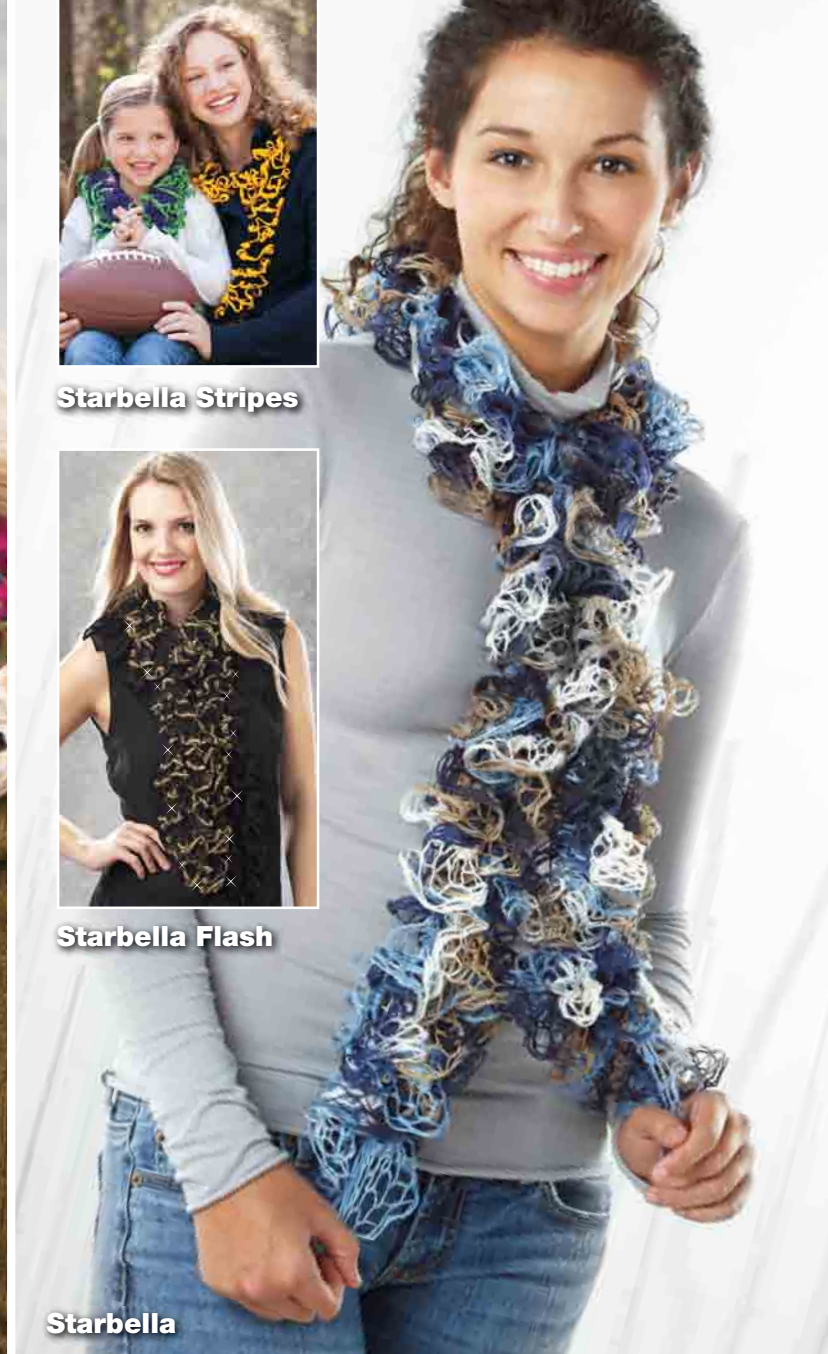
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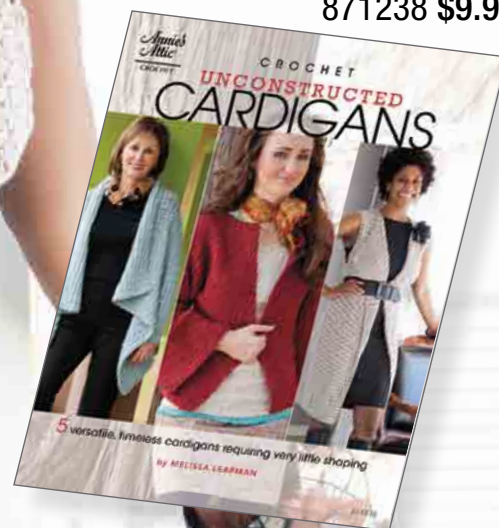
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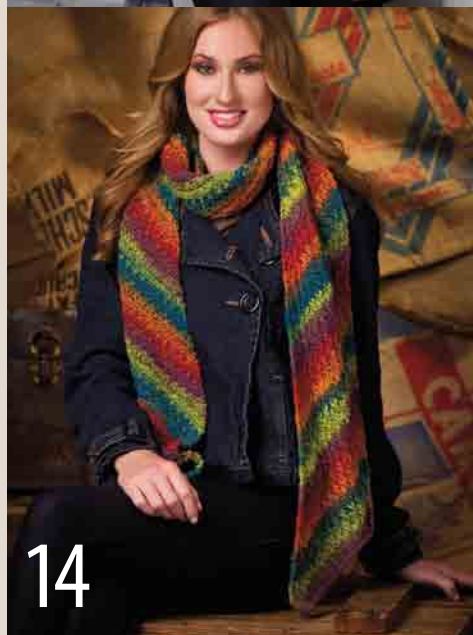
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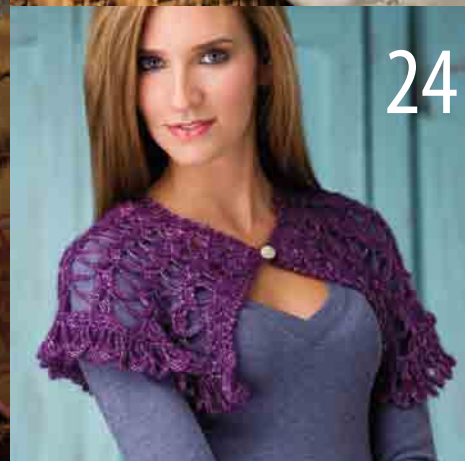
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A NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

Denise Interchangeable teams up with Della Q to offer just what many crocheters have been looking for: a beautiful, compact and travel-friendly set of versatile crochet hooks, including tapestry and double-ended hooks.

Denise Interchangeable makes an uber-useful set of crochet hooks—from size F/5 (3.75mm) to P/Q (15mm)—paired with flexible cords that fit onto the end of the hooks.

The set includes end buttons and cord extenders that allow for creating longer cords; by combining cord lengths, you can create afghan/Tunisian hooks from 8–37 inches long. Cords are sold separately in lengths up to 52 inches, and hooks are also sold individually, so that you can create double-ended hooks in any lengths you need.

Della Q is known for silk bags: project bags that are as beautiful as any purse you own, and smaller organizers that are really too pretty to be hidden.

Together they make a can't-miss product. The Denise in a Della Q set comes in a jewelry case/foldover style, in a choice of four lovely silk-blend fabrics. The case holds 12 hook sizes, six cords, four end buttons and two

extenders. Hook pockets are labeled with U.S./metric sizes. Knitting needle tips are also available, so if you are

also a knitter, the sets become doubly useful. For more information, visit www.knitdenise.com.

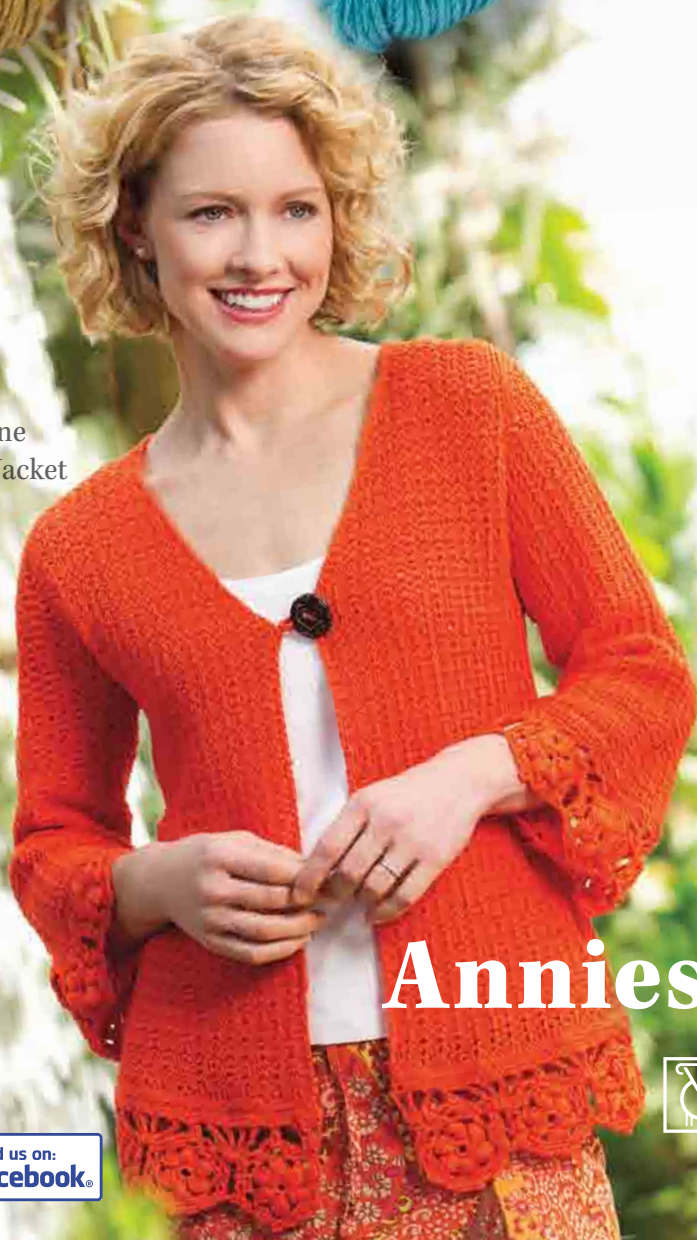




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CROSSROADS TUNIC

DESIGN BY JO'ELLE GALO

THIS COMFORTABLE FIGURE-FLATTERING TUNIC FEATURES A UNIQUE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO PIECES THAT ARE WOVEN TOGETHER AS THE SECOND ONE IS CROCHETED. WEAR IT WITH JEANS FOR A CASUAL LOOK OR OVER A CHIC DRESS FOR A MORE DRAMATIC STYLE.

SKILL LEVEL  **INTERMEDIATE**

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size small/medium; changes for large/X-large and 2X-large/3X-large are in [].

FINISHED GARMENT MEASUREMENTS

See Measurement Notes at end of instructions.

MATERIALS

- Elsebeth Lavold Silky Wool light (DK) weight wool/silk/nylon yarn¹ (1¼ oz/192 yds/50g per ball): 8 [9, 10] balls #063 purple
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers



¹OTHER YARN SUGGESTIONS:

¹Berroco Vintage DK light (DK) weight acrylic/wool/nylon yarn (3½ oz/288 yds/100g per hank): 6 [6, 7] hanks color of choice
Lion Brand LB Collection Superwash Merino light (DK) weight superwash merino yarn (3½ oz/306 yds/100g per ball): 6 [6, 7] balls color of choice
Berroco Comfort DK light (DK) weight acrylic/nylon yarn (1¼ oz/178 yds/50g per ball): 9 [10, 11] balls color of choice

GAUGE

4 sts = 1 inch; 6 pattern rows = 1 inch

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

All stitches are worked in the back loops only unless otherwise stated.

The Tunic is made in 2 pieces. The first piece is the Right Front and Back Left with slits in it. The 2nd piece is Left Front and Back Right;

it is woven into the slits as you work. The 2 pieces are then seamed on the sides after construction is complete.

Rows 1–17 are later referred to as section 1, rows 18–34 are section 2, and rows 35–51 are section 3, this will be important to know when you start weaving them together.

When working on the 2nd piece, move the entire ball of yarn through the woven piece. This will prevent your yarn from getting tangled.

Place marker in 2nd row to mark the right side.

TUNIC

Body

Right Front/Back Left

Row 1 (WS): Ch 241 [257, 281], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (240 [256, 280] sc)

Row 2: Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*), ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3–16: Rep row 2.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each of first 156 [168, 180] sts, sc in both lps of each of next 40 [40, 40] sts, sc in back lps of each of rem 44 [48, 60] sts, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in back lps of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, ch 40, sk next 40 [40, 40] sc, sc in back lps of each of rem 156 [168, 180] sts, turn.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in back lps of each of first 156 [168, 180] sts, sc in each of next 40 chs, sc in back lp of each of rem 44 [48, 60] sts, turn.

Rows 20–33: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn. (240 [256, 280] sc)

Row 34: Ch 1, sc in back lps of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, sc in both lps of each of next 40 [40, 40] sts, sc in back lps of each of rem sts, turn.

Row 35: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 156 [168, 180] sts, ch 40, sk next 40 [40, 40] sc, sc in back lps of each of rem sts, turn.

Row 36: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, sc in each of next 40 chs, sc in back lps of each of rem 156 [168, 180] sts, turn.

Rows 37–50: Rep row 2.

Row 51: Ch 1, sc in both lps of each st across. Fasten off.

Left Front/Back Right

Row 1 (WS): Ch 241 [257, 281], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (240 [256, 280] sc)

Row 2: Working in back lps, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3–16: Rep row 2.

Row 17: Ch 1, sc in each of first 156 [168, 180] sts, sc in both lps of each of next 40 [40, 40] sts, sc in back lps of each of rem 44 [48, 60] sts, turn.

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in back lps of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, ch 40, with RS facing lay piece 1 out flat, weave rows 1–16 under Section 1 (see *Assembly Diagram*), over Section 2, under Section 3, weave ch 40 over Section 1, under Section 2, over Section 3, sk next 40 sc, sc in back lps of each of rem 156 [168, 180] sts, turn.

Row 19: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 156



[168, 180] sts, sc each of next 40 chs, sc in back lp of each of rem 44 [48, 60] sts, turn.

Rows 20–33: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st across, turn.

Row 34: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, sc on both lps of each of next 40 [40, 40] sts, sc in back lps of each of rem 156 [168, 180] sts, turn.

Row 35: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 156 [168, 180] sts, ch 40, weave ch under

Section 1, over Section 2, and under Section 3, sk next 40 [40, 40] sc, sc in back lps of each of rem 44, [48, 60] sts, turn.

Row 36: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 44 [48, 60] sts, sc in each of next 40 chs, sc in back lps of each of rem 156 [168, 180] sts, turn.

Rows 37–50: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st across, turn.

Row 51: Ch 1, sc in both lps of each st across. Fasten off.

Finishing

Fold in half at shoulders, cross Back pieces, lay Back on top of Front.

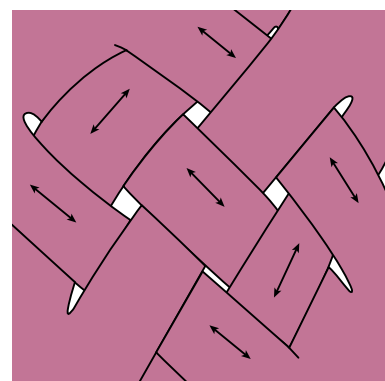
At side of the piece, join with sc at corner, working through both thicknesses, sc seam for 20 sts. Fasten off.

Do the same for other side. With the piece still WS facing, using tapestry needle and yarn, sew woven area. This will help so the woven holes will not stretch over time, and the piece will not sag.

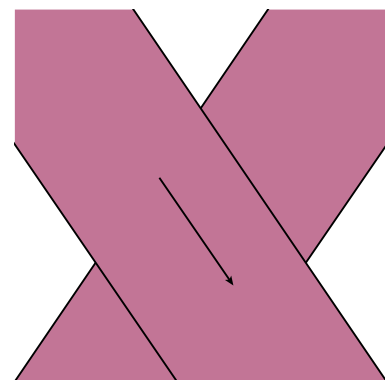
Starting in back, sew seam up where 2 pieces touch working in back lps of both pieces so it will not be seen in the front.

Use a few extra sts at the top opening for added security; this area will take the most wear when putting Tunic on and taking it off.

