## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

22 inches in circumference, 412-inch Brim

## MATERIALS

- Omega Sinfonia light (light worsted) weight cotton yarn ( $31 / 20 z / 232 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):
3 skeins \#861 sand 1 skein \#838 brown
- Size $(/ 2 / 2.75 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- Small seashell beads: 14
- Spray starch
- Plastic wrap
- Stitch markers: 12


## GAUGE

$24 \mathrm{sc}=4$ inches; 24 sc rows $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds, do not join or turn unless otherwise stated.
Mark first stitch of round. Move markers up with each round.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## HAT

Rnd 1 (RS): With sand, ch 1, 6 sc in back bar of ch (see illustration), do not join (see Pattern Notes). (6 sc)


Back Bar of Chain

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each st around. ( 12 sc )
Rnd 3: [Sc in next st, place marker (see Pattern Notes) in sc just made, sc in same st as last $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next st] around. ( $18 \mathrm{sc}, 6$ markers)

Rnd 4: [2 sc in marked st, sc in each st around to next marked st] around. ( 24 sc )
Rnds 5-19: [Rep rnd 4] 15 times. (114 sc at end of last rnd)
Rnd 20: Sc in each st around.
Rnds 21 \& 22: [Rep rnd 20] twice.
Rnd 23: [2 sc in marked st, sc in each st around to next marked st, sc in marked st, sc in each st around to next marked st] around. ( 117 sc )

Rnds 24-26: [Rep rnd 20] 3 times.
Rnd 27: [Sc in marked st, sc in each st around to next marked st, 2 sc in marked st, sc in each st to next marked st] around. (120 sc)

## PATTERN NOTES

When crocheting with elastic thread, it is recommended to begin with number of chain stitches given in pattern and then check fit after completing row 1 . If you want a smaller or tighter anklet, decrease number of chains; if you want a larger or looser anklet, add

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# SPLIT INFINITIVE: <br> AN INTRODUCTION TO TAPESTRY OVERLAY <br> BY LORIM. CARLSON 


#### Abstract

LEARN HOW TO CREATE THIS INNOVATIVE CROCHET DESIGN THAT COMBINES TRADITIONAL TAPESTRY CROCHET AND MODERN OVERLAY STITCHING TECHNIQUES. FOLLOW OUR EASY, STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS AND CLEAR, CONCISE PHOTOS TO MASTER THE SKILL IN NO TIME!


It was about seven years ago that I decided to become a "thread only" crocheter as I enjoy the versatility and challenges that crocheting with thread provides. The extra effort thread crochet often demands can result in the creation of a work of artbe it a fine piece of delicate lace or an intricately stitched doily.

I like to challenge myself-it is through my self-imposed challenges that I've developed some of my skills, along with seeking out difficult patterns to accomplish. It all began innocently enough when I decided to "colorize" doilies that were originally a single solid color. My various experimentations with colorizing eventually resulted in a happy accident: tapestry overlay.

Overlay stitching techniques have been used extensively by designers Patricia (Trish) Kristoffersen and Melody MacDuffee. Trish is known for the use of the front post
split stitch (also called split front post stitch), while Melody makes use of front post stitches as well as multiple colors with a single color being worked per round. Carol Ventura is renowned for her tapestry crochet techniques and designs. Tapestry overlay is the synthesis of these two techniques: Overlay stitches are worked in their own color creating a foreground; they are simultaneously worked with the background. The background may also use elements of tapestry crochet to create a pattern.

Modern mandala artwork and the children's toy Spirograph ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ served as the inspiration for the Split Infinitive design. The overlay pattern is created by use of the front post split stitch, which when worked into other front post split stitches creates a diamond pattern. Mastering this stitch with a change of color will take practice and patience. If you find your overlay stitches are pulling
the fabric inward, try pulling up a generous "golden loop" when working the legs as this will help increase their length.

## FRONT POST SPLIT STITCH

The front post split stitch (also called a split front post stitch) is essentially a decrease stitch or cluster stitch that is worked in two parts or legs. The stitch can be worked to any length specified by the number of yarn-over wraps made on the hook, e.g., double crochet (dc), treble crochet ( tr ).

On the initial round of front post split stitches in the Split Infinitive pattern, the first and second legs will be worked into the double crochet stitches designated. On all subsequent rounds the front post split stitches will be worked into the two horizontal loops of the previous round of front post split stitches (see Photo 1).

The first leg is worked by

inserting the hook top to bottom through the horizontal loops of the designated front post split stitch (see Photo 2). Continue to work the stitch holding back last two loops. Yarn over the specified number of wraps.

The second leg is worked by inserting the hook bottom to top through the horizontal loops of the
designated front post split stitch (see Photo 3). Continue to work the stitch, holding back the last three loops. Yarn over new color and draw through all three loops.

## FRONT POST SINGLE CROCHET WORKED AROUND FRONT POST SPLIT STITCH

Insert the hook right to left underneath the first horizontal bar of the front post split stitch. The exposed post will be the previous color worked. Work the single crochet as normal around the post (see Photo 4). C!

## MATERIALS

- Handy Hands Lizbeth size 10 crochet cotton (122 yds/25g per ball):
2 balls each \#605 silver and \#656 wedgewood dark
1 ball each \#602 natural, \#631 country purple light, \#641 lilac dark, \#658 ocean turquoise light and \#663 bright turquoise dark
- Size $7 / 1.65 \mathrm{~mm}$ steel crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Fiberfill
- Straight pins
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Rnds 1-5 on Back $=5$ inches across

## PATTERN NOTES

The basic tapestry crochet technique of carrying 1 or more colors and working over the carried color(s) is used throughout the pattern.

Work over or weave in ends as work progresses.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Do not fasten off silver once it is started. Secure it when not in use, then carry it up to next working round.

Always change colors in last stitch worked. Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

## Front post split stitches (fp split sts):

Holding back last Ip of each st (this may be a dtr, tr or trtr) on hook, work st as indicated (first leg), work st as indicated (2nd leg), yo, pull through all Ips on hook.

## Quintuple treble crochet (quintuple

tr): Yo 5 times, insert hook as indicated instructions, [yo, pull through 2 Ips on hook] 6 times.

## PILLOW

## Front

## Center Circle

Rnd 1: With natural, work slip ring (see illustration), ch 1,12 sc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (12 sc)


Slip Ring

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 24 dc )
Rnd 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 36 dc )

Rnd 4: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] around, changing color (see Pattern Notes and Stitch Guide) to silver in last st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around, sc in last st, join in beg sc, mark back Ip (see Stitch Guide) of first sc for rnd 10. (72 sc)
Rnd 6: SI st in each sc around to last st, working behind sl sts just worked, join lilac dark in front lp (see Stitch Guide) in first sc of rnd 5. Do not fasten off silver (see Pattern Notes).
Rnd 7: All sts on this rnd are worked behind sl sts of rnd 6 in front lps only of sc on rnd 5, ch 1,3 sc in first st, ch 2 , sk next 2 sts, [ 3 sc in next st, ch 2, sk next 2 sts] around, join in both lps of first sc. (24 3-sc groups)
Rnd 8: All dc on this rnd will be worked behind sl sts of rnd 6 and in front of ch sps of rnd 7, working in front lps only of sc on rnd 5 and in back lps only of sc on rnd 7, pull up Ip of silver in back Ip of first sc on rnd 7, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in each of next 2 sts, [sk next st on rnd 5, dc in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts on rnd 7] around, ending with dc in last st, join in both lps of first sc, place markers around first and last de worked on this rnd for rnd 12. (96 sts)
Rnd 9: SI st in each st around, working behind sl st just worked, join in first sc of rnd 8.

