It is a little-known fact that heart disease is the leading cause of death of women in the United States.

Crochet Red is a combination pattern book and information guide about heart-healthy living. It includes 12 eclectic designs from a variety of designers, all crocheted in vibrant red yarn (of course). The designs include a vest, cardigans, shawls and accessories made in a range of yarn weights. Beyond the patterns is information about preventing heart disease, including understanding risk factors and encouraging healthy lifestyle-things we should all be thinking about.

The Stitch Red campaign is a national heart disease awareness campaign supported by the needle arts industry. A portion of the proceeds from the sale of Crochet Red will be donated to the National Institutes of Health in support of The Heart Truth ${ }^{\text {® }}$.

## FINISHED MEASUREMENT

9 inches square

## MATERIALS

- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice medium (worsted) weight
acrylic yarn ( $3 ½ 0 z / 170 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):

1 skein each \#108 dusty blue, \#123 beige, \#135 rust and \#105 silver blue

- Lion Brand Vanna's Choice Baby medium (worsted) weight acrylic yarn ( $3 ½ 0 z / 170 \mathrm{yds} / 100 \mathrm{~g}$ per skein):

1 skein each \#132 goldfish and \#100 angel white

- Black embroidery floss or scrap yarn
- Sizes J/10/6mm and L/11/8mm crochet hooks or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Sewing needle
- Matching sewing thread
- 9-inch-square pillow form (or to make pillow form: two 10-inch fabric squares, fiberfill, sewing needle and matching thread)
- $3 / 16$-inch dowel rod, 20 inches long
- 7 mm purple ribbon: 2 pieces each 12 inches long
- 5/8-inch black buttons: 2
- 3/8-inch black buttons with shanks: 2
- Stitch markers


## GAUGE

Size L hook: 12 sts = 4 inches; 16 rows = 4 inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Rows are worked without a beginning turning chain.
Work in continuous rounds; do not turn or join unless otherwise stated.
Mark first stitch of round. Move marker up with each round.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Change color in last stitch of row or round. Keep color not in use to back of work until needed.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Knit: With yarn to back, insert hook from front to back in Ip as indicated, yo, draw through st and Ip on hook.
Purl: With yarn to front, insert hook from back to front in Ip as indicated, yo, draw through st and Ip on hook.
Purl 2 together (purl2tog): With yarn to front, insert hook from back to front in front Ip of each of next 2 sts, yo, draw through both sts and Ip on hook.

## PREPARATION

To Make Hair Curls: Preheat oven to 200 degrees. Wrap rust yarn approximately 250 times in single layer around dowel rod keeping wraps close tog. Tuck ends under first and last wrap to keep yarn from unraveling. Wet yarn
and squeeze out excess. Place yarn-wrapped dowel rod in oven and bake for 15 minutes (do not leave oven unattended). Carefully remove dowel rod from oven and allow yarn to cool completely. Once yarn has cooled, slide yarn off dowel rod. Cut yarn into 8 equal lengths (approximately 30 wraps per curl).
To Make Pillow Form: With RS tog, sew two 10 -inch squares of fabric tog with $1 / 2$-inch seam allowance, leaving opening on 1 side. Turn piece RS out, stuff pillow with fiberfill to desired softness, and then sew opening closed.

## PILLOW

## Front

Skirt
Row 1 (WS): With size L hook and dusty blue, ch 28, knit (see Special Stitches) in back Ip (see Stitch Guide) of 2nd ch from hook, knit in back Ip of each rem ch across, turn. (27 sts)
Row 2 (RS): Purl (see Special Stitches) in front lp (see Stitch Guide) of each st across, turn.
Row 3: Knit in back Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 4: Knit in front Ip and knit in back lp of each st across, turn. ( 54 sts )

Row 5: Purl in back Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 6: Knit in front Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 7: Rep row 5.
Row 8: Purl2tog (see Special Stitches) across, turn. (27 sts)
Row 9: Rep row 3.
Row 10: Rep row 2.


Row 11: Knit in back Ip of each st across, changing to angel white in last st, turn. Fasten off dusty blue.

## Shirt

Row 1 (RS): With angel white, knit in back Ip of each st across, turn. ( 27 sts )
Row 2: Purl in back lp of each st across, changing to goldfish in last st, turn.
Row 3: With goldfish, purl in front Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 4: Purl in back Ip of each st across, changing to angel white in last st, turn.
Row 5: With angel white, knit in front Ip of each st across, turn.

Row 6: Purl in front lp of each st across, changing to goldfish in last st, turn.
Rows 7-10: Rep rows 3-6.
Row 11: Rep row 3.
Row 12: Knit in back Ip of each st across, changing to beige in last st, turn. Fasten off angel white and goldfish.

## Face

Row 1 (RS): With beige, knit in back lp of each st across, turn. (27 sts)
Row 2: Purl in back Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 3: Knit in front Ip of each st across, turn.
Rows 4-9: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times.
Row 10: Rep row 2.
Row 11: Knit in front Ip of each st across, changing to rust in last st, turn. Fasten off beige.

## Hair

Row 1 (WS): With rust, purl in back Ip of each st across, turn. (27 sts)
Row 2 (RS): Purl in front lp of each st across. Fasten off rust.

## Facial Features

For eyes, place $5 / 8$-inch buttons on Face $11 / 4$ inches below hairline and $21 / 4$ inches apart and sew in place. With black floss or yarn, using straight stitch (see illustration), embroider smile on Face


Straight Stitch
just below button eyes as shown in photo.

## Back

Skirt
Rows 1-11: Rep rows
1-11 of Front Skirt.

## Shirt

Rows 1-11: Rep rows 1-11 of Front Shirt.
Row 12: Knit in back Ip of each st across, changing to rust in last st, turn. Fasten off angel white and goldfish.

## Hair

Row 1 (RS): With rust, knit in back Ip of each st across, turn. (27 sts)
Row 2: Purl in back Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 3: Purl in front Ip of each st across, turn.

## RECOVERYBUDDIES

Bethany, a young woman with an eating disorder, spent one very long, lonely month in the hospital far away from family and friends. Her "roommate," a stuffed duck named Flynn that her friends had given her before she left home, was her main source of comfort.

In August 2008, Bethany, now a beautiful, healthy young woman, decided to help others who were going through what she had experienced. Recovery Buddies was born-a charity that mails soft cuddly friends to those being treated for eating disorders, depression, self-harm and addiction.

Due to treatment center regulations, Buddies need to be between 8 inches and 9 inches square. Legs should be approximately 3 inches
long and arms $2^{1 ⁄ 2}$ inches long. Buddies need to look like a square pillow as some centers do not allow stuffed animals. Buddies can have smooth, flat, sew-on buttons but cannot have anything sharp attached to them. Preference is bright colors, but no red and no wool.

Row 4: Rep row 2.
Row 5: Knit in front Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 6: Knit in back Ip of each st across, turn.
Row 7: Rep row 5.
Rows 8-13: Rep rows 2-7. At end of last row, fasten off rust.