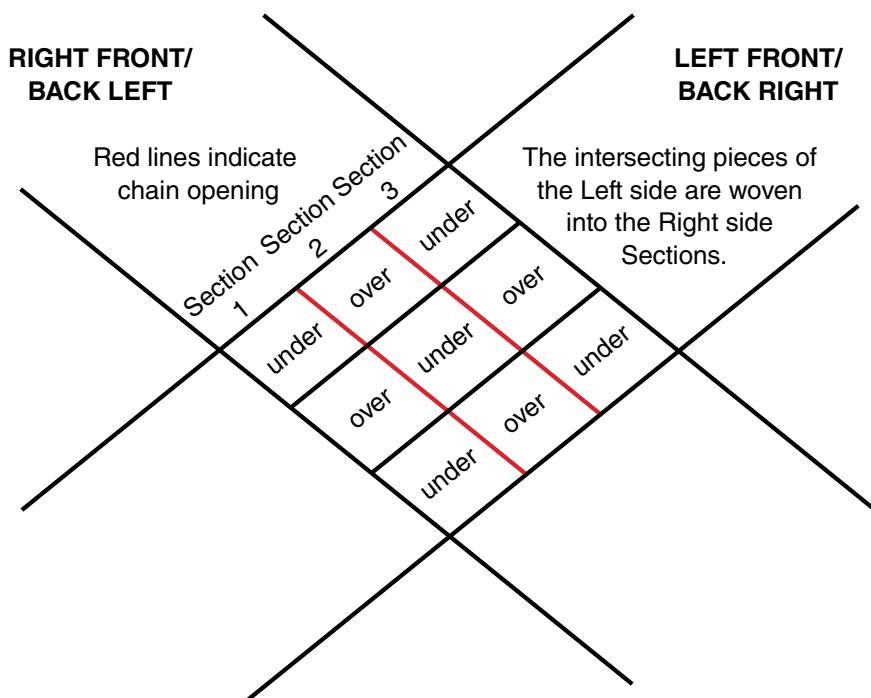
On Fronts, make sure all the woven pieces are straightened out and fill the entire sp. Sew through the back lps of the pieces that are on top. Sew woven area. **C!**

MEASUREMENT NOTES

SMALL/MEDIUM SIZE

Bust = 34–38 inches

Length from shoulder = 30 inches, entire piece 60 inches (240 sts)

Length from shoulder to opening = 9 inches (36 sts)

Length of opening = 10 inches (40 sts)

Length from end of opening to bottom = 11 inches (44 sts)

Width of shoulder = 8½ inches (51 rows)

Width of strips = 2¾ inches (17 rows)

LARGE/X-LARGE SIZE

Bust = 40–46 inches

Length from shoulder = 32 inches, entire piece 64 inches (256 sts)

Length from shoulder to opening = 10 inches (40 sts)

Length of opening = 10 inches (40 sts)

Length from end of opening to bottom = 12 inches (48 sts)

Width of shoulder = 10 inches (60 rows)

Width of strips = 3½ inches (20 rows)

2X-LARGE/3X-LARGE SIZE

Bust = 48–54 inches

Length from shoulder = 35 inches, entire piece 70 inches (280 sts)

Length from shoulder to opening = 10 inches (40 sts)

Length of opening = 10 inches (40 sts)

Length from end of opening to bottom = 15 inches (60 sts)

Width of shoulder = 10 inches (60 rows)

Width of strips = 3½ inches (20 rows)

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GEMSTONES SCARF

DESIGN BY LINDA DEAN

INCREASES WORKED ON ONE SIDE AND DECREASES ON THE OTHER GIVE THIS SCARF A STRIKING ANGULAR DESIGN.

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

7½ inches wide x 77 inches long

MATERIALS

- Bernat Mosaic medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/209 yds/100g per skein):
3 skeins #44609 optimistic
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



GAUGE

13 sts = 4 inches; 11 pattern rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-1 at beginning of row counts as first single crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

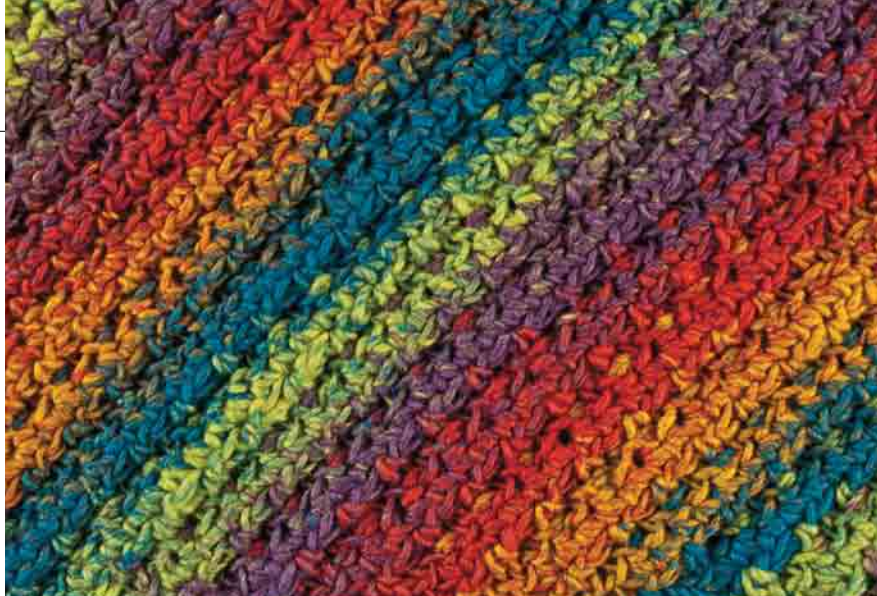
SCARF

Row 1: Ch 32, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (31 sc)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in next st, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, **dc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in last 2 sts, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1 (see Pattern Notes), **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in ch-3, turn.





Row 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, *fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc 2 rows below, sk next st on this row behind fpdc**, dc in next stst, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (14 fpdc)

Row 5: Rep row 3.

Row 6: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, [fpdc around next dc 2 rows below,

sk next st on this row, dc in next st] 13 times, [holding last lp of next st on hook, fpdc around next st 2 rows below] twice, yo, pull through all lps on hook, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 3–6 consecutively until Scarf measures 77 inches, ending with sc row. At end of last row, fasten off. **C!**

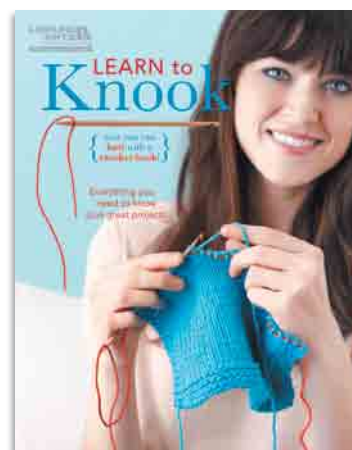
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SWEET PEA COCOON

DESIGN BY BENDY CARTER

THIS DARLING PEA-POD COCOON MAKES A GREAT GIFT FOR A NEW MOM, OR TO GIVE TO A CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION SUCH AS RELIEF SHARE. MAKE A PLAIN COCOON FOR A BOY, OR ADD CUTE FLOWER AND VINE ACCENTS FOR A GIRL'S COCOON.

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

Fits newborn with shoulder circumference of 20 inches

MATERIALS

- Berroco Comfort DK light (DK) weight nylon/acrylic yarn (1¾ oz/178 yds/50g per ball):
4 balls #2740 seedling
1 ball #2754 rabe
½ ball each #2721 sprig, #2723 rosebud, #2722 purple, #2726 cornflower, #2702 pearl and #2745 filbert
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread to match
- Size 4 sew-on snaps: 4
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

18 sts = 4 inches; 20 rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Place marker between 2 center stitches of each row. Move marker as work progresses.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

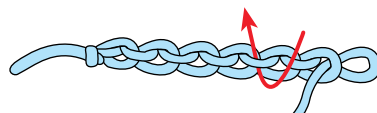
Surface slip stitch (surface sl st): Holding indicated color below fabric and holding

hook above fabric, insert the hook between next 2 sts of row above or below, yo, pull lp through sp and through lp on hook.

PEA POD

Body

Row 1 (RS): With seedling, ch 1, 6 sc in **back bar of ch** (see illustration), **do not join**, turn. **Place marker** (see Pattern Notes) between 3rd and 4th sts. (6 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each st across to st before marker, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (8 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across to 2 sts before marker, 2 sc in each of next 4 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (12 sts)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (18 sc)

Row 6: Rep row 4.

Rows 7–9: Rep rows 2–4. (24 sc at end of last row)

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (30 sts)

Rows 11–14: Rep rows 6–9. (36 sc at end of last row)

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (42 sc)

Rows 16–19: Rep rows 6–9. (48 sc at end of last row)

Row 20: Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (54 sc)

Rows 21–24: Rep rows 6–9. (60 sc at end of last row)

Row 25: Ch 1, sc in each of first 9 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 9 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (66 sc)

Rows 26–28: Rep rows 6–8. (72 sc at end of last row)

Row 29: Ch 1, **sc dec** (see Stitch Guide) in first 2 sts, sc in next st, [sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in next st] twice, sc in each rem st across to last 3 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (66 sc)

Rows 30–32: Rep row 29. (48 sc at end of last row)

Row 33: Rep row 4.

Rows 34–39: Rep rows 20–25. Remove marker at end of last row. (66 sc at end of last row)

Rows 40–42: Rep row 4.

Row 43: Ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch and in each st across to last 6 sts, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, turn. (72 sc)

Rows 44–46: Rep row 43. (90 sc at end of last row)

Rows 47–105: Rep row 4.





Row 106: Ch 1, sc in each of first 13 sts, sc dec in next st, [sc in each of next 13 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (84 sc)

Row 107: Rep row 4. Place marker between 42nd and 43rd sts.

Row 108: Ch 1, sc in each st across to 4 sts before marker, [sc dec in next 2 sts] 4 times, sc in each rem st across. (80 sc)

Row 109: Ch 1, sc in each st across to 2 sts before marker, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in each rem st across, turn. (78 sc)

Row 110: Rep row 4.

Row 111: Ch 1, sc in each of first 11 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 11 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (72 sc)

Row 112: Rep row 4.

Rows 113–115: Rep rows 108–110. (66 sc at end of last row)

Row 116: Ch 1, sc in each of first 9 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 9 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (60 sc)

Rows 117–120: Rep rows 112–115. (54 sc at end of last row)

Row 121: Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sts, sc dec

in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 7 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (48 sc)

Rows 122–125: Rep rows 112–115. (42 sc at end of last row)

Row 126: Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 5 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (36 sc)

Rows 127–130: Rep rows 112–115. (30 sc at end of last row)

Row 131: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (24 sc)

Rows 132–135: Rep rows 112–115. (18 sc at end of last row)

Row 136: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc dec in next 2 sts, [sc in next st, sc dec in next 2 sts] across, turn. (12 sc)

Row 137: Rep row 4.

Rows 138 & 139: Rep rows 108 and 109. At end of last row, leaving long strand, fasten off. (6 sc)

Finishing

Weave long strand through top of sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Edging

With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) sprig at opening, ch 1, evenly sp sc around opening, join in beg st. Fasten off.

Body Assembly

With WS facing, hold beg and end of rows 1–28 tog, working in Edging sts only, sew ends of rows tog. Rep with rows 83–139.

Sew ½ of snap to each end of rows 46, 56, 66 and 76.

PEA POD CAP

Rows 1–14: With rabe, rep rows 1–14 of Pea Pod Body.

First Point

Row 15: Ch 1, sc in each of first 9 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (9 sc)

Row 16: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (8 sc)

Row 17: Rep row 16. (7 sc)

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 19–24: [Rep rows 16–18 consecutively] twice. (3 sc at end of last row)

Row 25: Rep row 16. (2 sc)

Row 26: Ch 1, sc dec in 2 sts, turn. (1 sc)

Row 27: Ch 1, sc in st. Fasten off.

2nd–4th Points

Row 15: Join rabe in first unworked st on row 14 of Pea Pod Cap, ch 1, sc in each of next 9 sts leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (9 sts)

Rows 16–27: Rep rows 16–27 of First Point.

Pea Pod Cap Assembly

With RS facing, holding ends of rows 1–14 tog, sew ends of rows tog.

Turn piece RS out and place over top of Pea Pod. Sew in place as shown in photo.

BABY PEA POD

With seedling, ch 8, working in back bar of chs, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in next ch, sc in last ch. Leaving long strand, fasten off.

Using long strand, sew Baby Pea Pod to top of Pea Pod Cap.

SWEET PEA FLOWERS

Make 2 each pearl, purple, cornflower & rosebud.

Rnd 1 (WS): Ch 3, join in 3rd ch from hook, [ch 5, sl st in ring] 3 times, **do not join or turn.** (3 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 2 (WS): Working in front of ch-5 sps, sl st in ring between next 2 sl sts, [ch 3, sl st in ring between next 2 sl sts] twice, turn. (2 ch-3 sps)

Rnd 3 (RS): (Sl st, ch 2, dc, 2 tr, 2 dtr, ch 3, sl st) in first ch-3 sp, (sl st, ch 3, 2 dtr, 2 tr, dc, ch 2, sl st) in next ch-3 sp. Leaving long strand, fasten off.

Using long strand, sew Sweet Pea Flowers randomly on Pea Pod.

VINE

With filbert, using **surface sl st** (see *Special Stitch*), randomly make Vine twisting around Sweet Pea Flowers on each side of Pea Pod as shown in photo or as desired. **C!**

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BUTTONED NAPKIN RINGS

DESIGN BY CARRIE CARPENTER

ADD A QUICK, FINISHED LOOK TO YOUR TABLE SETTING WITH A SET OF SUPER-EASY NAPKIN RINGS THAT CAN HAVE A VARIETY OF DIFFERENT LOOKS DEPENDING ON YOUR CHOICE OF YARN AND BUTTONS. ADD MORE ROWS TO MAKE THEM LONG ENOUGH FOR CUTE BRACELETS!

SKILL LEVEL  BEGINNER

FINISHED SIZE

2 inches wide x 6 inches long, excluding Button Loop

MATERIALS

- Tahki Yarns Cotton Classic light (DK) weight mercerized cotton yarn (1¾ oz/108 yds/50g per hank):
1 hank each #3214 coffee and #3358 tobacco brown
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 7/8-inch buttons: 2



GAUGE

18 pattern sts = 4 inches; 14 pattern st rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTE

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

NAPKIN RING

Make 1 with each color.

Row 1: Ch 9, sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch, [sc in next ch, dc in next ch] across, ending with dc in last ch, turn. (8 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, [sc in next dc, dc in next sc] across, ending with dc in last sc, turn.

Rows 3–21: Rep row 2 for pattern. Do not fasten off.

Row 2 may be repeated to desired length.

Edging

Working around outer edge in sts, ends of rows and in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, ch 1, evenly sp sc around with 3 sc in each corner, **join** (see *Pattern Note*) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Button Loop

Working on 1 short end, join in center st, ch 8, sl st in same st, ch 1, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) in each ch, sl st in joining sl st. Fasten off.

Finishing

Sew button on rem short end opposite Button Loop.

Block if desired. 





THE DOUBLE BULLION: A NEW TAKE ON A VINTAGE STITCH

BY SUZANN THOMPSON

WE SHOW YOU STEP-BY-STEP HOW TO CREATE THE LOOK OF A VINTAGE RUSSIAN DARNING STITCH IN CROCHET, INSPIRED BY AN ARTICLE PUBLISHED OVER A CENTURY AGO.

HISTORY

Olivia Longacre was born in 1865, the eldest daughter of a farming family in Pennsylvania. She married Alvin Wertman, a farm boy who became an allopathic doctor.

One can almost imagine this Victorian-era lady decorating her parlor with handmade netting curtains or table covers. She notices the Russian darning stitch embroidery on the netting. “That’s interesting,” she thinks. Over and over she finds her eye drawn to the peculiar stitch. Finally she utters the fateful words, “I wonder if I could crochet that?”

Olivia Longacre Wertman did figure out how to imitate Russian darning in crochet. Her article regarding this technique appeared in the April 1900 issue of *Home Needlework Magazine*, but the article offered more of a stitch description than a “how-to.”

The Russian spoke stitch looks like two bullion stitches side by side, so I renamed it the double bullion stitch. It is much easier to make than a regular bullion stitch.



A Russian Darning Stitch embroidered by my grandmother runs down the center of this hand-knotted netting. The stitch inspired Mrs. Wertman’s crochet invention.

BASIC DOUBLE BULLION STITCH

One double bullion stitch (double bullion st) occupies two stitches, chains, spaces, etc., of the indicated

row. The double bullion stitches in our example are worked into a row of sc, and they begin with a chain-7.

1. Ch 7 for double bullion st ch (see Photo 1).

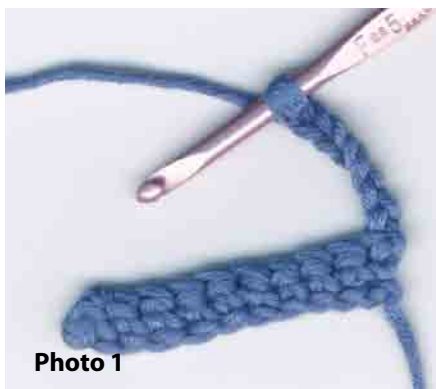

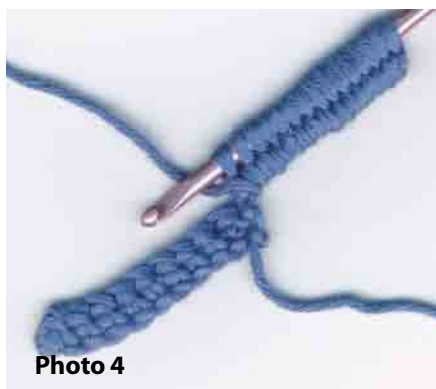

2. Insert hook under beg ch, yo, pull up lp (*see Photo 2*).
3. Yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (*see Photo 3*).
4. Rep steps 2 and 3 until you have 2 lps for every ch in double bullion st ch, not including original lp at end of double bullion st ch (*see Photo 4*). (15 lps on hook)
5. Insert hook into next st on indicated row, yo, pull lp through (16 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, pulling enough yarn to allow st to stand straight (*see Photo 5*). (1 lp on hook)
6. To make another double bullion st, leaving last lp of previous double bullion st on hook, insert hook in next st of the row below, yo, pull lp through, ch 7 (or desired number), pull last ch through last lp of pre-

vious double bullion st, ch 1 (*see Photo 6*).

