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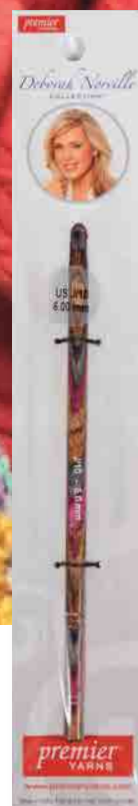

FINISHED SIZES

Dad's: 8½ inches long, excluding Cuffs

Mom's: 7¼ inches long, excluding Cuffs

Child's: Instructions given for 5½ inches long, with 6 inches long in [], excluding Cuffs

MATERIALS FOR DAD

- Universal Classic Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per skein):
2 skeins #647 flannel
- Sizes G/6/4mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Black size large Boye Suede Mitten Palms
- Lanyard hooks: 2
- Stitch markers



MATERIALS FOR MOM

- Universal Classic Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein each #7071 wood violet and #7069 iris orchid
- Universal Classic Worsted Long Print medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per skein):
2 skeins #11418 purple allure
- Sizes G/6/4mm and H/8/5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- Round elastic cord: 2 pieces each 6 inches in length or circumference size of wrist
- Lanyard hooks: 2
- Stitch markers



MATERIALS FOR CHILD

- Universal Classic Worsted medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #651 white
- Universal Classic Worsted Tapestry medium (worsted) weight acrylic/wool yarn (3½ oz/197 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #7008 Easter surprise
- Sizes G/6/4mm and I/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- Round elastic cord: 2 pieces each 5 [5½] inches in length or circumference size of wrist
- Trinkets, charms or beads: 3
- Lanyard hooks: 2
- Stitch markers



GAUGES

Size H hook Dad's: 16 pattern sts = 4 inches; 14 pattern rows = 4 inches

Size H hook Mom's: 15 pattern sts = 4 inches; 17 pattern rows = 4 inches

Size I hook Child's: 16 pattern sts = 4 inches; 18 pattern rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Work in continuous rounds, do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.

Mark first stitch of round. Move marker up with each round.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of rows counts as first back post double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH FOR DAD'S

Front post single crochet decrease (fp sc dec): Insert hook in next st, yo, pull lp through, insert hook around post of next st, yo, pull lp through, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

SPECIAL STITCHES FOR MOM'S

Leg single crochet (leg sc): Resembles knitting when worked in continuous rnds, insert hook between legs of st (2 vertical bars at base of st), yo, pull lp through, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

2-stitch decrease (2-st dec): Insert hook around post of next st, yo, pull lp through, insert hook between legs of next st, yo, pull lp through, insert hook around post of next st, yo, pull lp through, yo, pull lp through all lps on hook.



**SPECIAL STITCH FOR CHILD'S**

Slip stitch decrease (sl st dec): Insert hook in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each of next 2 sts, yo, pull lp through sts and lp on hook.

DAD'S MITTENS**Make 2.****Palm**

Rnd 1 (RS): With size H hook, ch 36, being careful not to twist ch, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1, sc in same ch as joining and in each ch around, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **mark first st of rnd** (see *Pattern Notes*). (36 sc)

Rnd 2: * [Sc in next st, **fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st] twice, sc in next st, fpdc around same st as last sc, rep from * around to last st, sc in last st. (43 sts)

Rnd 3: [Fpsc around next st, sc in next st] around to last st, fpdc around last st.

Rnd 4: [Sc in next st, fpdc around next st] around to last st, sc in last st.

Rnds 5–8: [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] twice.

Rnd 9: Rep rnd 3.

Fingers

Rnd 1: Ch 4 (*thumb crossing ch*), sk next 10 sts, [sc in next st, fpdc around next st] 16

times, sc in last st. (33 sts, 4 chs)

Rnd 2: Sc in each of next 4 crossing chs, [fpdc around next st, sc in next st] 16 times, fpdc around last st. (37 sts)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next st, fpdc around next st] around to last st, sc in last st.

Rnd 4: [Fpsc around next st, sc in next st] around to last st, fpdc around last st.

Rnds 5–16: [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] 6 times.

Rnd 17: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 18: Fpsc around next st, sc in next st, fpdc around next st, ***fpdc dec** (see *Special Stitch*) twice, sc in next st, fpdc around next st**, sc in next st, fpdc around next st, rep from * around to last 4 sts, ending last rep at **, fpdc dec twice. (27 sts)

Rnd 19: Rep rnd 4.

Rnd 20: Fpsc around next st, [sc in next st, fpdc around next st, 2 fpdc dec] 4 times, sc in next st, fpdc around last st. (19 sts)

Rnd 21: [Sc in next st, fpdc around next st, 2 fpdc dec] 3 times, sc in last st. Leaving long end, fasten off. (13 sts)

Weave long end through top of sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Thumb

Rnd 1 (RS): With size H hook and RS of Mitten facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first fpdc on opening, ch 1, sc in same st as joining, [fpdc around next st, sc in next st] 4 times, fpdc around next st, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in corner and first thumb crossing ch, sc in each of next 3 crossing chs, sc in corner, **do not join**. (15 sts)

Rnd 2: [Fpsc around next st, sc in next st] around to last st, fpdc around last st.

Rnd 3: [Sc in next st, fpdc around next st] around to last st, sc in last st.

Rnds 4–9: [Rep rnds 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times.

Rnd 10: Fpsc around next st, [sc in next st, fpdc around next st, 2 fpdc dec] around to last 2 sts, sc in next st, fpdc around last st. (11 sts)

Rnd 11: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 12: Fpsc around next st, fpdc dec 5 times. Leaving long end, fasten off. (6 sts)

Weave end through sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Cuff

Rnd 1: With size G hook and RS of Mitten facing, join in beg ch-36 on Palm, **ch 2** (see *Pattern Notes*), working sts around post of sc on rnd 1 of Palm, [**fpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st, **bpdc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st] around to last st, fpdc around last st, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (36 sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, [fpdc around next st, bpdc around next st] around to last st, fpdc around last st, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnds 3–8: [Rep rnd 2] 6 times. At end of last rnd, fasten off.



Finishing

Following manufacturer's instructions on package, sew Suede Mitten Palm on Mitten. Attach lanyard hook near Cuff on side of Mitten farthest from thumb.

MOM'S MITTENS

Make 2.

Preparation

Overlap elastic ends ½ inch, sew in place, forming ring.

Cuff

Row 1: With size G hook and wood violet, ch 11, sl st in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of 2nd ch from hook and in back lp of each ch across, turn. (10 sl sts)

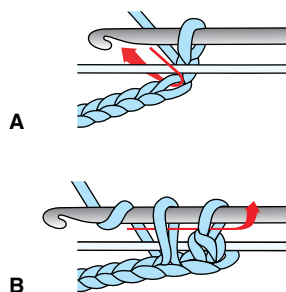
Row 2: Sl st in back lp of each sl st across, turn.

Rows 3–38: [Rep row 2] 36 times. At end of last row, leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

Sew first and last rows tog.

Palm

Rnd 1 (RS): With size H hook and purple allure, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in end of row on Cuff, ch 1, **working over elastic ring** (see *illustration*), sc in end of each row on Cuff, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **mark first st of rnd** (see *Pattern Notes*). (38 sts)



Sc Around Elastic

Rnd 2: [Leg sc (see *Special Stitches*) in next st, fp sc (see *Stitch Guide*) around next st] around.

Rnds 3–10: [Rep rnd 2] 8 times.

Fingers

Rnd 1: Leg sc in next st, ch 3 (*thumb crossing ch*), sk next 9 sts, [leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] 14 times. (29 sts, 3 chs)

Rnd 2: Leg sc in next st, sc in each of the next 3 crossing chs, [leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] 14 times. (32 sts)

Rnd 3: [Leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] around.

Rnds 4–16: [Rep rnd 3] 13 times.

Rnd 17: *Leg sc in next st, **2-st dec** (see *Special Stitches*), [leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] twice, rep from * around. (24 sts)

Rnds 18 & 19: [Rep rnd 3] twice.

Rnd 20: [Leg sc in next st, 2-st dec, leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] around. (16 sts)

Rnd 21: Rep rnd 3. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Weave long end through sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Thumb

Rnd 1 (RS): With size H hook and purple allure, with RS of Mitten facing, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in first leg sc on opening, ch 1, leg sc in same st as joining, [fp sc around next st, leg sc in next st] 3 times, fp sc around next st, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in corner and first thumb crossing ch, sc in next ch, sc dec in last crossing ch and corner, fp sc around next st, **do not join**. (12 sts)

Rnd 2: [Leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] around.

Rnds 3–10: [Rep rnd 2] 8 times.

Rnd 11: [Leg sc in next st, 2-st dec, leg sc in next st, fp sc around next st] twice. (8 sts)

Rnd 12: Rep rnd 2. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Weave long end through sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Ruffle

With RS facing and size H hook, join iris orchid in end of row on Cuff, ch 1, [(sc, ch 2, dc) in end of row, sk end of next row] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. (19 Ruffles)

FESTIVE FRILLS

DESIGN BY PATRICIA RITCHIE

TURN AN OTHERWISE PLAIN SCARF WORKED IN EASY SINGLE AND HALF DOUBLE CROCHET STITCHES INTO A GLAMOROUS ACCESSORY WITH THE ADDITION OF FRILLY RUFFLED ENDS CREATED WITH NETTING-TYPE YARN.

1 2 3 4 5 6 CONFIDENT
BEGINNER

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

4¾ x 44 inches

MATERIALS

- Red Heart Shimmer medium (worsted) weight acrylic/metallic polyester yarn (3½ oz/280 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #1929 red
- Premier Starbella super bulky (super chunky) weight acrylic yarn (3½ oz/33 yds/100g per skein):
1 skein #0003 cinnamon candy
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge



GAUGE

18 dc = 4 inches; 6 dc rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Beginning chain-1 or chain-2 **does not count** as first stitch unless otherwise stated.

The chain extension in rows 18 and 19 will be attached to future row, leave them unworked until stated otherwise.

SCARF

Row 1: With red, ch 21, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (20 sc)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in first st and in each st across, turn.

Row 3 (netting row): Fold top of netting over several times until you have gathered 3 holes, sc in first hdc and all gathered holes

ADD SOME KITSCHY VINTAGE GLITZ TO YOUR LOOK WITH THIS EASY, LUXE BRACELET THAT'S A GREAT WAY TO RECYCLE A PRETTY ANTIQUE BROOCH OR BUTTON.

1 2 3 4 5 6 EASY

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

1¾ x 8½ inches, including button lp

MATERIALS

- Skacel Seta light (DK) weight mulberry silk yarn (1¾ oz/115 yds/50g per ball):
1 ball each #02 black and #08 hot pink
- Skacel Karat light (DK) weight polyester metallic yarn (1¾ oz/143 yds/50g per ball):
1 ball #02 silver metallic
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- ¾-inch silver button
- 1½-inch decorative button or brooch



GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Surface stitch (surface st): Holding yarn at back of work, insert hook between sts or rows, pull lp through st and lp on hook.



BRACELET

Row 1: With black, ch 37, dc in 3rd ch from hook (*first 3 chs count as first dc*) and in each ch across, turn. (35 dc)

Row 2: **Ch 3** (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in each st across, ch 5 (*button lp*), sl st in base of first dc on row 1. Fasten off.

Edging

Join hot pink with sc in first ch of button lp, sc in each of next 4 chs, [ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc] across to end, working in end

of rows, [ch 3, sk next row, sc in next row] across, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, [ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, ch 3, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Trim

With silver metallic, work **surface st** (*see Special Stitch*) across top, sides and bottom of black sts as shown in photo.

