same. With size I hook and with black, ch 17, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.


To make letters evenly sp on Sign Front, start with center O. Each letter should be approximately 1 inch wide x 1¾ inches tall. With tapestry needle and rem length of yarn, tack each letter to Sign Front spelling out ZOO.

## **Sign Back**

**Rows 1–7:** With black, rep rows 1–7 of Sign Front. At the end of row 7 **do not fasten off**.

**Rnd 8:** Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc evenly sp around outer edge, working 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc, leaving a 24-inch length, fasten off.

With WS of Sign Front and Back facing, thread tapestry needle with rem length and, working through both thicknesses, **whipstitch** (*see illustration*) edges tog around outer edge, inserting cardboard between layers before closing.

## Arch

**Rnd 1:** With black, leaving a 6-inch length at beg, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around.

Rep rnd 2 until piece measures 7 inches long. Leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Sew each end of Arch to top of Sign (*see photo*).



## **Vertical Bar**

## Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With black, leaving a 6-inch length at beg, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around.

Rep rnd 2 until piece measures 1¾ inches. Leaving 6-inch length, fasten off. Sew Vertical Bars centered to top of Sign and Arch (*see photo*).

## **FLOWER**

## Make 5 each red & yellow.

*Note:* Instructions given are for red Flowers. Changes for yellow Flowers are in [].

**Rnd 1:** With size F hook and yellow [pumpkin], ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

**Rnd 2:** Join red [yellow] in any sc of rnd 1, [ch 3, 3 dc, ch 2, sl st in same st, sl st in next st] 5 times, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Sew Flowers in groups of 2 evenly sp around on the Grass or as desired.

## **HIPPO**

## BODY

**Rnd 1:** With lavender, ch 48, join to form a ring, ch 1, sc in each ch around. (*48 sc*)

**Rnds 2–9:** Sc around, **inc** (see Stitch Guide) 6 sc evenly sp around. (96 sc)

Rnd 10: Sc in each sc around.

**Rnds 11–18:** Sc around, **dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) 6 sc evenly sp around. At the end of rnd 18, sl st in next st, leaving 24-inch length, fasten off. (*48 sc*)

Matching sts of rnd 18 to opposite side of foundation ch, whipstitch edges tog, stuffing with fiberfill as work progresses to form ring.

## HEAD

**Rnd 1:** With lavender, ch 3, join to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in ch around. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (*12 sc*)

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

**Rnd 5:** [Sc in each of next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (*36 sc*)

**Rnd 6:** [Sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (42 sc)

**Rnds 7–11:** Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 4:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, \*shell in next shell, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] twice, rep from \* around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (6 shells, 12 groups of 3-dc)

**Rnd 5:** Join blue in any ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*[ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, ch 3\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3. (6 shells, 24 ch-3 sps)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, 2 dc in each of next 2 ch-3 sps, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3\*\*, shell in next ch-2 sp of shell, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3. (6 shells, 36 dc)

Rnd 7: Sl st in next ch-2 sp of

shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3\*\*, shell in next shell, rep from \* around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (6 shells, 36 ch-3 sps)

## **JOINING BASE MOTIF**

## Make 6.

**Rnds 1–6:** Rep rnds 1–6 of First Base Motif.

**Rnd 7:** Sl st in next ch-2 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch-2 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, ch 3, sc in ch-3 sp, ch 3, **joining** shell (see Special Stitches), ch 3, sc in ch-3 sp, \*ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] 3 times, ch 3, sc in ch-3 sp, ch 3\*, rep from \* to \* as many times as needed to join working Motif to adjacent Motif(s) following Assembly Diagram for placement, ending rnds with [shell in shell, ch 3, sc in ch-3 sp, {ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc} 3 times, ch 3, sc in ch sp, ch 3] as many times around as needed to complete Motif, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off.