7. Rep steps 2–6 to create desired number of double bullion sts.
8. When the last double bullion st is finished, leaving long end, fasten off. With tapestry needle, secure long end by stitching around 1 of the lps at the top of the last double bullion st ch (*see Photo 7*).
9. Thread the yarn down through the lps of the double bullion st to secure (*see Photo 8*). Weave in yarn end and trim.

VARIATIONS ON THE BASIC DOUBLE BULLION STITCH

Vary the height of the double bullion stitch by making the beginning chain longer or shorter. Repeat steps 2 and 3 of Basic Double Bullion Stitch until you have two loops per

Cascade Yarns Kid Seta fine (sport) weight super kid mohair/silk/merino wool yarn (¾ oz/300 yds/25g per ball): 2 [2, 2, 2] balls color of choice

GAUGE

21 dc = 4 inches; 12 dc rows = 4 inches; (sc, ch 3, 3-dc cl) = ⅝ inch; (sc, ch sp, 3-tr cl) = ¾ inch

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTE

Read The Double Bullion: A New Take on a Vintage Stitch on page 22 to see step-by-step instructions for the Double Bullion Stitch.

SPECIAL STITCHES

3-double crochet cluster (3-dc cl): Holding

back last lp of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

3-treble crochet cluster (3-tr cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Picot: Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

Half treble crochet (htr): Yo twice, insert hook in st, yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through 2 lps, yo, pull through 3 lps.

Double bullion stitch (double bullion st):

(Place hook under indicated ch, yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through 1 lp) 10 times (11 lps on hook), insert hook in next ch sp on rnd 1 of Trim, yo, pull up lp (12 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, pulling enough for double bullion st to stand straight (1 lp left on hook).

SHOULDER SCARF

Body

Row 1 (WS): Ch 85 [90, 95, 100], sc in 2nd ch from hook, *ch 3, **3-dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch, ch 3, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 3, 3-dc cl in next ch, sk next ch, tr in last ch, turn. (33 [35, 37, 39] ch sps)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, sk first tr, sc in top of next 3-dc cl, *ch 3, 3-dc cl in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sc in top of next 3-dc cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 3, 3-dc cl in next ch-3 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sk first tr, sc in top of next 3-dc cl, *ch 4, **3-tr cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sc in top of next 3-dc cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-3 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

Rows 4 & 5: Ch 1, sk first tr, sc in top of next 3-tr cl, *ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in top of next 3-tr cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

Rows 6 & 7: Ch 1, sk next tr, sc in top of next 3-tr cl, *ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, ch 6, sc in top of next 3-tr cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18]

- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- 1½-inch buttons: 8
- Stitch markers

Tunisian Knit Stitch decrease (TKS dec): Insert hook as for TKS through 2 vertical bars at same time, yo, pull lp through.

Bind off: Sk first vertical bar, keeping hook to back of work, insert hook from right to left (*side to side*) under back vertical bar, yo, pull lp through st and lp on hook.

BUTTONHOLES

Buttonhole placement will beg on 5th st from beg of row, on row 4 and be placed every 10 rows thereafter.

On 2X-large and 3X-large sizes only omit last buttonhole.

Body

Row 1: With size J hook, ch 74 [82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122], working **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), pull up lp in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across (74 [82, 90, 98, 106, 114, 122] lps on hook); **work lps off hook** (see *Special Stitches*).

Row 2: 7 TRS (see *Special Stitches*), 11 [12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17] TKS (see *Special Stitches*), **M1** (see *Special Stitches*), TKS, mark last st, M1, 4 [6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16] TKS, M1, TKS, mark last st, M1, 24 [26, 28, 30, 32, 34, 36] TKS, M1, TKS, mark last st, 4 [6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16] TKS, M1, TKS, mark last st, M1, 11 [12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17] TKS, 7 TRS, TKS last st; work lps off hook.

Row 3: 7 TRS, [TKS across to next marker, M1, TKS in marked st, M1] 4 times, TKS across to last 8 sts, 7 TRS, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Rows 4–20 [4–22, 4–24, 4–26, 4–28, 4–30, 4–32]: Rep row 3, working **button-holes** (see *Buttonholes*) as stated, beg with row 4.

Sleeves Joining

Next row: 7 TRS, TKS across to next marker, insert hook knitwise through first marked st

and next marked st, pull up lp, ch 1 to secure join, TKS across to next marker and insert hook knitwise through first marked st and next marked st, pull up lp, ch 1 to secure join, TKS across to last 8 sts, 7 TRS, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Rem Body

Next row: 7 TRS, TKS across to last 8 sts, 7 TRS, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Next rows: Rep last row 48 [48, 47, 47, 46, 45, 43] times.

For longer cardi, add 8 rows here in pattern.

Next row: With size I hook, TRS across row to last st, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Next rows: Rep last row 7 times.

Last row: **Bind off** (see *Special Stitches*). Fasten off.

Sleeve

Row 1: Join (see *Pattern Notes*) in first st next to Sleeve Joining, TKS in each st around to last st before Sleeve Joining.

Rows 2–21 [2–23, 2–23, 2–25, 2–25, 2–27, 2–27]: Rep row 1.

Decreases

Row 1: TKS dec (see *Special Stitches*), TKS across; work lps off hook.

Row 2: TKS across; work lps off.

Row 3: TKS across to last 3 sts, TKS dec, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Rows 4 & 5: Rep row 2.

Next rows: [Rep rows 1–5 consecutively] 10 times.

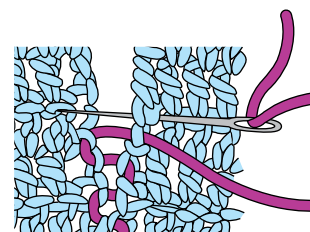
Next row: With size I hook, TRS across row to last st, TKS in last st; work lps off hook.

Next rows: Rep last row 7 more times. Bind off. Fasten off.

Rep Sleeve on rem armhole.

Assembly

Bust: 34 inches (*small*) [38 inches (*medium*), 42 inches (*large*), 46 inches (*X-large*), 50 inches (*2X-large*)] loose fit

MATERIALS

- Berroco Lustra medium (worsted) weight Peruvian wool/Tencel® lyocell yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per hank): 9 [10, 11, 12, 13] hanks #3162 ratatouille
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size 19/15mm 16-inch circular knitting needle
- Tapestry needle
- Straight pins



GAUGE

Size I hook: 14 pattern sts = 4 inches;
6 pattern rows = 4 inches
Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Main Body of Wrap is constructed in 1 rectangular piece incorporating Armholes. Sleeves are created separately and set into main Body. The broomstick lace edging on both main Body of Wrap and Sleeves are worked

onto each piece at end prior to finishing.

Chain-1 at beginning of row counts as first single crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

WRAP

Front Edge

Row 1: Ch 77 [81, 85, 89, 93], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (76 [80, 84, 88, 92] sc)

Row 2: Working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), **ch 1** (see *Pattern Notes*), sk first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), ch 1, sk first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Body

Row 5 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), (3 dc, ch 2, sl st) in next sc, [sk next 3 sc, (4 dc, ch 2, sl st) in next sc] across for pattern to last sc, dc in last sc, turn.

Row 6 (WS): Ch 3, [(4 dc, ch 2, sl st) in next ch-2 sp] across for pattern, ending with dc in last st, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 6 until piece measures 15½ [16, 16½, 17, 18] inches from beg, ending on a RS row.

First Armhole

Row 1 (WS): Work in pattern across first 3 reps, ch 20 [24, 28, 32, 36], sk the next

6 ch-2 sps (*armhole*), continue pattern in next ch-2 sp, complete to end of row.

Row 2: Work in pattern across to ch-2 sp before Armhole opening, work 1 pattern, rep in first ch, *sk next 3 chs, work pattern in next ch, rep from * across ch (5 [6, 7, 8, 9] *pattern reps*), ending with sk last 3 chs, continue in pattern across rem of row.

Back

Next rows: Continue in established pattern until 32½ [35, 37½, 40, 43] inches from beg, ending on RS row.

2nd Armhole

Work same as First Armhole.

Continue Body

Continue in pattern until piece measures 46½ [49½, 52½, 55½, 59½] inches from beg.

Front Edge

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 dc, sk next dc, ch 1] across, ending sc in each of last 3 dc, turn. (76 [80, 84, 88, 92] sts)

Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, sc in next ch, [sc in back lp of each of next 3 sc, sc in next ch] across, ending with sc in last st.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in front lp of each st across, turn

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each st across.
Do not turn or fasten off.

Turn work so that top of Wrap is now your working area.

GAUGE

Chevron st pattern: 16 sts = 4 inches,

The st gauge should be measured evenly across sts, sloping in same direction as sts. If you measure straight across chevrons, st gauge is closer to 20 sts = 4 inches. Each chevron measured straight across = 3½ [3¾, 4¼, 4½, 5, 5½] inches.

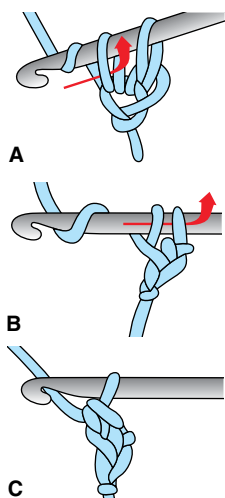

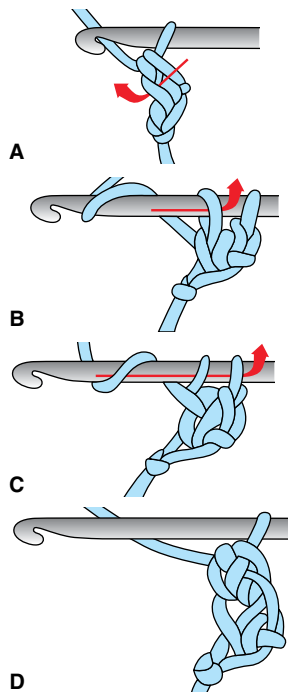

STRIPE PATTERN

Foundation row: With A, **first foundation sc** (see *Special Stitches*), **next foundation sc** (see *Special Stitches*) 86 [96, 106, 116, 126, 136], turn. (87 [97, 107, 117, 127, 137] sc)

Row 1 (WS): Ch 2 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next st, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, *sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, rep from * across to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st, **changing colors** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to B in last st, turn. (5 chevrons)

Row 2: With B, rep row 1.

Small, Large & 2X-Large Sizes Only

Row 3: Ch 2, sk next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 2 [3, 4] times, ch 1, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 3 [4, 5] times, *hdc in next st, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 2 [3, 4] times, ch 1, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, [ch 1,

sk next st, hdc in next st] 3 [4, 5] times, rep from * across to last 3 sts, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st, hdc in last st, turn.

Medium, X-Large & 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [3]: Ch 2, sk next st, hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 3 [4, 5] times, ch 1, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 4 [5, 6] times, *ch 1, sk next 2 sts, hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 3 [4, 5] times, ch 1, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] 4 [5, 6] times, rep from * across to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st, turn.

All Sizes

Note: Place marker in the center st of the first and last 3-hdc group (at "peak" of first and last chevron). Move markers up as work progresses.

Row 4: Ch 2, working in each st and ch-1 sp, sk next st, hdc in each st across to marked st, *3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, rep from * across to next marked st, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each st to next 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st, turn. (87 [97, 107, 117, 127, 137] sts, 5 chevrons)

Rows 12–15: With C, [rep row 1] 4 times, change to A in last st of row 15.

Rows 16 & 17: With A, [rep row 1] twice, change to B in last st of row 17.

Rows 18–21: With B, rep rows 2–5, change to A in last st of row 21.

Rows 22 & 23: With A, rep row 1, change to B in last st of row 23.

Rows 24–27: With B, rep rows 2–5, change to C in last st of row 27.

Rows 28–31: With C, [rep row 1] 4 times, change to A in last st of row 31.

Armhole Shaping

Row 32: With A, ch 1, sk first st, sl st in each of next 5 [5, 5, 6, 6, 6] sts, sc in each st across to marked st, *3 sc in next marked st, sc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, sk next 2 sts, sc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, rep from * across to next marked st, 3 sc in next marked st, sc in next 3 [4, 5, 5, 6, 7] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (77 [87, 97, 105, 115, 125] sts)

Row 33: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk next st, sc in each st across to marked st, *3 sc in next st, sc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, sk next 2 sts, sc in each of next 7 [8, 9, 10, 11, 12] sts, rep from * across to next marked st, 3 sc in next st, sc in each st to last 2 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn, change to C in last st.

Large, X-Large, 2X-Large & 3X-Large Sizes Only

Row [34]: With C, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each st across to marked st, *3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next [9, 10, 11, 12] sts, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next [9, 10, 11, 12] sts, rep from * across to next marked st, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each st across to last 3 sts, sk next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. ([95, 103, 113, 123] sts)

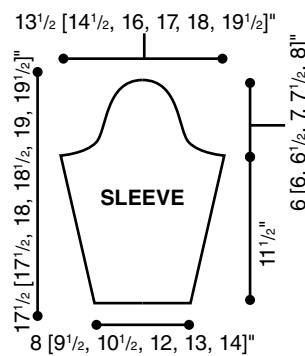
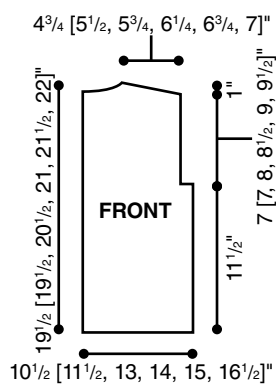
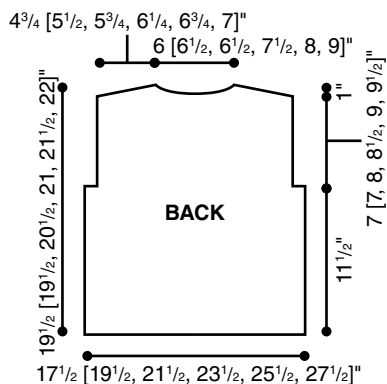

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- 1¾-inch buttons: 2
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

21 sts = 4 inches; 20 pattern rows = 4 inches
Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTE

Front

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 125 [125, 131, 131, 133], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] chs (*bottom ribbing*), [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, ending with sc in last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next sc] across to 1 st before bottom ribbing, sc in next st, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, sc in next st, [ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp] for pattern across to last ch-1 sp and last sc, sc in last ch-1 sp, sc in last sc, turn.

Rows 4–17 [4–17, 4–19, 4–21, 4–23]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 7 [7, 8, 9, 10] times.

Row 18 [18, 20, 22, 24]: Rep row 2.

Row 19 [19, 21, 23, 25]: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern st for next 72 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next ch-1 sp and sc, turn. (85 [85, 91, 91, 93] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 20 [20, 22, 24, 26]: Ch 1, sc dec in first sc and ch-1 sp, work in pattern across next 71 sts, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn. (84 [84, 90, 90, 92] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 21 [21, 23, 25, 27]: Ch 1, working in back lp, sc in each of first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern across to last ch-1 sp, sc dec in next ch-1 sp and last sc, turn. (83 [83, 89, 89, 91] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 22 [22, 24, 26, 28]: Ch 1, sc dec in first sc and ch-1 sp, work in pattern across to ribbing,

working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn. (82 [82, 88, 88, 90] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 23 [23, 25, 27, 29]: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern across, ending with sc dec in last ch-1 sp and sc, turn. (81 [81, 87, 87, 89] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 24 [24, 26, 28, 30]: Ch 1, sc dec in first sc and ch-1 sp, work in pattern across to ribbing, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn. (80 [80, 86, 86, 88] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 25 [25, 27, 29, 31]: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern across, ending with sc dec in last ch-1 sp and sc, turn. (79 [79, 85, 85, 87] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 26 [26, 28, 30, 32]: Ch 1, sc dec in first sc and ch-1 sp, work in pattern across to ribbing, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn. (78 [78, 84, 84, 86] sts and ch-1 sps)

Large, X-Large & 2X-Large Sizes Only

Rows [29–32, 31–36, 33–42]: *Rep rows [22 and 23, 24 and 25, 26 and 27], rep from * 1 [2, 4] time(s). ([80, 78, 76] sts and ch-1 sps)

All Sizes

Row 27 [27, 33, 37, 43]: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern across, turn.

Row 28 [28, 34, 38, 44]: Ch 1, work in pattern across to ribbing, working in back lps, sc in each of last 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, turn.

Rows 29–32 [29–32, 35–38, 39–42, 45–48]: *Rep rows 27 and 28 [27 and 28, 33 and 34, 37 and 38, 43 and 44], rep from * 2 [2, 1, 1, 1] time(s). At end of last row, fasten off.

Back

First Half

Row 1: Ch 125 [125, 131, 131, 133], sc in 2nd ch from hook, *ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch across 110 chs, ch 1, sk next ch, sc in each of last 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] chs (*ribbing*), turn. (124 [124, 130, 130, 132] sts and chs)

Row 2: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 12 [12, 18, 18, 20] sts, work in pattern across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, work in pattern across 112 sts, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 4–33 [4–35, 4–37, 4–41, 4–43]: Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately.