Finishing

Sew ¾-inch button to opposite end from button lp.

Sew decorative button or brooch to center as shown in photo. **C!**

THE SAVVY SINGLE CROCHET

BY KAREN RATTO-WHOOLEY

DO YOU SOMETIMES FIND THE PLAIN AND SIMPLE SINGLE CROCHET A BIT BORING? LEARN HOW TO JAZZ UP THIS BASIC STITCH WITH THREE COOL VARIATIONS TO ADD SOME CREATIVITY TO YOUR CROCHET.

The savvy single crochet is based on the American single crochet (UK/International know it as the double crochet). By changing the placement of your stitches and using a larger size hook than you would normally with the yarn you are using, the fabric gives the look of knit, with a softer drape and feel.

Another feature of using this technique is that you use less yarn than you would in normal crochet. The larger hook size and the “taller” stitches allow your item to be completed more quickly too.

Originally, these stitches were found in the early 1990s in Afghanistan. Over the decades since, there have been many who have tried to clarify and improve upon the stitches. What you will find here are three of the original stitches with clearer names and explanations. Once you learn the basic terminology, creating the stitches is easy!

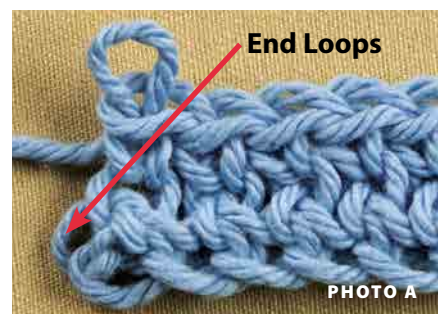
TERMINOLOGY

As with learning any crochet technique, there are always new terms and abbreviations to learn. That is no different with the savvy single crochet. The table below includes all the terms and abbreviations that I will be using in this article.

STITCH OR TERM	ABBREVIATION
End Loops	EL
Knit Stitch	KS
Rear Bump of Chain	RBC
Rear Loop of Stitch	RLS
Twisted Single Stitch	TSS
V-Knit Stitch	VKS

WORKING IN THE END LOOPS

Because in working these stitches you are always skipping the first stitch of the row (when working in rows), you will have to add a stitch to the end of each row. The skipped stitch of the previous row will create two visible loops called the End Loops (EL), shown in Photo A.



REAR BUMP OF THE CHAIN

In traditional crochet, the foundation row is worked with the front of the starting chain facing forward, shown in Photo B.



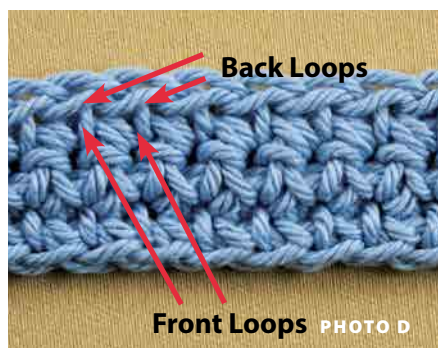
To create the base for the stitches, the starting chain is turned backward. You will notice in Photo C that there are loops/nubs coming through the center that join the chains together. These are the Rear Bumps or Back Bars of the Chain (RBC).





WORKING IN THE REAR LOOP OF THE STITCH

In traditional crochet, stitches are worked on top of each other through the front and back loops of the stitches of the previous row/round, shown in Photo D.



With these stitches, you will work your single crochets in the loop on the back side of the stitch just underneath the back loop of the stitch, shown in Photo E. This is the Rear Loop of the Stitch (RLS).



LEARNING THE STITCHES

We will start off with this technique by learning three of my favorite stitches.

THE KNITTED SINGLE STITCH



Ch 20.

Row 1: Work 1 sc in RBC of each ch across, turn. (20 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in RLS in 2nd sc from hook and in each sc across, sc in EL that forms at end of row, turn.

Repeat row 2 for pattern.

THE V-KNIT STITCH



Ch 20.

Row 1: Work 1 sc in RBC of each ch across, turn. (20 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in RLS and BOTH lps in 2nd sc from hook and in each sc across, sc in EL that forms at end of row, turn.

Repeat row 2 for Pattern.

THE TWISTED STITCH



Ch 20.

Row 1: Work 1 sc in RBC of each ch across, turn. (20 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, inserting hook from top to bottom, work sc in RLS in 2nd sc from hook and in each sc across, sc in EL that forms at end of row, turn.

Repeat row 2 for pattern.

SOME TIPS TO KEEP YOU IN STITCHES

One of the hardest parts of this technique is keeping the sides straight. There are some tips I can leave you with to prevent losing stitches.

1. Use stitch markers on either side to mark the End Loops. If you have these end loops marked with a different color marker on either side, you can also tell if you are on an even row or an odd row.

2. Don't forget to skip the first stitch. This is the most common reason that a piece grows. Even when increasing, you still want to skip that first stitch because working in that first stitch is not only difficult, but it creates an edge that is not smooth.

3. Keep the turning chain loose. By keeping that turning chain loose, you can see that end loop much easier, not to mention that it will be easier to insert your hook in that space. **C!**

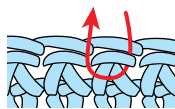

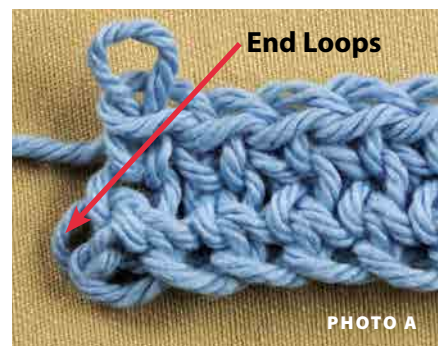

Dec 2 sts at each armhole edge 1 [1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 9] time(s). (60 [68, 70, 74, 74, 74, 74] sts at end of last row)

Dec 1 st at each armhole edge 2 [3, 2, 3, 2, 2, 1] time(s). (56 [62, 66, 68, 70, 70, 72] sts at end of last row)

Rows 5–21 [6–23, 6–25, 8–27, 9–29, 11–31, 12–31]: Continue to work in Pattern as established, ending with WS row.

Neckline Shaping

First Side

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across first 21 [24, 25, 26, 26, 26, 26] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (21 [24, 25, 26, 26, 26, 26] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sk first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] twice, work in Pattern as established across, turn. (18 [21, 22, 23, 23, 23, 23] sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 4 [4, 4, 4, 6, 6, 6] sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 2 [2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3] times, turn. (6 [19, 20, 21, 20, 20, 20] sts)

Row 4: Ch 1, sk first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 1 [1, 1, 1, 1, 2, 2] time(s). Fasten off. (14 [17, 18, 19, 18, 17, 17] sts)



2nd Side

Getting started: With RS facing, sk next 14 [14, 16, 16, 18, 18, 20] unworked sts after last worked st of First Side neckline row 1, join in next st on first st of row 1 worked in same st as joining.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across next 21 [24, 25, 26, 26, 26, 26] sts, turn. (21 [24, 25, 26, 26, 26, 26] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 6 sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, turn. (18 [21, 22, 23, 23, 23, 23] sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, sk first st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 1 [1, 1, 1, 2, 2, 2] time(s), turn. (16 [19, 20, 21, 20, 20, 20] sts)

Row 4: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 4 [4, 4, 4, 4, 6, 6] sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 2 [2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3] times. Fasten off. (14 [17, 18, 19, 18, 17, 17] sts)

Right Front

Getting started: Worked across 46 (50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70) sts.

With WS facing, sk next 6 unworked sts after last worked st of Back armhole row 1, join in next st, first st of row 1 worked in same st as joining.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across, turn. (43 [47, 51, 55, 59, 63, 67] sts)

Rows 2–4 [2–5, 2–5, 2–7, 2–8, 2–10, 2–11]: Continue to work in Pattern as established and **at the same time** work decs as follows by working **hdc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts:

Dec 2 sts at armhole edge 1 [1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 9] row(s). (41 [45, 47, 49, 49, 49, 49] sts at end of last row)

Dec 1 st at armhole edge 2 [3, 2, 3, 2, 2, 1] row(s). (39 [42, 45, 46, 47, 47, 48] sts at end of last row)

Rows 5–21 [6–23, 6–25, 8–27, 9–29, 11–31, 12–31]: Continue to work in Pattern as established, ending with WS row.

Neckline Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Sl st in each of first 12 sts, ch 1, sk next st, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 1 [1, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3] time(s), work in Pattern as established across, turn. (25 [28, 30, 31, 32, 32, 32] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 4 [4, 6, 6, 6, 6] sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 2 [2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 3] times, turn. (23 [26, 27, 28, 29, 29, 29] sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc dec in first 2 sts, work in Pattern as established across, turn. (22 [25, 26, 27, 28, 28, 28] sts)

Row 4: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 4 [4, 4, 4, 6, 6, 6] sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 2 [2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3] times, turn. (20 [23, 24, 25, 25, 25, 25] sts)

Row 5 & 6: Rep last 2 rows. (17 [20, 21, 22, 21, 21, 21] sts at end of last row)

Row 7: Rep row 3. (16 [19, 20, 21, 20, 20, 20] sts)

Row 8: Ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 4 [4, 4, 4, 4, 6, 6] sts, [hdc dec in next 2 sts] 2 [2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3] times. Fasten off. (14 [17, 18, 19, 18, 17, 17] sts)

Sleeve

Make 2.

Row 1 (WS): First foundation sc, 55 [59, 65, 69, 75, 79, 83] next foundation sc, turn. (56 [60, 66, 70, 76, 80, 84] sc)

Row 2–68 [2–70, 2–70, 2–70, 2–72, 2–72, 2–74]: Work in Pattern.

Sleeve Cap Shaping

Row 1: Sl st in each of first 3 sts, ch 1, work in Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, leaving last 3 sts unworked, turn. (50 [54, 60, 64, 70, 74, 78] sts)

Row 2–14 [2–18, 2–20, 2–16, 2–18, 2–21, 2–24]: Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. (24 [20, 22, 34, 36, 34, 32] sts)

Size Small Only

Row 15: Work in Pattern as established, turn.

Row 16: Ch 1, hdc in first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Patterns as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. (22 sts)

Row 17 & 18: Rep last 2 rows. (20 sts at end of last row)

Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large, 3X-Large & 4X-Large Only

Next row: Ch 1, sk first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. ([31, 33, 31, 29] sts)

Next rows: Rep last row [3, 3, 2, 1] time(s). ([22, 24, 25, 36] sts)

All Sizes

Next row: Ch 1, sk first st, hdc dec in next 2 sts, work in Pattern as established across to last 3 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, hdc in last st, turn. (17 [17, 19, 19, 21, 22, 33] sts)

Next row: Rep last row once. Fasten off. (14 [14, 16, 16, 18, 19, 30] sts)

Collar

Row 1: First foundation sc, 99 [99, 103, 103, 107, 111, 111] next foundation sc, turn. (100 [100, 104, 104, 108, 112, 112] sc)

Rows 2–39: Work in Pattern.

Row 40: Ch 2, hdc in each st across. Fasten off.

Finishing

Block all pieces to schematic measurements.

Sew shoulder seams.

Set sleeves into armholes and sew into place.

Sew seam along underside of sleeve.

Block Collar to schematic measurements.

Attach ¾-inch snap to top inside corner of neckline.

Sew decorative button to outside of Jacket.

Collar is removable. Overlap ends of Collar to desired snugness and secure with shank/post button, shawl pin or brooch.

Pleats

Working from WS, flatten the sk sts so that half of the sts are on each side of the opening and the sts match.