## **PLAIN MOTIF**

## Make 12.

**Rnds 1–3:** Rep rnds 1–3 of First Base Motif. At the end of rnd 3, fasten off. (6 shells, 6 groups of 3-dc)

**Rnd 1:** With natural, ch 4, 13 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (14 dc)

**Rnd 2:** [Ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in each of next 4 chs, dc in each of next 4 chs, sk next dc on rnd 1, sl st in next dc] around, join in first dc. Fasten off. (7 *petals*)

## Make 2 for each flower.

**Rnd 1:** Rep rnd 1 of Large Petals.

of next 2 chs, ch 2, dc in each of next 2 chs, sk next 3 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, [ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, ch 2, sk next 2 chs, 2 dc in next ch, ch 3, sk 1 ch, 2 dc in next ch (peak), ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, sk next 3 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs (valley) 8 times, ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, ch 2, sk next 2 chs, 2 dc in next ch, ch 3, sk 1 ch, 2 dc in last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in ch-3 sp, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, [2 dc in each of next 2 ch-2 sps (valley), ch 2, 2dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp (peak), ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] 8 times, 2 dc in each of next 2 ch-2 sps, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in end of ch-4 sp, turn.

Rows 3-16: Rep row 2. At the end of row 16, fasten off.

Row 17: Join fern in first st. **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in ch-3 sp, [dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in ch-2 sp] twice, sk next 4 dc, \*[2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, [dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp] twice, rep from \* 7 times, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in each of next 2 dc] twice, 2 dc in ch-4 sp. Fasten off.

Row 18: Join moonstone in first st of previous row, ch 1, [sc in each st across to ch-3 sp at peak, (2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-3 sp] across. Fasten off. (212 sc)

Row 19: Join mustard in first st of previous row, ch 3, dc in same

st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, [dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 5 sts, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next 5 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts] 8 times, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, 2 dc in last st. Fasten off.

Row 20: Rep row 18. (212 sc)

Row 21: Join fern in first st of previous row. ch 3. dc in same st. dc in each of next 7 sts, [sk next 4 sts. dc in each of next 8 sts. sk next 2 sts, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 8 sts] 8 times, sk next 4 sts, dc in each of next 7 sts, 2 dc in next st. Fasten off.


Row 22: Join white in first st of previous row, ch 4, 2 dc in same st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, [dc in each of next 4 sts, ch 2, sk next 3 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 3 sts, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next 3 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 3 sts] 8 times, dc in each of next 4 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in last st, turn.

Rows 23–26: Rep row 2.

Rows 27-66: [Rep rows 17-26 consecutively] 4 times.

Rows 67-72: [Rep rows 17-22 consecutively] once.

Rows 73-87: Rep row 2. At the end of row 87, fasten off.

- Size 7/4.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch x 9 inches corrugated plastic strips: 2
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch in diameter x 17 inches long cotton rope: 2 pieces
- 2 small safety pins

## GAUGE

16 dc = 4 inches; 7 dc rows = 4 inches

## **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Rounds with 5-dc popcorns are worked twice, using black first and then beige worked behind on the same round.

When dropping a color to wrong side, draw up loop, secure loop with safety pin. Remove safety pin when picking up color.

## **SPECIAL STITCH**

**5-double crochet popcorn** (**5-dc pc):** [Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 5 times in same st (6 lps on hook), yo, draw through all 6 lps on hook.

## BAG

## BODY

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With black, ch 41, dc in 5th ch from hook, dc in each of next 35 chs, 5 dc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, dc in each of next 35 chs, 3 dc in next ch, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in beg ch. (80 dc)

**Rnd 2:** *Front rnd:* With black, **ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each of next 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in each of next 7 dc] 9 times, ch 1, sk next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, join in beg ch, draw up a lp, secure with **safety pin** (*see Pattern Notes*), drop black to WS. (10 ch-1 sps, 70 dc)

*Back rnd:* Draw up lp of beige in base of first dc of rnd, holding yarn at back of piece, ch 5, [working behind ch-1 sp, **5-dc pc** (see *Special Stitch*) in next sk dc, ch 7] 9 times, working behind ch-1 sp, 5-dc pc in next sk dc, ch 4, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, draw up a lp, secure with safety pin, drop to WS. (10 pcs)

**Rnd 3:** Pick up dropped lp of black, ch 3, working over the beige ch sts and into dc sts of rnd, dc in next 2 dc, \*dc in next st by inserting hook through ch-1 sp directly above 5-dc pc and in top of 5-dc pc and complete dc\*\*, continuing to work over beige ch sts, dc in each of next 7 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, working over beige ch sts, dc in each of next 4 sts, join in beg ch-3. **Rnd 4:** *Front rnd:* With black, ch 3, dc in each of next 6 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in each of next 7 sts] 9 times, ch 1, sk next st, join in beg ch-3, draw up a lp, secure with safety pin, drop black to WS.

