FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS
Under Bust (including Buttonhole
Tab): $31 \frac{1}{2}$ inches (small) [ $331 / 2$ inches (medium), $351 / 2$ inches (large), $371 / 2$ inches ( $X$-large), $391 / 2$ inches ( $2 X$-large), $411 / 2$ inches ( $3 X$-large)]

## MATERIALS

- Patons Lace fine (sport) weight mohair/wool yarn (3 $0 z / 498 \mathrm{yds} / 85 \mathrm{~g}$ per ball):

3 [3, 4, 4, 4, 5] balls \#33427

> woodrose

- Sizes $\mathrm{F} / 5 / 3.75 \mathrm{~mm}$ and $\mathrm{G} / 6 / 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- $11 / 2$-inch button


## GAUGE

Size F hook: 7 mesh $=4$ inches; 2 dc and 1 sc rows $=1 \frac{1}{4}$ inches

Size G hook: 4 shells $=4$ inches; 3 shell rows $=11 / 4$ inches
Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Bottom of garment is worked in 1 piece from side to side, starting at bottom left front.

This is a close-fitting garment.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIALSTITCHES

Mesh: Ch 2, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch or st.

Shell: 5 dc as indicated in instructions.

## SWEATER

## Body

Row 1 (WS): With size F hook, ch 61 [61, 64, 64, 67, 67], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 9 chs (band), mesh (see Special Stitches) 14 [14, 15, 15, 16, 16] times, ch 7, sk next 7 chs, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in last ch, turn. ( $10 \mathrm{sc}, 14[14,15$, 15, 16, 16] mesh)

Row 2: ( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of first ch-3 sps (3 petals), ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, mesh $15[15,16,16,17$, 17] times, dc in each of last 9 sts, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 10 sts , mesh $16[16,17,17,18,18]$ times, ch 7 , sk next tr in next petal, (dc, $\{c h 3, d c\} 3$
times) in tr in center petal, turn.
Row 4: ( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of first ch-3 sps (3 petals), ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, mesh 17 [17, 18, 18, 19, 19] times, dc in each st across, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 10 sts , mesh $18[18,19,19,20,20]$ times, ch 7 , sk next tr in next petal, (dc, $\{c h 3, d c\} 3$ times) in tr in center petal, turn.
Row 6: ( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of first ch-3 sps (3 petals), ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, mesh 19 [19, 20, 20, 21, 21] times, dc in each st across, turn.
Row 7: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 10 sts, mesh $14[14,15,15,16,16]$ times, ch 7 , sk next 2 mesh and next ch sp, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in next dc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Next rows: [Rep rows 2-7] 14 [15, 16, 17, 18, 19] times.
Next row: Rep row 2.

## Buttonhole Tab

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, ch 4, sk next 4 sts (Buttonhole), sc in each of next 3 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, sc in each of next 4 chs, sc in each of next 3 sts , turn.
Rows 3 \& 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

## Bodice

Row 1: With RS facing and size G hook, working in ends of rows, evenly sp 96 [102, 108, 114, 120, 126] sc across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, leaving last 4 sts in Buttonhole Tab unworked, turn. (92 [98, 104, 110, 116, 122] sc)
Row 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), sk next st, shell (see Special Stitches) in next st, [sk next 2 sts, shell in next st] across, ending with sk next st, dc in last st, turn. ( 30 [ $32,34,36,38,40$ ] shells)

Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] across to last shell, sk last shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.

## Neck Shaping

Row 5: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] across to last shell, sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, sk next 2 sts , dc in last st, turn.
Row 6: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] across to last 4 sts, sk next 3 sts , dc in last st, turn.
Row 7: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] across to last shell, sk last shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.

## Left Front

Row 1: With WS facing, ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8$, 8] times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 3: Ch 3,2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8$,$] times, sk$ next shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same
shell, sk next 2 sts , dc in last st, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 6: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 7: Ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell $][5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 8: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 9: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.
Row 10: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 11: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 12: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times, sk last shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.
Row 13: Ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times, sk last shell, 3 dc in last st, turn.
Row 14: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times, $5 k$ next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 15: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$ times,
sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 16: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $2[3,3,4,5,5]$ times, sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, sk next 2 sts , dc in last st, turn.
Row 17: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $2[3,3,4,5,5]$ times, sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.

## Small Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## Medium, Large, X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [18]: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] [ $3,3,4,5,5$ ] times, sk first 4 sts of last shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.

## Medium Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## Large, X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [19]: Ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $[3,4,5,5]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.

## Large Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [20]: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $[4,5,5]$ times, sk next 3 sts, dc in last st, turn.

## X-Large Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [21]: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last
st of same shell] $[5,5]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st, leaving last st unworked, turn.

## 2X-Large Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## 3X-Large Size Only

Row [22]: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] [5] times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st. Fasten off.

## Back

Row 1: With WS facing and size G hook, sk next shell and first 4 sts of next shell from Left Front on row 7 of Body, join (see Pattern Notes) in last st of same shell, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] 11 [11, 13, 13, 13, 15] times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3, sk next st, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] 11 [11, 13, 13, 13, 15] times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] 11 [11, 13, 13, 13, 15] times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] for 14 [15, 16, 17, 18, 19] additional rows. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Right Front

Row 1: With WS facing and size G hook, sk next shell and first 4 sts of next shell from Back on row 7 of Body, join in last st of same shell, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell $] 5[6,6,7$, 8, 8] times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $6[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, leaving last st unworked, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3 , [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $5[6,6,7,8,8]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 7: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] 4 [5, 5, 6, 7, 7] times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 8: Ch 3, sk next 2 sts, shell in next st, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.

Row 9: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk first 4 sts of next shell, 3 dc in last st of same shell, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 10: Ch 3, sk next st, 3 dc in next st, [sk first 4 dc of next shell, shell in last dc of same shell] 4 [5, 5, 6, 7, 7] times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 11: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3 , [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, leaving last st unworked, turn.
Row 12: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch3 , [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $4[5,5,6,7,7]$ times, sk next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn.
Row 13: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk first 4 sts of next shell, shell in last st of same shell] $3[4,4,5,6,6]$

FINISHED SIZES
Instructions given fit woman's size small/medium; changes for large/Xlarge are in [ ].

## MATERIALS

- Drops Paris medium (worsted) weight cotton yarn ( $133 / 40 z / 82 \mathrm{yds} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ per ball): 1 ball each \#02 light turquoise, \#26 dark beige and \#16 white
- Sizes $\mathrm{G} / 6 / 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ and $\mathrm{H} / 8 / 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle
- White and turquoise sewing thread
- $7 / 8$-inch buttons: 2


## GAUGE

Size H hook: $15 \mathrm{sc}=4$ inches 18 sc rows $=4$ inches

Take time to check gauge.
Gauge not important for Flower.

## PATtERN NOTES

Work 1 round with each color consecutively in following order: dark beige, light turquoise and white.

For a nice transition between colors, change colors when you pick up yarn in last sl st on round, insert hook through chain from beginning of round, pick up new color, pull through chain and stitch on hook; continue next round with new color.
Do not fasten off after each color change; let the colors follow on the inside of Hat.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

Picot: Ch 1, sl st in top of last st made as indicated in instructions.

## HAT

Rnd 1: With size $H$ hook and dark beige, ch 4 , sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1 , 8 sc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc and change colors (see Pattern Notes) to light turquoise (see Pattern Notes). (8 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each st around, join in beg $s c$, changing to next color. ( 16 sc )
Rnd 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] around, join changing to next color. (24sc)

## gauge

Dogwood heather: 39 pattern sts = 8 inches
Green tea heather: 16 pattern sts = 4 inches
Wave heather: 35 pattern sts $=8$ inches
Row gauge is not important for this project.

## SPECIALSTITCHES

Hump single crochet (hump sc): After you turn your work, the back bar (see illustration) of sc appears in front, sc in back bar of $s c$.