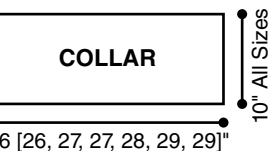
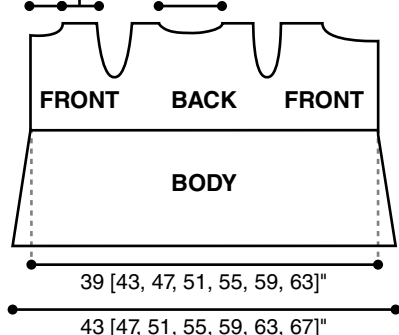

GAUGE

12 linked dtr in pattern = 4 inches; 8 pattern rows = 4 inches

12 sc & fpdc = 4 inches; 18 pattern rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Front and Back panels are made first, sewn together at shoulders and side seams. Sleeves are worked directly into armholes next.

Bottom panel is sewn to bottom of Front and Back panels. Collar is made and sewn to top of one end of bottom panel, up front panel, around back of next, down second Front and opposite end of bottom panel.

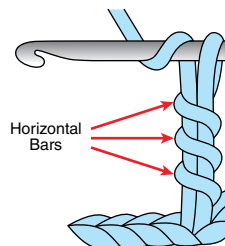
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Double Treble Stitch

Beginning linked half double crochet (beg linked hdc): Ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in first st, yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Linked half double crochet (linked hdc):

Working in horizontal bar of previous st, insert hook in next bar, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up lp (3 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

Linked double crochet (linked dc): Working in horizontal bar of previous st, insert hook in next bar, yo, pull up lp, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up lp (3 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice.

Cable: Sk next 2 sts 2 rows below, fpdc (see *Stitch Guide*) around each of next 2 sts, working, over sts just worked, in 2 sts just sk, fpdc around first sk st, fpdc around 2nd sk st.

CARDI

Back

Row 1 (WS): Ch 41 [41, 43, 43, 45, 45], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (40 [40, 42, 42, 44, 44] sc)

Row 2: Beg linked dtr (see *Special Stitches*) in first st, **linked dtr** (see *Special Stitches*) in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), sc in each st across, turn.

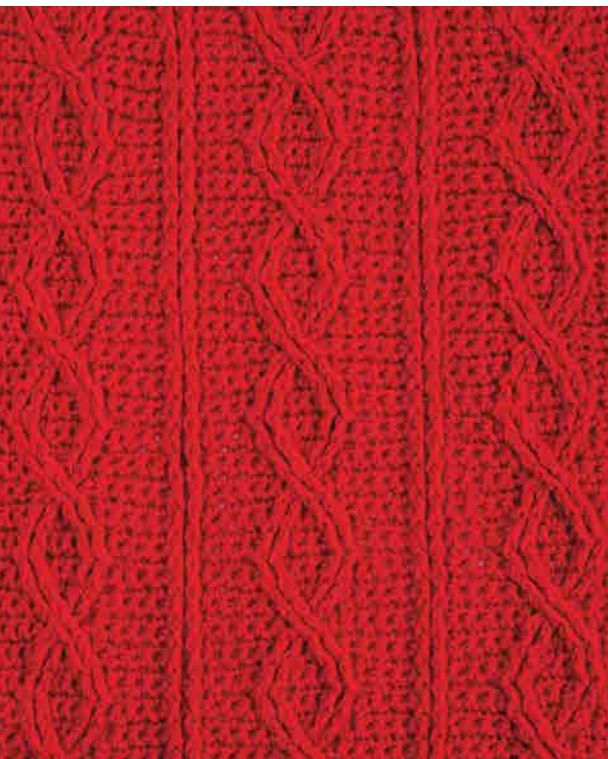

(10 linked hdc, 10 linked dc, 20 [20, 22, 22, 24, 24] linked dtr)

Top Edging

Row 4 [6, 8, 10, 12, 14]: Beg linked dtr in first st, linked dtr in each of next 19 [19, 21, 21, 23, 23] sts, [insert hook in next horizontal bar, yo, pull up lp] 3 times, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up lp, [yo, pull through 3 lps on hook] twice, linked dc in each of next 9 sts, [insert hook in next horizontal bar, yo, pull up lp] twice, insert hook in next st, yo, pull up lp, yo, pull through all lps on hook, linked hdc in each st across, turn. (10 linked hdc, 10 linked dc, 20 [20, 22, 22, 24, 24] linked dtr)

Row 5 [7, 9, 11, 13, 15]: Rep row 3.

Rows 6–11 [8–13, 10–15, 12–17, 14–19,

16–21]: *Rep rows 4 and 5 [6 and 7, 8 and 9, 10 and 11, 12 and 13, 14 and 15], rep from * twice. At end of last row, fasten off.

Top Edging

Rep Top Edging for Left Front.

Assembly

With RS tog, sew shoulder seams.

(16 fpdc, 28 [28, 32, 32, 36, 36] sc)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 [3, 5, 5, 7, 7] sts, fpdc around each of next 2 post sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 post sts] twice, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 post sts, sc in each of next 2 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 post sts, sc in each of next 4 sts, fpdc around each of next 2 post sts, [sc in each of next 3 sts,

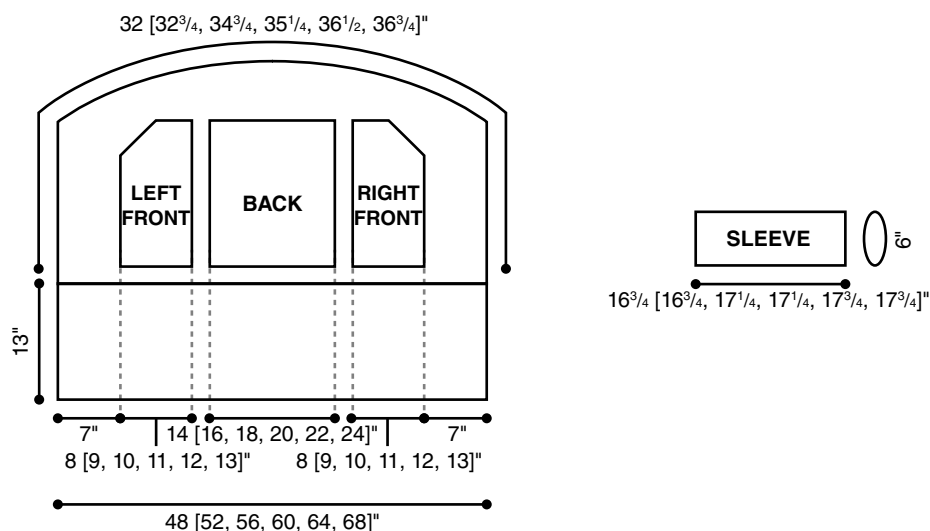

Row 3: Ch 1, hdc in first ch-2 sp, [fan in next hdc, hdc in center ch-2 sp of next fan] across, ending with hdc in last ch-2 sp, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for pattern] 13 [14, 14, 15, 16, 17] times. At end of last row, fasten off.

Front

Make 2.

Row 1 (RS): Beg at shoulder, with blue heather, ch 27 [27, 35, 35, 43, 43], hdc in 3rd ch from hook, [sk next 3 chs, fan in next ch, sk next 3 chs, hdc in next ch] across, turn. (3 [3, 4, 4, 5, 5] fans)

Row 2: Rep row 2 of Back. (2 *half fans*, 2 [2, 3, 3, 4, 4] fans)

Row 3: Rep row 3 of Back.

Row 4: Rep row 2 of Back.

Row 5: Ch 1, hdc in first ch sp, [fan in next hdc, hdc in center ch sp of next fan] across

to last hdc, fan in last hdc, hdc in next tr, fan in last ch sp, hdc in last tr, turn. (4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 6] fans)

Rows 6–8: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] twice, ending last rep with row 2.

Row 9: Rep row 5. (5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] fans)

Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for pattern] 10 [11, 11, 12, 13, 14] times. At end of last row, fasten off.

Assembly

Lay Fronts on Back with RS tog, with shoulder shaping incs toward each other.

Sew shoulder seams. Turn RS out.

Edging

Working across bottom edge of Back, **join** (*see Pattern Note*) black in end of last row, [sc in hdc, ch 2, sl st in last sc, hdc in each of next 4 sts and chs, (2 dc, tr, 2 dc) in next ch sp, hdc in each of next 4 sts and chs] across. Fasten off. (9 [10, 11, 12, 13, 14] scallops)

Work Edging across bottom edge of each Front. (5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] scallops across each Front)

Frog

Make 5 [5, 5, 5, 8, 8].

Rnd 1: With black, ch 8, sl st in 8th ch from hook to form ring, ch 28, sl st in 8th ch from hook to form ring, ch 1, dc in each ch across to first ch-8 sp, (2 dc, 12 tr, 2 dc) in ch-8 sp, dc in each ch across to 2nd ch-8 sp, (2 dc, 12 tr, 2 dc) in ch-8 sp, join in top of beg dc. (24 tr, 48 dc)

Rnd 2: [Sl st in each st across to first dc in first ch-8 sp, sc in each of next 8 sts, ch 2, sc in each of next 8 sts] twice, join in beg sl st.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 [2, 6, 10, 13, 17] sc, [puff st (see *Special Stitch*) in next sc, sc in each of next 9 sc] across, ending with puff in next sc, sc in each of last 3 [2, 6, 10, 13, 17] sc, turn. (7 [8, 8, 8, 8, 8] puff sts, 60 [67, 75, 83, 89, 97] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc in each puff st across, turn.

Rows 3–65: [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 32 times for Body pattern, ending last rep with row 1.

Armhole Shaping

Next row: Sl st in each of first 4 [4, 5, 6, 7, 8] sts, work in established pattern across, leaving last 4 [4, 5, 6, 7, 8] sts unworked, turn. (59 [67, 73, 79, 83, 89] sts)

Dec row: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sts for dec, dec at beg and end of next 3 [6, 8, 10, 11, 13] rows (total of 8 [11, 14, 17, 19, 22] armhole decs). (51 [53, 55, 57, 59, 61] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Continue established pattern until piece measures 24¾ [25¼, 25¾, 26, 27, 27½]

inches from beg, ending WS. Fasten off. (98 [100, 102, 104, 108, 110] total Body Pat rows)

Right Front

Getting started: Read entire section before beg so that you will understand the Neck/Armhole Shaping.

Make 4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 6] Little Boxes. (28 [28, 35, 35, 42, 42] rows)

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 [2, 6, 10, 13, 17] sc, [puff st in next st, sc in 9 sts] across, puff st in next st, sc in each of last 2 [7, 7, 7, 7, 7] sc, turn. (3 puff sts, 32 [36, 40, 44, 47, 51] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc and in each puff st across, turn.

Rows 3–65: [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 32 times for Body pattern, ending last rep with row 1.

Neck & Armhole Shaping

Next row: Work in established pattern across, leaving last 4 [4, 5, 6, 7, 8] sts unworked, turn. (22 [26, 29, 32, 34, 37] sts)

Next rows: Dec 1 st at armhole edge every row 4 [7, 9, 11, 12, 14] times and at same time, beg on row 67, dec 1 st at neck edge now and every 4th row 0 [1, 3, 5, 2, 5] time(s), then every 6th row 4 [4, 3, 2, 5, 3] times. (13 [13, 13, 13, 14, 14] sts at end of last row)

Rows 9–96 [9–104, 9–112, 9–120, 9–128, 9–136]: [Rep rows 5–8 consecutively] 22 [24, 26, 28, 30, 32] times. (24 [26, 28, 30, 32, 34] squares at end of last row)

Edging rnd: Ch 1, evenly sp 4 sc down side of Square, ch 2, evenly sp 4 sc along next side of same Square, *evenly sp 4 sc along side of next Square, ch 2, evenly sp 4 sc along next side of same square 23 [25, 27, 29, 31, 33] times*, ch 2, place marker in last ch-2 sp made, working on opposite side of Square strip, rep between * around, sl st in marked ch-2 sp, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg sc. Fasten off.