*Back rnd:* Draw up lp of beige in base of first dc of rnd, holding yarn at back of piece, ch 9, 5-dc pc in next sk dc, [ch 7, 5-dc pc in next sk dc] 9 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-9, draw up a lp, secure with safety pin, drop to WS. (10 pcs)

**Rnd 5:** Pick up dropped lp of black, ch 3, working over the beige ch sts and into dc sts of rnd, dc in next 6 dc, \*dc in next st by inserting hook through ch-1 sp directly above 5-dc pc and in top of 5-dc pc and complete dc \*\*, continuing to work over beige ch sts, dc in each of next 7 dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg ch-3.

**Rnds 6–13:** [Rep rnds 2–5 consecutively] twice.

**Rnd 14:** With black, ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in beg ch-3. Fasten off. (80 dc)

## BORDER

**Rnd 15:** Pick up dropped lp of beige, ch 5 to bring yarn up level with previous rnd, sc in first dc, ch 1, sk next dc, [sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc] around, join in beg sc. (40 sc, 40 ch-1 sps)

**Rnd 16:** Sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp as beg ch-1, ch 1, sk next sc, [sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc.

Rnds 17-19: Rep rnd 16.

**Rnd 20:** Ch 3, dc in st before beg ch-3, [sk next st, dc in next st, dc in sk st] around, for Handle openings, working as follows on each the front and back of Border (*12 cross dc*),



center 6 inches on each the front and back (*see illustration*), ch 2, sk 2 sts, join in beg ch-3.

**Rnd 21:** Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, ch 1, sk next st, [sc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] around, join in beg sc.

**Rnds 22–24:** Rep rnd 16. At the end of rnd 24, fasten off.

With a length of beige, sew corrugated plastic strips to inside edge of Border centered between rnds 16–19 on each front and back of Border.

## HANDLE

## Make 2.

**Row 1:** With black, ch 60, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (59 sc)

**Rows 2–7:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 7, fasten off.

**Row 8:** Fold Handle in half lengthwise over length of cotton rope, working through both thicknesses of row 7 and opposite side of foundation ch, join beige, sl st in each sc across. Fasten off.

Insert each end of first Handle in opening of rnd 20 of Bag front and with length of beige, sew each end on the inside edge of the Border. Attach 2nd Handle in same manner on back of Bag.

#### BOW

## **Section A**

**Row 1:** With black, ch 40, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (*39 sc*)

**Rows 2–4:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At the end of row 4, fasten off.

**Row 5:** Join beige in first sc of row 4, sl st in each sc across. Fasten off.

**Row 6:** Join beige in opposite side of foundation ch, sl st in each ch across. Fasten off.

## **PATTERN NOTES**

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## PURSE

## **FRONT BODY**

**Row 1 (RS):** Beg at bottom of Front Body, with natural, ch 10, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, [sk 1 ch, 2 sc in next ch] 4 times, turn. (*10 sc*)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, [sk 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 4 times, 2 sc in last sc, **change color** (*see Stitch Guide*) to black, fasten off natural, turn. (12 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, [sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc] across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (14 sc)

**Rows 4–6:** Rep row 3. At the end of row 6, change color to yellow, fasten off black. (20 sc)

Rows 7 & 8: Rep row 3. (24 sc)

**Row 9:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc] across to last sc, sc in last sc, turn. (24 sc)

**Row 10:** Rep row 9, change color to black, fasten off yellow, turn.

**Rows 11 & 12:** Rep row 9. At the end of row 12, change color to yellow, fasten off black, turn.

**Rows 13–16:** Rep row 9. At the end of row 16, change color to black, fasten off yellow, turn.

**Rows 17 & 18:** Rep row 9. At the end of row 18, change color to yellow, fasten off black, turn.

Row 38: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice, [ch 2, sk next 3 sc (*buttonhole*), 2 sc in next, sk next sc, 2 sc in next] twice, 1 sc in last sc, turn. (14 sc, 2 ch-2 sps)

**Row 39:** Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice, 2 sc in ch-2 sp, sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sk 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, [sk next sc, 2 sc in next sc] twice, sc in last sc. Fasten off.

