CROCODILE STITCH FASHIONS!



The crocodile stitch is one of the hottest techniques in crochet today. The chic, contemporary fashion accessories featured in *Crocodile Stitch Fashions* from Annie's Attic beautifully showcase this intriguing stitch pattern.

You can tell why this stitch is called the crocodile stitch just by looking at the designs. It may look complicated to do, but it's actually much easier than it looks, using only chain and double crochet stitches. An intermediate crocheter or even a dedicated beginner will master this stitch in no time at all.

The crocodile stitch is formed by a two-row repeat: a row of V-stitches followed by a row of "scales" created with shells. The only novelty about this design is that the scales are crocheted in front of the V-stitches with clusters of front post double crochets from top to bottom, then from bottom to top, as opposed to working them on the top of the row, like most shell patterns.

Step-by-step photo illustrations are included for each of the eight designs in the book. The crocodile stitch pattern's layers of "scales" lends itself to many different designs, such as afghans, scarves, shawls, hats, gauntlets, place mats and purses to mention a few.

FLORAL FANTASY SHAWL

DESIGN BY THERESA KEHRER

STITCHED IN GORGEOUS SELF-PATTERNING SHADES OF FINGERING-WEIGHT WOOL YARN, THIS EXQUISITE FLORAL WRAP WILL CLOAK YOU IN GENTLE WARMTH ON THOSE COOL AUTUMN FVFNINGS.

SKILL LEVEL



FINISHED SIZE

35 inches long x 68 inches wide

MATERIALS

 Crystal Palace Mini Mochi super fine (fingering) weight wool/nylon yarn¹ (1¾ oz/195 yds/50g per ball):



5 balls #103 violets rainbow

- Crystal Palace Mini Solid super fine (fingering) weight wool/nylon yarn¹ (1¾ oz/195 yds/50g per ball): 2 balls #1104 deep loden
- Size C/2/2.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Embroidery needle
- · Press cloth

¹Yarns you might also like:

Premier Yarns Deborah Norville Serenity Sock Weight super fine (fingering) weight merino/bamboo/ nylon yarn (1¾ oz/230 yds/50g per ball): 5 balls variegated color of choice, 2 balls solid color of choice

Lion Brand Sock-Ease super fine (fingering) weight wool/ nylon yarn (3½ oz/438 yds/100g per ball): 3 balls variegated color of choice, 1 ball solid color of choice Berroco Ultra Alpaca Fine super fine (fingering) weight

wool/alpaca/nylon yarn (3½ oz/433 yds/100g per hank): 1 hank color of choice

GAUGE

Flower Motif = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Shawl is in shape of triangle with wide edge at top and point at bottom. There are 9 rows: 17 Flower Motifs at the wide end, reducing by 2 for each subsequent row (15, 13, 11, 9, 7, 5, 3) until there is only 1 Flower Motif left at point.

Motifs will need to be gently blocked with steam iron on low setting before joining, to eliminate any curling, **do not iron with back-and-forth motion**. Use press cloth.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.



Beginning cluster (beg cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, ch 4, 2 tr in same place as beg ch-4, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Triple treble decrease (tr tr dec):

Holding back last lp of each st on hook, tr tr in each of next 3 sts, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Picot: Ch 5, sl st in 5th ch from hook.

SHAWL

Flower Motif

Make 81.

Rnd 1 (RS): With violets rainbow, ch 5,

sl st in first ch to form ring, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), 23 dc in ring, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, **turn**. (24 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 3: [Ch 10, **tr tr dec** (see Special Stitches), **picot** (see Special Stitches), ch 10, sl st in same st as last leg of tr tr dec] around, join in joining of last rnd. Fasten off.


Lay Motifs out in rows with blue-violetcolor Motifs in bottom lower point of triangle and red-violet-color Motifs in upper corners of triangle.

Joining Motif

Joining 4 adjacent Motifs is done counterclockwise, through the overlapping picots in each of the petals.

With deep loden, ch 6, sl st in first ch to form ring, **beg cl** (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 7, sl st through 1 picot on each of 2 adjacent Motifs (see Assembly Diagram), ch 7, **cl** (see Special Stitches) in ring, [ch 7, sl st in picots of next 2 adjacent Motifs to left, ch 7, cl in ring] 3 times, ch 7, sl st in picot of next 2 adjacent Motifs to left, ch 7, join in beg cl. Fasten off.

Continue joining in this manner until all adjacent Motifs are joined.



Floral Fantasy Shawl Assembly Diagram

When making Joining Motifs for right and left sides of Shawl, work as before and join in 4 petals of 3 Motifs as there will be no adjacent Motif to join on the outside edge. When joining across top edge, adjacent

horizontal petals need to be tacked to each other at picots.

Vertical petals at the top are left loose. Gently block. **C**!

DESIGN BY RANDY CAVALIERE FOR CARON INTERNATIONAL

PAINTED-LOOK YARN CREATES A RICH COLOR PALETTE IN THIS FUN, EASY SCARF. INTERLOCKING CHAIN LOOPS WORKED AROUND THE FDGES OF THE MOTIES GIVE THE IMPRESSION OF ELOWER PETALS.

SKILL LEVEL



FINISHED SIZE

5 x 50 inches

MATERIALS

• Caron Simply Soft Paints medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (4 oz/200 yds/113g per ball):

1 ball #0006 oceana

- Caron Simply Soft Collection medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3 oz/157 yds/85g per ball): 1 ball #0004 blueberry
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle

GAUGE

Flower Motif = 5 inches across; 12 sc = 3½ inches; 15 rows = 4 inches
Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

Flowers are worked in joined rounds and then turned.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.



SCARF

Flower Motif

Make 10.

Rnd 1 (RS): With oceana, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1, 12 sc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc, turn. (12 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 1, [sc in next st, ch 1] around, join in beg sc, turn. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Join blueberry in first ch sp, ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), (dc, ch 1, dc, hdc) in same ch sp, [sk next ch-1 sp, (hdc, dc, ch 1, dc, hdc) in next ch-1 sp] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, turn. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: Join oceana in first st, ch 4, sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 4, [sk next dc, sl st in next hdc, ch 4, sl st in next ch sp, ch 4] around, join in base of beg ch-4, turn. (12 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 5: Ch 12, being careful not to twist ch, sk first ch-4 sp to right or to left if left-handed, sl st in 2nd ch-4 sp to right, working back across ch-12 just made, sl st in **back bar** (see illustration) of 2nd ch from hook and in back bar of each ch across (ch-lp completed), sl st in same ch-4 sp at base of ch-12, sl st in next ch-4 sp, [ch 12, being careful not to twist ch and in front of last ch lp, sk first ch-4 sp to right, sl st in 2nd ch-4 sp, sl st in back bar of 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sl st in same ch-4 sp at base of ch-12, sl st in next ch-4 sp] 9 times, ch 12, being careful not to twist ch and in back of last ch lp, sk first ch-4 sp to right, sl st in 2nd ch-4 sp, sl st in back bar of 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, join in base of beg ch-12. Fasten off.



Back Bar of Chain

Backing

Row 1: Leaving long end, with blueberry, ch 7, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (6 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 48 inches. At end of last row, leaving long end, fasten off.

Finishing

Using long end at beg of row 1, sew WS of rnd 3 of 1 Flower Motif to beg of Backing, allowing ch-lps to extend past the end of Back ½ inch.

Using long end at end of last row, sew 1 Flower Motif to other end of Backing in same manner as first Flower Motif.

Sew rem Flower Motifs evenly sp between the first and last Flower Motif. CI






NOCHE BUENA CHRISTMAS ORNAMENT

CREATED ESPECIALLY FOR PROJECT RUDOLPH, A CHARITY THAT PROVIDES SMALL, HANDMADE ORNAMENTS TO MILITARY PERSONNEL WHO ARE AWAY FROM THEIR FAMILIES AT CHRISTMAS, THIS SPARKLING ORNAMENT WILL ALSO BE BEAUTIFUL ON YOUR OWN HOLIDAY TREE OR PACKAGES.





FINISHED SIZE

21/4 inches in diameter, excluding hanging loop

MATERIALS

- Aunt Lydia's Fashion Crochet size 5 crochet cotton (100 yds per ball):
 - 1 ball #90g gold/gold
- Size B/1/2.25mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Beading needle
- 2-inch craft ring
- Gold rocailles beads: 18

GAUGE

Noche Buena should fit snugly inside 2-inch ring

PATTERN NOTE

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

ORNAMENT

Center

Ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join (see Pattern Note) in beg sc. (6 sc)

Bract 1

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in first st, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (1 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 4 sc in sc, turn. (4 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (2 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc dec in 2 sts, turn. (1 sc)

Row 5: Working around ring, ch 1 to connect Bract to ring. Fasten off.

Bracts 2-6

Rows 1–5: Join in next st on Center, rep rows 1–5 of Bract 1.

Ring

Join with sc around ring between 2



Bracts, 6 sc in ring, ch 28 (hanger), 7 sc in ring, 14 sc between each of next 2 Bracts around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Sew beads to Center for flower.

MATERIALS

• Premier Yarns Spangle light (DK) weight polyester/glitter yarn (1% oz/165 yds/50g per ball):

1 ball #11-203 brown bling

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- %-inch coordinating button
- 3½x 9-inch piece black felt
- Black thread
- Sewing needle
- Stitch marker
- 1-inch-long lanyard hook
- 9mm jump rings: 2

GAUGE

23 sts = 5 inches: 11 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Do not join at end of each round.

Work in continuous rounds unless otherwise stated.

BAG

Body

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 15, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 12 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of beg ch, sc in each of next 12 chs, do not join (see Pattern Notes). (30 sts)

Next rnds: Working in continuous rnds (see Pattern Notes), sc in each st around until bag is 4½ inches tall.

Last rnd: Mark center back of bag, sl st in each st around to marker, ch 15, sl st in 15th ch from hook, sl st in next st on bag and in each rem st around, join with sl st in beg sl st. Fasten off.

Sew button to center front.

Lining

Fold felt in half. Sew sides tog (leave top open). Insert Lining in Bag. Sew top of Lining to top of Bag.

Finishing

Attach first jump ring to side of Bag. Cut 7 strands of yarn each 7 inches long. Fold strands in half around 2nd jump ring. Tie last cut strand around top of folded strands. Trim ends as desired.

Attach 2nd jump ring to lanyard hook. Attach lanyard hook to first jump ring. C!

MATERIALS

Classic Elite Wool Bam Boo light (DK) weight wool/bamboo viscose yarn¹ (1¾ oz/118 yds/50g per ball):

14 [15, 17, 19, 22, 24] balls #1650 vanilla

- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

17 pattern sts = 4 inches; 18 Pattern rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Fronts are narrow. The wide collar that is worked after pieces are assembled makes up the rest of the front width.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 2, dc) as indicated in instructions.

PATTERN

Worked in multiple of 2 sts plus 1, plus 1 turning ch.

Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn.

Row 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in first st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for Pattern.

CARDIGAN

Back

Row 1: Ch 76 [84, 92, 100, 110, 118], work row 1 of Pattern. (75 [83, 91, 99, 109, 117] sc)

Next rows: Work rows 2 and 3 of Pattern until piece measures 16½ [16½, 16, 16,

 $15\frac{1}{2}$, $15\frac{1}{2}$] inches from beg, ending with row 2.

Armhole Shaping

Next row (RS): SI st in each of first 4 [4, 6, 6, 8, 10] sts, work in Pattern across, leaving last 4 [4, 6, 6, 8, 10] sts unworked, turn. (67 [75, 79, 87, 93, 97] sts)

Next rows: Maintaining Pattern, **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts and in last 2 sts in each of next 3 [4, 4, 7, 9, 11] rows. (61 [67, 71, 73, 75, 75] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures $6\frac{1}{2}$ [7, $7\frac{1}{2}$, 8, $8\frac{1}{2}$, 9] inches from beg of Armhole Shaping, ending with row 2.