Bottom Square Edging

Row 1: Join with sc in any ch-2 sp on Edging rnd, sc in same sp, holding all lps on hook, pick up lp in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each of next 5 sts (6 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Row 2: Sk first st, pick up lp in each of next 3 vertical bars, pick up lp in back lp of next st on Edging rnd (5 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] twice, yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Row 3: Sk first st, pick up lp in next 2 vertical bars, pick up lp in next st on Edging rnd (4 lps on hook), yo, pull through 2 lps on hook, yo, pull through all 3 lps on hook.

Row 4: Sk first st, pick up lp in next vertical bar, pick up lp in next st on Edging rnd (3 lps on hook), yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Row 5: 2 sc in next ch-2 sp on Edging rnd, pick up lp in back lp of each of next 5 sts (6 lps on hook), [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] 3 times, yo, pull through 3 lps on hook.

Rows 6–96 [6–104, 6–112, 6–120, 6–128, 6–136]: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 23 [25, 27, 29, 31, 33] times, ending last rep with row 4. At end of last row, join in first st on row 1, **turn**.

Bottom Body

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, ch 1, working in **front lps** (see *Stitch Guide*), 2 sc in same st as joining, sc in each of next 4 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 4 sts] around, join in beg sc, turn. (144 [156, 168, 180, 192, 204] sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first st, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sts, [sc in front lp of next st, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sts] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each next 2 sc, [sc in back lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] around, join in beg sc, turn.

Rnds 5–26 [5–28, 5–30, 5–32, 5–34, 5–36]: [Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately] 15 [12, 13, 14, 15, 16] times. At end of last rnd, **do not fasten off**.

Rnds 1–20 [1–22, 1–24, 1–26, 1–28, 1–30]: Rep rnds 1–20 [1–22, 1–24, 1–26, 1–28, 1–30] of Bottom Body.

Back Top

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of

each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] 23 [25, 27, 29, 31, 33] times, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] across, turn.

Rows 4–23 [4–25, 4–27, 4–27, 4–29, 4–31]: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 10 [11, 12, 12, 13, 14] times.

Row 24 [26, 28, 28, 30, 32]: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] 7 [8, 8, 9, 9, 10] times, [sl st in front lp of next dc, sl st in back lp of each of next 2 sc] 8 [8, 10, 10, 12, 12] times, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] 8 [9, 9, 10, 10, 11] times. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Top Front

Row 1: Join with sc in back lp of next unworked dc on last rnd of Top Body, sc in back lp of next dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] 23, [25, 27, 29, 31, 33] times, turn.

Rows 2–17 [2–19, 2–21, 2–21, 2–23, 2–25]: Work same as for Top Back.

Left Front Shoulder

Row 18 [20, 22, 22, 24, 26]: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] 9 [10, 10, 11, 11, 12] times, sc in front lp of next dc, leaving rem sts unworked for now, turn.

Row 19 [21, 23, 23, 25, 27]: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, sc in back lp of next dc, sk next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] across, turn.

Row 20 [22, 24, 24, 26, 28]: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] 8 [9, 9, 10, 10, 11] times, sc in front lp of next sc, turn.

Row 21 [23, 25, 25, 27, 29]: Rep row 19 [21, 23, 23, 25, 27].

Row 22 [24, 26, 26, 28, 30]: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of next 2 sc] 7 [8, 8, 9, 9, 10] times, sc in front lp of next sc, turn.

Row 23 [25, 27, 27, 29, 31]: Rep row 19 [21, 23, 23, 25, 27].

Row 24 [26, 28, 28, 30, 32]: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back loop of next 2 sc] 7 [8, 8, 9, 9, 10] times. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Right Front Shoulder

Row 1: Sk next 10 sts on last row of Top Front, join with sc in back lp of next st, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back lp in each of first 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] across to last 4 sts, [sk next st, sc in back lp of next st] twice, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sk first 2 sts, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in back lp of each of first 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc, [sc in back lp of each of next 2 dc, dc in front lp of next sc] across to last 3 sts, sk next st, sc in back lp of each of next 2 sts, turn.

Row 5: Rep row 3.

Row 6: Rep row 4.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in front lp of first dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc, [sc in front lp of next dc, dc in back lp of each of next 2 sc] across. Leaving long end, fasten off.

Sleeve

Make 2.

Ribbing

Joining row: Fold piece in half so last row and beg ch line up, with WS tog, sl st through

Half cluster shell (half cl shell): (Cl, ch 2, dc) as indicated in instructions.

Beginning half cluster shell (beg half cl shell): Ch 5, cl in same place as beg ch-5.

INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1: Ch multiple of 5 plus 11, **cl** (*see Special Stitches*) in 6th ch from hook, [sk next 4 chs, **cl shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in next ch] across to last 5 chs, sk next 4 chs, **half cl shell** (*see Special Stitches*) in last ch, turn.

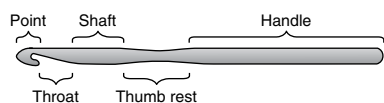

But before addressing questions, any crocheter needs to understand the parts of a crochet hook and how important each plays as you crochet each and every stitch.

A simple crochet hook has five important parts.



Parts of a Crochet Hook

Each part of the hook is designed to serve a specific function.

1. Point: This part of the hook is inserted into previously made stitches and must be sharp enough to slide easily through the stitches, yet blunt enough so that it doesn't snag or split the yarn.

2. Throat: The open narrow part underneath the point where the hook catches the yarn as you work.

3. Shaft: The shaft holds the loops of each stitch and helps to determine the size and gauge of your stitches and rows.

4. Thumb rest: The flat part of

the hook located on the shaft, the thumb rest, which is held between your thumb and middle finger, allowing the hook to turn into the proper position to form each stitch.

5. Handle: The remaining length of the hook below the thumb rest is called the handle. This part of the hook allows you to achieve the proper balance when crocheting.

Crochet hooks come in different types and brands that vary slightly in appearance. For example, some points are sharper than others and some have ergonomic handles. Some are plastic, while others are made of steel, bamboo or wood. Experiment with different hooks to find those that feel the best to you and are the most comfortable to use.

Q. I find working into a foundation chain is difficult and frustrating. Why are my chains and beginning stitches so tight? —*Velma W.*

A. Try working your foundation more loosely than usual. If you find the foundation row of stitches are still too tight, try working the first row with a hook one size larger than called for. For example, if after marking a

swatch and checking your gauge, you plan to work your project using a size I/9/5.5mm hook, try working the beginning foundation chains only using a size J/10/6mm hook, making it easier to insert your required size hook into each chain across. Be sure each completed stitch is placed onto the shaft of the hook to create the proper size. When stitches remain at the throat of a hook, they end up being smaller and tighter than the intended size.

Q. Is there an easy way to tell when I'm working on a Right Side row? —*Tracee S.*

A. Unless instructions tell you otherwise, most patterns begin with a Right Side row. The quickest way to determine which side you are working on is to look at the tail at the end of your first row. When the yarn tail is to your left, you are working on a Right Side row. Likewise, if the tail is to your right, you are working on a Wrong Side row. All the light green rows in the swatch shown in Photo 1 are Right Side rows, while Wrong Side rows are worked in pink to distinguish how rows look when viewed from the Right Side.

By nature, meaning the way crochet stitches are formed, every other row of stitches line up. Every time you insert your crochet hook into the top two loops of the previous row, a V is formed. Notice what happens when you complete a stitch by drawing the yarn through the last loops—now the stitch is closed and the last loop is slightly to the left of the stitch just made, instead of directly above the stitch. When you complete a row and turn to work back across the first row, as you work into the top loops of a stitch, you will notice the last loop of a stitch is placed slightly to the right of each stitch below.

When the Right Side is facing you, a Wrong Side row has bumps. See the pink bumps above the red stitches on the swatch shown. And when the Right Side of work is facing you, crochet usually looks neater and more uniform than does the Wrong Side of the work.

The swatch shown is divided into thirds, although not exactly equal in size, the lower third is worked in single crochet, the middle third is worked in half double crochet and the upper third is worked in double crochet. The purple running stitches isolate stitches vertically to help you begin to understand how stitches are formed and line up.

Q. I'm having difficulty maintaining an even tension. What can I do? —*Elaine A.*

A. Tension refers to how the yarn passes through your hand and fingers, in particular, the index finger. To begin, pull a long length of yarn free from your skein of yarn. The yarn should glide easily through your hand and fingers without effort; when your index finger feels pressure or feels the flow of yarn is tightening, stop and pull more yarn loose.

The more you crochet, the more your tension improves. Some people naturally tend to crochet loosely, while others tighter. Crocheting at times when you are feeling stressed or anxious often results in stitches

that are a bit tighter than usual.

Even we old-timers find tension varies. For example, while all three sections of the swatch were worked with the same size hook and yarn, when working in single crochet, my work is always a bit tighter than when working in half double or double crochet. So I never just assume, but always work a swatch to determine prior to starting any crochet piece.

Q. Do I really need to re-count the number of stitches across if my first row count is right? —*Gretchen S.*

A. Counting stitches and rows is part of crocheting, even for the most experienced crocheter. Sometimes, we all make mistakes, or inadvertently increase one or two stitches, or lose a stitch altogether.

This is just of one of many ways to make use of plastic markers. Place a marker every 10 stitches across and every 10 rows. Check your stitch count every time you add a marker to stay on track. Then if your count is off, it takes much less time to rip out a few rows, rather than have to re-stitch an entire garment piece.

Q. I just completed a baby afghan for my first crochet project. The pattern stitch was mostly worked in double crochet, but I don't like the gap at the beginning of each row when instructions say to "chain 3." Is there a way to avoid these gaps? —*Sandra W.*

Neck Wrap

Row 1 (RS): Ch 57, holding back lps on hook, pull up lp in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 4 chs (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1, which creates hold above 6 sts, [pull up lp in hole, pull up lp in side of last st, pull up lp in same ch as last worked in, pull up lp in each of next 2 chs (6 lps on

hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook] across to last ch, hdc in last ch, turn. (26 star sts)

Row 2: Ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), 2 hdc in each hole across ending with hdc in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), pull up lp in 2nd and 3rd chs from hook, pull up lp in each of first 3 sts (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1, [pull up lp in hole, pull up lp in last st, pull up lp in same st as last of 6 sts worked, pull up lp in each of next 2 sts (6 lps on hook), yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 1] across, ending with hdc in last st, turn.

Rows 4–7: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] twice.

Row 8 (WS): Work as before and at same time inc by working 3 hdc instead of 2 hdc in 7th and 8th hole counted from each side.

Row 9: Work in established pattern across. (28 star sts)

Rows 10–12: Continue as before, on row 12, inc again by working 3 hdc in 8th and 9th holes counted from each side.

Row 13: Work as before, there will now be 30 star sts.





Rows 14–16: Continue as before, on row 16, inc again by working 3 hdc in 9th and 10th holes counted from each side.

Row 17: Work as before, there will now be 32 star sts.

Row 18: Work in pattern, do not turn.

Edges

Row 1: Working in ends of rows, evenly sp 24–26 sc along short end, turn.