## GUSSET

## **First Side**

**Row 1:** With natural, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, turn. (*3 sc*)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

**Rows 3–13:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

**Row 14–17:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to yellow.

**Rows 18–21:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

**Rows 22 & 23:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to yellow.

**Rows 24–27:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

**Rows 28 & 29:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to yellow.

**Rows 30–33:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

## **Shoulder Strap**

[Ch 1, sc in each of next 3 sc, turn] to desired length of Shoulder Strap. At the end of last row, change color to yellow.

## 2nd Side

**Rows 34–37:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

**Rows 38 & 39:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to yellow.

**Rows 40–43:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

**Rows 44 & 45:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to yellow.

**Rows 46–49:** Rep row 2. At the end of last rep, change color to black.

Rows 50-53: Rep row 2.

At the end of last rep, with care that Gusset and Shoulder Strap are not twisted, with WS facing, working through both thicknesses of row 53 and opposite side of foundation ch of row 1, sl st in each st across. Fasten off.

## ANTENNAE

## Make 2.

**Row 1:** With black, ch 13, [yo, insert hook in 4th ch from hook, yo, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook, sl st in each of next 9 chs, leaving 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

## LARGE UPPER WING

## Make 2.

With natural, ch 10, 3 dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as first dc), dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in next ch, sc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs, 4 dc in same ch as beg dc sts, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg dc. Fasten off.


## **SMALL LOWER WING**

## Make 2.

With natural, ch 8, 2 hdc in 3rd ch from hook (2 sk chs count as first hdc), hdc in next ch, sc in each of next 3 chs, sl st in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in next ch, 3 hdc in same ch as beg dc sts, join in 2nd ch of beg hdc. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

With RS tog, matching colors, **whipstitch edges** (see illustration) of Gusset to Front Body. Matching sts of Back Body to opposite edge of Gusset, whipstitch edges tog.

Sew Antennae centered to top of row 31 of Purse, just in front of rem free lps of row 31. Sew buttons for eyes centered over rows 24 and 25 of Front Body in line with buttonholes.

Sew Wings to Gusset on each side of Body centered over center strip of yellow.

## 5-treble crochet cluster (5-tr

**cl):** [Yo hook twice, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, {yo, draw through 2 lps on hook} twice] 5 times, yo, draw through all 6 lps on hook.

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## **Beginning shell (beg shell):**

(Ch 4, tr, ch 3, 2 tr) in indicated st or sp.

**Shell:** (2 tr, ch 3, 2 tr) in indicated st or sp.

## WALL ART

**Rnd 1 (RS):** With yellow, ch 5, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) to form a ring, **ch 6** (*see Pattern Notes*), (tr, ch 2) 11 times in ring, join in 4th ch of beg ch-6. Fasten off. (*12 tr, 12 ch-2 sps*)

**Rnd 2:** Join rose in any ch-2 sp, **beg 4-tr cl** (*see Special Stitches*) in same ch-2 sp, ch 5, [**4-tr cl** (*see Special Stitches*), ch 5] around, join in 3rd ch of beg cl. (*12 cls, 12 ch-5 sps*)

**Rnd 3:** Sl st in ch-5 sp, **beg 5-tr cl** (*see Special Stitches*) in same ch-5 sp, ch 6, [**5-tr cl** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch-5 sp, ch 6] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (*12 cls, 12 ch-6 sps*)

**Rnd 4:** Join green with sc in any ch-6 sp, ch 8, [sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 8] around, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 5:** Sl st in ch-8 sp, **ch 2** (*see Pattern Notes*), 8 hdc in same ch-8 sp, 9 hdc in each rem ch-8 sp around, join in beg ch-2. (*108 hdc*)

**Rnd 6:** Sl st in sp between last hdc and beg ch-2 of previous rnd, **beg shell** (see Special Stitches) in same sp, [ch 5, sk 4 hdc, sc in next hdc, sk 4 hdc, **shell** (see Special Stitches) in sp between last sk st and next st] 11 times, ch 5, sk 4 sts, sc in next st, ch 5, join in 4th ch in beg ch-4. Fasten off.