First Shoulder Shaping

Ch 1, sc in each of next 5 [6, 6, 7, 7, 7] sts, hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7, 7, 7, 7] sts, dc in each of next 6 [7, 7, 7, 7, 7] sts, leaving rem sts unworked. Fasten off. (16 [19, 20, 21, 21, 21] sts)

2nd Shoulder Shaping

Sk next 29 [29, 31, 31, 33, 33] sts for back neck, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in next st, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 5 [6, 6, 6, 6, 6] sts, hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7, 7, 7, 7] sts, sc in each of last 5 [6, 6, 7, 7, 7] sts. Fasten off. (16 [19, 20, 21, 21, 21] sts)

Right Front

Row 1 (RS): Ch 28 [32, 36, 40, 44, 48],

work row 1 of Pattern. (27 [31, 35, 39, 43, 47] sts)

Next rows: Work rows 2 and 3 of Pattern until piece measures 16½ [16½, 16, 16, 15½, 15½] inches from beg, ending with row 2.

Armhole & Neck Shaping

Next row (RS): Work in Pattern across first 23 [27, 29, 33, 35, 37] sts, leaving last 4 [4, 6, 6, 8, 10] sts unworked, turn. (23 [27, 29, 33, 35, 32] sts)

Next rows: Maintaining Pattern, work sc dec at armhole edge every row 3 [4, 4, 7, 9, 11] times, **at same time**, work sc dec at neck edge every 6 rows 4 [4, 5, 5, 5, 5] times. (16 [19, 20, 21, 21, 21] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures same as Back to First Shoulder, ending with row 2.

Shoulder Shaping

Ch 3, dc in each of next 5 [6, 6, 6, 6, 6] sts, hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7, 7, 7, 7] sts, sc in each of next 5 [6, 6, 7, 7, 7, 7] sts. Fasten off.

Left Front

Work same as Right Front reversing all shaping.



Sleeve

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 44 [44, 50, 56, 56, 62], work row 1 of Pattern. (43 [43, 49, 55, 55, 61] sts)

Rows 2 & 3: Work rows 2 and 3 of Pattern.

Sleeve Shaping







Assembly

Block pieces.

Sew shoulder seams.

Fold 1 Sleeve in half lengthwise, place fold at shoulder seam, sew in place.

Rep with rem Sleeve.

Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Front Edging

With RS facing, working in ends of rows, join in lower corner of Right Front, evenly sp 104 [106, 106, 108, 108, 110] sc across to shoulder seam, 2 sc in Back Shoulder Shaping, evenly sp 29 [29, 31, 31, 33, 33] sc across Back neck edge, 2 sc in Back Shoulder Shaping, evenly sp 104 [106, 106, 108, 108, 110] sc down Left Front. Fasten off. (241 [245, 247, 251, 253, 257] sts)

Collar

Row 1: With RS facing, sk first 28 [27, 28, 27, 28, 27] sc on Edging, join in next st, ch 3, sk next st, [**V-st** (see Special Stitch) in next st, sk next 2 sts] 60 [62, 62, 64, 64, 66] times, V-st in next st, sk next st, dc in next st, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (61 [63, 63, 65, 65, 67] V-sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, 5 sc in ch sp of each V-st across, sc in last st, turn. (307 [317, 317, 327, 327, 337] sts)

Row 3: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, V-st in next st, [sk next 4 sts, V-st in next st] across, ending with sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3] 12 times, ending last rep with row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

Cuff

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 of Sleeve, join in seam, ch 1, evenly sp, 45 [45, 51, 57, 57, 63] sc around, join in beg sc, **turn**.


Rnd 2: Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch-2), dc in same st (ch-5 and dc counts as first V-st), sk next 2 sts, [V-st in next st, sk next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn. (15 [15, 17, 19, 19, 21] V-sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, 5 sc in ch sp of each V-st around, join in beg sc. (75 [75, 85, 95, 95, 105] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc in rem lp from row before,sc in next sc] across, turn.

Rep rows 1 and 2 for Pattern.

JACKET

Back

Row 1 (WS): Ch 75 [84, 93, 102, 111] sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (74 [83, 92, 101, 110] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 2 inches from beg, ending with a WS row.

Side Shaping

Next row (dec): Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts, sc in each st across with sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (72 [81, 90, 99. 1081 sc)

Next rows: [Rep row 2] 5 times.

Next rows: Rep dec row, work even for 13 rows. (70 [79, 88, 97, 106] sc at end of last row)

Next row (inc): Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each st across with 2 sc in last st, turn. (72 [81, 90, 99, 108] sc)

Next rows: Work even for 5 rows.

Next row: Work inc row. (74 [83, 92, 101, 110] sc)

Next rows: Rep even until piece measures 11 inches from beg, ending on a WS row.

Armhole Shaping

Next row: SI st in each of first 5 [5, 6, 7, 8] sts, ch 1, sc in each st across, leaving last 5 [5, 6, 7, 8] sts unworked, turn. (64 [73, 80, 87, 94] sc)

Next rows: Dec 1 st at each end of every row 4 [6, 7, 10, 10] times. (56 [61, 66, 67, 74] sc at end of last row)

Next rows: Work even until piece measures 17½ [18, 18½, 19, 19½] inches from beg, ending with a WS row.

First Shoulder & Neck Shaping

Next row: With RS facing, ch 1, sc in each of first 15 [17, 19, 19, 22] sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Next rows: Dec 1 st at neck edge every row 4 times, work 1 row even. At end of last row, fasten off. (11 [13, 15, 15, 18] sc at end of last row)

2nd Shoulder & Neck Shaping

Next row: Sk center 26 [27, 28, 29, 30] sc, join with sc in next st, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: Dec 1 st at neck edge every row 4 times, work 1 row even. At end of last row, fasten off.

Right Front

Row 1 (WS): Ch 38 [42, 45, 51, 55], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (37 [41, 44, 50, 54] sc)

Row 2: Work first row of **Lp St** (see Loop Stitch Pattern) across first 11 sts (Lp St is on front edge), sc in both lps of each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 27 [31, 34, 40, 44] st, work row 2 of Lp St across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 for Pattern until piece measure 2 inches from beg, ending with a WS row.

Side Shaping

Next row (dec): Work in Pattern across, ending with dec at side edge, turn. (36 [40, 43, 49, 53] sc)

Next rows: Work even in Pattern for 5 rows, work dec row once, work even for 13 rows. (35 [39, 42, 48, 52] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Inc 1 st at side edge on next row, work 5 rows even, inc 1 st at side edge on next row. (37 [41, 44, 50, 54] sc at end of last row)

Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures 11 inches from beg, ending with a WS row.

Armhole Shaping

Next row: Work in Pattern across, leaving last 5 [5, 6, 7, 8] sts unworked, turn. (32 [36, 38, 43, 46] sc)

Next rows: Dec 1 st at armhole edge every row 4 [6, 7, 10, 10] times, work even in Pattern until piece measures 12½ [13, 13½, 14, 14½] inches from beg, ending with a WS row. At end of last row, fasten off. (28 [30, 31, 33, 36] sc at end of last row)

Neck Shaping

Next row: Sk first 11 sts, **join** (see Pattern Note) in next st, sc dec in same st and next st, sc in each st across, turn. (16 [18, 19, 21, 24] sc)

Next rows: Dec 1 st at neck edge every RS row 5 [5, 4, 6, 6] times, work even in Pattern until piece measures 18½ [19, 19½, 20, 20½] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off. (11 [13, 15, 15, 18] sc)

Row 1 (WS): Ch 38 [42, 45, 51, 55], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (37 [41, 44, 50, 54] sc)





First foundation half double crochet (first foundation hdc): Ch 3, yo, insert hook into 3rd ch from hook, yo, pull up lp (3 lps on hook—see illustration A), yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (ch-1 completed see illustration B), yo, pull through all lps on hook (first foundation hdc completed -see illustrations C and D).

Next foundation half double crochet (next foundation hdc): [Yo, insert hook in ch-1 just made (see illustration A), yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (ch-1 completed—see illustration B), yo, pull through all lps on hook (hdc

completed—see illustrations C and D)] as indicated in instructions.

PATTERN

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [gather (see Special Stitches), hdc in each of next 5 sts] across to last 10 sts, gather, hdc in each of last 3 sts, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately for Pattern.

CARDI

Body

Row 1: Work 1 first foundation hdc (see Special Stitches), work 120 [132, 156, 168, 192, 204, 216, 228, 252] next foundation hdc (see Special Stitches), turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in first st and in each st across, turn.

X-Small Size Only

Row 1: Work in Pattern across, turn.

Row 2: Work **inc row** (see Special Stitches), turn. (123 hdc)

Rows 3–54: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, work inc row every 3rd row. (155 sts at end of last row)

First Front

Row 1: Work in Pattern across first 41 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Rows 2–20: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 3rd row. At end of last row, fasten off. (47 sts at end of last row)

Back

Row 1: Join (see Pattern Notes) in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, leaving last 41 sts unworked, turn. (73 sts)

Rows 2–20: Work even in Pattern. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Front

Row 1: Join in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, turn. (41 sts)

Rows 2–20: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 3rd row. At end of last row, fasten off. (47 sts at end of last row)

Small Size Only

Rows [1–18]: Work in Pattern, and at same time, work inc row (see Special Stitches) every other row. ([151] sts at end of last row)

Rows [19–53]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, work inc row every 3rd row. ([173] sts at end of last row)

First Front

Row [1]: Work in Pattern across first 46 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Rows [2–22]: Work in Pattern, and at same time, inc at neck edge only every

3rd row. At end of last row, fasten off. ([53] sts at end of last row)

Back

Row [1]: Join (see Pattern Notes) in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, leaving rem last 46 sts unworked, turn. ([81] sts)

Rows [2–22]: Work even in Pattern. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Front





FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

Bust: 40 inches (*small/medium*) [46 inches (*large/X-large*), 52 inches (*2X-large/3X-large*)]

MATERIALS

- NaturallyCaron.com Spa light
 (DK) weight acrylic/bamboo
 rayon yarn (3 oz/251 yds/85g per ball):
 4 [5, 6] balls #0010 stormy blue
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers

GAUGE

21 pattern sts = 4 inches; 11 pattern-st rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

The main piece is a mesh rectangle, crocheted side to side in 1 piece with openings for armholes. Lace is then worked around all edges of mesh rectangle.

Chain-1 at beginning of row or round does not count as first stitch unless otherwise stated.

When working Lace, mark the corner stitch or space. This will help you to work the pattern correctly. Move markers up as each round is completed.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

VEST

Mesh Rectangle

First Front

Row 1: Ch 92 [96, 102], dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs does not count as first dc), [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch] across, turn. (44 [46, 49] ch-1 sps, 45 [47, 50] dc)

Row 2: Ch 1 (see Pattern Notes), dc in first st, dc in next ch sp, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] across, ending with dc in last st, turn. (43 [45, 48] ch-1 sps, 46 [48, 51] dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, dc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] across to last 2 sts, ch 1, sk next st, dc in last st, turn.

Rows 4–35 [4–41, 4–47]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 16 [19, 22] times. Piece should measure about 13 [15, 17] inches from beg.