Rows 2–5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rep on rem short end making 3 buttonholes

on row 4 by working [ch 1, sk next st], placing 1 buttonhole close to neck edge and rem 2 at 2½ inches between. On row 5 work sc in each st and in each ch sp across. At end of row 5, fasten off.

Sew buttons to opposite end from buttonholes. **C!**

INFINITY RIPPLE COWL

Row 1: Ch 22, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, *sc in each of next 3 chs, **sc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 3 chs, sc in each of next 3 chs*, 3 sc in next ch, rep between * once, 2 sc in last ch, turn. (21 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, *sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 3 sts, sc in each of next 3 sc*, 3 sc in next sc, rep between * once, 2 sc in last sc, turn.

Rows 3–250: Rep row 2.



Last row: At end of row 250 or when desired, leaving long end, fasten off.

Finishing

To make an infinity moebius Cowl, twist 1 narrow end of Cowl 180 degrees so that the

back side is now in front. Pin edge of this end to other end, match sts on last row with chs of beg row. Sew ends tog. Fasten off. **C!**

- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- 2-inch-wide black elastic: 24 inches
- Lanyard hooks: 2 for Neck Strap or 1 for Wrist Strap
- ¾-inch D-ring
- Stitch marker



GAUGE

11 sts = 4 inches; 12 rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

When working in rounds with Puddel yarn, most of the mohair curl shows on the back



side of the piece, therefore the back side of the piece is the right side of the work.

Work in continuous rounds, do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.

Mark first stitch of rounds.

Move stitch markers up with each round.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

WARMERS

Hand Muff

Rnd 1 (WS): Ch 47, being careful not to twist ch, sl st in beg ch to form ring, ch 1, sc in same ch as beg sl st and in each ch around, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*). (47 sc)

Rnd 2: Sc in each st around.

Next rnds: Rep rnd 2 until piece measures 24 inches from beg. At end of last rnd, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg st. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

Finishing

With WS facing, RS out 6 inches on each end, so that first and last rnd meet in center of Muff. With long end, sew first and last rnds tog.

Sew D-Ring to seam.

Turn entire piece RS out so seam and D-Ring are inside Muff.

Neck or Wrist Strap

Neck Strap: Cut 6 strands each 120 inches long. Holding strands tog, tie knot 3 inches from end. Going down strands, [tie knot every 1¼ inches] 3 times, go down 17 inches from last knot and tie knot, [tie knot every 1¼ inches] 6 times, go down 17 inches from last knot and tie knot, [tie knot every 1¼ inches] 3 times. Fasten off 3 inches from last knot.

After ends are woven in, attach 1 lanyard hook on each end near knot. Attach strap to D-Ring. (15 knots)

Wrist Strap: Cut 6 strands each 60 inches in length. Holding strands tog, tie knot 3 inches from end. Going down strands, [tie knot every 1¼ inches] 3 times, [go down 7 inches from last knot and tie knot] twice, [tie knot

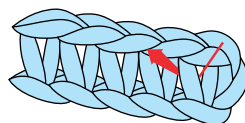

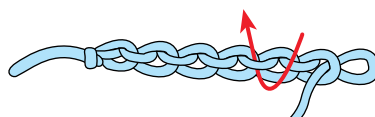

Rnd 1 RS: Ch 96, being careful not to twist ch, sl st in **back bar of beg ch** (see illustration) to form ring, ch 1, sc in back bar of same ch as joining sl st and in back bar of each ch around, **do not join** (see Pattern Notes). (96 sc)



Back Bar of Chain

Rnd 2: Leg sc (see Special Stitches) in each st around.

Next rnds: Rep rnd 2 until piece measures 7 inches from beg.

Next rnd: [Sl st in next st, ch 3, sk next 2 sts] around, **join** (see Pattern Notes) in beg sl st. Fasten off. (32 ch-3 lps)

Ribbing

Rnd 1 (RS): Turn Bottom upside down, working on opposite side of chs on rnd 1 of Bottom, join in first ch, **ch 2** (see Pattern Notes), hdc in each ch around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (96 hdc)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, **fpdc** (see Stitch Guide) around next st, **lpdc** (see Stitch Guide) around next st, fpdc around next st] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.

Rnds 3–7: [Rep rnd 2] 5 times.

Top

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each of next 3 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 3 sts] around, join in beg sc, **do not turn**. (120 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, **fpdc** (see Stitch Guide) around post of each st around, join in beg sc, **turn**.

Next rnds: Rep rnd 2 until piece measures 12½ inches long from beg.

Top Shaping

Row 1: Sl st in each of first 2 sts, ch 1, fpdc around next st and around each st across to last 2 sts, leaving last 2 sts unworked, turn. (116 fpdc)

Row 2: Rep row 1. (112 fpdc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sk first st, fpdc around next st and around each st across to last st, leaving last st unworked, turn. (110 fpdc)

Rows 4–6: [Rep row 3] 3 times. (104 fpdc at end of last row)

Rows 7 & 8: Ch 1, fpdc around each st across, turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, sk first st, fpdc around next st and around each st across, turn. (103 fpdc)

Rows 10–24: [Rep rows 7–9 consecutively] 5 times. (98 fp_{sc} at end of last row)

Next rows: Rep row 7 until piece measures 22½ inches long ending with RS row.

Row 1 (WS): Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each of first 42 sts, [fp dec (see *Special Stitches*), fp_{sc} around next st] 5 times, fp_{sc} around each of last 41 sts, turn. (93 fp_{sc})

Row 2: Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each of first 41 sts, [fp dec, fp_{sc} around next st] 4 times, fp_{sc} around each of last 40 sts, turn. (89 fp_{sc})

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each of first 39 sts, [fp dec, fp_{sc} around next st] 4 times, fp_{sc} around each of last 38 sts, turn. (85 fp_{sc})

Row 6: Rep row 2.

Row 7: Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each of first 37 sts, [fp dec, fp_{sc} around next st] 4 times, fp_{sc} around each of last 36 sts, turn. (81 fp_{sc})

Row 8: Ch 1, fp_{sc} around each of first 34 sts, [fp dec, fp_{sc} around next st] 5 times, fp_{sc} around each of last 33 sts, turn. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. (76 fp_{sc})

With WS facing, fold row 8 in half to form top of hood. Using long end, inserting needle under both lps of each st, sew top closed.

Face Opening

Rnd 1 (WS): With WS facing, join at bottom of opening, ch 1, work evenly sp 84 sc around opening, **do not join**.

Rnd 2: [Sl st in next st, ch 3, sk next 2 sts] around, join in beg sl st. Fasten off. (28 ch-3 lps)

Rope

Make 2.

Cut 1 strand 8 yards in length. Fold in half. Tie ends in knot. Slip knotted end onto a stationary object the diameter of a pencil. Put looped end on finger. Make strands taut. Twist strands approximately 500 times. Put 1 finger in center of Rope, fold in half letting strands twist tog.

Starting at the back of the hood, weave first Rope through ch-3 sps on Bottom. Place 2 double-end cord stops on Rope ties. Trim Rope to 45 inches in length. Place knot in each Rope tie 1 inch from end.

Weave 2nd rope through ch-3 sps on Face Opening beg and ending 3 inches from bottom of opening on each side. Place 1 single-end cord stop on each Rope tie then place 1 double-end cord stop on Rope ties. Trim Rope to 45 inches in length. Place knot in each Rope tie 1 inch from end.

How to Wear

To Tell RS From WS:

When looking at ribbing rnds, RS will have a complete rib look, WS will appear to have a front post missing, caused by the ch-2 at the beg of the rnds.

Ski Mask: With WS facing, tuck leg sc mask rows and ribbing neck rows inside post sc hood rows. Pull hood over

your head keeping leg sc mask rows over nose and ears. Adjust cord stops for perfect fit.

Face Mask: Follow method for Ski Mask, then push post sc hood rows off head toward the back keeping leg sc mask rows over nose and ears. Adjust cord stops for perfect fit.

Hood: Follow method for Ski Mask, then fold leg sc mask rows down inside rib neck rows. Adjust cord stops for perfect fit.

Scarf: Follow method for Ski Mask, then fold leg sc mask rows down inside rib neck rows and push post sc hood rows off head toward the back.

Ski Cap: With RS facing, tighten double-end cord stop on leg sc Rope to close opening. Tuck post sc hood rows inside ribbing and leg sc rows. Place cap on head.

Duffle Bag: With RS facing, tighten double-end cord stop on leg sc rope to close opening. Push 2nd double-end cord stop on leg sc rope down so that it sits 1 inch from knotted tie ends. Place items inside bag through post sc hood opening. Tighten single-end cord stops on post sc Rope to close opening. Push double-end cord stop on post sc Rope down so that it sits 1 inch from knotted tie ends. Twine 2 double end cord stops near the knotted tie ends tog to form shoulder strap.

Rnd 1: Ch 4, 11 dc in 4th ch from hook (*first 3 chs count as first dc*), **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (12 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (*see Pattern Notes*), dc in same st as beg ch-3, [2 **fpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around next st, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (24 sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around each of next 2 sts, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (36 sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 fpdc around next st, [dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 fpdc around next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (48 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, 2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (60 sts)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, fpdc around st just sk, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (72 sts)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, dc in same st as last fpdc, dc in next st, fpdc around same st as last dc, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 8: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, dc in same st as last fpdc, dc in each of next 3 sts, fpdc around same st as last dc, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (96 sts)

Rnd 9: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, dc in same st as last fpdc, dc in next st, sk next st, fpdc around next st, fpdc around st just sk, dc in each of next 2 sts, fpdc around same st as last dc worked, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (108 sts)

in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (120 sts)

Rnd 11: Ch 3, dc in next st, [2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, dc around each of next 2 sts, sk next st, fpdc around next st, dc in same st as last fpdc, dc in each of next 3 sts, fpdc in same st as last dc, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, fpdc in same st as last dc, sk next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 fpdc around next st, dc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, **turn**. (132 sts)

Rnd 12: Ch 2 (*see Pattern Notes*), working in back bars of rnd below for all sts in rnd 12, hdc in each of next 8 sts, **hdc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sts, [hdc in each of next 9 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (120 sts)

Rnd 13: Ch 2, **bpdc** (*see Stitch Guide*) around next st, hdc in each of next 6 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, [hdc in next st, bpdc around next st, hdc in each of next 6 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (108 sts)

Rnd 14: Ch 2, hdc in next st, bpdc around next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, [hdc in each of next 2 sts, bpdc around next st, hdc in each of next 4 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (96 sts)

Rnd 15: Ch 2, hdc in each of next 2 sts, bpdc around next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts, [hdc in each of next 3 sts, bpdc around next st, hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc dec in next 2 sts] around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. (84 sts)

ring, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 9 dc in ring, **changing color** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) in last st, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (10 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (20 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (30 dc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, [dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (40 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, [dc in each of next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (50 dc)

Next rnds: Continue working in established pattern, work 1 inc between each inc every rnd until there are 120 dc in last rnd.

Next rnd: Ch 3, dc in each st around and at same time evenly inc 8 dc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (128 dc)

Next rnds: Changing colors as established, work Body Pattern until piece measures 12½ inches from beg ending with dc rnd, measuring from center of ring upward. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Square

Make 2 each with denim blue as first color and dark pink as 2nd color; off white as first color and denim blue as 2nd color; light olive as first color and off white as 2nd color; dark pink as first color and light olive as 2nd color.

Rnd 1: With first color, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 1 (*does not count as first sc*), 8 sc in ring, changing colors to 2nd color in last st, join in beg sc. Fasten off first color.