## Beginning connected treble crochet-double crochet-single crochet (beg connected tr-dc-sc):

 Insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through st, [insert hook in next st, yo, pull Ip through st] twice, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, (dc, sc) in last st hook was inserted into.Connected treble crochet-double crochet-single crochet (connected tr-dc-sc): [Insert hook in next st, yo, pull Ip through st] 3 times, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, (dc, sc) in last st hook was inserted into.

Puff cross-stitch (puff cross-st): Sk next st, sc in next st, [insert hook in st just sk, yo, pull Ip through st, yo] twice, insert hook again in st just sk, yo, pull through all lps on hook.
Front slip stitch (front sl st): With yarn in back, insert hook from front to back through st as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through st and Ip on hook.
Back slip stitch (back sl st): With yarn in front, insert hook from back to front through st as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through st and Ip on hook.

## DOGWOOD HEATHER WASHCLOTH

Row 1: Ch 52 , sc in back bar (see illustration) of 2nd ch from hook, sc in back of each ch across, turn. ( 51 sc )

## MATERIALS

- Cascade Yarns Ultra Pima light (light worsted) weight cotton yarn ( 3 120z/220 yds $/ 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per hank):

1 hank each \#3716 dark brown, \#3717 khaki and \#3718 cream

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

$5 \mathrm{tr}=1$ inch; 1 tr row $=1$ inch

## PATTERN NOTE

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SCARF

Row 1: With dark brown, ch 27, working in back bar of ch (see illustration), tr in 5th ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (24 tr)


Back Bar of Chain

Rows 2-5: Ch 4 (see Pattern Note), tr in each of next 2 sts, [ch 4, sk next 4 sts, tr in each of next 3 sts] across, turn. (3 ch sps, 12 tr)
Row 6: Ch 4, tr in each st and in each ch across, changing colors (see Stitch Guide) to khaki in last st, turn. Fasten off dark brown.

Row 7: Ch 4, tr in each st across, turn.
Rows 8-11: Rep rows 2-5.
Row 12: Rep row 6, changing to cream in last st.
Next rows: Rep rows 7-12 consecutively in established color sequence until you have a total of 10 color blocks or until length desired. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing

When weaving in ends, use tapestry needle to run end through several sts, slip needle around 1 thread and then U-turn back along same path. When Scarf is stretched, yarn ends will not pop out.
Block wet scarf, pinning at each row edge to open out pattern. C!


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## BACKED BROOMSTICK LACE <br> BY LINDA DEAN

OFTEN the design of broomstick lace is appealing, but the openness is not appropriate for the item you are creating. The beauty of the stitch can often be lost by the lack of contrast between the yarn and the item under it. However, you can give new life to this classic by giving it a backdrop in which it can shine with a built-in backing stitcch. This stitch can be used as a border or edging on blankets, sleeve cuffs, accents on handbags, collars on coats and anywhere that you want some lace, but lace alone just won't work.

To start, evaluate how thick you want your finished piece and judge yarn accordingly. I usually do not use any yarn heavier than a light or sport weight, but mixing weights can often give you a unique product. Choose a hook suitable for the yarn and a knitting needle, I recommend a needle size no smaller than a U.S. size 19
( 15 mm ); the larger the needle the larger the "peacock" opening of the lace, and needles smaller than size 19 often make stitches that do not distinguish the "peacock" opening very well, if at all.

How to make a broomstick stitch: Pull loop through stitch and place over knitting needle (see illustration $A$ ), continue pulling loops through stitch and over needle until you reach the end of the row. *Insert hook through 5 loops on needle, yo and pull through all loops (see illustration B), chain 1 and place 5 single crochet in groups of loops (see illustration $C)^{*}$, repeat between * across.

Front row 1: Begin with the yarn used for the right side (broomstick side) of the piece. Chain in a multiple of 5 and work a row of broomstick stitches into the chain (See Photo 1).

Back row 1: Switching to con-trasting-color yarn, slip stitch in

first open loop on the beginning chain, chain 2 , double crochet in remaining loops of beginning chain. Back row 2: Note: This is your decision-making row; how you proceed is dependent upon your

row height and remaining height to the top of the front row. You will need to select which stitch fits. Below are the three options that will most likely fit your needs. (Photo samples shown use single crochet attached stitch.)

## Single crochet attached stitch

 (scatst): Chain 1, turn, insert into next stitch, yarn over, pull through a lp, insert hook into the closest lp of the top of the single crochet in Broomstick row (See Photo 2) yarn over, pull through all 3 lps onhook* (See Photo 3) continue across.
Half double crochet attached stitch (hdcatst): Chain 2, turn, yarn over, insert into next stitch, yarn over, pull through a lp, insert hook into the closest lp of the top of the single crochet in Broomstick row, yarn over, pull through all 4 lps on hook,* continue across.

## Double crochet attached

 Stitch (dcatst): Chain 3, turn, yarn over, insert into next st, yarn over pull through a lp, yarn over, pull through 2 lps , insert hook into theclosest lp of the top of the single crochet in Broomstick row, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook* continue across.

Front row 2: Switch to broomstick row, pick up lp from broomstick row below and complete broomstick stitch across row, working in the front lps of the row below.

Back row 3: Chain 3, double crochet in all stitches in back row.

Repeat the row sequence of front row 2, back row 3 and back row 2 until desired length.

Chain-1 at beginning of row counts as first single crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Broomstick stitch (broomstick st): Pull Ip through st and place over needle (see illustration A), continue pulling Ip through st and over needle until you reach end of row, [insert hook through 5 lps on needle (see illustration B), yo, pull though all lps, ch 1,5 sc in lps (see illustration C)] across.
Joined single crochet (joined sc):
[Insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through Ip, insert hook in closest Ip of top sc in broomstick row, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook] across.

## CLUTCH

Front row 1 (RS): With gold, ch 40, broomstick st (see Special Stitches) across. (8 groups of 5 lps)

Back row 1: Working on opposite side of beg ch on Front row 1, pull Ip of vanilla through Ip on hook, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each ch across, turn.
Back row 2: Ch 1 (see Pattern Notes), joined sc (see Special Stitches) across, turn.

Front row 2: Working in front row 1, with gold, broomstick st across, turn.
Back row 3: With vanilla, ch 3, dc in each st across back row 2, turn.

Back row 4: Rep back row 2.

Front rows 3-6 \& back
rows 5-12: [Rep front row 2]

4 times and [rep back rows 3 and 4 alternately] 4 times.
Front row 7: With gold, working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide) of front row 6 and front lp (see Stitch Guide) of back row 12 at same time, sc in each st across, turn. (40 sc)
Front row 8: Ch 3, dc in each st across, turn.

Front row 9: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Front rows 10-37: [Rep rows front row 8 and front row 9 alternately] 14 times.
Front row 38: Rep front row 8. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Fold front row 38 up to front row 9, working through both thicknesses, beg at fold and working from left to right, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) across, working across front row 38, reverse sc across, working through both thicknesses, reverse sc across to fold. Fasten off.
Working around flap, join (see Pattern Notes) gold in end of back row at top of sides, working from left to right, reverse sc around flap, ending on opposite side. Fasten off.

## INTRODUCTION TO JAPANESE CROCHET <br> BY EDIE ECKMAN

# DO THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR BEAUTIFUL JAPANESE CROCHET DESIGNS HAVE YOU STUMPED? OUR INTERESTING NEW TWOPART SERIES WILL HELP DE-MYSTIFY THESE PATTERNS AND GET YOU STARTED ON A NEW CROCHETING EXPERIENCE. 

## JAPANESE CROCHET FOR YOU <br> PART ONE

When you think of lovely silk kimonos and exquisite bonsai trees, you realize that the Japanese have a tradition of incorporating beautiful design into their everyday lives. But did you know that Japanese crochet is one of the most exciting elements of today's crochet universe? In both needlework design and technique, the Japanese have a lot to teach us about making lovely, functional and beautifully executed handwork.

In the next series of articles, we'll dip our toes into the world of Japanese crochet. You'll find that it may be easier than you thinkand you don't even need to know how to read Japanese!