First Armhole

Row 1: Place marker in first st to indicate top, ch 1, dc in first st, dc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] 7 [8, 9] times, ch 41 [45, 47] (armhole), sk next 41 [45, 47] sts and ch sps (you will be sk 20 [22, 23] ch sps and 21 [23, 24] dc), dc in next ch sp, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] across, dc in last st, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, dc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] across to dc before armhole, ch 1, sk next st, dc in first ch, [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch] 20 [22, 23] times, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch sp] across to last 2 dc, ch 1, sk next st, dc in last st, turn. (44 [46, 49] ch-1 sps, 45 [47, 50] dc)

Back

Rows 1–34 [1–40, 1–46]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 of First Front] 17 [20, 23] times.

2nd Armhole

Work same as First Armhole. Make sure that you are beg row 1 at marked top edge.

2nd Front

Rows 1–34 [1–40, 1–46]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 of First Front] 17 [20, 23] times. At end of last row, fasten off.

Lace Edging

Getting started: Select 1 side of Mesh Rectangle to be RS, place marker to indicate RS. Working in ends of rows, in sts and in starting ch on opposite side of row 1.

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join (see Pattern Notes) in corner to work across 1 short end, ch 1, *evenly sp 89 [95, 103] sc across short end, sc in corner, place marker in corner sc, evenly sp 215 [245, 285] sc across long edge, sc in corner, mark corner sc, rep from * once, join in beg sc. Do not turn. (612 [676, 780] sc)

Rnd 2: SI st in next st, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 2 sts, *ch 5, sk next 5 [6, 5] sts, dc in next st, ch 5, sk next 5 sts, dc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * across to 1 [2, 1] sc before next corner, ch 3, sk next 1 [2, 1] sc, dc in next corner sc, ch 3**, sk next 1 [2, 1] sc, dc in each of next 3 dc, rep from * ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Turn. (12 [12, 14] ch-5 sps across short ends, 30 [34, 40] ch-5 sps across long edges, 2 ch-3 sps at each corner)

Rnd 3 (WS): Ch 6 (counts as first dc and ch-3), sk next ch-3 sp, (dc, ch 4, dc) in corner dc, *ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp**, dc in each of next 3 dc, [ch 3, sk next ch-5 sp, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next st, ch 3, sk next ch-5 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts] across to ch-3 sp before next corner, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, (dc, ch 4, dc) in corner dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, [dc in each of next 3 dc, ch 3, sk next ch-5 sp, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next st, ch 3, sk next ch-5 sp] across, dc in each of last 2 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, *[ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp, (dc, {ch 1, dc} 4 times) in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 3 dc] across to ch-3 sp before next corner ch-4 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp,



(dc, {ch 1, dc} 6 times) in corner ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp**, dc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Rnd 5: SI st in each st across to first dc of first corner, sI st in first dc of first corner, ch 5 (counts as first dc and ch-2), sk next ch-1 sp, [dc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch sp] 6 times, $\lozenge*$ dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 3 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, [dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch sp] 5 times, dc dec in next 3 sts, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp**, rep from * across to first dc of next corner, [dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch sp] 7 times, rep from \lozenge around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.



 - grape soda
- Premier Yarns Spangle light (DK) weight polyester/glitter yarn (1¾ oz/ 165 yds/50g per ball):

- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- · Locking stitch markers

GAUGE

Size I hook and purple: Rows 1–6 of Main Body: 7 sts = 2 inches; 5 rows = 2 inchesTake time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Item is worked from top down, increasing to underarms, and then joined and continued for necessary rows.





Row 1: With purple, first foundation sc (see Special Stitches), work next foundation sc (see Special Stitches) 19 [29, 33, 41, 51] times, place marker in first and last sc, count inward from both ends 1 [3, 3, 5, 7] sc, place marker, count over 1 [3, 3, 5, 7] sc, place marker.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), **V-st** (see Special Stitches) in same marked st, [dc in each st across to next marked st, V-st in marked st] across, dc in same st as last V-st, turn. Move all markers to ch-1 sps of V-sts. (6 V-sts, 16 [26, 30, 38, 48] dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in sp between ch-3 and V-st, V-st in ch sp of next V-st, [dc in each sp between sts across to next marked V-st, V-st in ch sp of V-st] across, ending with dc in each sp between sts across, dc in last st, turn. (6 V-sts, 23 [33, 37, 45, 55] dc)

Rows 4–7: Ch 3, [dc in sp between sts across to next V-st st, V-st in ch sp of next V-st] across, ending with dc in sp between sts across, dc in last st, turn. (6 V-sts, 51 [61, 65, 73, 83] dc at end of last row)

Row 8: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), [tr in sp between sts across to next V-st, 4 tr in ch sp of next V-st, move markers in sp between 2nd and 3rd tr of tr group] across, tr in sp between sts across, tr in last st, turn. (64 tr groups, 58 [68, 72, 80, 90] tr)

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in sp between first 2 tr, [ch 5, sk sp between next 2 tr, sc in sp between next 2 tr] across, turn. (40 [45, 47, 51, 56] ch sps)

Row 10: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), dc in first ch-5 sp, *[ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across** to next marked st, ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in marked st, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 1, tr in last st, turn. (2 ch-1 sps, 51 [56, 58, 62, 67] ch-2 sps)

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-2 sp] across to ch-1 sp, ch 5, sc in last st, turn. (52 [57, 59, 63, 68] ch sps)

Bust Shaping

Small & Medium Sizes Only

Rows 12–15: [Rep rows 10 and 11 alternately] twice. (76 [81] ch-2 sps at end of last row)

Large, X-Large & 2X-Large Sizes Only

Row [12]: Using different-color markers, place marker in sc toward row ends from first and last marked sc for bust incs, ch 5, dc in first ch-5 sp, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to marked bust inc, ch 2, tr in marked sc, *[ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to next marked st, (tr, ch 2, tr) in marked st, rep from * 5 times, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to marked bust inc, ch 2, tr in marked sc, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across, ch 1, tr in last st, turn. (2 ch-1 sps, [72, 76, 81] ch-2 sps)

Large, X-Large Sizes Only

Rows [13–15]: Remove markers at bust inc, [rep rows 11 and 10 alternately] twice, ending last rep with row 11. ([85, 89] ch-2 sps at end of last row)

2X-Large Size Only

Row [13]: Remove markers at bust inc, rep row 11. ([82] ch-2 sps)

Row [14]: Rep row 10. ([2] ch-6 sps, [93] ch-2 sps)

Row [15]: Rep row 11. ([94] ch-2 sps)

All Sizes

Row 16: Ch 5, dc in first ch-5 sp, *[ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to next marked st, ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in marked st, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to next marked st, ch 2, dc in marked st, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to next marked st, ch 2, (tr, ch 2, tr) in marked st, rep from * once, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across, ch 1, tr in last st, turn. (2 ch-1 sps, 85 [90, 94, 98, 103] ch-2 sps)

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in first st, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-2 sp] across** to first marker, **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in first marked ch-2 sp and in 3rd marked ch-2 sp (armhole), rep

from * across, ending last rep at **, turn.

Row 18: Ch 5, dc in first ch-5 sp, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across, ch 1, tr in last st, turn.

Front Cutaway

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-2 sp] across, ch 2, dc in last st (ch-2 and dc forms last ch-5 sp), place marker in first sc and at base of last dc, turn.

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in first ch-5 sp, ch 3, dc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp] across to last ch-5 sp, ch 3, sc in last ch-5 sp, turn.

Row 21: Ch 2, sc in ch-3 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-2 sp] across, ch 2, dc in last ch-3 sp, turn.

Row 22: Rep row 20. Fasten off. Place markers in first and last dc.

Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join purple with sc at center back neck, working on opposite side of foundation sc, sc in each st across, 2 sc in end of next 6 rows, 3 sc in end of next row, sc in end of each sc row, 3 sc in end of each tr row across to row 17, 2 sc in marked st at end of row 18, move marker to 2nd sc, [2 sc in next ch sp, sc in end of next row] 3 times, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in next marked st, move marker to 2nd sc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, [sc in next dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp] across to last ch-2 sp before next marker, 2 sc in marked st, move marker to first st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, [sc in end of next row, 2 sc in next ch sp] 3 times, 2 sc in marked st, move marker in first st, sc in end of sc rows, 3 sc in ends of tr rows across to row 7, 3 sc in end of row 7, 2 sc in end of each row across, sc in each foundation sc across, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (215 [228, 244, 252, 2711 sc)

Rnd 2: Move markers in bottom corners up each rnd to st closest to bottom of garment, ch 1, sc in each st around with 2 sc in each marked st, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. Fasten off. (223 [236, 252, 260, 279] sc)

Rnd 4: With WS facing, join grape soda with sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next

GAUGE

12 sts in pattern = 4 inches; 12 rows in pattern = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Front Panels and Collar are made in 1 piece. The striped half of the Front Panel piece forms the collar. The solid black half of the piece forms the left and right fronts.

When the Front Panel piece has been completed, it is curved to spread the opening along the black half so that the opening can serve as the 2 Shoulders and the back neck. Refer carefully to the Assembly Diagram.

When changing colors, always change in the last st of the old color. Do not fasten off old color. Keep unused colors on wrong side of work until needed.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Extended single crochet (ext sc):

Insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, pull lp through st, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Cross-stitch (cross-st): Sk next st, sc in next st, working over sc just worked, sc in sc just sk, ch 1.

JACKET

Back

Row 1: Beg at neck edge, with black, ch 49 [53, 53, 57], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (48 [52, 52, 56] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in each of next 1 [1, 2, 2] sc, sc in each st across to last 2 [2, 3, 3] sc, 2 sc in each of next 1 [1, 2, 2] sc, sc in last st, turn. (50 [54, 56, 60] sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, **ext sc** (see Special Stitches) in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 5–22: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 9 times. At end of last row, fasten off.

Row 23: Join claret with sc in first st, **cross-st** (see Special Stitches) across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (2 sc, 24 [26, 27, 29] cross-sts)

Rows 24–29: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk all ch-1 sps, cross-st across, ending with sc in last

sc, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Row 30: Join black with sc in first st, sk all ch-1 sps, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 31–36: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 3 times. At end of last row, fasten off.

Row 37: With silver service, rep row 23.

Rows 38–49: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk all ch-1 sps, cross-st across, ending with sc in last sc, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Row 50: Rep row 30.

Rows 51–60: Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 5 times. At end of last row, do not turn or fasten off.

First Side Edging

Working in ends of rows, ch 1, sc in end of each row across side edge. Fasten off. (60 sc)

2nd Side Edging

Working in ends of rows on the rem side edge, join black with sc in end of first row, sc in end of each row across side edge. Fasten off. (60 sc)

Front Panels & Collar Piece First Front Panel & Collar

Row 1: With black, ch 24 [28, 32, 36] (collar), **changing colors** (see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes) to charcoal, ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 19 chs, changing to black in last st, sc in each ch across, turn. (44 [48, 52, 56] sc)

Row 2: With black, ch 1, ext sc in each of first 24 [28, 32, 36] sts, changing to charcoal in last st, sc in next st, cross-st 9 times, sc in last st, turn. (2 sc, 9 cross-sts, 24 [28, 32, 36] ext sc)

Row 3: With charcoal, ch 1, sc in first st, sk all ch sps, cross-st 9 times, sc in next st, changing to black in next st, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4–9: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times.

Row 10: Ch 1, ext sc in each of first 24 [28, 32, 36] sts, changing to claret, sc in next st, cross-st 9 times, sc in last st, turn.

Row 11: With claret, ch 1, sc in first st, cross-st 9 times, sc in next st, changing to

black, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 12–17: [Rep rows 10 and 11 alternately] 3 times. At end of last row, fasten off claret.

Row 18: With black, ch 1, ext sc in each st across, turn.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 20–23: Using black and silver service, [rep rows 10 and 11 alternately] twice. At end of last row, fasten off silver service.

