## EDGIT

Fans of crocheted edgings will flip when they see the Edgit, a piercing crochet hook. This small steel crochet hook has a sharp point made for piercing woven fabric. While the instructions suggest sewing a machine zigzag stitch around the edge of the fabric to set the hole spacing, it is possible to either measure carefully or to "eyeball" the spacing, and dispense with the sewing machine. Use the small hook to pierce hemstitched fabric while you work a round of single crochet with crochet cotton or fingering-weight yarn; then use a regular hook to add additional rounds of decorative edging. You'll

## GAUGE GRABBER

Measuring gauge is not anybody's favorite part of crocheting, but it can be vitally important. An accurate gauge reading can be the difference between a sweater that fits and one that doesn't, or between having enough yarn for your project and running out of yarn. Gauge Grabber ${ }^{\mathrm{TM}}$ stickers from Susan Bates are a new tool to help you count stitches and rows within a 2 -inch ( 5 cm ) square. Just peel off the sticker, place it on your swatch, and then count the stitches and rows within the 2 -inch $(5 \mathrm{~cm})$ outline. There's even a spot for you to note yarn and hook size right on the sticker. It's available in both black print, for use on light yarns, and in pink print, for use on dark yarns.

Hat: Fits newborn to 13 -inch circumference
Blanket: $251 / 2$ inches from side to side; 281/2 inches from corner to corner

## MATERIALS

- Caron Simply Soft Light light (light worsted) weight acrylic


Mark first stitch of round. Move marker up with each round.

## HAT

## Pentagon

## Make 6.

(RS): With Riviera, ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, sl st in ring, ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), [3 dc in ring, ch 2 (corner)] 4 times, 2 dc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. ( $15 \mathrm{dc}, 5$ ch-2 corners)

## Hexagon

## Make 15 white \& 5 Riviera.

(RS): Ch 4, sl st in beg ch to form ring, sl st in ring, ch $5,[3 \mathrm{dc}$ in ring, ch 2 (corner)] 5 times,

2 dc in ring, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. ( 18 dc , 6 ch-2 corners)

## Half Hexagon

## Make 5.

(RS): With white, ch 4, sl st in beg ch to form ring, sl st in ring, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 3 dc in ring, [ch 2 (corner), 3 dc in ring] twice, dc in ring. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. (11dc, 2 ch-2 corners)

## Assembly

With RS facing, working through back Ips (see Stitch Guide) of each st, sew pieces tog according to Hat Assembly Diagram on page 12 or use a soccer ball for reference.



## Brim

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS facing, join white in ch-2 sp on Riviera hexagon, ch 1 , sc in same sp as joining, *sc in each of next 3 dc , scin next ch- 2 sp, sc in joining, 2 sc in side of next dc, sc in beg ch-4 of Half Hexagon, 2 sc in side of next dc, sc in joining**, sc in ch-2 sp of next Hexagon, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in front Ip (see Stitch Guide) of beg sc. (60 sc)
Rnds 2-8: SI st in front Ip of each st around, do not join. At end of last rnd, fasten off.
Allow Brim to naturally curl up. Tack Brim in place if desired.

## BLANKET

## Hexagon

## Make 24 white \& 13 Riviera.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, sl st in ring, ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), [3 dc in ring, ch 2 (corner)] 5 times, 2 dc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-5. (18 dc, 6 ch- 2 corners)
Rnd 2: SI st in ch-2 corner, ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in same corner sp, ${ }^{\text {* ffpdc (see }}$ Stitch Guide) around next st, bpdc (see Stitch Guide) around next st, fpdc around next st**, (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in next ch-2 corner sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-4. (30 sts, 6 ch-2 corners)
Rnd 3: SI st in ch-2 corner, ch 4, hdc in same corner sp, *[bpdc around next st, fpdc around next st] across to last st before next ch- 2 corner, bpdc around last st**, (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in ch-2 corner sp, rep from * around, ending last

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rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-4. (42 sts, 6 ch-2 corners)
Rnd 4: SI st in ch-2 corner, ch 4, hdc in same corner sp, *[fpdc around next st, bpdc around next st] across to last st before next ch-2 corner, fpdc around last st**, (hdc, ch 2, hdc) in ch-2 corner sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-4. (54 sts, 6 ch-2 corners)

Rnds 5 \& 6: Rep rnds 3 and 4. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off at end of last rnd. (78 sts, 6 ch-2 corners at end of last rnd)

## Assembly

With RS facing, working through back Ips (see Stitch Guide) of each st, sew pieces tog according to Blanket Assembly Diagram or use a soccer ball for reference.

## Edging

Rnd 1 (RS): With RS facing, working in back Ips only, join white in first hdc on Riviera straight side, ${ }^{*}$ sl st in each st across Riviera

straight side to ch-2 corner, sl st in each of next 2 chs, ${ }^{* *}$ sl st in next st, sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, hdc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, [dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] twice, [tr dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] twice, at join dtr dec (see Stitch Guide) in ch corner on current Hexagon and

ch corner on next Hexagon, [tr dec in next 2 sts] twice, [dc dec in next 2 sts] twice, hdc dec in next 2 sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, sl st in next $s t$, $s l$ st in each of next 2 corner chs, rep from ** to next Riviera straight side, rep from * around, join in front Ip (see Stitch Guide) of beg st, do not turn. (395 sts)
Rnds 2-8: SI st in front Ip of each st around, do not join (see Pattern Notes). At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Allow Edging to naturally curl up. Tack in place if desired.

One size fits most

## MATERIALS

- Elastic beading thread:

5 yds silver

- Size $D / 3 / 3.25 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Darice Mix and Mingle metal-lined glass beads:
7 large aqua and white mix


## GAUGE

$9 \mathrm{sc}=1$ inch, unstretched

## PATTERN NOTE

Because of the nature of crocheting with elastic, begin with numbers in pattern and check after completing row 1 for fit. If you want a smaller or tighter bracelet, decrease number of stitches. If you want a larger or looser bracelet, add more stitches.

## BRACELET

Row 1: Ch 51, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (50 sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1 , sl st in each st across. Leaving 4 -inch end, fasten off.

## Finishing

Thread 7 beads onto Bracelet.
Bracelet should have slight curl to 1 side.
Carefully slide beads in place as desired, making sure elastic consistently curls in 1 direction all the way around.

Do not pull hard on bracelet as it will stretch out of shape.
Using 4-inch end, sew ends tog. C!

## CHAIN-LINK SHAWL

DESIGN BY KATHLEEN VAN HORN FOR SUNRISE YARNS

## USING TWO BEAUTIFUL, COMPLEMENTARY YARNS, A LAYERED-CHAIN EFFECT IS CREATED WHEN THE CHAINS WORKED IN THE SECOND YARN ARE OVERLAID AND WOVEN INTO CHAINS WORKED IN THE FIRST YARN.

## (1) (2) 4) 56 easr

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS
70 inches wide $x 16$ inches long

## MATERIALS

- Sunrise Diakeito DiaCosta Nuova (CSN) light (DK) weight rayon/acrylic yarn ( $11 / 20 z$ oz $148 \mathrm{yds} / 40 \mathrm{~g}$ per ball):
3 balls \#107 purple core with red/ green strands (MC)
- Sunrise Diakeito Masterseed Cotton Lily (MSY) light (DK) weight cotton tape yarn (116 yds per ball):
3 balls \#607 purple (CC)
- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook


## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

This layered Shawl is worked from the center back with main color (MC) down 1 side and then worked from the center back down the other side. The contrasting color (CC) is overlaid and woven into the main-color chain, working the front center down 1 side and then working from the center back down the other side.
Chain-7 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet and chain-3 at corner unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SHAWL

## Step 1

Row 1: With MC, ch 81, sc in first ch from hook, [ch 7, sk next 4 chs, sc in next ch] across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 7 (see Pattern Notes), [sc in next ch-7 sp, ch 7] across to last ch-7 sp, ch 3, tr in last st forming last ch sp, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in last tr, [ch 7, sc in next ch-7 sp] across, ending with tr in last ch-3 sp, turn.
Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 31 times. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Step 2

Row 1: Join MC with sc in first ch on opposite side of row 1 of Step 1, [ch 7, sk next 4 chs, sc in next ch] across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep rows 2 and 3 of Step 1 alternately] 32 times in opposite direction. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Step 3

Getting started: Join CC in center of ch-3 at end of row 1 of MC as shown on Diagram 1 (see page 76).
Row 1: Ch 3, sc in ch-5 sp of starting ch on row 1 of Step 1, [ch 7, sc in next ch-5 sp] across, turn ch mesh.