## READING CHARTS

The first thing you'll notice about a Japanese crochet pattern is its very graphic nature. In other words, it has lots of charts and
diagrams, but few words. Fortunately, if you know how to read the charts and diagrams, you don't really need to understand the words.

One advantage of using charts is that it's easy to see the relationship of stitches to each other; you can immediately recognize, for instance, that a particular diagram is a symbol for a square motif. Let's stitch the chart, step-by-step. Try reading just the chart, following the text instructions only when you need a bit of extra help.

Let's start with the symbol charts, the most common type of crochet chart. Each symbol represents a crochet stitch, a representation of that stitch as it appears on the right side of the fabric. Note that the chain symbol looks a bit like a chain and that the slip stitch symbol looks like a closed up or tighter version of a chain stitch. Single, half double and double
crochet symbols are each increasingly taller, just as the real stitches are. The basic symbols can be grouped to form representations of more complex stitches. Every pattern should have a stitch key explaining each symbol used, so you won't have to memorize every one. When all the symbols are put together, they form a language you already know-crochet!

The relationship of the symbols to each other tells a story. Three double crochet symbols fanning out from a single point tell you that all three stitches are worked into the same base stitch. Symbols that slant tell you that's the way the stitches will lean when they are complete. If you are meant to put the hook into the stitch on the row below, the symbol will be directly over that stitch. If you are meant to put it between stitches or into a space, the symbol will be placed accordingly. There are unique symbols for "front/back
loop only" stitches and front/back post stitches.

Sometimes, the size or spacing of the stitches varies because the illustrator had to skew or stretch the symbols to get all of them to fit into the required shape and to show each stitch in its correct position relative to the other stitches. If the chart is especially large or complex, it may be abbreviated to show only a portion of the main stitch pattern, plus those parts of the pattern when a special or different technique is used. Different illustrators may use slightly differ-
ors. For patterns using more than one color, the row/round might be printed in that color, or it might be indicated with a color or letter symbol next to the number.

Try not to be overwhelmed by looking at the whole chart at once. You only have to read it one or two stitches at a time! Begin by glancing at the whole chart to get an idea of the shape of the piece and the types of stitches you will be using. Then, starting with the foundation chain or starting chain, work each stitch step-bystep, or work stitch group by stitch ent symbols to indicate a stitch, but you shouldn't find it difficult to understand the slight changes, in the same way that you recognize that "a" and " A " are the same letter.

Turning chains are shown at the beginning of alternate rows (on pieces worked back and forth), with the row numbers and perhaps directional arrows printed on the side where the row begins. The chart may have highlighting or lines to show a stitch repeat, corresponding to the *do this; rep from * or [do this] this many times as in written instructions. Sometimes alternating rows are printed in different col-

group. If you have trouble focusing on just part of the chart, try covering the parts you haven't yet worked with plain paper or sticky notes. Take a little time to practice stitching the chart provided here.

In future articles, we'll learn a few useful Japanese characters and explore more about Japanese technique and design.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sk next 2 sts, (dc, ch $5, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next st, sk next 2 sts**, sc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc.
Rnd 3: Ch 3, *sc in next ch-5 sp**, (dc, ch $5, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next $s c$, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, dc in same st as beg ch3 , ch 5 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnds 4-30: Rep rnd 3.

## Body

Row 31: Now working in rows, ch 3, [sc in next ch-5 sp, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next sc] around, (dc, ch 2, dc) in same st as beg ch-3, do not join, turn.

Row 32: Ch 1, sc in first st, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next sc, [sc in next ch-5 sp, (dc, ch 5, dc) in next sc] across, turn.
Row 33: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch- 5 , sc in next ch- 5 sp, [(dc, ch 5, dc) in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with (dc, ch 2, dc) in last st, turn.
Rows 34-101: [Rep rows 32 and 33 alternately] 34 times.

## 2nd Sleeve

Rnd 102: Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc in first st, ${ }^{*}(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 5, \mathrm{dc})$ in next $\mathrm{sc}{ }^{* *}$, sc in center of next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg $s c$, do not turn.

Rnd 103: Ch 3, sc in center of next ch-5 sp, [(dc, ch 5, dc) in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp] around, ending with dc in same st as beg ch-3, ch 5 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnds 104-131: Rep rnd 103.
Rnd 132: Ch 3, dc in next dc, [ 5 dc in next ch-5 sp, sk next dc, dc in next sc, sk next dc] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
( 102 [102, 114, 114, 126, 126] dc)

## Small \& Medium Sizes Only

Rnd 133: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide), ch 3, [dc in each of next $10 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc] 8 times, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd [133]: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide), ch 3, [dc in each of next 26 sts, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] 4 times, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ([110] dc)

Rnd [133]: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide), ch 3, [dc in each of next 5 sts, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] 16 times, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ([110] dc)

## All Sizes

Rnd 134: Working in back lps, ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnds 135 \& 136: Rep rnd 134.

## 2nd-Sleeve Border

Rnd 137: Working in back lps, ch 3, dc in each of next 12 dc , *ch 4 , sk next 4 dc , sm shell (see Special Stitches) in next dc, ch 4, sk next 4 sts**, dc in each of next 13 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (5 sm shells)
Rnd 138: SI st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 10 dc , ${ }^{*}$ ch 4 , sk next dc and next
ch-4 sp, sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 2, 3-dc cl (see Special Stitches) in same ch $s p$ as last sm shell, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp and next $\mathrm{dc}^{* *}$, dc in each of next 11 dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 139: Sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 8 dc , *sk next dc and next ch-4 sp, sm shell in ch $s p$ of next $s m$ shell, ch $2, \mathrm{sm}$ shell in next ch-2 sp, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp and next $\mathrm{dc}^{* *}$, dc in each of next 9 dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 140: Sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 6 dc , *sk next dc and next ch-4 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{sm}$ shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch
2, Ig shell (see Special Stitches) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2 , sm shell in ch $s p$ of next sm shell, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp and next dc**, dc in each of next 7 dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 141: Sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 4 dc , *ch 4 , sk next dc and next ch-4 sp, sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 2,7 dc in ch sp of next $\lg$ shell, ch 2, sm shell in ch $s p$ of next sm shell, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp and next dc**, dc in each of next 5 dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 142: Sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next 2 dc , *ch 4, sk next dc and next ch-4 sp, sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 2 , sk next ch-2 sp, [dc in next dc, ch 2] 7 times, sk next ch-2 sp, sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp and next $\mathrm{dc}^{* *}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 3 dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{*}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 143: Sl st in next dc, ch 1 , sc in same dc as sl st, *ch 2, sk next dc and next ch-4 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{sm}$ shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp and next dc, [ 3 -dc cl in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] 6 times, ch 2, sk next dc and next ch-2 sp , sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, ch 2, sk next ch-4 sp and next dc**, sc in next dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc.
Rnd 144: Sl st in each of next 2 chs , sl st in next $s \mathrm{~cm}$ cl, sl st in next ch- 2 sp , sm shell in same ch sp as last sl st, ${ }^{*}$ ch 4 , sk next ch-2 sp and next $3-\mathrm{dc}$ cl, [5-dc cl (see

Special Stitches) in next ch-2 sp, ch 4] 5 times, $s k$ next ch-2 $2 p, s m$ shell in ch $s p$ of next sm shell, sk next ch-2 $s p$, next sc and next ch-2 sp**, sm shell in ch sp of next sm shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in top of first sm shell.