Rows 34–47 [36–49, 38–55, 42–61, 44–67]: Rep rows 19–32 [19–32, 21–38, 23–42, 25–48] of Front. At end of last row, fasten off.

2nd Half

Row 1: Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 on First Half of Back, **join** (see *Pattern Note*) in first ch at top of Back, work row 3 of First Half.

Rows 2–47 [2–49, 2–55, 2–61, 2–67]: Work same as First Half.

Sleeve

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 19, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, ending with sc in last ch, turn. (18 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, work in pattern across, ch 21 [21, 13, 13, 13], turn. (39 [39, 31, 31, 31] sts, ch-1 sps and chs)

Row 3: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across chs, work in pattern across, turn. (38 [38, 30, 30, 30] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row 4: Rep row 2. (59 [59, 43, 43, 43] sts, ch-1 sps and chs)

Row 5: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across chs, work in pattern across, ch 7 [7, 5, 5, 5], turn. (65 [65, 47, 47, 47] sts, ch-1 sps and chs)

Row 6: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across chs, work in pattern across, ch 31 [31, 13, 13, 13], turn. (95 [95, 59, 59, 59] sts, ch-1 sps and chs)

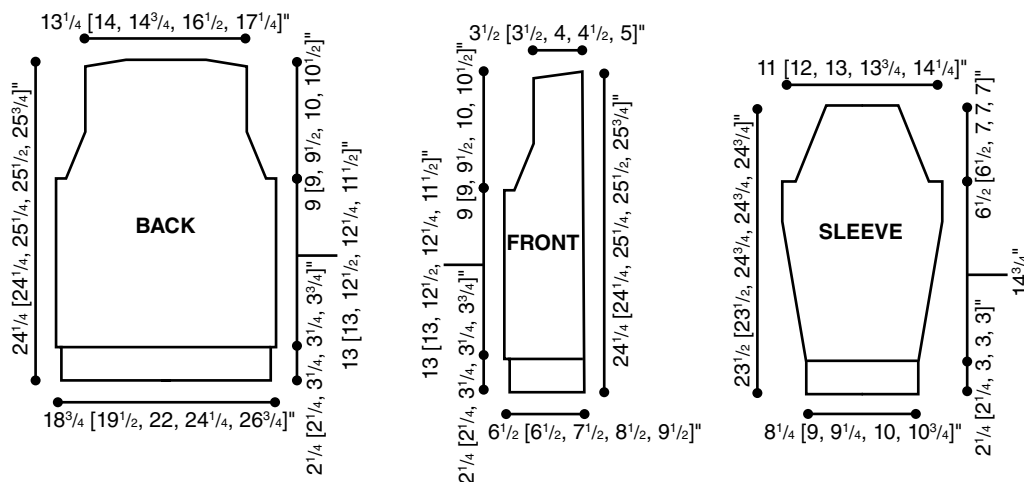

Rows [25–46, 25–50, 25–54]: [Rep rows 23 and 24 alternately] [11, 13, 15] times.

Row [47, 51, 55]: Rep row [23].

Row [48, 52, 56]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across to last 16 sts, working in back lps, sc in each of last 16 sts, turn. ([126] sts, ch-1 sps)

Row [49, 53, 57]: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 16 sts, work in pattern across, turn.

Rows [50–57, 54–61, 58–65]: Rep rows [48 and 49, 52 and 53, 56 and 57] alternately [4, 4, 4] times. ([110] sts, ch-1 sps and chs at end of last row)

Row [58, 62, 66]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across to

last 16 sts, leave last 16 sts unworked, turn. ([90] sts, ch-1 sps and chs)

Row [59, 63, 67]: Ch 1, work in pattern across, turn.

Row [60, 64, 68]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across 74 sts, leave last 12 sts unworked, turn. ([74] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row [61, 65, 69]: Ch 1, work in pattern across, turn.

Row [62, 66, 70]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across 58 sts, leave last 12 sts unworked, turn. ([58] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row [63, 67, 71]: Ch 1, work in pattern across, turn.

Row [64, 68, 72]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across 42 sts, leave last 12 sts unworked, turn. ([42] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row [65, 69, 73]: Ch 1, work in pattern across, turn.

Row [66, 70, 74]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across 30 sts, leave last 12 sts unworked, turn. ([30] sts and ch-1 sps)

Row [67, 71, 75]: Ch 1, work in pattern across, turn.

Row [68, 72, 76]: Sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1, sc in same st as last sl st, work in pattern across 18 sts, leave last 12 sts unworked. Fasten off.

Sew shoulder seams.

Ribbed Panel

Row 1: Join in lower front corner of Front, ch 34 [36, 38, 40, 42], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across to last ch, sk next st on Front, sc dec in last ch and next st on Front, turn. (33 [35, 37, 39, 41] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 32 [34, 36, 38, 40] sc, sk next st on Front, sc dec in last sc and next st on Front, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately around right Front, across back neck edge, and down left Front. At end of last row, fasten off.

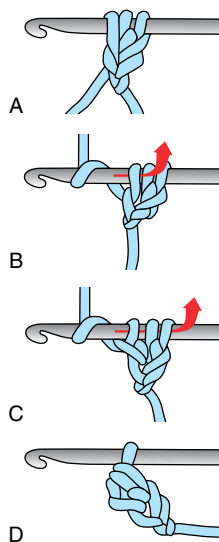

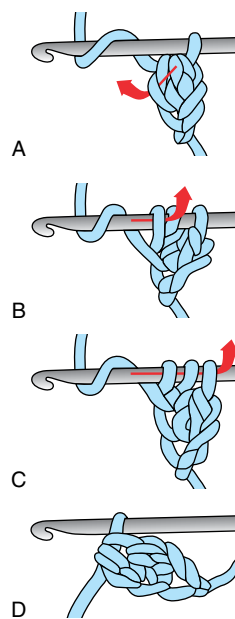

Armhole Shaping

Row 65 (WS): Ch 1, sk first st, sl st in next st, ch 1, hdc in both lps of next st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 4 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of next st, leaving last 2 sts unworked, turn. (69 [77, 85, 95, 103, 113, 121] sts)

Next rows: [Rep row 65] 0 [0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5] time(s). (69 [77, 81, 87, 91, 97, 101] sts at end of last row)

Next row (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 4 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st,

turn. (67 [75, 79, 85, 89, 95, 99] sts)

Next row (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in back lp of next st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. (65 [73, 77, 83, 87, 93, 97] sts)

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows] 1 [1, 1, 2, 2, 2, 3] time(s). (61 [69, 73, 75, 79, 85, 85] sts at end of last row)

Next row: Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn.

Next rows: Rep last row until armhole measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ [5, $5\frac{1}{2}$, 6, $6\frac{1}{2}$, 7, $7\frac{1}{2}$] inches from beg of Armhole Shaping, ending with WS row.

Neck & First Shoulder Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] 12 [13, 14, 14, 15, 16, 16] times, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of next st, leaving rem sts unworked for Neck and 2nd Shoulder, turn. (27 [29, 31, 31, 33, 35, 35] sts)

Row 2 (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (25 [27, 29, 29, 31, 33, 33] sts)

Row 3 (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 6 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (23 [25, 27, 27, 29, 31, 31] sts)

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3. (19 [21, 23, 23, 25, 27, 27] sts at end of last row)

Row 6: Rep row 2. Fasten off. (17 [19, 21, 21, 23, 25, 25] sts)

Neck & 2nd Shoulder Shaping

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk next 7 (11, 11, 13, 13, 15, 15) unworked sts following first shoulder, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in next st, ch 1, hdc in same st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps

of last st, turn. (27 [29, 31, 31, 33, 35, 35] sts)

Row 2 (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 6 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (25 [27, 29, 29, 31, 33, 33] sts)

Row 3 (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (23 [25, 27, 27, 29, 31, 31] sts)

Rows 4 & 5: Rep rows 2 and 3. (19 [21, 23, 23, 25, 27, 27] sts at end of last row)

Row 6: Rep row 2. Fasten off. (17 [19, 21, 21, 23, 25, 25] sts)

Back

Work same as Front.

Sleeve

Make 2.

Row 1 (WS): First foundation hdc, next foundation hdc 40 [42, 44, 46, 48, 50, 52] times, turn. (41 [43, 45, 47, 49, 51, 53] sts)

Rows 2–4: Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn.

Row 5 (inc): Ch 1, 2 hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, 2 hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (43 [45, 47, 49, 51, 53, 55] sts)

Rows 6 & 7: Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, hdc in back lp of next st [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn.

Row 8 (inc): Ch 1, 2 hdc in both lps of first st, hdc in back lp of next st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last st, 2 hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (45 [47, 49, 51, 53, 55, 57] sts)

Rows 9–13 [9–13, 9–12, 9–11, 9–11, 9–10, 9–10]: [Rep row 2] 5 [5, 4, 3, 3, 2, 2] times.

Row 14 [14, 13, 12, 12, 11, 11]: Rep row 5. (47 [49, 51, 53, 55, 57, 59] sts)

Rows 15–19 [15–19, 14–17, 13–15, 13 & 14, 12 & 13, 12 & 13]: [Rep row 6] 5 [5, 4, 3, 2, 2, 2] times.

Next rows: Rep rows 8–19 [8–19, 8–17, 8–15, 8–14, 8–13, 8–13] 3 [3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8] times. (59 [61, 67, 73, 79, 85, 91] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Rep row 6 until piece measures 18½ [19, 19½, 19½, 20, 20, 20½] inches from beg.

Cap Shaping

Rows 1–13 [1–13, 1–15, 1–16, 1–18, 1–19, 1–20] (dec): Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in back lp of next st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 5 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. (7 [9, 7, 9, 7, 9, 9] sts)

Next 2 rows: Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, hdc in back lp of next st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Collar/Neck Wrap

Row 1 (WS): First foundation hdc, next foundation hdc 88 [94, 94, 100, 100, 106, 106] times, turn. (89 [95, 95, 101, 101, 107, 107] hdc)

Rows 2–31: Ch 1, hdc in both lps of first st, [hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in back lp of next st] across to last 2 sts, hdc in front lp of next st, hdc in both lps of last st, turn.

Row 32: Ch 1, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 33: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Assembly

Block Collar/Neck Wrap to schematic measurements.

With WS tog, fold in half lengthwise.

Sew 3 open sides closed, leaving small opening at end of seam on last side. **Do not fasten off.**

Turn RS out through small opening.

Sew small opening closed.

Attach button to 1 corner as shown in photo.

Finishing

Block pieces to schematic measurements.

Sew shoulder seams.

Sew in Sleeves.

Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Neckline Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join in Neck edge at Shoulder seam, ch 1, evenly sp an even number of hdc around Neck edge, join in first hdc.

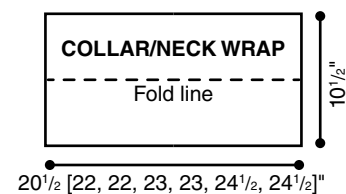
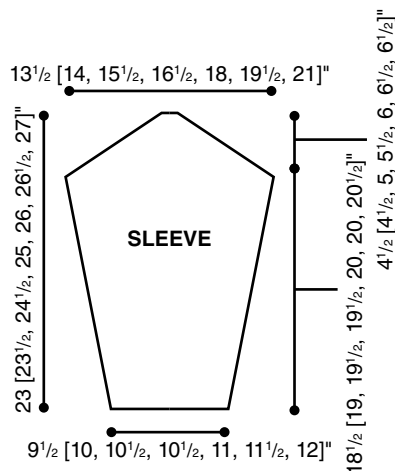
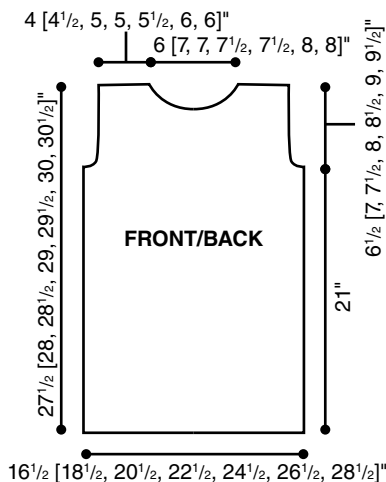
Rnds 2 & 3: Ch 1, hdc in each st around, join in first hdc.

Sleeve Edging

With RS facing, join in Sleeve edge at seam, ch 1, hdc in first st, *ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] around, ch 1, fasten off and join to hdc with invisible join.

Rep on rem Sleeve. **C!**

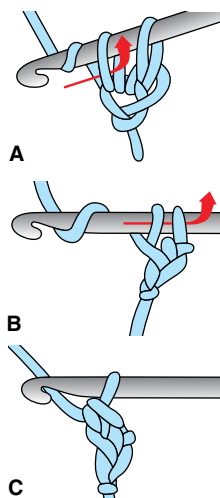

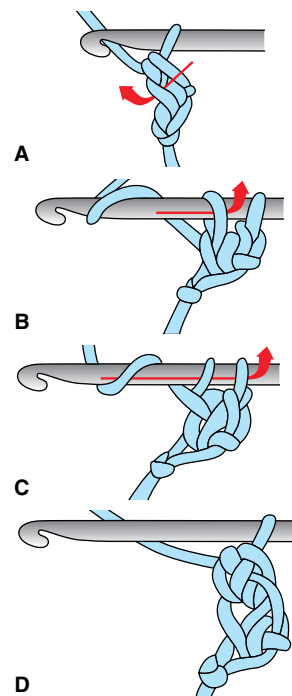

Rows 5–160: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 78 times.

Row 161 (WS): Rep row 3.

Armholes Shaping

Row 1 (dec) (RS): Ch 1, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sts, [**spike** in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, **spike** in next st, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (97 [107, 119, 129, 141, 151] sts)

Rows 2–8 [2–10, 2–12, 2–14, 2–16, 2–18]: [Rep row 1] 7 [9, 11, 13, 15, 17] times, turn.

(83 [89, 97, 103, 111, 117] sts)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

Next row (WS): Ch 1, sc in first st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Next rows: Rep last 2 rows alternately until piece measures 5 [5½, 6, 6½, 7, 7½] inches from beg of Armhole Shaping, ending with WS row.

Neck & First Shoulder Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] 15 [16, 18, 19, 21, 22] times, sc in next st, leaving rem sts unworked for Neck and 2nd Shoulder, turn. (33 [35, 39, 41, 45, 47] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3 (dec): Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, spike in next st, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (32 [34, 37, 40, 44, 46] sts)

Row 4 (dec): Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn. (31 [33, 36, 39, 43, 45] sts)

Rows 5–18: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 7 times. (17 [19, 23, 25, 29, 31] sts at end of last row)

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk next 17 [19, 19, 21, 21, 23] unworked sts following First Shoulder, join with sc in next st, sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] 15 [16, 18, 19, 21, 22] times, sc in last st. (33 [35, 39, 41, 45, 47] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3 (dec): Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (32 [34, 37, 40, 44, 46] sts)

Row 4 (dec): Ch 1, sc in first st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, spike in next st, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (31 [33, 36, 39, 43, 45] sts)

7 times. (17 [19, 23, 25, 29, 31] sts)

Work same as Back until armholes measure 3 [3½, 4, 4½, 5, 5½] inches, ending with WS row.

Row 4 (dec): Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn. (32 [34, 38, 40, 44, 46] sts)

Rows 5–7: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 8 (dec): Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across, turn. (31 [33, 37, 39, 43, 45] sts)

Row 9: Rep row 3.

Row 10: Rep row 2.

Row 11 (dec): Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, spike in next st, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (30 [32, 36, 38, 42, 44] sts)

Rows 12 & 13: Rep rows 5 and 6.

Row 14 (dec): Rep row 8. (29 [31, 35, 37, 41, 43] sts)

Rows 15–20: Rep rows 9–14. (27 [29, 33, 35, 39, 41] sts)

Row 21: Rep row 3.

Row 22 (dec): Rep row 4. (26 [28, 32, 34, 38, 40] sts)

Row 23: Rep row 5.

Row 24 (dec): Rep row 8. (25 [27, 31, 33, 37, 39] sts)

Rows 25–36: [Rep rows 21–24 consecutively] 3 times. (19 [21, 25, 27, 31, 33] sts at end of last row)

Row 37 (dec): Rep row 11. (18 [20, 24, 26, 30, 32] sts)

Row 38 (dec): Rep row 8. (17 [19, 23, 25, 29, 31] sts)

Row 39 (dec): Rep row 11. (16 [18, 22, 24, 28, 30] sts)

Row 40: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across. Fasten off.