Rnd 2: **Ch 5** (see *Pattern Notes*), [sc in next st, ch 4] around, join in beg first ch of beg ch-5, **do not change colors or fasten off.**

Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc sc) in each ch-4 sp around, join in beg ch-1. Fasten off 2nd color. (8 petals)

Rnd 4: Join light brown with sc in sp between dc at top of any petal, ch 8, [sc in sp between dc at top of next petal, ch 8] around, join in beg sc.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-2 unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCH

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Low Front Ridge: Ch 1, sl st in 2nd st and in each st across, sl st in turning ch, turn.

Arrow row:

Row 1: Ch 2, dc in each of first 2 sts, [sk next 3 sts, tr in next sc, working behind tr just made, dc in each of 3 sk sts] across, ending with dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Woven stitch (woven st): Sk first st, [yo, insert hook in next st, yo, pull lp through st and 1 lp on hook, yo, pull lp through 2 lps on hook (*first half completed*), yo, insert hook in same st, yo, pull lp through st and 2 lps on hook (*2nd half completed*), sk next st] across, last woven st should be worked in last st, turn.

SHAWL

Stole Section

Row 1: With size I hook, ch 253, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (252 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3: Working in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*), work **low front ridge** (see *Pattern Rows*).

Row 4: Working in rem lps of row 2, sc in each lp across, do not work in turning ch, turn.

Back Section

Row 1: With size I hook, ch 65, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (64 sc)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, *sc in next ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 4 times, shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell**, shell in next sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell, ch 5**, sc in next ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 2, dc in last sc, turn.

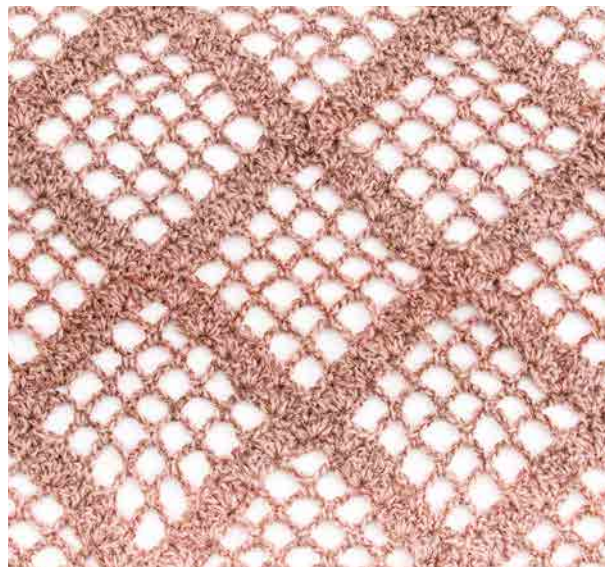

Make 2.

Foot

Rnd 1: Beg at toe, with petrol, ch 3, sl st in first ch to form ring, **ch 1** (see *Pattern Notes*),

4 [5, 6] sc in ring, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in beg ch-1. (5 [5, 6] sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, 2 sc in each st around, join in beg ch-1. (10 [10, 12] sc)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around, join in beg ch-1. (15 [15, 18] sc)

Rnds 4–6: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg ch-1.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in each of next 2 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in each of next 2 sts] around, join in beg ch-1. (20 [20, 24] sc)

Next rnds: Rep rnd 4 until piece measures 4½ [5, 5½] inches from beg.

Heel

Divide piece mid front by working rows with sc in each sc.

When piece measures 9 [10, 11] inches from beg, fold last row tog and working through both thicknesses, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Right Top

Row 1: With petrol, join with sc 1 inch after mid front, evenly sp 25 [27, 29] sc around until you are back at beg, turn, do not join.

Rows 2–6: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Row 7: Join dark brown with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn.

Rows 8 & 9: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Flap

Row 1: Working in ends of rows toward front edge, join with sc in end of first row, sc in each row across, turn.





Rows 2 & 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

Top Edging

With RS facing, working from left to right, join with sc in first st, **reverse sc** (see *Stitch Guide*) around top edge. Fasten off.

Left Top

Work same as for Right Top but beg working 1 inch before mid front.

Opening should be on the other side.

Finishing

Sew 2 buttons through both layers on Flap on each Boot as shown in photo. **C!**

1 skein each #1092 fashion farn, #600 white and #2020 violet
- Size E/4/3.5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers



GAUGE

20 ext sc = 4 inches

Take time to check gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

To make sure socks match, work 2 socks at once.

Work in continuous round, do not turn or join rounds unless otherwise indicated.

Move up markers on each row even when not indicated.

Mark the beginning of round with different color marker so that you can remember where you are.

Extended single crochet stitch in foot creates softer fabric to walk on and keeps sock from being stiff.

Finished socks are smaller than actual fit so that they stretch to stay on the foot.

When working in Fair Isle chart, there are only 2 colors per round.

Always work over the non-working yarn without pulling to allow for maximum stretch.

Rnd 1: Ch 11 [14, 16], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, place marker in last st to mark side, working on opposite side of ch, sc in each ch across to end, place different color marker in last st to mark side, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*). (20 [26, 30] sc)

Rnd 2: [Sc in each sc across to 1 sc before marked st, 2 sc in next sc, sc in marked st, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 [30, 34] sc)

Rnd 3: [Sc in each sc across to 1 sc before marked st, 2 sc in next sc, sc in marked st, 2 sc in next sc] around. (28 [34, 38] sc)

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around.

Next rnds: Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately until there are 36 [42, 46] sc around. Remove markers.

Foot

Rnd 1: Ext sc (see *Special Stitch*) in each st around. (36 [42, 46] ext sc)

Next rnds: Rep rnd 1 until Foot is 2 inches shorter than measured foot length.

Gusset

Getting started: Lay Sock flat so that Toe is flat at rnd 1, work ext sc until you reach 1 side, place markers at either side so that there are 17 [20, 22] sts between markers on each side.

Rnd 1: Ext sc in marked stitch, 2 ext sc in next ext sc, ext sc in each st to 1 st before next marker, 2 ext sc in next ext sc, ext sc in

marked st and in each st around. (38 [44, 48] ext sc)

Rnds 2–8: [Rep rnd 1] 7 times. (52 [58, 62] ext sc at end of last rnd)

Heel Turn

Row 1: Ext sc in each of next 13 [13, 13] ext sc, sc in each of next 8 [11, 13] ext sc, sl st in next ext sc, turn. (8 [11, 13] sc)

Row 2: Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each of next 4 [7, 9] sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, sl st in next ext sc, turn. (10 [13, 15] sc)

Row 3: Sc in each sc across, sl st in next ext sc, turn.

Row 4: Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 4 [7, 9] sc, 2 sc in next 2 sc, sc in last sc, sl st in next ext sc, turn. (14 [17, 19] sc)

Row 5: Rep row 3.

Row 6: Sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in each of next 8 [11, 13] sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc, sl st in next ext sc, turn. (18 [21, 23] sc)

Bobble: (Yo, insert hook in indicated st, yo, draw up lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook) 3 times in same st, yo, draw through last 4 lps on hook.

6 treble popcorn (6-tr pc): 6 tr in next st, remove hook from lp, insert hook in first tr of 6-tr group, pick up dropped lp and draw through st on hook, ch 1 to lock.

3 double crochet popcorn (3-dc pc): 3 dc in indicated st, remove hook from lp, insert hook in first dc of 3-dc group, pick up dropped lp and draw through st on hook, ch 1 to lock.

BLANKET

Square

Make 4 white, 9 delft blue & 12 light blue.

Row 1 (RS): Ch 30, [hdc, dc] in 3rd ch from hook (*sk chs count as first sc*), sk next 2 chs, [(sc, hdc, dc) in next ch, sk next 2 ch] 8 times, sc in last ch, turn. (28 sts)

Row 2: Ch 1 (*see Pattern Notes*), [hdc, dc] in first st, [sk next dc and hdc, [sc, hdc, dc] in next sc] across to last 3 sts, sk next dc and hdc, sc in top of ch-1, turn.

Rows 3–20: Rep row 2.

Edging

Rnd 1: Now working in rnds, ch 1, 3 sc in first st (*corner st*), sc in each st across, with 3 sc in last st (*corner st*), sc evenly across end of rows, 3 sc in next corner, sc in each st of

opposite side of foundation ch, 3 sc in corner, sc evenly across end of rows, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in first sc. Fasten off. (26 sc across top and bottom, 19 sc across each side, not counting corner sts)

Joining

Square Placement

Blanket rows 1, 3 and 5: delft blue, light blue, delft blue, light blue, delft blue.

Blanket rows 2 and 4: light blue, white, light blue, white, light blue.

Join Squares with light blue by placing Squares RS tog and working through **front lps** (*see Stitch Guide*) of Square closest and **back lps** (*see Stitch Guide*) of the Square farthest away, join in bottom corner st, sl st in each st across.

Join rows of Squares tog in same manner.

Blanket Edging

Rnd 1: Join white with sc in center corner sc in bottom corner, [sc in each of next 28 sc, **sc dec** (*see Stitch Guide*) in next 2 sc over joining of Squares] around outer edge, working sc dec in joining of squares. (494 sc, 16 sc dec)

Rnd 2: [Sc, hdc, dc] in first sc of rnd 1, sk next sc, *[(sc, hdc, dc) in next sc, sk each of next 2 sts] 9 times, (sc, hdc, dc) in next sc dec, sk next st, rep from * across, working (sc, hdc, dc) in corner sc, for side of Blanket, [sk next st, (sc, hdc, dc) in next sc] across to next corner sc, rep from * across last 2 sides. Sl st to join in first sc. Fasten off.

Appliqués

Star

Rnd 1: With gold, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around, join in beg sc. (10 sc)





Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next st, (hdc, dc, tr, dc, hdc) in next st] 5 times, join in first sc. (30 sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in each of next 2 sts, (sc, dc, sc) in next st, [sc in each of next 5 sts, (sc, dc, sc) in next st] 4 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, join in first sc. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.



Moon

Rnd 1: With pale yellow, ch 20, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, [hdc in each of next 4 sts, sk next st] twice, sc in each of next 3 sts, (sl st, ch 1, sl st) in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 3 sts, sk next st, [hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] twice, sk next st, [hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] twice, sk next st, sc in next 3 sts, sl st in same st as first sl st. (20 hdc, 12 sc, 4 sl sts, 1 ch-1 sp)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sl st in first sl st, sc in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, sk next st, sc in each of next 6 sts, [sl st, ch 1, sl st] in ch-1 sp at end, sc in each of next 3 sts, [hdc in each of next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st]

4 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, sl st in last st, leaving 8-inch length of yarn, fasten off. (18 sc, 16 hdc, 4 sl sts, 1 ch-1 sp)



Sun

Rnd 1: With bright yellow, ch 4, join in first ch to form a ring, **ch 3** (see Pattern Notes), 15 dc in ring, join in beg ch-3. (16 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in each st around, join in top of ch-3. (32 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] around, join in top of beg ch-3. (48 dc)

Rnd 4: [Ch 4, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch sl st in next 2 sts on rnd 3] around, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. When sewing Sun to Square, do not sew rays to Square, sew only rnd 3 to Square. (24 rays)



Rainbow

Row 1: With cherry red, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, **change**

color (see Stitch Guide) to pumpkin, fasten off cherry red, turn. (9 sc)

Rows 2–6: Ch 1, working in back lp of each st, sc in each of next 9 sc, change color to next color of Rainbow (color order: bright yellow, paddy green, delft blue, amethyst), leaving 6-inch length of yarn, fasten off.