Rows 24–27: [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately] twice.

Rows 28–31: Using black and charcoal, [rep rows 10 and 11 alternately] twice. At end of last row, fasten off charcoal.

Rows 32–41: [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately] 5 times.

Rows 42–45: Using black and claret, [rep rows 10 and 11 alternately] twice. At end of last row, fasten off claret.

Rows 46–60: [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately] 8 times, ending last rep with row 18. At end of last row, fasten off all colors except black.

Opening for Neck & Shoulders

Row 1: With black, ch 1, sc in each of first 27 [29, 33 35] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

The unworked sts of last row form the top of the first shoulder.

Row 2: Ch 1, ext sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3.

Row 6: Ch 1, ext sc in each of first 17 [19, 23, 25] sts, dc in each of last 10 sts, turn.

Row 7: Rep row 3.

Rows 8–23: [Rep rows 6 and 7 alternately] 8 times.

The dc at end of row 6 will cause the back neck collar to curve slightly.

Rows 24–28: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with row 2.

The ends of rows on the inside edge of this opening form the back neck.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, *ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next st**, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in each of next 3 sts, sc in next ch-3 sp] across, ending with ch 2, dc in last st, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 3, sk next st,

sc in each of next 3 sts, [ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] across, ch 3, sc in last st, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across to last ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in last ch-3 sp, sc in last st, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, *sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp**, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Rows 9–26: [Rep rows 3–8 consecutively] 3 times.

Row 27: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, *ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next st**, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 2 sts, ch 51 [51, 51, 61, 61, 61], drop lp from hook, with another hank, join (see Pattern Notes) in first st of this row, ch 50 [50, 50, 60, 60, 60], fasten off this hank, pick up dropped lp, turn.

Right Front & Back

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 3, sk next 3 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, ch 3, sk next 3 chs, [sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 3 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs, ch 3, sk next 3 chs] 4 [4, 4, 5, 5, 5] times, sc in next st on Sleeve, *ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next st, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk

Next rows: Work in Pattern until piece measures 22½ [22½, 22½, 22¼, 22¼, 22¼, 22¼, 22, 22] inches from beg, ending with a RS row.

Row 1: With WS facing, work in Pattern across until there are 12 [13, 18, 24, 30, 31, 36, 42, 42] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 9: Working in back lps, ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each st across with 3 hdc in last st, turn. (23 hdc)

Row 10: Rep row 2. (25 hdc)

Row 11: Rep row 9. (29 hdc)

Row 12: Working in front lps, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 13: Working in back lps, ch 2, hdc in next st, **hdc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, [hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts] across ending with hdc in last st, turn. (22 hdc)

Row 14: Working in front lps, ch 2, hdc in next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts] across, turn. (17 hdc)

Row 15: Working in back lps, ch 2, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (9 hdc)

Row 16: Working in front lps, ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in each of next 3 sts, 3 hdc in next st, 2 hdc in each st across with 3 hdc in last st, turn. (21 hdc)

Row 17: Working in back lps, ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 9 sts, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in each of next 9 sts, 3 hdc in last st, turn. (1 ch sp, 24 hdc)

Body

Row 18: Working in front lps, ch 2, 2 hdc in same st as beg ch-3, hdc in each st and ch across, with 3 hdc in last st, turn. (29 hdc)

Row 19: Working in back lps, ch 2, hdc in each of next 13 sts, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in each st across, turn. (1 ch sp, 28 hdc)

Row 20: Working in front lps, ch 2, hdc in each st and ch across, turn. (29 hdc)

Next rows: Rep rows 19 and 20 alternately for pattern until piece measures 39 inches from beg.

2nd End


Row 1: Working in back lps, **ch 1** (see Pattern Notes), hdc in next st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 10 sts, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in each of next 10 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, turn. (1 ch-1 sp, 24 hdc)

Row 2: Working in front lps, ch 1, hdc in

next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each of next 6 sts, hdc dec in next ch and next st, hdc in each of next 5 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, turn. (18 hdc)

Row 3: Working in back lps, ch 1, hdc in next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (9 hdc)

Row 4: Working in front lps, ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, [hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] 3 times, 2 hdc in last st, turn. (17 hdc)



Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 3, sc in 2nd tr of next tr group, ch 3, sc in next sc, [ch 3, sc in center tr of next tr group, ch 3, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 4, tr in same sc, ch 2, sc in next sc, [ch 2, 4 tr in next sc, ch 2, sc in next sc] across, ending with ch 2, 3 tr in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 3, sc in next sc, [ch 3, sc in 2nd tr of next tr group, ch 3, sc in next sc] across, ch 3, sc in last st, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 2, 4 tr in next sc, ch 2, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Rows 6–141: [Rep rows 2–5] 34 times. At end of last row, leaving long end, fasten off.

Sew row 1 and row 141 tog. C!

INSPIRED BY A VINTAGE IRISH CROCHET DESIGN AND STITCHED IN A GORGEOUS, AUTUMNAL VARIEGATED LACE WOOL YARN, THIS VIRTUALLY WEIGHTLESS SCARF CAN BE WORN AROUND THE NECK OR DRAPED ON THE SHOULDERS FOR A STUNNING PRESENTATION.

SKILL LEVEL INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

12 x 47 inches

MATERIALS

- Jojoland Harmony lace
 (lace) weight wool yarn
 (1¾ oz/880 yds/50g per ball):
 1 ball #HC06 red/green/blue
- Size 12/1.00mm steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Embroidery needle
- · Press cloth (optional)

GAUGE

9 tr = 1 inch; Large leaflet blocked = $2\frac{1}{2}$ x $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Each Leaf is comprised of 5 different-size leaflets, which are sewn to a center ring. All sewing is worked on wrong side.

Leaflets may need to be lightly steamblocked before joining if they curl, **do not iron with back-and-forth motion.** This may be done with steam iron on lowest wool setting with press cloth placed gently over Leaflet.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

SCARF

Large Leaflet

Make 11.

Row 1: Ch 18, tr in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (16 tr)

Row 2: Working in sps between sts, sk first st, sl st in each of next 3 sps, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), tr in each of next 11 sps, (3 tr, ch 6, 3 tr) in next ch-2 sp at beg of row 1, working in sps between chs, sk first ch, tr in each of next 12 sps, leaving rem sps unworked, turn. (1 ch-6 sp, 30 tr)

Rows 3–6: Sk first st, sl st in each of next 3 sps, ch 3, tr in each of next 11 sps, (3 tr, ch 6, 3 tr) in next ch-6 sp, sk next st, tr in each of next 12 sps, leaving rem sps unworked, turn.

Row 7: Sk first st, [sl st in each of next 3 sps, ch 3, tr in each of next 11 sps, 6 tr in next ch-6 sp, sk next st, tr in each of next 12 sps, leaving rem sps unworked, turn. Fasten off.

This is the top center section of the leaf. The Leaflet will have 5 holes formed from ch-6 sps.

Medium Leaflets

Make 22.

Rows 1–5: Rep rows 1–5 of Large Leaflet.
Rows 6: Rep row 7 of Large Leaflet.
These are placed on either side of Large

Leaflet and will have 4 holes formed from ch-6 sps.

Small Leaflets

Make 22.

Rows 1–3: Rep rows 1–3 of Large Leaflet.

Rows 4: Rep row 7 of Large Leaflet.

These are placed below the Medium Leaflets evenly and will have 2 holes formed from ch-6 sps.

Center Ring

Make 11.

Ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 2, 20 dc in ring. Fasten off.

Leaf Assembly

Sew 1 Center Ring to bottom (wider end) of 1 Large Leaflet.

Sew 2 Medium Leaflets in place on each side and below the Large Leaflet, sewing to Center Ring and Large Leaflet.

Sew 2 Small Leaflets in place on each side and below Medium Leaflets, sewing to Center Ring and Medium Leaflets.

Sides of Leaflets should be touching but not overlapping.

Rep with rem Leaflets until 11 Leaves are completed.



Cowl: 7 hdc = $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches: 3 Pattern rows = 2 inches

Take time to check gauge.





PATTERN

Row 1: First dc (see Special Stitches) in first st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, ending with dc in last st, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp across, turn.



Next Foundation Half Double Crochet

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sk next 3 sts, (dc, {ch 1, dc} 6 times) in next sc, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 4: First dc, sk first ch-1 sp, *sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp**, ch 1, sk next 2 ch-1 sps, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sk last ch-1 sp, dc in last st, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk next ch-1 sp, (dc, {ch 1, dc} 6 times) in next ch-3 sp, [sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp, sk next ch-1 sp, (dc, {ch 1, dc} 6 times) in next ch-3 sp] across, sk last ch-1 sp, sc in last st, turn.

Rows 6 & 7: Rep rows 4 and 5.

Row 8: Rep row 4.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in



next sc, [sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] across, sc in last st, turn.

Rows 10–15: Rep rows 1–6.

Row 16: Rep row 9.

Rep rows 1–16 for Pattern.

RUANA

Back

Row 1: If you prefer to beg with traditional ch, with aubergine, ch 122, hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across OR work first foundation hdc (see Special Stitches), and then work 120 next foundation hdc (see Special Stitches), turn. (121 hdc)

Rows 2–65: [Work rows 1–16 of Pattern consecutively] 4 times. *(15 pattern reps)*

Rows 66 & 67: Work rows 1 and 2 of Pattern.

Last rnd: Ch 1, evenly sp hdc around all edges, **join** (see Pattern Note) in beg hdc. Fasten off.

Front Panel

Make 2.

Row 1: If you prefer to beg with traditional ch, with aubergine, ch 50, hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across **OR** work first foundation hdc, and then work 48 next foundation hdc, turn. (49 hdc)

Rows 2–65: [Work rows 1–16 of Pattern

consecutively] 4 times. (6 pattern reps)

Rows 66 & 67: Work rows 1 and 2 of Pattern.

Last rnd: Ch 1, evenly sp hdc around all edges, join in beg hdc. Fasten off.

Finishing

Block Back and Front Panels according to schematic.

Place Front Panels on top of Back, with side edges even and sp between Front Panels for back neck, sew shoulder seams.

Fringe

Cut 2 strands of plum perfect each 24 inches in length. Holding both strands tog, fold in half, pull fold through. Pull ends through fold, pull to tighten.

Attach Fringe across bottom edges of Front Panels and bottom edge of Back.

Tassels

Gather 12 Fringe tog and wrap separate strand several times around gathered Fringe about 2 inches from first fold. Secure end.

Rep across Front Panels and Back. Some Tassels may have more or less Fringe.

COWL

Row 1: With aubergine, work **first foundation hdc** (see Special Stitches), and then work 70 **next foundation hdc** (see Special Stitches) turn.

Row 2: First dc (see Special Stitches), dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, ending with dc in last st, turn. (34 ch-1 sps, 37 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st and in each ch-1 sp across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, [sk next 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across, ending with sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 5: First dc, dc in next st, 3 dc in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, [sk next 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across to last 5 sts, sk next 2 sts, 3 dc in next st, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn. [10 dc groups]

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, [sk next 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across, ending with sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Rows 7–10: [Rep rows 5 and 6] twice.

Row 11: Rep row 5.

Row 12: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across, ending with ch 1, sk next st, sc in last st, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, dc in each st and in each ch sp across with 2 dc in each ch-2 sp, turn.


Rows 14 & 15: Rep rows 2 and 3. At end of last row, fasten off.

Finishing

Working in ends of rows, join aubergine with sc in end of first row, evenly sp sc across to next corner. Fasten off.

Rep on rem ends of rows.

Sew hook-and-eye closures evenly sp down edges. C!