## Outer Circle

Rnd 10: All sts on this rnd are worked in back lps of rnd 5, pull up Ip of country purple light


in back lp of marked sc on rnd 5, ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), tr in each st around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (72 tr)
Rnd 11: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next st] around, join in beg sc. (96 sc)
Rnd 12: All fp split sts (see Special Stitches) on this rnd are worked behind sl sts of rnd 9 into dc of rnd 8, sk sc in that row, ch 3, dc in next st changing color to silver, fptr split sts changing color to country purple light, working first leg in last dc made and marked on rnd 8 and 2nd leg in first marked dc on rnd 8, [dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st changing color to silver, fp split st changing color to lilac dark, working first leg in previously worked dc on rnd 8 and 2nd leg in following dc on rnd 8] around, ending with dc in each of last 2 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (120 sts)
Rnd 13: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, *fpsc (see Stitch Guide) around next fp split sts**, sc in each of next 4 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in each of last 2 sts, join in beg sc. ( 120 sts)
Rnd 14: All fp split sts are worked into 2 center horizontal lps of previous rnd of fp split sts, ch 3, dc in each of next 3 sts, dc in next st changing color to silver, beg first leg of fptr
split st changing color to country purple light in last fptr split st on rnd 12 and 2nd leg of fptr split st changing color to country purple light in first fptr split st on rnd $12,{ }^{*}$ dc in each of next 4 sts, dc in next st changing color to silver, fptr split st changing color to country purple light in previously worked and following fptr split sts on rnd 12, rep from * around, for last fptr split st, change color to lilac dark, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (144 sts)
Rnd 15 transition rnd: Ch 1, sc in first st changing color to country purple light, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st changing color to lilac dark, sc in extended st, fpsc around next fp split st, sc in next st changing color to country purple light] around, ending with fpsc around last fp split st, join in beg sc. (144 sts)
Rnd 16: Ch 3, *dc in next st changing color to country purple light, dc in next st changing color to silver, fptr split sts changing color to country purple light in previously worked and following fptr split st on rnd $14^{* *}$, dc in each of next 4 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, dc in each of last 3 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (168 sts)
Rnd 17: With lilac dark, ch 1, sc in first st, sc in each dc and fpsc around each fp split st, join in beg sc. (168 sts)

Rnd 18: SI st in next st, ch 3, dc in each of next 4 sts, $d$ c in next st changing color to silver, fpdtr split sts changing color to lilac dark in previously worked and following fp split sts on rnd 16, dc in same st as last dc worked, [dc in each of next 6 sts, $d c$ in next st, changing color to silver, fpdtr split sts changing color to lilac dark in previously worked and following fp split sts on rnd $16, \mathrm{dc}$ in same st last dc work, rep from around, dc in last st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 216 sts)
Rnd 19: Ch 1, sc in each of first 6 sts, *fpsc around next fp split st, sk next st after fp split sts**, sc in each of next 7 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sc in last st, join in beg sc.
Rnd 20: SI st in each of first 4 sts, ch 3 , dc in each of next 6 sts, *dc in next st, changing color to silver, fpdtr split st changing color to lilac dark in previously worked and following fp split st on rnd $18, \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as last dc worked**, dc in each of next 7 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, changing color to ocean turquoise light in last st, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (240 sts)
Rnd 21 transition rnd: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sc in next st changing color to lilac dark, sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st changing color to ocean turquoise light, sc in each of next 2 sts, sk next dc, fpsc around next st, sk next $\mathrm{dc}{ }^{* *}$, sc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. (192 sts)
Rnd 22: SI st across next 2 sts changing color to lilac dark, sl st across next 2 sts, changing color to ocean turquoise light, ch 3, dc in each of next 5 sts, *dc in next st changing color to lilac dark, dc in next st changing color to silver, fpdtr split sts changing color to lilac dark in previously worked and following fp split sts on rnd 20, dc in same st as last dc worked changing color to ocean turquoise light ${ }^{* *}$, dc in each of next 6 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. (240 sts)

Rnd 23: Ch 1, sc in each of first 8 sts, *fpsc around next st, sk next dc**, sc in each of next 8 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. (216 sts)
Rnd 24: SI st across next 4 sts, ch 3, dc in each of next 7 sts, *dc in next st changing color to silver, fpdtr split st color to ocean

## FINISHED SIZES

Instructions given for small bracelet; changes for large bracelet are in [ ].

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

$3 / 4 \times 7$ inches (small)
[11⁄4 $\times 7$ inches (large)]

## MATERIALS

- $1 / 8$-inch bulky (chunky) weight nylon cord: 3 [5] yds
- Size $\mathrm{K} / 101 / 2 / 6.5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sturdy closure or clasp (available at hardware or sporting-good stores)
- Heat gun


## GAUGE

First 6 rows of large size $=11 / 4 \times 3$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

When working with nylon cord, use a heat gun to melt cut ends so they do not come unraveled.
Make to desired length to fit comfortably around wrist.


## BRACELET

Row 1: Join with sc to 1 end of clasp, sc again in same place 0 [1] time(s), turn. (1 [2] SC) Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Rows 3-14 [3-13] or to desired length: Rep row 2. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing

Melt (see Pattern Notes) or wrap end around other side of clasp and through top of last row. C!

Q. I am a beginner at crochet and am finding it difficult to read patterns. Any advice?
-Janice $S$.
A. Every beginner can find reading a pattern to be confusing at first; after all, learning to read patterns is the same as learning a new language. Reading crochet patterns is somewhat like reading a cake recipe in that you follow the instructions step by step. First, gather your ingredients for the "cake," that is, the materials listed at the beginning of a pattern. Then combine the particular ingredients or stitches following the steps given in the "recipe," that is, a crochet pattern.

## PATTERN EXAMPLEFOR A SIMPLESHELLSTITCH

Row 1 (RS): Ch 20, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *sk next 2 chs, 5 dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch, rep from * across.

Use a highlighter to mark each punctuation mark to divide the instructions into steps. Now work to each punctuation mark; then work to the next mark and so on to the end.

Learning to memorize the abbreviations for crochet is important,
but if you get confused about a stitch or term, use the abbreviation page in your pattern or book to find the answer. Break down the pattern instructions in this way: Consider each punctuation mark as the end of a step. Read between the first two punctuation marks, and then stop reading! Follow the instructions you have just read. Read the next section, and then stop reading! Continue in this manner to the end of the row. Sometimes, it is easiest for beginners to write out the steps of a pattern into longhand until they become more familiar with crochet terms and abbreviations.

Crocheting a $4 \times 4$-inch swatch helps you to learn and understand crochet terms and their abbreviations, and shows you how to break down instructions into doable steps. Best of all, it allows you to measure and check your gauge. Gauge determines the length and width for garment sec-tions-back, front or sleeves-or even a simple afghan. If you always swatch before beginning any crochet project, you'll never be like the sad crocheter who is sure a pattern is wrong because the sweater intended for 4-year-old

Jack is small enough for the new baby, or nearly large enough for you. The all-important gauge determines the size of any project, not the pattern.

A slotted gauge helps you measure your gauge accurately. For example, you have a pattern that states a gauge of five single crochet stitches and four single crochet rows each equal 2 inches. Lay the slotted gauge flat against your swatch, counting and writing down the number of stitches, including partial stitches, that show within the 2 -inch horizontal slot. Then, measure and record the number of rows shown in the 2 -inch vertical slot. As you can see, the sample swatch exactly matches our pattern gauge of five single crochet stitches and four single crochet rows each to equal 2 inches.

If the stitches that show within the slot are not full stitches, then use the 6 -inch side of the gauge to measure over 4 inches or more until you have isolated only a specific number of full stitches. Measuring a second time, over a great number of inches, also serves to ensure that your first 2-inch measurement is accurate.
Q. I want to crochet some motifs and embellishments for a jean jacket; how do I attach them to the jacket?
-Margie A.
A. Arrange the embellishments on the jacket in a way you find pleasing. Pin each motif in place. Using a handsewing needle and thread that matches each motif, holding the right side of garment facing you, work through the strands of motif from back to front, so the sewing stitches do not show in the right side. Secure the center of the motif with one stitch on top of another; run the thread on the wrong side of the motif, one backstitch at a time to the outer edge, and then backstitch around the outer edge back to the starting point. Denim is a good choice for a first project, as is most any other woven fabric. If you want to attach motifs, cuffs or a collar to a T-shirt or another stretchy fabric, you must slightly stretch the fabric so it maintains its natural elasticity and moves when the fabric stretches.