Rnd 145: Sl st across to first ch-4 sp, ch 3, picot shell (see Special Stitches) in each ch-4 sp around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

Rnd [1]: Working in starting ch on opposite side of rnd 1 on First Sleeve, join in first ch, ch 3 , [dc in each of next 26 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times, $d$ c in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ([110] dc)

(1 sc, 2 ch-6 sps, $4 d c$, 4 shells)
Row 3: Ch 3, sk next dc, shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, ch 7, sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in
next sc, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell, shell in sp before last 2 sts , dc in last st, turn. (2dc, $3 \mathrm{sc}, 4$ shel/s)
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, ch 6 , sc in next ch- 6 sp , sc in each of next 3 sc, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next shell, shell in $s p$ before next shell, 2 dc in last st , turn. (2 shell, $4 d c, 5 \mathrm{sc}$ )

Row 5: Ch 3, sk next dc, shell in sp before next shell, ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in each of next 5 sc , sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next shell, shell in sp before last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. ( $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2$ shells, 7 sc )
Row 6: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, ch 6 , $s c$ in next ch- 6 sp , sc in each of next 7 sc, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, 2 dc in last st, turn. ( $4 d c, 9 \mathrm{sc}$ )
Row 7: Ch 3, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in each of next 7 sc , ch 6, sk next $s c$, shell in next ch-6 sp, dc in last st, turn. (2dc, 2 shells, 7 sc)
Row 8: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in each of next 5 sc , ch 6 , shell in ch- $6 \mathrm{sp}, 2$ dc in last st, turn. (2 shells, $4 d c, 5 \mathrm{sc}$ )
Row 9: Ch 3, sk next dc, shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, ch 6, shell in next ch-6 sp, sk next shell, shell in sp before last 2 sts , dc in last st , turn. ( $2 d c, 3 s c, 4$ shells)
Row 10: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 6, shell in next ch-6 sp, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, 2 dc in last st, turn. (1 sc, $4 d c, 4$ shells)


Row 11: Ch 3, sk next dc, [shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell] twice, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 13 , shell in next ch-6 sp, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell, shell in $s p$ before last 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (1 ch sp, 2 dc , 6 shells)

Rows 12-91: [Rep rows 2-11 consecutively] 8 times.
Rows 92-100: Rep rows 2-10.
Row 101: Ch 3, sk next dc, [shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell] twice, shell in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, shell in next ch-6 sp, sk next shell, shell in sp before next shell, sk next shell, shell in $s p$ before last 2 sts, dc in last st. Fasten off. (1 ch-6 sp, $2 d c, 6$ shells)

## Underarm Panels

Place marker at each end of rows 35 and 66 on each Side Panel.

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, working in ends of rows, join (see Pattern Notes) in bottom right-hand corner of 1 Side Panel, work beg linked dc (see Special Stitches), evenly sp 69 linked dc (see Special Stitches) across to marker, turn. (70 linked dc)

Rows 2-8 [2-10, 2-12, 2-14, 2-16, 2-20]: Beg linked dc, linked dc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.
Rep Underarm Panel across left-hand side edge of rem Side Panel.

## Center Back Panel

Rows 1-40: Beg at back bottom edge, rep rows 1-40 of Side Panel.

Row 41: Rep row 101 of Side Panel, at end of row, do not fasten off.

## Side Edging

Row 1 (RS): Working in ends of rows, beg linked dc, evenly sp 84 linked dc across side edge of Center Back Panel, turn.

## Small Size Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## Medium, Large, X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row (s) [2, 2 \& 3, 2 \& 3, 2-4, 2-4]: Beg linked dc, linked dc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.
Rep Side Edging on rem side edge of Center Back Panel.

## Assembly

Fold each Side Panel in half.
Whipstitch last row of Underarm Panel to corresponding rows of top half of same Side Panel.
Rep on rem Side Panel.
With bottom edges aligned, whipstitch Center Back Panel to inside edges of Side Panels.

## Sleeve

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS facing, join with sc in center bottom of armhole at top edge of Underarm Panel, ch 3, evenly sp [sk sp of one st, sc in edge of armhole opening, ch 3$] 24[25,25,26,28,30]$ times around opening, do not join. Mark first st of rnd, moving marker up as work progresses.

Rnds 2-20: (Ch 3, sc) in each ch-3 sp around.

Rnd 21: Evenly sp 72 [72, 76, 80, 84, 92] sc around.

Rnds 22-24: [Fpsc (see Stitch Guide) around each of next 2 sc , bpsc (see Stitch Guide) around each of next 2 sc ] around. At end of last rnd, join in beg fpsc. Fasten off.
Rep Sleeve in rem armhole.

## Trim

Row 1 (WS): With WS facing, working in ends of rows, join in bottom left-hand corner of left front edge, beg linked dc, evenly sp 244 linked dc across left front, back neck edge and down right front edge to bottom of right-hand corner st on right front, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [sk next 3 sts, shell in next st] across, turn. (62 shells)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Do not fasten off.

## Ribbing

Rnd 1 (RS): Now working in rnds, ch 1, 2 sc in each of first 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts before next corner, 2 sc in each of first 2 sts, evenly sp 251 [257, 265, $273,281,289$ ] sc across bottom edge, do not join. Mark first st of rnd, moving marker up as work progresses.
Rnds 2-4: [Fpsc around each of next 2 sts, bpsc around each of next 2 sts] around. At end of last rnd, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

After rnd $4=51 / 4$ inches at widest point; 4 inches across 1 side edge

## Pentagon Motif:

After rnd $2=3$ inches at widest point
After rnd $3=41 / 2$ inches at widest point; 3 inches across 1 side edge
After rnd $4=53 / 4$ inches at widest point; 4 inches across 1 side edge

Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Motifs are worked in joined rounds with right side always facing.
X-Small, Small, Medium \& Large sizes have 1 Square Motif at the front and back sections and for top of each shoulder/ armhole section. X-Large, 2X-Large \& $3 X$-Large have 2 Square Motifs at front and back sections and 1 for top of shoulder/armhole section. Four Pentagon Motifs form the raglan shaping points of Yoke for all sizes.

With stitches that are as open as this, simply working over loose ends at each color change will not be secure enough. Leave long enough ends at beginning and end each time you change colors to thread into a tapestry needle and weave in securely. Weaving in ends as you work also keeps the rounds neater and easier to read.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-7 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-4 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Shell: (3dc, ch 5, 3 dc ) as indicated in instructions.
V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 2, dc) as indicated in instructions.

Picot: Ch 4, sc in 4th ch from hook.
Corner to Corner Motif Join: Hold Motifs with RS facing, side by side, with previous Motif on right and working Motif on left. At corner to be joined, work first sc in corner ch sp, ch 2, sc in corresponding corner ch sp of previous Motif, inserting hook from front to back, ch 2, sc in same corner ch sp of working Motif to complete corner. [Ch 2, sc in next ch sp of previous Motif, ch 2, sc in next ch sp of working Motif] 3 times, ch 2, sc in next corner ch sp of previous Motif, ch 2, sc in same corner ch sp of working Motif to complete corner, continue same as rnd 5.

## LACE PATTERN

Getting started: Lace Pattern is worked in rnds and in a 2-rnd rep-a WS rnd of picots and RS rnd of V-sts. Working picots on WS makes them pop to outside.
Picot rnd (WS): Ch 1, (sc, picot—see Special Stitches, sc) in beg st, ch 7, [(sc, \{picot, sc\} twice) in ch-2 sp of next V-st, ch 7] around, (sc, picot) in same ch sp as beg sc, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc, turn.
V-st rnd (RS): Ch 7 (see Pattern Notes),
sc in next ch-7 sp, ch 4, [sk next sc and next picot, V-st (see Special Stitches) in next sc between picots, ch 4, sc in next ch-7 sp, ch 4] around, dc in same sc as beg ch-7, ch 1 , sc in 3rd ch of beg ch forming beg $V$-st, turn.