# HOW TO INCREASE IN DELTA LACE CROCHET <br> BY KAREN RATTO-WHOOLEY 

## DELTA MEANS "TRIANGLE,"WHICH APTLY DESCRIBES THE LOOK OF THIS LOVELY OPENWORK PATTERN. FOLLOW OUR EASY STEPS TO ADD FLEXIBILITY TO DELTA LACE WITH TWO TYPES OF INCREASES.

If you haven't worked with delta crochet in the past, let me give you a quick definition. Delta is another word for "triangle." For example, the Greek letter, delta, is $\Delta$. A river delta has a triangular shape. So when we talk about delta crochet, we are talking about fabric that is made from openwork triangles.

If you have a copy of my book Learn to Delta Lace Crochet, published by Annie's in 2010, you will notice that there is only one pattern in there that has any increases at all, but I really don't mention it at all in the how-to portion. In this article I am going to explain two ways of increasing in delta lace: by increasing on the edges to make a triangle-shape piece or by increasing in the middle of a row, such as I do in the Delta Lace Topper in the book.

## INCREASING TO CREATE A TRIANGULAR SHAPE

Increasing on the edges of a piece is actually much easier than it sounds! All it takes is to create an extra triangle at the beginning of each row. In the example below we will be using double treble crochet (dtr), but this can be easily modified to work with double crochet (dc) and treble crochet ( tr ) as well.
Row 1: Ch 11 (counts as first dtr and ch-5 sp), dtr in 11th ch from hook, turn. (1 ch-5 sp) (See Photo A)
Note: Ch 10 turning ch counts as dtr and ch-5 sp now and throughout pattern.
Row 2: Ch 10 , tr in first dtr, (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in 5th ch of turning ch, turn. (2 ch-5 sps) (See Photo B)
Row 3-desired length: Ch 10, dtr in first dtr, [sk next dtr, (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in next dtr] across to turning ch, (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in 5th ch of turning ch, turn. (3 ch-5 sps) (See Photo C)



At this point, all you have to do is repeat row 3 as many times as you need to create the size triangle you need. In the photo below, I have repeated row 3 twice to get a total of five rows with five chain- 5 spaces in that row.
(See Photo D)

## INCREASING IN THE MIDDLE OF THE ROW

Increasing in the middle of a row works best when you are trying to make a point that shows up in the fabric. It is great for flounces or to create an A-line shape. It works really well when working in the round. In the sample instructions below, I am using treble crochet (tr) stitches, but you can easily modify for double crochet (dc) or taller stitches.
Row 1: Ch 29, tri in 9th ch from hook, [sk next 4 chs , trin next ch, sk 4 chs, (tr, ch 4, tr) in next st] across to end, turn. ( $6 \mathrm{ch}-4 \mathrm{sps}$ )
Row 2: Ch 8, tr in first tr, sk next tr, (tr, ch 4, tr) in next tr, sk next tr, (tr, ch 4, $2 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 4$, tr ) in next tr (inc made), [sk next tr, (tr, ch 4, tr) in next tr] across to turning ch, (tr, ch 4, tr) in 4th ch of turning ch, turn. (7 ch-4 sps) (See Photo E)
Row 3: Ch 8, tr in first tr, [sk next tr, (tr, ch 4, tr) in next tr] 3 times, sk next $\operatorname{tr}$, ( tr , ch 4, 2 tr , ch 4, tr) in next tr (inc made), [sk next tr, (tr, ch 4, tr ) in next tr across to turning ch , ( $\mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 4, \mathrm{tr}$ ) in 4th ch of turning ch, turn. (9 ch-4 sps) (See Photo F)
 From this point forward you will keep increasing in the increase of the previous row where the two trebles are in the middle of the increase.

As you can see, increasing in delta lace crochet is very easy! Once you know where the increases need to be, you can visually keep the increases going without using a pattern. I hope that you will start to play with delta lace crochet and use the increases that you learned in this article.I would love to see what you come up with! C!

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS
45 inches wide x 30 inches long, excluding edging

## MATERIALS

- Prism Yarns Bon Bon medium (worsted) weight rayon yarn (2 oz/88 yds/57g per hank): 4 hanks sunrise
- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

4122 pattern reps $=4$ inches; 3 pattern rows
$=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Chain-10 at beginning of row counts as first double treble crochet and chain-5 unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SHAWL

Row 1: Ch 11, dtr (see Stitch Guide) in 11th ch from hook (first 10 chs count as first dtr and ch-5), turn. (1 ch-5 sp)

Row 2: Ch 10 (see Pattern Notes), dtr in first dtr, (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in 5th ch of turning ch, turn. (2 ch-5 sps)

Row 3: Ch 10, dtr in first dtr [sk next dtr, (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in next dtr] across, ending with (dtr, ch 5, dtr) in 5th ch of turning ch, turn. (3 ch-5 sps)

Rows 4-29: Rep row 3. At end of last row, do not turn or fasten off. (29 ch-5 sps at end of last row)

## Edging

Working in ends of rows down side, ( $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{hdc}$, dc, 3 tr , dc, hdc, sc) in end of each of next 28 rows, (sc, hdc, dc, $3 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc}$, hdc, $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{hdc} \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in tip, (sc, hdc, dc, 3 tr, dc, hdc, sc) in end of each of next 28 rows, working in sts across row 29, sc in each ch and in each dtr across, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

## FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Bust: 37 inches (small) [ $411 / 2$ inches (medium), 47¼ inches (large), 49 inches (X-large), $541 / 2$ inches ( $2 X$-large), $581 / 2$ inches ( $3 X$-large), $623 / 4$ inches (4X-large), 65½ inches (5X-large)]

## MATERIALS

- Omega Fontana light (DK) weight cotton yarn ( $3 ½ 0 z$ / $219 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):
$7[7,8,8,9,9,10,10]$ skeins \#622 beige
- Size F/5/3.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- $11 / 4$-inch button


## GAUGE

$17 \mathrm{dc}=4$ inches; 8 rows $=4$ inches
Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Cluster (cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 4 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.
Shell: 6 dc as indicated in instructions.

## CARDI

## Back

Row 1: Ch 83 [89, 101, 113, 119, 125, 131, 143], dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs count as first $d c$ ) and in each ch across, turn.
( 81 [87, 99, 111, 117, 123, 129, 141] dc)
Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 2 dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, cl (see Special Stitches) in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc] across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each dc, in each ch-1 sp and in each cl across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), [sk next dc, dc in next dc, ch 1] across, ending with dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Row 5: Ch 4, [sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, ch 1] across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in each st and in each ch-1 sp across, turn.

Next rows: [Rep rows 2-6 consecutively] 6 times.

Next rows: Rep rows 2-5.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: SI st in each of first 7 [7, 9, 11, 15, 15, 17, 17] sts, ch 3, work in established pattern across, leaving last $6[6,8,10,14,14,16,16]$ sts unworked, turn. ( 69 [75, 83, 91, 89, 95, 97, 109] sts)

## Sizes Small, Medium \& Large Only

Next rows: Work even in established pattern and at same time, dec 1 st at each end of every row $3[4,5]$ times, then work even until CONTINUED ON PAGE 77

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch 3, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , [V-st in ch sp of next V-st, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc] across, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in top of turning ch, turn.
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , [V-st in ch sp of next V-st, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc] across, ending with 2 dc in top of turning ch, turn.

## Sizes Medium, Large, X-Large \& 2X-Large Only

Row [1]: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next 2 sc , [3 dc in next sc, sk next 2 sc, V-st (see Special Stitches), sk next 2 $\mathrm{sc}]$ across to last $\mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in last sc , turn.
Row [2]: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch 3, [V-st in ch sp of next V-st, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next $\mathrm{dc}]$ across, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in top of turning ch, turn.

Row [3]: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{V}$-st in ch sp of next V-st, [sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc , $V$-st in ch sp of next V-st] across, ending with 2 dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Rows [61 \& 62]: Rep rows 7 and 8 .
Rows [63-65]: Rep rows 11-13.

## Size 2X-Large Only

Rows [61-63]: Rep rows 7-9.
Rows [64 \& 65]: Rep rows 11 and 12.