Try placing motifs on any of the following: elbows, collars, shoulders, pockets, seam lines, cuffs or hemlines to turn a simple garment into something really special. Motifs can also be used to cover up a stain, snag or rip in a garment. Plan out your motifs so they appear to be planned embellishments, and no one will be the wiser. This trick is especially helpful to give new life to a child's garment. Lengthen pants or a top by placing a series of motifs around the bottom and sew them to the garment. Or
work up an edging that complements the garment. Add a strip of curlicues to the bottoms of jeans, and they will become a quirky conversation piece. A row of crochet ruffles can extend sleeves or the hemline of a top or jacket for a little girl. If you are unable to find a color that complements a garment, consider yarns or threads that are self-striping or variegated.
Q. How do I know whether I'm working on the right or wrong side?
-Joyce P.
A. In general, the right side of a crochet piece begins with the first row, and then each odd-numbered row that follows. That means every time you are working on the right side, you are working an odd-numbered row: $1,3,5,7$, etc. When an odd number is the right side, you can tell at a glance! If the beginning tail is on the left side of your work, you are working on the right side. Conversely, even-numbered rows- $2,4,6,8$, etc.-are wrong-side rows. This means the beginning tail will be on the right side when you are working a wrong-side row.

Occasionally, the first row becomes the wrong side. Rows 1, 2 and 3 of a pattern identify right or wrong side such as: Row 1 (RS), Row 2 (WS). In this case, because it becomes a habit to always consider an odd-numbered row as the right side, make a note on the pattern to help you remember that the even-numbered rows are actually the right side for this pattern.

Sometimes determining the right and wrong side of a crochet piece can be as simple as deciding which side you find most pleasing to the eye. However, if you prefer odd-numbered rows to be right-side rows, make a notation on your pattern so you can keep track of the true right side for yourself.
Q. When I'm about to run out of yarn, is there a way to know if I have enough yarn to finish another row?
-Vera L.
A. I love this question because the answer is so easy: If the remaining yarn is three times the width of the piece you are working on, you have enough yarn to crochet another row. C!

Row 2: With size F hook, ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), (tr, ch 1, tr) in same st as beg ch-5, sk next ch-1 and next sc, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next sc, sk next ch-1 and next sc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next sc, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 54 times, with size D hook, [sk ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c] 11$ times, with size $B$ hook, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] across, turn. (size B hook: 11 shells, size D hook: 11 shells, size F hook: 54 shells, total 76 shells)

Row 3: With size B hook, ch 1, sk next sc, next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c$, [sk next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next sc] 10 times, with size D hook, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 11 times, with size F hook, [sk next ch-1 and next st, shell in next st] across, turn. (size B hook: 11 shells, size D hook: 11 shells, size F hook: 57 shells, total 79 shells)


## Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: With size B hook, ch 1, sk sc, next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c$, sk next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c$, ch 3 , sk next ch-1 and all of next shell, shell in next sc, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 8 times, with D hook, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 11 times, with size F hook, [sk next ch-1 and next st, shell in next st] across, turn. (size B hook: 10 shells, size D hook: 11 shells, size F hook: 57 shells, total 78 shells)

Row 6: With size F hook, ch 5, (tr, ch 1, tr) in same st as beg ch-5, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next sc, sk next ch-1 and next sc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next sc, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 54 times, with size D hook, [sk next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c] 11$ times, with size $B$ hook, [sk next ch-1 and next sc, shell in next sc] 8 times, shell in next ch, shell in next sc, sk next ch-1 and next $s c$, shell in next $s c$, turn. (size B hook: 11 shells, size D hook: 11 shells, size F hook: 54 shells, total 76 shells)
Row 7: Rep row 3.
Rows 8-144 [8-156, 8-168, 8-180,
8-192]: [Rep rows 2-7 consecutively] 23 [25,

27, 29, 31] times, ending last rep with row 6. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing

Fold row 1 to last row, sew rows tog. Block as needed.

## Waist Drawstring

Make 3 chains each desired length, adding at least 12 inches to waist measurement, tie 1 end of each chain tog. Loosely braid chains, secure ends.

Weave Drawstring through opening around waist of Skirt. C!

## GAUGE

Due to the fiber of this yarn, your gauge swatch must be wet-blocked. While wet, hold it at the top and shake it down a couple of times. This will ensure proper growth of fiber. Shape and allow to dry completely before measuring.
Size H hook after blocking: 20 sts = 4 inches; $161 / 2$ rows $=4$ inches
Take time to check gauge.

Garment is made in a modular fashion. There is no seaming. The Bodice is made in 3 pieces, from the top down. The pieces are joined, and Body continues downward. A wide trim is applied to complete the shoulders and neck.
The fiber used will stretch when blocked.
Expect a growth in length of approximately 50 percent or more of the original size. The pattern has accounted for this and will appear shorter and perhaps a little wider before blocking.
Both the right side and wrong side of garment look similar. When there is a designation of right side or wrong side in pattern, it is only to make assembly easier. For best results, do not weave in ends until after blocking.

Unlike many patterns, the wide vertical trim along inner edge is worked with a larger, rather than smaller, hook. Due to the growth of the fabric lengthwise, compensation had to be made since the trim would not experience the same growth factors. It may ruffle a bit until blocked.

Work entire garment in back loops only except when instructed otherwise.
The last stitch of a row can become stretched out when working in all back loops. If necessary to maintain integrity of the sides of rows, work last stitch in both loops instead of only the back loop.
Use care when counting the rows of the fronts. It's easy to miscount the first couple of rows. Retain stitch markers on the 3 pieces of bodice until they are joined to ensure correct placement.
Place stitch marker to mark right side of pieces.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL StITCH

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Row 1 (RS): With size H hook, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)

Row 2: Working in back Ips (see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes), ch 1, 2 sc in sc, turn. (2 sc)
Row 3: Ch 1,2 sc in first $s c$, $s c$ in last $s c$, turn. (3 sc)
Row 4: Ch 1, 2 sc in first $s c, s c$ in next $s c, 2 s c$ in last sc, turn. (5 sc)
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across to last 2 sc , $2 s c$ in next $s c$, $s c$ in last $s c$, turn. ( 6 sc )

Next rows: [Rep rows 6 and 7 alternately] $0[0,0,1,3,4]$ time(s). (9 [9, 9, 12, 18, 21] sc)

Next row: Rep row $6 .(11[11,11,14,20$, 23] sc)
Next row: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn.
(11 [11, 11, 14, 20, 23] sc)
Next row: Ch 1 , sc in each st across to last 2 $\mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc , sc in last sc, turn. (12 [12, 12, 15, 21, 24] sc)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 5 [5, $5,4,2,1]$ time(s). (17 [17, 17, 19, 23, 25] sc)

## Peplum

Row 1: Working in ends of rows at bottom edge of Midriff, ch 1, evenly sp sc across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, hdc in each of first 5 sts, [2 hdc in next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts] across, turn.
Rows 3 \& 4: Ch 1, hdc in each of first 5 sts , dc
in each of st across, ending with hdc in each of last 5 sts, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, hdc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Buttons

On Left Front, sew 1 button at joining between Midriff and Bodice. Sew 1 button on Peplum, evenly sp rem 3 buttons between first 2 Buttons.

## Buttonholes

Place markers at corresponding sps on Right Front.
Join at lower edge of Peplum, sl st to first marker, [ch 5, sl st in same st, sl st in each st across to next marker] 5 times, sl st in each of next 2 sts. Fasten off.

## Sleeves

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join in center of Side Panel at underarm, ch 2, [sk next st, hdc in next st] across to 10 sts before shoulder seam, tr in each of next 20 [20, 21, 22, 23] sts, [sk next st, hdc in next st] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.
Rnds 2 \& 3: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 4: If more room is desired in upper arm do not dc dec, ch 3, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, dc in each st around, ending with de dec in last 2 sts, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Row 4: Sl st in first ch-5 sp, ch 3, (3 dc, sm picot—see Special Stitches, Ig picot—see Special Stitches, sm picot, 4 dc ) in same ch sp as beg ch-3, [( $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 3,2 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-5 sp, ( 4 dc, sm picot, Ig picot, sm picot, 4 dc ) in next ch-5 sp] across to marker, (sc, ch 3, sc) in marked ch sp, remove marker, [(2 sc, ch 3, 2 sc) in next ch-5 sp, ( 4 dc , sm picot, Ig picot, sm picot, 4 dc ) in next ch-5 sp] across. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 of Section 1, join with sc in first ch, sc in each ch across. Fasten off.