## Legs

## Make 2.

Rnd 1 (RS): With size J hook and beige, ch 4, knit in front lp of beg ch to form ring, knit in back Ip of same ch as joining, knit in front lp and knit in back lp of each ch around, do not join. (8 sts)
Rnd 2: Knit in front lp of each st around.
Rnds 3-14: Rep rnd 2. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Shoes

## Make 2.

## Bottom

Rnd 1 (RS): Leaving long end at beg for sewing, with size J hook and silver blue, ch 4, knit in front lp of beg ch to form ring, knit in back Ip of same ch as joining, knit in front lp and knit in back lp of each ch around, do not join. (8 sts)
Rnd 2: Purl in front Ip of each st around.
Rnd 3: Knit in front Ip of each st around.
Rnd 4: Rep rnd 2.
Top
Row 1 (RS): Knit in front lp of each of first 5 sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. ( 5 sts)

Row 2: Knit in back Ip of each st across, turn. (5 sts)
Row 3: Knit in front Ip of each st across, turn.

Row 4: Knit in back Ip of each st across, ch 5 , join in beg st to form ankle strap. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off. With beg strand, sew rnd 1 closed.

## Arms

## Make 2.

Rnd 1 (RS): Leaving long end at beg for sewing, with size J hook and beige, ch 3, knit in front lp of beg ch to form ring, knit in back lp of same ch as joining, knit in front Ip and knit in back Ip of each ch around, do not join. (6sts)
Rnd 2: Knit in front Ip of each st around.
Rnds 3-5: [Rep rnd 2] 3 times.
Rnd 6: Knit in front Ip of each st around, changing to goldfish in last st. Fasten off beige.

Rnd 7: With goldfish, knit in front Ip of each st around.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS
Necklace: 5 inches wide $x 6$ inches long, excluding neck chain
Earring: $1 \frac{1}{2}$ inches wide $21 / 2$ inches long, including fishhook earring post

## MATERIALS

- Lizbeth size 20 crochet cotton
(210 yds per ball):
1 ball each \#633 purple dark, \#620 azalea medium, \#683 leaf green light, \#676 leaf green dark and \#664 ocean teal medium
Size $9 / 1.25 \mathrm{~mm}$ steel crochet hook
- Embroidery needle
- Small shank button
- Fishhook earring posts: 2


## GAUGE

Gauge is not important for this project.

## PATTERN NOTES

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

Chain-2 at beginning of round counts as first half double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

8-treble crochet cluster (8-tr cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 8 tr as
indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.
Double crochet popcorn (dc pc): 4 dc in next st, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in top of first dc of dc group, pull dropped Ip through.
Treble crochet popcorn (tr pc): 5 tr in next st, drop Ip from hook, insert hook in top of first tr of tr group, pull dropped lp through.

## Beginning double crochet cluster (beg

 dc cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, ch $3,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same st as beg ch-3, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.Double crochet cluster (dc cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## 4-treble crochet cluster (4-tr

 cl): Holding back last lp of each st on hook, 4 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.
## NECKLACE

## MOTIF NO. 1

Rnd 1: With azalea medium, ch 5, 8-tr cl (see Special Stitches) in 5th ch from hook (first 4 chs do not count as first st), join (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg ch-5. (1 tr cl)
Rnd 2: Working around tr Cl , sc in top of 8-tr cl , evenly sp 5 sc down side of 8 - tr cl , sc in



bottom of 8-tr cl, evenly sp 5 sc up side, join in first sc. Fasten off. (12 sc)
Rnd 3: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in same st as beg $s c, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each st around, join in first sc. (24 sc)
Rnd 4: Ch 1 , $s c$ in first $s t, 2$ sc in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 36 sc )
Rnd 5: Join leaf green light in first st, ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), hdc in each st around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.
Rnd 6: Ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rnd 7: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in same st as beg sc, 2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (72 sc)
Rnd 8: Join azalea medium in first st, ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

Rnd 9: Join ocean teal medium in first st, ch 3, fpdc (see Stitch Guide) around next st, [dc in next st, fpdc around next st] around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3.
Rnd 10: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, [sc in each of next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (96 sc)
Rnd 11: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in each of next 22 sts, dc pc (see Special Stitches) in next st, [sc in each of next 23 sts, dc pc in next st] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( $4 \mathrm{dc} p \mathrm{c}, 92 \mathrm{sc}$ )
Rnd 12: Join leaf green light with sc in first st, *[ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] 11 times, ch 5, sk next dc $\mathrm{pc}^{* *}$, sc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## MOTIF NO. 2

Rnd 1: With leaf green light, ch $5, \operatorname{tr} \mathbf{~ p c}$ (see Special Stitches) in 5th ch from hook.
Rnd 2: Working around $\operatorname{tr} \mathrm{pc}$, join leaf green dark with sc in top of tr pc, evenly sp 6 sc down side of $\operatorname{tr} \mathrm{pc}$, sc in bottom of tr pc, evenly sp 6 sc up side, join in first sc. Fasten off. (14 sc)
Rnd 3: Join azalea medium with sc in first st, sc in same st as beg sc, 2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 28 sc )
Rnd 4: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, 2 sc in first st and in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 56 sc )
Rnd 6: Join ocean teal medium with sc in first st, sc in each st around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rnd 8: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 9: Join azalea medium in first st, beg dc cl (see Special Stitches) in same st, sk next st, [dc cl (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next st] around, join in top of beg de cl. Fasten off.

## MOTIF NO. 3 (CRESCENT MOTIF)

## Make 2.

Rnd 1: With azalea medium, ch 5, 4-tr cl (see Special Stitches) in 5th ch from hook (first 4 chs do not count as first st). ( 1 tr cl)

Rnd 2: Working around tr Cl , sc in top of 4-tr cl, evenly sp 4 sc down side of 4-tr cl, sc in bottom of 4-tr cl, evenly sp 4 sc up side, join in first sc. (10 sc)
Rnd 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (20 sc)
Rnd 4: Join leaf green dark with sc in first st, 2 sc in next $s t$, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (30 sc)
Rnd 5 (RS): Join leaf green light in first st, ch 2, hdc in each st around, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2.
Row 6: Now working in rows, sl st in each of first 5 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in next st] around, leaving last 5 sts unworked, turn. Fasten off. (30 sc)
Row 7: Join purple dark with sc in first st, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off.
Row 8: Join azalea medium with sc in first st, 2 sc in next st, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] across, turn. (45 sc)
Row 9: Ch 3, dc in each st across, turn. Fasten off.
Row 10: Join leaf green dark with sc in first $s t$, sc in each st across, turn. Fasten off.

Row 11: Join ocean teal medium in first st, ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$ cl in each st across to last st, dc in last st, turn. Fasten off.
Row 12: Join purple dark with sc in first st, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] across, turn. Fasten off.

## MOTIF NO. 4

## Make 2.

Rnd 1: With ocean teal medium, ch 5, 4-tr cl in 5th ch from hook (first 4 chs do not count as first st). (1 tr cl)
Rnd 2: Working around tr Cl , sc in top of 4-tr cl , evenly sp 3 sc down side of $4-\mathrm{tr} \mathrm{cl}$, sc in bottom of 4-tr cl, evenly sp 3 sc up side, join in first sc. ( 8 sc )
Rnd 3: Ch 1,2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 16 sc )
Rnd 4: Join purple dark in first st, ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in next st, [dc in next $s t, 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. ( 25 dc )
Rnd 5: Join leaf green light in first st, (beg $\mathrm{dccl}, \mathrm{dccl})$ in same st as joining, dc cl in each

st around, join in top of beg dc cl. Fasten off. ( 26 dc cl )
Rnd 6: Join azalea medium with sc in first st, sc in same st as first sc, 2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 52 sc )

Rnd 7: Join leaf green dark with sc in first st, [ch 3, sk next st, sc in next st] around to last 7 sts, ch 1, sl st in 2nd ch sp on 1 Motif No. 3, ch 1, sk next st on this Motif, sc in next st, [ch 1, sl st in next ch sp on Motif No. 3, ch 1, sk next st on this Motif, sc in next st] twice, ch 3, sk last st, join in first sc. Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Sew Motif No. 2 to top of Motif No. 1 as shown on Necklace Assembly Diagram.
Sew Motifs No. 3 to back sides of Motif No. 2 and Motifs 4 to tops of Motifs 3 as shown on Necklace Assembly Diagram.