Row 4: Ch 3, dc in each dc across to last 2 dc , dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. ( 33 [36, 42, 49, 55] sc)
Rows 5 \& 6: Rep rows 3 and 4 . ( 31 [ 34,40 , 47, 53] sc at end of last row)

Rows 7-12: [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 3 times. ( 25 [28, 34, 41, 47] sc at end of last row)
Rows 13-21: Rep rows 3-11. (16 [19, 25, 32, 38] sc at end of last row)

## Left Front Neck Shaping

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (36 [39, 45, 52, 58] sc)
Row 2: Ch $1, \mathrm{sc}$ dec in first $2 \mathrm{sts}, \mathrm{sc}$ in each sc across, turn. (35 [38, 44, 51, 57] sc)
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each de across to last 2 sts, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. ( 34 [37, 43, 50, 56] sc)
Row 4: Ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$ dec in first 2 sts , dc in each sc across, turn. (33 [36, 42, 49, 55] sc)

Rows 5 \& 6: Rep rows 3 and 4. (31 [34, 40, 47, 53] sc at end of last row)
Rows 7-12: [Rep rows 1 and 2 alternately] 3 times. (25 [28, 34, 41, 47] sc at end of last row)

Rows 13-21: Rep rows 3-11. (16 [19, 25, 32, 38] sc at end of last row)

## Sizes Small \& Medium Only

Row 22: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

## Size Large Only

Row [22]: Rep row 2. ([24] sc)
Rows [23 \& 24]: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Size X-Large Only

Row [22]: Rep row 2. ([31] sc)

Sweater is worked in 1 piece from Front bottom edge to Back bottom edge. Then sides and underarms are single crocheted together to finish.

Chain-3 counts as 1 single crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## PATTERN ROWS

Chain Lace Row: Sc in first st, [ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see

Pattern Notes), sk next st, sc in next st] across.

Row 4: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), dtr (see Stitch Guide) in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ending with last sc in turning ch, turn.
Row 6: Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 7: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn. (63 [69, 75, 81, 87, 93] sc)

Rows 8-23: [Rep rows 4-7 consecutively for pattern] 4 times.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: SI st in each of first $11[13,15,17,19$, 21] sts, ch 4, dtr in each st across, leaving last 10 [12, 14, 16, 18, 20] sts unworked, turn. (43 [45, 47, 49, 51, 53] dtr)

Rows 2-16: Work in established pattern, ending with row 7.

## First Shoulder Shaping

Row 1: Ch 4, dtr in each of first 14 sts for all sizes, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.
2nd Shoulder Shaping

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn. ( 31 [37, 43, 49, 55, 61] sc)
Rows 8-11: Rep rows 4-7 for pattern.
Rows 12-14: Rep rows 4-6.

between next 2 dc$] 3[5,7]$ times, ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, 2 dc between first and $2 \mathrm{nd} \mathrm{dc}, 2$ dc between 2 nd and $3 \mathrm{rd} \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ between 3rd and 4th dc ;
Back: work same as first sleeve;
2nd sleeve: work same as first sleeve;
2nd front: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 12[12,12]$ times, ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between last dc and turning ch, dc in turning ch, turn.

First sleeve: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 3[5,7]$ times, ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, 2 dc between first and 2 nd dc , ch 1, 2 dc between 3rd and 4th dc, ch 1, 2 dc between 5 th and 6th dc;

Back: work same as first sleeve;

First front: Ch 3, sk next ch-4 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc , [ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 11$ [11, 11] times, ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp, in raglan seam, [2 dc between next 2 dc, ch 3] twice, 2 dc between next 2 dc ;
First sleeve: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 3[5,7]$ times, ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, [ 2 dc between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 3$ ] twice, 2 dc between next 2 dc ;
Back: work same as first sleeve;
2nd sleeve: work same as first sleeve;

First front: Ch 2, sk next ch-3 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc , [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 11[11,11]$ times, ch 5 , sk next ch- 5 sp , in raglan seam, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 4] twice, 2 dc between next 2 dc ;

First sleeve: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 3[5,7]$ times, ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, [ 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 4] twice, 2 dc between next 2 dc ;
Back: work same as first sleeve;
2nd sleeve: work same as first sleeve;

First sleeve: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 3[5,7]$ times, ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] twice, 2 dc between next 2 dc ;

Back: work same as first sleeve;
2nd sleeve: work same as first sleeve;
2nd front: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 12$ [12, 12] times, ch 1 , sk next ch-2 sp, 2 dc between last dc and turning ch, dc in turning ch, turn.
Row 8: Ch 3, 2 dc between first and 2nd dc, continue as follows:

First sleeve: [ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, 2 dc between next 2 dc$] 5[7,9]$ times, ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp, working in raglan seam, work 4 dc between next 2 dc ;

Back: work same as first sleeve;

2nd sleeve: work same as first sleeve;
2nd front: ch 5, sk next ch-5 sp, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp] 12 [12, 12] times, ending with 2 dc between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ between last dc and turning ch, dc in turning ch, turn.
Row 9: Ch 3, 2 dc between first and 2nd dc, sk next $2 \mathrm{dc}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ between next 2 dc , continue as follows:

Rnd 3: Beg shell (see Special Stitches) in first st, *ch 1 , sc in next ch-5 sp, ch $1^{* *}$, shell (see Special Stitches) in next sc, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch3. ( 6 sc, 6 shells, 12 ch- 1 sps)

Rnd 4: Ch 1 , sc in first st, *sc in next st, (sc, ch $5, s c$ ) in next $s t, s c$ in each of next 2 sts,

18 inches wide $x 11$ inches tall, excluding strap

## MATERIALS

- Plymouth Covington medium (worsted) weight cotton yarn
( $31 / 20 z / 184 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):

1 skein \#2002 sand

- Embroidery thread:

1 yd each green, blue and gold

- Size $\mathrm{H} / 8 / 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Embroidery needle
- Sewing needle
- Pair of jeans
- Seam sealer (optional)


## GAUGE

$14 \mathrm{sc}=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Sample bag is made from 1 leg and waistband of size 14 jeans.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCH

Cluster (cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## BAG

## Cutting

Cut jeans into 15 size 4 x 4-inch squares. Also cut out strip of jeans that is $3 \times 30$ inches. You can add seam sealer to all edges, but it is not necessary.
Cut off waistband for shoulder strap. The size of jeans used will affect length of shoulder strap

## Blanket-Stitch Edges

Cut yarn into 15 strands each 1 yd long. Divide each of these strands into 3 plies; this will be embroidery thread for the blanket stitches.
With 1 of the 3-ply strands, thread embroidery needle and work 9 blanket stitches (see illustration) on each side of the jean square and make 1 corner st in each corner for total of 12 sps between the sts.



Use 2 of the 1 -yd strands for 1 square. Rep for all of the squares.
For the $3 \times 30$-inch strip you will make 72 blanket stitches on the long sides and 8 blanket stitches on the short sides.

## Crochet Edging

Sc rnd: Join (see Pattern Notes) full yarn strand from skein in first blanket stitch, 2 sc in same st , sc in each of next 10 blanket stitches, 2 sc in the next blanket stitch starting corner, [2 sc in next blanket stitch, sc in each of next 10
blanket sts, 2 sc in the next blanket stitch] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.
Work sc rnd around each square.

## Assembly

Make 2 panels. There is a panel of 6 squares for front and a panel of 9 squares for back and flap.

## Front

With 2 squares and WS tog, working through both squares, join in corner sc, sc in each of next 13 sts, continue to connect the next 2 squares with 14 sc . Fasten off.
Rep to combine last 2 squares so there is a 2 x 3 panel of squares.
Fold panel in half WS tog to make a 3-square panel, working in both squares at beg corner sc, join and evenly sp 42 sc across all 3 squares. Fasten off.

## Back \& Flap

Rep Front, making a $3 \times 3$ panel of squares.

## Gusset

Join in corner sp of long side of $3 \times 30$-inch strip, 2 sc in same sp, sc in each of next 70 sps across, 2 sc in each of next 2 sps, sc in each of next $6 \mathrm{sps}, 2$ sc in each of next 2 sps , sc in each of next 70 sps, 2 sc in each of next 2 sps , sc in each of next $6 \mathrm{sps}, 2$ sc in last sp, join in first $s c$. Do not fasten off.

