The clever folks at Clover have come up with yet another useful product. The Elastic Yarn Thread is an ultra-thin, carry-along elastic that helps your fabric keep its shape. Put it in socks and cuffs to maintain their "hug." Use it with cotton, rayon and bamboo fibers that lack inherent elasticity. The off-white thread is thin enough not to affect your gauge, so you can use it in some spots and not in others, as needed. Elastic yarn thread comes in 98 -yard spools, but the
thread grows to more than twice its length when stretched.

It can be used on finished projects too. Just double or triple the thread, use a tapestry needle to thread it through the wrong side of saggy spots like droopy sleeve cuffs, snug up the problem spot and tie off the thread. ## A WINNER IN THE 2012 CROCHET GUILD OF AMERICA DESIGN COMPETITION, THIS AMAZING DESIGN SHOWCASES A SPECTACULAR WINDMILL PATTERN THAT ENCOMPASSES THE ENTIRE PIECE. ADD SNAPS TO EASILY CREATE ARMHOLES FOR A SHRUG, OR LEAVE THE PIECE COMPLETELY OPEN FOR A WRAP.

## (1) (2)34) (5) mask

## FINISHED SIZE

51 inches in diameter

## MATERIALS

- Newton's Yarn Country Dazzle
 2 light (light worsted) weight rayon/wool/metallic yarn ( $61 / 20 z / 830$ yds/184g per skein):

1 skein each taupe iridescent and ecru

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hooks
- Sewing needle
- Ecru sewing thread
- Small snaps: 2
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Shrug can be made to desired length. It can also be worn without snaps as a shawl.
Each repeat is increased by adding 1 single crochet and also adding chain-1 as indicated which is crocheted in back loops unless otherwise stated.
Work in continuous rounds, do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.
Mark first stitch of round.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

Slip ring: Leaving 4-inch end on yarn,
lap yarn over 4-inch end forming $\mid \mathrm{p}$, insert hook through Ip, insert hook through Ip from front to back, yo (see step 1), pull through Ip to form ring, yo, pull through Ip on hook (see step 2).

## SHRUG

Rnd 1: With taupe, make slip ring (see Special Stitch), 12 dc in ring, do not join (see Pattern Notes), pull ring to close. (12 dc)
Rnd 2: 2 dc in each sp between dc around. (24dc)
Rnd 3: Working rem rnds in back lps (see Stitch Guide), [sc in each of next 3 sts, ch 3, sk next st] around, mark to last ch-3 sp between sc groups.
Rnd 4: [Sk next sc, sc in each of next 2 sc , 2 sc in next ch sp, ch 4] around. (4 sc between each (h sp)

Rnd 5: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 5] around. ( 5 sc between each ch $s p$ )
Rnd 6: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 6] around. ( 6 sc between each ch $s p$ )
Rnd 7: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 7] around. (7 sc between each ch $s p$ )



Rnd 8: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2 s c$ in ch $s p$, ch 7] around. Fasten off. ( 8 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 9: Sk first st, join ecru with sc in next st, sc in each st across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 8, [sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 9] around. (9 sc between each ch $s p$ )
Rnd 10: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 9] around. Fasten off. (10 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 11: Sk first st, join taupe with sc in next $s t, s c$ in each st across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 9, [sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 9] around.
(11 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 12: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $\mathrm{sp}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in ch sp , ch 9] around.
( 12 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 13: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 10] around.
(13 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 14: Rep rnd 13. (14 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 15: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 11] around.
(15 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 16: Rep rnd 15. (16 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 17: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 12] around.
(17 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 18: Rep rnd 17. (18 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 19: [Sk next sc , sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 13] around. (19 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 20: Rep rnd 17. (20 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 21: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch $s p$, ch 14] around. Fasten off. (21 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 22: Sk first st, join ecru with sc in next $s t$, $s c$ in each st across to next ch $s p, 2 s c$ in ch sp, ch 14, [sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch $s p, 2$ sc in ch sp, ch 14] around.
(22 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 23: [Sk next sc, sc in each sc across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch sp, ch 15] around. Fasten off. ( 23 sc between each ch sp)
Rnd 24: Sk first st, join taupe with sc in next st, sc in each st across to next ch sp, 2 sc in ch

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

$71 / 4$ inches wide $\times 251 / 2$ inches long

## materials

- Aunt Lydia's Fashion Crochet size 3 crochet cotton ( 100 yds per ball): 1 ball \#932 island multi
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge


## GAUGE

15 sts $=4$ inches; 7 rows $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTE

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SCARF

Row 1: Ch 33, dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs count as first dc), ch 6, sk next 6 chs, $d c$ in each of next 15 chs, ch 6 , sk next 6 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, turn. (2 ch-6 sps, 19 dc )
Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Note), dc in next st, ch 3 , sc around both ch- 6 sps of beg sk chs and row 1, ch 3, dc in each of next 15 sts, ch 3 , sc around both ch- 6 sps of beg sk chs and row 1, ch 3, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 6, sk next ch-3, next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in each of next 7 sts, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 6, sk next ch-3 sp, next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 6, sk next ch-6
$\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 3 sts , dc in next ch sp , ch 1 , sk next st, dc in each of next 5 sts, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next ch $s p$, $d c$ in each of next 3 sts, ch 6, sk next ch-6 sp, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 3, sc around ch- 6 sps of last 2 rows, ch 3 , dc in each of next 4 sts, dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 4 sts, ch 3, sc around ch- 6 sps of last 2 rows, ch 3 , dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 6, sk next ch-3 sp, next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in next st, dc in next ch sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in next ch sp , dc in next st, ch 1 , sk next st, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 6 , sk next ch- 3 sp, next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Rows 7-36: [Rep rows 4-6 consecutively] 10 times.
Rows 37 \& 38: Rep rows 4 and 5.
Row 39: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 6, sk next ch-3 sp , next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each st and ch sp across to next ch-3 sp, ch 6, sk next ch-3 $s p$, next sc and next ch-3 sp, dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.
Row 40: Ch 3, dc in next st, ch 6, sk next ch-6 sp , dc in each of next 15 sts, ch 6, sk next ch-6 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of last 2 sts , turn.
Row 41: SI st in each of first 2 sts, ch 3, sc around ch- 6 sps of last 2 rows, ch 3 , sl st in each of next 15 sts, ch 3 , sc around ch-6 sps of last 2 rows, ch 3, sl st in each of last 2 rows. Fasten off.
Block to measurements. C!

## FINISHED MEASUREMENT

13 inches square

## mATERIALS

- Caron Simply Soft medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn(c) 4 ( $6 \mathrm{oz} / 315 \mathrm{yds} / 170 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein): 1 skein each \#0013 nutmeg and \#9729 red
$2 \mathrm{oz} / 100 \mathrm{yds} / 58 \mathrm{~g}$ each \#9701 white, \#0017 lemon and \#9702 off-white
- Caron Simply Soft Light light (light worsted) weight acrylic (9) 3 Oigt yarn ( $3 \mathrm{oz} / 330 \mathrm{yds} / 185 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):

1 skein each \#0001 white and \#0013 red
1 oz/70 yds/28g \#0014 black

- Sizes $\mathrm{G} / 6 / 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ and $\mathrm{H} / 8 / 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 53/4-inch cat-rattle ball (optional)
- Fiberfill
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Size G hook and 1 strand each light- and medium-weight yarns held tog: $16 \mathrm{sc}=$ 4 inches; 20 sc rows $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Use 1 strand yarn unless otherwise stated.
Work in continuous rounds; do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.
Mark first stitch of rounds.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

Surface slip stitch (surface sl st): Holding yarn at back of work, insert hook between rows, yo, pull ip through st and lp on hook.

## MONKEY

## Head \& Body

Rnd 1: With size G hook, holding 1 strand each light- and medium-weight white tog, ch 1,6 sc in back bar of ch (see illustration), do not join (see Pattern Notes). (6 sc)


## Back Bar of Chain

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)
Rnd 3: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 4: [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts] around, changing colors (see Stitch Guide) to 1 strand nutmeg and 1 strand light-weight white in last st. (24 sc)
Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.
Rnds 6-11: Rep rnd 5.
Insert cat-rattle ball if desired.
Rnd 12: [Sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts , sc in each of next 2 sts ] around. ( 18 sc )
Rnd 13: [Sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in next st] around. (12 sc)
Rnd 14: Rep rnd 3. (18 sc)
Rnd 15: [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts] around. ( 24 sc )

Rnd 16: [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] around. ( 30 sc )

Rnd 17: Sc in each st around, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.
If rattle ball was not used, firmly stuff Monkey's Head with fiberfill.

## Ear

## Make 2.

Rnd 1: Using size G hook, holding 1 strand nutmeg and 1 strand lightweight white tog, ch 1, 6 sc in back bar of ch, do not join. (6sc)
Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around, join in beg st. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. ( 12 sc ) Sew Ears to sides of Head as shown in photo.


## Muzzle

Rnd 1: Using size G hook, holding 1 strand each light- and medium-weight white tog, ch $1,6 \mathrm{sc}$ in back bar of ch, do not join. (6 sc)
Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. (12 sc)
Rnd 3: Sc in each st around.
Rnd 4: Sc in each st around, join in beg st. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

## Mouth

Using size $G$ hook and 1 strand red, ch 7 , sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 4 chs, (sl st, ch 1, slst) in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each of next 4 chs , sl st in same ch as beg sl st , ch 1 , join in beg sl st . Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. With WS of mouth facing, using light black, surface sl st (see Special Stitch) across beg ch-7. Fasten off.

## Facial Features

Sew Mouth to Muzzle as shown in photo, stuff Muzzle with fiberfill and then sew Muzzle to Head.
With black, using satin stitch (see illustration), embroider eyes as shown in photo; using straight stitch (see illustration) embroider eyebrows and nose.

## Hand \& Arm

## Make 2.

Rnd 1: Using size G hook, holding 1 strand each light- and medium-weight white tog, ch 1,6 sc in back bar of ch, do not join. ( 6 sc )
Rnd 2: Sc in each st around.
Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2.
Rnd 4: Sc in each st around changing colors to 1 strand nutmeg and 1 stand lightweight white in last st.

Rnd 5: [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] around. (9 sc)
Rnds 6-11: Rep rnd 2.
Rnd 12: Sc in each st around, join in beg st. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. Lightly stuff Hand \& Arm with fiberfill. Sew Arms to sides of Body as shown in photo.

## BANANA

Rnd 1: Using size G hook, with off-white, ch 1, 4 sc in back bar of ch, do not join. (4 sc)
Rnd 2: Sc in each st around.
Rnds 3-8: Rep rnd 2. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Banana Skin

Row 1 (inside of Banana Skin): Using size $G$ hook, with lemon, ch 11 (mark first 5 chs made), sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (10 sc)
Row 2 (outside of Banana Skin): Ch 1 , sc in each of first 5 sts, ch 6 , turn.
Row 3: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch and st across, turn. (10 sts)
Rows 4 \& 5: Rep rows 2 and 3.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sts (mark next st), leaving rem sts unworked. Leaving

Blanket requirements: 20 inches or smaller blanket with animal head sewn in corner or center of blanket. Use only acrylic yarn. Do not use buttons, beads or anything that a small child can pull off.