If longer necklace is desired, 1 set of leaves plus 1 pearl equal $31 / 2$ inches in length.
Chain-3 at beginning of rows counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Leaf sequence: Work this sequence over next 13 sts: $s l$ st in next st, sc in next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts, tr in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in each of next 2 sts , sc in next st, sl st in last st.

Invisible joining: After working last st, leaving 6 -inch tail, fasten off, pull 6 -inch tail through last st, sk first st of rnd, insert hook under both top lps from front to back of 2nd st in rnd and pull end through, insert hook back to front between top lps of last st of rnd,

Rows 6-9: Rep rows 2-5. (26 sts at end of last row)
Row 10: Ch 1, dc-sc inc in first st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last st, dc-sc inc in last st changing colors (see Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes) to 1 strand white and 1 strand country red in last st, turn. Fasten off tea rose. (28 sts)
Row 11: Rep row 3.
Rows 12 \& 13: Rep rows 4 and 5. (30 sts at end of last row)
Row 14: Rep row 10 changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand tea rose. Fasten off country red. ( 32 sts)
Row 15: Rep row 3.
Rows 16 \& 17: Rep rows 4 and 5. (34 sts at end of last row)
Rows 18 \& 19: Rep rows 2 and 3. (36 sts at end of last row)

Row 20: Rep row 10 changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand key lime pie. Fasten off tea rose. (38 sts)
Row 21: Rep row 5.
Rows 22-24: Rep rows 2-4. At end of last row, fasten off both colors. (42 sts at end of last row)
Row 25: Holding 3 strands sunshine tog, join with $s c$ in first $s t, d c$ in next $s t$, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 26: Rep row 2. (44 sts)
Rows 27-31: [Rep row 3 and row 5 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with row 3.
Row 32: Dc-sc dec (see Special Stitches) in first 2 sts, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across to last 2 sts, dc-sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (42 sts)
Row 33: Ch 1, sc in first st, dc in next st, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand key lime pie, turn. Fasten off sunshine.
Row 34: Ch 1, sc-dc dec (see Special Stitches) in first 2 sts, [sc in next st, dc in next st] across to last 2 sts, sc-dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (40 sts)

Row 35: Ch 1, dc in first st, sc in next st, [dc in next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Rows 36 \& 37: Rep rows 32 and 33, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand tea rose at end of last row. Fasten off key lime pie at end of last row. (38 sts at end of last row)
Rows 38 \& 39: Rep rows 34 and 35. ( 36 sts at end of last row)
Rows 40-43: Rep rows 32-35, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand country red at end of last row. Fasten off tea rose at end of last row. ( 32 sts at end of last row)
Rows 44-47: Rep rows 32-35, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand tea rose at end of last row. Fasten off country red at end of last row. ( 28 sts at end of last row)
Rows 48-55: [Rep rows 32-35 consecutively] twice. (20 sts at end of last row)

Row 56: Rep row 32. Fasten off all colors. (18 sts)

## Body Trim

Rnd 1: Holding 1 strand white and 1 strand country red tog, join (see Pattern Notes) in first ch before 1 long edge, [evenly sp 56 sc across to next corner, place marker at corner, evenly sp 18 sc across short edge, place marker at corner] around, join in beg sc. (148 sc)

Rnd 2: Sc in each of first 3 sts, $\mathbf{s c} \mathbf{~ d e c}$ (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, *[sc in each of next 3 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts] across to marker, sc in each of next 18 sts, rep from * once, join in beg sc. ( 126 sc )
Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. (108 sc)
Rnd 4: Dc in each of next 4 sts , dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, *[dc in each of next 4 sts , dc dec in next 2 sts ] across to marker, dc in each of next 18 sts, rep from * once, join in beg sc, turn. ( 96 dc )

## First Handle Flap

Row 1: Ch 1, dc in first st, [dc dec in next 2 sts] across to marker, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand key lime pie, turn. ( 15 dc )
Rows 2-7: Ch 1, dc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, leaving long end, fasten off.

## 2nd Handle Flap

Row 1: Join 1 strand white and 1 strand country red in next marked st, ch 1, [dc dec in next 2 sts, $d$ c in next st] across to marker, changing colors to 1 strand white and 1 strand key lime pie, turn. (15 dc)

Block pieces according to measurements on Assembly Diagram.

## Assembly

Working according to Assembly Diagram to join pieces in vertical sections, hold 2 pieces to be attached with WS tog, join cream in 3rd sc of right-hand side corner, ch 1, sc across, ending with last sc in 3rd sc of corner at lefthand side corner.
Once pieces have been joined, you will have 4 vertical sections, join sections in same manner as pieces.

## Border

Rnd 1: Join cream in lower right-hand corner, evenly sp sc around working 170 sc across each long edge, 142 sc across each short end with 3 sc in each center corner sts, join in beg sc. Fasten off. ( 636 sc )

Rnd 2: Join elderberry in first st, ch 2, hdc in each st around with 3 hdc in each center corner st, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off. (644 hde)
Rnd 3: Join royal purple in first st, working from left to right, ch 1, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st around with 3 reverse sc in each center corner st, join in first reverse sc. Fasten off. (652 reverse sc) C!

- Size I/9/5.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Sulky 12 -wt cotton sewing thread: \#1192 fuchsia
- 18 -inch solid white decorator pillow
- Hand steamer
- Office clip (optional)


## GAUGE

Petal $=2$ inches wide $\times 2$ inches high

## PATTERN NOTES

Working so many stitches into the first chain causes it to loosen and enlarge. While this natural loosening makes it easy to work all the stitches in the chain, it can also cause the end of the yarn to slip out of the initial slip knot, causing all your stitching to be lost. To prevent this from happening, attach a small office clip to the end of the beginning yarn tail and let it naturally drop below your crocheting. The clip will prevent the end from slipping out of the slip knot. After the last slip stitch, at the end of the Petal round, remove the clip and firmly pull on the beginning tail to close up the center opening of the Petal; pull the ending tail to the back side at the center top edge of the Petal and knot with beginning tail. Thread tails through tapestry needle and weave through back side of Petal to secure and then trim any excess.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 and slip stitch in same space at end of Petal round counts as one stitch.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Petal bottom edge is chain-2, 2 double crochet and chain-2.

Even rounds of Flower, which join Petals, are worked through both thicknesses of Petal and previous round of Flower.

## PETALS

## Make 139.

Leaving 4-inch tail (see Pattern Notes), ch 4, (4 tr, 4 dc, ch 2, 2 dc, ch 2—see Pattern Notes, $4 \mathrm{dc}, 4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in same ch as last tr. Leaving $11 / 2$-inch end, fasten off. (20 sts)

## FLOWER

Rnd 1: Ch 2, 10 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. (10 sc)
Rnd 2: Work rem rnds in back Ips (see Stitch Guide), lay bottom edge of Petal WS up over first 2 sts of rnd 1, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 sp of Petal right corner and pull dropped lp through, sl st in ch-2 sp at right bottom corner of Petal, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same sp through both thickness, 2 dc in next ch-2 of Petal and in next dc on
rnd 1, *2 dc in next ch-2 sp of Petal and next dc of rnd $1^{*}$, [lay next Petal bottom on next 2 dc of rnd 1 and rep between * twice to join next Petal] around to join 3 more Petals, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (5 Petals, 20 dc )
Rnd 3: Ch 1,2 sc in first st, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. ( 21 sc )
Rnd 4: Lay bottom edge of Petal WS up over first 3 sc of rnd 3, drop Ip on hook, insert hook in ch-2 sp of Petal right corner and pull dropped lp through, ch 3, 2 dc in sp between next 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 3,dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 3, *lay next Petal over next 3 sc of rnd 3 in same manner as last Petal, 2 dc in ch-2 sp of Petal and in next sc of rnd $3, d c$ in sp between next 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 3, 2 dc in next ch- 2 sp on Petal and in next sc of rnd 3, lay next Petal over next 3 sc of rnd 3 in same manner as last Petal, dc in ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 3, 2 dc in sp between next 2 dc on Petal and in next sc of rnd 3, dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc of rnd 3, rep from * twice, join 3rd ch of beg ch-3. There are 2 colors listed with rounds 2 and 3; alternate these colors between Motifs, as shown in photo.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning cluster (beg cl): Ch 3, yo, insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through 2 lps on hook, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Cluster (cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.
Beginning popcorn (beg pc): Ch 3, 4 dc in same place as beg ch-3, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in 3rd ch of beg ch-3 of dc group, pull dropped Ip through.