Neck & 2nd Shoulder Shaping

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk next 17 [19, 19, 21, 21, 23] unworked sts following First Shoulder, join with sc in next st, sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] 15 [16, 18, 19, 21, 22] times, sc in last st, turn. (33 [35, 39, 41, 45, 47] sts)

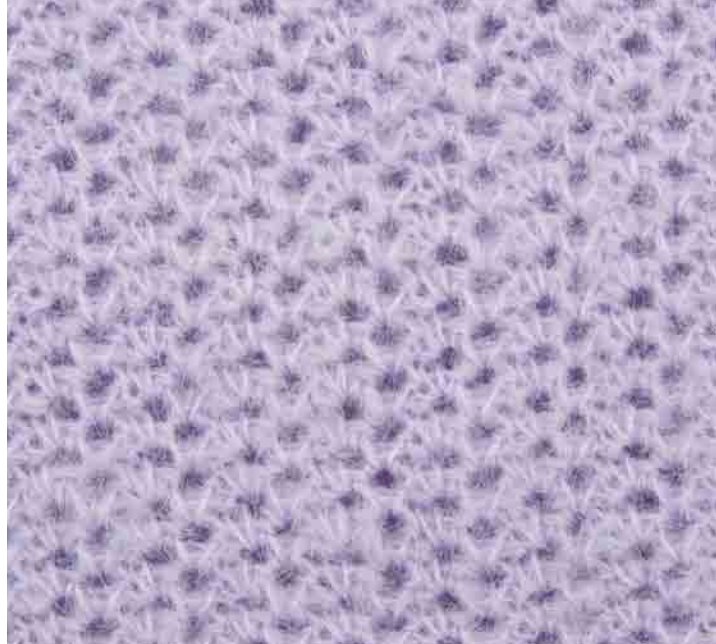

Row 22 (dec): Rep row 4. (26 [28, 32, 34, 38, 40] sts)

Row 23: Rep row 5.

Row 24 (dec): Rep row 8. (25 [27, 31, 33, 37, 39] sts)

Rows 25–36: [Rep rows 21–24 consecutively] 3 times. (19 [21, 25, 27, 31, 33] sts)

Row 37 (dec): Rep row 11. (18 [20, 24, 26, 30, 32] sts)

Row 8 (inc): Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, spike in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in last st, turn. (55 [57, 59, 61, 63, 65] sts)

Rows 93 & 94: Rep rows 3 and 4.

Row 95: Rep row 3.

Next rows: [Rep rows 88–95 consecutively]

0 [1, 2, 3, 4, 5] time(s). (77 [83, 89, 95, 101, 107] sts at end of last row)

Cap Shaping

Next row (dec): Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 5 sts, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, sc in last st, turn. (73 [79, 85, 91, 97, 103] sts)

Next row: Rep row 3.

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows] 9 [10, 11, 12, 13, 14] times. (37 [39, 41, 43, 45, 47] sts at end of last row)

Next row (dec): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in next st, [spike in next st, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in last st, turn. (35 [37, 39, 41, 43, 45] sts)

Next row: Rep row 3.

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows] 14 [15, 16, 17, 18, 19] times. At end of last row, fasten off. (7 sts at end of last row)

Finishing

Block pieces to schematic measurements.

Sew shoulder seams.

Sew in sleeves.

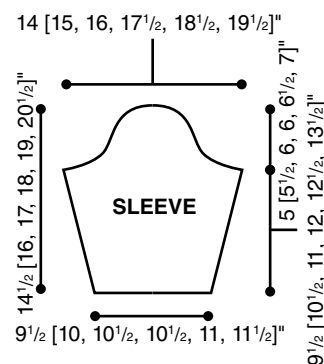
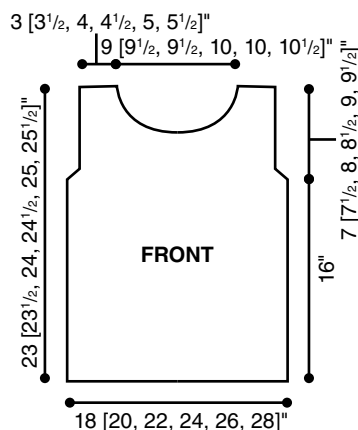
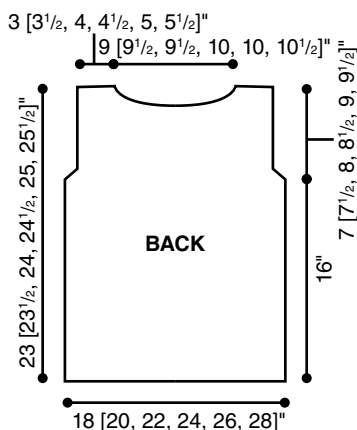

- ½-inch black shank buttons: 3 [4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 5]
- Hook-and-eye closures: 3

GAUGE

Size F hook: 9 linked tr = 2 inches; rows 1 and 2 of Waistband = 1 inch

Size G hook: 5 pattern rnds = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Skirt is intended to sit on high hip or low waist area and will stretch a little.

Skirt Waistband is worked in rows, making overlap and opening. Main Skirt is worked in rounds using incrementally increasing hook sizes to achieve increases.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

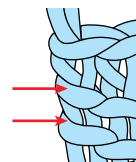

Linked treble crochet (linked tr): Pull up lp in each **horizontal bar** (see illustration) of previous linked tr (2 bars) and in next st (4 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps] 3 times.

Row 1: Pull up lp in 2nd, 3rd and 4th chs from hook, [yo, pull through 2 lps] 3 times (counts as beg linked tr), **linked tr** (see Special Stitches) in each st across to last st, tr in last st (buttonhole), turn. (131 [145, 159, 183, 205, 221, 241] linked tr, 1 tr)

THIS QUICK AND EASY NECK WARMER CAN BE MADE TWO DIFFERENT WAYS—AS A SEAMED COWL, AS SHOWN, OR AS AN OPEN-ENDED PIECE THAT CAN BE FASTENED AT THE FRONT WITH A PRETTY CLOSURE.

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

8¾ inches high x 26 inches in circumference

MATERIALS

- Crystal Palace Mini Mochi super fine (fingering) weight superwash merino wool/nylon yarn (1¾ oz/195 yds/50g per ball):
 - 2 balls #108 Neptune rainbow
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

2 pattern rows = 7½ inches wide x 1 inch tall

PATTERN NOTES

Cowl is worked horizontally, with beginning chain determining height of Cowl.

The chains in row 1 can be hard to see before and after working shells. You can place stitch markers in chain before working first row so you know exactly where your stitches will go. Or slide your shells to right after working them so you can fully see adjacent chains and not miss any stitches.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: 5 dc as indicated in instructions.

COWL

Row 1 (RS): Loosely ch 46, dc in 6th ch from hook (*first 5 chs count as first dc, ch 1*), [sk next 2 chs, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch] across, turn. (*5 shells, 12 dc*)

Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, [sk first 2 dc of next shell, shell in next dc of same shell, sk last 2 dc of same shell, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc] across, ending with dc in turning ch, turn.

Rows 3–60 or to desired circumference: Rep row 2, trying it on as you go to decide on circumference, you need an even number of rows for Border. At end of last row, **do not fasten off**.

Finishing

If making open-ended front-closure cowl, sk Seam for Continuous Cowl instructions below and proceed directly to Border instructions, followed by Open-End Front Closure instructions.

Proceed to Seam for Continuous Cowl instructions below for pictured Cowl, and then on to Border instructions.

Seam for Continuous Cowl

Getting started: To straighten out last row for seam, turn and work across last row as follows (*this does not count as row*): Ch 1, dc in first st, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, [hdc in next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc, hdc in next dc, dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in

next dc] across, ending with dc in turning ch, turn. (*43 sts*)

Line up sts evenly on both ends of cowl and secure tog with st markers or pins. Working through both thicknesses, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. **do not fasten off**.

Seamed Cowl Border

Getting started: Border looks best with WS facing outward, so first work Bottom Border on WS of Cowl, and then turn Cowl RS out to work Top Border as top neck edge will spill over in front, showing correct side of Border.

For close-fitting stand-up Cowl, work both Borders on WS.

Bottom Border

Working on WS, sl st in first ch of next ch-3 sp, (sc, hdc, dc, tr, dtr) in same ch sp as beg sl st, (dtr, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next dc (*scallop*), [(sc, hdc, dc, tr, dtr) in next ch sp, (dtr, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next dc] across, ending with sl st in dc of straightened edge. Fasten off. (*30 scallops*)

Turn Cowl RS out.

Top Border

Join with sl st in first ch of ch-3 sp to left of seam, (sc, hdc, dc, tr, dtr) in same ch sp as beg sl st, (dtr, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next dc (*scallop*), [(sc, hdc, dc, tr, dtr) in next ch sp, (dtr, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in next dc] across, ending with sl st in dc of straight edge. Fasten off.

Open-End Front Closure

Work same pattern as Continuous Cowl,

except stop after an even number of rows at desired circumference, turn. Do not straighten last row.

Work both Borders for Continuous Cowl omitting references to seam and paying attention to which side of each Border you want to face outward. Fasten off.

Sew on buttons or use decorative pin on other closure to fasten Cowl in front, wavy end on top. **C!**



RUFFLE REDUX SHAWL

DESIGN BY BARBARA WORN-WURTZ

THIS BILLOWY, LIGHT-AS-AIR PIECE CAN BE WORN AS A LONG RUANA, AS A DOUBLED WRAP, OR AROUND THE NECK AS AN OVERSIZE COWLED SCARF.

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

20 x 70 inches at Edge Bands, excluding Fringe

MATERIALS

- Universal Yarns Swiss Mohair superfine (fingering) weight mohair/acrylic yarn (3½ oz/601 yds/100g per skein):
4 skeins #2510 mist
- Sizes I/9/5.5mm, K/10½/6.5mm, M/13/9mm, N/15/10mm and P/16/11.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Beading needle: fine
- Beading thread
- 6mm white pearl beads: 185
- Blocking board



GAUGE

Size M hook and 1 strand yarn: 11 sc = 4 inches; 13 sc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTE

Shawl is worked from side to side with Edge Bands at top and bottom.

SPECIAL STITCH

Shell: (Sc, hdc, dc) as indicated in instructions.

SHAWL

First Edge Band

With size I hook and 3 strands mist held tog, ch 271, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in 2nd ch from hook, [sk 2 chs, shell in next ch] across. Fasten off. (90 shells)

2nd Edge Band

With size I hook and 3 strands mist held tog, ch 271, shell in 2nd ch from hook, [sk next 2 chs, shell in next ch] across, turn. **Do not fasten off.**

Body

Row 1 (RS): With 1 strand of mist, ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (360 sc, 90 inc)

Row 2: With size K hook, ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (480 sc, 120 inc)

Row 3: With size M hook, ch 1, sc in first st and in each st across, turn.

Rows 4–14: Rep row 3.

Rows 15–24: With size N hook, rep row 3.

Rows 25–38: With size P hook, rep row 3.

Rows 39–48: With size N hook, rep row 3.

Rows 49–60: With size M hook, rep row 3.

Row 61: With size K hook, ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc dec in next

2 sts] across, turn. (360 sc, 120 sc dec)

Row 62: With size I hook, rep row 61. Fasten off. (270 sc, 90 sc dec)

Finishing

Recount last row of Body before sewing. If necessary, ease to fit.

With tapestry needle and 3 strands mist held tog, with RS facing, sew First Edge Band to last row of Body, carefully matching sts, adjusting tension as necessary to match dimensions and visual appearance of 2nd Edge Band.

Beading

With RS facing, using beading needle and thread, sew beads to Edge Bands, evenly sp beads about ¾ inch apart, stitching through each bead twice to secure. Do not carry thread more than 3 beads across.

Fringe

Cut 192 strands of yarn each 20 inches in length. Holding 3 strands tog, fold in half, with size I hook, pull fold through, pull ends through fold. Pull to tighten.

Evenly sp 32 Fringe across each short edge, including ends of Edge Bands. **C!**

4 sts = 2 inches; 4 rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Cross-stitch (cross-st): Sk next st, hdc in next st, hdc in st just sk.

SCARF

Row 1: With size H hook, ch 102, hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (101 hdc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), **cross-st** (see Special Stitch) across, turn. (50 cross-sts)

Row 3: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Rows 5 & 6: Rep rows 3 and 2.

Row 7: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of first 2 sts, [(dc, ch 3, dc) in next st, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] across, ending with dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 8: Ch 5, (3 dc, ch 3, dc) in each ch-3 sp across, 3 dc in last st, turn.

Row 9: Ch 5, (3 dc, ch 3, dc) in each ch-3 sp across, ending with 3 dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.

Rows 10–13: Rep row 9.

Row 14: Ch 2, hdc in each dc across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.

Rows 15–20: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times.

Closing row: Fold in half with ends of rows tog, working through both thicknesses, evenly sp 40 sc across. Fasten off.

BEANIE

Rnd 1: With size J hook, ch 4, 9 dc in 4th ch from hook, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg ch-4. (10 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (20 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts] 3 times, 2 dc in last st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (25 dc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, [2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 3 sts] 5 times, 2 dc in next st, dc in last st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (31 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, [sk next st, dc in next st, dc in st just sk, dc in next st] 10 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 6: Ch 3, [sk next st, dc in next st, dc in st

just sk, 2 dc in next dc] 10 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (41 sts)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, [sk next st, dc in next st, dc in st just sk] 20 times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnds 8–11: Rep rnd 7.

Rnd 12: Ch 3, dc in next st, [(dc, ch 3, dc) in next st, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] 9 times, (dc, ch 3, dc) in next st, dc in each of last 2 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

- Metallic embroidery floss (6 plies, 8¾ yds per skein):
2 skeins silver
- Size C/2/2.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Embroidery needle
- Sewing needle
- Beading needle
- White sewing thread
- Beading thread
- Swarovski 17704 SS29 XILION silver-plated setting with 2 holes, crystal AB, 6.5 x 6.5 x 6.0mm (*crystal and setting come in 1 piece*): 15
- ¾ x 1½-inch hook-and-loop fastener

GAUGE

1 strand black and 1 strand silver floss held tog: 6 sts = 1 inch; 8 rows = 1 inch





PATTERN NOTES

Hold 1 strand black crochet cotton and 1 strand silver floss together throughout unless otherwise stated.

When changing colors, always change in last stitch. Do not fasten off color not in use. Carry color along top of row and work stitches over color not in use until pattern indicates use of color.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 8 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

CUFF

Flower

Make 3.

Cut 1 skein silver floss in half. Separate out 4 strands.

With 4 strands silver, ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, [ch 3, 2 tr in ring, ch 3, sl st in ring] 5 times. Fasten off. (5 petals)

Background

Row 1 (RS): Separate 2 rem strands of silver floss, with 1 strand silver and 1 strand black (see Pattern Notes) held tog, ch 47, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (45 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sts,

SKILL LEVEL  INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given fit size small; changes for medium and large are in [].

FINISHED GARMENT

MEASUREMENTS

3 inches across Hand x 8 inches long (*small*) [3¾ inches across Hand x 9 inches long (*medium*), 4¼ inches across Hand x 9½ inches long (*large*)]

MATERIALS

- Cascade Yarns Venezia medium (worsted) weight wool/silk yarn (3½ oz/218 yds/100g per hank):
1 [1, 2] hank(s) #174 mulberry
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

5 dc = 1 inch; 4 rows = 1½ inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Gloves are worked same for right and left hands except for optional finger loop.

Because gloves are worked in rounds, stitches will shift slightly; use increases to keep front post double crochet stitches for ruffles straight and in right places.



Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

GLOVE

Make 2.

Hand

Rnd 1: Loosely ch 28 [32, 36], sl st in first ch

to form ring being careful not to twist ch, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (28 [32, 36] dc)

Rnds 2–4 [2–4, 2–5]: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 5 [5, 6]: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, ch 12 [15, 15] for thumb shaping, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (1 ch lp, 28 [32, 36] dc)

Rnd 6 [6, 7]: Ch 3, go back and sl st in 10th

[12th, 12th] ch of ch lp, dc in each dc around including same dc as ch lp, sl st in 3rd ch of ch lp and in each of next 4 [7, 7] chs, **do not join**.

Large & X-Large Sizes Only

Rnd [7, 8]: Dc in each dc around, sl st in 3rd sl st of ch lp and in each of next 2 sl sts, **do not join**.

All Sizes

Rnd 7 [8, 9]: Dc in each dc around, sc in top of rem ch lp, **do not join**. (29 [33, 37] sts)

Rnd 8 [9, 10]: Dc in each dc around to last dc, hdc in last dc, join in dc.

Arm

Rnd 1: Ch 3, dc in each of next 11 [13, 15] dc, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, fpdc around next dc, dc in each of next 12 [14, 16] sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (29 [36, 37] sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc and fpdc around each fpdc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Next rnds: [Rep rnd 2] 10 [12, 13] times, keep trying Glove on as you work and adding incs as needed for snug fit, and at same time, work at least 2 incs between fpdcs in last few rnds.

Next rnd: Ch 3, dc in each st around, inc if needed, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Last rnd: Ch 1, working from left to right, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around, join in first reverse sc. Fasten off.

First Ruffle

Getting started: Holding the Glove with the 2 lines of fpdc facing and finger edge up, the 1 on your right is First Ruffle, the 1 on your left is 2nd Ruffle. The center is RS.

Row 1: With RS facing, join in end fpdc of rnd 14 [16, 17] of Arm, turn to work across line of fpdc, ch 2, 2 hdc around same fpdc, 3 hdc around each fpdc across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, 2 hdc in next hdc, [hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first hdc, hdc in each hdc across, sl st in Glove Hand at base of fpdc row. Fasten off.

2nd Ruffle

Getting started: With RS facing, join in end



fpdc of rnd 1 of Arm, turn to work across line of fpdc.

Rows 1–2: Rep rows 1–2 of First Ruffle.