## Banana Peel Edging

Join lemon in marked st, ch 1 , sc in same st as ch-1, sc in each of next 3 sts, ${ }^{*}$ sl st in next st, ch 1, going down Banana Peel, sl st in unworked ch sp, sc in each of next 4 unworked ch sps, sl st between 2 Banana Peels**, going up Banana Peel, sc in each of next 4 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg st. Fasten off. Insert Banana in Banana Skin and then sew in place.

Wrap Monkey's right hand around bottom of Banana Skin and then sew in place.

## BLANKET

## Base

Rnd 1 (WS): Using size G hook, holding 1 strand nutmeg and 1 strand lightweight


## BIG BEADS NECKLACE

DESIGN BY ANDEE GRAVES

## A SIMPLE SINGLE CROCHET TUBE WORKED IN SIZE 10 CROCHET COTTON MAKES THE PERFECT NECKLACE CORD FOR STRINGING ON BIG-HOLE BEADS AND PENDANTS.

## (1) 2(3) 4) (6) BEGINNER

## FINISHED MEASUREMENT

17 inches in length, including clasp

## materials

- Aunt Lydia's Classic Crochet size 10 crochet cotton (350 yds per ball):

1 ball \#495 wood violet

- Size $7 / 1.65$ steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Magnetic necklace clasp or 3/4-inch button
- 4 large-hole beads in colors and shapes of choice
- Pendant
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

10 sc rnds $=1$ inch
Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds, do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.
Mark first stitch of round.

## NECKLACE

Rnd 1: Leaving long end, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join (see Pattern Notes). ( 5 sc )
Rnd 2: Mark first st (see Pattern Notes), sc in each st around.

Rnds 3-148 or to desired length: Rep rnd 2 until piece measures $151 / 2$ inches or desired
length, leaving long end. Fasten off if attaching magnetic clasp, do not fasten off if using Button \& Loop Closure.
Weave long end through top of sts on last rnd, pull to close. Do not fasten off end.

## Finishing

Weave beads onto Necklace. Attach clasp using long ends left at beg of rnd 1 and end of last rnd. Secure ends.

## Optional Button \& Loop Closure

Sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in all 5 sts, ch 10 or amount needed to match button for closure, sl st in top of dc dec. Fasten off.
Using long end left at beg, sew button securely to end.


## RECREATING FILET INTO TAPESTRY CROCHET <br> BY LINDA DEAN

## LEARN HOW TO TRANSFORM PATTERNS WORKED IN TRADITIONAL FILET LACE INTO THE MORE MODERN APPLICATION OF TAPESTRY CROCHET. IT WILL OPEN UP NEW OPTIONS FOR CREATING A VARIETY OF PROJECTS.

An appreciation for old patterns can lead you to a world of art in filet crochet, a lacy design that can showcase images and words. These patterns have traditionally been done in thread and can be found on dressing tables or hanging on walls in frames. I have wanted to showcase these designs in a more modern way and have, at the same time, reintroduced myself to tapestry crochet. Tapestry crochet has allowed me to bring filet designs to handbags, pillows and even afghans.

Tapestry crochet is a solid fabric that is worked in multiple colors, in single crochet, crocheting over the color strands not being stitched (see Photos 1 and 2). It is a flat piece of fabric worked in one direction. Each row is fastened off at the end, and then the next row is attached at the opposite end and worked across the same direction as the previous row. This creates a finished piece with stitches that are worked in the same direction, giving a very
definite right and wrong side to the fabric. However, due to the intrinsic

nature of crochet stitches, this method will cause designs to slant to one direction unless they are worked in the round. This can be corrected in flat work by working rows back and forth. The smooth, flat finish will be sacrificed for an even design.

The charts of filet crochet are typically represented in a grid-like format, with "open" and "closed" blocks. These blocks are worked as ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ for "open" spaces and 3 dc for "closed" spaces, and can easily reflect a twocolor chart. This chart can then be translated into a work of tapestry crochet by assigning colors to the "open" and "closed" blocks.

There are two things to keep in mind when choosing a chart to translate. The first thing is size. When changing from a thread design to one created in yarn, it is obviously going to be bigger as the yarn will increase the stitch size, and a larger hook will be utilized (see Photo 3). You will want to create a test swatch


The second thing to consider is the number of "open" blocks on the chart. Openness may not seem like a possible area of concern; however, in tapestry crochet one carries yarn not being used under its stitches. This allows possible bumps and tweaks in your work. These bumps and tweaks are created by the extra strands of yarn that are being crocheted over. If the stitches are too open, with the yarn and hook you want to use. Make your swatch in single crochet. The number of stitches for width will match that of the chart, so 16 stitches of filet (either "open" or "closed" blocks) will equate to 16 stitches of single crochet. For row height, there will be two rows of single crochet for every row of the filet (meaning that each line on the filet chart will be worked twice). By testing in this manner, you can determine if the size of the work will represent what you want in a finished piece. For example, if you want to use a pattern from a table runner, and after swatching you find that three blocks of the filet grid would translate to 5 inches in the yarn and hook you've chosen, you might find that your finished work would span your living room. If this is the case, you may want to choose only a section of the design within the grid and highlight it, crocheting just this portion instead of the whole thing. Or you may decide to just find another design.
these will show through the work (see Photos 4 and 5). This can be addressed at the time of color change by pulling the slack from the strand just before changing colors, but areas with vast amounts of openness can create a greater possibility of this laxness.

Be careful when pulling up slack; if you are inconsistent and pull too tightly, your work will have puckered stitches, and if you are pulling too loosely, it will leave the yarn bumping out from under your stitches. Keeping a consistent pull on these strands makes your work look better, but choosing a design that has more changes
between colors can greatly reduce the ability of the strand to become lax.

Keeping these tips in mind, it is easy to get double duty out of your filet pattern grids and show off your projects in a variety of ways. You can make tapestry pillow covers from a table runner filet pattern, or fashion a handbag that reminds you of your grandmother's wall hanging, or create an afghan that highlights designs in your lacy crocheted curtains. The possibilities are endless, opening another door to the beauty of both of these techniques. C !

Beginning block (beg block): Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts.

Block: Dc in each of next 3 sts OR 2 dc in next ch sp, dc in next dc.
Beginning space (beg sp): Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), sk next 2 sts, dc in next st,


OR sk next ch sp, dc in next st.
Space (sp): Ch 2, sk next 2 sts, dc in next st, OR sk next ch sp, dc in next st.
Picot shell: ( $3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3$, sl st in top of last dc , 4 dc ) as indicated in instructions.

## CUFF

Row 1: Ch 84, dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs count as first dc), dc in each ch across, turn. ( 82 dc )
Row 2: Beg sp (see Special Stitches), block (see Special Stitches) 3 times, sp (see Special Stitches), block, sp 15 times, block, sp 5 times, turn.
Rows 3-9: Work according to Chart. At end of last row, do not fasten off.

## Edging

Ch 1 , sc in last st, working in ends of rows, picot shell (see Special Stitches) in end of row 8 , ( $s c, c h 9, s c$ ) in end of row 6 (button $l p)$, picot shell in end of row $4,(\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 9, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in end of row 2 (button Ip), picot shell in end of row $1,3 \mathrm{sc}$ in corner, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , *sk next 3 chs, picot shell in next ch**, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch, rep from * across, ending last rep at ** (shell should be at corner), sc in top of row 1 , picot shell in end of row 3 , sc in top of row 4 , picot shell in end of row 6 , $s$ in bottom of row 8, shell in corner, [sk next 3 sts, sc in next st, sk next 3 sts, picot shell in next st] across, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Block as necessary.
Sew buttons to opposite end from button Ips.

 GARMENTS WITH CROCHETED BUTTONS.Q. Even though I made a 4 x 4-inch swatch beforehand, and my gauge was correct, the mittens I crocheted in the round are too tight. Why?
—EdnaJ.
A. For some odd reason, many crocheters tend to crochet more tightly in the round than when working a flat swatch back and forth in rows. For example, when I use my favorite yarn and a size H hook, my gauge is always the same: 7 stitches $=2$ inches. But when I'm making socks or mittens in the round, my gauge tightens up and changes to 8 stitches $=$

2 inches. To be sure mittens worked in the round fit right, instead of making the usual flat swatch, work a swatch in the round as though you were crocheting a mitten from the top down. This is faster than beginning at the bottom.

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook, place marker on last sc and move marker to last sc as each rnd is completed.
Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (16 sc)
Rnd 3: *Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next st, rep from * around. (24 sc)

Continue to increase evenly in the same manner until you have the number of stitches required.

Work a total of 10 rounds and then measure your gauge. If your gauge is still not quite right, place a marker on the last round, change to a larger hook if you need fewer stitches per inch or a smaller hook if you need more stitches. Work another 10 rounds and remeasure. If your gauge is still off, place a marker on the last row and work another 10 rounds with a larger or smaller hook until your gauge is correct.
Q. I made my son a sweater using a pattern in two colors, changing it to stripes of his favorite colors, but I'm not happy with the end result. It just

doesn't look quite right, and I'm not sure why. Can you help?
-Marilyn B.
A. When crocheting stripes, if you always begin the first stitch of a new row on the right side, the visual outcome is more pleasing. The sample in Photo 1 was worked in the usual way-turning the work at the end of each row. The sample in Photo 2 was worked by beginning the first stitch of each new color on the right side. As you can see, when color changes are made on the wrong side of the piece and are viewed from the front, that row doesn't look as neat as when colors are always started on the right side.

Whether you are crocheting a sweater or an afghan in this manner, the appearance of the wrong side also changes as well, and sometimes makes it confusing when you are counting rows or rounds. To alleviate that problem, place a marker on every 10th row or round to make it easier and faster to keep track of the total number or rows or rounds completed.
Q. I'm beyond frustrated! I spent so much time crocheting a sleek, sophisticated walking jacket in my favorite color, red. I've been to every fabric store in town and every red button is just a bit off in color. Then I tried silver, gold, antique gold and wooden buttons, but I can't find buttons that are just right. Do you have a solution?

-Anjanette C.

A. Having run into the same problem many times myself, my solution is to crochet buttons in the same yarn and color as the garment. There are two ways to do this. I prefer the button shown in Photo 3. I keep cover button refills of various sizes on hand for just this purpose.

Note: Always work crochet buttons with a small hook to avoid gaps.

## CROCHET BUTTONS

Here's a crochet button worked in the round:

Rnd 1: Ch 2, work 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do not join.
Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. Do not join. (16 sc)

At this point determine whether this piece fits your buttonhole. If you need a larger button, work:
Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

Continue to increase 1 stitch every 8th row evenly spaced until you reach desired size.
Last rnd: Work [sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] until 6 or 8 sts remain. Join, leaving long end, fasten off.

Thread end into yarn needle and
pull stitches together tightly. Secure stitches.

## FOR A MORE <br> SOPHISTICATED ROUND BUTTON

Buy cover button refills at the fabric store in desired size or use buttons (all the same size) from your stash.
Row 1: Ch enough sts to fit around center of button, sc in 2nd ch from hook and sc in each ch across to end, turn.
Row 2 (required length): Ch 1, sc in each st across to end. At end of last row, fasten off.