## MOTIFS

## Square Motif

Rnd 1: With A, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in ring, [ch 5, 3 dc in ring] 3 times, ch 2, join with dc in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3 forming last ch sp . (4 ch-5 sps)
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, [ch 5, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 3 dc, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, ch 5, dc dec in next 3 dc , ch 5 , join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off. (8 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 3: Join B in any $s c$, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg ch-3, *sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp**, shell (see Special Stitches) in next sc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, ch 2, join with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 forming last ch sp. Fasten off. (4 corner ch-5 sps, 1 ch-5 sp between corners)
Rnd 4: Join C in ch-5 sp of any shell, ch 3, 2 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-3, *dc in next sc, ch 5 , sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, dc in next $s c^{* *}$, shell in ch-5 sp of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch sp as beg ch-3, ch 5 , join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 corner ch-5 sps, 2 ch-5 sps between each corner ch sp)

Rnd 5: Join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch $5^{* *}$, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next corner ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 5 , $s c$ in same ch $s p$ as joining sc, ch 5, join in joining sc. Fasten off. (4 corner ch sps with 2 ch-5 sps between corners)

## Pentagon Motif

Rnd 1: With A, ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), 2 tr in ring, [ch 5, 3 tr in ring] 4 times, ch 2, join with dc in 4th ch of beg ch-4 forming last ch $s p$, (5 ch-5 sps)
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same ch $s p$ as beg ch1 , ${ }^{*}$ ch 5 , dc dec in next 3 tr , ch $5^{* *}$, sc in
next ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (10 (h-5 sps)
Rnd 3: Join B in any $s c$, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg ch-3, *sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, $s c$ in next ch- $5 \mathrm{sp}^{* *}$, shell in next sc , rep from * around, ending last rep at **, 3 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, ch 2 , join with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 forming last ch sp . Fasten off. (5 corner ch-5 sps with 1 ch-5 sp between corners)
Rnd 4: Join C in ch-5 sp of any shell, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch sp as beg ch-3, *dc in next sc, ch 5 , sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5 , dc in next $s c^{* *}$, shell in ch $s p$ of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch sp as beg ch-3, ch 5, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. ( 5 corner ch sps with 2 ch-5 sps between corners)

Rnd 5: Join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch $5^{* *}$, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next corner ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, sc in same ch sp as joining sc, ch 5, join in joining sc. Fasten off.

## TOP

## Motif Yoke

Getting Started: A ring of Square and Pentagon Motifs is worked first. The Motifs are connected to each other when working rnd 5, using Corner to Corner Motif Join technique.

The neckline is worked around top of Motif ring. Then the rem of the Yoke is worked from the lower edge of Motif ring downward to armholes. The piece is then divided, and the Body and Sleeves worked separately, from lower edge of Yoke downward.

## X-Small, Small, Medium \& Large Sizes Only

Make 4 Square Motifs and 4 Pentagon Motifs complete through rnd 4.
Following Assembly Diagram and as instructed below, finish each Motif with rnd 5, connecting Motifs to each other as you go, moving clockwise, until 8 Motifs are joined in ring for Yoke.

With RS Facing, join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5, sc in next corner ch-5 sp, connect next side to previous Pentagon Motif using Corner to Corner Motif Join, complete rnd 5 in established pattern. Fasten off.

## 4th-7th Motifs

Connect Pentagon Motif (4th), Square Motif (5th), Pentagon Motif (6th) and Square Motif (7th) in same manner as 2nd and 3rd Motifs.

## 8th Motif (Pentagon)

With RS facing, join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5 , sc in next corner ch- 5 sp, connect next side to previous Square, work md 5 across to next side (neckline), connect to side of First Motif, complete rnd 5 in pattern. Fasten off.

## X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Sizes Only

Make 6 Square Motifs and 4 Pentagon Motifs complete through rnd 4.
Following Assembly Diagram and as instructed below, finish each Motif with rnd 5 , using Corner to Corner Motif Join technique, connecting to each other as you go, working clockwise, until 10 Motifs are joined in ring for Yoke.


## First Motif (Square)

Complete through rnd 5 without joining.

## 2nd Motif (Square)

With RS facing, join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5 , sc in next corner ch- 5 sp, connect next side to previous Square using Corner to Corner Motif Join (see Special Stitches), complete rnd 5 in established pattern. Fasten off.

## 3rd Motif (Pentagon)

With RS facing, join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp]
twice, ch 5 , sc in next corner ch-5 sp, connect next side to previous Square using Corner to Corner Motif Join, complete rnd 5 in established pattern. Fasten off.

## 4th-9th Motifs

Connect Square Motif (4th), Pentagon Motif (5th), Square Motif (6th), Square Motif (7th), Pentagon Motif (8th), Square Motif (9th) in same manner.

## 10th Motif (Pentagon)

With RS facing, join MC with sc in any corner ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5, sc in next corner ch-5 sp, connect next side to previous Square using Corner to Corner Motif Join, work rnd 5 across to next side (neckline), connect to side of First Motif, complete rnd 5 in pattern. Fasten off.

## Neckline

## All Sizes

Getting Started: To make fitting easier and more accurate, finish the slightly gathered neckline before continuing with Yoke Edging and Body. See Pattern Notes and Assembly Diagram for positioning of Motifs in reference to body.

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS facing, at neck edge of Motif Yoke, working clockwise, sk side of 1 shoulder Square Motif, sk side of 1 Pentagon Motif, join MC in sc row edge at center of next Motif joining, insert hook under 2 strands of sc row edge each time you work into join, ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), *sk rem ch sp of corner join, sc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 2 , sk rem ch sp of corner join, V-st (see Special Stitches) in sc row edge at center of join, ch 2, rep from * across next $6[6,6,6,8,8,8]$ Motif edges, sk rem ch sp of corner join, sc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 5 , sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 2, sk rem ch sp of corner join, dc in same sc row edge as beg ch -5 , ch 1 , join with sc in 3 rd ch of beg ch-5 forming ch sp of first V -st. ( $8[8,8,8,10,10,10] V$-sts, $16[16,16,16$, 20, 20, 20] (h-5 sps)
Rnd 2: Ch 5, *sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5 , sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp**, V-st in ch sp of next V-st, ch 2, rep from * around, ending last rep at
**, dc in same ch sp as beg ch-5, ch 1 , sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5 forming first V-st.
Rnd 3: Ch 1 , sc in last ch sp formed, *4 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, 4 dc in next sc , sk next ch-2 sp**, sc in next ch sp of next V -st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. Fasten off.
(16 [16, 16, 16, 20, 20, 20] dc groups)

## Yoke Edging

Getting Started: The 4 Pentagon Motifs of Yoke have 1 lower corner ch-5 sp that is left free. These 4 points become raglan corners of Yoke, mark these corners and move markers up as you work into the sp or $s t$ at center of each corner.

## X-Small \& Small Sizes Only

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS facing, join MC with sc in ch-5 sp at point of any Pentagon Motif, work the following steps to complete rnd:
A. Ch 5;
B. [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 3 times across side of Pentagon Motif, sc in rem ch $s p$ of next Motif join, ch 5, sk sc row edge in center of join, ch 5 , sc in rem ch sp of Motif join of next Motif, ch 5;
C. rep step B across side of Square Motif;
D. [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 3 times across side of Pentagon Motif, ( sc , ch 5, sc) in next marked corner ch-5 sp;
E. rep steps A-D twice;
F. rep steps A-C once, [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 3 times across side of Pentagon Motif;
G. sc in same corner ch sp as joining sc, ch 2, dc in joining sc forming last ch sp. (60 ch-5 sps)

## Medium Size Only

Rnd [1]: With RS of Yoke facing, join MC in ch-5 sp at point of any Pentagon Motif, working across Body section, work the following steps to complete the rnd:
A. Ch 1, ( $s c$, ch $5, ~ s c)$ in same ch sp as beg ch-1;
B. *ch 5;
C. [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 3 times across side of Pentagon Motif, sc in rem

- Size $\mathrm{E} / 4 / 3.5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

18 sts $=4$ inches; 24 rows $=4$ inches
Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Pattern is worked in continuous rounds, do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.

Placing stitch markers makes it easy to see increase and decrease points rather than counting stitches each time. Move each stitch marker to corresponding stitch in next row. When working an increase at
stitch marker, move stitch marker to 2nd stitch of increase.
When changing colors, always change in last stitch made and do not fasten off onyx.
Each topaz round is worked in front loops only of previous round and each onyx round that follows is worked in back loops of that same previous round.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## TOP

## Yoke

Rnd 1: With onyx, ch 128 [140, 144, 152], sl st in first ch to form ring being careful not to twist ch, working in back bar of ch (see illustration), sc in each ch around, do not join (see Pattern Notes). (128 [140, 144, 152] sc)


Back Bar of Chain
Rnd 2: Mark first st (see Pattern Notes), sc in each st around.