Cloud

Rnd 1: With cloud yarn, ch 10, 3 dc in 4th ch from hook, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, 3 dc in next ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, 8 dc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, 3 dc in next ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, 4 dc in last ch, join in beg ch-3. (30 sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as sl st, 2 dc in next 2 sts, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next 6 sts, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in last 3 sts, join in beg ch-3, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (42 sts)

When sewing Cloud to Square, place on diagonal. Make sure to place and sew Rainbow first and then place and sew Cloud after.



Flower

Rnd 1: With pale yellow, ch 4, join to form a ring, ch 3, 14 dc in ring, change color to pale plum in last dc, join in beg ch-3. (15 dc)

Petal

Make 5.

Row 1: Now working in rows, ch 1, 2 sc in same beg ch-1, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7 sc)

Row 4: Rep row 2.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 3 sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (5 sc)

Row 6: Rep row 2.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc dec in next 2 sc, sc in next sc, sc dec in next 2 sc, turn. (3 sc)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc dec over 3 sc. Fasten off. (1 sc)

To make rem Petals, start by joining with sl st in next st on rnd 1. When last Petal is completed, **do not fasten off**.

Sl st in end of each row and each st around all of the Petals, join in first st, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.



Peekaboo Bear

Rnd 1: With buff fleck, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 4: Working in back lps, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (18 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 6: [Sc in each of next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 7: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 8: Sc in each of next 4 sc, [sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc] in front lp of next st (*ear*), sc in next 9 sc, [sc, hdc, 2 dc, hdc, sc] in front lp of next sc (*ear*), sc in next sc, sl st in next sc, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Muzzle

Rnds 1 & 2: Rep rnds 1 and 2 of Peekaboo Bear. (12 sc)

Rnd 3: Sc in each sc around, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Sew Muzzle to face over rnd 3, insert cotton ball before closing.

Paws

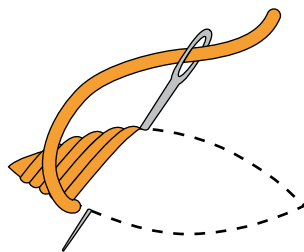

Rnd 1: With buff fleck, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

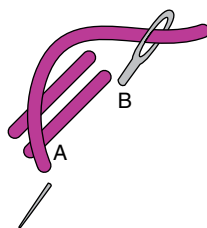

Rnd 3: Ch 3, [bobble (see Special Stitches) in ch-2 sp, ch 1] around, join in top of first bobble. (10 bobble sts)



Rnd 4: Ch 3, [bobble in top of bobble, ch 1, bobble in ch-1 sp, ch 1] around, join in top of first bobble, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. (20 bobbles)

Rnd 5: Join spring green in first bobble, ch 4, **6-tr pc** (see Special Stitches) in same st, ch 4, sl st in same st (*head*), ch 4, sl st in 3rd bobble from last 1 worked, ch 3, **3-dc pc** (see Special Stitches) in same st, ch 3, sl st in same st (*leg*), ch 6, sl st in 3rd bobble from last 1 worked, ch 3, 3-dc pc in same st, ch 3, sl st in same st (*leg*), ch 6, sl st in 4th bobble from last 1 worked, ch 3, sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, sl st in bobble (*tail*), ch 6, sl st in 4th bobble from last 1 worked, ch 3, 3-dc pc in same st, ch 3, sl st in same st (*leg*), ch 6, sl st in 3rd bobble from last 1 worked, ch 3, 3-dc pc in same st, ch 3, sl st in same st (*leg*), ch 4, sl st in first sl st. Fasten off.

Note: 3-dc pc sts are worked with black. Carry black behind cherry red on working rnd. Drop black in back until needed.

- Size 1/9/5.5mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge



GAUGE

Block = 5 inches square

PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning popcorn (beg pc): Ch 3 (see *Pattern Notes*), 3 dc in same place as beg ch-3, drop lp from hook, insert hook in top of beg ch-3, pull dropped lp through.

Popcorn (pc): 4 dc as indicated in instructions, drop lp from hook, insert hook in first dc of dc group, pull dropped lp through.

Picot: Ch 3, sl st in first ch.

Joining picot: Having completed Block to right of Block in progress and having RS up, ch 1, insert hook in corresponding picot of completed Block, yo, pull lp through, ch 1, sl st at base of first ch.

THROW

First Block

Rnd 1: Wrap yarn around 2 fingers of left hand leaving short end, ch 4 (*counts as first dc and ch-1*), dc in ring, (ch 1, dc) 10 times in ring, ch 1, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in 3rd ch of rem 4 chs of beg ch-5, gently pull on end to see which side is moving, pull on that end from opposite side to close ring. (12 dc, 12 ch sps)

Rnd 2: Sl st in first ch sp, **beg pc** (see *Special Stitches*) in same ch sp as sl st, ch 3, [**pc** (see *Special Stitches*) in next ch sp, ch 3] around, join in beg pc.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [(sc, ch 2, sc) in each of next 3 ch-3 sps, ch 3 (*corner*)] around, join in beg sc.

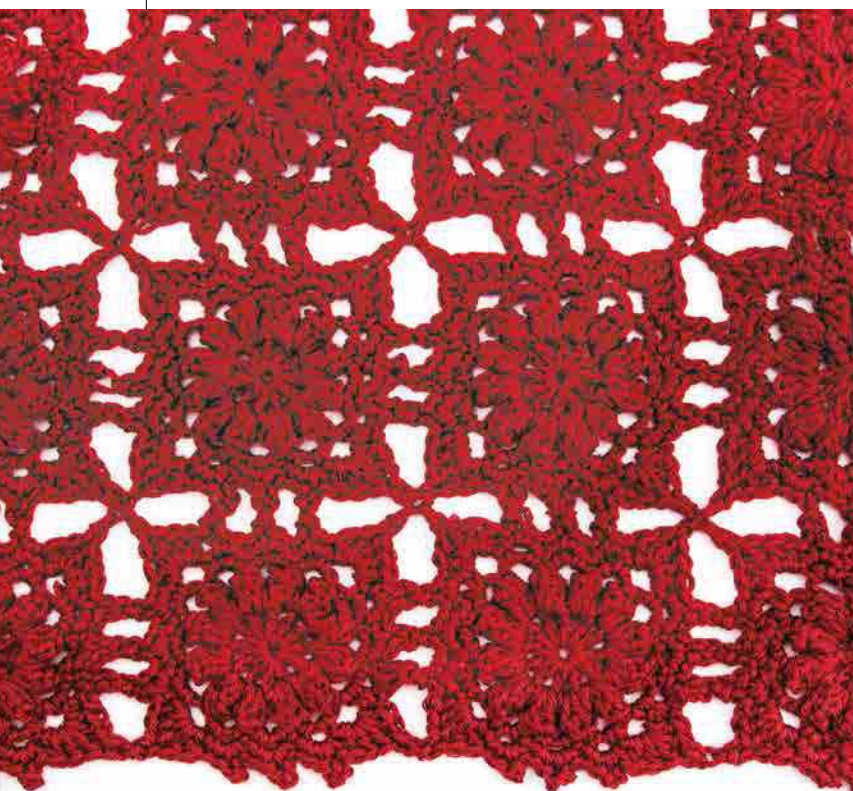
Rnd 4: Ch 1, (2 sc, **picot**—see *Special Stitches*, sc) in each of next ch-2 sp around with (3 dc, picot, 2 dc) in each corner ch-3 sp, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Joining Block

Rnds 1–3: Rep rnds 1–3 of First Block.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, (2 sc, picot, sc) in each of next 3 ch-2 sps, (3 dc, **joining picot**—see *Special Stitches*, 2 dc) in corner ch-3 sp, *(2 sc, joining picot, sc) in each of next 3 ch-2 sps, (3 dc, joining picot, 2 dc) in corner ch-3 sp, rep from * across number of sides to be joined, complete rnd same as rnd 4 of First Block, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Work 12 rows of 9 Blocks on each row, joining Blocks as they are worked. **C!**

- Size M/13/9mm Tunisian crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Size K/10½/6.5mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- 14-inch pillow form



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GAUGE

14 Tunisian sts = 4 inches; 13 Tunisian st rows = 4 inches

PATTERN NOTES

Pillow consists of Front and Back worked the same. Each has an inner 11-inch square of Tunisian crochet, followed by 1½-inch border of classic crochet. Front and Back are then joined with single crochet with wrong sides touching around 3 sides, pillow is inserted and fourth side is completed.

Tunisian crochet rows consist of 2 passes per row—pick up and work off or return pass.

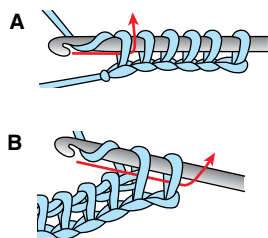

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 7, sk next st, sc in next st] 5 times, ch 3, dc in first st forming last ch sp. (6 ch sps)

Rnd 3: **Ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), 4 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-3, [ch 3, 5 dc in next ch-7 sp] around, ending with ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, 4 dc in same ch sp as beg ch-3, *ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3**, dc in each of next 5 dc, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.

Rnd 5: Ch 3, **dc dec** (see *Stitch Guide*) in next 4 sts, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice**, dc dec in next 5 sts, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 2, dc in top of first dc dec to form last ch sp.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] around, ending with ch 2, dc in beg sc forming last ch sp.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1,

*ch 3, **shell** (see *Special Stitch*) in next ch-5 sp**, [ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 8: With white, pull up lp in ch-3 sp to left of any shell, ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, *[ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] twice, ch 3, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch sp of next shell**, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, ch 1, join with dc in beg sc forming last ch sp.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, beg with sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, *[ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times, ch 3, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch sp of next shell, ch 3**, sc in next ch-3 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 10: With light sage, pull up lp in first ch-3 sp to left of any ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, shell in next ch sp, [sc in next ch sp, shell in next ch sp] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 11: With red, pull up lp in ch-2 sp at point of hex, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same ch sp as beg ch-1, *[ch 3, dc in next sc, ch 3, sc in ch sp on next shell] twice, ch 3, dc in next sc, ch 3**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch sp of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.

Rnd 12: Sl st in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same ch sp as beg ch-1, *[ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp] 6 times, ch 3**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 13: With white, rep row 10, **do not fasten off**.

Rnd 14: [Ch 3, (sl st, ch 3, sl st) in ch sp of next shell, ch 3, sl st in next sc] around, join in joining sl st of last rnd. Fasten off. **C!**

Finishing

Attach Lanyard hook near Cuff on side of Mitten farthest from thumb.

CHILD'S MITTENS

Make 2.

Preparation

Overlap elastic ends ½ inch, sew in place forming ring.

Cuff

Row 1: With size G hook and white, ch 7 [8], sl st in **back lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of 2nd ch from hook and in back lp of each ch across, turn. (6 [7] sl sts)

Row 2: Sl st in back lp of each sl st across, turn.

Rows 3–32 [3–35]: [Rep row 2] 30 [33] times. At end of last row, leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

Sew first and last rows tog.

Palm

Rnd 1 (RS): With size I hook, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) Easter surprise in end of row on Cuff, **working over elastic ring** (see *illustration*), sl st in end of each row on Cuff working last sl st in same sp as joining, **do not join** (see *Pattern Notes*), **mark first st** (see *Pattern Notes*). (32 [35] sl sts)

Rnd 2: Sl st in **front lp** (see *Stitch Guide*) of each sl st around.

Rnds 3–7 [3–9]: [Rep rnd 2] 5 [7] times.

Fingers

Rnd 1: Ch 2 [3] (*thumb crossing ch*), sk next 7 sts, sl st in front lp of each sl st around. (25 [28] sl sts, 2 [3] chs)

Rnd 2: Sl st in front lp of each of next 2 [3] crossing chs, sl st in front lp of each sl st around. (27 [31] sl sts)

Rnd 3: Sl st in front lp of each sl st around.