Insert cover button refill in center of crochet square and pull stitches tog. Secure stitches. C!

Upper Body is worked first, using Solid Stitch Pattern. Then stitches are picked up across lower edge of Upper Body and Lower Body is
worked in Lace Pattern down to bottom edge of Duster.

Upper Body is made in 1 piece from midriff up to armholes and neckline. The piece is then divided into 3 sections: Left Front, Right Front and Back. These 3 pieces are worked separately up to shoulders.

Left Front and Right Front refer to left and right side as worn.
Sleeves are worked in Solid Stitch Pattern from top of Forearm up to Sleeve Cap. Stitches are picked up across lower edge of sleeve and Lace Pattern worked down to wrist.

When working split-hdc stitches, make sure that hook splits the stitch you are working into on both the right and wrong sides.

When instructed to work in a pattern stitch "as established," work the next row of the pattern stitch and make sure that the stitches line up as in previous rows.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Row 1: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, cl—see Special Stitches) in first st (counts as first cl V-st), ch 2, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st, *ch 2, sk next 3 sts, cl V-st (see Special Stitches) in next st, ch 2, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st, rep from * across to last 4 sts, sk next 3 sts, (cl, ch 1, dc) in last st (counts as last cl V-st), turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 2, dc V-st (see Special Stitches) in next sc, [ch 2, sc in ch-2 sp of next cl V-st, ch 2, dc V-st in next sc] across to last cl V-st, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 2, cl V-st in ch-2 sp of next dc V-st, ch 2, sc in next sc] across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, dc) in first st (counts as first dc V-st), ch 2 , sc in ch-2 sp of next cl V-st, [ch 2, dc V-st in next sc, ch 2, sc in ch-2 sp of next cl V-st] across to last $s c$, ch 2, (dc, ch 1 , dc) in last sc (counts as last dc V-st), turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, cl) in first st (counts as first cl V-st), ch 2, sc in next sc, [ch 2, cl V-st in ch-2 sp of next dc $V$-st, ch 2 , sc in next $s c]$ across to last cl V-st, ch 2, (cl, ch 1, dc) in 2nd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Rep rows 2-5 consecutively for Pattern.

## LACE BRIDGE PATTERN

Getting started: Work in multiple of 8 sts plus 1.

Row 1: Ch 1, (sc, ch 2) in first st (counts as first dc), dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next sc, dc in next ch-2 sp, [ch 1, sk next dc, 3 dc in ch-2 sp of

next dc V-st, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next sc, dc in next ch-2 sp] across to last dc V-st, ch 1, dc in turning ch-sp, dc in 2nd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in each st and ch-1 sp across, turn.

## SOLID STITCH PATTERN

Getting started: Work in multiple of 4 sts plus 1.
Row 1: Ch 1, hdc in first st, [sk next st, hdc V-st (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next st, hdc in next st] across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc V-st in ch-1 sp of next hdc V-st, [split-hdc (see Special Stitches) in next st, hdc V-st in ch-1 sp of next hdc V-st] across, hdc in last st, turn.
Rep row 2 for Pattern.

## Dec at Beg of Solid Stitch Pattern Row

Ch 1, hdc in first st, work number of hdc dec as indicated, the sts worked in by hde dec could be any combination of 2 hdc , split-hdc, or ch-1 sps. If the last hdc dec was worked into any sts of an hdc V-st, hdc in each rem st of the hdc V-st, then work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established (see Pattern Notes) to end of row.

## Dec at End of Solid Stitch Pattern Row

Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established to last hdc V-st before the first hdc dec is to be worked. If first hdc dec needs to be worked into some, but not all, of the sts of this hdc V-st, work an hdc in each of the sts including each hdc and each ch-1 sp of the hdc V-st up to st into which first leg of first hde dec is to be worked, then work the hde dec and hdc in the last st.
To calculate number of sts needed at end of row to work decs, multiply number of decs by 2 and then add 1 . For example, to dec 3 sts, work to the last $2 \times 3+1=7$ sts. This leaves 6 sts total for the 3 hdc dec and 1 additional st for the final hdc.

## DUSTER

## Upper Body

Row 1: First foundation sc (see Special Stitches), 264 [296, 324, 356, 384, 416] next foundation sc (see Special Stitches), turn. (265 [297, 325, 357, 385, 417] sc)
Next rows: Beg with row 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern until piece measures $6[51 / 2,5$, $512,5,41 / 2]$ inches from beg.

## Left Front

## Neck \& Armhole Shaping

Getting started: If the last $1-3$ sts to be worked into include sts of an hdc $V$-st, but not all 4 of the sts, do not work an hdc V-st in the ch-1 sp. Instead, work hdc in each of the hdc V-sts included in the row. Continue to work beg and ends of rows in the same manner. Whenever row beg or ends within an hdc V-st, but doesn't include all sts of hdc V-st, work an hdc in each of hdc V-sts included in row.
Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc dec (see Special Stitches), hdc in next st, work in Solid Stitch Pattern across next $56[63,69,75,80$, 87] sts, leave rem sts unworked, turn. (59 [66, 72, 78, 83, 90] sts)
Rows 2-8 [2-9, 2-11, 2-15, 2-19, 2-23]: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and at same time dec 1 st at beg and end of each row. (45 [50, 52, 50, 47, 46] sts at end of last row)

## Continue Neck Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and at same time dec 1 st at end of row. (44 [49, 51, 49, 46, 45] sts)
Row 2: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and dec 1 st at beg of row. (43 [48, 50, 48, 45, 44] sts)

Next rows: [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 3 [3, 3, 3, 0, 0] times. (37 [42, 44, 42, 45, 44] sts at end of last row)
Next row: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established.

Next row: Rep row 2. (36 [41, 43, 41, 44, 43] sts)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 7 [8, $8,6,9,7]$ times. (29 [33, 35, 35,35,36] sts at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern until Armhole measures $7\left[7 \frac{1}{2}, 8,81 / 2,9,91 / 2\right]$ inches from beg of Armhole. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Back

Getting started: If row beg or ends within an hdc V-st, but does not include all of sts of hdc V-st, work an hdc in each st of hdc V-st that are to be included.

Row 1 (WS): With WS facing, sk 12 [14, 16,

20,24,26] unworked sts following first row of Left Front, join (see Pattern Notes) in next st, ch 1 , beg in same st as joining, work in Solid Stitch Pattern over next 121 [135, 147, 159, $169,183]$ sts and dec 1 st at beg and end of row, turn. (119 [133, 145, 157, 167, 181] sts)
Rows 2-8 [2-9, 2-11, 2-15, 2-19, 2-23]: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and at same time dec 1 st at beg and end of each row. (105 [117, 125, 129, 131, 137] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern until Armhole measures $6\left[61 / 2,7,7 \frac{1}{2}, 8,81 / 2\right]$ inches from beg.

## Neck Shaping

## First Side

Row 1 (RS): Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across 42 [46, 48, 48, 48, 49] sts, leaving rem sts unworked for Back Neck and 2nd Side, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sk first st, sl st in each of next 3 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across, turn. ( 38 [42, 44, 44, 44, 45] sts)

Row 3: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and dec 3 sts at end of row. ( 35 [39, 41, 41, 41, 42] sts)
Row 4: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and at same time, dec 3 sts at beg of row. ( $32[36,38,38,38,39]$ sts)
Row 5: Rep row 3. Fasten off. (29 [33, 35, 35, 35, 36] sts)

## 2nd Side

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, sk 21 [25, 29, 33, 35,39 ] unworked sts following first row of First Side, join in next st, beg in same st as joining, work in Solid Stitch Pattern across. (42 [46, 48, 48, 48, 49] sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 4 sts, leave last 4 sts unworked, turn. (38 [42, 44, 44, 44, 45] sts)

Row 5: Rep row 3. Fasten off. (29 [33, 35, 35, 35, 36] sts)

## Right Front

## Neck \& Armhole Shaping

Row 1 (WS): With WS facing, sk 12 [14, 16, 20, 24, 26] unworked sts following first row of Back, join in next st, ch 1, beg in same st as joining, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and dec 1 st at end of row, turn. (59 [66, 72, 78, 83, 90] sts)

Rows 2-8 [2-9, 2-11, 2-15, 2-19, 2-23]: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and at same time dec 1 st at end of row, turn. (45 [50, 52, 50, 47, 46] sts at end of last row)

## Continue Neck Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and dec 1 st at beg of row, turn. (44 [49, 51, 49, 46, 45] sts)

Row 2: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established and dec 1 st at end of row, turn. (43 [48, 50, 48, 45, 44] sts)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 3 [3, 3, 3, 0, 0] times. (37 [42, 44, 42, 45, 44] sts at end of last row)
Next row: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established.

Next row: Rep row 2. (36 [41, 43, 41, 44, 43] sts)

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 12 -inch square $1 / 2$-inch-thick foam block or corkboard
- Straight pins


## GAUGE

$5 \mathrm{sc}=1$ inch; 4 sc rows $=1$ inch
Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Enlarge Diagram 1 by 200 percent on photocopy machine.
The crocheted cord is made first and then is woven into a Knot. Once the Knot is formed, crochet stitches are worked into the edge of the Knot to transform it into the Shrug shape.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

Working in back of single crochet (working in back of sc): In top row of Cord there are 2 lps at top of each sc, front lp and back Ip. When looking at WS of sc there are 3 more strands. One strand (side-to-side strand) goes across sc and is located just below back Ip. The other 2 strands or V-strands make an upside-down letter " $V$ " stemming from the side-to-side strand. To work in the back of sc, pick 1 of these 3 strands, side-to-side or V-strands to work into. Some of the sc in the cord will be right side up and others will be upside down, so the best strand to work into will vary.

## SHRUG

## Celtic Knot Cord

Row 1: Ch 425, working in back bar of ch (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off.


## Back Bar of Chain

Row 2: With RS facing, join with sc in first st, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Weave Celtic Knot

With RS facing, using Crochet Cord and Diagram 1 on page 39, weave Knot as follows:

1. Place photocopy of Diagram 1 on top of foam block;
2. start at * by pinning end of Crochet Cord to foam block;
3. continue to bend Cord around, following path and arrows of Celtic Knot using pins to keep proper shape;
4. make sure Cord passes correctly either over or under at each crossing.
Once Knot is woven, adjust all lps so number of sc sts in each Ip of Knot matches numbers

given in Assembly Diagram, each Ip should be at least within 1 sc of number given in Diagram. These slight variations will not matter in the look of project.
Pin each cross section to secure weave.
Carefully remove Knot from foam block, flip over to WS and tack each crossing to secure, making sure that stitching does not show on RS.
Make sure to secure and hide Cord end under corner section that passes over it.