Row 3: Ch 2, sl st in Glove Hand at base of fpdc row, hdc in each hdc across. Fasten off.

Hand Edging

Working in starting ch on opposite of rnd 1, join in any st, loosely sl st around edge working optional ch 15 [17, 20] in center back of Hand for finger lp if desired, join in first sl st. Fasten off. **C!**

7 balls #5004 tidal foam
- Outback Fibers Merino Wool roving (20 oz/57g) per package):
1 package #ME30 Sydney harbor
- Sizes G/6/4mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

Size H hook: 13 sts = 4 inches; 14½ rows = 4 inches over sc

Size H hook: 14½ sts = 4 inches; 9 rows = 4 inches over cls

PATTERN NOTES

Tease roving gently until when slightly twisted, it resembles bulky yarn. Tug roving into 4-inch lengths, but do not cut, using alternately 10 and 11 lengths of roving per row. The longer and thicker the roving lengths, the more cushy the lining.

Chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Roving stitch (roving st): Working in 3 sts, lay roving piece next to last st worked, with



1 inch to back, with yarn sc in next st, bring longer end of roving to back, insert hook in next st, lay roving over hook and pull to front, complete sc with yarn, bring roving to front, sc in next st with yarn, bring roving to back.

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 5 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

PATTERN

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each st across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 2, dc in next st, **cl** (see Special Stitches) in next st, [dc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st] across to last 2 sts, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 3: Rep row 1.

Row 4: Ch 2, [dc in each of next 3 sts, cl in next st] across to last 4 sts, dc in each of last 4 sts, turn.

Rep rows 1–4 alternately for Pattern.

HAND WARMER

Row 1 (RS): With size H hook, ch 69, sc in 2nd

ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (68 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, **roving st** (see Special Stitches), [sc in each of next 3 sts, roving st] across to last 2 sts, sc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sts, [roving st, sc in each of next 3 sts] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

Row 6: Rep row 2.

Next rows: Rep rows 3–6 consecutively for pattern until piece measures 8 inches from beg, ending with either row 4 or row 6.

Pocket-hole row: Ch 1, sc in each of first 23 sts, ch 22, sk next 22 sts, sc in each of next 23 sts, turn.

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn.

Cuff-hole row: Ch 1, sc in each of first 12 sts, *ch 11, sk next 11 sts*, sc in each of next 22 sts, rep between * once, sc in each st across, turn.

Inc row: Using size G hook, working across sts

and chs, ch 1, dc in first st, [2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 7 sts] 7 times, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of last 3 sts, turn. (77 sts)

Next rows: Beg at row 2, work in Pattern until work measures 24 inches from beg, ending with row 2 or row 4 of Pattern, turn.

Edging rnd: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, [sc in each st across to corner st, 3 sc in corner st, evenly sp sc in ends of rows across] twice working in corner st, sc in corner st where rnd beg, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Pocket

Row 1: With RS facing and size H hook, and with roving panel at bottom of work, join at right-hand edge of Pocket hole, ch 1, sc in each of next 22 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures 10 inches from Pocket edge ending with RS row, turn.

Joining row: [Sc in next st of Pocket and in next st of Pocket edge at same time] across. Fasten off.

Sl st ends of rows tog on each side of Pocket.

Cuff

Row 1: Using size G hook, join at 1 end of Cuff hole, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across (10 sc), sl st in each of next 2 sts on Hand Warmer, turn.

Next row: Working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sk sl sts, sc in each of next 10 sts, turn.

Next row: Working in back lps, ch 1, sc in each of next 10 sts, sl st in each of next 2 sts on Hand Warmer, turn.

Next rows: Rep last 2 rows around Cuff hole joining with sl sts to Hand Warmer as you go.

Joining row: Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 and in sts of last row at same time, sl st in each st across. Fasten off.

Rep on rem Cuff hole.

Buttonhole Edge

Fold over 8 inches of roving section so WS are tog, sew 7 inches down each side edge leaving 1 inch of roving section loose to fold under.

A GORGEOUS, SPARKLY YARN IN A SOPHISTICATED COLORWAY TURNS SIMPLE STITCHWORK INTO AN INTERESTING SCARF THAT CAN BE MADE IN JUST A FEW HOURS. THE EDGING IS CLEVERLY CREATED AS THE SCARF IS CROCHETED.

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

6½ inches wide x 70 inches long

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Boutique Midnight medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool/nylon/metallic polyester yarn (2½ oz/153 yds/70g per ball):

3 balls #1945 shadow

- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle



GAUGE

15 pattern sts = 4 inches; 15 pattern rows = 4 inches



PATTERN NOTES

Scarf is worked in decreasing rows off of base foundation; each triangle after that is worked off the back spine of previous triangle.

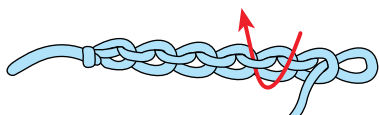
Work fewer triangles and add ¾-inch buttons to create a neck cozy or work more triangles to make longer Scarf.

The decreasing edge on first triangle is the same side as beginning end.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SCARF

Row 1: Ch 33, working in **back bar** (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, **do not turn**. (32 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2 (bottom edging): Ch 3, sl st in end of row 1, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, ch 1, [sk next ch, (sc, hdc, sc) in next ch, sk

next ch, sl st in next ch] 8 times, ch 3, sl st in first st of row 1.

Row 3: Working across sts of row 1, ch 2, [sk next st, sc in next st, ch 1] 15 times, sk next st, sc in last st of row, turn. (16 sc, 15 ch-1 sps, 1 ch-2 sp)

Row 4: Ch 2, [sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] across to last sc and ch-2 sp, sc in ch-2 sp, turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, [sk next st, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] across to last ch-1 sp, sc in ch-1 sp, turn. (15 sc, 14 ch-1 sps, 1 ch-2 sp)

Rows 6–34: [Rep rows 4 and 5 alternately] 14 times, ending last rep with row 4.

Row 35: Ch 1, working in ends of rows along the short edge of triangle, sc in side of 32 rows, turn. (32 sc)

Row 36: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 3–36 consecutively] 6 times.

Next rows: Rep rows 3–35 once.

Next row (top edging): Ch 1, [sk next st, (sc, hdc, sc) in next st, sk next st, sl st next st] 8 times. Fasten off.

Finishing

Gently wet-block to measurements. **C!**

FINISHED SIZE

3 x 12 x 14 inches, excluding Strap

- Cascade 220 Heathers medium (worsted) weight Peruvian highland wool yarn (3½ oz/220 yds/100g per skein):
5 skeins #9441 plum 
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sewing thread to match fabric
- ¾ yd lining fabric
- ¼ yd double-sided fusible ultra-firm interfacing
- ½-inch buttons: 6
- Straight pins
- Stitch markers

GAUGE

15 patterns sts = 4 inches; 6 pattern rows = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

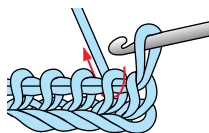
The Messenger Bag Body is created in 1 rectangle; the Strap is created separately and then sewn to Bag Body.

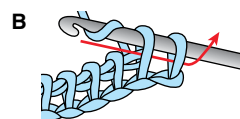
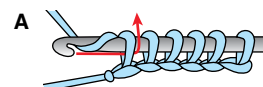

Rows 2–4: TKS (see *Special Stitches*) 5 times (6 lps on hook), insert hook in next st, pull lp



through st and through first lp on hook, work lps off hook.

Row 5: With 1 lp on hook, sl st front to back between 2 vertical bars of each st across (*block completed*).

BAG

Body

Row 1 (WS): Ch 60, 4 dc in 4th ch from hook, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch, [sk next 3 chs, 9 dc in next ch, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch] across, ending with 5 dc in last ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, [TKS block (*see Special Stitches*), sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st and in each st across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, **dc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 4 sts, ch 1 tightly to close dc dec, ch 3, sc in next sc, [ch 3, dc dec in next 9 sts, ch 1 tightly to close dc dec, ch 3, sc in next sc] across to last 5 sts, ch 3, dc dec in last 5 sts, ch 1 tightly to close dc dec, turn.

Row 5: Ch 3, 4 dc in top of last dc dec, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, sk next ch-3 sp, [9 dc in top of next dc dec, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, sk next ch-3 sp] across, ending with 5 dc in top of last dc dec, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2–5 consecutively until piece measures 35 inches, ending with row 4. At end of last row, fasten off.

Strap

Row 1: Ch 16, holding each lp on hook, pull up lp in each ch across; yo, pull through 1 lp on hook, **work lps off hook** (*see Special Stitches*).

Row 2: TKS across; yo, pull through 1 lp on hook, work lps off hook.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until Strap measures 80 inches from beg.

Last row: Sl st from front to back between 2 vertical bars of each st across. Fasten off. Block pieces if desired.

Flap Trim

With RS of Body facing, join with sc in top right corner, evenly sp 54 sc across top edge with 3 sc in corner, working in ends of rows, evenly

MATERIALS

- Stitch Nation Washable Ewe medium (worsted) weight superwash wool yarn (3½ oz/183 yds/100g per ball):
1 ball #3430 kitten
- Red Heart Boutique Sashay medium (worsted) weight acrylic/metallic polyester yarn (3½ oz/30 yds/100g per ball):
1 ball #1936 waltz
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 1-inch decorative button
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

16 sts = 4 inches; 16 rows = 4 inches
Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

Clutch is worked in a long rectangle from the bottom up, starting with 3 rows of single crochet, and then 2 rounds are made to create shaping. Beginning at the 4th round and continuing to the top of Clutch, work is created in spirals. Flap is crocheted separately and then sewn on.

When working with waltz yarn, trim raw end to neaten and then fold boxes or spaces so they make 5 stitches with skip 1 between

each stitch and work through first stitch and first boxes at same time, [skip next boxes, single crochet in next stitch and boxes at same time] across, fold to hide raw edges.

Ruffles are attached to back of single crochet round for each of work. Wrong side of kitten fabric is used as right side of finished Clutch.

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Cross-stitch (cross-st): Sk next st, dc in next st, dc in st just sk.

Double crochet, treble crochet cluster

(dc tr cl): Holding back last lp of each st, (dc, tr) as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Beginning double crochet, treble crochet decrease (beg dc tr dec): Ch 4, holding back last lp of each st on hook, ch 4, tr in next st, sk next st, dc in next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Double crochet, treble crochet decrease (dc tr dec): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, dc as indicated, sk next st, tr in next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

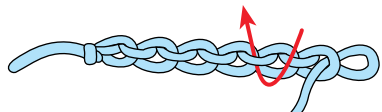
Treble crochet decrease (tr dec): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, tr as indicated in instructions, sk next 2 sts, 2 tr in next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.



CLUTCH

Body

Row 1: With kitten, ch 31, working in **back bar of ch** (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (30 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, **do not turn**.

Row 4: Working in ends of row, 2 sc in end of row 3, sc in end of row 2, 2 sc in end of row 1, place marker in first and 5th sc, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, sc in each ch across, working in ends of rows 2 sc in end of row 1, sc in end of row 2, 2 sc in end of row 3, place marker in first and 5th sc on last side, working in sts across row 3, sc in each st across, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (70 sc)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, 3 sc in first marked st, sc in each st across to next marked st, [3 sc in next marked st, sc in each st across to next marked st] around, join in beg sc, remove markers. Place marker in last st of this rnd. (78 sc)

Rnd 6: Working in continuous rnds, mark first st, ch 1, sc in each st around, **do not join**.

Rnds 7–13: Sc in each st around.

Ruffles

Rnd 14: Holding waltz with RS facing, working in 2nd row of boxes at top edge of waltz and in sts of row 13 at same time, **fold waltz over** (see Pattern Notes), sc in first st and first boxes, sk next boxes, [sc in next st and next box, sk next box] around.

Rnd 15: Working with kitten only, sc in each st around.

Rnd 16: Working with waltz and kitten at same time, sc in first st and box, sk next box, [sc in next st and next box, sk next box] around.

Rnds 17–35: [Rep rnds 15 and 16 alternately] 10 times, ending last rep with rnd 15.

LEG WARMERS

First Leg Warmer

Row 1 (WS): With size J hook and A, ch 44, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next



2 chs, *sk next 2 chs, sc in each of next 2 chs**, 3 sc in next ch, sc in each of next 2 chs, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 sc in last ch, **change color** (see *Stitch Guide*) to B in last sc, turn. **Fasten off** (see *Pattern Note*) A. (43 sts)

Row 2 (RS): With B, ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, *sk next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc**, 3 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 sc in last sc, change color to A in last sc, turn. Fasten off B.

Row 3: With A, ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, *sk next 2 sc, sc in each of next 2 sc**, 3 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, 2 sc in last sc, change color to B in last sc, turn. Fasten off A.

Rows 4–29: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 13 times. **Do not fasten off or change colors** at end of row 29, turn.

Row 30: Ch 1, sl st in first sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sk next 2 sc, *sc in each of next 2 sc**, sl st in next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc, sk next 2 sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sl st in last sc, turn. Fasten off. (31 sts)

Row 31: With RS facing (*WS of row 1*), working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, join A with sl st in first ch, sc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in next ch, *sk next 2 chs, sc in each of next 2 chs, sl st in next ch**, sc in each of next 2 chs, rep from * across, ending last rep at **. Fasten off.

2nd Leg Warmer

Row 1: With size J hook and A, ch 32, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 16 chs, change color to B, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (31 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first sc and in each of next 13 sc, change color to A, sc in each rem sc across, turn.

Rows 3–46: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, changing colors as shown in color chart. At end of last row, fasten off.

Ribbing

Make 4.

Row 1: With size H hook and C, ch 5, working in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in 2nd ch

Row 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn.

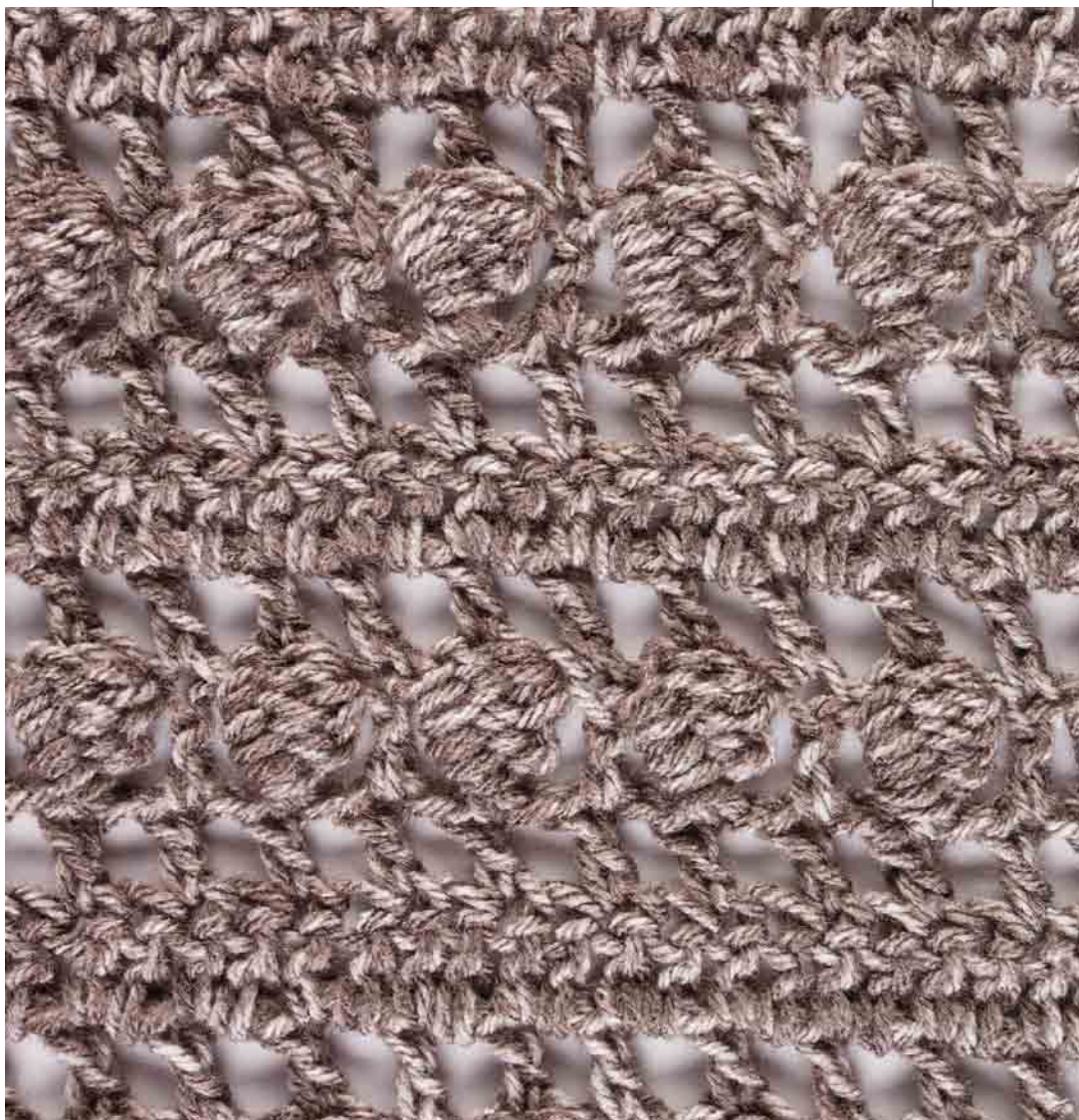

SKILL LEVEL  INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED SIZE

5½ inches wide x 10 inches long

MATERIALS

- Omega Hilos La Espiga size No. 24 medium weight nylon (7 oz/150 yds/200g per ball):
1 ball #18 brown
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Bamboo bag handles:
7-inch ring
7½-inch rings: 2
- Cellophane tape (*optional*)



GAUGE

12 sts = 4 inches; 16 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Work post stitch around post of stitch 2 rows below. Leave stitch behind post stitch unworked unless otherwise stated.