Rnds 4–11 [4–13]: [Rep rnd 3] 8 [10] times.

Rnd 12 [14]: Sl st in front lp of next 0 [1] sl st(s), *sl st in front lp of each of next 7 [8] sl sts, **sl st dec** (see *Special Stitch*), rep from * around. (24 [28] sl sts)

Rnd 13 [15]: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 14 [16]: *Sl st in front lp of each of next 4 [5] sl sts, sl st dec, rep from * around. (20 [24] sl sts)

Rnd 15 [17]: Rep rnd 3.

Rnd 16 [18]: *Sl st in front lp of each of next 2 [1] sl st(s), sl st dec, rep from * around. Leaving long end, fasten off. (15 [16] sl sts)

Weave long end through front lp of sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Thumb

Rnd 1 (RS): With size I hook and RS of Mitten



facing, join Easter surprise in front lp of first sl st on opening, sl st in front lp of each of next 6 sl sts, sl st in corner, sl st in each thumb crossing ch, sl st in corner, sl st in same sp as joining, **do not join**. (11 [12] sl sts)

Rnd 2: Sl st in front lp of each of first 6 sl sts, sl st dec, sl st in front lp of 0 [1] sl st(s), sl st dec, sl st in front lp of last sl st. (9 [10] sl sts)

Rnd 3: Sl st in front lp of each sl st around.

Rnds 4–6 [4–8]: [Rep rnd 3] 3 [5] times.

Rnd 7 [9]: Sl st in front lp of next 0 [1] sl st(s), [sl st in front lp of next sl st, sl st dec] around. Leaving long end, fasten off. (6 [7] sl sts)

Weave long end through front lp of sts on last rnd, pull tight to close. Secure end.

Finishing

A. Good question, because when you first learn how to crochet, you form habits and bad habits are difficult to change. Instead of making a chain to represent a half double or double crochet, there is a simple fix: When the last stitch of a row is completed, do not chain, simply pull up a loop and work into each stitch across in the stitch required. By making this good habit, your work will look more

professional around edges and seams by eliminating those annoying gaps.

Q. When beginning to crochet is it best to pull the yarn from the outside or inside of a skein? —*Janet A.*

A. It is really a matter of preference. Personally, I prefer to begin by pulling from the inside, so the skein is easier to control and is more likely

to stay in place. When the yarn is pulled from the outside, the skein has to turn around to unravel, and tends to be hard to wrangle as it often gets away from easy reach. Either way, make a habit of beginning each skein of the project the same way, especially yarns that are variegated, self-striping or otherwise patterned, to keep the color changes the same throughout. **C!**

Edging rnd: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ch 2, working in ends of rows, evenly sp 96 sc across, ch 2, working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, sc in each ch across, ch 2, working in ends of rows, evenly sp 96 sc across, ch 2, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Assembly

Working in last rnd of both Stole Section and Back Section, sk 77 sc, working through both thicknesses, join in ch-2 sp on Back and next st on Stole, sl st in each st across Back Section, sl st in next ch-2 sp. Fasten off.

Lace Border

Row 1: Working in 1 end of Stole Section, with RS facing, join in ch-2 sp, **ch 3** (see *Pattern Notes*), dc in each st across, turn. (50 dc)



Row 2: Ch 4 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next ch sp, [sc in next st, sc in next ch sp] twice, ch 3, sl st in top of last st just worked, *[sc in next st, sc in next ch sp] 4 times**, ch 3, sl st in top of last sc worked, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, [sc in next st, sc in next ch sp] twice, sc in turning ch, turn.

Row 4: With size G hook, sl st in each of first 2 sts, ch 3, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, [ch 8, sk next 7 sts, 3 dc in next st] across to last st, leaving last st unworked, turn.

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in

next st, 2 dc in next st, [ch 3, sc in next ch-8 sp, ch 3, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] across, turn.

Row 6: Ch 4 (counts as first tr), sk next st, cl (see *Special Stitch*) in next st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next 2 sts, cl in next st] across to last 2 sts, sk next st, tr in last st, turn. (7 cls)

Row 7: Sl st in first tr, sk next st, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, *[sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3] twice, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, rep from * across to last ch-5 sp, sc in last ch-5 sp, sk next st, sl st in last st, turn.

Row 8: Ch 5 (see *Pattern Notes*), sk next ch-3 sp, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st,

[ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, 2 dc in next st, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st] across to last ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk last ch-3 sp and next sc, dc in last sl st, turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp and next 2 sts, cl in next st, ch 4, sl st in top of cl just worked, ch 5, [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 4, sl st in 4th ch from hook, ch 1, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sk next 2 sts, cl in next st, ch 4, sl st in top of cl just worked, ch 5] across to last ch-5 sp, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch. Fasten off.

Rep Lace Border across rem end of Stole Section and across bottom edge of Back Section. **C!**

Row 8: [Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, *ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell**, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 4 times, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, ch 2, dc in last st, turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first st, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, *shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc**, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] 4 times, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 10: *[Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * across, [sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] twice, ch 2, dc in last st, turn.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in first st, *[ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * across, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 12: [Ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, *shell in next sc, sc in ch sp of next shell,

[ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, rep from * across, ending with ch 2, dc in last st, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, shell in next sc, *sc in ch sp of next shell, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 3 times, ch 5, sc in ch sp of next shell, shell in next sc, sc in next ch-5 sp**, shell in next sc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, ch 5, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2–13 consecutively] 8 times. At end of last row, do not turn.

Edging

Working around outer edge, in ends of rows, in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 and in sts, evenly sp [shell, ch 1, sc in next, ch 1] around, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of beg dc. Fasten off.

Steam-block. **C!**

Row 7: Sc in each sc across, sl st in next ext sc, turn. (18 [21, 23] sc)

Rnd 2: Ext sc in each ext sc, **changing colors** (see *Stitch Guide and Pattern Notes*) to fashion farn in last st, **join** (see *Pattern Notes*) in top of first ext sc.

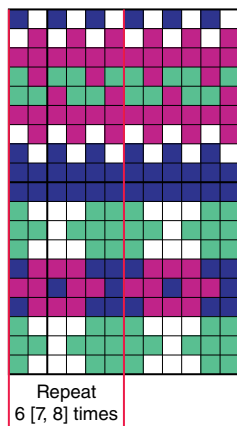
Rnds 3–21: Using Color Diagram, **working in back lps** (see *Pattern Notes*), sc in each st across changing colors as needed. At end of rnd 21, change to marine.

Rnds 22–24: Ext sc in each sc around. At end of last rnd, join in beg ext sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, (change color to black, **3-dc pc** (see *Special Stitches*), change color to cherry red, sc) in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] twice, sc in next st, (change color to black, **3-dc pc**, change color to cherry red, sc) in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st. (2 3-dc pc, 16 sc)

Rnd 4: [Sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (24 sc)

Rnd 5: [Sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (30 sc)

Rnd 6: *Sc in each of next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, [change color to black, **3-dc pc** in next st, change color to cherry red, sc in each of next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice, rep from * once. (4 3-dc pc, 32 sc)

Rnd 7: [Sc in each of next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] around. (42 sc)

Rnd 8: Sc in each st around, sl st in next st,

leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Head

Row 1: Join black in next to last st in rnd 8, 8 dc in next st of rnd 8, sl st in 3rd st of rnd 8, sl st in next st, turn. (2 sl sts, 8 dc)

Row 2: Working in sts of row 1, sk next sl st, 2 sc in each of next 3 dc, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 2 chs (*antenna*), 2 sc in each of next 2 dc, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 2 chs (*antenna*), 2 sc in each of next 3 dc, sl st in first sl st of row 1, leaving 8-inch length, fasten off. When sewing Ladybug to square, sew Head and body, leaving antennae free.

Butterfly

Body & Head

Rnd 1: With black, ch 10, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each of next 7 chs, (3 hdc in last ch, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next ch for antenna, hdc in same last ch of foundation ch, ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in next ch for antenna, 3 hdc in same last

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ch of foundation ch) (*head completed*), working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each of next 7 chs, sc in last ch, join in first sc. Leaving 8-inch length, fasten off.

Left Wing

Row 1: Join pumpkin in 2nd sc of rnd 1 with sc, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st, hdc in next st, 3 dc in each of next 2 sts, turn. (13 sts)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-2, dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, sc in last st, change color to black, turn. (17 sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 7 sts, sl st in next st, sc in each of next 9 sts. Fasten off.

Right Wing

Row 1: Working on opposite side of Body, join pumpkin in 2nd sc from Head in rnd 1, ch 3, 2 dc in same st, 3 dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next st, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next st, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, sc in next st, hdc in next st, 2 dc in next st, dc in each of next 4 sts, 2 dc in last st, change color to black, turn. (17 sts)

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of next 9 sts, sl st in next st, sc in each of next 7 sts. Fasten off.

When sewing Butterfly, sew Head and Body to Square, leaving antennae free. Tack center of each Wing, leaving remainder of Wing unsewn.

FINISHING APPLIQUÉS

Appliqués are sewn to center 9 Squares of Blanket, or as desired, following specific details for each Appliqué indicated. If no special instructions are indicated, sew entire Appliqué to Square. **C!**

Row 4:

A. With grey, TPS in next st, [TSS in next st, TPS in next st] across working last TSS under both strands;

B. with ocean, work lps off hook.

Row 5:

A. Sl 1 without working, with ocean, [TPS in next st, sl 1 without working] across to last st, TSS under both strands (*stop and look before working step B, if worked correctly you will alternate ocean and grey, beg and ending with ocean*);

B. with grey, work lps off hook.

Rows 6–35: [Rep rows 2–5 consecutively] 8 times, ending last rep with row 3.

Row 36:

A. Rep step A of row 4;

B. with ocean, work lps off hook to last 2 lps, with new ball of grey, yo, pull through last 2 lps. Fasten off ocean.

Row 37:

A. With grey, TSS in each st across;

B. with grey, work lps off hook.

Bind off: With grey, sl st as if to TSS in each st across, ending with sl st under both strands of last st.

First Side Edging

With size K hook, ch 2 (*does not count as first st*), hdc in end of each row across, hdc in first ch. Fasten off. (37 hdc)

2nd Side Edging

With RS facing, **join** (*see Pattern Notes*) in last ch of row 1, ch 2, hdc in end of each row across. Fasten off.

Final Edging

Rnd 1: Join ocean with sc in upper right corner, ch 2, sc in same st as joining sc (*corner*), sc in each st around with (sc, ch 2, sc) in each corner, making sure you have odd number of sc between ch-2 at corners, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Join grey with sc in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 2, sc in same ch sp as joining sc, *[ch 1, sk next st, sc in next st] across to next corner ch sp**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Join ocean with sc in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 2, sc in same ch sp as joining sc, *[ch 1, sk next st, working over ch-1, sc in next sk st on row before last] across to next corner ch sp**, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc.

Fasten off.

Rnd 4: With grey, rep rnd 3.

Rnds 5–8: [Rep rnds 3 and 4 alternately] twice. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Assembly

Hold Front and Back with WS tog, working through both thicknesses, join ocean with sc in any ch-2 sp, 2 sc in same ch sp as joining sc, sc in each st and in each sk st on row before last around 3 sides with 3 sc in each corner ch-2 sp, insert pillow form, continue working as before around last side, join in beg sc. Fasten off. **C!**

Projects using basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot mats, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within this skill category, as well as the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

1 2 3 4 5 6 INTERMEDIATE

Projects that incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing.