## NECK CHAIN

Join purple dark in top st of Motif No. 4 as indicated by arrow on Assembly Diagram, ch 5,
dc cl in same st as beg ch-5, ch 1 , insert hook in top of de cl just made, yo, pull Ip through, yo, pull through 1 lp on hook (ch-1 made), yo, pull through all Ips on hook (sc made), [insert hook in last ch-1 made, yo, pull Ip through, yo, pull through 1 Ip on hook (ch-1), yo, pull through all Ips on hook ( $s c$ )] until ch measures 9 inches or desired length. Fasten off.

Rep on 2nd Motif 4.
Fold first chain end over to form Ip to fit over button; sew end to chain.
Sew button to end of 2nd chain.

## EARRING

## Make 2.

## MOTIF

Rnd 1: With leaf green light, ch 5, dc cl (see Special Stitches) in 5th ch from hook.
Rnd 2: Working around dc cl , sc in top of dc cl , evenly sp 3 sc down side of dc cl , sc in bottom of dc cl, evenly sp 3 sc up side, join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. Fasten off. (8 sc)

Rnd 3: Join leaf green dark with sc in first st, sc in same st as beg sc, 2 sc in each st around, join in first sc. Fasten off. (16 sc)

Rnd 6: Join ocean teal medium in first st, beg dc al (see Special Stitches) in same st as joining, dc cl in each st around, join in top of beg dc cl. Fasten off.
Rnd 7: Join purple dark with sc in first st, ch 3, sk next st, [sc in next st, ch 3, sk next st] around, join in first sc.
Rnd 8: Ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), dc cl in same st as beg ch-3, ch 5, sl st in top of last dc cl to form Ip. Fasten off.
Attach 1 fishhook post to ch-5 Ip as shown in Assembly Diagram.

Rnd 47: Ch 1, sc in each st and ch around, join in first st.

## LEARN HOW TO EXPAND ON THE SHELL-LIKE LIMPET STITCH BY MAKING IT DOUBLE TO ADD EXTRA TEXTURE OR A UNIQUE FLAIR OF COLOR TO YOUR CROCHET PIECES.

Enjoy some texture in your crochet pieces or simply add a unique flair of color with the technique of double limpets. Many of you may be familiar with the traditional limpet stitch; it offers a raised shell appearance, almost like a small fan that waves across your fabric. The double limpet offers an even greater range with some simple modification to this favorite textural stitch. This technique can add a unique edge to any item, or it can give a fascimating color and texture play as a featured design.

The technique is based upon creating a multiple numbben of limpets at the same time. If you are not familiar with the limpet stitch, it is worked by adding loops to the hook, not by chaining or by utilizing features of Tunisian crochet, but by adding loops directly to the hook, much like casting on in knitting. You manually create loops and add them to the hook, and then you yarn over and pull through all the loops. This creates a limpet. A double limepet is worked similarly-you manually add loops, but you yarn over and only pull through a select number of loops; then repeat the yarn over and pull through.

There are various combinations that can be created through this method. A traditional limpet can be created nestled within a larger one. Limpets can also be made to appear to be stacked on top of one another. Arches of limpets can be either left to dangle as fringe or tacked down in other rows to create stunning color plays. These stitches can be worked to the front or back of the fabric;
however, I feel that the front of the fabric looks a little nicer, especially for the arched effect.

Mastering this technique is easier than it sounds. First, work the basic stitches that form the fabric. For simplification purposes, I will describe this technique within double crochet (dc) stitches unless otherwise stated. Working in double crochet, you leave the double crochet stitch unfinished and complete it with a double limpet, as described below, to reduce aping in the stitches; however, if placing these stitches in a base of single crochet, complete the single crochet before beginming the double limpet.

The traditional limpet stitch is worked on the wrong side of a base fabric of single crochet. To work the traditional limpet stitch: Finish the prior stitch and then acreate a loop in the working yarn. I do this by grabbing the yarn and twisting it over my pointer finger, making sure that the working yarn from the skein is in front (Photo 1). Place this loop over the hook and repeat the process of adding loops until the number indicated is reached. Yarn over and pull through all the loops on the hook; then continue the regular stitch of the fabric in the next stitch (Photo 2).

Now here are the twists. For stacked limpets, reate your base fabric in double crochets. When you come to the place to add a stacked limpet, yarn over, insert the hook into the next stitch, yarn over and pull through a

loop, yarn over and pull through two loops, leaving the remaining two loops on hook (basically, you are one step away from finishing a double crochet; this will help anchor the stacked limpets to the fabric better). Add seven loops to the hook as described in the traditional limpet (nine loops on book), yarn over and pull through five loops leaving remaining five on hook, add an additional four loops to hook as described in traditional limpet (Photo 3), yarn over and pull through all loops (Photo 4), push to front of work, double crochet in next stitch. You can see that there appears to be one shell on top of another.

For nestled limpets, it's necessary to make some variations on the stacked limpet. To create a stitch that appears to have a limpet nestled under another, create your base fabric in double crochets. When adding a nestled limpet, make an unfinished double crochet as described for the

stacked limpet, add seven loops to the hook as described for the traditional limpet, yarn over and pull through five loops, add another four loops to the hook, yarn over and pull through five loops; then yarn over and pull through the remaining loops, push to the front of the work and double crochet in the next stitch.

The arched limpet is simply a number of limpets in a row together. For practical purposes, I am explaining three together, but it can be easily expanded to any number. For arched limpets, create your base fabric. When you are ready to place an arched limpet, make an unfinished double crochet as described for the stacked limpet, add 11 loops to the hook as described for the traditional method, yarn over and pull through five loops three times, push to the beginning of the work and then double crochet in the

Row 5: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in next st, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, [(2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp, ch 2 , sk next 2 sts and next ch-2 sp, dc in next st, ch 2 , sk next ch-2 sp] across, ending with 2 dc in next st , dc in each of last 3 sts, turn.

Row 6: Ch 3, dc in each of next 2 sts, [ch 2, sk next 2 sts and ch-2 sp, (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc ) in next st, ch 2 , sk next 2 sts and next ch-2 sp, dc in next st] across, ending with dc in each of last 2 sts, turn.