Rnd 3: Sc in each st around, changing colors (see Pattern Notes and Stitch Guide) to topaz, do not fasten off onyx (see Pattern Notes).
Rnd 4: Working in front Ips (see Stitch Guide), reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st around, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg reverse sc. Fasten off topaz.

Rnd 5: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide) of rnd 3, pick up onyx, sc in each of first 3 sts on rnd 3,2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next st] around, do not join. (160 [175, 180, 190] sc) Rnds 6-8: Rep rnds 2-4.
Rnd 9: Working in back lps on rnd before last, with onyx, sc in each st around.
Rnds 10-12: Rep rnds 2-4.
Rnd 13: Working in back lps on rnd before last, with onyx, sc in each of first 4 sts, 2 sc in next $s t$, [sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (192 [210, 216, 228] sc)
Rnds 14 \& 15: [Rep rnd 2] twice
Rnd 16: Rep rnd 3.
Rnds 17 \& 18: Rep rnds 4 and 9.
Rnds 19-21: Rep rnds 14-16.
Rnd 22: Rep rnd 4.
Rnd 23: Working in back lps on rnd before last, with onyx, sc in each of first 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next $5 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next st] around. ( 224 [ $245,252,266]$ sc)
Rnds 24-26: Rep rnds 14-16.
Rnds 27 \& 28: Rep rnds 4 and rnd 9.
Rnds 29-31: [Rep rnd 2] 3 times.
Rnd 32: Rep rnd 3.
Rnd 33: Rep rnd 4.

## Small \& Medium Sizes Only

At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Large \& X-Large Sizes Only

Rnd [34]: Working in back lps on rnd before last, with onyx, sc in each of next

9 [10, 11, 12, 14] balls \#0005 blue bird

- Sizes $\mathrm{G} / 6 / 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ and $\mathrm{H} / 8 / 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Shawl pin (optional)
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Size G hook: 3 pattern reps $=4$ inches
Take time to check gauge.

## Pattern notes

Body is worked in 1 piece, from lower edge up to armhole. Piece is then divided, and fronts and back are worked separately
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIALSTITCHES

Fan: 5 dc as indicated in instructions.
Shell: (3 dc, ch 1,3dc) as indicated in instructions.

## Shell pattern

Note: Shell Pattern is worked in multiple of 6 sts plus 1.
Row 1 (RS): Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), shell (see Special Stitches) in each ch-2 sp across, ch 1 , dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 4, sk first ch-1 sp, [fan (see Special Stitches) in ch sp of next shell, ch 2] across to last shell, fan in ch sp of last shell, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 3: Ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, shell in each ch- 2 sp across, 3 dc in 3 rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3 (counts as $1 / 2$ fan), ch 2 , [fan in ch sp of next shell, ch 2] across, ending with 3 dc in top of turning ch ( $1 / 2$ fan), turn.

Rep rows 1-4 consecutively for Shell Pattern.

## JACKET

## Body

Foundation row (RS): With size G hook, ch 158 [170, 182, 194, 206], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn.
(157 [169, 181, 193, 205] sc)
Rows 1-4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3, 2 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, [ch 2 , sk next 5 sc , fan in next sc] across to last 6 sc , ch 2 , sk next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in last sc , turn. $(26[28,30,32,34]$ ch-2 sps)
Next rows: Beg with row 1 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern until piece measures 18 [ $18,181 / 2,181 / 2,19]$ inches from beg, ending with row 4 WS of pattern.

## Armholes

## First Front

Row 1 (RS): Ch 4, shell in each of next 6 [7,7,8,8] ch-2 sps, ch 1, dc in center dc of next fan, leaving rem sts unworked for Armholes, Back and 2nd Front, turn. (6 [7, 7, 8, 8] pattern reps)
Next rows: Beg with row 2 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern over front sts only until Armhole measures $6[61 / 2,7$, $71 / 2,8]$ inches from beg of Armholes, ending with row 3 on RS of Shell Pattern.

## Shoulder Shaping

Next row (WS): Ch 3, 2 dc in same st as

beg ch-3, ch 2, [fan in ch-1 sp of next shell, ch 2] $1[2,2,3,3]$ time(s), 3 dc in ch- 1 sp of next shell, leaving rem sts unworked for Front neck, turn. (2 [3, 3, 4, 4] pattern reps)
Next rows: Beg with row 1 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern over Shoulder sts only until Shoulder measures 2 inches.
At end of last row, fasten off.

## Back

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk next unworked ch-2 sp following First Front (Armhole), with size G hook, join (see Pattern Notes) in center dc of next fan, ch 4, shell in each of next 12 [12, 14, 14, 16] ch-2 sps, ch 1, dc in center dc of next fan, leaving rem sts unworked for 2nd Armhole and 2nd Front, turn. (12 [12, 14, 14, 16] pattern reps)
Next rows: Beg with row 2 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern across back sts only until piece measures same as First Front. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Front

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk next unworked ch-2 sp following Back (Armhole), with size G hook, join in center dc of next fan, ch 4, shell in each rem ch-2 sp across, ch 1 , dc in top of turning ch, turn. (6 [7, 7, 8, 8] pattern reps)
Next rows: Beg with row 2 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern over front sts only until Armhole measures $6[6 / 12,7,71 / 2,8]$ inches, ending with row 3 on RS of pattern.

## Shoulder Shaping

Next row (WS): SI st in each st across to ch-1 sp of 4th shell for Front neck, (sl st, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in ch-1 sp, ch 2 , fan in ch- 1 sp of each rem shell across, 3 dc in top of turning ch, turn. ( $2[3,3,4,4]$ pattern reps)
Next rows: Beg with row 1 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern over Shoulder sts only until Shoulder measures 2 inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Sleeve

## Make 2.

Foundation row: With size G hook, ch 38 [ $38,44,44,50]$,
sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across, turn. (37[37, 43, 43, 49] sc)
Rows 1-12: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 13: Ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same sc as beg ch-3, [ch 2 , sk next 5 sc , fan in next sc] across to last 6 sc , ch 2 , sk next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in last sc , turn. ( $6[6,7,7,8]$ ch-2 sps)

Next rows: Beg with row 1 of Shell Pattern, work in Shell Pattern for 7 rows (last row worked should be row 3 of Shell Pattern).

## Sleeve Shaping

Note: The Sleeves are shaped using 2 inc methods. In the first, additional chs are added between the fans or shells. In the 2nd, chs continue to be added and additional dc are worked at beg and ends of rows.

## First Set of Inc

Row 1 (inc): Ch 3, 2 dc in same dc as beg ch-3, ch 2, [fan in ch-1 sp of next shell, ch 3] across to last shell, fan in ch-1 sp of last shell, ch 2, 3 dc in top of turning ch, turn.
Note: Notice that there are more chs between the fans in this row. This is what creates inc.
Row 2: Ch 4, [shell in next ch-sp, ch 1] across to last ch-sp, shell in last ch-sp, ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$ in top of turning ch, turn.
Row 3: Ch 4, sk first ch-sp, [fan in ch-1 sp of next shell, ch 3] across to last shell, fan in ch-1 sp of last shell, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in same dc as beg ch-3, ch 1 , sk first ch-sp, [shell in next ch-sp, ch 2] across, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in 3 rd ch of turning ch, turn.