## Bag Assembly

Place Front and Gusset WS tog, working in both pieces, sc in each sc around Front, sc in each of next 8 sc on Gusset, place Back so first square is sk for Flap, sc in 2nd square, with WS tog, work through both squares, Sc in each sc around the $3 \times 3$ panel for 72 more sts, sc in each of last 8 sc of Gusset, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Flap Edging

Row 1: With RS facing, join in first corner st, sc in same st, sc in each of next 41 sc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 5 sc , [sk next 2 sc , ch 3 , sc in each of next 4 sc$] 5$ times, sk next 2 sc , ch 3 , sc in each of last 5 sc , turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 3 sc , ch 2, [(cl—see Special Stitch, \{ch 2, cl\} twice, ch 2)

Row 3: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sk next dc of next dc group, dc in each of next 3 dc ] across, ch 3 , (dc, ch $2, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, sk next dc of next dc group, dc in next dc] across, ch 2, sc in last ch-3 sp, ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next sc and next 2 ch sps, [(dc, ch 2, dc) in next dc, ch 3, sk next sc and next 2 ch sps] across, ending with ( $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in last ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.
Rows 6-9: Rep rows 2-5.
Row 10: Rep row 2.
Row 11: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, [tr in next sc, ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in center dc , ch 2] across, tr in next sc , ch 1 , ( dc , ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.
Row 12: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sc in next tr, ch 3, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next ch-2 sp] across, ch 3, sc in next tr, ch 3, ( $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 2, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in last ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.

Row 13: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, [tr in next sc, ch 2, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 2] across, tr in last sc, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in last ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.
Row 14: Ch 3, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sk next 2 ch sps, [(dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch sp, ch 3, sk next 2 ch sps] across, ending with (dc, ch 2, dc) in last ch-2 sp, dc in last st, turn.
Rows 15-92: [Rep rows 2-14 consecutively] 6 times.
Row 93: Rep row 2. Fasten off.

## Edging

Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, join (see Pattern Notes) in first ch, ch $3,[(d c, c h 2, d c)$ in next ch, ch 1 , sc in next ch-3 sp, ch $1,5 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch] across, ch 1, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, (dc, ch 2, dc) in next ch, dc in last ch. Fasten off.
Block to measurements. C!

## GAUGE

Swatch: 3 inches wide $\times 2$ inches high, slightly stretched.
Row 1: Ch 37, double petal (see Special Stitches) in 12th ch from hook, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, ch 5 , sk next 4 chs , sc in next ch, ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 4 chs, double petal in next ch, ch 3, sk next 4 chs, dc in last ch, turn.
Row 2: Ch 6, *sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp between petals, ch 3 , sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next dc*, 4-petals (see Special Stitches), dc in next dc, ch 3, rep between *. Fasten off. Take time to check gauge.

## PATTERN NOTES

Filet panels consist of short rows, just a bit shorter than normal rows, with taller stitches at bottom and shorter stitches at top. The top of each group of short rows is slip stitched to same stitch as indicated in instructions. The heights of stitches are varied slightly from 1 row to the next so that shaping is gradual.
When working 4-petals stitch, work under top 2 loops of indicated chain. For the 4th petal of group, you will see the "eye" form after completing 3rd petal and making 1 chain. As instructed, make 3 more chains and complete 4th petal.
Check length of Poncho at end of row to be sure you are meeting gauge. It should be $101 / 2$ inches when slightly stretched.

Chain-6 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-3 unless otherwise stated.

Chain-8 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-5 unless otherwise stated.
Chain-7 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and start of next 4-petals unless otherwise stated.

Chain-9 at beginning of row counts as first double treble crochet and chain-4 unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Double petal: *Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all sts on hook, ch 3, rep between * in same st as beg 3 tr , yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 3.

4-petals: Ch 4, holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 tr in last dc made, ${ }^{* * * y o, ~ p u l l ~}$ through all Ips on hook, [holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 tr in 3rd ch of next ch-5] twice, yo, pull through all lps on hook, ch 4, holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 tr in eye of flower, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## PONCHO

Row 1: Ch 77 [77], double petal (see Special Stitches) in 12th ch from hook, *sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch**, ch 5, sk next 4 chs, sc in next ch, ch 5, sk next 4 chs, dc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 4 chs, double petal in next ch, rep from ${ }^{*}$ across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, turn. ( $31 / 2$ pattern reps)
Row 2: Ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), *sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp between 2 petals, ch $3^{* *}$, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next dc, 4-petals (see Special Stitches), dc in next dc, ch 3, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sk next 3 chs, dc in last st, turn.
Row 3: Ch 8 (see Pattern Notes), *sc in next sc , ch $5^{* *}$, dc in next dc, ch 3, double petal in next eye, dc in next dc , ch 5 , rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, dc in 3 rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 4: Ch 7 (see Pattern Notes), holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 tr in 3rd ch of beg ch-7 just made, work rem 3 petals of 4-petals beg at ${ }^{* * *}$ (see 4-petals in Special Stitches), [dc in next dc, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, dc in next dc, 4-petals] across, dc in 3 rd ch of turning ch, turn.

## Size Large/X-Large Only

Row [5]: Ch 6, *double petal in next eye**, $d c$ in next dc, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, dc in


next dc, ch 3, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, dc in turning ch, turn.
Rows [6-8]: Rep rows 2-4.
Both Sizes
Row 5 [9] (short row): Ch 9 (see Pattern Notes), dtr (see Stitch Guide) in next eye, ch

4, dtr in next dc, ch 4, tr in next sc, ch 4, tr in next dc, ch 4, tr in next eye, ch 4, dc in next dc , ch 4, dc in next sc, ch 4, dc in next dc, ch 4, hdc in next eye, ch 4, hdc in next dc, ch 4, hdc in next sc, ch 4, sl st in top of next dc, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 6 [10] (short row): [Ch 4, sk next 4 chs, hdc in next st] 4 times, [ch 4 , sk next 4 chs, dc in next st] 3 times, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, tr in next st] 3 times, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, dtr in next st] across, ending with last dtr in 5th ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 7 [11] (short row): Ch 9, sk next 4 chs, dtr in next st, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, dtr in next st] twice, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, tr in next st] 3 times, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, dc in next st] 3 times, [ch 4, sk next 4 chs, hdc in next st] 3 times, ch 4, sl st in top of same dc as end of row 5, turn.
Row 8 [12]: Rep row 6 [10].
Row 9 [13]: Ch 6, double petal in next dtr, dc in next dtr, ch 5, sc in next tr, ch 5, dc in next tr, ch 3, double petal in next tr, dc in next dc, ch 5, sc in next dc, ch 5, dc in next dc, ch 3, double petal in next hdc, dc in next hdc, ch 5 , sc in next hdc, ch 5 , dc in same dc as end of rows 5 and 7, ch 3, working in worked sts of row 4 [8], double petal in next eye, dc in same st as petal, turn.
Rows 10-12 [14-16]: Rep rows 2-4.
Row 13 [17]: Ch 6, *double petal in next eye ${ }^{* *}$, dc in next dc, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, dc in next dc, ch 3, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, dc in turning ch, turn.
Rows 14-16 [18-20]: Rep rows 2-4.

## Size Small/Medium Only

Rows 17-89: [Rep rows 5-16 consecutively] 6 times.
Rows 90-96: Rep rows 5-11.

## Size Large/X-Large Only

Rows [21-24]: Rep rows [9-12].
Rows [25-28]: Rep rows [13-16].
Rows [29-32]: Rep rows 5-8.
Rows [33-56]: [Rep last 12 rows] twice.
Rows [57-60]: Rep rows 9-12.
Rows [61-68]: Beg with row 13, work in floral pattern.


Rows [69-108]: Rep rows 21-60.
Rows [109-116]: Beg with row 13, continue in floral pattern.

## Both Sizes

Last row: Connect to first row as you work, ch 3 , sl st in 3rd ch at top of Poncho, *3 petals of 4 petals, sl st in base ch of 2 petals, work 4th petal of 4 petals, $d c$ in next $d c$, $s l s t$ in base ch of next dc, ch 3, sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp , sl st in base ch of next $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{ch} 3, \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc**, sl st in base ch of next dc, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, sk next 3 chs on opposite edge, sl st in next ch. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Block Poncho by spritzing it to dampen, then pin to desired measurement and let dry.