Next rows: Rep rows 3-6 consecutively until piece measures $121 / 2[121 / 2,121 / 2,141 / 4,141 / 4$, $141 / 4]$ inches, ending with row 5.
Next row: Sk all ch-1 sps, ch 3, dc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (204 [220, 236, 260, 284, 316] dc)

## First Front

Next rows: Ch 3, dc in each of first 49 [52, $57,62,68,75]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn and at same time beg dec (see Special Stitches) 2 sts or end dec (see Special Stitches) at armhole edge every row 0 [0,
$1,2,3,5]$ time(s) and 1 dc 1 [2, 2, 3, 5, 6] time(s). (49 [51, 53, 55, 57, 59] dc at end of last row)
Next row: Ch 3, dc in each st across, turn.
Next rows: Rep last row until piece measures $16 \frac{1}{2}$ [17, $\left.17 \frac{1}{4}, 181 / 2,19,191 / 4\right]$ inches, then beg at neck edge, work beg dec across 13 [13, $14,14,15,15$ ] sts, then end dec across 3 sts, 2 sts twice, and 1 st 3 times. ( $26[28,29,31$, $32,34] d c$ )

Next rows: Work even in established pattern until piece measures $201 / 2\left[21,21 \frac{1}{4}, 231 / 4\right.$, $231 / 2,24]$ inches. At end of last row, fasten off.

Rows 3-25: Rep row 2.

## Armhole Shaping

Row 26: SI st across first 5 [5, 7, 11, 13, 15] sts, work in established pattern across to last $5[5,7,11,13,15]$ sts, turn leaving rem sts unworked. (75 [84, 89, 93, 98, 103] sts)
Row 27: Ch 3, dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts, work in established pattern across to last 3 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in last st, turn. (73 [82, 87, 91, 96, 101] sts)


Next rows: Rep row 27 for $6[9,9,9,11,13]$ times more. 61 [64, 69, 73, 74, 75] sts rem. Work even for a total of $39[40,41,42,43$, 44] rows from foundation ch.

## First Side Neck Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Work in established pattern across first 13 [14, 15, 16, 17, 17] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, work in established pattern across. Fasten off. (12 $[13,14,15,16,16]$ sts)

## 2nd Side Neck Shaping

Row 1 (RS): Beg counting at end of First Side Neck Shaping and sk center $35[36,39,41$, 40, 41] sts; join (see Pattern Notes) in next st, ch 3, work in established pattern across.
Row 2: Ch 3, work in established pattern across to last 3 sts, dc dec in next 2 sts, dc in last st. Fasten off. ( $12[13,14,15,16,16]$ sts)

## Lower Border

Row 1: With size C hook, with RS facing, working in unused lps on opposite side of foundation ch, join in first ch, ch 1, sc in same ch as beg ch- 1 , sc in each rem ch across, turn. (85 [94, 103, 115, 124, 133] sts)
Rows 2-10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Front

Row 1: With size D hook, ch 33 [39, 42, 48, 54,57 ], dc in 4th ch from hook (3 sk chs count as dc), [ch 1, sk next ch, dc in each of next 2 chs] across to last 2 chs, ch 1 , sk next ch, dc in last ch, turn. (31 [37, 40, 46, 52, 55] sts)

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, [dc in next ch sp, ch 1 , sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn. (32[38, 41, 47, 53, 56] sts)

Row 3: Ch 3, [dc in next ch sp, ch 1, sk next dc , dc in next dc$]$ across to last st, 2 dc in last st, turn. (33 [39, 42, 48, 54, 57] sts)
Row 4: Ch 3, dc in first st, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc, [dc in next ch sp, ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc] across, turn. $(34[40,43,49$, 55, 58] sts)

Row 5: Ch 3, [dc in next ch sp, ch 1, sk next dc , dc in next dc] across, turn.

Rows 6-18: Rep row 5.

## V-Neck Shaping

Row 1: Ch 3, dc dec in next 2 sts, work in established pattern across, turn. (33 [39, 42, 48, 54, 57] sts)

Note: Mark last row as first dec row.


Row 2: Ch 3, work in established pattern across to last 2 sts, de dec in last 2 sts, turn. (32[38, 41, 47, 53, 56] sts)

- Sizes $\mathrm{D} / 3 / 3.25 \mathrm{~mm}, \mathrm{E} / 4 / 3.5 \mathrm{~mm}$, $\mathrm{F} / 5 / 3.75 \mathrm{~mm}$ and $\mathrm{G} / 6 / 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ crochet hooks or sizes needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

Each Block measures $71 / 2$ inches square with Trim after blocking.

## PATTERN NOTES

Use of different hook sizes is to get different stitch gauges. Each Block may have varying numbers of stitches and different tensions or gauges. To get uniform sizes of Blocks, change hook sizes accordingly. Aim for smaller hook if gauge falls between hook sizes as piece may be blocked to measurements afterward.
Each ball of yarn will yield about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ Blocks.
Blocks can be made with 1 or 2 colors.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

If changing colors (see Stitch Guide), always change in last stitch worked. Do not fasten off color not being used, but carry it loosely along side edge of work.
When working Trim, make sure you have the same number of stitches on each Block.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Loosely chain-1 at beginning of row
does not count as first stitch unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Loosely chain 1 (loosely ch 1): Loosen Ip on hook slightly, very loosely ch 1 and pull up to height of next st to be worked; this does not count as first st.

Bobble: Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 5 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.
Cluster (cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.

## TOTE BAG

## Colorwork B/Giant Shells (see photo on page 56)

Work multiple of 8 chs plus 2. Can be made in one or two colors.
Row 1 (WS): Ch 34, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [sk next 3 chs, 7 tr in next ch, sk next 3 chs, sc in next ch] across, turn.
Row 2 (RS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [bpsc (see Stitch Guide) around each of next 7 tr , scin next sc] across, change colors (see Pattern Notes) here if working in stripes, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 3 tr in same st as beg ch-3, sk next 3 sts, scin next st, sk next 3 sts, [7 tr in next sc, sk next 3 sts, sc in next $s t$, sk next 3 sts ] across to last $\mathrm{sc}, 4$ tr in last $s c$, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first tr, bpsc around each of next 3 tr , sc in next sc , [bpsc around each of next 7 tr , sc in next sc ] across to last 4 sts , bpsc around each of next 3 tr , sc in 3 rd ch of turning ch-3, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 5: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sk next 3 sts, 7 tr in next sc, sk next 3 sts, sc in next st] across, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, [bpsc around each of next 7 tr , sc in next sc] across, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 3-6 consecutively for total of 22 rows, ending with row 4.
At end of last row, fasten off only 1 of the colors if working with 2 colors.
Last row (WS): Ch 1, sc in first sc, [sc in next $s c$, hdc in next $s c$, dc in next $s c$, tr in next $s c$, dc in next $s c$, hdc in next $s c$, sc in each of next $2 \mathrm{sc}]$ across, turn.

## Trim

With RS facing, ch 1 and evenly sp 33 sc across, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly $s p 33$ sc in ends of rows along side edge, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and working on opposite side of foundation ch, evenly sp 33 sc in each ch across, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows along other side edge, ch 2 (corner), join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc. Leaving long end at least 3 edges'length for sewing, fasten off.

Row 5: Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 dc , [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch- 1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc , ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in each of next 3 dc on this row] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

Row 6: Loosely ch 1, dc in each of first 6 sts, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1 , sk next ch-1

## Block \#8

With size G hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and with coral for first color and canary for 2nd color, work Colorwork B/Giant Shells, with 2 rows of each color. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Solid Texture C/Diamond Bobbles (see first photo on page 57)

Work multiple of 12 chs plus 6 .
Row 1 (RS): Ch 30 , working in back bar of ch (see illustration), sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in each of next 11 chs] across to last 3 chs, ch 1 , sk next ch, sc in each of last 2 chs, turn.