Work spike single crochet in stitch 3 rows below.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning post stitch decrease (beg post st dec): Insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, yo, insert hook around post of next st 2 rows below, yo, pull through, yo, pull through 2 lps on hook, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Spike single crochet (spike sc): Sc in next st 3 rows below.

BASKET ASSEMBLY

Top Handle: Holding both 7½-inch rings tog, wrap nylon around top of rings until 2 inches is covered. Fasten off, secure end.

Base: Measure and mark bottom 10 inches on both 7½-inch rings. Separate rings at bottom and then stand rings on top of 7-inch ring.

Optional: Use small amount of tape to attach bottom of 7½-inch rings to 7-inch ring to hold in place while wrapping.

Wrapping: For each side of Basket, in 10-inch marked area, wrap nylon around 7½-inch ring for 3½ inches. Then wrap nylon another 3 inches wrapping around 7½-inch and

7-inch rings, and continue wrapping around 7½-inch ring for another 3½ inches. Marked area of 7½-inch rings should be covered.

BASKET

Row 1 (RS): Ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (12 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, **fpdc** (*see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) around first st on row 2 rows below (*inc*), [sc in next st on this row, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (13 sts)

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below, [sc in next st on this row, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below] across to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (14 sts)

Rows 6 & 7: Rep row 2.

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first st, **spike sc** (*see Special Stitches and Pattern Notes*) in first st on row 3 rows below (*inc*), spike sc across, sc in last st on this row (*inc*), turn. (16 sts)

Rows 9 & 10: Rep row 2.

Row 11: Rep row 3. (17 sts)

Row 12: Rep row 2.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first st, [fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below, sc in next st on this row], turn.

Rows 14 & 15: Rep row 2.

Row 16: Ch 1, spike st across, turn.

Rows 17 & 18: Rep row 2.

Row 19: Rep row 13.

Rows 20–27: Rep rows 12–19.

Row 28: Rep row 2.

Row 29: Beg post st dec (*see Special Stitches*), [sc in next st, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below] across to last st, sc in last st, turn. (16 sts)

Row 30: Rep row 2.

Row 31: Ch 1, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in first 2 sts, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (14 sts)

Rows 32–34: Rep rows 16–18.

Row 35: Ch 1, sc in first st, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below, [sc in next st, fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below] across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (13 sts)

Rows 36 & 37: Rep rows 28 and 29. Do not turn at end of last row. (12 sts at end of last row)

Row 38: Working from left to right, ch 1, **reverse sc** (*see Stitch Guide*) across. Fasten off.

Row 39: Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, join with sl st in first ch to work from left to right, ch 1, reverse sc in each ch across. Fasten off.

Attach Basket to Basket Assembly, wrapping nylon through ends of Basket rows and over rings.

Handle


Row 1: Ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (7 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3 & 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, [fpdc around next st on row 2 rows below, sc in next st] across, turn.

Rows 6–8: Rep row 2. At end of last row, leaving long end, fasten off.

Place Handle over wrapped section at top of 7½-inch rings, sew row 1 to row 8, enclosing rings inside.

- Sew thread to match fabric
- ¾-inch decorative buttons: 3
- ⅝-inch decorative buttons: 2
- 16-inch square pillow form

GAUGE

Size I hook: 3 cls = 2 inches; 3 pattern rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Use I hook unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

PILLOW

Front

Row 1 (RS): With sunset and **size I hook** (see *Pattern Notes*), ch 52, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, turn. (26 sc, 25 ch-1 sps)

Row 2: Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), [cl (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next sc] across, ending with dc in last sc, turn. (25 cls, 2 dc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [sc in ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next cl] across, ending with sc in last st, turn. (26 sc, 25 ch-1 sps)

Rows 4–33: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 15 times and **at same time** work rows 15, 17, 19 and 21 in **back lps** (see *Stitch Guide*) and not in ch sps, rem rows will be worked as normal. At end of last row, fasten off.

Back

Work same as Front, but working all rows in ch sps. At end of last row, fasten off.

Short Ruffles

Row 1: Join (see *Pattern Notes*) ranch red in first unworked lp of row 17, ch 3, dc in same lp, 2 dc in each lp across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, turn.

Row 3 (Ruffle edging): Ch 3, sk first 2 sts, [sl st in next st, ch 3, sk next 2 sts] across, ending with sl st in next st. Fasten off.

Join ranch red in first unworked lp of row 19, rep rows 1–3.

Long Ruffles

Rows 1 & 2: Join ranch red in first unworked lp of row 15, rep rows 1 and 2 of Short Ruffle.

Row 3: Rep row 2 of Short Ruffle, turn.

Row 4 (Ruffle edging): Rep row 3 of Short Ruffle. Fasten off.

Join ranch red in first unworked lp of row 21. Rep rows 1–4.

Button Round

Make 5.

With size F hook and ranch red, ch 2, 9 sc in first ch, join in first sc. Fasten off.

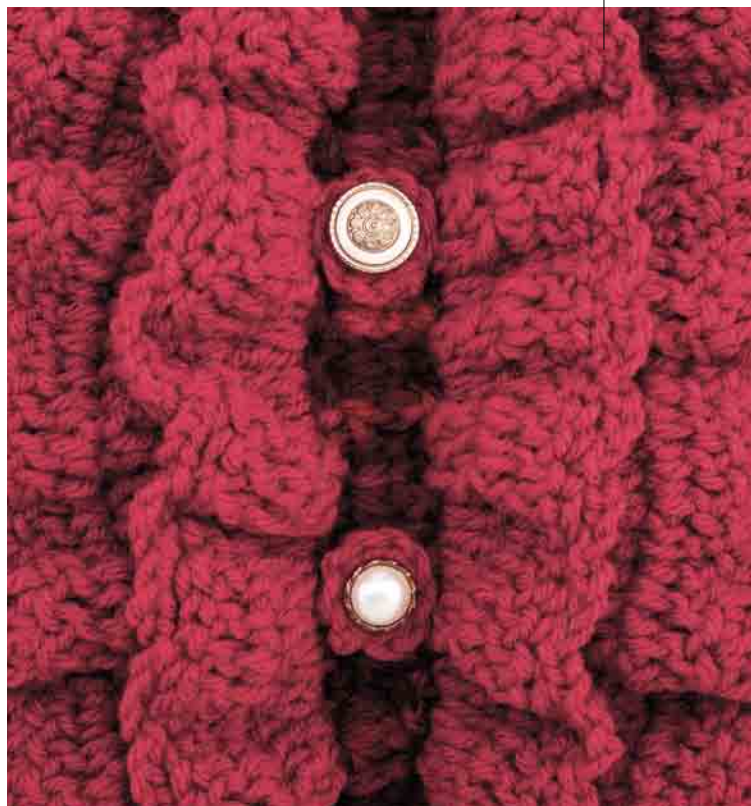
Place Button Rounds evenly sp down center of pillow between 2 Short Ruffles.

Place buttons on top of Button Rounds having 3 larger buttons on each end and in the center and 2 smaller buttons between.

Sew buttons and Rounds to center of Pillow with needle and thread.

Pillow Edging

Place Front and Back WS tog making sure edges are lined up. On 2 sides you will be working in ends of rows rather than in sts across; you will need to evenly sp your sts, so you have the same amount of sts on all sides. Working through both thicknesses, join ranch red in any corner of Pillow, *[ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across to next corner, ch 3**, (sc, ch 3, sc) in corner, rep from * twice, insert pillow form, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across, (sc, ch 3) in last corner join in beg sc. Fasten off. **C!**

- Crystal Palace Mendocino medium (worsted) weight merino wool/nylon yarn (1¾ oz/97 yds/50g per skein):
24 skeins #503 red rainbow
- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

Triangle = 8 x 10 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Triangles are joined together with slip stitches as they are worked.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning double crochet cluster (beg dc cl): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), holding back last lp of each st on hook, 2 dc in same place as beg ch-3, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Double crochet cluster (dc cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Treble crochet cluster (tr cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Picot (3-ch or 5-ch picot): Ch required number, sl st in top of last st worked.

Slip stitch join (sl st join): Place finished Triangle on right with RS up, ch required

number (1 for 3-ch picots or 2 for 5-ch picots), place hook over corresponding ch, put hook under the finished Triangle, yo, pull through, continue with required number of chs (1 for 3-ch picots or 2 for 5-ch picots), sl st at base to complete picot.

THROW

First Triangle

Rnd 1: Ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, **beg dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*), ch 5, [**dc cl** (see *Special Stitches*) in ring, ch 3, dc cl in ring, ch 5] twice, dc cl in ring, ch 3, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of beg cl. (6 dc cls)

Rnd 2: Sl st in first ch-5 sp, (beg cl, ch 4, **tr cl**—see *Special Stitches*, **5-ch picot**—see *Special Stitches*, ch 4, dc cl) in same ch sp as sl st, *ch 3, sk next dc cl, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, (dc cl, ch 4, tr cl, 5-ch picot, ch 4, dc cl) in next ch-5 sp, rep from * once, ch 3, sk next dc cl, next sc, ch 3, join in top of beg dc cl. (6 dc cls)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, *5 dc in next ch-4 sp, (2 dc, ch 5, 2 dc) in next ch-5 picot, 5 dc in next ch-4 sp, dc in next cl, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in next sc, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in next cl, rep from * twice, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (23 dc per side between ch-5 sps)

Rnd 4: Sl st in next dc, ch 4, [sk next dc, dc in next dc, 3-ch picot, ch 1] twice, sk next dc, dc in next dc, ch-3 picot, *ch 2, (dc cl, 3-ch picot, ch 4, tr cl, 5-ch picot, ch 4, dc cl, 3-ch picot, ch 2) in next ch-5 sp, (dc, 3-ch picot, ch 1) in next dc**, [sk next dc, dc in next dc, 3-ch picot, ch 1] 11 times, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, [sk next dc, dc in next dc, 3-ch picot, ch 1] across, join in 3rd ch, 3-ch picot. Fasten off. (12 dc and ch-3 picots per side)

SKILL LEVEL  EASY

FINISHED SIZE

9 inches in circumference x 12 inches tall

MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Recycled Cotton medium (worsted) weight recycled cotton/acrylic/other fiber yarn (3½ oz/185 yds/100g per ball):

1 ball #110 marine (1 ball will make several vase cozies)

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Cylindrical vase: 10 x 11 inches



GAUGE

3 pattern reps = 3½ inches; 5 pattern rows = 2 inches

PATTERN NOTE

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

VASE COZY

Row 1: Ch 51, dc in 4th ch from hook (*first 3 chs count as first dc*), [ch 5, sk next 5 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs] across, dc in each of last 2 chs, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc, [ch 5, sc in each of next 2 dc] across, ch 5, sc in last 2 dc, turn.

Row 3: **Ch 3** (*see Pattern Note*), dc in next sc, [ch 5, dc in each of next 2 sc] across, dc in each of last 2 sc, turn.

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POPCORN & POST STITCH COLUMNS AND RAISED CHEVRONS

DESIGNS BY ANNIE'S

"RAISE THE BAR" IN YOUR CROCHET WORK WITH A PATTERN OF VERTICAL POST-STITCH AND POPCORN COLUMNS, AND A RIBBED-LOOK CHEVRON OF ALTERNATING FRONT AND BACK POST-STITCH ROWS.



POPCORN & POST-STITCH COLUMNS

PATTERN NOTE

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Popcorn (pc): 5 dc as indicated in instructions, drop lp from hook, insert hook in first dc of dc group, pull dropped lp through, ch 1 tightly to secure.

Row 1: Ch in multiples of 16 plus 7, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each of next 3 chs, [ch 5, sk next 4 chs, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next ch,

sc in next ch, ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in each of next 5 chs] across, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Note*), **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 4 dc, [ch 5, dc in next ch sp, ch 1, **pc** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, dc in next ch sp, ch 5, fpdc around each of next 5 dc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 4 fpdc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 5, bpdc around each of next 5 fpdc] across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, fpdc around each of next 4 bpdc, [ch 5, dc in next ch sp, ch 1, pc in next ch-3 sp,

ch 1, dc in next ch sp, ch 5, fpdc around each of next 4 bpdc] across, turn.

Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately for pattern.

RAISED CHEVRON

PATTERN NOTE

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Shell: (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) as indicated in instructions.

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THE DOUBLE BULLION

chain, not including the original loop. In Photo 9, the double bullion stitch chains range in height from two chains to 14 chains. When transitioning to taller stitches, just pull the final loop out farther than usual (*see step 6 of the Basic Double Bullion Stitch*).

In the Purple Haze Shoulder Scarf pattern (page 24), the double bullion stitches are separated at the top by extra chains, which are covered with a decorative stitch pattern worked before the next double bullion stitch is worked. When working double bullion stitches

into a ring, use the above method to add space between the tops of the double bullion stitches at the outer edge.

Rows 10 & 11: Ch 1, sk first tr, sc in top of next cl, *ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, ch 8, sc in top of next cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, sk first tr, sc in top of next cl, *ch 4, 3-tr cl in next ch-4 sp, ch 9, sc in top of next cl, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 4, 3-dc cl in next ch-4 sp, tr in last sc, turn.

Large & X-Large Sizes Only

Row [13]: Rep row 12.

All Sizes

Row 13 [13, 14, 14]: Ch 1, sk first tr, *sc in top of next 3-tr cl, ch 1, hdc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, dc in next sc, ch 1, (dc, ch 1, hdc, ch 1, sc, ch 1) in next ch-9 sp, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, sc in top of next 3-tr cl, ch 1, hdc in ch-4 sp, ch 1, dc in last sc, turn. (99

[105, 111, 115] sts, 99 [105, 111, 115] ch-1 sps)

Trim

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, ch 5, hdc in first dc, work rem of rnd as follows:

- A. *Ch 1, sk next ch sp, hdc in next hdc, ch 1, sk next ch sp, [hdc in next sc, ch 1, sk next ch sp] twice, hdc in next hdc, ch 1, sk next ch sp, hdc in next dc, ch 1, sk next ch sp, hdc in next dc, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, ch 1, sk next ch sp, hdc in next hdc, ch 1, sk next ch sp, (hdc, ch 1, dc, **picot**—*see Special Stitches*, hdc, picot) in next sc;
- B. working in ends of rows across front edge, *(hdc, picot) twice in next row, hdc in next row, hdc in next row, picot, rep from * 5 [5, 6, 6] times, (hdc, picot) twice in next corner st;
- C. working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, *hdc in ch at base of next 3-dc cl, picot, hdc in next ch sp, picot, rep from * 15 [16, 17, 18] times, hdc in ch at base of next 3-dc cl, picot, (hdc, picot) twice next in corner st;

- D. working in ends of rows, *(hdc, picot) twice in next row, hdc in next row, picot, rep from * 5 [5, 6, 6] times, hdc in next row, picot, join with sl st in 4th ch of beg ch-5. (178 [186, 200, 206] hdc, 96 [102, 108, 114] ch-1 sps, 78 [80, 88, 90] picots)

Row 2: Now working in rows, ch 5, **double bullion st** (*see Special Stitches*) around ch-5, *leaving rem lp on hook, insert hook in next hdc on rnd 1 of Trim, yo, pull up lp, ch 8, pull last ch through rem lp from previous double bullion st (ch-8 sp made), ch 1, (sc, hdc, dc, **htr**—*see Special Stitches*, tr, htr, dc, hdc, sc, sl st) in ch-8 sp, push all sts onto top 3 chs of ch-8, double bullion st around rem 5 chs of ch-8, rep from * across to last sp before corner dc of previous rnd, at the end of last rep, leaving 4-inch end, fasten off and pull final lp completely out of last double bullion st. Weave in end around last st from last double bullion st then through lps from rem 12 sts of last double bullion st. Weave in end. (106 double bullion sts)

Frogs**Left Side**

Rnd 1: Ch 14, dc in 7th ch from hook, dc in

each rem ch across, ch 3, working on opposite side of beg ch-14, (sl st, sc) in first ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in each of next 3 chs, 3 tr in next ch, picot, ch 4, sl st in next ch, (sc, hdc, dc, htr, picot, htr, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-6 sp, sl st in next dc.

Row 2: Now working in rows, ch 4, picot, 3 tr in next st, tr in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next ch-3 sp. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Right Side

Rnd 1: Ch 14, dc in 7th ch from hook, dc in each rem ch across, ch 8 (*button lp*), working in rem lps on opposite side of beg ch-14, (sl st, sc) in first ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in each of next 3 chs, 3 tr in next ch, picot, ch 4, sl st in next ch, (sc, hdc, dc, htr, picot, htr, dc, hdc, sc) in next ch-6 sp, sl st in next dc.