## Shoulder Straps

Getting started: Shoulder Straps are longer on 1 side than the other to account for shoulder slope. Be sure when you work last row of each Strap that Strap does not twist. Adjust lengths of Straps as necessary by adding or subtracting reps of row 2.

## First Strap

Row 1: Count 5 rows from last row of Poncho and place marker, count 5 rows from first row of Poncho and join (see Pattern Notes), this should be at right edge of flower at ch-3 that extends from petal, ch 6, dc in side of next petal , ch 3 , dc in side of next ch-3 extending from flower, leaving rem rows unworked, turn.
Rows 2 \& 3: Ch 6, dc in next dc, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 4: Ch 6, dc in next dc, ch 3, tr in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 5: Ch 7, dc in next dc, ch 3, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Row 6: Ch 6, dc in next dc, dc in 4th ch of turning ch, turn.

Rows 7 \& 8: Rep row 2.
Row 9: Ch 3, sl st to marker, sl st across to next 2 chs on Poncho, dc in next ch on Strap, sl st across to next 2 chs on Poncho, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, sl st across to next dc on Poncho. Fasten off.

## 2nd Strap

Getting started: The seam is at right side of garment and will run along upper arm. On front of Poncho, count 6 flowers over from First Strap and join at corresponding spot where first Strap begs at right edge of flower. Place marker on corresponding spot on back.
Rows 1-3: Rep rows 1-3 of First Strap.
Row 4: Ch 7 (counts as first tr and ch-3), dc in next dc , ch 3, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.
Row 5: Ch 6, dc in next dc, ch 3, tr in 4th ch of turning ch, turn.
Rows 6-8: Rep row 2 of First Strap.
Row 9: Ch 3, sl st to marker, sl st across to next 2 chs on Poncho, dc in next dc on Strap, sl st across to next 2 chs on Poncho, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, sl st across to next dc on Poncho. Fasten off.

## 3rd \& 4th Straps

Getting started: The 3rd and 4th Straps are worked 1 flower toward the center on front and back. Place marker at left edge of flower on back since there is 1 more row.

## 3rd Strap

Rows 1-3: Join at right edge of next flower toward center from First Strap, rep rows 1-3 of First Strap.

Rows 4 \& 5: Rep row 2 of First Strap.
Rows 6 \& 7: Rep rows 4 and 5 of First Strap.
Rows 8 \& 9: Rep row 2 of First Strap.
Row 10: Rep row 9 of First Strap.

## 4th Strap

Rows 1-5: Join at right edge of next flower toward center of 2nd Strap, rep rows 1-5 of 3rd Strap.
Rows 6 \& 7: Rep rows 4 and 5 of 2nd Strap.
Rows 8 \& 9: Rep row 2.
Row 10: Rep row 9 of 2nd Strap. C!

## 2nd Section

Row 38 [44, 44, 50]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to aqua in last st, turn. Fasten off white.

Row 39 [45, 45, 51]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to white in last st, fasten off aqua.
Row 40 [46, 46, 52]: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn.

Row 41 [47, 47, 53]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to aqua in last st, turn. Do not fasten off.
Row 42 [48, 48, 54]: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 43 [49, 49, 55]: Ch 1 , sc in each st across, changing to white in last st, turn. Do not fasten off.

Rows 44-47 [50-53, 50-53, 56-59]: Rep rows 40-43 [46-49, 46-49, 52-55]. At end of last row, fasten off both colors.

## 3rd Section

Row 1: Join aqua with sc in first st, sc in each st across, changing colors according to Chart B, turn.

Rows 2-4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing colors according to Chart B, turn. At end of last row, fasten off white.

## 4th Section

Row 1: With aqua, ch 1 , sc in each st across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Edging

Working around outer edge, with RS facing, join baby pink marl with sc in 10th ch of starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , sc in each ch across to corner, ch 1 , sc in end of each row across to next corner, ch 1 , sc in each st across to next corner, ch 1, sc in end of each row across to corner, ch 1 , sc in each ch across, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg sc. Fasten off.

## First Side Panel

Row 1: With RS of Front Bodice facing, join white with sc in corner ch sp, sc in each st across to next corner ch $s p$, $s c$ in ch $s p$, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to aqua in last st, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, changing to white in last st, turn.

Rnd 6: Sl st in ch sp, ch 1, (sc, ch 4, sc) in same ch sp as beg sl st , sc in next ch-2 sp , ( $s c$, ch $4, s c$ ) in next ch-2 $s p,{ }^{*}(s c$, ch $6, s c)$ in next corner ch sp, [(sc, ch 4, sc) in next ch-2 sp, sc in next ch sp] across** to next corner ch sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Assembly

Make 12 Motifs joining in 2 rows of 6 Motifs using the following joining instuctions.

Rnd 6: Ch $5, \mathrm{sl}$ st in same st as beg ch-5, (2 sc, hdc, dc, hdc, 2 sc ) in next ch-6 sp, [(sl st, ch $5, s l s t)$ in next $s l s t,(2 s c, h d c, d c$, hdc, 2 sc ) in next ch-6 sp] around, join in joining sl st of rnd 5. (8 ch-5 sps)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, 2 sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 4, sl st in next dc, ch 4, [sl st in next ch-5 sp, ch 4, sl st in next dc, ch 4] around join in 2nd sc. (16 (h-4 sps)

Rnd 8: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 3, sl st in same ch $s p$ as beg $s l s t$, ch 3, [(sl st, ch 3, sl st) in next ch $s p$, ch 3] around, join in beg sl st. Leaving 10 -inch end, fasten off.

## 2nd Motif

Rnds 1-7: Work rnds 1-7 of First Motif.
Rnd 8: Sl st in next ch-4 sp, ch 3, sl st in same ch sp as beg ch-3, [ch 3, sl st in next ch-4 sp] 15 times, attaching to First Motif in 16th ch-3 sp counterclockwise from fastening-off point as follows: ch 1, insert hook from front

Row 1: First foundation dc (see Special Stitches), 9 next foundation de (see Special Stitches), with 1 set of Motifs with RS facing at beg Motif, work joined foundation dc (see Special Stitches) in center ch of 8th ch-3 sp counterclockwise from fastening-off point, [20 next foundation dc, joined foundation dc in same ch on next Motif] across, ending with 10 next foundation dc, turn. (421 [587] foundation dc)

Row 2: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn. (211 [294] dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each ch $s p$ and in each dc across, turn. (421 [587] dc)
Row 4: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] across, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately 11 times, then rep row 3 for total of 27 rows from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Side 2 of First Motif Row

Row 1: First foundation dc, 9 next foundation dc, turn First Motif Row so Filler Pattern is now at bottom of work and holding Motif at right corner with RS facing, joined foundation dc in center ch of 16th ch-3 sp counterclockwise from joined foundation dc from previous first row, [20 next foundation dc, joined foundation dc in next as previous Motif] across, ending with 10 next foundation dc, turn. (421 [587] foundation dc)
Row 2: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn. (211 [294] dc)
Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each ch sp and in each dc across, turn. (421 [587] dc)
Row 4: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] across, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately 11 times, for total of 26 rows from beg.

Last row: Attaching to 2nd Motif Row, ch 3, dc in each of next 10 sts, dc in next st and holding 2nd row of Motifs with initial Motif at right edge and RS facing, insert hook from front to back in 2nd ch of 8th ch-3 sp clockwise from fastening-off point, yo, pull through all lps on hook, [dc in each of next 21 sts, insert hook from front to back in 2nd ch of same ch-3 sp on next Motif as for first, yo,
pull through all lps on hook] across, ending with dc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Side 2 of 2nd Motif Row

Row 1: With far right Motif of 2nd Motif Row directly below, first foundation $\mathrm{dc}, 9$ next foundation dc , joined foundation dc in center ch of 16th ch-3 sp counterclockwise from joined foundation dc from previous row, [20 next foundation dc, joined foundation dc in same ch of next Motif as previous Motif] across, ending with 10 next foundation dc, turn. (421 [587] foundation dc)
Row 2: Ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn. (211 [294] dc)

Row 3: Ch 3, dc in each ch $s p$ and in each $d c$ across, turn. (421 [587] dc)
Row 4: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] across, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 3 and 4 alternately 11 times, for total of 26 rows from beg.
Last row: Attaching to 3rd Motif Row, ch 3, dc in each of next 10 sts, dc in next st and holding 2nd row of Motifs with initial Motif at right edge and RS facing, insert hook from front to back in 2nd ch of 8th ch-3 sp clockwise from fastening-off point, yo, pull through all lps on hook, [dc in each of next 21 sts, insert hook from front to back in 2nd ch of same ch-3 sp on next Motif as for first, yo, pull through all lps hook] across, ending with dc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Side 2 of 3rd Motif Row

Rows 1-26: Rep rows 1-26 of Side 2 of 2nd Motif Row.
Row 27: SI st in back Ip (see Stitch Guide) of first dc, ch 3, dc in back lp of each of next 105 [168] sts, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in back Ip of next st] 105 [168] times (buttonholes), dc in back Ip of each st across, turn.