**Rnd 7:** Join white in any ch-3 sp of shell, beg shell in same ch sp, [ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, shell in next ch-3 sp of shell] 11 times, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, join in 4th ch of beg shell. Fasten off.


**Rnd 8:** Join blue in any ch-3 sp, beg shell in same ch-3 sp, [ch 6, sc in next sc, ch 6, shell in next ch-3 sp] 11 times, ch 6, sc in next sc, ch 6, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4.

**Rnd 9:** Sl st in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in same ch-3 sp, [ch 7, sc in next sc, ch 7, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp] 11 times, ch 7, sc in next sc, ch 7, join in beg sc. **Do not fasten off**, draw up a lp, remove hook.

Steam-block, pinning outer ch-3 sps of points so crocheted piece is stretched slightly. Make sure all pinned points are evenly sp around and let dry overnight.

*Note:* Before starting rnd 10, use twist ties to temporarily secure each ch-3 sp of rnd 9 to metal ring. As rnd progresses, remove each twist tie just before working in that ch-3 sp.

**Rnd 10:** Work **sc around ring** (*see illustration*) and in ch-3 sps of rnd 9, [2 sc in next ch-3 sp and around ring, 25 sc around ring only] around until ring is completely covered and all 12 points of rnd 9 of piece are attached to ring, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

**Rnds 11–14:** Rep rnd 4. (40 *ch-5 sps*)

**Rnd 15:** Ch 5, [sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] around, join in st at base of beg ch-5. Fasten off. (40 ch-5 sps)

**Row 16 (RS):** Now working in rows, join white in center ch of any ch-5 sp, ch 1, sc in same st, [**roll-st shell** (see Special Stitches) in next ch-5 sp, sk next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp] 11 times. Fasten off.

**Row 17 (RS):** Join white in first sc of last row, [roll-st shell between 3rd and 4th roll sts of next roll-st shell, sc in next sc] 11 times, turn. Fasten off.

**Row 18 (WS):** Join pink in last sc, [ch 6, sl st between 3rd and 4th roll sts of next roll-st shell, ch 6, sl st in next sc] across, turn. (22 ch-6 sps)

**Row 19:** [Ch 5, sl st in next ch-6 sp, ch 5, (sl st, ch 5, sl st) in next ch-6 sp] across, ending with ch 5, sl st in last sl st, turn. (34 ch-5 sps)

**Rows 20–28:** [Ch 5, sl st in next ch-5 sp] across, turn. At end of row 28, fasten off, turn. (34 ch-5 sps) **Row 29 (RS):** Join white in first ch-5 sp, rep row 16.

Rows 30–33: Rep rows 17–20.

Rnd 34: Now working in rnds, sl st in first sp, (ch 9, sl st in 5th ch from hook, tr, {ch 7, sl st—*ch-7 picot made*, ch 4, sl st} in top of tr just made, ch 4, sl st) in same sp, \*[ch 9, sl st in 5th ch from hook, tr in next sp, {ch 7, sl st (ch-7 picot made), ch 4, sl st} in top of tr just made, ch 4, sl st in next ch-5 sp] across to next bottom corner sp\*, (ch 9, sl st in 5th ch from hook, tr, {ch 7, sl st—*ch-7 picot made*, ch 4, sl st} in top of tr just made, ch 4, sl st) in corner sp (18 ch-7 picots across front), rep from \* to \* in ch-5 sps along bottom back of Bonnet, ending with ch 4, sl st in sp at base of beg ch-9, (10 ch-7 sps across bottom back). Fasten off.

Rnd 35 (RS): Join pink in first ch-7 picot of previous rnd, ch 8, sl st in next ch-7 picot, [ch 6, sl st in next ch-7 picot] 15 times, ch 8, sl st in corner ch-7 picot, ch 8, sl st in next ch-7 sp, [ch 7, sl st in next ch-7 picot] 9 times, ch 8, join in beg sl st.