## Center Knot Rectangle

Getting started: Each of the 3 center Ips on top and bottom of the Celtic Knot should have $6 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{lps}$ across and each of end side lps should have $11 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{lps}$. This means that you may need to sk 2 sc to sp the ch-5 Ips on rnd 2 evenly, depending on how many sc you have in each Knot lp.
Rnd 1: Working in back of sc (see Special Stitches), join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc of top left Knot Ip ** on Assembly Diagram, sc in this st and in each sc around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: [Ch 5, sk next sc, sc in next sc] around ( 58 lps ), join with sc in base of beg ch- 5 .
Rnd 3: SI st in next ch-5 lp, ch 1, sc in same ch Ip as sl st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] around, ch 5 , join in beg sc.
Rnd 4: SI st in next ch-5 lp, ch 1, sc in same ch lp as sl st, ch 6, dc in next ch-5 lp, *ch 4, tr in next ch-5 lp, ch 6, trtr in next ch-5 lp, ch 3 , tr in next ch-5 lp, ch $4, \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-5 lp, ch 3 , dc in next ch-5 lp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] 8 times, ch 4 , dc in next ch-5 lp, ch 3, dc in next ch-5 lp, ch 4, tr in next ch-5 lp, ch 4, trtr in next ch-5 lp, ch 6, tr in next ch-5 lp, ch

4, dc in next ch-5 lp, ch 3, dc in next ch-5 lp, [ch 4, dc in next ch-5 Ip] 11 times, rep from * once, join in 3rd ch of first ch-5 Ip. Fasten off.

## Corner Piece

Row 1: With RS facing, sl st in ch-3 sp just after first trtr of rnd above, (ch 4, tr, ch 5, tr) in next lp, [ch 4, tr in next Ip] twice, ch 4, dc in next lp, ch 4, sc in next lp, [ch 5, sc in next lp] 4 times, ch 4, dc in next lp, [ch 4, tr in next lp] twice, (ch 4, tr, ch 5, tr) in next lp, ch 5, sc in next Ip. Fasten off. (14 Ips across)

Rep row 1 beg at diagonally opposite corner with RS facing beg in ch-3 lp after 3rd trtr of rnd 4.
Left-handers will start at bottom left and top right corners in ch-3 lp after 2nd trtr and 4th trtr of rnd 4.

## Side A

Row 1: With RS facing join in corner ch-5 sp between 2 tr of Corner Piece row 1 at bottom right-hand corner of Center Knot Rectangle (see red dot on Assembly Diagram), ch 4, dc in next lp, [ch 5, sc in next lp] 10 times, ch 5, dc in
next lp, ch 2, dc in next lp (13 lps across), turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sl st in ch-2 sp, [ch 5, sc in next Ip] across ( 12 ch-5 lps across), turn.
Row 3: [Ch 5, sc in next lp] across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep row 3] 20 [23, 26, 29] times for total of 23 [26,29,32] rows. At end of last row, fasten off.
For longer Sleeves, continue to rep row 3 until desired length.

## Side B

Rep same as for Side A joining in corner ch-5 sp between the 2 tr of Corner Piece row 1 at top left-hand corner of Center Knot Rectangle, knot (see red dot on Assembly Diagram).

## Top Edge of Shrug (Section C)

Row 1: With RS facing, join in last ch-5 Ip of the last row of Side A, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] across, turn.
Row 2: [Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep row 2] $2[4,6,8]$ times. At end of last row, fasten off.


Bottom Edge of Shrug (Section D)
Row 1: With RS facing, join in last ch-5 lp of last row of Side B at bottom left-hand corner of Center Knot Rectangle, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] across, turn.
Row 2: [Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 Ip] across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep row 2] 0 [2,3,4] times. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Block Shrug

Dampen Shrug with cold water and lay out on towel on flat surface with RS facing down. Stretch gently so rectangle is uniform. Make sure all sps within mesh stitching and the Celtic Knot are gently pulled out so they are also uniform.
Let dry for 2-4 hours. Then, using a clean cotton pressing cloth, go over with steam iron set on "cotton." Let dry completely.

## Seaming Sleeves

With RS facing, fold Shrug in half along length, matching up last $9 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{lps}$ of each side.
Join in last ch-5 lp of 1 side, working in zigzag between both sides, [ch 3, sc in correspond-
ing ch-5 Ip of other side] 12 times, [ch 5, sc in corresponding ch-5 Ip of other side] 4 times, [ch 6, sc in opposite ch-5 Ip again] twice to provide secure join where the seam will get a lot of wear and tear. Fasten off.

If you need more room across back, work in zigzag for less reps.
Rep for other Sleeve.

## Sleeve Edging

With RS facing, join in any ch-5 lp, 3 sc in this and each Ip around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. Rep for other Sleeve.

## Body Edging

With RS facing, join in center top ch-5 Ip of Section C, 3 sc in this and in each ch-5 lp around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Edging Knot Cord

## Make 7.

Ch 64, working in the back bar of the ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off. (63 sc)

## Weaving Edging Knots

Weave in same manner as Celtic Knot using Diagram 2.

Section marked with * should be 2 sc long and folded back and under Knot when sewing all crossings.
Block each Knot same as for Shrug.

## Finishing

Align 1 Edging Knot with center bottom of Shrug as shown in photo and secure with tapestry needle and yarn.
Make sure to sew on Knot so that stitching does not show on the front.
Referring to Assembly Diagram throughout, sew 3 Edging Knots on Section D leaving 1 ch- 5 lp in between.

Positioning Edging Knot so that it hangs over outside of arm, sew 1 Edging Knot on edge of each Sleeve. This will not be in the center of the sleeve when lying flat on your work surface. You may need to try Shrug on first.
Sew 1 Edging Knot on each side of the collar area Section C to left and right of neck.

## Bust

Next rows: [Work Increase Row every 4 rows] 3 times. (70 [78, 86, 94, 102] sts at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures 15 inches from beg, ending with WS row.


## Armhole Shaping

Next row (RS): SI st in each of first 3 [4, 5, 6, 7] sts, ch 2, work in Pattern across to last 2 [3, $4,5,6]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. ( $66[72,78,84,90]$ sts)
Next row: SI st in each of first $3[3,3,4,4]$ sts, ch 2, work in Pattern across to last $2[2,2$, $3,3]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (62 [ $68,74,78,84]$ sts)
Next rows: [Work Decrease Row] 1 [2, 3, 3, 4] time(s), then work Decrease Row every other row twice. ( 56 [60, 64, 68, 72] sts)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures $21 \frac{1}{2}\left[22,22 \frac{1}{2}, 221 / 2,23\right]$ inches from beg, ending with WS row.

## First Shoulder Shaping

Next row: Work in Pattern across first 14 [16, $18,20,22$ ] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Next row: Ch 2, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Pattern across, turn. (13 [15, 17, 19, 21] sts)
Next rows: Work even until piece measures $221 / 2[23,2312,231 / 2,24]$ sts from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Shoulder Shaping

Next row: With RS facing, sk center 28 sts, join (see Pattern Notes) in next st, ch 2, work in Pattern across, turn.
Next row: Ch 2, work in Pattern across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn.

Next rows: Work even until piece measures $221 / 2[23,231 / 2,231 / 2,24]$ sts from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Left Front

Row 1: Ch 39 [43, 47, 51, 55], work row 1 of Pattern. (38 [42, 46, 50, 54] sts)
Next rows: Work row 2 of Pattern until piece measures $31 / 4$ inches from beg ending with WS row.

## Waist

Next row: [Working in Pattern, dec 1 st at Armhole edge every 4 rows] 3 times. (35 [39, 43, 47, 51] sts at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures $91 / 2[91 / 2,10,10,10]$ inches from beg ending with WS row.


## Bust

Next rows: [Working in Pattern, Inc 1 st at Armhole edge every 4 rows] 3 times. (38 [42, $46,50,54]$ sts)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures 15 inches from beg, ending with WS row.

## Armhole \& Neck Shaping

Next row (RS): SI st in each of first 3 [4, 5, 6, 7] sts, ch 2, work in Pattern across, turn.

Next row: Work in Pattern across to last 2 [2, $2,3,3]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Next rows: Working in Pattern and at same time dec 1 st at Armhole edge every row 1 [2, $3,3,4]$ time(s), then every other row twice and at same time, dec 1 st at Neck edge every row 16 times, then every other row twice. (13 [15, 17, 19, 21] sts at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures same as Back. At end of last row, fasten off.

Place markers evenly sp for 3 buttons, marking first $1 / 2$ inch from beg of Front Neck Shaping and last 8 inches from Front Neck Shaping.

## Right Front

Work same as Left Front reversing all shaping and make 3 buttonholes opposite markers on RS rows as follows: Work 2 sts in Pattern across, ch 3, sk next 3 sts, continue Pattern across row, then on next row, work Pattern and work 3 sts in ch-2 sps of previous row.

## Sleeve

## Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 43 [43, 43, 49, 49], work row 1 of Pattern. (42 [42, 42, 48, 48] sts)
Next rows: Work in Pattern and inc 1 st at each side every row $0[0,0,0,1]$ time(s), every other row $5[8,9,7,9]$ times, then every 4th row $2[0,0,1,0]$ time(s), working new sts into Pattern as they accumulate. (56 [58, $60,64,68]$ sts at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even in Pattern until piece measures $5122[51 / 2,6,6,6]$ inches from beg.

## Cap Shaping

Next row: SI st in each of first 3 [4, 5, 6, 7]
sts, ch 2, work in Pattern across to last $2[3,4$, $5,6]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Next rows: Working in Pattern, dec 1 sts at each side every other row $4[6,6,7,6]$ times, then every row $9[7,7,7,9]$ times. ( $26[26$, $26,26,26]$ sts at end of last row)
Next row: SI st in each of first 3 sts, ch 2, work in Pattern across to last 2 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (24 sts)
Next row: Rep last row. (22 sts)
Next row: SI st in each of first 4 sts, work in

Pattern across to last 2 sts, leaving rem sts unworked. Fasten off.

## Cuff

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 on Sleeve, join with sc in first ch, evenly sp 40 sc across, turn. (41 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st] across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 5, sc in first ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ in last $s c$, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with ch 5 , sc in 3 rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.
Row 5: Rep row 3.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 7, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.
Row 7: Ch 6, sc in first ch-7 sp, [ch 7, sc in next ch-7 sp] across, ending with ch-3, dc in last sc , turn.
Row 8: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 7, sc in next ch-7 sp] across, ending with ch 7 , sc in 3 rd ch of beg ch-6, turn.
Row 9: Rep row 7.
Row 10: Ch 1 , sc in each st across with 7 sc in each ch sp, ending with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-6, turn.
Row 11: Ch 1, working from left to right, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st across. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew shoulder seams.


## Neckband

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, join 33/4 inches from beg of Front Neck Shaping, evenly sp 73 sc across neckline, leaving last $33 / 4$ inches unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st] across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 5, sc in first ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ in last st, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, ending with sc in 3rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.
Row 5: Rep row 3. Fasten off.

## Assembly

Fold 1 Sleeve in half, place fold at shoulder seam, sew Sleeve in place.
Rep with rem Sleeve.
Sew side and Sleeve seams.

## Front Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing join in side seam at lower Right Front side, ch 1, evenly sp sc along lower edge of Right Front, along Right Front edge, along right side of Neckband, along back of Neckband, along left side of back, along Left Front edge, along lower Left Front edge and along lower Back Edge, working 3 sc at each outside corner and sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in 2 sts at each inside corner, join in beg sc. Do not turn.
Rnd 2: Working from left to right, reverse sc in each st around, join in beg reverse sc. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.
Thread ribbon along neckline as shown in photo.