## Back Bar of Chain

Row 2: Loosely ch 1 (see Pattern Notes and Special Stitches), dc in each of first 2 sc , [ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 11 sts] across to last ch-1 sp, ch 1, sk last ch-1 sp, dc in each of last 2 sc , turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc , bobble (see Special Stitches) in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, [ch 1, sk next dc, sc in each of next 7 dc , ch 1 , sk next $d c$, sc in next $d c$, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch- 1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in
$\mathrm{sp}, \mathrm{dc}$ in each of next 7 sts ] across to last 2 ch-1 sps, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of next 3 sts, ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp, dc in each of last 6 sts, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in each of first 6 dc , [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch- 1 sp 2 rows below, sc in each of next 7 dc on this row] across to last 2 ch- 1 sps , bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch- 1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in each of last 6 sts on this row, turn.

Row 8: Loosely ch 1 , dc in each of next 8 sts, ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp, [dc in each of next 11 sts, ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp] across to last 8 sts, dc in each of last 8 sts, turn.
Row 9: Ch 1 , sc in each of first 6 dc , ch 1 , sk next dc , sc in next dc , [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in each of next 7 dc , ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in next dc] across to last ch-1 sp, bobble in last ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1 , sk next dc , sc in each of last 6 dc , turn.

Row 10: Rep row 6.

Row 11: Ch 1, sc in each of first 4 dc , [ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch- 1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in each of next 3 dc on this row, bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in each of next 3 dc] across to last st, sc in last st, turn.

## Row 12: Rep row 4.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 dc , ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in next dc, [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in each of next 7 dc on this row, bobble in next ch- 1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row, ch 1 , sk next dc, sc in next dc] across to last dc, sc in last dc, turn.

## Row 14: Rep row 2.

Next rows: Rep rows 3-14 consecutively for total of 20 rows, ending with row 8.
Last row: Work next RS row of pattern but work a sc instead of a ch 1 and sk dc across, or ch 1 , sc in each of first 8 dc , [bobble in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch- 1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row and in each of next 11 dc ] across to last ch-1 sp, bobble in last ch-1 sp 2 rows below in front of ch-1 sp of last row thus pushing bobble forward, sc in next dc on this row and in each of last 7 dc , do not turn.

## Trim

With RS facing, ch 2 (corner), turn piece and evenly sp 29 sc in ends of rows along side edge, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and sc in opposite side of foundation 29 chs, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 29 sc in ends of rows along other side edge, ch 1 and sc to first sc of last row for corner (sc replaces another ch and brings end of rnd to center of corner sp), turn.
Next rnd (WS): Ch 1, sc in beg corner sp, [ $s c$ in each of next 29 sc , (sc, ch $2, s c$ ) in next corner ch-2 sp] around, ending with just 1 sc in beg corner sp, ch 1, join with sc to first sc of rnd for corner (sc replaces another ch and brings end of rnd to center of corner sp), turn.
Next rnd (RS): Ch 1, sc in beg corner sp, [sc in each of next 31 sc , ( $s c$, ch $2,5 c$ ) in next corner ch-2 sp] around ending with just 1 sc in beg

corner sp, ch 1 and sc to first sc of rnd for corner, ch 2 (corner), join in beg sc. Leaving long end of at least 3 edges' length for sewing, fasten off.

bpdc (see Stitch Guide) around each of next 3 dc ] across to last st, hdc in last st, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 3: Loosely ch 1, hdc in first hdc, [fpdc around each of next 3 bpdc , bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc across to last st, hdc in last hdc, turn.

Row 4: Loosely ch 1, hdc in first hdc, [bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc, fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc across to last st, hdc in last hdc st, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 5: Loosely ch 1, hdc in first hdc, [bpdc around each of next 3 fpdc, fpdc around each of next 3 bpdc$]$ across to last st, hdc in last hdc, turn.
Row 6: Loosely ch 1, hdc in first hdc, [fpdc around each of next 3 fpdc , bpdc around each of next 3 bpdc$]$ across to last st, hdc in last hdc, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 3-6 consecutively for pattern to desired length, ending with row 3 or row 5 or WS row, total of 21 rows. If working stripes, fasten off previous color worked.

## Trim

With RS facing, ch 1 and sc across row and inc 1 st by working 2 sc in same st, ending with 33 sc, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows along side edge, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each ch across and inc 1 st, ending with 33 sc , ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows
along other side edge, ch 2 (corner), join in first sc. Leaving long end of at least 3 edges' length for sewing, fasten off.


## Block \#3

With size G hook for all rows except Trim, and with French blue for first color and canary for 2nd color, work Solid Texture B/Basketweave, with 2 rows of each color. Use size E hook for Trim.


## Block \#12

With size G hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and coral, work Solid Texture B/Basketweave. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Lace Texture B/Clovers (see first photo on page 58)

Work multiple of 3 chs plus 1.
Row 1 (RS): Ch 31 plus loosely ch 1, working in back bar of ch, dc in 2nd ch from hook or first ch past loosened ch-1 and in each ch across, turn.

Row 2: Loosely ch 1, hdc in each st across, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.

Row 3: Loosely ch 1, 2 dc in first hdc, ch 3, cl (see Special Stitches) in top of dc just made, sk next hdc, [dc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 3 hdc, ch 3, cl in top of de dec just made] across to last 2 hdc , dc dec in last 2 hdc , turn.

Row 4: Loosely ch 1, 2 dc in first dc dec, sk cl, [3 dc in top of next dc dec, sk cl] across to last st, 2 dc in last st, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 5: Loosely ch 1, dc in each dc across, turn.
Row 6: Loosely ch 1, hdc in each dc across, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 3-6 consecutively for pattern for total of 16 rows, ending with a WS row. At end of last row, fasten off last color worked if working stripes.

## Trim

With RS facing, loosely ch 1 , hdc in each st across row and at same time evenly sp inc 2 sts by working 2 hdc in each of 2 sts, ending with 33 hdc, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and work evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows along side edge, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and working on opposite side of starting ch, sc in each ch across and at same time evenly sp inc 2 sts, ending with 33 sc , ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows along other side edge, ch 2 (corner), join in top of first hdc. Leaving long end of at least 3 edges' length for sewing, fasten off.


## Block \#4

With size E hook and coral for first color and canary for 2nd color, work Lace Texture $\mathrm{B} / \mathrm{ClO}_{0}$ vers, with 2 rows of each color.

## Solid Texture D/Eyelids (see photo below and at right)

## Work multiple of 10 chs plus 6 .

Row 1 (RS): Ch 36, working in back bar of ch, sl st in 2nd ch from hook and in each of next 4 chs, [hdc in each of next 5 chs, $s l$ st in each of next 5 chs] across, turn.

Row 2: Remainder of piece is worked in back Ips (see Stitch Guide), tightly ch 1, sl st in each of first 5 sl sts, [hdc in each of next 5 hdc , sl st in each of next 5 sl sts ] across, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 3: Loosely ch 1, hdc in each of first 5 sl sts, [sl st in each of next 5 hdc , hdc in each of next 5 sl sts] across, turn.
Row 4: Loosely ch 1 , hdc in each of first 5 hdc , [sl st in each of next 5 sl sts, hdc in each of next 5 hdc across, change colors here if working in stripes, turn.
Row 5: Tightly ch 1, sl st in each of first 5 hdc , [hdc in each of next 5 sl sts, sl st in each of next 5 hdc] across, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 2-5 consecutively for pattern for total of 32 rows, ending with a WS row. At end of last row, fasten off only 1 of the colors if working with 2 colors.