OHIO BAG

DESIGN BY ELLEN GORMLEY

THIS FELTED BAG HAS LONG STRAPS ATTACHED WITH CLIPS THAT CAN BE EASILY REPOSITIONED TO CARRY IT AS A SHOULDER SATCHEL, BACKPACK OR MESSENGER BAG. A SINGLE HANDLE ALLOWS IT TO BE CARRIED LIKE A BRIEFCASE.



FINISHED SIZE

Before felting: Body is 16 x 21 inches with flap open; Base is 4¼ x 17 inches; each Strap is 1¾ x 17 inches

After felting: Body is 10½ x 14 inches with flap open; Base is 4 x 14 inches with flap open; each Strap is 1½ x 24 inches

MATERIALS

 Knit Picks Palette super fine (fingering) weight Peruvian wool yarn (1¾ oz/231 yds/ 50g per ball):



- 4 balls each #24246 pimento and #23733 mist
- 3 balls each #23723 pool and #23731 ash
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle
- 1-inch steel rings: 4
- 1-inch swivel clasps: 2
- · Locking stitch marker

GAUGE

21 sc = 4 inches; 15 sc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Straps can be clasped to the rings on round 2 to make a backpack, or Straps can be clasped onto the opposite ring on round 44 to make a double shoulder Strap. Clasps can also be hooked together to make a longer, single Strap to fit across the body. Or the straps can be left off completely, using just the Handle to carry the Bag like a briefcase. This would give

4 ways to carry the Bag.

Hold 2 strands together unless otherwise stated.

When changing colors in the multicolored section, drop and work over the unused color and pick up new color.

Always change color in last stitch.

Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless otherwise stated.

Mark first stitch of each round.

BAG

Base

Row 1 (RS): With 2 strands of pimento held tog (see Pattern Notes), ch 60, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (59 sc)

Rows 2-16: Ch 1, sc in each st across,

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each st across, do not turn.

Body

Rnd 1 (RS): Now working in rnds and in ends of rows, working in back lps (see Stitch Guide), 3 sc in end of next row, place marker in center sc of group, move markers with each rnd, evenly sp 13 sc across to last row, 3 sc in last row, place marker in center sc of group, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, sc in each ch across, 3 sc in end of next row, place marker in center sc of group, evenly sp 13 sc across to last row, 3 sc in last row, place marker in center sc of group, sc in each st across, **do not join** (see Pattern Notes). (156 sc)

Rnd 2: Mark 3 sts in from corner on each end of 1 long edge for 1-inch rings, work 3 sts over each ring, working in both lps, sc in each st around with 3 sc in each center corner st, **changing colors** (see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes) to mist. (164 sc)

Rnd 3: With mist, sc in each st around with 3 sc in each center corner st. (172 sc)

Rnd 4: With mist, sc in each st around.

Rnd 5: With ash, sc in each st around.

Rnds 6 & 7: With mist, sc in each st around.

Rnd 8: With mist, sc in next st [with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in each of next 3 sts] around, ending with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in each of last 2 sts.

Rnd 9: [With pool, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in next st, with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in next st] around.

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 8.

Rnd 11: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 12: With ash, sc in each st around.

Rnds 13 & 14: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 15: With pimento, sc in each st around.

Rnd 16: [With pimento, sc in each of next 3 sts, with mist, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in each of next 3 sts, with pool, sc in next st] around to last 4 sts, with pimento, sc in each of last 4 sts.

Rnds 17 & 18: [With pimento, sc in next st, with mist, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in each of next 5 sts, with pool, sc in next st] around to last 4 sts, with pimento, sc in each of last 4 sts.

Rnd 19: [With pimento, sc in each of next



2 sts, with mist, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in each of next 3 sts, with pool, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in next st] around to last 4 sts, with pimento, sc in each of last 4 sts.

Rnds 20 & 21: [With pimento, sc in each of next 3 sts, with mist, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in next st, with pool, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in each of next 2 sts] around to last 4 sts, with pimento, sc in each of last 4 sts.

Rnd 22: Rep rnd 19.

Rnd 23: Rep rnd 18.

Rnd 24: Rep rnd 17.

Rnd 25: Rep rnd 16.

Rnd 26: Rep rnd 15.

Rnds 27 & 28: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 29: With ash, [sc in each st across to marker, **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] around. (168 sc)

Rnd 30: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 31: With mist, rep rnd 29. (164 sc)

Rnd 32: With mist sc in next st, [with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in each of next 3 sts] around to last 3 sts, with pool sc in next st, with mist, sc in each of last 2 sts.

Rnd 33: [With pool, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in next st, with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in next st] around.

Rnd 34: Rep rnd 32.

Rnd 35: With mist, rep rnd 29. (160 sc)

Rnd 36: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 37: With ash, rep rnd 29. (156 sc)

Rnd 38: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 39: With mist, rep rnd 29. (152 sc)

Rnds 40–42: With pimento, rep rnd 29. (140 sc at end of last rnd)

Rnd 43: With pimento, rep rnd 15.

Rnd 44: With pimento, sc in each of next 86 sts, sc in each of next 4 sts working over 1 ring at same time, sc in each of next 46 sts, sc over rem ring in each of last 4 sts.

Rnd 45: With pool, [sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts] around.

Rnd 46: With pool, sc in each st and in each ch around.

Rnds 47 & 48: With ash, sc in each st around.

Rnd 49: With ash, sc in each of next 36 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next st, ch 20, sk next 20 sts (handle opening), dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in each of next 48 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next st, ch 20, sk next 20 sts (handle opening), dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in each st around.

Rnd 50: With ash, sc in each st and in each ch around.

Rnd 51: With ash, sc in each st around.

Rnds 52 & 53: With mist, sc in each st around.

Rnd 54: [With mist, sc in each of next 3 sts, with pool, sc in next st] around.

Rnd 55: With mist, sc in each of next 2 sts, [with pool, sc in next st, with pimento, sc in next st, with pool, sc in next st, with mist, sc in next st] around.

Rnd 56: Rep rnd 54.

Rnd 57: With mist, rep rnd 4.

Rnd 58: With ash, sc in each st around.

Rnds 59–61: With pimento, sc in each st around.

Rnd 62: With pimento, ch 1, working from left to right, **reverse sc** (see Stitch Guide) in each st around. Fasten off.

Handle

Row 1: With ash, ch 25, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (24 sc)

Rows 2–10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Last row: Fold Handle in half lengthwise, working through both thicknesses of sts on last row and starting ch on opposite side of row 1, ch 1, sc in each st across. Leaving long end, fasten off.

With long ends, sew Handle to RS of Body so that it will pass through both handle openings on rnd 49.

Strap

Make 2.

Row 1: With ash, ch 102, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (101 sc)

Row 2: With mist, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: With mist, ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, with pool, sc in next st, [with mist, sc in each of next 3 sts, with pool, sc in next st] across, with mist, sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 4: With mist, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: With ash, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rnd 6: Working in ends of rows and in sts, with pimento, ch 1, sc in each st and end of each row around and **at same time**, sc in 5 sts over 1 swivel clasp on 1 short end and working 5 sts over 1 ring on rnd 44 of Body on rem short end. Fasten off.

Attach to Bag as desired (see Pattern Notes).

Felting

With mild detergent and color-safe, heavy fabrics such as denim, machine-wash in hot water.

Check frequently until Bag and Straps are felted as desired. Allow to agitate longer for more shrinkage.

Do not tumble dry.

Shape and lie flat or fill with plastic grocery bags to hold shape. Allow to air dry. C!

X AND Y MARK THE SPOT WHEN YOU ADD THESE PRETTY, EYE-CATCHING STITCHES TO YOUR CROCHET PROJECTS.





TEXTURED X-STITCH

PATTERN NOTE

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first leg of beginning crossstitch unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning cross-stitch (beg cross-st):Ch 2, sk next st, dc in next st, ch 4
(counts as first dc and ch-1), dc in top
of last dc worked.

Cross-stitch (cross-st): Yo twice, insert hook in next st, yo, pull lp through, yo, pull through 2 lps on hook, yo, sk next st, insert hook in next st, yo, pull lp through, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice (center), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice, ch 1, dc in center.

INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1: Ch a multiple of 3 sts plus 1, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Working in back lps (see Stitch Guide), beg cross-st (see Special Stitches), cross-st (see Special Stitches) across, turn.

Row 3: Working in **front lps** (see Stitch Guide), ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch-1 sp across, turn.

Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for pattern.

UPSIDE-DOWN Y-STITCH

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-7 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Y-stitch (Y-st): Yo twice, insert hook in st or ch, yo, pull lp through, yo, pull through 2 lps on hook, yo, sk next 2 sts or chs, insert hook in st or ch, yo, pull lp through, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 4 times.

INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1: Ch a multiple of 4 sts plus 16, **Y-st** (see Special Stitch) in 10th ch from hook, (first 9 chs count as first tr, sk 2 chs and ch-3), [ch 3, Y-st] across, to last 3 chs, ch 4, sk next 2 chs, tr in last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), tr in each ch and in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 7 (see Pattern Note), sk next 2 sts, Y-st, [ch 3, Y-st] across to last 3 sts, ch 4, sk next 2 sts, tr in last st, turn.

Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for pattern. C!

GREAT BEGINNINGS & HAPPY ENDINGS

BY DARLA SIMS

CREATING A GREAT CROCHET PROJECT IS MUCH LIKE WRITING OR READING A STORY—COMPLETE WITH A GREAT BEGINNING THAT CATCHES YOUR ATTENTION TO THE CONCLUSION WITH A HAPPY ENDING FOR COMPLETE SATISFACTION.

GREAT BEGINNINGS

Everyone wants to crochet to impress. Knowing some tricks for beginning and ending your crochet projects can help you achieve this goal as well as provide each project with a professional look.

No doubt, you've noticed some crochet instructions simply tell you to chain a specific number, leaving the tension up to you, while other instructions will be more specific, and instruct you to "chain loosely." It's the term "loosely" that often leaves readers wondering what that means and how to achieve what is expected.

In order to ensure that the beginning of any crochet project has the same tension as the rest of the piece make sure you chain loosely. In other words, make your foundation chain using less tension than you use for the following rows or rounds, while slightly exaggerating the size of the chains in a consistent manner.

If you have difficulty maintaining the size consistency for each chain, try working the foundation chain with a hook that is one size larger than the size required for the project. After completing the foundation chain, use the required hook for the remainder of the project.

WORKING INTO THE CHAIN

There are two methods for working the first row of your crochet project. Illustration 1 shows how to single crochet in the chain;



however, the first row can be worked in any stitch or stitch pattern. After completing your chain, take a good look at both sides. The right side of the chain should look like a series of interlocked "V's". When you turn the chain over to view the wrong side, you should see a series of bumps or bars—each of which is counted as one chain.

Many crocheters learned the method of working into the top (or back) of each V (chain) across (see illustration 1). However, if you use this method, you will probably need to add an edging so your crochet work looks finished.

An alternate method would be to work into the bumps or back bars on the back of the chain (see illustration 2). This method provides a great self-finish that is perfect for everything from ripple afghans to



hats because the first and last row look the same and require no edging, unless an additional heading is desired. This alternate method of beginning the size consistency for each chain provides a more uniform stitch shape in your first row.

To ensure your ending is great, when you change colors—at the beginning and end of a color change—or are ready to end your work, be sure to leave a 6-inch tail for finishing.

GAPS

Gaps don't happen when you are working every row in single crochet. They do happen, however, when you chain 2 (for half double crochet, or chain 3 for double crochet, etc.) at the beginning of the row. These beginning chains are intended to be the same height as the stitch used in the row; however, the chains are not the same width or density as the stitch they are representing. Also, there is a noticeable gap at the ends of the rows of two pieces being sewn together or at the end of rows being used as an edging foundation.