- Size $\mathrm{F} / 5 / 3.75 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- 60 -inch lengths $1 / 4$-inch-wide ribbon: 2


## GAUGE

Blocked Solid Stitch Pattern: 22 sts = 6 inches 13 rows $=41 / 2$ inches
Blocked Lace Pattern: 19 sts $=4$ inches; 14 rows $=41 / 2$ inches

Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Upper body is worked first in Solid Stitch Pattern. Then stitches are picked up across lower edge of upper body and Lace Pattern is worked down to lower edge of Top.
When instructed to work in stitch 2 rows below, insert hook in indicated stitch in row numbered 2 less than row you are working on. For example, if you are working row 5 , a stitch " 2 rows below" is in row 3.
When instructed to work in pattern stitch "as established," work next row of pattern stitch and make sure that stitches line up as in previous rows.
Left side and right side refer to left and right side as worn.

Single crochet and chain-2 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

First foundation single crochet (first foundation sc): Ch 2, insert hook into 2nd ch from hook, yo, pull up Ip, yo, pull through 1 Ip on hook (ch-1 completed), yo, pull through all lps on hook (sc completed).

## Next foundation single crochet (next

 foundation sc): [Insert hook in last ch-1 made, yo, pull up Ip , yo, pull through 1 Ip on hook (ch-1), yo, pull through all Ips on hook (sc)] as indicated.Half double crochet decrease (hdc dec): $Y_{0}$, insert hook in next $s t$ and pull up Ip, insert hook in next $s t$, pull up $\mid p$, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Row 1: Ch 1 , sc in first st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, [ch 5, sk next 5 sts, sc in next st] across to last 3 sts, ch 2 , sk next 2 sts, sc in last st, turn.
Row 2: Sc, ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next sc, [ch 7, sk next ch-5 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc$]$ across to last ch-2 sp , ch 3, sk last ch-2 sp, dc in last sc, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 3, sk next ch-3
sp, sc in next sc, [ch 7, sk next ch-7 sp, sc in next sc] across to last ch-3 sp, ch 3, sk last ch-3 sp, sc in last dc, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp and next sc, Ing sc (see Special Stitches) around next ch-7 sps, [ch 5, sk next sc, Ing sc around next ch-7 sps] across to last ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk last ch-3 sp, sc in last sc, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 5, sk first ch-5 sp, sc in next sc, [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, sc in next sc] across, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 7, sk next ch-5 sp, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 7, sk next ch-7 sp, sc in next st] across, turn.

Row 8: Sc , ch 2, ch 2, Ing sc around next ch-7 sps, [ch 5, sk next sc, Ing sc around next ch-7 sps] across, ch 2, dc in last $s c$, turn.
Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, sc in next sc, [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, sc in next st] across to last ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk last ch-2 sp, sc in last dc, turn.
Rep rows 2-9 consecutively for Lace Pattern.

## TOP

## Front

Row 1 (WS): First foundation sc (see Special Stitches), 61 [69, 77, 83, 91, 99] next
foundation sc (see Special Stitches), turn. (62 [70, 78, 84, 92, 100] foundation sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next $s t$, dc in next st] across, turn.

Next rows: Rep row 2 until piece measures $131 / 2\left[13,13,12^{1 ⁄ 2}, 12^{1 ⁄ 2}, 12\right]$ inches from beg.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: Ch 1, sk first st, sl st in each of next 5 $[6,8,11,14,17]$ sts, ch 1 , work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established (see Pattern Notes) across to last $6[7,9,12,15,18]$ sts, leave last $6[7,9,12,15,18]$ sts unworked, turn. (50 [56, 60, 60, 62, 64] sts)

Next rows: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established until Armhole measures 3 inches, ending with WS row.

## Front Neck Shaping

## First Side

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across first 21 [25, 26, 28, 28,29] sts, leave rem sts unworked for Front Neck Shaping and 2nd Side, turn. (21 [25, 26, 28, 28, 30] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sk first st, hdc dec (see Special Stitches) in next 2 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern across, turn. (19 [23, 24, 26, 26, 28] sts)
Row 3: Ch 1 , work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 2 sts, hdc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (18 [22, 23, 25, 25, 27] sts)
Row 4: Ch 1, hde dec in first 2 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across, turn. (17 [21, 22, 24, 24, 26] sts)

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows] 3 [4, 4, 5, 5, 6] times. (11 [13, 14, 14, 14, 14] sts at end of last row)

Next row: Rep row 3. (10 [12, 13, 13, 13, 13] sts)
Next rows: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established until Armhole measures $71 / 2$ [ $8,81 / 2,9,91 / 2,10]$ inches. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Side

Getting started: With RS facing, sk next 8 [ $6,8,4,6,4]$ unworked sts following row 1 of First Side of Neck Shaping, join (see Pattern Notes) in next unworked st.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, beg in same st as joining, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established over last $21[25,26,28,28,30]$ sts, turn. (21 [25, 26, 28, 28, 30] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, leave last st unworked, turn. (19 [23, 24, 26, 26, 28] sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc dec in first 2 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across, turn. (18 [22, 23, 25, 25, 27] sts)
Row 4: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 2 sts, hdc decrease, turn. (17 [21, 22, 24, 24, 26] sts)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows] 3 [4, 4, 5, 5, 6] times. (11 [13, 14, 14, 14, 14] sts at end of last row)

Next row: Rep row 3. (10[12, 13, 13, 13, 13] sts)

Next rows: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established until Armhole measures $71 / 2[8$, $81 / 2,9,91 / 2,10]$. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Back

Work same as Front to end of Armhole Shaping. ( 50 [56, 60, 60, 62, 64] sts)

Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established until Armhole measures $51 / 2[6,612,7$, $71 / 2,8]$ inches end with WS row.

## Neck Shaping

## First Side

Row 1: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across first 18 [20, 21, 21, 21, 21] sts, leave rem sts unworked for 2nd Side of Neck Shaping. (18 [20, 21, 21, 21, 21] sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, sk first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across, turn. (16 [18, 19, 19, 19, 19] sts)
Row 3: Ch 1, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 3 sts , hdc dec, leave last st unworked, turn. (14 [16, 17, 17, 17, 17] sts)

Rows 4 \& 5: Rep rows 2 and 3. (10 [12, 13, $13,13,13$ ] sts at end of last row)
Row 6: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established. Fasten off.

## 2nd Side

Getting started: With RS facing, sk next 14 [16, 18, 18, 20, 22] unworked sts following row 1 of First Side of Neck Shaping, join in next unworked st.

Row 1: Ch 1, beg in same st as join, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established over last 18 [20, 21, 21, 21, 21] sts, turn. ( 18 [20, 21, 21, 21, 21] sts)
Row 2: Work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, leave last st unworked, turn. (16 [18, 19, 19, 19, 19] sts)
Row 3: Ch 1, sk first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Solid Stitch Pattern as established across, turn. ( 14 [16, 17, 17, 17, 17] sts)
Rows 4 \& 5: Rep rows 2 and 3. (10 [12, 13, 13, 13, 13] sts at end of last row)
Row 6: Work even in Solid Stitch Pattern as established. Fasten off.

## Lower Lace Section

Getting started: This section is worked across lower edges of Front and Back. With RS facing and working across lower edge of row 1 of Front in chs at base of foundation, join at beg of row.
Row 1: Beg in same st as joining, sc in each of next $9[5,12,6,13,10]$ sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next $1[2,2,3,2,3]$ sts, rep from * $21[19,17,17,21,19]$ times, 2 sc in next st, sc in each st across to end of row, turn. (85 [91, 97, 103, 115, 121] sts)
Rows 2-22: Work even in Lace Pattern. At end of last row, fasten off.
Rep Lower Lace Section across lower edge of Back.

Rows [14 \& 15]: Ch 5, love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, double love knot, sc in 5th ch of beg ch 5, turn. ([1] love knot, [4] double love knots)

## Size X-Large Only

Row [16]: Ch 5, love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, double love knot, sc in 5th ch of beg ch 5, turn. ([1] love knot, [4] double love knots)

## Sizes 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Row [16]: Ch 5, love knot, sc in next sc (inc), [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 4 times, double love knot, sc in sc of 5th ch of beg ch 5, turn. ([1] love knot, [5] double love knots)

## Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Row [17]: Ch 5, love knot, sc in first sc of next double love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] [3, 4, 4] times, double love knot, sc in 5th ch of beg ch 5, turn. ([1] love knot, [4, 5, 5] double love knots)

Row [18]: Ch 5, love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] [3, 4, 4] times, double love knot, sc in 5th ch of beg ch 5. ([1] love knot, [4, 5, 5] double love knots)

## MATERIALS

- Crystal Palace Yarns Panda Cotton super fine (sock) weight sufer rime bamboo/cotton/elastic nylon yarn ( $13 / 40 \mathrm{oz} / 182 \mathrm{yds} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ per ball): 10 [11, 13, 14, 15, 17] balls \#509 foliage
- Size $D / 3 / 3.25 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

33 pattern sts $=43 / 4$ inches; 27 pattern rows $=41 / 2$ inches

Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

When instructed to work in Body Pattern "as established," work single crochet in first and last stitch of row. Between first and last
stitch, work single crochet in each chain-1 space and work chain-1 over each single crochet, skipping that single crochet.

When working single crochet decrease, work it in the next 2 stitches. These stitches may be 2 single crochet stitches, or 1 single crochet stitch and 1 chain- 1 space in any order.

Work last st of rnd, and leaving 6-inch tail, cut yarn. Pull last Ip on hook all the way through last st made until tail passes through st. Sk next st (first st of rnd), with tapestry needle, run 6-inch tail under both Ips of next st and pull through. Insert needle back through sp where tail originally came from (last st made) and behind work. Snug yarn to cover sk st with duplicate st just worked. Weave in tail.

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

2 hanks cactus

- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Gauge it not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

The Leaf Motif is composed of 5 Leaves and has no right or wrong side.

In Leaf Motifs, move stitch marker to center stitch of 3 single crochet at base of leaf.
In Grape Bunch Motifs, stitch count and stitch location varies by row to give shape a "bunch" look.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Block Motif by wetting it, and then gently
wring out all extra water. Pin it out on flat surface and let dry completely.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in st across to marker, 3 sc in marked st, move marker to center of sc group just worked, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, leave rem 3 sts unworked, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across to marker,

3 sc in marked st, move marker to center sc of sc group just worked, sc in each st across to last 3 sts, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn.

Row 4: Rep row 3.
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across to marker, 3 sc in marked st, 3 sc in next st, sc in each st across to last 3 sts, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st across to center bottom. Fasten off.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sts, joining sc (see Special Stitches) in 8th st from lower point of Center Leaf on 1 side (see Leaf Assembly Diagram), joining sc in each of next 8 sts. Fasten off.

Make 2nd Medium Leaf and join to rem side of Center Leaf.

## First Small Leaf

Rows 1-4: Ch 15, rep rows 1-4 of Center Leaf.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, joining sc in 7th st from lower point on side of 1 Medium Leaf, joining sc in each of next 8 sts. Fasten off.