Popcorn (pc): 5 dc as indicated in instructions, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in first dc of dc group, pull dropped lp through.

Rnd 8: SI st in first ch sp of beg V-st, ch 20, sk next V-st, *[sc in ch sp of next V-st, sc in next ch sp] twice ${ }^{* *}$, sc in ch sp of next V-st, ch 20, sk next V-st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, do not join. (4 ch sps, 20 sc)

Rnd 9: ( $3 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{hdc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{hdc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in first ch sp, *sk next st, sc in each of next 4 sts**, ( $3 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{hdc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{tr}, 3 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{hdc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. ( $4 \mathrm{tr}, 24 \mathrm{hdc}, 24 \mathrm{dc}$, 46 sc )

Rnd 10: Sl st in each of first 9 sts, ch 20 (counts as first tr and ch-15), [tr in next tr, ch 15] 3 times, join in 5 th ch of beg ch-20. ( 4 tr, 4 (h sps)

Rnd 11: Ch 1, evenly sp 60 sc around, join in beg sc. (60 sc)
Rnd 12: Beg V-st in first st, ch 1, sk next 2 sts, [V-st in next st, ch 1, sk next 2 sts] around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-5. ( 20 ch sps, 20 V-sts)


## TENTACLE STITCH: A NEW CHANGE IN COLOR BY LINDA DEAN

## TENTACLE IS A TYPE OF CROCHET STITCH THAT TAKES COLORWORK IN A NEW DIRECTION BY ALLOWING YOU TO ADD NEW COLOR IN ADVANCE INTO THE ROWS AHEAD OF THE ROW BEING WORKED, RATHER THAN INTO ROWS ALREADY WORKED.

This stitch is worked over at least two rows and helps to camouflage a straight edge. The basic concept seems easy enough, and by keeping aware of a couple of factors and having a little crochet knowledge, you can master this approach.

The tentacle stitch creates a flat piece of fabric with the intrusion of color into the rows ahead of the row that is currently being worked. There are many methods that help you to incorporate color into the rows you have previously worked, and these are typically angular with straight lines and stitches, but by working with the color in the rows ahead of the current row you can get a more curved appearance. However, you do have to put

in a little more work to obtain it.

In concept, the stitch is worked as a chain in the middle of a working row that has stitches added to round the end (see Photo 1) and are crocheted down the side until reaching the working row, and then the crocheting is continued along the working row. The color is changed on the next row, and dependent upon how tall the chain "tentacle" is, you select a stitch to crochet across the row.

Upon reaching the tentacle, if your current stitch is tall enough to measure the same as the tentacle, then you simply slip stitch the stitches at the top of the round (see Photo 2) and work a progressive decrease stitch on the other side.

A progressive decrease stitch is a stitch that works together more than one stitch that is not of the same type (see Photo 3). For instance, to work a progressive decrease stitch of a $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{dc}$, in two stitches, you would insert your hook in the first indicated stitch, yarn over and pull through a loop, yarn over, insert your hook into the next indicated stitch, yarn over and pull through a loop, yarn over, pull through two loops, yarn over and pull through all four loops on hook. In essence you are working both stitches in the spaces indicated, but you are not finishing them; you are leaving the last step incomplete and beginning the next stitch and once the indicated stitches have been placed, you are finishing them off together in one pull through all the last loops of the stitches.

Once the progressive decrease stitch has been worked, the remaining stitches are worked with the stitch you originally selected until you reach the next tentacle (see Photo 4). If you have a tentacle that is too large to be contained in one row, this can be addressed by

slip stitching over the entire tentacle, working a progressive decrease stitch only when you have reached the height of the stitches you are using, and continuing across; then on the next row the same process is applied until the row height can accommodate the vertically inserted stitches.

The problem area with this stitch, if you want a square, flat piece of fabric, is ensuring that you do not have the number of stitches per row increase, as it is easy to add all the new stitches at the top of the tentacle as you slip stitch across. This is addressed in the progressive decrease, and it should be minded that you need to decrease across as many stitches as were added in the slip stitches. However, if you are working in the round or want the fabric to expand in certain areas, the progressive decrease can be reduced in stitches to allow of the increase, but the decrease cannot be eliminated as it helps to bind the tentacle to the work and eliminate gapping in the fabric (see Photo 5). C!

## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for these projects.

## PATTERN NOTES

When counting stitches, the tentacle stitch should encompass 2 stitches for the row or round.

Circle is worked turning each row after joining.
Chain-4 at beginning of row or round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of row or round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of row or round counts
as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Linked double crochet (linked dc): Insert hook in horizontal lp at middle front of last dc of horizontal row, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in next st of row, yo, pull up Ip, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

## Single crochet-treble crochet decrease

 (sc-tr dec): Insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, pull Ip through, yo twice, insert hook in next indicated st, yo, pull through lp, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, pull through 3 Ips on hook.
## SQUARE

Row 1 (WS): With tropic breeze, ch 32, hdc in 3rd ch from hook (first 2 chs count as first $h d c)$, [sc in each of next 3 chs, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, ch 5, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of rem 3 chs (tentacle made), linked dc (see Special Stitches) in last dc worked just before ch-5, hdc in next ch] across, ending with sc in last ch, changing color (see Stitch Guide) to snap pea in last st, turn. (30 sts)
Row 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), tr in next st, [sc in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in next sc, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in last sc and ch at base of $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{tr}$ dec (see Stitch Guide) in base of ch and
next dc, tr dec in next hdc and next sc, tr dec in next $2 s c$, tr in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), [dc in next st, ch 5, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in rem 3 chs (tentacle made), linked dc in last dc just before ch-5, hdc in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in next st] across, ending with dc in last st, changing color to tropic breeze in last st, turn.
Row 4: Ch 4, tr in each of next 5 sts , [sc in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in next sc, sc dec in last sc of tentacle and ch at base of $s c$, $t r$ dec in base of ch and next dc , tr dec in next hdc and sc , tr dec in next 2 sc , tr in next st] 3 times, $s c$ in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in next sc, sc dec in last $s c$ and ch at base of $s c, t r d e c$ in base of ch, next dc, and last st, turn.
Row 5: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in next st, [sc in each of next 3 sts, hdc in next st, dc in next st, ch 5, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each rem 3 chs (tentacle made), linked dc in last dc worked before ch-5, hdc in next st] across, ending with sc in last st, changing color to snap pea in last st, turn.

## Finishing

Cover flat surface, such as a table, with plastic wrap. Following directions on spray starch bottle, spray underside of Brim thoroughly. Place Hat, sprayed side down, on covered surface. Flatten Brim. Allow to dry completely.

Rnd 15: Ch 3, dc in each of next $6 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, [dc in each of next 7 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (216 dc)
Rnd 16: Ch 3, dc in each of next $7 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in
next st, [dc in each of next 8 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (240 dc)
Rnds 17 \& 18: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 19: Ch 3, dc in each of next $8 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, [dc in each of next 9 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (264 dc)

Rnd 20: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 21: Ch 3, dc in each of next $9 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, [dc in each of next $10 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (288 dc)
Rnd 22: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 23: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, [dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. ( 384 dc )

## Joining

With WS of Back facing, lay Front on top with RS facing, pin Front and Back pieces tog around edges, stuffing with fiberfill before closing.
All sts will be worked behind sl st of last rnd on Front, work through both Front and Back layers of sts, join silver in any st, working from left to right, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st around, join in beg reverse sc. Fasten off. C

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each of first 10 sts , ch 7, sk next 7 sts, sc in each of next 3 sts, work in Main Body Pattern across to last 19 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 7, sk next 7 sts, sc in each of last 10 sts, turn.
Row 19: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 10 sts, ch 8 , sk next 8 sts, sc in next st, work in Main Body Pattern across to last 20 sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, ch 8 , sk next 8 sts, sc in each of last 10 sts, turn.
Row 20: Ch 1, sc in each of first 10 sts, ch 9, sc in next st, work in Main Body Pattern
across to last 19 sts, ch 9 , sk next 9 sts, sc in each of last 10 sts , turn.
Next rows: Continue to work in established pattern across until piece measures 16 [16, 16] inches from beg, ending with WS row.
Divide for armholes.