## 2nd Set of Inc

Row 5 (inc): Ch 3, 2 dc in same dc as beg ch-3, dc in next dc, ch 2, [fan in ch-1 sp of next shell, ch 4] across to last shell, fan in ch-1 sp of last shell, ch 2, sk next dc, dc in next dc, 2 dc in top of turning ch, turn.
Row 6: Rep row 2, working 1 more dc at beg and end of row, and 1 more ch between shells.
Row 7: Rep row 3, working 1 more dc at beg and end of row, and 1 more ch between fans.
Row 8: Rep row 4, working 1 more dc at
beg and end of row, and 1 more ch before first shell, 1 more ch between shells and 1 more ch after last shell.
Row 9 (inc): Rep row 5, working 1 more dc at beg and end of row and 1 more ch between fans.
Next rows: Rep rows 6-9 consecutively until piece measures $171 / 2[171 / 2,18,18$, $181 / 2]$ inches from beg, ending with row 6 or 8. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Collar

## Mesh Base

Foundation row: With size H hook, ch 84 [84, 84, 86, 86], dc in 6th ch from hook (first 5 chs counts as dc and ch 1), [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch] across, turn. (40 [40, 40, 41, 41] ch-1 sps, 41 [41, 41, 42, 42] dc)
Rows 1-7: Ch 4, sk first ch-1 sp, [dc in next dc, ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp] across, dc in 4th ch of turning ch, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Lazy-J Motif

## Make 12 for Collar \& 6 for Sleeve Cuffs.

Note: All rows in this Motif are worked with the RS facing, do not turn at the ends of rows.
Row 1 (RS): With size G hook, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, 2 hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, 2 dc in next ch, 3 tr in last ch, do not turn. (12 sts)
Row 2: Working in front Ips (see Stitch Guide), from left to right, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st across, do not turn.
Row 3: Working in rem back Ips (see Stitch Guide) of row 1 , sc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, dc in each of next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next $s t$, $t r$ in each of last 2 sts , do not turn. (14 sts)
Row 4: Rep row 2.
Row 5: Rep row 3, leaving sts at the end of the row unworked.
Row 6: Rep row 2.
Rows 7 \& 8: Rep rows 5 and 6 .

At end of last row, fasten off.

## Small Flowers

## Make 11 for Collar \& 2 for Sleeve Cuffs.

Rnd 1: With size G hook, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1,10 sc in ring, join in first sc. (10 sc)

Rnd 2: [Ch 2, 3 dc in next st, ch 2, sl st in next st] 5 times, join in same st as join of previous rnd. Fasten off. ( 5 petals)
Sew Motifs and Flowers to Collar as shown in photo. Do not sew Motifs to Sleeves at this time.

## Finishing

Sew Shoulder seams.
Fold Sleeve in half, place fold at Shoulder seam and edges of top of Sleeve at underarms. Sew in place.
Rep for rem Sleeve. Sew Sleeve seams.

## Border

Getting Started: To aid in spacing first row of Border sts, place markers as follows:
Place 3 markers evenly sp across each Front edge, dividing the Front edges into 4 equal-length sections.
Place another marker at center Back neck.
Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, join in lower Front corner to work up Front edge, remove markers as you work this row, *evenly sp $20[20,21,21,22]$ sc to next
marker, rep from * twice, evenly sp $20[20,21,21$, 22] sc across to top Front corner, 3 sc in corner, evenly sp $30[30,31,31$, 32] sc across Front neck edge, evenly sp 25 [25, 26, 26,27] sc across to marker at center Back neck, evenly sp $25[25,26,26,27]$ sc across remainder of Back neck, evenly sp 30 [30, 31,31,32] sc across other Front neck edge, 3 sc in corner, **evenly sp 20 [20, $21,21,22$ ] sc across to next marker, rep from ** twice, evenly sp 20 [20, 21, 21,22] sc across to lower Front corner, turn.
Place 10 markers evenly sp around entire neck edge. Move markers up as row 2 is worked.
Row 2: Sc in each st up Front edge, work 3 sc in center sc of 3-sc corner, [sc in each st across to next marker, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] 10 times, sc in each sc across to end of neck edge, work 3 sc in center sc of 3-sc corner, sc in each st down front edge, turn.
Row 3: Rep row 2, removing markers as you work. Fasten off.

## Attach Collar

Mark center Back neck. Mark center of

Collar. Pin Collar in place, matching center Back markers and pinning ends of Collar to Front edges, easing to fit. Sew Collar in place.

## Attach Motifs

Arrange Motifs on Sleeves as shown in photo or as desired, and sew in place.

## Block

If blocking is desired, lay garment flat on a padded surface. Spray with water and pat into shape. Allow piece to dry. Do not iron. C!

Rnd 1: Holding 2 strands tog (see Pattern Notes), ch 35, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (first 2 chs count as first hdc) and in each of next 31 chs, 4 hdc in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, hdc in each of next 31 chs, 2 hdc in next ch, join (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg ch-2. (70 hdc)

Rnd 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next 30 hdc, 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc, hdc in each of next $30 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 2 hdc, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (78 hdc)
Rnd 3: Ch 2, hdc in each of next $2 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next $31 \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next $4 \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next $31 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in last hdc, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (86 hdc)

Rnd 4: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next 32 hdc, 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc, hdc in each of next $7 \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{hdc}$ in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next 32 hdc , 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of last 2 hdc , join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (94 hdc)


Rnd 5: Ch 2, hdc in each of next $5 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 3 hdc , hdc in each of next $35 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in each of next $8 \mathrm{hdc}, 2$ hdc in each of next 3 hdc , hdc in each of next 35 hdc , 2 hdc in each of next 2 hdc , hdc in last 2 hdc, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (104 hdc)

## Sides

1 skein each \#1 white (B), \#350 dark linen (C) and \#870 cornflower blue (D)

- Size $I / 9 / 5.5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread to match
- 7-inch D-shaped purse handles: 2
- $11 / 8$-inch wooden buttons: 4


## GAUGE

$3 \mathrm{sc}=1$ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

The first 8 rounds of this pattern are worked with 2 strands of yarn held together. At round 9 , the pattern will be worked with a single strand in front loops only and continued in both loops to round 29a. Then pattern will be worked with a single strand in back loop only and continued in both loops to round 33b. This will make the bag reversible. The reason that there are more rounds

on back loops than on front loops is that the back part of handbag is worked in single crochet, so it needs more rows to complete.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Popcorn (pc): 4 dc as indicated in instructions, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in first dc of group, pull dropped Ip through, ch 1 to close.
Cross-stitch (cross-st): Sk next st, dc in next st, dc in st just sk.
V-stitch (V-st): (Dc, ch 2, dc) as indicated in instructions.

## Side

## Make 2.

Row 1: With 2 strands A held tog (see Pattern Notes), ch 33 , sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. ( 32 sc)

Rows 2-7: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing colors (see Stitch Guide) to 1 strand of $B$ in last st worked. Do not fasten off $A$.

## Section A

Row 9a: Working in front Ips (see Stitch Guide), ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 10a: Working in both Ips, sc in each st across, changing color to C in last st, turn.
Row 11a: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), [pc (see Special Stitches) in next st, dc in next st] across, ending with dc in last st, changing to $B$ in last st, turn.
Row 12a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 13a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to $D$ in last st, turn.
Row 14a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 15a: Ch 3, cross-st (see Special Stitches) across to last 2 sts, sk next st, dc in last st, turn.


Row 16a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing color to $B$ in last st, turn.
Rows 17a \& 18a: Rep rows 12a and 13a, changing to C in last st of row 18a, turn.
Row 19a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 20a: Ch 3, sk next st, V-st (see Special Stitches) in next st, [sk next 2 sts, V-st in next st] across to last 2 sts, sk next st, dc in last st, turn.
Row 21a: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, changing colors to B in last st, turn.
Rows 22a \& 23a: Rep rows 12a and 13a, changing to A in last st of row 23a, turn.
Rows 24a-26a: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 27a: Ch 1, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 24 sts , [sc dec in next 2 sts ]
twice, turn. (28 sc)
Row 28a: Ch 1 , sc dec in first 2 sts , sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 20 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts ] twice, turn. ( 24 sc )
Rnd 29a: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each of next 20 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (22 sc)
Row 30a: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each of next 14 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice. Fasten off. (18 sc)

## Section B

Row 9b: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide) or rem Ips of row 8, pick up 1 strand of A , ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off unused strand of A .
Rows 10b-29b: Working in both Ips, ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn.
Row 30b: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc

Rows 54-56: Ch 1, dc in first dc, (2 dc, ch $1,2 \mathrm{dc})$ in each ch-1 sp across, dc in last dc, turn.
Row 57: Ch 1 , sc in each dc and in each ch-1 sp across, turn. (112 sc)

Rows 58-61: Ch 1 , sc in each sc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2ND SIDE

Row 1: With RS facing and working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 on First Side, join (see Pattern Notes) in first ch, hdc in same ch and in each ch across, turn. (112 hdc)
Rows 2-61: Rep rows 2-61 of First Side.