**Rnd 36:** Ch 1, 2 sc in same st as joining, sc in each sl st and in each ch across to next corner, 3 sc in corner sl st, sc in each rem ch and sl st around, join in back lp only of beg sc. (216 sc)

**Rnd 37:** Ch 1, working in back lps only this rnd, sc in same

st as joining, sc in each rem sc around, join in beg sc. (216 sc)

**Rnd 38:** Ch 4, sk next 2 sts, [sl st in next st, ch 4, sk next 2 sts] around, join in st at base of beg ch-4. Fasten off. (72 ch-4 sps)

**Rnd 39 (RS):** Join white in first ch-4 sp after joining, ch 1, sc in same sp, \*roll-st shell in next sp, sk next sp\*\*, sc in next sp, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc.

**Rnd 40:** Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, \*roll-st shell between 3rd and 4th roll st of next shell\*\*, sc in next sc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 41 (RS): Join pink in joining st of last rnd, \*ch 2, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) between first and 2nd roll sts of next roll-st shell, [ch 2, sk next 2 roll sts, (sl st, ch 4, sl st) in sp before next roll st] twice, ch 2\*\*, sl st in next sc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Starch Bonnet lightly.

Cut 2 12-inch lengths of ribbon. Sew 1 to each side of Bonnet at bottom front corners for ties.

Cut 2 10-inch lengths of ribbon. Tie each into bow. Trim ends to desired length. Tack 1 bow on each side of Bonnet at top of ties.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 3, dc in each dc to first corner ch-2 sp, \*dc in ch-2 sp, ch 2, dc in next dc of corner, ch 2, dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc across next first corner ch-2 sp, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Using Placement Diagram as a guide and holding 2 Squares with WS tog and working through both thicknesses, join white with \*sc in dc at center corner of Squares, sc in ch-2 sp, sc in each dc across, ending with sc in ch-2 sp, sc in dc at center corner of Squares, do not fasten off, working to the left, pick up next 2 Squares to be joined and with WS tog, rep from \*, rep until 2 rows of 5 Squares are joined tog horizontally.

Working right to left, beg with Squares 2 and 3, join 2 rows of

5 Squares the same way until all 10 Squares are worked tog horizontally.

Working right to left, beg with Squares 1 and 4, join 2 rows of 5 Squares the same way until all 10 Squares are worked tog horizontally.

Now joining the rows of Squares vertically, beg at bottom right, with WS of Squares 2 and 5 tog, join white and working through both thicknesses, \*sc in dc at center corner of Squares, sc in ch-2 sp, sc in each dc across, ending with sc in ch-2 sp, sc in dc at center corner of Squares, do not fasten off, holding next 2 Squares to be joined and with WS tog, rep from \*, rep until 2 rows of 6 Squares are joined tog vertically.

Now beg at bottom again, join next row of Square to the left to the previously joined row. Continue to join rows vertically until all 5 rows are joined tog. After last Squares have been joined, **do not fasten off**.

## BORDER

**Rnd 1 (RS):** Ch 3, working in **back lp** (see Stitch Guide) of each st for this rnd only, dc in each st across, working 2 dc in each ch-2 sp across edge until ch-2 sp before corner of Afghan, \*at corner work dc in ch-2 sp, ch 2, dc in dc at center of corner, ch 2, dc in next ch-2 sp, continue with dc in back lp of each dc, 2 dc in each ch-2 sp until ch-2 sp before next corner, rep from \* around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, dc in each dc around, working in each corner, dc in ch-2 sp, ch 2, dc in dc at center corner, ch 2, dc in next ch-2 sp, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

**Rnd 3:** Ch 1, sc in same dc, \*ch 4, 3-tr cl in next 3 dc, ch 4\*\*, sc in next dc, rep from \* around, ending last rep at \*\*, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

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

Fasten off. (286 sc)

## **BOTTOM GUSSET**

**Row 1:** With pink, ch 81, working in back bar of ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (80 sc)

**Rows 2–17:** Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off at end of row 17.

## Make 2.

**Row 1:** With pink, ch 64, working in back bar of ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (63 sc)

**Rows 2–17:** Rep rows 2–17 of Bottom Gusset. Do not fasten off.

## Lower Edge

Row 1: Ch 1, working in ends

of rows, work 14 sc evenly sp across. Fasten off. (*14 sc*)

## HANDLE

## Make 2.

**Row 1:** With pink, ch 91, holding a 2nd strand of pink behind ch and working in back bar of ch, **enc sc** (*see Special Stitch*) in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (90 sc)

**Rows 2–7:** Ch 1, with 2nd strand held behind Handle, enc sc in each st across. Fasten off at end of row 7.

## ASSEMBLY

Lightly steam-block to listed measurements and allow all pieces to dry thoroughly.