Row 28: Working in back lps, ch 1, tr in each st and in each ch sp across. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Fold Coverlet lengthwise with WS facing out, RS facing in. Join at top edge and seam each Filler Pattern section closed with sl st seam.
Using 10-inch end of initial Motif in each Motif row, attach each initial Motif to each ending Motif with sl st in corresponding ch-3 $s p$ of each ending Motif.
Once entire edge is seamed, Coverlet should be 1 long tube 70 inches wide $x 88$ inches long [88 inches wide x 91 inches long]. With WS still facing, reposition seam so it sits in the center back of cover. Then, holding both bottom edges of tube tog, join at bottom right and seam edges closed with sl st seam.

Turn Coverlet with RS facing. Position 5 [7] buttons evenly sp along inside back button band. Sew buttons in place to button band. Place duvet inside Coverlet. When buttoned, buttons should not show on outside front of Coverlet.

Row 3: Ch 3, [dc in next pc, dc dec in next ch sp and dc dec, dc in next ch sp , dc in next pc, 2 dc in next ch sp, dc in next dc dec, 3 dc in next ch sp, dc in next pc, 3 dc in next ch sp, dc in next dc dec, 2 dc in next ch sp , dc in next pc , dc in next ch sp, dc dec in next dc dec and next ch $s p$ ] across, dc in last $p c$, $d c$ in top of turning ch, turn.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Row 1 (RS): Ch in multiples of 17 plus 19 , dc in 4th ch from hook (first 2 chs and dc count as first dc dec), [dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] twice, *[ch 1, puff st (see Special Stitch) in next st] 5 times, ch 1**, $^{*}$ [dc dec in next 2 sts] 6 times, rep from * across, ending last rep at **, [dc dec in next 2 sts ] 3 times, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Note), dc in next
st (first ch-3 and dc counts as first dc dec), [dc dec in next 2 sts] twice, *[ch 1, puff st in next st] 5 times, ch $1^{* *}$, [dc dec in next 2 sts] 6 times, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, [dc dec in next 2 sts] 3 times, leaving turning ch unworked, turn.
Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately for pattern.

## RICKRACK STITCH

## PATTERN NOTE

Chain-5 at beginning of row counts as first double treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Cluster (cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 dtr (see Stitch Guide) in next st, sk next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{dtr}$ in next st , yo, pull through all lps on hook.
Joined cluster (joined cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 dtr (see Stitch Guide), sk next 5 sts, 3 dtr in next st, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

Row 1: Ch 41 [47, 53, 53, 59, 65, 71, 71], dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (39 [45, 51, 51, 57, 63, 69, 69] dc)
Next rows: Work same as for Back to Armhole Shaping.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: SI st in each of first $7[7,9,11,15,15$, 17,17 ] sts, ch 3 , work in established pattern across to last 2 sts, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in last 2 sts, turn. ( 32 [38, 42, 40, 42, 48, 52, 52] sts)

## Sizes Small, Medium \& Large Only

Next rows: Work even in established pattern and at same time, dec 1 st at each end of every row $3[4,5]$ times, then dec 1 st at neck edge every row until there are 19 [21, 23] sts rem.
Next rows: Work even in established pattern until $14[16,16]$ rows have been worked from beg of Armhole Shaping. At end of last row, fasten off.


## Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large, 3X-Large, 4X-Large \& 5X-Large Only

Row [2]: SI st in each of first 3 sts, work in established pattern across to last 2 sts, dc dec in last 2 sts, turn. ([37, 39, 45, 49, 49] sts)

Next rows: [Rep row 2] [0, 0, 2, 1, 4] time(s), then work in established pattern and at same time, dec 1 st at each end of every row $[6,5,4,6,6]$ times, then work in pattern and dec 1 st at neck edge every row until there are $[23,25,25,25,25]$ sts rem.

Next rows: Work even in established pattern until $[18,18,18,20,20]$ rows have been worked from beg of Armhole Shaping. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Front

Work same as First Front, reversing all shaping.

## Sleeve

Make 2.
Row 1: Ch 59 [71, 71, 77, 77, 77, 89, 89], dc in 4th ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (57 [69, 69, 75, 75, 75, 87, 87] dc)
Next rows: [Rep rows 2-6 consecutively of Back] 3 times, then rep rows 2-5 of Back once.

## Cap Shaping

Row 1: SI st in each of first $7[7,9,11,15,15$, 17,17 ] sts, ch 3 , work in established pattern across leaving last $6[6,8,10,14,14,16,16]$ sts unworked, turn. (45 [57, 53, 55, 47, 47, 55, 55] sts)


## Sizes Small, Medium \& Large Only

Next rows: Work in established pattern and at same time, dec 1 st at each end every row $3[4,5]$ times, then dec 2 sts at each end of next $4[2,5]$ rows, then 3 sts at each end of next $0[3,0]$ rows, work $1[1,0]$ row(s) even. You should have at total of $9[11,11]$ rows from beg of Cap Shaping. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large, 3X-Large, 4X-Large \& 5X-Large Only

Row [2]: Sl st in each of first 3 sts , work in established pattern across, leaving last 2 sts unworked, turn. ( $[51,43,43,51,51]$ sts)

Row 1: Ch $41[41,41,47,47]$, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (40 [ $40,40,46,46]$ sc)
Rows 2-4: Rep rows 1-3 of Pattern.
Rows 5-10: [Rep rows 2 and 3 of Pattern alternately] 3 times.
Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each $d c$ and in each ch $s p$ across, ending with sc in turning ch, turn.
( $40[40,40,46,46]$ sc)
Row 12: Ch 1,2 sc in first $s c$, sc in each sc across to last $s c, 2$ sc in last $s c$, turn. (42 [42, 42, 48, 48] sc)
Row 13: Ch 1 , sc in each sc across, turn.
Rows 14-16: Ch 1 , sc in each sc across, turn. Row 17: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each $s c$ across to last dc, 2 dc in last sc , turn. ( 44 [44, 44, 50, 50] sc)
Rows 18-20: Ch 3, dc in each dc across, ending with last dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Row 21: Rep row 13.
Row 22: Rep row 12. (46 [46, 46, 52, 52] sc)
Rows 23-26: Rep row 13.
Row 27: Rep row 17. (48 [48, 48, 52, 52] sc)
Rows 28 \& 29: Rep rows 18 and 19.
Row 30: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, dc in each dc across to last dc, 2 dc in last dc, turn. (50 [50, 50, 52, 52] sc)

Row 31: Rep row 13.
Row 32: Rep row 12. (52 [52, 52, 54, 54] sc)
Rows 33-36: Rep row 13.
Row 37: Rep row 17. (54 [54, 54, 58, 58] sc)
Rows 38-40: Rep rows 18-20.
Row 41: Rep row 13.
Row 42: Rep row 12. (56 [56, 56, 62, 62] sc) Rows 43-46: Rep row 13.

Next rows: Rep rows 37-46 consecutively to $16,\left[161 / 2,17,17 \frac{1}{2}, 18 \frac{1}{4}\right]$ inches from beg or to desired length.
Rows 47 \& 48: Rep rows 17 and 18.
Rows 49-51: Rep row 13. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing Armhole Side of Right \& Left Fronts

Getting started: Join in the top row for 1 Front and in the bottom row for the other Front.
With RS facing, join (see Pattern Notes) in end of row on armhole side of Front, sc in end of each sc row and 2 dc in end of each dc row (see Pattern Notes).

Rep on rem Front.

## Finishing Back

Getting started: Join in 1 side on the top row and in the bottom row on the opposite side.