## Trim

With RS facing, ch 1, working in back Ips, sc across row and at same time evenly sp [sc dec (see Stitch Guide) in next 2 sts] twice,


Block \#5
With size F hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and with French blue for first color and coral for 2nd color, work Solid Texture D/Eyelids, with 2 rows of each color. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Solid Texture A/Allover Puffs <br> (see first two photos on page 59)

Work multiple of 4 chs plus 2.
Row 1 (RS): Ch 34, working in back bar of ch, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, ( $s c, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in first $s c$, [sk next 3 sc , ( $s c, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next sc ] across to last 4 sc , sk next 3 sc , sc in last sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, (sc, 3 dc ) in first sc, [sk next $3 \mathrm{dc},(\mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{dc})$ in next sc ] across to last sc , sc in last sc , turn.
Rows 4-22: Rep row 3 for pattern. At end of last row, if using 2 or more colors, fasten off all but 1 color.

## Trim

With RS facing, ch 1 , sc in each st across, ch 2 (corner), working in ends of rows, evenly sp 33 sc or amount needed to reach next corner across, ch 2 (corner), working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , sc in each ch across, ch 2 (corner), evenly sp 33 sc or amount needed to reach next corner across, ch 2 (corner), join in beg sc. Leaving long end of at least 3 edges' length for sewing, fasten off.


## Block \#7

With size G hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and with French blue, work Solid Texture A/ Allover Puffs. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Block \#9

With size G hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and with French blue for first color, coral for 2nd color and canary for 3rd color, work Solid Texture A/Allover Puffs, with 1 row of each color always in that order. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Colorwork A/Zigzags (see photo at far right)

Work multiple of 6 chs plus 1.
Row 1 (RS): Ch 31 plus loosely ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in 2nd ch from hook or ch past loosened ch-1, sk

next 2 chs, sc in next ch, [sk next 2 chs, 5 dc in next ch, sk next 2 chs, sc in next ch] across to last 3 chs, sk next 2 chs, 3 dc in last ch, changing colors to 2nd color in last st, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 3, dc dec in next 5 sts, ch 3, sc in next dc, [ch 3, dc dec in next 5 sts, ch 3, sc in next dc] across, turn.
Row 3: Loosely ch 1, 3 dc in first sc , sc in next dc dec, [ 5 dc in next sc , sc in next dc dec] across to last $\mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in last sc , changing colors to first color in last st, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 3, dc dec in next 5 sts, [ch 3, sc in next dc, ch 3, dc dec in next 5 sts] across to last st, ch 3 , sc in last st, turn.

Row 5: Loosely ch 1, 3 dc in first sc , sc in next dc dec, [ 5 dc in next sc, sc in next dc dec] across to last st, 3 dc in last st, changing colors to 2nd color in last st, turn.

Next rows: Working in established color sequence, rep rows 4 and 5 alternately for total of 18 rows. At end of last row, fasten off first color.

## Trim

With RS facing and 2nd color, rep row 5 but evenly sp 6 dc instead of 5 dc in each of 2 sc across row for inc of 2 sts for total of 33 sts across, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing and evenly sp 33 sc in ends of rows along side edge, ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing, working in chs on opposite side of starting ch, sc in each ch across and at same time evenly sp 2 inc for total of 33 sc , ch 2 (corner), turn piece with RS facing, evenly $s p$ 33 sc in ends of rows along other side edge, ch 2 (corner), join in first sc. Leaving long
end of at least 3 edges' length for sewing, fasten off.


## Block \#10

With size F hook for all rows, excluding Trim, and with canary for first color and French blue for 2nd color, work Colorwork A/Zigzags with 2 rows of each color. Use size E hook for Trim.

## Finishing

Block pieces to measurements.
Using invisible seam (see illustration), sew Blocks tog in back lps with long ends according to Assembly Diagram on page 92.


## Invisible Seam

## Edging

Rnd 1: With WS facing and size E hook, join French blue in any st, ch 1, evenly sp sc around opening, join in beg sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 2: With RS facing, join canary in any st, ch 1, working from left to right, reverse sc (see Stitch Guide) in each st around, join in beg reverse sc. Fasten off.

Row 4: Beg half shell (see Special Stitches) in first dc , *ch $1, \mathrm{dc}$ in center dc of next dc group, ch $1^{* *}$, shell in ch sp of next V-st, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, half shell (see Special Stitches) in 3rd ch of turning ch-4, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in next dc, ${ }^{*}$ ch 1 , sk next ch-1 sp, V-st in next dc, ch $1^{* *}$, $d c$ in each of 3 center dc of next shell, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, sk next ch-1 sp and next 2 dc , dc in next dc, dc in 3 rd ch of turning ch 3 , turn.
Rep rows 2-5 consecutively for pattern.

Double Solomon's knot: [Solomon's knot] twice.

Solomon's knot: [Pull up Ip on hook to $5 / 8$ inch, yo, pull through Ip just made, sc in between single strand and Ip .
Row 1: Ch multiple of 5 plus 8, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next ch, picot (see Special Stitch), [dc in each of next 5 chs, picot] across to last 3 chs , dc in each of last 3 chs , turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first dc, [double Solomon's knot (see Special Stitches), sk next 4 dc , sc in next dc] across, ending with sk next 4 dc , sc in 3 rd ch of turning ch-3, turn.
Row 3: Ch $\mathbf{5}$ (see Pattern Notes), sc in center sc of next double Solomon's knot, [ch 5, sc in center sc of next double Solomon's knot] across to last double Solomon's knot, ch 2, dc in last $s c$, turn.
Row 4: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), dc in each of next 2 chs, [sk next sc, dc in each of next 3 chs, picot, dc in each of next 2 chs] across, ending with $s k$ last $s c$, dc in each of next 3 chs of turning ch-5, turn.
Row 5: Ch 3, Solomon's knot (see Special Stitches), sk next dc, sc in next dc, [double Solomon's knot, sk next 4 dc , scin next dc] across, ending with Solomon's knot, sk next 2 $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{dc}$ in 3 rd ch of turning ch-3, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in first dc, ch 5, [sc in sc at center of next double Solomon's knot, ch 5] across to last double Solomon's knot, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3, turn.
Row 7: Ch 3, [dc in each of next 3 chs, picot, dc in each of next 2 chs, sk next sc] across to last ch-5 sp, dc in each of next 3 chs , picot, dc in each of next 2 chs, dc in last sc, turn.
Rep rows 2-7 consecutively for pattern. C!

- Size H/8/5mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

Square $=6$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Join subsequent motifs on round 5 at corners and sides with slip stitch as desired.
Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-4 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Beginning cluster (beg cl): Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), holding back last lp of each st on hook, 2 dc in same place as beg ch-3, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.