## 2nd Small Leaf

Rows 1-4: Ch 15, rep rows 1-4 of Center Leaf.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sts, joining sc in 7th st from lower point on side of rem Medium Leaf, joining sc in each of next 8 sts, ch 1 , work so that bottoms of all Leaves are facing, insert hook in first unworked sc to right of work, yo, pull Ip through, insert hook and yo, pull Ip through on all unworked sts of Medium and Center Leaves, insert hook and yo, pull ip through, in first unworked st of next Small Leaf, yo, pull through all Ips, ch 10 (stem), 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each ch across, sl st in last st worked on Leaf. Fasten off.

## Edging

Rnd 1: Join (see Pattern Notes) in lower point on outside of Small Leaf, [ch 9, sc at next marked X on Leaf Assembly Diagram] around, ch 9, join in joining sl st, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sl st in ch sp, [ch 7, sc in next ch sp] 19 times, leaving rem ch sps unworked, turn.

Row 3: Ch 7, sc in first ch sp, [ch 7, sc in next ch sp] 18 times. Fasten off.
Block Motif (see Pattern Notes). Motif will not lay completely flat after blocking. Blocking is to keep Leaves from curling around.

## Grape Bunch A Motif

## Make 3.

Getting started: When you make each bobble st, it will count as 2 sts. The ch- 1 at end of each bobble st counts as a st.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 2, bobble (see Special Stitches) in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 bobble)
Row 2: Ch 1, bobble in first st, which will be 2nd ch from hook or ch-1 at end of bobble (see Getting started), bobble in next st, bobble in side of bobble just worked, turn. (3 bobbles)
Row 3: Ch 1, bobble in first st, bobble in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in next st, leaving last st unworked, turn. (4 bobbles)

Row 4: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, bobble in next st, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, bobble in next st, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, bobble in each of

next 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, turn. (5 bobbles)

Row 6: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 3 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in next st, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. (6 bobbles)
Row 7: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in each of first 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, leaving rem 4 sts unworked, turn. ( 5 bobbles)
Row 8: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in first st, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, turn.
(7 bobbles)
Row 9: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 3 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, bobble in next st, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn. (8 bobbles)
Row 10: Ch 1, bobble st in each of first 2 sts, sk next st, bobble st in each of next 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble st in next st] 3 times, leaving 4 sts unworked, turn. (8 bobbles)
Row 11: Ch 1, bobble in first st, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 5 times, leaving rem 5 sts unworked, turn. (6 bobbles)
Row 12: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in each of first 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 3 times, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, bobble in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, leaving rem 4 sts unworked, turn. (5 bobbles)
Row 14: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 4 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, bobble in last st, turn. (8 bobbles)

Row 15: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 2 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 4 times, leaving rem 6 sts unworked, turn. (6 bobbles)
Row 16: Ch 1, bobble st in first st, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 3 times, leaving rem 4 sts unworked, turn. (4 bobbles)

## Stem Leaf

Row 17: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 4 sts , leaving rem 4 sts unworked, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next $6 \mathrm{chs}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next ch, leaving last ch unworked, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each of next 6 chs, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. (4 bobbles, 16 sc )
Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sts, 3 sc in next st, sc in each of next 6 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

## Rows 19 \& 20: Rep row 18.

Row 21: Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sts , sl st across to base of ch on row 17, ch 8 (Stem), 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of next 6 chs, sl st to top of bobble closest to ch on row 17. Fasten off.

## Block Leaf if curling.

## Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, with WS facing, join to base of row 1 , ch 9 , sc in end of row 4, ch $9, s c$ in end of row 6, ch 9 , $s c$ in end of row 8, ch 9, sc in end of row 10, ch 9, sc in end of row 12 , ch 9 , sc in end of row 14 , ch 9 , sc in end of row 16, ch 9, sc in first lower point of Stem Leaf, ch 9, sc in top of Stem Leaf, ch 9, sc in lowest point of Stem Leaf, ch 9, sc in top of Stem, ch 9, sc in end of row 15 , ch 9 , sc in end of row 11 , ch 9 , sc in end of row 4, leaving rem rows unworked, do not turn or join.
Rnds 2 \& 3: [Ch 7, sc in next ch sp] 17 times. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Row 7: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 3 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn.
Row 8: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 3 times, bobble in next st, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. (7 bobbles)
Row 9: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in each of next 2 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, bobble in each of next 2 sts , leaving rem 4 sts unworked, turn. (6 bobbles)
Row 10: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in each of next 3 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. (7 bobbles)
Row 11: Ch 1, bobble in each of first 2 sts, [sk next st, bobble in each of next 2 sts] twice, bobble in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, bobble in next st, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. (9 bobbles)
Row 12: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in next st, sk next st, bobble in each of next 4 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 3 times, bobble in next st, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn.
Row 13: Ch 1, bobble in first st, [sk next st, bobble in next st] twice, [bobble in next st, sk next st] 4 times, bobble in next st, leaving rem 3 sts unworked, turn. (8 bobbles)

Row 18: Ch 1, sk first st, bobble in each of next 2 sts, [sk next st, bobble in next st] 3 times, ch 11, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 8 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each of next 8 chs, leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn. ( 5 bobbles, 20 sc )
Rows 19-21: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 9 sts, 3 $s c$ in next st, sc in each of next 8 sts , leaving rem 2 sts unworked, turn.
Row 22: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 10 sts, sl st in

Row 3: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] across to ch-5 sp, ch 2, dc in ch-5 sp, ch 7, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in tr on center petal, turn. (31 ch-2 sps)
Row 4: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, dc, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in
each ch-3 sp (petals), ch 5, dc in next ch-7 sp, ch 2, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] across, turn. (32 ch-2 sps)
Row 5: Ch 5, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp , dc in next dc across to last dc, ch 2, dc in next ch-5 sp, ch 7, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in tr of center petal, turn. (33 ch-2 sps)
Row 6: Rep row 4. (34 ch-2 sps)
Row 7: Ch 5, dc in next dc, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc] across to 6th dc from end, ch 7, sk next 4 ch-2 sps, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in 5th ch-2 sp, turn. (29 ch-2 sps)

Rows 8-157: [Rep rows 2-7 consecutively] 25 times.

Rows 158-162: Rep rows 2-6.

## Flowers on First Short End

Next rows: [Rep row 7 and row 4 alternately] 7 times.
Next row: Ch 10, (dc, \{ch 3, dc\} 3 times) in 5th ch-2 sp, turn.

Next row: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, dc, tr, dc, hdc, sc) in each of next 3 ch-3 sps, ch 5, dc in next ch-10 sp, ch 2 , sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch. Fasten off. (total of 1 ch- 2 sp and 8 Flowers across Short End)

## Flowers on 2nd Short End

Getting started: Turn piece to RS of beg ch
with Flowers on your left. Piece will be upside down. Join (see Pattern Notes) in corner ch of first row.

Next rnd: With size $P$ hook, ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch around, do not join. ( 54 sc )

Next rnds: Rep rnd 2 until piece measures $61 / 2$ inches from beg of marked st, 2 sc in next st to finish rnd at flattened side edge, turn, do not join or fasten off. Remove marker.

## First Upper Side

Row 1: Now working in rows, ch 1, sl st in each of first 5 sts, ch 1 , sc in same st as last sl st, sc in each of next 18 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (19 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Next rows: Rep row 2 until Upper Side measures $11 / 2$ inches from beg, at end of last row, do not fasten off.

Attach handle: Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 sts, *[ch 3, working 2 inches from handle end, beg with hook under handle, yo, pull up lp around handle, yo, pull tightly through both Ips] twice, ch $3^{*}$, sc in each of next 11 sts, working from left edge of handle, rep between *, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

## 2nd Upper Side

Row 1: With WS facing, join in 9th sc on Lower Section from First Upper Side, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 18 sc , leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (19 sc)
Work rem rows same as First Upper Side.

## Finishing

Optional: To prevent yarn from slipping off bamboo handles, dab a thin line of glue on handles approximately 2 inches from each end and slide strand of yarn nearest to ends over glue.

## Without Lining

Center magnetic button inside Upper Sides $3 / 4$ inch below top edges and sew through all thicknesses.

## With Lining

Cut 2 pieces satin fabric each $4 \times 81 / 2$ inches for Upper Sides and 1 piece $81 / 2 \times 11 \frac{1}{2}$ inches for Lower Section.
If stiffener is desired, cut 2 pieces $13 / 8 \times 71 / 4$ inches from plastic canvas.
Upper Sides: With RS of fabric and short edges tog, sew sides with $1 / 2$-inch seam allowance to form pocket for stiffener. Trim seams and press under $1 / 2$ inch from top edge to WS. Turn fabric pocket RS out and insert stiffener in pocket.
Pin pocket to WS of Upper Sides $3 / 8$ inch below top edge, sew in place, closing open edges as you sew.
Rep for 2nd Upper Side.
Center magnetic button inside Upper Side approximately $3 / 4$ inch below top edges and sew through all thicknesses.

Chain-3 join (ch-3 join): Ch 1, remove Ip from hook, insert hook from front to back through corresponding ch-3 sp of neighboring Motif, return Ip to hook, ch 2, the first of these 2 chs will wrap around ch-3 sp of neighboring Motif.

## First Flower Motif

Rnd 1 (RS): With first color (see Color Chart), make slip ring (see Special Stitches), ch 2, beg cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 2, [cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 2] 7 times, duplicate-st join (see Special Stitches), pull end to close ring. ( $8 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}, 8 \mathrm{cls}$ )
Rnd 2: With RS facing, join (see Pattern Notes) 2nd color in any cl, ch 1, 2 hdc in same st as ch-1, 2 hdc in next ch-2 sp, [2 hdc in next cl, 2 hdc in next ch-2 sp] around, join in first hdc. (32 hdc)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next st, (sc, ch 7, sc) in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts (sc group), (sc, ch 7, sc) in next st] 7 times, sc in next st, duplicate-st join. ( 40 sc, 8 ch-7 sps)
Rnd 4: With RS facing, join 3rd color in center SC of any 3 -sc group, ch 1 , sc in same st as beg ch1 , sk next 2 sts, ( $8 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3,8 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-7 sp (petal), [sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, ( $8 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3,8 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-7 sp] around, sk last 2 sts, duplicate-st join. (8 sc, 8 petals)

## Next Flower Motif

Getting started: The working Motif is joined to each neighboring Motif at tips of 2 petals and at points of Diamond Motifs while


working 2 ch- 3 sps. Hold neighboring Motifs (see Assembly Diagram) with RS facing and sts matching.
Rnds 1-3: Rep rnds 1-3 of First Flower Motif.
Rnd 4 (joining rnd): With RS facing, join 3rd color in center of any sc group, ch 1 , sc in same st as beg ch-1, sk next 2 sts, ( 8 dc , ch 3 , 8 dc ) in next ch-7 sp (petal), [sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, ( 8 dc , ch-3 join—see Special Stitches, 8 dc ) in next ch-7 sp] around until Motif is joined to all neighboring Motifs, sk next 2 sts, [sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, (8 dc, ch 3, 8 dc ) in next ch-7 st, sk next 2 sts] around, duplicate-st join. (8 sc, 8 petals) Make total of 62 Next Flower Motifs, joining according to Motif Assembly Diagram.