Row 1: With RS facing, join in end of row, sc in sc end of each sc row and 2 dc in end of each dc row, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off. Rep on rem side.

## Finishing Sleeves

Getting started: Join in the top row on 1 side and in the bottom row on the opposite side.

With RS facing, join in end of row, sc in end of
each sc row and 2 dc in end of each dc row across. Fasten off.
Rep on rem side.
Rep on rem Sleeve.

## Finishing

Sew shoulder seams.

## Neckband

Row 1 (RS): With RS facing, join in end of row 30 on Right Front, ch $1, \mathrm{sc}$ in same st, [sc in end of each sc row, 2 dc in end of each dc row, sc in each sc] across to the end of row 30 on Left Front, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across to shoulder seam, sc in each st across and at same time, evenly sp 5 decs from shoulder seam to shoulder seam, sc in each rem sc across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

## Assembly

Fold 1 Sleeve in half lengthwise, place fold at shoulder seam, sew Sleeve in place.
Rep with rem Sleeve.
Sew side and Sleeve seams.

## Left Side

Row 1: With RS facing, join in end of row of Neckband, ch 1, sc in end of first sc row, sc dec in end of next 2 sc rows, [ sc in end of each sc row, 2 dc in end of each dc row] across to the last 3 sc rows, sc dec in end of next 2 sc rows, sc in end of last sc row, turn.
Rows 2-6: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Right Side

Row 1: With RS facing, join in end of row 1 of Front at bottom, ch 1, [sc in end of each sc row, dc in end of each dc row] across, turn.
Rows 2 \& 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first 3 sc , buttonhole (see Special Stitches) across to last 3 sc , sc in each of last 3 sc , turn.
Row 5: Ch 1 , sc in each $s c$ and ch $s p$ across, turn.
Rows 6 \& 7: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes.

## Finishing Around Neckband

Join in end of sc row, [sc in end of each sc row and dc in end of each sc row] across. Fasten off. C!



Row 1: Ch 84 [90, 100, 108, 118, 126], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. ( 83 [89, 99, 107, 117, 125] sc)
Rows 2-4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 5-7: Ch 1, work Chain Lace Row (see Patterns) across, turn.
Next rows: Work Pattern Rows (see Patterns) until piece measures 10 inches for all sizes.
Next rows: Work $4[4,6,6,8,8]$ sc rows. Armhole
Row 1: Ch $1,2 \mathrm{sc}$ in first st , sc in each st across to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (85 [91, 101, 109, 119, 127] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st, sc in each st across to last st, 2 sc in last st, turn. (87 [93, 103, 111, 121, 129] sc)

## Sleeves

Row 1: Ch 53 [54, 56, 56, 58, 58], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 2: Rep row 1 for rem Sleeves. (193 [201, 217, 223, 237, 245] sc)

## Bodice \& Sleeves

Getting started: You have completed the Front bodice with 2 chs as on each side for Sleeves.
Row 1: Continue working on Front, sc in first st, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn.

Next rows: Work Chain Lace until piece measures 22 [22, 23, 23, 24, 24] inches from beg. At end of last row, fasten off.

## First Shoulder

Getting started: Working on Front side, place st marker at center of top edge, join (see Pattern Notes) in next st on left side of marker.

Row 1: *Work Chain Lace across, sc in last st, turn.
Row 2: Work Chain Lace across to last st, sl st in last st at neck edge, turn.
Row 3: Sl st in first st, ch 3, work in established pattern across, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 2 and 3 until 81 [81, 87, 87, 93, 97] sts rem.
Next rows: Work even in Chain Lace until piece measures 29 [ $29,29 \frac{1}{2}, 30,31,31$ ] inches from beg, ending at neck edge. At end of last row, fasten off.

## 2nd Shoulder

Turn Sweater, beg at center neck, rep First Shoulder, ending at Sleeve Edge. Do not fasten off at end of last row.

## Neck Joining

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ch 31 [39, 43, 49, 49, 51], sc in each st across First Shoulder, turn. (193 [201, 217, 223, 237, 245] sc)
Row 2: Ch 1, work Chain Lace across, turn.
Next rows: [Rep row 2] 2 [2, 2, 3, 3, 3] times.

## Peekaboo Opening

## First Side

Row 1: Work Chain Lace across first 95 [95, 101, 107, 113, 119], leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 2: SI st in first st, Chain Lace across, turn. (93 [93, 99, 105, 111, 117] sts)

Row 3: Ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st, work Chain Lace across, turn. (91 [91, 97, 103, 109, 115] sts)
Rows 4-7: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] twice. (83 [83, 89, 95, 101, 107] sts)

## Sizes Small, Medium \& Large Only

At end of last row, fasten off.

## Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Row [8]: SI st in each of first 2 sts, Chain Lace across, turn. ([93, 99, 105] sts)
Row [9]: Ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st, work Chain Lace across, turn. Fasten off ([91, 97, 103] sts)

## 2nd Side

Beg at side edge, rep First Side, ending at Sleeve edge. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Joining Back

Next: Join at Sleeve edge, work Chain Lace across first 83 [83, 89, 93, 99, 105] sts, ch 27 [35, 39, 35, 39, 35], Chain Lace across rem sts, turn.

## Back Continues

Getting started: At this point, lay Sweater flat, measure from Front bottom edge to top of Shoulder (see schematic). Mark Sleeve edge at $22[22,23,23,24,24]$ inches.
Next rows: Continue Chain Lace across 193 [201, 217, 223, 237, 245] sts until length is equal to Chain Lace section on Front.
Next row: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off.

## Bottom Back

Row 1: Sk first 53 [ $54,56,56,58,58]$ sts, join with sc in next st, sc in each of next 86 [ $92,102,110,120,128]$, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. ( 87 [93, 103, 111, 121, 129] sc)
Rows 2 \& 3: Ch 1, sk first st, sc in each st across, turn. (85 [91, 101, 105, 119, 127] sts at end of last row)

Next rows: Work $4[4,6,6,8,8]$ sc rows.

Work Pattern Rows for 10 inches for all sizes.
At end of last row, fasten off.
Make sure Front and Back pieces match in width and length.

## Assembly

With RS tog, sc side and Sleeve seams.

## Cuff

Rnd 1: Join in seam at end of Sleeve, evenly sp sc around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 sts, sk next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, sk next st] around,

join in beg sc.
Rnds 3-5: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 6: Rep rnd 2.
Next rnds: Rep rnd 3 until Cuff measures $21 / 2$ inches. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

Rep on rem Sleeve.

## Bottom Edging

With RS facing, join in side seam, sc in each st around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: Sk first 6 [12, 18, 24, 30, 36] sts, join in next st, ch 4, dtr in each st across, turn. (22 dtr for all sizes)
Row 2: Ch 1, sc dec in first 2 sts, sc in each st across, turn. (21 sc for all sizes)

Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc dec in first st and first ch sp , $s c$ in each st and in each ch $s p$ across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 4, dtr in each st across, turn.
Rows 6-17: [Rep rows 2-5 consecutively] 3 times. (14 sts for all sizes at end of last row)

Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## 2nd Front

Row 1: Ch 42 [48, 54, 60, 66, 72], sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (41 [47, 53, 59, 65, 71] sc)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 4, dtr in each st across, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ending with last sc in turning ch, turn.
Row 6: Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across, turn. (41 [47, 53, 59, 65, 71] sc)

Rows 8-14: Work in established pattern, ending with row 6.
Row 15: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 32 $[38,44,50,56,60]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 16: Ch 4, dtr in each st across, turn.
Row 17: Ch 1 , sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. ( $30[36,42,48,54$, 58] sts)

Row 18: Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 19: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch sp across to last ch sp , sc dec in last ch sp and last st, turn.
Rows 20-23: Rep rows 16-19.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 1: Ch 4, dtr in each of next 13 [19, 25, 31, 37,43 ] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each st across to last 2 sts, sc dec in last 2 sts, turn. (13 [19, 25, 31, 37, 43] sc)
Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as first dc and ch-1), sk next st, dc in next st, [ch 1, sk next st, dc in next st] across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch $s p$ across to last ch sp , sc dec in last ch sp and last st, turn. (12 [18, 24, 30, 36, 42] sc)

Row 5: Ch 4, dtr in each of next 13 [19, 25, $31,37,43]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Rows 6-17: [Rep rows 2-5 consecutively] 3 times.
Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew shoulder seams of Fronts to Back.
Sew side seams.