## Right Front

Row 1 (RS): Work as established in pattern st across first 43 [48, 52,58, 62, 67] sts, sc in same st as last st worked, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (44 [49, 53, 59, 63, 68] sts)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, work in established pattern st across, turn.

Next row: Ch 1 , sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Top border row: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn.

Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Left Front

Getting started: With RS facing, join in same st as sc border for Back row 1.
Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, work in established pattern across, turn.
Row 2: Work in established pattern across to last st, sc in last st, turn.
Next rows: Work in established pattern maintaining sc border along edge of armhole until piece measures $71 / 2[8,81 / 2,9,91 / 2,10]$ inches from beg of armhole.
Top border row: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn.
Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Macramé Motif \#1

Rnd 1: Make slip ring (see Special Stitches), *[stretched hdc (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 1] 4 times, stretched hdc, ch 4, rep from * 3 times, join in beg stretched hdc. (20 stretched hdc, 4 ch-4 sps)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, *2 sc in first stretched hdc, sc in next ch-1 sp, [2 sc in top of next stretched hdc, sc in next ch-1 sp] 4 times, 5 sc in next ch-4 sp, rep from * around, join in first stretched hdc. (76 sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in each of next $18 \mathrm{sc}, 3$ sc in center corner st] around, join with duplicate st (see Special Stitches). Fasten off. (84 sc)

## Macramé Motif \#2

Rnd 1-3: Work same as for Macramé Motif \#1.

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 20 sts, 3 sc in center corner st] around, join rnd with duplicate st. (92 sc)

Sew side seams of 3 [3, 3, 3, 4, 4] Motifs tog to form band for forearm. Join in center corner st of Motif.
Rnd 1: Ch 1 , evenly sp $84[84,90,90,102$, 102] sc evenly around Band.
Rnd 2: First X-st (see Special Stitches), X-st (see Special Stitches) around, join in first X-st. ( 28 [28, 30, 30, 34, 34] X-sts)
Rnd 3: Ch $1, \mathrm{sc}$ in each st around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 4: First X-st dec (see Special Stitches), X-st dec (see Special Stitches) twice, work $X$-st around, join in first $X$-st dec.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. (81 [81, 87, 87, 99, 99] sts)
Rnds 6-19 [6-19, 6-17, 6-17, 6-17,
6-17]: [Rep rnds 4 and 5 alternately] 7 [7, 6, 6, 6, 6] times. (60 [60, 69, 69, 81, 81] sts at end of last rnd)

## Sizes Large, X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Rnd [18]: First X-st, X-st around, join in first X-st. ([23, 23, 27, 27] X-sts)

Rnd [19]: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.
Next rnds: [Rep rnds 18 and 19 alternately] [1, 1, 2, 2] time(s).

## All Sizes

Sew forearm Band to last rnd.
Next rnd: With RS facing, join with sc in any st, sc around forearm Band, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Edging

With RS facing, join in corner st of top of Sleeve.

Rnd 1: Ch 1 , evenly sp sc around top of Sleeve, join in beg sc. ( $84[84,90,90,102$, 102] sts)
Rnd 2: First X-st, X-st around, join in first X-st. (28 [28, 30, 30, 34, 34] X-sts)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Assembly

Block pieces to schematic measurements.
Sew shoulder seams.
Sew Sleeves into armholes.

## Collar

Work 10 rows of sc along top edge of neckline and front lapels forming 2-inch Collar.

## Finishing

With sewing thread and needle, tack clasp to front edge just below bustline, placing half on Right Front and other half on Left Front as shown in photo.

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 1 [2, $2,3,3,4]$ time(s). ( 23 [26, 26, 31, 35, 40] sc)

Next row: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each st across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2$ sc in next sc, $s c$ in last $s c$, turn. Fasten off. ( 25 [28, 28,33, 37, 42] sc)

## Back Bodice

Row 1 (RS): With size H hook, ch 50 [56, 61, 68,71,74], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (49 [55, 60, 67, 70, 73] sc)
Row 2: Working in back lps, ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn.
Next rows: Rep row 2 until 23 [25, 25, 27, 23, 25] rows are completed from beg.
Next row: Ch $1, s c$ in first $s c, 2$ sc in next sc, $s c$ in each $s t$ across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $s c$, sc in last sc, turn. ( 51 [ $57,62,69,72,75] ~ s c)$
Next rows: Rep last row $6[6,6,6,10,10]$
times. Fasten off. ( 63 [69, 74, 81, 92, 95] sc at end of last row)

## 2nd Front Bodice

Row 1 (RS): With size H hook, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, turn. (1 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1,2 sc in sc, turn. (2 sc)

Row 4: Ch $1,2 s c$ in first $s c, s c$ in next $s c, 2 s c$ in last $s c$, turn. ( 5 sc )
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each st across, turn. (6sc)
Row 6: Ch 1 , sc in first $\mathrm{sc}, 2$ sc in next sc , $s c$ in each $s t$ across to last $2 s c, 2$ sc in next $s c$, sc in last sc, turn. (8 sc)
Row 7: Ch 1, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next $s c, s c$ in each st across, turn. (9 sc)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 0 [0, $0,1,3,4]$ time(s). $9[9,9,12,18,21]$ sc at end of last row)
Next row: Rep row 6. (11 [11, 11, 14, 20, 23] sc)
Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
(11[11, 11, 14, 20, 23] sc)
Next row: Ch 1, sc in first $s c, 2$ sc in next sc, sc in each st across, turn. (12 [12, 12, 15, 21, 24] sc)

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 5
[5, 5, 4, 2, 1] time(s). (17 [17, 17, 19, 23, 25] scat end of last row)
Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Next row: Ch 1 , sc in first $s c, 2$ sc in next $s c$, sc in each $s t$ across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $s c, s c$ in last $s c$, turn. (19 [19, 19, 21, 25, 27] sc)
Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across to last 2 $s c, 2 s c$ in next $s c, s c$ in last $s c$, turn. (20 [20, $20,22,26,28$ ] sc)
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 1 [2, $2,3,3,4]$ time(s). ( 23 [26, 26, 31, 35, 40] sc at end of last row)
Next row: Ch $1, s c$ in first $s c, 2$ sc in next $s c$, $s c$ in each st across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2$ sc in next sc , sc in last sc, turn. Do not fasten off. (25 [28, 28,33,37, 42] sc)

## Joining Bodices

Row 1 (RS): Work following steps:
A. Still with size H hook and 2nd Front Bodice, ch 1 , sc in first $s c, 2$ sc in next $s c, s c$ in each st across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc , sc in last sc. Do not turn. (26 [29, 29, 34, 38, 43] sc)
B. Ch $10[10,12,12,16,16]$ (bottom of armhole), with RS of Back Bodice facing, $s c$ in first $s c, 2 s c$ in next sc, sc in each st across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in last sc. Do not turn. ( 65 [71, 76, 83, 94, 97] sc) C. Ch $10[10,12,12,16,16]$ (bottom of 2nd armhole), with RS of First Front Bodice facing, $s c$ in first $s c, 2 s c$ in next $s c$, sc in each $s t$ across to last $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in last sc, turn. (26 [29, 29, 34, 38, 43] sc)

## Body

Row 2: Ch 1, without twisting joining chs or Bodice pieces, sc in each sc and ch across, turn. (135 [149, 158, 175, 202, 215] sc)
Row 3: Ch $1, s c$ in first $s c, 2 s c$ in next $s c, s c$ in each $s t$ across to last $2 s c, 2 s c$ in next $s c$, sc in last sc, turn. (137 [151, 160, 177, 204, 217] sc)
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 6 [ $6,6,5,2,2]$ times. (151 [163, 172, 187, 208, 221] sc at end of last row)


Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep last row] 17 [19, 21, 23, 31, 31] times. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Inner-Edge Trim

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing and size I hook, join (see Pattern Notes) to beg working along ends of rows of Front, ch 1 , sc in end of each row, ch 10 [10, 12, 12, 12, 12], sc in each unworked ch of row 1 on Back Bodice, ch 10 $[10,12,12,12,12]$, sc in end of each row of opposite Front, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc and in each ch across, turn. (121 [131, 140, 151, 154, 161] sc) Mark 2 sc on left and right side of Back neck. Move markers up as work progresses.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across with sk each marked sc, turn. (119 [129, 138, 149, 152, 159] SC)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep last 2 rows alternately] 3 [3, 5, 7, 6, 7] times. (113 [123, 128, 135, 140, 147] sc at end of last row)
Next row: Rep row 3. (111 [121, 126, 133, 138, 145] sc)

Next rows: [Rep row 4] 0 [0, 2, 1, 6, 6] time(s).
Counting sts from lower hem, mark 2 button Ip positions on right Front at approximately st $15[18,19,20,21,22]$ and st 19 [22, 23, 24, $25,26]$.
Next row: Ch 1 , sc in each st across with same neck dec, except at both buttonhole positions, sc in both Ips, ch 4, sc in both lps of next sc.

## Hem Trim

Discontinue working in back Ips only here and for remainder of instructions.

At the beg and end of the row, work will be in end of rows, with the remainder in sts. Count
ends of rows same as sts when working or sk sts.
With size H hook and RS facing, join to beg working along Hem, ch 1, sc in first row or sc, ${ }^{*}$ ch 3, cl (see Special Stitch) in side of sc just made, sk next 2 rows or $s c$, sc in next row or sc, rep from * across. Fasten off.

## Armhole Trim

Rnd 1: With size F hook and RS facing, join in beg working around Armhole, ch 1, sc in each end of row and in each ch around, join in first sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first sc.

Rnd 3: Rep rnd 2. Fasten off. Rep for opposite Armhole.

## Blocking

Completely immerse in cool water. Squeeze gently to remove most of the water.
Roll in a clean, dry towel to remove as much water as possible.
Lay garment on a flat surface and shape.
Smooth from neck to Hem and block according to schematic measurements.
The top of the garment will not be completely flat when blocking. It is OK to allow it to fold over a bit at the shoulders. Allow to dry completely.
If hung before completely dry, the fibers will continue to grow. The garment requires this special care, but the results are worth it. C!

Rnd 23 [23, 24, 25, 26]: Ch 3, hdc in tip of next motif, ch 2, [hdc in tip of next motif, ch 2] around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.

## Finishing

Block piece to measure 22 [24, 26, 28, 30] inches wide by 8 inches tall.

Rows 34 \& 35 [ 38 \& 39, 42 \& 43, 46 \& 47, 50 \& 51]: Rep row 2. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

## Finishing

With RS tog, sew Bodice pieces tog leaving 5 unworked sts on row 33 [37, 41, 45, 49] unsewn at top edge for armholes.
The side seam will be slightly off-center.

## Neckline Trim

With same size hook used for Yoke, join (see Pattern Notes) in corner of neckline, evenly $s p$ $60[64,58,72,76]$ sc around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Armhole Trim

With same size hook used for Yoke, join at center bottom of armhole opening, evenly sp 52 sc around opening, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rep on rem armhole.

## Bottom Trim

Rnd 1: With same size hook used for Yoke, working around bottom edge, join in Bodice side seam, evenly sp 132 [140, 148, 156, 164] sc around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Beg cl (see Special Stitches) in first st, ch 3, cl in same st as beg cl, sk next 3 sts, [(cl, ch 3, cl) in next st, sk next 3 sts] around, join in beg cl. Fasten off.

Rnd 8: ( $(\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{hdc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc})$ in each ch-8 sp around, join in first $s c$. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Wrap First Handle Flap around purchased handle. Using long end, sew edge of Flap to row 3 of Flap.
Rep with 2nd Handle Flap and rem handle.
With matching-color yarn, sew Leaves to 1 side of Purse just below row 1 of Handle Flap as shown in photo.
Place Flower on top of Leaves and sew tog with hot green through center of small petals several times to create look of stamen as shown in photo.

## Lining

Place finished Purse flat on tissue paper with Flower side facing. Trace outline starting at lower side of Handle Flap and continuing around to opposite side of Handle Flap.
*Place tissue pattern on fabric so that Purse bottom is positioned on fold line. Begin cutting at bottom corner of fold line and continue cutting around following outline of tissue pattern to the opposite side of pattern fold line. Do not cut along fold. You will now have a Lining piece that resembles a flat-topped figure-8.

With RS of fabric tog, sew a $5 / 8$-inch seam on each side*.

Rep between * to cut interfacing for purse.
Insert Lining into interfacing, WS tog (seams will be sandwiched in between). Place both pieces inside finished Purse.
Fold raw edges of lining and interfacing under toward WS of Purse edge. Hand-stitch lining and interfacing to top edge with sewing thread. C!

Fasten off.
Make 4 rows of 4 Motifs on each row.

## Edging

Join pistachio with sc in any ch $\mathrm{sp},(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{sc})$ in same ch $s p$ as joining sc. (sc, dc, sc) in each ch $s p$ around, join in first $s c$. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, hdc in each of next 2 sts, [2 hdc in next st, hdc in

Row 9: Ch 1, [sc dec in next 2 sts] twice, turn. (2 sc)
Row 10: Ch 1, sc dec in 2 sts, do not fasten off. (1 sc)

## Edging

Ch 1 , sc in first st, evenly sp 5 sc in ends of rows to row 5 , ch 1 , sc in same st as last sc, evenly sp 5 sc in ends of rows to bottom, ch 1 , $s c$ in same st as last $s c$, evenly $s p 5 s c$ in ends of rows to row 5 , ch 1 , sc in same st as last $s c$, evenly sp 5 sc in ends of rows, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rows 2-6: Ch 2, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in each st across to last 2 sts, hdc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (19 hdc at end of last row)

Rows 7-9: Ch 2, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc in each st across to last 4 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, turn. At end of last row, fasten off. (7 hdc at end of last row)

## Wing Front Scallop Edge

Row 1: Join turquoise to side of last hdc of row 1 on Wing, evenly sp 37 sc around front edge curve, working last sc in bottom ch of beg ch-2 of row 1 , turn. ( 37 sc )
Row 2: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, 5 dc in next st, sk next st, sl st in next st, [sk next st, 5 dc in next $s t$, sk next $s t$, sl st in next st] across. Fasten off. ( 9 dc groups)

## ASSEMBLY

Lay Pocket onto 1 Side piece (this will be Pillow back), having top edge of Pocket even with row 37 of Side piece, and then pin top edge of Gusset row 5 along side and bottom edges of Pocket 1 inch in from side and bottom edges of Side piece. Using tapestry needle and guacamole, sew Gusset edges and Side pieces tog.
Using matching-color yarn, sew Eyes, Beak and Wings to rem Side piece for front as shown in photo.
Lay front Side onto 6-8 layers of batting and cut batting slightly smaller than Side piece for stuffing (cut more batting layers if desired for fuller OwI). Insert batting between WS of front and back Sides. With size G hook, working through both thicknesses, join guacamole through center bottom edges of pieces, evenly $s p s c$ around outer edges, working $3 s c$ in each bottom corner and 3 sc in each Ear tip, join in beg sc. Fasten off.
Fold Blankie in thirds lengthwise and then fold in thirds widthwise to create 12-inch square. Insert folded Blankie in Pocket on back Side.