## Diamond Motif

Rnd 1 (RS): With E, make slip ring, ch 1, 8 hdc

1 skein each \#1814 true blue, \#1303 Aran, \#1620 clover, \#1601 lettuce and \#1207 cornsilk

- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge


## GAUGE

( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in ch, ch 4 , sk 4 chs, ( $s c$, ch $2, s c$ ) in next ch $=2$ inches; 5 pattern rows = 2 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Afghan is quick to make and is made with single crochet and chains only. It can be made in all scraps of yarn with 1 color for each row or in varying numbers of rows as desired.

Leave 7 -inch ends at beginning and end for Fringe.

Always begin new color on right side. Work each color on both sides of center.

## AFGHAN

Getting started: Work rows on both sides of starting ch, working both sides for each row.

## Row 1 (RS):

A. With cornsilk, leaving 7-inch end (see Pattern Notes), ch 147, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *ch 4, sk next 4 chs ${ }^{* *}$, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in last ch, leave 7 -inch end. Fasten off.
B. Working on opposite side of row 1 , join cornsilk with sc in first ch, *ch 4, sk next 4 chs**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in last ch. Fasten off.

## Rows 2 \& 3:

A. Join lettuce with sc in first sc, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 $\mathrm{sp}^{* *}$, ( $s c, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-2 sp , rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, $s c$ in last sc. Fasten off.
B. Working on opposite side, join lettuce with sc in first st, ${ }^{*}$ ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp**, ( $s c$, ch $2, s c$ ) in next ch-2 $s p$, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in last st. Fasten off.

Row 4: With true blue, rep row 2.
Row 5: With medium purple, rep row 2.
Rows 6 \& 7: With delft blue, rep row 2.
Row 8: With clover, rep row 2.
Rows 9-12: With lavender, rep row 2.
Row 13: With light raspberry, rep row 2.
Row 14: With light country rose, rep row 2.
Row 15: With buff, rep row 2.

Row 16: With Aran, rep row 2.
Row 17: With cornmeal, rep row 2.
Rows 18-20: With cornsilk, rep row 2.
Next rows: [Rep rows 2-20] once.
Next rows: Rep rows 2-17.

## Last row:

A. Join cornsilk with sc first st, ch 3 , sc in same st as beg $s c$, (sc, ch 3, sc) in each ch-4 $s p$ and in each ch-2 $s p$ across, ending with ( $s c$, ch $3, s c$ ) in last st. Fasten off.
B. Rep A on opposite side.

## Fringe

Cut strand 14 inches in length. Fold strand in half, pull fold through, pull ends through fold. Pull to tighten.
Add 1 Fringe of matching yarn to end of each sc row with 7-inch ends.
Add 2 Fringe to ends of rows with no ends. Trim ends even. C!

Rows 8-36: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 37: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing colors to black in last st, turn.

Rows 38-44: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Stripe Section

## Make 2.

Color Sequence: 4 rows hot green, 2 rows hot pink, 4 rows swimming pool, 2 rows hot pink, 4 rows key lime pie, 4 rows hot blue, 2 rows hot green, 4 rows pinky stripes, 2 rows hot green, 4 rows swimming pool, 4 rows hot pink, 2 rows hot blue, 4 rows key lime pie, 2 rows hot blue, 4 rows hot green, 2 rows hot pink, 4 rows swimming pool, 2 rows hot pink, 4 rows key lime pie, 4 rows hot blue, 2 rows hot green, 4 rows pinky stripes, 2 rows hot green, 4 rows swimming pool, 4 rows hot pink.
Row 1: With hot green (see Color Sequence), ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (20 sc)

Rows 2-79: Following Color Sequence, ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 80: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing color to black in last st, do not turn.
Row 81: Working in ends of rows, sc in end of each row across. Fasten off. ( 80 sc )

## Side A Assembly

Place Stripe Sections with row 81 next to Center Section. Top edge of left-side piece should beg with hot green and top edge of right-side piece should beg with hot pink.


With tapestry needle and black, sew 1 Stripe Section to each side of Center Section so the hot green rows of 1 Section are at top on 1 side and hot pink rows are at top of the 2nd Stripe Section as shown in photo.
Block (see Pattern Notes) piece if needed.

## Outer Top Edging

Row 1: Hold piece so the Stripe Sections are at top and bottom, working in ends of rows, join black with sc in end of row at top right corner, sc in end of each row across, turn. ( 80 sc )

Rows 2-8: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn. Measure piece before end and adjust number of rows for sizing if needed. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Outer Bottom Edging

Rows 1-8: Rep Outer Top Edging on bottom edge.

## Make 1 each hot blue \& hot green.

## Long Piece

Row 1: Ch 23, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (22 sc)

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Short Piece

## Make 2.

Row 1: Ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (9 sc)

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Letter X Assembly

Sew the 2 Short Pieces to Long Piece to form the Letter X as shown in photo.

Rnd 1: With hot pink, ch 30 , sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1 , [sc in each of next 4 chs, 2 sc in next ch] around, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (36 sc)
Rnd 2: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] around, join in beg sc. (42 sc)
Rnd 3: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st] around, join in beg sc. (48 sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in each of first 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (54 sc)

## Small Flower

Rnd 1: With black, ch 3, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1,10 sc in ring, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (10 sc)
Rnd 2: Join hot pink in first st, ch 1, sc in same st, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] around, ch 3 , sk last st, join in beg sc. ( 5 sc )
Rnd 3: Ch 1, sk first sc, [(sc, hdc, dc) in next ch-3 sp, tr in sk sc of rnd 1 , (dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-3 sp, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (5 petals)

## Medium Flower

Rnd 1: With black, ch 3, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 2 (does not count as st), 10 hdc in ring, join in first hdc. Fasten off. (10 hdc)

Rnd 2: Join hot pink in first hdc, ch 1, sc in same st, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] around, ch 3 , sk last st, join in beg sc. ( 5 sc)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, sk first sc, [(sc, hdc, dc) in ch-3 sp, tr in sk hdc of rnd 1, (dc, hdc, sc) in same ch-3 sp, sk next sc] around, join in beg sc. (5 petals)
Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sl st in first st, *sc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, 3 dc in next $s t, 2$ hdc in next st, sc in next st**, sl st in each of next 2 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep with ${ }^{* *}$, sl st in last st, join in beg sl st. Fasten off.

## Large Flower

Rnds 1-4: Rep rnds 1-4 of Medium Flower. Do not fasten off at end of row 4.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, sk next st, *sl st in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next $s t, 3$ dc in next $s t, 2$ hdc in next st, sc in each of next 2 st , sl st in next st**, sk next st rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg st. Fasten off.

## Appliqué Finishing

Sew Appliqués in place as shown in photo using either sewing thread or yarn.

## Right Border Side

Row 1: Hold piece sideways with RS facing, join black with sc in end row of Outer Bottom Edging at top right corner, working in ends of rows, scin each row across, sc in each st across Stripe Section, sc in end of each row on Center Section, scin each st across next Stripe Section in ends of rows on Outer Top Edge, turn. (102 sc)
Rows 2-11: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn. Measure piece before end and adjust number of rows for sizing if needed. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Left Border Side

Rows 1-11: Rep rows 1-11 of Right Border Side.

2 rows swimming pool, 2 rows hot blue, 2 rows key lime pie, 2 rows hot green, 8 rows black, 30 rows white (center), 8 rows black, 2 rows hot green, 2 rows key lime pie, 2 rows hot blue, 2 rows swimming pool, 2 rows hot pink, 2 rows pinky stripes, 2 rows black, 2 rows pinky stripes, 2 rows hot pink, 2 rows swimming pool, 2 rows hot blue, 2 rows key lime pie, 2 rows hot green, 2 rows black.
Row 1: With black (see Color Sequence), ch 81, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. ( 80 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Rows 3-102: Following Color Sequence, ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Small Heart

## Make 2.

Row 1: With hot pink, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 3 sc in first st, turn. (3 sc)
Row 3: Ch 4, (tr, dc) in same st as beg ch-4, sl st in next st, (dc, tr) in next st, ch 4, sl st across to last st, sl st in ends of rows across and in beg st of row 1, sl $s t$ in ends of rows back up on other side. Fasten off.

## Medium Heart

## Make 2.

Row 1: With hot pink, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, 3 sc in first st, turn. (3 sc)
Row 3: Ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in first st, sc in next $\mathrm{st}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in last st, turn. ( 5 sc )
Row 4: Ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in first st , sc in each of next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 2$ sc in last st, turn. (7 sc)
Row 5: Ch 4, (3 tr, dc) in first st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, (dc, 3 tr) in next st, ch 4, sl st to last st, sl st in ends of rows around and in beg st in row 1 , then slst back up in ends of rows on other side. Fasten off.

## Large Heart

Row 1: With hot pink, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1,3 sc in first st, turn. (3 sc)
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.


Row 4: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st, turn. ( 5 sc )
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (7sc)
Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 8: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next $5 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in last st, turn. (9 sc)
Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 10: Ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in first st , sc in each of next 7 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (11 sc)
Row 11: Ch 1 , sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 12: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 9 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. ( 13 sc )
Row 13: Ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in first st , sc in each of next 11 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (15 sc)

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 15: Ch 1,2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 13 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (17 sc)
Row 16: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 15 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. (19 sc)

Row 17: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 17 sts, 2 sc in last st, turn. ( 21 sc )
Rows 18 \& 19: Ch 1, sc in each st, across, turn.
Row 20: Ch 1, sc in each of next 10 sts, leave rem sts unworked, turn. (10 sc)
Row 21: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 9 sts, turn. (9 sc)

Row 22: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 23: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 6 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. ( 7 sc )
Row 24: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 4 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. (5 sc)

Row 25: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, sc in last st. Fasten off. (3 sc)
Row 26: Hold Heart so that unworked top portion is on left side, then on row 19 join yarn in 10th st from end of row, ch 1 , sc in same st and in each of next 9 sts, turn. (10 sc)
Row 27: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 8 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. (9 sc)
Row 28: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 29: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each of next 6 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. (7 sc)

Row 30: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in next 4 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, turn. ( 5 sc )
Row 31: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in next 2 sts, sk next st, sc in last st, (3 sc), sl st in ends of rows, and in bottom of beg st in row 1 , then sl st in ends of rows back up on other side. Fasten off.

## Side B Assembly

Sew Appliqués in place as shown in photo using either sewing thread or yarn.

## Top Border

Row 1: Hold piece upright with RS facing, join black with sc in first st at the top righthand corner, sc in end of each row across, turn. (102 sc)

Rows 2-11: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Measure piece before end and adjust number of rows for sizing if needed. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Bottom Border

Rows 1-11: Rep rows 1-11 of Top Border.

## Pillow Assembly

Block sections if needed.
With black yarn and tapestry needle, sew 3 sides tog, insert pillow form and then sew the last side tog or sew in zipper.

3 skeins each \#156 beanstalk, \#146 sea sprite and \#157 honey bee

- Size J/10/6mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Rug backing (optional)


## GAUGE

$11 \mathrm{sc}=4$ inches; 11 sc rows $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTE

To create neater edge, yarn should be carried up sides of your work rather than fastening off and weaving in ends.
Apply rug backing if rug is to be used on uncarpeted floors.