Row 2: Now working in rows, ch 4, picot, 3 tr in next st, tr in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next

ch-3 sp. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Finishing

Lay out Shoulder Warmer, using schematic as a guide.

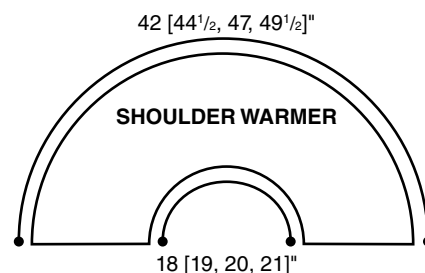
Block as follows: Lay damp press cloth over Shoulder Warmer and barely touch a hot iron to the press cloth.

Block Frogs the same way. Allow pieces to cool and dry out.

Sew Frogs at the top of the neck opening with their bases at the top corners of the Shoulder Warmer.

Use the long chain at the base of the Right Side Frog as button loop. **C!**



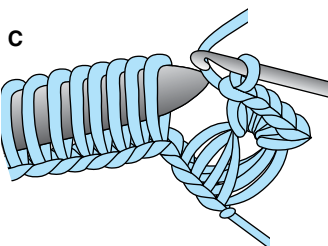
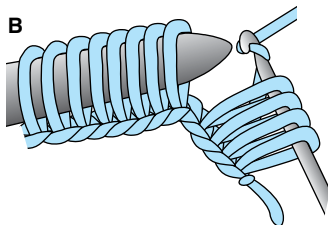
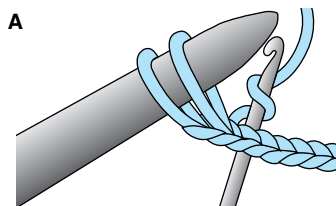

Top Lace Edging

Set-up row: Work 2 sc in corner, evenly sp 4 in end of rows across Front Edge, evenly sp 180 [184, 188, 192, 196] sc across top edge, evenly sp 4 sc in ends of rows across rem Front Edge, 2 sc in corner, turn.

Next row: Working in front lps, ch 1, sc in each st across, **do not turn**. You will have WS of work facing.



Broomstick Lace (4 loop)

Broomstick Lace

Row 1: Widen lp on the crochet hook and insert knitting needle in lp with yarn held in back of needle, [insert hook in next st, yo, pull up through st and place lp on knitting needle (*see A on illustration*)] across row. (192 [196, 200, 204, 208] lps on knitting needle)

Row 2: Insert hook in first 4 lps and remove from knitting needle (*see B on illustration*), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1 to close, ch 3, 3 dc in same lp set, *yo, insert hook in next 4 lps and remove from knitting needle, yo, pull through lps taken off needle, yo and pull through 2 lps, yo, pull through last 2 lps on hook (*first dc*), 3 dc in same lp set, rep from * across, working off 4 lps from knitting needle each time with 4 dc in each lp set, **do not turn**.

Next rows: [Rep rows 1 and 2] twice. At end of last row, turn.

Last row: Ch 1, [sc in each of next 3 dc, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next dc] across, ending with sc in each of last 3 dc. Fasten off.

Bottom Lace Edging

First rows: With RS facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in right-hand corner, work same as for Top Lace Edging, completing set-up row and next row of sc, ending with WS facing. **Do not turn.**

Next row (RS): Working in front lps, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next row (WS): Working in back lps, ch 1, sc in each st across.

Last row: Working in front lps, ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Sleeve

Make 2.

Set-up row: Ch 33 [33, 37, 37, 37], sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn.

Next row: Ch 3, (3 dc, ch 2, sl st) in next sc, [sk next 3 sc, (4 dc, ch 2, sl st) in next sc] across, ending with pattern rep in next to last sc, dc in last sc, turn.

Next rows: Work in pattern until piece

measures 6 [6, 6½, 6½, 7] inches from beg.

Inc row: Work 4 [4, 5, 5, 5] pattern reps, (2 dc, ch 2, sl st) in sp between next 2 pattern reps (½ *pattern inc*), work last 4 [4, 5, 5, 5] pattern reps, turn.

Next row: Work pattern in each ch-2 sp across, turn. (9 [9, 10, 10, 10] *pattern reps*)

Next rows: Work in pattern until piece measures 11 [11, 11½, 11½, 12] inches from beg.

Next row (inc): Work 5 pattern reps, (2 dc, ch 2, sl st) in sp between next 2 pattern reps (½ *pattern inc*), work final 4 [4, 5, 5, 5] pattern reps, turn.

Next row: Work pattern in each ch-2 sp across, turn. (10 [10, 11, 11, 11] *pattern reps*)

Next rows: Work in pattern until piece measures 15 [15, 15½, 15½, 16] inches from beg, turn.

Sleeve Cap Shaping

Row 1: Sl st in first ch-2 sp, sl st in each of next 3 dc, dc in next st, work pattern in next ch-2 sp, work pattern in each of next 8 [8, 9, 9, 9] ch-2 sps, ending with dc in 4th dc from

hook, turn. (1 *pattern rep dec at each edge*)

Row 2: Sl st in first ch-2 sp, sl st in each of next 3 dc, dc in next st, work pattern in each of next 5 [5, 6, 6, 6] ch-2 sps, ending in dc in 4th dc from hook, turn. (1 *pattern rep dec at each edge*)

Next rows: Rep row 2 until 3 pattern reps are rem.

Last row: [Sl st in next ch-2 sp, sl st in each of next 3 dc] across. Fasten off.

Sleeve Edging

Set-up row: With WS facing, join at bottom right-hand corner, evenly sp 32 [32, 36, 36, 36] sc across edge.

Next rows: Work 2 rows of Broomstick Lace as for Body. At end of last row, turn.

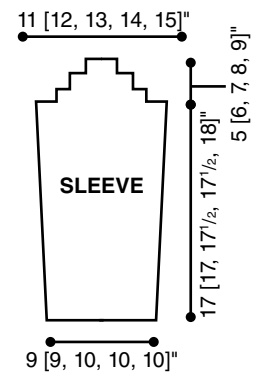
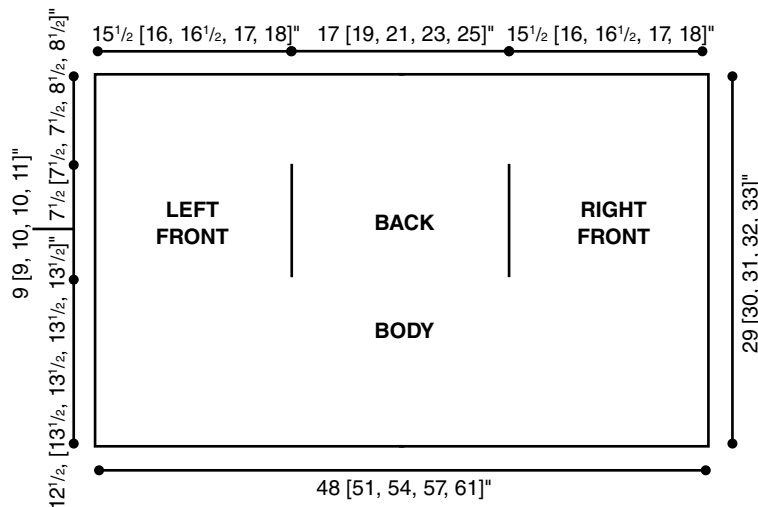

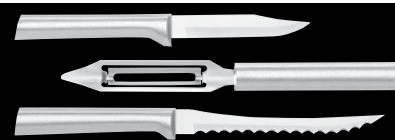

Row [41]: Sl st in each of first [3, 3, 5] sts, hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] [2, 3, 4] times, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] [2, 3, 4] times, ch 1, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] [3, 4, 5] times, hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, [ch 1, sk next st, hdc in next st] [2, 3, 4] times, leave rem sts unworked, turn. ([31, 39, 47] sts)

All Sizes

Row 42: Ch 2, working in each st and ch-1 sp, sk next st, hdc in each of next 2 [3, 4, 5, 6, 7] sts, sk in each of next 3 sts, hdc in each of next 6 [7, 8, 9, 10, 11] sts, 3 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 6 [7, 8, 9, 10, 11] sts, sk next 3 sts, hdc in each st across to last 2 sts, sk next st, hdc in last st, turn. (21 [25, 29, 33, 37, 41] sts)

Row 43: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 1 [2, 3, 4, 5, 6] st(s), sk next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7, 8, 9, 10] sts, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, sk next st, hdc in each of next 5 [6, 7, 8, 9, 10] sts, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each st across, turn. (17 [21, 25, 29, 33, 37] sts)

Note: Place marker in the center st of the 3-hdc group for "peak." Move marker up as work progresses.

Row 44: Ch 2, hdc in each of first 1 [2, 3, 4, 5, 6] st(s), sk next 2 sts, hdc in each st across to 1 st before marker, sk next st, 3 hdc in next st, sk next st, hdc in each st across to last 4 [5, 6, 7, 8, 9] sts, sk next 2 sts, hdc in each st across to last st, 2 hdc in last st, turn. (15 [19, 23, 27, 31, 35] sts)

Next row(s): Rep last row 1 [1, 2, 4, 5, 6] more time(s). (13 [17, 19, 19, 21, 23] sts at end of last row)

Next row: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

Last row: Sl st in first st, hdc in each st across to last st, sl st in last st. Fasten off. (11 [15, 17, 17, 19, 21] sts)

Assembly

Sew Shoulder seams.

Sew in Sleeves.

Sew side and Sleeve seams.

Collar

Row 1: With WS of Jacket facing, join B in center st of 2nd 3-hdc group from Front top corner, ch 2, working across Front, Back and other Front neck edges, hdc in each st across to center st of last 3-hdc group, working each "valley" and "peak" as follows: at each valley work [hdc dec (see *Stitch Guide*)] twice, beg 2 sts before each peak, work 2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next st, turn.



Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, working hdc dec in next 2 sts at each valley, turn.

Rows 3–8: Ch 2, hdc in each st across, turn.

Rows 9 & 10: Sl st in each of first 2 sts, hdc in each st across to last 2 sts, leave last 2 sts unworked, turn. Fasten off.

Row 11: With RS of Collar facing (*RS of Collar is WS of Jacket*), join C with sc in Front top corner, evenly sp sc across top edge and Collar edge to opposite Front corner. Fasten off.

Row 12: With RS of Collar facing, join A with sc in first st of row 11, sc in each st across. Fasten off. **C!**

Pocket

Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 31, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 6 chs, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, ending with sc in last ch, turn. (30 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, work in pattern across to last 6 sts, working in back lps, sc in each of last 6 sts, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each of first 6 sts, work in pattern across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately until piece measures 4 [4½, 5, 5½, 6] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

Finishing

Sew 1 Pocket to each Front as shown in photo.

Sew bottom button approximately 6 inches

above bottom ribbing and just beside Ribbed Panel on left Front. Sew 2nd button 3 inches above first button.

Rnd 1: With size G hook, ch 1, sc in first st, sk next st, **shell** (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next st, [sc in next st, sk next st, shell in

next st, sk next st] around, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in first sc, **turn**. (42 [46, 50, 56, 61, 65, 70] shells, 42 [46, 50, 56, 61, 65, 70] sc)

Rnd 2: Sl st across to dc of first shell, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, shell in next sc, [sc in dc of next shell, shell in next sc] around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 2, (dc, hdc) in same st as beg ch-2 (counts as first shell), sc in dc of next shell, [shell in next sc, sc in dc of next shell] around, join in top of beg ch-2.

Next rnds: [Rep rnds 2 and 3 alternately] until Main Skirt measures 6 [5, 5, 5, 4, 4, 3] inches from beg of Main Skirt.

st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (336 [368, 400, 448, 488, 520, 560] dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, evenly sp inc 20 dc, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (356 [388, 420, 468, 508, 540, 580] dc)

Next rows: [Rep rnd 2] 4 [5, 6, 7, 7, 8, 8] times.

Last rnd: Sl st in each st around, join in first sl st. Fasten off.

Waistband Edging

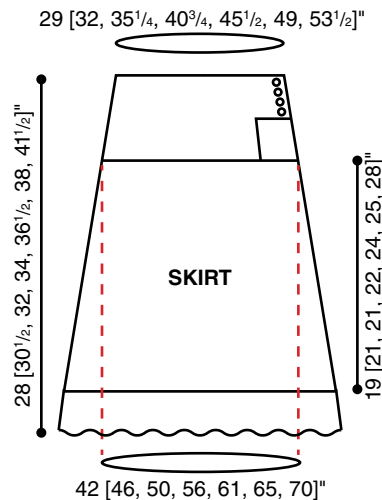

With WS of Body and Strap facing out, pin 1 open Strap end to left side of Body, measuring 14 inches from top front of Body, 3 inches for bottom of Bag and 14 inches up Body back, stopping at fold line.

Do same for other side of Bag.

Make any adjustments necessary, and then sew in place.

Buttons

Turn Bag RS out, with front of Bag facing.

Using Flap as guide, place pins on Bag front for button placement 2 inches from top edge of front.

Sew buttons in place.

Lining

Cut piece of lining fabric 15 x 32 inches. Sew ½-inch hem on each short side of rectangle.

Fold in half width-wise with RS tog. Sew side edges tog leaving top edges open for top.

With WS of both Bag and Lining facing out, slip Lining onto Bag.

Fold each bottom corner of Lining and tack in place along Lining bottom creating square bottom corners.

Slip Lining off Bag. Turn Lining RS out and slip back onto WS of Bag.

Pin top of Lining to Bag along front top, sides and along inside fold line of Flap.

Sew Lining to Bag,

Turn Bag RS out.

Bag Bottom Insert

Cut piece of fusible interfacing 2½ x 13 inches. Cut 2 pieces of lining fabric same size as interfacing.

Place interfacing between 2 fabric pieces.

You may wish to turn 1 fabric piece WS out to designate right and wrong sides of Insert.

With iron on wool setting, carefully iron both sides of Insert to initially set fabric in place,

using quick movements with very little pressure; then, place damp cloth on top of 1 side of Insert, and with hot iron on dry setting, iron across insert to permanently fuse fabric to interfacing.

Remove cloth, turn Insert over and rep on other side.

Remove damp cloth, and with iron once more on wool setting, run across each side of Insert.

Let cool. Trim any rough edges.

Place Insert in bottom of Bag. **C!**

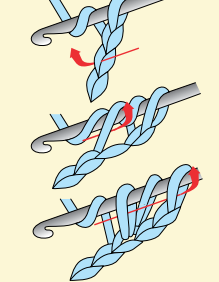
Front post stitch (fp): Back post stitch (bp): When working post st, insert hook from right to left around post of st on previous row.



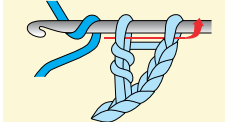
Chain color change (ch color change) Yo with new color, draw through last lp on hook.



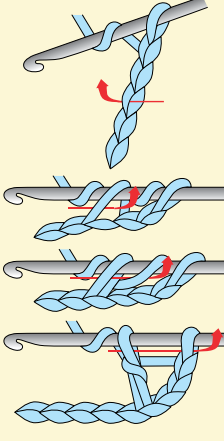
Half double crochet (hdc): Yo, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook.



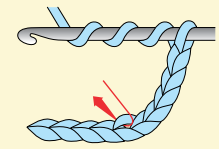
Double crochet color change (dc color change) Drop first color, yo with new color, draw through last 2 lps of st.



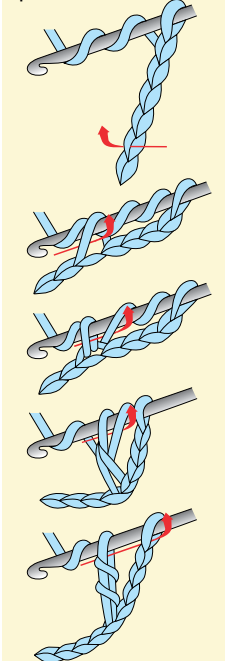
Double crochet (dc): Yo, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, [yo, pull through 2 lps] twice.



Double treble crochet (dtr): Yo 3 times, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, [yo, pull through 2 lps] 4 times.



Treble crochet (tr): Yo twice, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, [yo, pull through 2 lps] 3 times.

THE LEGACY OF ELIZABETH HIDDLESON

Elizabeth Hiddleson was a talented and prolific designer of crochet thread patterns. She died in 2003 at the age of 101, leaving behind an impressive legacy of designs that no other designer can equal in quantity and originality.

During her long career, Elizabeth designed and self-published 59 pattern books and hundreds of individual patterns. She began as a freelance designer in the 1930s, selling her work to publishers and thread companies. In those days, thread companies did not credit designers by name. Elizabeth wanted her name to appear with her designs, so she began printing and selling her own creations.

Her patterns were all printed from the actual finished pieces, photographed on a black background so that every stitch could be seen, and included written instructions.

Her first patterns were sold by direct mail through 25-cent ads in weekly newspapers. These were so successful that she began advertising in *Workbasket*, a popular magazine of the time, which brought in so many orders that she had to set up a family production line at home to fill them. Employed full time at the dockyards in Vallejo, Calif., she designed, wrote instructions, filled and mailed her pattern orders, all while raising two children.