Cluster (c): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 dc as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## ZINNIASQUARE

Rnd 1: Ch 6, sl st in first ch to form ring, beg cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 3, [cl (see Special Stitches) in ring, ch 3] 7 times, join (see Pattern Notes) in top of beg cl . $(8 \mathrm{cl}, 8 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps})$

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, [sc in next st, 3 sc in next ch sp] around, join in first sc. ( 32 sc )
Rnd 3: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), 2 tr in same st as beg ch-4, tr in each of next 3 sts, [ 3 tr in next st, tr in each of next 3 sts] around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-4. (48 tr)
Rnd 4: Ch 1, (sc, ch 5, sc) in first st, sc in each of next 11 sts, [(sc, ch 5, sc) in next st, sc in
each of next 11 sts] around, join in first sc.
Rnd 5: Sl st in ch-5 sp, ch 4, ( $3 \mathrm{tr}, \mathrm{ch} 3,4 \mathrm{tr}$ ) in same ch sp as beg ch-4, ${ }^{*}$ ch 2 , sk next 6 sts, ( $s c, c h 5, s c$ ) in next $s c$, ch 2 , sk next $6 s^{* *}$, ( 4 tr , ch 3, 4 tr ) in next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 4 th ch of beg ch-4. Fasten off. (4 ch-3 sps, 4 ch-5 sps, 32 tr)

Beginning treble crochet cluster (beg tr cl): Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 2 tr in same place as beg ch-4, yo, pull through all lps on hook.
Treble crochet cluster (tr cl): Holding back last Ip of each st on hook, 3 tr as indicated in instructions, yo, pull through all lps on hook.

## ASTER SQUARE

Rnd 1: Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 11 dc in ring, join (see Pattern Notes) in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (12 dc)

Rnd 2: Beg dc cl (see Special Stitches), ch 3, dc cl (see Special Stitches) in each st around, join in top of beg dc cl. ( $12 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{cl}, 12 \mathrm{ch}-3 \mathrm{sps}$ )
Rnd 3: Ch 1 , sc in first st, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp, [sc in next st, ch 5, sk next ch-3 sp] around, join in first sc.
Rnd 4: SI st in ch-5 sp, (beg tr cl—see Special Stitches, ch 5, tr cl-see Special Stitches) in same ch sp as last sl st, *[ch 3, dc in next ch-5 sp] twice, ch $3^{* *}$, $(\operatorname{trcl}$, ch $5, \operatorname{tr} \mathrm{cl})$ in next ch-5 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in top of beg tr cl .
Rnd 5: Ch 3, *(3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc ) in next ch-5 sp, dc in next st, [ 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, dc in next dc] twice, 3 dc in next ch-3 $\mathrm{sp}^{* *}$, dc in next st, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off. (4 ch-3 sps, 76 dc) C!

CROCHET SOLUTIONS 101

## OUR CROCHET EXPERT SHOWS YOU HOW TO ADD THE SLEEK LOOK OF INSERTED POCKETS, HOW TO MAKE BUTTONHOLES AND LOOPS THAT FIT PROPERLY, AND HOW TO DEAL WITH GARMENT HEMLINES THAT STRETCH.

Q. I don't like the bulky look of a patch pocket. How do I add an insert pocket to a crochet garment?

## A. Once you learn how to cro-

 chet an insert pocket, you can easily add a pocket to not only a garment, but parts of a garment and other items as well. Insert pockets can be made in any desirable size for any of the following: a sleeve, as a design element 4 inches below the shoulder line on the front(s) of a pullover or jacket, on pillows as an accent, on a winter hat, on a dog coat, on the sides and/or the front of a handbag or any place you like.First, determine the desired finished width and height of one pocket. For example, a pocket that measures $4 \times 4$ inches is a good size for children and most women. Begin with this singular piece which becomes the inside or back of the pocket. If your gauge is four stitches per inch, multiply the width of 4 inches by 4 stitches to equal 16 stitches across, plus one extra chain-a total of 17 chains. I prefer to work this piece in single crochet regardless of the pattern stitch because it is firm, yet pliable. Work in single crochet over 16 stitches until the length is the same as the width when the piece is folded into

a triangle. Finish with a wrong-side row and set aside.

Work the front(s) to where you wish to place the pocket opening, ending with a wrong-side row. Place markers for the insert, marking each corner, with one additional marker in between corners. Using the example of a gauge of four stitches per inch, you need an opening of 16 stitches. If you are making a jacket, be sure the numbers of stitches on each side of pocket, and the opening are exactly the same for each front. This ensures pocket placement matches up perfectly.

When the front is worked to the desired length for the pocket opening, ending with a right-side row, crochet in pattern to the marked opening, pick up the insert, holding the back of the insert to the front of the work and leaving the front opening of the pocket free, work in pattern across the 16 stitches of the insert; continue to complete the row. Complete the jacket front. Pin the insert to inside of the front and whipstitch it in place around the sides and bottom, working so the stitches don't show on the right side of the work. Add a button, crocheted flap or other embellishments, if desired. Or try adding one row of
reverse single crochet in a contrasting color to top of pocket opening as in the photo.
Q. How can I make sure my button loops or buttonhole openings fit my buttons properly?
A. To fit properly, the opening needs to fit snugly around a button. Yarn has natural elasticity and tends to stretch, so the more times an opening is stretched around a button, the more saggy it becomes. When it is important for buttons to meet exactly, you need to push the button through the opening. To make sure the opening is snug enough, make one opening, single crochet in each of next two stitches, turn and work enough additional rows to complete opening. Insert button, making sure it fits tightly enough. Pull out the few extra stitches and rows, going onto the next opening.

If a finished button loop or buttonhole is a bit too large, use a threaded needle of same color to pull back sides of opening together, one stitch at a time. Try the fit again and repeat if necessary. Secure yarn ends.

The swatch shows three different button openings. Always mark button placement on the left front of garment for women and the right front for men (left and right sides are from the wearer's perspective). The openings are made across from each marker on the opposite band.

1. Center buttonhole: The opening is centered in the front band.
2. Firm button loop: Work to within the marker, chain 4 or the number of chains desired to fit the button, skip three stitches (or one less st than number of chains) to the right of chain, slip stitch in next stitch to right, work four single crochets in chain- 4 , single crochet in the next stitch to left of chain and repeat from the beginning.
3. Plain button loop: Slip stitch into the marked stitch, chain desired number of chains to fit around the button, slip stitch in the same stitch as the last slip stitch. Work to the next marker and repeat.
Q. The hemline of my jacket is stretching and doesn't hang evenly. Help!
A. The fastest and easiest fix is to run three evenly spaced rows and even lengths of elastic thread on the inside of the ribbing. Pull it to the desired length and secure ends. Use this fix if the garment began with a lower ribbing.

## Other Fixes

If the lower ribbing was added to your garment after assembly, try any of the following fixes.

1. Using matching yarn and a hook one size smaller than used for the body, work one row reverse single crochet across the bottom or edging. This is best used for an edging that flares slightly, not one that ripples from too many stitches.

2. Make use of the frog stitch: Pull out the entire edging. The first row or round of the edging should be worked in single crochet because it sets the stage for any edging pattern stitch. The use of this beginning of single crochet makes for a more professional finish. Because there are more rows than stitches to 1 inch of crochet, ${ }^{*}$ work four single crochets, skip the next stitch to avoid too many stitches*; repeat from * to * to the end. Lay your work down often to check the appearance of the ribbing.
Remember to work three single crochets in each corner.
3. Unravel all of ribbing. Work one row or round in single crochet. Now try working ribbing using a hook one or two sizes smaller than used for body.

- Size G/6/4mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle


## GAUGE

5 sts $=1$ inch

## PATTERN NOTES

Weave in ends as work progresses.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated. Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Puff stitch (puff st): Yo, insert hook as indicated in instructions, yo, draw up Ip, [yo, insert hook in same st, yo, draw up Ip] twice (7 Ips on hook), yo, draw through all Ips on hook.
Shell: 7 dc as indicated in instructions.