**Panels:** 18 inches wide x 15 inches long

**Side Gussets:** 3¼ inches wide x 15 inches long

**Bottom Gusset:** 3¼ inches wide x 18 inches long

**Handles:** 1¾ inches wide x 22½ inches long

## **Side Gusset Join**

## Work 4 times.

With RS held tog, pin long edge of Side Gusset to side edge of Panel, positioning lower edge of Side Gusset with bottom of Panel and ensuring that top edges are even.

**Joining row:** With WS of Side Gusset facing, join pink in front lp of first sc, ch 1, insert hook in same lp and in back lp of first st of Panel, yo, pull through all lps on hook (*sl st made*), working in front lp of Side Gusset sts and back lp of Panel sts, (ch 1, sl st) in each st across. (*63 sl sts*)

## **Bottom Gusset Join**

With RS held tog, pin lower edge of Panel to long edge of Bottom Gusset.

**Joining rnd:** With WS of Bottom Gusset facing, join pink

in front lp of first sc, ch 1, insert hook in same lp and in back lp of first st of Panel, vo, pull through all lps on hook (sl st made), working in front lp of Bottom Gusset sts and in back lp of Panel sts, sc in next 79 sts across, sk ch-1 sp at lower corner of Panel, \*working in front lps only of Bottom Gusset and in ends of rows of Side Gusset, sc in next 14 sc\*, working in front lp of Bottom Gusset sts and in back lp of Panel sts, sc in next 80 sts, rep from \* to \* once, join in first sl st. Fasten off. (188 sc)

## FACING

Place a bamboo pin in center of top edge on each Panel. To mark Handle openings on each Panel, place a 2nd pin 4 inches to right of center pin and a 3rd pin in 6th st to right of 2nd pin, rep 2nd and 3rd pin placement to the left of the center pin.

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join pink to center top edge of Side Gusset, ch 1, [work 6 sc in ends of rows to first front lp of side seam, holding WS of Panel and Side Gusset tog and working front lps only, insert hook in first st of long edge of Side Gusset and in first st (at top edge) of Panel, yo, draw through all lps on hook (corner sl st made), ch 1, working in front lps only of Panel edge, sc in same first st as sl st just made, sc in each st to first pin, \*remove pin, ch 7, sk next 7 sc\*, sc in each st to next pin, rep from \* to \*, sc in each st across to last st, holding WS of Panel and Side Gusset tog and working in front lps only, insert hook in last st of Panel and in first st of first row of Side Gusset, draw through all lps on hook (corner sl st made), sc in same st of Side Gusset as sl st just made, 6 sc in ends of rows to center of Side Gusset] twice, join in first sc of rnd. (160 sc, 4 ch-7 sps)

**Rnd 2:** Ch 1, sk corner sl sts, sc in each sc and ch, join in first sc. Place marker on sc worked in first ch of each Handle opening and move up as each rnd is completed. (*188 sc*)

**Rnds 3–5:** Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc.

**Rnd 6:** Ch 1, [\*sc in each sc to next marked st, insert Handle

## **Section B**

**Row 1:** With black, ch 12, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (*11 sc*)

**Row 2:** Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

**Row 3:** Join beige in first sc of row 3, sl st in each sc across. Fasten off.

## Center

**Rnd 1:** With natural, ch 2, 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join.

**Rnd 2:** Sc in each sc around, do not join.

**Rnd 3:** Sc in each sc around, do not join, leaving a 20-inch length, fasten off.

## Assembly

With Petals staggered, layer Small Petals on Large Petals referring to photo for placement. Thread rem length of Center on tapestry needle, sew Center to Petals and then sew an assembled Water Lily to center of each Base Motif.