Always change color in last stitch worked.
Chain-1 at beginning of row counts as first single crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.


## SPECIAL STITCH

Spike single crochet (spike sc): Sc in next st 2 rows below, pulling up lp to height of this row.

## RUG

Row 1: With beanstalk, ch 85 , sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, changing color (see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes) to sea sprite in last st, turn. ( 84 sc )

Row 2: Ch 1 (see Pattern Notes), sc in next
st, [working over sc, sc in next ch below, sc in next sc] across, changing colors to honey bee, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in next st, [spike sc (see Special Stitch), sc in next st] across, changing to next color, turn.
Rows 4-91: Rep row 2 working 1 row with each color in established color sequenced. At end of last row, fasten off.

Apply rug backing to 1 side for back as desired. C!

## INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1: Working in multiples of 8 plus 2 chs , sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each ch across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), picot cl (see Special Stitch) in first st, [sk next 3 sts, (tr, ch 2, picot cl) in next st] across to last 4 sts, sk next 3 sts , tr in last st, turn.

[ch 7, sk next ch-5 sp, sc in next sc] across to last ch-5 sp, ch 3, sk next 2 chs, dc in next ch (3rd ch of last ch-5 sp), leave rem sts unworked, turn. ( 10 [11, 12, 13, 14, 15] reps)
Rows 15-19: Work even in Lace Pattern as established.
Row 20: Ch 1, sk first $s c$, $s l$ st in each of next 3 chs, ch 1, Ing sc in next ch-7 sps, [ch 5, sk next sc , Ing sc in next ch-7 sps] across, leave last sc unworked, turn. (9 [10, 11, 12, 13, 14] reps)
Rows 21-31: Work even in Lace Pattern as established.

Row 32: Rep row 20. (8 [9, 10, 11, 12, 13] reps)
Next rows: Work even in Lace Pattern as established until piece measures $16[16,161 / 2$, $161 / 2,17,17]$ inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Crochet Lacing (optional)

## Lacing

Rnd 17: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next double love knot, sk next st, love knot, [sc in sc in next double love knot, double love knot] twice, sc in sc of next double love knot, love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. ( $6 \mathrm{sc}, 4$ love knots, 4 double love knots, 117 [128, 154, 168, 182, 198] ext dc)
Rnd 18: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next love knot, sk next st, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] twice, double love knot*, sk next
ext dc, rep between * once. (4 $\mathrm{sc}, 6$ double love knots, 113 [124, 150, 164, 178, 194] ext dc)

Rnd 19: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next double love knot, sk next st, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, double love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. ( $6 \mathrm{sc}, 8$ double love knots, 109 [120, 146, 160, 174, 190] ext dc)

Rnd 20: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next double love knot, sk next st, love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. (8 sc, 4 love knots, 6 double love knots, 105 [116, 142, 156, 170, 186] ext dc)
Rnd 21: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next love knot, sk next st, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, double love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. ( $6 \mathrm{sc}, 8$ double love knots, 101 [112, 138, 152, 166, 182] ext dc)
Rnd 22: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next double love knot, sk next st, love knot, sc in sc of next love knot, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. (8 sc, 4 love knots, 6 double
love knots, 97 [108, 134, 148, 162, 178] ext dc)
Rnd 23: Sk first ext dc, *ext dc in each st across to last st before next love knot, sk next st, [double love knot, sc in sc of next double love knot] 3 times, double love knot*, sk next ext dc, rep between * once. ( $6 \mathrm{sc}, 8$ double love knots, 93 [104, 130, 144, 158, 174] ext dc)

## Border

Rnd 24: Sc in next ext dc, [double love knot, sk next 4 sts, sc in next st] 9 [10, 12, 14, 15, 18] times, *sk rem ext dc, [double love knot, sc in next double love knot] 8 times, double love knot*, sc in next ext dc, [double love knot, sk next 4 sts, sc in next st] $9[10,12,14$, $15,18]$ times, rep between * once, join in beg sc. (27 [29, 33, 37, 39, 45] double love knots)
Rnd 25: Love knot, [sc in sc of next double love knot, double love knot] around, do not join.
Rnds 26 \& 27: [Sc in sc of next double love knot, double love knot] around. At end of last rnd, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Neck Edging

With RS facing, join with sc in last row of right back Shoulder Shaping, working across back edge, evenly sp 31 [36, 46, 51, 56, 61] sc across, working in ends of rows on Shoulder,
evenly $s p 4 s c$, evenly sp 10 sc across rows of Front Armhole Section, working across Front Inset, *double love knot, sk next $4[4,5,4,5$, 4] sts, sc in next st, rep from * across, working in ends of rows, evenly sp 10 sc across Front Armhole Section, evenly sp 4 sc across ends of rows at Shoulder, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

Rows 4-8: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with row 2 . ( 28 [34, 40, $46,52,58]$ sts at end of last row)
Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc dec in next 2 sts, work in Body Pattern as established across to end of row, turn. (27 [33, 39, 45, 51, 57] sts)
Row 10: Work in Body Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts , sc in last st, turn. (26 [32, 38, 44, 50, 56] sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), [dc in next dc, ch 1] 3 times, dc in next dc, *sk last dc of group and first dc of next group**, dc in next dc, [ch 1, dc in next dc] 6 times, rep from * around,
ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, [dc in next dc , ch 1] twice, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off.
Rnd 3: Join light turquoise with sc in first ch-1 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, *sc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp]** 5 times, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 1, join with hdc in first sc. Fasten off.

## Bodice

Getting started: Turn piece upside down, and with RS facing, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 on Skirt, join white in first ch.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3, dc in each ch around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.

Rnds 2-9 [2-11, 2-11]: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Shoulder Strap

Getting started: With WS of Bodice, mark 9th [11th, 13th] and 42nd [46th, 50th] dc of last rnd of Bodice.

## First Strap

Row 1 (WS): With WS facing, join white in first marked st and working along last rnd
of Bodice, ch 3, sk next dc, V-st (see Special Stitches) in next dc, sk next dc, dc in next dc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (1 V-st, 2 dc )
Rows 2-24 [2-28, 2-30]: Ch 3, V-st in ch sp of next $V$-st, dc in top of beg ch-3, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Strap

Join in next marked st and rep First Strap.

## Bodice Edging

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, join light turquoise in first dc of last rnd of Bodice, ch 1, sc in same dc and in each of next 2 dc , * ${ }^{*}$ Ing sc (see Special Stitches), sc in each of next 2 dc$]$ across** to Shoulder Strap, work along Shoulder Strap edge as follows: 2 sc in end of each row, placing 3 sc in top $V$-st and corner sps; rep from * twice, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg ch-1.

## Blocking

Wet- or steam-block to finished measurements.

## Sewing \& Buttons

Locate center of back Bodice top edge, place marker.
On the back, with sewing needle and thread, sew buttons inside Bodice top edge, each spaced $2\left[2 \frac{1}{2}, 3\right]$ inches from marked st. Button straps as desired.

## Make 1 each with pink \& Mexican pink.

in first sc. (5 ch-3 sps, 5 sc )
Rnd 3: Ch $1,(\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{hdc}, 5 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each ch-3 sp around, join in beg sc. ( 5 petals)
Rnd 4: Ch 1, working behind petals of rnd 2, [sc in next sc of rnd 1, ch 5] around, join to beg sc.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 9 dc , hdc, sc) in each ch-5 sp around, join in beg sc. Leaving long end, fasten off.

## Leaf

With lime green, ch 31 , sc in 2nd ch from hook, *hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 2
chs, tr in each of next 6 chs, dc in each of next 2 chs, hdc in next ch*, sc in next ch, sl st in each of next 2 chs , $s c$ in next ch, rep between * once**, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of ch, rep from * to ${ }^{* *}$ once, sc in last ch. Leaving long end, fasten off.
With tapestry needle and using long ends, sew Roses and Leaf to Top as shown in photo. With sewing needle and thread, sew 1 pearl sequin in center of each Rose.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sk first st, (sc, dc) in next dc, [sk next st, (sc, dc) in next dc] around, join in beg ch-1. Fasten off.

## Hood

Using rem 2 Motifs, with tapestry needle and long ends, with invisible seam (see illustration), sew short ends of Motifs tog.


Invisible Seam

With WS facing, pin Hood Motifs to top back of Snuggler, lining up seam between Hood Motifs with center seam on back. Using invisible seam, sew Motifs to Snuggler.
With either side facing, join to top right edge of Hood Motifs, ch 1, dc in same st as beg ch1, [sk next st, (sc, dc) in next st] across, turn. (22 pattern reps)
Next rows: Rep row 2 of Motif 3 times. Leaving 10 -inch end, fasten off.
Fold Hood in half with RS tog. With 10 -inch end, using invisible seam, sew top edges of each Motif tog to form top of Hood. Turn Hood RS out.

## Hood Edging

Row 1: With RS of back of Snuggler facing, join to right side at base of Hook where it meets top of Snuggler, ch 1, evenly sp 60 sc around edge of Hood, ending last sc in st at base of other side of Hood where it meets top of Snuggler, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, dc in same st as beg ch-1, [sk next st, (sc, dc) in next st] across, ending in beg ch-1 of row 1. Fasten off.

## Tie

[Ch 150. Fasten off] twice.
Knot 2 ch lengths at 1 end. Lightly twist both ch lengths tog, knotting when finished at other end.
Beg at center front Snuggler, weave Tie in tie casing, ending back at center front. Trim ends if needed.

in ring, join in first hdc, pull end to close ring. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: With RS facing, join F in any hdc, ch 1, 3 hdc in same st as beg ch-1, hdc in next st, [3 hdc in next st, hdc in next st] around, join in first hdc. Fasten off.
Rnd 3 (joining rnd): With RS facing, join E in center hdc of any hdc group, ch 1, (2 dc, ch-3 join, 2 dc ) in same st as beg ch-1 (corner), [hdc in each of next 3 sts, ( 2 dc , ch-3 join, 2 dc ) in next st] around, until Motif is joined to all neighboring Motifs, hdc in each of last 3 sts, join in beg dc. Fasten off.
Work Diamond Motifs as fill-in between 4 Flower Motifs according to Motif Assembly Diagram.

## Finishing

Wash Throw according to yarn label instructions. Lie out and stretch into shape to open up sts in Motifs. Let dry completely. C!

Double crochet (dc):

Projects for first-time crocheters using basic stitches, with little or no shaping.

Projects for new crocheters who are comfortable with the beginner basic stitches and are ready to combine them into short pattern sequences. Skills include simple increasing, decreasing and minimal color changes.

## (1234) (3) easr

Projects using basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot mats, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within this skill category, as well as the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

## (1)23435 (intermedate

Projects that incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing. The crocheter has the ability to read more advanced stitch pattern charts, such as lace and cable charts.

## 103456 moobative

Projects that utilize a wide variety of stitches and techniques such as those noted above, as well as more detailed colorwork, shaping, construction and finishing.

## 123(4)36 chalenging

Projects that require a more intuitive understanding of a pattern or chart and that also include advanced stitches and techniques, as well as more intricate methods such as intarsia, cables, lace, stranded colorwork with numerous color changes and advanced shaping and construction techniques.