Rnd 5: Ch 1,2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 5 sts , [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 5 sts] around, sc in last st, join in beg sc. ( 36 sc )
Rnd 6: Lay Petal bottom WS up over first 3 sc of rnd 5, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 sp of Petal right corner, pull dropped lp through, ch 3, 2 dc in next sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc of rnd 5, dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc of rnd 5, *lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc of rnd $5, \mathrm{dc}$ in ch-2 $s p$ on Petal and in next sc on rnd 5, 2 dc in sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc of rnd 5, dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 5, rep from * around, join with 3rd ch of beg ch-3. ( 12 Petals, 48 dc )
Rnd 7: Ch 1,2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 5 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 5 sts] around, $s c$ in same st as last $s c$, join in beg $s c$. (57 sc)
Rnd 8: Lay Petal bottom WS up over first 3 sc of rnd 7, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 sp of Petal right corner and pull dropped Ip through, ch 3 , dc in same sp as beg ch-3, dc in next $s p$ between $2 d c$ on Petal and in next sc on rnd 7, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and

Rnd 10: Lay Petal bottom WS up over first 3 sc on rnd 9, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 $s p$ of Petal right corner, pull dropped Ip through, ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$ in same sp as beg ch-3, dc in next sp between $2 d c$ on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd $9,{ }^{*}$ [lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 9, dc in ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9 , dc in sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9, dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9] 4 times, lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 9, 2 dc in ch-2 sp on Petal and next sc on rnd $9, \mathrm{dc}$ in next sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd 9, rep from * 3 times, [lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 9 , dc in ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 9 , dc in sp between 2 dc on Petal and

Rnd 12: Lay Petal bottom WS up over first 3 sc of rnd 11, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 $s p$ of Petal right corner, pull dropped Ip through, ch 3, dc in same sp, dc in next sp between 2 dc of Petal and in next sc on rnd 11,2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd 11, *[lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 11, dc in ch-2 sp of Petal and in next sc on rnd 11, dc in sp between 2 dc of Petal and in next sc on rnd 11, dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 11] 6 times, lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 11, 2 dc in ch-2 sp on Petal and next sc on rnd 11, dc in next sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 11, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd 11, rep from * 3 times, [lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd $11, \mathrm{dc}$ in ch-2 sp of Petal and in next sc on rnd 11, dc in sp between 2 dc of Petal and in next sc on rnd 11, dc in next ch-2 sp on Petal and in next sc on rnd 11] twice, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. Rnd 14: Lay Petal bottom WS up over first 3 sc of rnd 13, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in ch-2 sp of Petal right corner and pull dropped Ip through, ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in next sp between 2 dc of Petal and in next sc on rnd 13, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd 13, *[lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc of rnd 13, dc in ch-2 sp of Petal and in next sc on rnd $13, \mathrm{dc}$ in sp between 2 dc of Petal and in next sc on rnd 13, dc in next ch-2 sp of Petal and in next sc on rnd 13] 8 times, lay next Petal bottom WS up over next 3 sc on rnd 13, 2 dc in ch- 2 sp of Petal and next sc on rnd 13, dc in next sp between 2 dc on Petal and in next sc on rnd 13, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp and in next sc on rnd 13, rep from * 3
times, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (37 Petals, 121 sts)

## Assembly

With bottom edge of Petal RS facing, use light raspberry and tapestry needle to run a continuous gathering stitch horizontally through center of rem 3 Petals, pull snugly to gather all 3 Petals tog and sew to center of Flower.

Lightly steam Flower and let dry.

## Optional

To tack Petals to Flower, if desired, use 1 strand light raspberry and tapestry needle, and beg on rnd 12 , insert needle from WS up through center opening of any Petal, insert needle back down through Flower to WS 1⁄8 inch away and in $s p$ between beg and ending of Petal rnd 1 to loosely tack Petal in place.

Rep around Flower in same manner for rem rnds $2,4,6,8,10$. Do not do rnd 14.
Center Flower onto front of pillow, and using a double strand sewing thread and needle, whipstitch top of rnd 14 to pillow. Tack tops of rnd 14 Petals randomly to pillow top if desired. C!

Rnd 1: With yellow, make slip ring (see illustration), beg cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 3, [cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 3] 7 times, join (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg cl. Fasten off. ( $8 \mathrm{cls}, 8 \mathrm{ch}$ sps)

Rnd 2: Join white or light teal (see Pattern Notes) in any ch-3 sp, beg pc (see Special Stitches) in same ch sp as joining, * ch 5 , sc in next ch sp, ch $5^{* *}$, pc (see Special Stitches) in next ch $s p$, rep from * around, join in beg $p$. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Join light teal or white in first ch after any pc, ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), 4 dc

in same ch sp as beg ch 3, fpdc (see Stitch Guide) around next sc, 5 dc in next ch sp, ch 1 , fpdc around next pc , ch $1, * 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch sp , fpdc around $\mathrm{sc}, 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-5 sp, ch 1, fpde around popcorn, ch 1, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch3. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: Join yellow in first ch $s p$ after fpdc around any pc , ch 1 , sc in same ch sp as ch1, [ch 3, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st] across to ch-1 sp, *sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 3, sk next 2 dc , sc in next dc] across to next ch-1 sp, rep from * around, join in first $s c$. Do not fasten off.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, * ${ }^{*}$ sc, picot—see Special Stitches, sc) in each of next 4 ch sps , ( 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next ch sp at corner, rep from * around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Next Motifs

## Make 23.

Getting started: For rem Motifs, alternate white and light teal (see Pattern Notes).
There should be 12 Motifs with white for rnd 2 and light teal for rnd 3 , and 12 with light teal for rnd 2 and white for rnd 3. Join Motifs to make 8 rows of 3 Motifs each.

Rnds 1-4: Work rnds 1-4 of First Motif.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, ( 2 sc , picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch sps, (3 sc, joining picot—see Special Stitches, 2 sc ) in next corner ch sp, *(2 sc, joining picot, sc) in each of next 4 ch sps, (3 $s c$, joining picot, 2 sc) in next corner ch sp, rep from * for as many sides joining needed, [(2 $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{picot}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each of next 4 chs sps , ( 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch sp] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

## 4th Strap

Sk next 4 V-sts on rnd 12 from 2nd Strap, join in sc worked in ch sp of next V-st, rep First Strap, do not fasten off.

## Top Section

Rnd 1: *Ch 5, tr in same st as beg ch-5, ch 5, tr in top of last tr worked**, sl st in last sc of next Strap, rep from * around connecting all 4 Straps ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, do not join.

Rnd 2: [Sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each ch-1 sp around, join in beg sc.

## Hanging Loop

Ch 1, 12 next foundation sc, sc in sc on opposite side. Fasten off. C!

Rnd 4: Ch 4, [sc in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in each of next 2 sc , tr in base of ch, tr in each of next 3 sts , tr in same st as ch] 7 times, sc in 3 rd sc on tentacle, sc in each of next 2 sc , tr in base of ch, tr in each of next 3 sts, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. ( 64 sts)
Rnd 5: Ch 2, hdc in next st, [dc in next st, ch 5,5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of rem 3 chs (tentacle made), linked dc in last dc before ch-5, hdc in each of next 2 sts] 15 times, $d$ c in next st, ch 5, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each of rem 3 chs, linked dc in next st changing color to tropic breeze in last st, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, turn.
Rnd 6: Ch 4, tr in st at base of ch-5, [sc in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in next st, sc-tr dec (see Special Stitches) in next sc and base of ch, tr in each of next 3 sts, tr in same st as ch] 15 times, sc in 3rd sc on tentacle, sc in next sc, sc-tr dec in next sc and base of ch, tr in each of next 2 sts, changing color to snap pea in last st, join in 4th ch of beg ch4, turn. (112 sts)

Projects using basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot mats, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within this skill category, as well as the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

## (1)(234)36 intermedate

Projects that incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing. The crocheter has the ability to read more advanced stitch pattern charts, such as lace and cable charts.

## 123456 moobeater

Projects that utilize a wide variety of stitches and techniques such as those noted above, as well as more detailed colorwork, shaping, construction and finishing.

## (1)23435 chalenaing

Projects that require a more intuitive understanding of a pattern or chart and that also include advanced stitches and techniques, as well as more intricate methods such as intarsia, cables, lace, stranded colorwork with numerous color changes and advanced shaping and construction techniques.