To avoid those gaps, try making only one chain at the beginning of a row, and then drawing the loop on the hook up to the height of a half double crochet or a double crochet. Then, work into the first stitch, instead of skipping the first stitch when chaining 2 or 3 at the beginning of the row, and the gap is gone!

HEADING TO YOUR HAPPY ENDING

After you have worked approximately 3 to 4 inches, double-check your gauge to ensure your project will match the finished measurements in your pattern. Sometimes as you become more comfortable with a pattern stitch, you'll relax more and have less tension in your

work, which can affect your gauge. It's more than worth the short amount of time is takes to stop at this point and remeasure rather than taking a chance.

HAPPY ENDINGS

To block or not?

It's now time to block the piece(s). There are several methods for blocking:

1. Using tepid water, thoroughly wet each piece; roll in a towel to remove excess moisture. Placing the pieces on a dry, doubled-up towel, use your hands to gently manipulate each piece to fit the fin-

- ished measurements. Use rustproof straight pins, placing them about an inch apart to hold the piece in place and allow it to air dry.
- 2. Steam each piece, after laying it out and pinning it into place to fit finished measurements. Do not allow the iron to actually touch the yarn, but hover over each piece with the iron held an inch or two above piece. Allow piece to sit for at least half an hour.
- 3. Lay out each piece; with rust-proof pins, pin it into place to fit finished measurements, placing the pins about an inch apart to hold the piece in place. Dampen, using a spray bottle filled with tepid water. Do not remove pins until thoroughly dry.

If your yarn is acrylic, there is no point in blocking because acrylic yarns have built-in memory. This means that when anything is crocheted in acrylic, after laundering and drying, it will automatically return to its original shape. However, you may wish to use the steam method above to smooth out the pieces. If your yarn is a natural fiber or blend of fibers, check the label for instructions.

THE GRAND FINALE: SEAMING

I prefer to weave in all the loose ends prior to seaming; however, you may prefer to do the weaving in after seaming. To make weaving in easier, I always leave at least

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle

GAUGE

9 sc = 2 inch; 5 sc rows = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTE

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 4 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Cable: Loosely ch 3, sk next 2 sc, sc in next st, turn, sc in each of next 3 chs, sl st in sc worked before ch-3, turn, working behind ch-3, sc in each of 2 sk sts.

WRAP

First Cluster Section

Row 1: With baby denim marl, ch 155, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (154 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [cl (see Special Stitches) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts] across, turn. (51 cl)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (154 sc)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, cl in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, cl in next st] across, ending with sc in last st, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. (154 sc)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] until you have 15 rows of cls. At end of last row, fasten off.

First Cable Section

Row 1: Working in back lps (see Stitch Guide), join (see Pattern Note) baby blue in first st, sl st in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Working in rem lps of row before last, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3 & 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across,

Row 5: Working in back lps, sl st in each st across, turn. Fasten off.

Row 6: Working in rem lps on row 4, join baby white with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first st, cable (see Special Stitches) across, ending sl st in last st, turn.

Rows 9 & 10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rows 11-15: Rep rows 1-5 of Cable Section. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Cluster Section

Row 1: With RS facing, working in rem lps

of row before last, join baby blue with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2–5 of First Cluster Section consecutively] until you have 5 rows of cls. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Cable Section

Work same as First Cable Section.

3rd Cluster Section

Work same as 2nd Cluster Section.

3rd Cable Section

Work same as First Cable Section.

4th Cluster Section

Row 1: With RS facing, join baby blue with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2-5 of First Cluster Section consecutively] until you have 10 rows of cls. At end of last row, fasten off.

4th Cable Section

Work same as First Cable Section.

5th Cluster Section

Work same as 2nd Cluster Section.

5th Cable Section

Work same as First Cable Section.

6th Cluster Section

Work same as 2nd Cluster Section.

6th Cable Section

Work same as First Cable Section.

7th Cluster Section

Row 1: With RS facing, working in rem lps of row before last, join baby blue with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2–5 of First Cluster Section consecutively] until you have 15 rows of cls. At end of last row, fasten off.

Border

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, in rem lps of previous row, in end of rows and across starting ch on opposite side of row 1, join baby blue with sc in first st, sc in each st and in end of each row around with 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Working in **front lps** (see Stitch Guide), sl st in each st around, join in beg sl st.

Rnd 3: Working in rem lps of rnd 1, ch 1, sc in each st around with 3 sc in each center corner st, join in beg sc.

Rnds 4 & 5: Ch 1, sc in each st around, with 3 sc in each center corner st, join in beg sc.

Rnd 6: Working in front lps, sl st in each st around, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

Rnd 7: Working in rem lps of rnd before last, join baby white with sc in center st of any corner, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Ribbing

Row 1: Row 1: Ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sk next st on last rnd of Border, sl st in next st, turn.

Row 2: Working in back lps, sk sl st, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Working in back lps, ch 1, sc in each sta cross, sk next st on last rnd of Border, sl st in next st, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately around last rnd of Border, ending with row 2. At end of last row, leaving long end, fasten off.

Sew first row of Ribbing to last row of Ribbing. **C**!

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size 2 (small); changes for sizes 4 (medium) and 6 (large) are in [].

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Chest: 24 [26, 28] inches **Length:** 11½ [13½, 15] inches

MATERIALS

- Caron Sheep(ish) medium
 (worsted) weight acrylic/
 wool yarn (3 oz/150 ds/85g per ball):
 4 [4, 5] balls #0007 hot pink(ish) (A)
 1 [1, 1] ball #0012 yellow(ish) (B)
 1 oz/50 yds/28g #0001
 black(ish) (C)
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Split-ring markers
- Yarn needle

GAUGE

16 dc = 4 inches; 10 dc rows = 4 inches Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-2 counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Surface slip stitch (surface sl st): Hold

a slip knot (not on hook) on WS of piece. Insert hook from RS to WS. Place slip knot on hook, draw lp to RS. *A small distance from last insertion, insert hook from RS to WS through piece, yo, draw lp to RS and through lp on hook (surface sl st made); rep from * as needed.

SWEATER

Back

Row 1: With A, ch 49 [53, 57], dc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (*48* [52, 56] *dc*)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each dc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 11½ [13½, 15] inches from beg. Fasten off. Place marker 4½ [5, 5½] inches down from top edge on each side of Back (*armhole*).

Front

Row 1: With A, ch 49 [53, 57], dc in 3rd ch from hook (*beg 2 sk chs count as first dc*), dc in each rem ch across, turn. (*48* [52, 56] *dc*)

Row 2: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 9½ [11½, 13] inches from beg.

Shape First Shoulder

Row 1: Ch 2, dc in each of next 18 [19, 20] sts, leave rem sts unworked for neck and 2nd Shoulder, turn. (19 [20, 21] dc)

Row 2: Ch 2, **dc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, dc in each dc across, turn. (18 [19, 20] sts)

Row 3: Ch 2, dc in each dc across to last 2 sts, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (17 [18, 19] sts)

Row 4: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 4 until Front measures same as Back. Fasten off.

Shape 2nd Shoulder

Row 1: Sk next 10 [12, 14] unworked sts on last row of Front, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in next st, ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn. (19 [20, 21] dc)

Row 2: Ch 2, dc in each dc across to last 2 sts, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (18 [19, 20] sts)

Row 3: Ch 2, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in each rem dc across, turn. (17 [18, 19] sts)

Row 4: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 4 until Front measures same as Back. Fasten off. Place marker 4½ [5, 5½] inches down from top edge on each side of Front (armhole).

Sew Shoulder seams.

Sleeves

Row 1: Working across 1 side edge of seamed Front/Back piece, join A at first armhole marker, ch 2, work 35 [39, 43] dc evenly sp across to other armhole marker, turn. (36 [40, 44] dc)

Rows 2 & 3: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 2, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in each dc across to last 2 dc, dc dec in next 2 sts, turn. (34 [38, 42] dc)

Rows 5-7: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Row 8: Rep row 4. (32 [36, 40] dc)



Rows 9-20 [9-24, 9-28]: [Rep last 4 rows consecutively] 4 [5, 6] times. (24 [26, 28] sts at end of last row)

Row 21 [25, 29]: Ch 2, dc in each dc across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 21 [25, 29] until piece measures 10 [11½, 13] inches from Shoulder. Fasten off.

Rep Sleeve on other side edge of seamed Front/Back piece.

Sun Appliqué

Rnd 1: With B, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; join in first sc. (6 sc)


Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in first sc. (12 sc)


Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, [sc in each of





next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (36 sc)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (42 sc)

Rnd 8: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (48 sc)


Rnd 9: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, join in first sc. (54 sc)


Rnd 10: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, in first sc. (60 sc)

Rnd 11: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc. Fasten off.

Finishing

With C, embroider pupils of eyes using French knot (see illustration), and smile and eyes outline using straight stitches (see illustration) on Appliqué as shown in photo.





Sew side and sleeve seams.


Neckband

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join A in neck edge at Shoulder seam, ch 1, sc evenly sp around neck edge, join in first sc. Fasten off.

> Sew Appliqué to center front of sweater.

Rays

With B, work 8 lines of surface **sl st** (see Special Stitch), evenly sp around sun, as shown in photo. Weave in all ends. C!

SKILL LEVEL

FINISHED SIZE

48 x 54 inches

MATERIALS

- Caron Dazzleaire bulky (chunky) weight acrylic/ nylon yarn (3 oz/155 yds/85g per skein):
 - 6 skeins #0008 pinot noir
- Caron Simply Soft Paints medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (4 oz/200 yds/113g per skein):
 - 9 skeins #0008 sunset
- Size I/9/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle

GAUGE

Motif = 6 inches square

PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

THROW

Motif Make 72 Center

Rnd 1: With pinot noir, ch 5, dc in 5th ch

from hook (first 4 chs count as first dc and ch-1), ch 1, [dc in same ch, ch 1] 6 times, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (8 dc, 8 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp, [sc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch-1 sp] around, join in beg sc.

Note: In rnd 3, all sts are worked around st 2 rnds below in rnd 1. Take care to sk the sts in rnd 2, these sk sts will be worked in on rnd 1 of Outer Square.

Rnd 3: Working in rnd 1, ch 1, **fpdc** (see Stitch Guide) around first st in rnd 1, dc in next ch sp on rnd 1, [fpdc around next st on rnd 1, dc in next ch sp on rnd 1] around, join in first fpdc. (16 sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, fpdc around first fpdc, *dc in sp between last st and next st, fpdc around next dc, dc in sp between last st and next st**, fpdc around next fpdc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in first fpdc. Fasten off. (32 sts)

Outer Square

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working in sts on rnd 2 of Center behind sts of rnds 3 and 4 on Center, pull up lp of sunset in any st, ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), (hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in same st (corner), *2 hdc in next ch-2 sp, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next ch-2 sp**, (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in next st (corner), rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (4 ch sps, 36 hdc)

Rnd 2: SI st in next st, sI st in next ch sp, ch 2, (hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in same ch sp, *working in back lps (see Stitch Guide) of rnd 4 on Center and both lps of last rnd, hdc in each of next 9 sts**, (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in next corner ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnd 3: SI st in next st, sI st in next ch sp, ch 2, (hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in same ch sp, hdc in each st around with (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in each corner ch sp, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off.

Assembly

Sew Motifs with WS tog in 9 rows of 8 Motifs. If desired, Motifs may be sl st or sc tog.

Edging

With RS facing, join sunset in any st, ch 1, hdc each st around with (2 hdc, ch 2, 2 hdc) in each corner ch sp, join in beg hdc. Fasten off. C!