Row 1: Ch 97 (multiple of 7 plus 13), dc in 4th ch from hook and in each of next 2 chs, ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ in same ch as last dc, sk 3 chs, *dc in each of next 4 chs**, ch 2, dc in same ch as last dc, sk 3 chs, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 3 dc , ch 2 , dc in same dc as
last dc , sk next dc , ${ }^{*} \mathrm{dc}$ in next $4 \mathrm{dc}{ }^{* *}$, ch $2, d c$ in same $d c$ as last $d c$, sk next $d c$, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 44 inches from beg.

## Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, ch 1, sc in each dc across with 2 sc in each ch- $2 \mathrm{sp}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in last dc. Working in ends of rows, continue down side working 2 sc into each dc and turning ch, catching 2 threads when possible, 3 sc into last st, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , sc in each ch across, 3 sc in last ch, working in ends of rows, continue down last side as before, 3 sc into last st, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 3, sk next st, (dc, \{ch 1, dc\} twice) in next st, *sk $2 \mathrm{sc},(\mathrm{dc},\{\mathrm{ch} 1, \mathrm{dc}\}$ twice) in next sc, rep from * around, ending with (dc, ch 1, dc, ch 1) into base of beg ch-3, if sc count
doesn't work out exactly, sk 1 as you get near the end of the round, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 3: Ch 3, *dc in center dc of next group, ch 6, sl st into 4th ch from hook, 3 dc around dc just worked, rep from * around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Steam to block. C!

(32 [32, 34, 38, 40, 44, 46] pattern reps)

( 8 V -sts)

Rnd [1] (RS): With RS facing, locate dc row edge just past 1 ch- 5 at underarm, join MC in end of dc row, ch 7, [sc in next ch-7 st of armhole, ch 4, sk next sc and next picot, $V$-st in next sc (between picots), ch 4] [7,7, 8, 8, 9, 9] times, sc in

Row 8: Ch 1 , sk 2 sl sts, sc in each sc across, ending sl st in 4th and 5th rows of Front Band.

Place marker at beg of rnd.

Fasten off.

## 13th-18th Motifs

Rep 11th and 12th Motifs alternately, alternating colors according to Placement Diagram and joining each Motif to 1 corner of previous Motif and 1 corner of neighboring Motif of previous row of Motifs.

## 3rd Row

## 19th Motif

With A, work same as 3rd Motif, joining to 1 corner of 10th Motif.

## 20th Motif

With C, work same as 11th Motif, joining to 1 corner of 19th Motif and then to 1 corner of 11th Motif.

## $\mathbf{2 1 s t}$ Motif

With C, work same as 12th Motif, joining to 1 corner of 20th Motif and then to 1 corner of 12th Motif.

## 22nd-27th Motifs

Rep 20th and 21st Motifs alternately, alternating colors according to Placement Diagram and joining each Motif to 1 corner of previous Motif and 1 corner of neighboring Motif of previous row of Motifs.

Work same as 19th-27th Motifs of row 3, alternating colors according to Placement Diagram and joining to Motifs in 3rd Row.

## 37th-45th Motifs

Work same as 19th-27th Motifs of row 3, alternating colors according to Placement Diagram and joining to Motifs in 4th Row.

## Filler Motifs

Rnd 3: Ch 1, 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sk cl, ch 1,3 hdc in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, sl st in 2nd corner ch of First Motif, ch 1, dc) in top of next cl, sl st in corresponding ch-1 of First Motif, 3 hdc in ch- 2 sp, sl st in corresponding ch-1 of First Motif, sk next $\mathrm{cl}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in ch-2 sp, sl st in corresponding ch-1 of First Motif, sk next cl, 3 hdc in next
ch-2 $s p$, $s l$ st in corresponding ch-1 of First Motif, (dc, ch 1, sl st in 2nd corner ch of First Motif, ch 1, dc) in top of next cl, ch 1, continue as for First Motif without joining.

## Rem Motifs

Continue making Motifs in the same manner as 2nd Motif, joining as made until you have 16 Motifs and Valence is 60 inches across.
Start the next row with a 2nd Motif.

All rem Motifs will be joined on 2 sides as they are made.

## Edging

With RS facing, join in upper left corner, ch 1,18 sc in the sts and chs across each Motif on side, bottom and right edge, continuing across top edge, *first foundation dc (see Special Stitches), 19 next foundation dc (see Special Stitches), sl st to Valance (hanging Ip), 18 sc across next Motif, rep from * across, ending 20 foundation dc at left edge, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Bottom Edging

Row 1: With WS facing, join in corner, ch 6 , dc in same corner as beg ch-6, [sk next $2 \mathrm{sc},(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next sc] across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 6 dc in ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, [7 dc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp] across. Fasten off. C!

Rnd 4: Ch 3, [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] twice, dc in next dc, sk next dc, (3 dc, ch 2,3 dc) in next corner ch-2 sp, *sk next $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 2 dc , [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 4 times, dc in next dc, sk next dc, ( 3 dc , ch 2,3dc) in next corner ch-2 2 p , rep from * twice, sk next dc , dc in next 2 dc , dc in next ch-1 sp , dc in next dc,
dc in next ch-1 sp, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 ch sps, 68 dc)

## LARGE BLOCK

Make 8 with A, 6 with B, 4 with C \& 6 with D .

Rnds 1-4: Rep rnds 1-4 of Small Block, do not fasten off at end of rnd 4.

Rnd 5: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1, sk next 2 dc c ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch-2 sp, *ch 1, sk next 2 dc , dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, ch 1, sk next 2 dc , (3 dc, ch $2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * twice, ch 1, sk next 2 dc , dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] twice, ch 1 , sk next dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (8 ch- 1 sps across each side)
Rnd 6: Ch 3, [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 4 times, dc in next dc, sk next dc , (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc ) in next corner ch-2 sp, *sk next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc ,

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[dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 8 times, dc in next dc, sk next dc, ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in next corner ch-2 sp, rep from * twice, sk next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc , [dc in next ch-1 1 sp , dc in next dc] 3 times, dc in next ch-1 sp , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 7: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1 , sk next dc, dc in next dc] 4 times, ch 1 , sk next 2 dc , ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch-2 sp, *ch 1, sk next 2 dc , dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 10 times, ch 1 , sk next 2 dc , ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * twice, ch 1 , sk next 2 dc , dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 4 times, ch 1 , sk next dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (12 ch-1 sps across each side)
Rnd 8: Ch 3, [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 6 times, dc in next dc, sk next dc, (3 $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2,3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next corner ch-2 sp, *sk next dc, dc in next 2 dc , [dc in next ch-1 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc] 12 times, dc in next dc, sk next dc, ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in next corner ch-2 sp, rep from * twice, sk next dc, dc in next 2 dc , [dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 5 times, dc in next ch-1 sp, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 9: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 6 times, ch 1 , sk next 2 dc , ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch-2 sp, *ch 1, sk next 2 dc , dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] 14 times, ch 1 , sk next 2 dc , ( 3 dc , ch 2, 3 dc ) in corner ch- 2 sp, rep from * 2 more times, ch

Arrange Blocks as shown in Assembly Diagram and sew tog.

## BORDER

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working all way around edge of Throw, join A with sc in first st evenly sp sc around, working 3 sc in each corner, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in center sc of each 3 -sc corner, join in beg sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 3: With RS facing, join B with sl st in any sc, ch 3, dc in each sc around, working 5 dc in center sc of each 3-sc corner, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rnd 4: With RS facing, join Cin any dc, ch 3 , dc in each dc around, working 5 dc in center dc of each 5-dc corner, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rnd 5: With RS facing, join A in any dc, ch 1, sc in each dc around, working 3 sc in center dc of each 5 dc corner, join in beg
sc. Do not fasten off.