## Edging

With RS facing, join with sc in center st at neck edge on Back, evenly sp sc around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rep Edging on each armhole.
Sew button to row 12 on Front.
Use sp between sts as buttonhole.

Row 29 (RS): Ch 3, 2 dc between first and $2 n d \mathrm{dc}$, sk next ch- 1 sp , [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5 , sk next ch-5 sp] $32[34,36]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , sk next ch- $1 \mathrm{sp}, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ between last dc and turning ch, dc in turning ch, this completes Body, do not turn.

## Edging

First side: With RS facing, ch 1, sl st in end of next dc row on side edge, [ch 2, sl st in end of next row (this is dc or a ch-3/p)] across.

2nd side: Ch 1, work same as for First Side. Rnd 16 [16, 18]: Ch 1 , sl st in sp before next dc , ch 7, turn, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch}$ 4, dc in same sp as beg ch-7, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-7, turn. ( 10 [12, 14] ch-5 sps)
Rnd 17 [17, 19]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc , ch 3 , dc in same sp as beg ch-3, ch 4 , [2 dc between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 5] 10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 4 , join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 18 [18, 20]: Ch 1 , sl st in sp before next $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 6$, turn, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 3 , dc in same sp as beg ch-6, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-6, turn. (10 [12, 14] ch-5 sps)

Rnd 19 [19, 21]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc , ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$ in same sp as beg ch-3, ch $3,[2 \mathrm{dc}$ between next 2 dc , ch 5$] 10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 3 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 20 [20, 22]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc, ch 5, turn, [ 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 2 , dc in same sp as beg ch- 5 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-5, turn.
Rnd 21 [21, 23]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc , ch 3 , dc in same sp as beg ch-3, ch 2 , [ 2 dc between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 5] 10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 2 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 22 [22, 24]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc , ch 4, turn, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] 10 [12, 14] times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 1 , dc in same sp as beg ch-4, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.
Rnd 23 [23, 25]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc , ch 3 , dc in same sp as beg ch-3, ch 1 , [2 dc between next 2 dc, ch 5$] 10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 1 , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 24 [24, 26]: Ch 1, sl st in sp before next dc, ch 3, turn, dc in next ch-1 sp, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5$] 10[12,14]$ times, 2 dc between next 2 dc , dc in next ch-1, dc in next dc, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, turn.
Rnd 25 [25, 27]: Ch 3 , dc in each of next 3 dc , ch 5, [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $9[11,13]$
times, sk next ch-5 sp, dc in each of last 4 dc , join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn. (10[12, 14] ch-5 sps)
Rnd 26 [26, 28]: Ch 1, sk next dc, sl st in next dc , ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 2 dc , ch 5 , [2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $9[11,13]$ times, sk next ch-5 sp, dc in each of next 3 dc , sk next dc , join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Rnd 27 [27, 29]: Ch 1, sl st in next dc, ch 3, dc in each of next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 5,[2 \mathrm{dc}$ between next 2 dc , ch 5] $9[11,13]$ times, sk next ch-5 $\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 3 dc , join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Rnd $\mathbf{2 8}$ [28, 30]: Ch 1, sk next dc, sl st in next dc , ch 3 , dc in next dc, ch 5 , [ 2 dc between next 2 dc , ch 5] $9[11,13]$ times, sk next ch-5 $s p, d c$ in each of next $2 d c$, sk next $d c$, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Rnd 29 [29, 31]: Ch 1, sk next dc, sl st in next dc , ch $8,[2 \mathrm{dc}$ between next 2 dc , ch 5$] 9$ [11, 13] times, sk next ch-5 sp, dc in dc, sk next dc , join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3, turn.
Edging: Ch 1, sl st in next dc, ch 2, dc in same st as beg ch-2, *sk next 2 chs of ch-5 sp, (sl st, ch 2,dc) in next ch, sk next 2 chs of same ch-5 sp, (sl st, ch 2, dc) next dc, rep from * across, joining in beg sl st. Fasten off.


Note: Jacket is worked from the neck down to underarms, then divided. Back and Fronts are joined and worked to lower edge. Sleeves are worked from underarm to lower edge in the round.
Separate pieces are shown for clarity of shaping.


Work should measure about 15 inches.

## Front

Work as for Back, do not fasten off at end of last row.

## Left Shoulder \& Sleeve

Row 53: Ch 1, sc in each of first 37 [37, 49, $49,61,61]$ dc, leave rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 54: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [ch 3, sk next 3 $\mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc$]$ across. $(9[9,12,12,15,15]$ (h-3 sps)

Row 55: Rep row 3.

Row 56: Rep row 4.
Row 57: Ch 1, sc in each tr and petal across, working 3 sc in each ch-3 sp .

Next rows: [Rep rows 54-57 consecutively for flower motif] $8[9,9,9,10,10]$ times. At end of last row, leaving long end for sewing, fasten off.

## Right Shoulder \& Sleeve

With RS facing, sk next 11 [17, 11, 17, 11, 17] V-sts, join (see Pattern Notes) in next dc, beg with row 53 and work same as for Left Shoulder \& Sleeve.

## Assembly

Sew side seams.
Sew last sc row of Shoulders to Back to correspond to Front.

## Neck Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join in first st on Back after Shoulder, ch 1 , sc in same st and in each of next $23[35,23,35,23,35]$ sts, 100 [108, 108, 108, 116, 116] sc along Left Shoulder, 24 [36, 24, 36, 24, 36] sc along Front neck, 100 [108, 108, 108, 116, 116] sc along Right Shoulder, join in first sc. (248 [288, 264, 288, 280, 304] sc)

## Sizes Small, Large \& 2X-Large Only

Rnds 2-5: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

## Sizes Medium \& X-Large Only

Rnd [2]: Ch 1, sc in each of first 10 sc , sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc, [sc in each of next 10 sc , sc dec in next 2 sc around, join in beg sc. ([264, 288sc)

Rnds [3-5]: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

## Size 3X-Large Only

Rnd [2]: Ch 1 , * [sc in each of next 11 sc , sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sc$]$ twice, sc in each of next 10 sc , sc dec in next 2 sc , rep from * around, join in first sc. ([280] Sc)
Rnds [3-5]: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.

## All Sizes

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sk next sc, shell (see Special Stitches) in next sc, [sk next sc, sc in next $s c$, $s k$ next $s c$, shell in next $s c$ ] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Sleeve Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join in first st of flower motif at underarm, ch 1, evenly sp sc around armhole edge as given for Neck Edging, join in first sc. ( 100 [108, 108, 108, 116, 116] sc)
Rnds 2 \& 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 4: Rep rnd 6 of Neck Edging.

## Bottom Edging

Rnd 1: With RS facing, working on opposite side of starting ch on row 1 of Front and Back, join in first ch after side seam, ch 1, sc in each ch around, and at same time, inc 2 sts if necessary to achieve a multiple of 4 sts .
Rnds 2-5: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join in first Sc .
Rnd 6: Rep rnd 6 of Neck Edging. C!

Row 3: Join baby pink marl with sc in first st on opposite side of row 3 , sc in each of next $8[9,11,11]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

## Side Edging

With RS facing, working from Shoulder down to bottom of Skirt on Front, join baby pink
marl with sc in first st, evenly sp sc across to bottom. Fasten off.
Rep on rem side of Front.
Rep on both side edges of Back.

## Finishing

Sew shoulder seams.
Sew side edges leaving $41 / 2[43 / 4,43 / 4,5]$ inches open for armhole on each side.

## Neck Edging

Working around neck edge, join bay pink marl with sc in shoulder seam, evenly sp sc around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1, with RS facing, join in first ch, ch 4, sm dec, [ch 3, tr in same st as 2nd leg of last dec made, work med dec] 3 times, *[ch 4, tr in same st as 2nd leg of last dec made, work med dec] twice, [ch 3, tr in same st as 2nd leg of last dec made, work med dec] twice, rep from * across to last 4 sts from end, ch 3, tr in same st as 2nd leg of last dec made, med dec, tr in last st. Fasten off.

## Fringe

Cut 8 strands each 16 inches long. Holding all strands tog, fold in half, pull fold through, pull ends through fold. Pull to tighten.
Working across each end of Throw, Fringe in each ch-3 and ch-4 sp across and in each corner on top and bottom edges.