SKILL LEVEL

FINISHED SIZE

40 x 44 inches

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Super Saver medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (7 oz/364 yds/198g per skein):
 - 2 skeins #406 medium thyme 1 skein each #321 gold, #718 shocking pink, #776 dark orchid, #312 black and #256 carrot
- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Tapestry needle

GAUGE

Center Stripe rows 1-6 = 2 inches square

PATTERN NOTES

Row 1 of Center Stripe is right side of work. Row 2 establishes pattern stitch repeated several places on Throw.

When working Stripes, Wedges and Corner Squares, always begin with right side facing.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.


SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: 3 dc as indicated in instructions.

THROW

Center Stripe

Row 1: With gold, ch 8, working in **back lps of ch** (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch
from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch]
across, turn.





Single Crochet in Chain

Rows 2–82: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next ch sp, sc in next st] across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

First Side

2nd Stripe

Row 1: With shocking pink, pull up lp in end of ch on Center Stripe at bottom right according to Assembly Diagram, ch 1, sc in same ch and in end of each row across, turn. (83 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3. At end of last row, fasten off.

3rd Stripe

Row 1: With medium thyme, pull up lp in first sc on last row of 2nd Stripe, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sk next st, shell (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next st, sc in next st] across, ending with sk next st, 2 dc in last st, turn.

Rows 3–6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [shell in next sc, sc in center st of next shell] across, ending with 2 dc in last st, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first st, *hdc in next st, dc in next st**, hdc in next st, sc in next st, rep from * across, ending last rep at **. Fasten off.

4th Stripe

Row 1: With shocking pink, pull up lp in first st at bottom of 3rd Stripe, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 2–5: Rep rows 2–5 of 2nd Stripe.

5th Stripe

Row 1: With gold, pull up lp in first st at bottom of 4th Stripe, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 2–6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across. Fasten off.



6th Stripe

Work same as 4th Stripe.

7th Stripe

Row 1: With carrot, pull up lp in first sc on 6th Stripe at bottom, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sk next ch-1 sp, shell in next st, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next st] across, ending with sk next ch-1 sp, 2 dc in last st, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 3 and 4 of 3rd Stripe.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, *hdc in next st, dc in next st**, hdc in next st, sc in

next st, rep from * across, ending last rep at **. Fasten off.

2nd Side

Work 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th Stripes on opposite side of Center Stripe.

First End

First Small Corner

Row 1: With shocking pink, pull up lp in end of row 1 on 7th Stripe at top left on 2nd Side, ch 1, sc in end of each sc row and 2 sc in end of each dc row across 7th Stripe, turn. (8 sc)

Rows 2–8: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Top Stripe

Row 1: With carrot, pull up lp in end of last row of 6th Stripe at top right, ch 1, working in ends of rows, evenly sp 71 sc across to end of 6th Stripe on opposite Side, sl st in row 1 of Small Corner, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sk next ch-1 sp, shell in next st, sk next ch-1 sp, sc in next st] across, ending with sk next ch-1 sp, 2 dc in last st, sl st in row 4 of Small Corner, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [shell in next sc, sc in center st of shell] across, ending with 2 dc in last st, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, [shell in next sc, sc in center st of shell] across, ending with 2 dc in last st, sl st in rows 7 and 8 of Small Corner, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, *hdc in next st, dc in next st**, hdc in next st, sc in next st, rep from * across, ending last rep at **. Fasten off.

2nd Small Corner

Work same as for First Small corner. SI st odd-numbered rows of 2nd Small Corner to corresponding odd-numbered rows of Top Stripe as follows: row 1, sI st to row

1, row 3, sl st in row 3, row 5, sl st in top of dc on row 4, row 7, sl st in bottom of dc on row 6, sl st in top of same dc.

2nd End

Rep First End on bottom edge of Stripes.



- · Caron Simply Soft Paints medium (worsted) weight yarn (4 oz/200 yds/113q per skein):

1 skein #0008 sunset (F)

- Sizes H/8/5mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle

GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

All rounds are worked with right side facing.

Even-numbered rounds are worked with slip stitches only.

All odd-numbered rounds except first are worked 2 rounds below.

Most rounds and rows begin by joining the yarn with a particular stitch and end with an invisible join. This results in a join that is almost undetectable.

Do not turn at end of rounds.

Color Sequence #1: Work 1 round each with A, B, D, C and then E.

Color Sequence #2: Work 1 round each with D, C, A, B and then E.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Invisible join: Cut yarn, leaving 6-inch tail, pull tail completely through last st. Using yarn needle, weave the end under the top 2 lps of the first st of the rnd and then back down into the center of the top of the last st of the rnd.

Join with double crochet (join with dc): Make slip knot, yo once, hold wraps in place with finger, insert hook in indicated place, finish as for dc.

Join with treble crochet (join with tr): Make slip knot, yo twice, hold wraps in place with finger, insert hook in indicated place, finish as for tr.

Join with single crochet (join with sc): Make slip knot, insert hook in place indicated, finish as for sc.

Join with half double crochet (join with hdc): Make slip knot, yo once, hold wraps in place with finger, insert hook in indicated place, finish as for hdc.

Join with double treble crochet (join with dtr): Make slip knot, yo 3 times, hold wraps in place with finger, insert hook in indicated place, finish as for dtr.





4X-Large Size Only

Rows [1–44]: Work in Pattern, and at same time, work inc row (see Special Stitches) every other row. ([273] sts at end of last row)

Rows [45–50]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, work inc row every 4th row. ([275] sts at end of last row)

First Front

Row [1]: Work in Pattern across first 70 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Rows [2–30]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 4th row. At end of last row, fasten off. ([77] sts at end of last row)

Back

Row [1]: Join (see Pattern Notes) in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, leaving last 70 sts unworked, turn. ([135] sts)

Rows [2–30]: Work even in Pattern. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Front

Row [1]: Join in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, turn.

Rows [2–30]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 4th row. At end of last row, fasten off. ([77] sts at end of last row)

5X-Large Size Only

Rows [1–26]: Work in Pattern, and at same time, work inc row (see Special Stitches) every other row. ([279] sts at end of last row)

Rows [27–50]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, work inc row every 3rd row. ([295] sts at end of last row)

First Front

Row [1]: Work in Pattern across first 75 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Rows [2–30]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 3rd row. At end of last row, fasten off. ([84] sts at end of last row)

Back

Row [1]: Join (see Pattern Notes) in next

unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, leaving last 75 sts unworked, turn. ([145] sts)

Rows [2–30]: Work even in Pattern. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Front

Row [1]: Join in next unworked st on Body, work in Pattern across, turn. *([75] sts)*

Rows [2–30]: Work in Pattern, and **at same time**, inc at neck edge only every 3rd row. At end of last row, fasten off. ([84] sts at end of last row)

Sleeve

Make 2.

Foundation row: Work 1 first foundation hdc, work 60 [60, 72, 72, 72, 84, 84, 84, 96] next foundation hdc, turn.

Rows 1–64 [1–64, 1–66, 1–66, 1–66, 1–68, 1–68, 1–68, 1–70]: [Work rows 1 and 2 of Pattern alternately] 32 [32, 33, 33, 34, 34, 34, 34, 35] times.

Row 65 [65, 67, 67, 67, 69, 69, 69, 71]: Rep row 2 of Pattern. Fasten off.

Front Edging

Join with sc at bottom edge of Front, evenly sp sc around to bottom edge of other Front. Fasten off.

Bottom Edging

Join in end of edging row on Front, working on opposite side of foundation hdc of row 1, hdc in each st across, hdc in end of Front Edging. Fasten off.

Finishing

Block all pieces.

Sew shoulder seam of 4 [5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts.

Fold 1 Sleeve in half lengthwise, place fold at shoulder seam, sew in place.

Rep with rem Sleeve.

Sew Sleeve seams.

Block all seams.

Holding buttons with back tog and fabric at top right Front, sew buttons tog as shown in photo. C!



Rnd 14: Now working in rnds, with RS facing, join purple at center back neck, ch 1, sc in each st across to first ch-3 sp, 2 sc in ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, *[sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3] 3 times, 4 dc in next ch-3 sp**, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, ch 1, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, rep from * 11 [11, 12, 12, 13] times, ending last rep at **, [ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 4

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, ext sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 5–15: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 6 times, ending last rep with row 3.

Rows 16–19: Rep rows 42–45 of First Front Panel & Collar.

Rows 20–29: [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately of First Front Panel & Collar] 5 times.

Rows 30–33: Rep rows 28–31 of First Front Panel & Collar.

Rows 34–37: [Rep rows 18 and 19 alternately of First Front Panel & Collar] twice.

Rows 38–41: Rep rows 20–23 of First Front Panel & Collar.

Rows 42 & 43: Rep rows 18 and 19 of First Front Panel & Collar.

Rows 44–51: Rep rows 10–17 of First Front Panel & Collar.

Rows 52–59: [Rep rows 2–9 consecutive-ly] of First Front Panel & Collar.

Row 60: Rep row 2 of First Front Panel, changing to black in last st, do not turn or fasten off.

Edging


Working in ends of rows across long edge of piece (Collar), ch 1, evenly sp sc across, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, sc in each ch across, working in ends of rows across rem long edge, sc in end of each row across, sc in each of next 17 [19, 19, 21] unworked sts of last row of First Front Panel & Collar (first shoulder), working in ends of rows across back neck, [sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 rows] 14 times (back neck), working on opposite side of chs on 2nd Front Panel & Collar, sc in each ch across (2nd shoulder), working in ends of rows across side edge of 2nd Front Panel & Collar, sc in end of each row across, sc in each st of last row, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Assembly

Correct assembly depends on correct folding and sewing of the Front Panel & Collar (see Assembly Diagram). The entire piece is curved to open the neck and shoulder opening farther, so that the neck and 2 shoulder edges form a straight line and can be sewn to the neck edge of the back. The long side edge forms the edge of the Collar and as the piece is curved, the collar folds lengthwise back over the other half of the piece. The 2 shorter side edges opposite the Collar edge, on either side of neck and shoulder opening, are sewn to side edge of Back, leaving openings for armholes.

Sew Back Neck of Front Panels Piece to Top Back

Curve the Front Panels and Collar piece to open the neck and shoulder opening until neck and 2 shoulder edges form straight line. Align 48 [52, 52, 56] sts of the neck and shoulder edges of Front Panels with sts along opposite side of row 1 on Back. Sew edges tog, working through both lps of all sts.



Front Panel & Collar Assembly Diagram

Sew Side Edges

Beg at lower edge of each side, match first 35 sts of 1 side of Back with first 35 sts on short edge of Front Panels, sew tog.

Beg at lower edge of Back, matching 35 sts, sew tog in same manner.

Sleeve

Rnd 1: Working in armholes, join black with sc in side seam, evenly sp 24 sc to shoulder seam, place marker in last sc, evenly sp 25 sc around, place marker in last sc, join in beg sc, **turn**. (50 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, ext sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 4: Rep rnd 2.

Rnd 5 (dec): Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each st across to marker, sc dec in next 2

sts, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnds 6–10: [Rep rnds 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with rnd 2.

Rnd 11 (dec): Rep rnd 5. (46 sc)

Rnds 12–35: [Rep rnds 6–11 consecutively] 4 times. At end of last rnd, fasten off. (38 sts)

Rnd 36: Join silver service with sc in first st, cross-st across to last st, sc in last st, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnds 37–39: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk all ch sps, cross-st across to last st, sc in last st, join in beg sc, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rnd 40: Join black with ext sc in first st, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext sc, turn.