## EDGING

With RS of Runner facing, join blue in first dc of shell on outer edge as indicated in end in opening with WS tog and Handle end even with last rnd, inserting hook in indicated sts and ends of Handle rows, sc in next 7 sts, rep from \* once, taking care not to twist Handle when inserting other end] twice, sc in each rem sc, join in first sc. Fasten off. Fold facing to WS.

**Row 4:** Join beige in opposite side of foundation ch, sl st in each ch across. Fasten off.


Fold ends of Section A to center and sew tog. Wrap Section B around center and sew ends tog at center back.

Sew center back of Section B to center front of Bag over Border rnds.

## FINISHING

With a 24-inch length of beige,

Assembly Diagram, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, sc in next dc, (sc, ch 2, sl st in sc) in ch-2 sp, sc in each of next 2 dc of shell, (2 sc, ch 2, sl st in last sc, sc) in each ch-3 sp of each Motif, working sc in each dc and sp of joining shells, and in each of the rem shells work [sc in first 2 dc of shell, (sc, ch 2, sl st in sc) in ch-2 sp, sc in last 2 dc of shell] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.



**Row 2: Beg Paris st** (see Special Stitches) in ch-2 sp of first Paris st, Paris st in ch-2 sp of each rem Paris st across, sc in 3rd ch of beg 3 sk chs, turn. (10 Paris sts, 1 sc)

Rows 3–17: Rep row 2. Do not turn at end of last row.

## EDGING

**Rnd 1:** Ch 1, working down first side, \*work 28 sc evenly sp across ends of rem rows\*, working on opposite side of foundation ch, 2 sc in first ch, work 28 sc evenly sp across to last ch, 2 sc in last ch, working up other side, rep from \* to \*, 2 sc in first st of last row, work 28 sc evenly sp across to last st, 2 sc in last st, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. (120 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each sc around, join in first reverse sc. Fasten off.

## Make 2.

**Rnd 1:** With orchid, ch 3, join to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (*12 sc*)

**Rnd 3:** [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

**Rnd 4:** [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

**Rnds 5 & 6:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 6, fasten off.

At the end of rnd 6 of 2nd Cheek, **do not fasten off**.


**Rnd 7:** Working on 2nd Cheek, sc in each of next 18 sc, pick up first Cheek, sc in each of next 18 sc, join in first st of 2nd Cheek, leaving a 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off. (*36 sc*)

## **Inner Ear**

## Make 2.

**Row 1:** With orchid, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn.

**Rows 2 & 3:** Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sc, turn. At the end of row 3, fasten off.

## **Ear Back**

Rep rows 1–3 of Inner Ear with lavender. At the end of row 3, **do not fasten off**.

Place both Inner Ear and Ear Back tog, with Inner Ear facing. Working through both thicknesses, work 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc up side of Ear, 3 sc in opposite side of foundation ch, sc down other side of Ear, join in first st, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Tack first and 4th sts tog to gather bottom of Ear. With Inner Ear facing front, sew Ears to Head 2 inches apart.

## LEG

## Make 4.

**Rnd 1:** With orchid, ch 3, join to form a ring, ch 1, 2 sc in each ch around. (6 sc)

**Rnd 2:** 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (24 sc)

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around.

**Rnd 5:** Working in back lps only, sc in each st around, **change color** (*see Stitch Guide*) to lavender.

**Rnds 6–10:** Sc in each sc around. At the end of rnd 10, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Stuff Legs with fiberfill and sew to Body as indicated on Placement Diagram.

## TAIL

Leaving a 4-inch length of lavender at beg, ch 8, working in **back bar of ch** (*see illustration*), sl st in 2nd ch from hook,



Back Bar of Chain

sl st in back bar of each rem ch, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

With beg rem length, attach Tail to end of Body centering between back Legs.

Cut 4 strands of orchid each 3 inches long. Holding strands tog, knot on end sp of Tail. Trim ends.

## **NOSTRIL BACK**



With orchid, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. Sew each Nostril Back to outer edges of Muzzle curving slightly to form a cup-like shape.

## EYE

## Make 2.

With tapestry needle and black, embroider 5 or 6 vertical **straight stitches** (see illustration) for each eye, placing Eyes just above Muzzle.



## NOSTRIL

## Make 2.

With tapestry needle and black, embroider 2 straight stitches for each nostril in front of Nostril Back.