Rnds 41 & 42: Rep rnds 2 and 3. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 43 & 44: With claret, rep rnds 36 and 37. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rnds 45–47: Rep rnds 40–43. At end of last rnd, fasten off.



Row 26: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, *3 sc in next ch-5 sp**, sc in each of next 5 sts, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in each of last 3 sts, do not turn.

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in each of next 9 sts, [fptr around next bptr, sk next bptr, fptr around next bptr, fptr around bptr just sk to twist, fptr around next bptr, dc in each of next 10 sts] across, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 9 sts, [bptr around next fptr, sk next fptr, bptr around next fptr, bptr around fptr just sk to twist, bptr around next fptr, dc in each of next 10 sts] across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 5 and 6 alternately] 4 times.

Last row: Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts, picot (see Special Stitches), [ch 3, sc dec in next 4 sts, picot, ch 3, sc dec in next 3 sts, picot] across, ending with sc dec in last 2 sts. Fasten off.





Assembly Diagram



Rep with 2 of 32mm rings and 2 of 24mm rings working about 32 sc in each 32mm ring and 23 sc in each 24mm ring.



Assembly

a 6-inch length of yarn when I change colors or add in a new skein. One at a time, thread a yarn needle with each end and pull the yarn through approximately 2 inches of stitches on the wrong side. Then, work back through about 1 inch of the same stitches going in the opposite direction to secure.

WHIPSTITCH

A whipstitch is one of the

easiest seams to do, and it creates a nonbulky seam. Flexible in nature, it's by far the easiest method to use for bulky or novelty yarns. Simply lay the pieces together with the edges facing and matching stitches (see illustration 3). Insert the yarn needle from back to front through the first stitch on the right-hand side of both pieces and repeat in the next stitch and each stitch to the end.



Whipstitch Edges



BACKSTITCH

The backstitch creates a sturdy seam and is good for shoulders, sleeve armholes and children's garments. Place pieces together with the edges facing (see illustration 4). Begin in the first stitch at the right. Leaving a tail and working through both pieces at the same time, insert the yarn needle from the back to the front of the first stitch, skip the next stitch, holding the yarn at the back of your work, and insert the needle from the back to the front. Then, insert your needle between the last two stitches from the front to the back and repeat to the end.

Stop periodically to make sure you aren't pulling the backstitches too tightly—you need to allow your seam to have some give. I always double-wrap both the first and last stitch for durability.

SLIP STITCH

Most crocheters like the slip-stitch-seaming technique because it's both easy and quickly

crocheted. Having right sides facing, begin by placing a slip knot on your hook. Insert the hook through both loops of the first stitch of each piece, yarn over and pull the yarn through both stitches and the loop on the hook; *insert the hook through the inside loop of the next stitch on each piece, yarn over and pull the yarn through both stitches and the loop on the hook; repeat from * to the end (see illustration 5). This seam is more bulky than the first two methods and is best used for worsted or lighter weight yarn. It is sturdy and elastic in nature.





Illustration 5 Slip-Stitch Seam

WEAVING

I find that this method creates a virtually invisible seam and is the best for matching patterns or stripes perfectly; likewise, it works well for lacy patterns. It also creates the least-bulky seams.

Lay the two pieces to be seamed, right sides up and next to one another. Insert the yarn needle from back to front of the piece on the left, insert the needle from



back to front of the corresponding piece on your right and pull tight (see illustration 6a). Insert the needle from front to back in the

bottom of the same stitch in which you began and pull tight. Insert the needle from front to back of the end stitch of the next row on the right-hand side (see illustration 6b). Insert the needle from front to back of the end stitch of the next

row on the left-hand side (see il-lustration 6c). Stop and double-check to ensure that your pattern or stripes are in alignment. Insert the needle from front to back of the next end stitch of the right side (see illustration 6d). Tighten the

yarn every couple of rows to ensure that stitches, patterns or stripes are aligning properly.

That's it! Having started with a great beginning, you now have a happy and professional-looking ending. C!

Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 7: Rep row 3, sl st in row 7 of First Panel, turn.

Row 8: Rep row 4.

Row 9: Rep row 3, sl st in row 9 of First Panel, turn.

Row 10: Rep row 4.

Row 11: Rep row 5, working fptr around sts on row 8.

Rows 12–17: Rep rows 6–11, sl st in corresponding rows on First Panel and working fptr around sts of row 14. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Panel

Row 1: With black, pull up Ip in last row of First Small Corner at top left, ch 1, sc in end of first 7 rows, 2 sc in end of last row, sl st in row 1 of Green Side Stripe, turn.

Rows 2-17: Work same as First Panel sl st in rows 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17 of Green Side Stripe. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rep Side Border on opposite Side.

End Border

First Large Corner

Row 1: With shocking pink, pull up Ip in row 1 of 2nd Panel on Side Border, ch 1, sc in end of each row across, turn. (17 sc)

Rows 2–17: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

First Panel

Row 1: With black, pull up Ip in first st of last row on First Small Corner, ch 1, 2 sc in same st, sc in each st across, sl st in row 1 of First Large Corner, turn.

Next rows: Continue as for other First Panels, sI st to every odd-numbered row on First Large Corner. At end of last row, fasten off.

End Stripe

Row 1: With dark orchid, pull up lp in top right st of Top Stripe, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 2–17: Rep rows 2–17 of Green Side Stripe, sl st in corresponding rows of First Panel. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Panel

Row 1: With black, pull up lp in top right st of 2nd Small Corner, ch 1, 2 sc in same st, sc in each st across, sl st in row 1 of End Stripe, turn.

Next rows: Continue as for other 2nd Panels, sl st to corresponding rows of End



Stripe. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Large Corner

Row 1: With shocking pink, pull up lp in last row of First Panel on Side Border, ch 1, sc in end of each row across, turn. (17 sc)

Rows 2–17: Continue as for First Large Corner, sl st in corresponding rows of 2nd Panel. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rep End Border on rem end.

Edging

Rnd 1: With black, pull up Ip in end of 2nd Large Corner at top right, ch 1, evenly sp 123 sc across each short end and 135 sc on each long edge with (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc, **turn**.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] around, with ch 1, sk next st, (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner ch sp, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 3: SI st in next ch sp, [ch 2, sk next st, sI st in next ch sp] around with ch 1, sk next st, (sI st, ch 3, sI st) in each corner ch sp, join in beg sI st. Fasten off. **C**I

st, place marker in last tr made, tr in same st, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 2 dc in next st, work invisible join. (76 sts, 4 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 8: Rep rnd 2. Fasten off 4th color.

Rnd 9: With RS facing and working in sts 2 rnds below, join 5th color with sc (see Special Stitches) in marked tr, sc in same st as join, 2 sc in next st, *sc in next st, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 10 sts, [sc dec (see Pattern Notes) in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 2 sts, (sc, hdc) in next st, (hdc, sc) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 2 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 2 sts; rep from * around, ending last rep at **, work invisible join. (88 sts, 4 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 10: Rep rnd 2. Fasten off 5th color.

Half Large Motif

Make 14.

Note: Half Large Motifs are worked in same order as Color Sequence #2 of Large Motifs.

Row 1 (RS): With D and size I hook, make slip ring, ch 4 (counts as first tr), (tr, 7 dc, 2 tr) in ring. Fasten off D. (11 sts)

Row 2: With RS facing, join D with sl st in first st, sl st in each rem st across. Fasten off D.

Row 3: With RS facing and working in sts

2 rows below, **join C with hdc** (see Special Stitches) in first st, 2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next st, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, 4 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in last st. Fasten off C. (19 sts)

Row 4: With C, rep row 2. Fasten off C.

Row 5: With RS facing and working in sts 2 rows below, join A with dtr (see Special Stitches) in first st, ch 1, tr in same st as join, tr in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 tr in each of next 2 sts, tr in next st, 2 tr in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 3 sts, tr in next st, (tr, ch 1, dtr) in last st. Fasten off A. (29 sts, 2 ch-1 sps)

Row 6: With A, rep row 2. Fasten off A.

Row 7: With RS facing and working in sts 2 rnds below, join B with tr in first st, ch 1, dc in same st as join, 2 hdc in next st, dc in next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, dc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, 3 hdc in next s

Row 8: With B, rep row 2. Fasten off B.

Row 9: With RS facing and working in sts 2 rows below, join E with dc in first st, ch

1, hdc in same st as join, (hdc, sc) in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 10 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each of next 10 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each of next 2 sts, (sc, hdc) in next st, (hdc, ch 1, dc) in last st. Fasten off E. (45 sts, 2 ch-1 sps)

Row 10: With E, rep row 2. Fasten off E.

Circle Motif


Make 82.

Rnd 1 (RS): With size H hook and F, ch 4, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring, ch 1, 8 sc in ring, join with sl st in first sc. (8 sc)

Rnd 2: SI st in each st around, work invisible join. Fasten off.

With WS facing, arrange all motifs as shown in assembly diagram. With E, and sewing on WS, whipstitch motifs tog. Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, with RS facing, working in sts and ends of rows, ch 1, *sc in end dec, sc in next ch sp, sc in next hdc, ch 2, [3 sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, sc in

side of next sc, ch 1] 7 times, 3 sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 2, sc in side of next sc, [sc in end of next row, 2 sc in end of next row, 3 sc in end of next row, sc in side of next sc] twice, sc in end of next row, sc in side of next sc, [3 sc in end of next row, 2 sc in

end of next row, sc in end of next row, sc in side of next sc] twice, ch 2, [3 sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, sc in side of next sc, ch 1] 7 times, ch 2, rep from * once, **join** in beg sc. Place markers in each ch-2 sp around.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each st and ch-1 sp



around with (sc, ch 2, sc) in each marked ch-2 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Finishing

Matching 7 sc between ch-1 sps on 1 Motif to ch-2 sps and 5 sc on 1 end of Body, sew tog.

Rep on other end of Body with rem Motif.

Trim

With RS facing, join in Motif at left side ch-1 sp closest to Body, ch 1, *sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in ch-1 sp on Motif and ch-2 sp on Body, working in back lps (see Stitch Guide), [sc each st across to next ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 1, sc) in next ch-2 sp] twice, sc in each st across to next ch-2 sp

before Motif, sc dec in ch-2 sp on Body and ch-1 sp on Motif, [sc in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, (sc, ch 1, sc) in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, rep from * once, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

I was watching a cooking show on television the other day, and I was very impressed—but not by the meal, as tasty as it looked. No—I was impressed by how little work the TV chef actually did. All the ingredients were premeasured and prepared by preproduction kitchen staff. All the chef did was to simply add them together and drink lots of sherry. Then, he popped the dish in the oven and immediately took out a hot, finished meal, prepared in advance by his crack team of flunkies.

Of course, people create crochet projects this way all the time. For instance, last week I wanted to make a prizewinning afghan, so I showed a photo of the desired finished product to my poorly paid and under-trained staff. They trotted off to my supply closet to search my stash. Since I have been less than attentive to how I stack yarn, it set me back 25 minutes while I waited for them to put all

those fallen skeins away again. The incompetence!

I finally had the yarn and hooks and such—but what's this? My junior assistant brought me seven skeins of yarn that came from sheep in Fulshear, Texas, instead of Brazos Valley, Texas. I'm glad I caught it in time; it could've ruined everything. I'll see she never works here again.

This afghan project had already become a lot of work, but I persevered. After the starting chain and a row of double crochet, the pattern called for a complicated color change—but no worries. My staff had prepared an exact finished copy of the afghan ahead of time, and I had lots of sherry available. So I just crocheted the first two rows, summoned my staff and before I knew it, I was smiling and holding up a perfect, professional-grade afghan with all the ends woven in and no visible knots. It couldn't have been easier! Of course, then I woke from my nap. \square