## COLOR STRIPE SEQUENCE

Stripe 1: Use rosie as first color and lily as 2nd color.

Stripe 2: Use spearmint as first color and rosie as 2nd color.
Stripe 3: Use lily as first color and spearmint as 2nd color.

## BLANKET

## Stripe 1

Row 1 (RS): With first color (see Color Stripe Sequence), ch 151, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (150 sts)
Row 2 (WS): Ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), working in front lps (see Stitch Guide), dc in each st across, drop first color, do not fasten off, turn.

Row 3 (RS): Join (see Pattern Notes) 2nd color in back Ip (see Stitch Guide) of first st, sl st in each of next 4 sts, ${ }^{*}$ (sl st, puff st—see Special Stitches) in next $s t$, $s l$ st in each of next 4 sts, rep from * across, do not turn. Fasten off 2nd color. (29 puff sts)

Row 4 (RS): With RS facing, place dropped Ip of first color on hook, sc in each st across, do not turn. Fasten off. ( 150 sts)
Row 5 (RS): Join first color in first st of row 4, ch 3, dc in each st across, turn.
Row 6: Ch 1, working in front lps, sc in each st across, changing to next stripe color in last st, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, working in back lps, sc in each st across, turn.

## Stripes 2 \& 3

Rep rows 2-7 of Stripe 1 for Stripes 2 and 3 following Color Stripe Sequence.

Rep 3-Stripe groups until Blanket measures 32 inches, ending with row 6 of Stripe 1. At end of last row, fasten off.

Chain-3 at beginning of round counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated. Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.
Chain-5 at beginning of round counts as first treble crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

## Joined Motifs

Rnd 1: Rep rnd 1 of First Motif.
Rnd 2: SI st in first picot, ch 5, (tr, \{ch 1, tr\} 4 times) in same picot as beg ch-5, [joining picot (see Special Stitches), shell] across as needed to join Motifs, joining picot, [shell, picot] around, join in 4th ch of beg ch-5. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: SI st in each of first 3 chs, turn, *ch 6 , dc in first ch-6 sp of last rnd and over sl sts just worked, ch 3 , dc in same ch sp , ch $3^{* *}$, s st in beg ch- 6 of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in base of beg ch-6 of previous rnd.
Rnds 3-18 or to desired length: Rep rnd 2.
Rnd 19: SI st in each of first 3 chs of beg ch-6 of last rnd, turn. *Shell in same ch sp as last sl st, ch 2**, sl st in beg ch-6 of next shell, rep from * around, ending last rep at **, join in base of beg ch-6 of previous rnd. Fasten off.

## QUART JAR COVER

Rnds 1-13: With orange and size 4 hook, work same as Pickle Jar Cover rnds 1-13.
Rnd 14: Work same as rnd 19 of Pickle Jar Cover.

## PINT JAR COVER

Rnds 1-11: With lime and size 7 hook, work same as rnds 1-11 of Pickle Jar Cover.

Rnd 12: Work same as rnd 19 of Pickle Jar Cover.

## Finishing (optional)

Place Cover over jar and use hand steamer to lightly apply steam to ch-6 sps of each shell at bottom edge and gently press against glass to block Cover to bottom curve of jar. C!

## SPECIAL STITCH

Beginning treble crochet (beg tr): Ch 3, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo, pull lp through, insert hook in 3rd ch from hook, pull up Ip, 3 Ips on hook, complete as for tr.

## TEAL CENTER COASTER

Rnd 1: With warm teal, ch 5, sl st in first ch to form ring, beg tr (see Special Stitch), ch 1, [tr in ring, ch 1] 11 times, join (see Pattern


Notes) in top of beg tr. Fasten off. ( 12 tr , 12 ch sps)

Rnd 2: Join copper mist with sc in any ch sp, ch 2, [sc in next ch sp, ch 2] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 3: Join warm teal in any ch sp, ch 1, (hdc, 3 dchdc ) in same ch sp as beg ch-1 and in each ch $s p$ around, join in top of first hdc. Fasten off. ( $24 \mathrm{hdc}, 36 \mathrm{dc}$ )
Rnd 4: Sk first hdc, join maize with sc in next dc , (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next dc, sc in next dc, sk all hdc, [sc in next dc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next dc , sc in next dc ] around, join in beg sc . Fasten off.

Rnd 5: Join warm teal with sc in first sc, hdc in next hdc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch sp, hdc in next hdc, sc in next sc, [sc in next sc, hdc in next hdc, (hdc, ch 1, hdc) in next ch sp, hdc in next hdc, sc in next sc] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 6: Join copper mist with sc in first sc, ch 2 , sk next 2 sts, sl st in next ch sp, ch 2, sk
next 2 sts, sc in next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sl st in next ch sp, ch 2, sk next 2 sts , sc in next sc$]$ around, join in beg sc . Fasten off.

## MAIZE CENTER COASTER

Rnd 1: With maize, rep rnd 1 of Teal Center Coaster. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Join warm teal with sc in any st, sc in each st and in each ch $s p$ around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.


Rnd 3: Join copper mist in any sc , ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, 3 dc in each sc around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch3. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: Join warm teal with sc in first dc of any dc group, (hdc, ch 3, hdc) in next dc, sc in next dc, [sc in next dc, (hdc, ch 3, hdc) in next $d c, s c$ in next dc] around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 5: SI st in next hdc, ch 1, [sc in next ch-3 sp, sk next st, 2 hdc in next st, ch 2, 2 hdc

in next st, sk next st] around, join in first sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 6: Join maize with $s c$ in any $s c$, ch 1 , $s c$ in same st, ( $s c, 3 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch sp, [(sc, ch $1, s c$ ) in next st, (sc, $3 \mathrm{hdc}, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch sp ] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## COPPER CENTER COASTER

Rnd 1: With copper mist, rep rnd 1 of Teal Center Coaster. Fasten off.
Rnd 2: With maize, rep rnd 2 of Maize Center Coaster. Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Join warm teal with sc in any sc, ch 1, [ $s c$ in next $s c$, ch 1] around, join in beg sc.

Rnd 4: Ch $\mathbf{3}$ (see Pattern Notes), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-2, *sk next sc, 3 dc in next st, ch

$2^{* *}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, rep from * around, join in 3 rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rnd 5: Join maize with sc in first dc, *hdc in next $d c, 2 d c$ in each of next $2 d c$, hdc in next $d c$, sc in next $d c, 3$ sc in next ch $\mathrm{sp}^{* *}$, sc in next dc , rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 6: Join copper mist with sc in first st, ch 2, sk next st, [sc in next st, ch 2, sk next st] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 7: Join warm teal in any ch $s p$, ( $s c, s l$ st) in same ch sp as first sl st, (sl st, sc, sl st) in each ch sp around, join in joining slst. Fasten off. C!

52 inches wide x 28 inches long, including hanging rings

## materials

- Nazli Gelin Garden size 5 crochet cotton ( $13 / 4 \mathrm{oz} / 174 \mathrm{yds} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ per ball): 10 balls \#500-65 light sage
- Size C/2/2.75mm crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers
- $11 / 4$-inch plastic rings: 12


## GAUGE

7 Fan motifs $=4$ inches; 10 rows $=4$ inches

## PATTERN NOTES

Curtain is worked from bottom up with Fan Edgings at top and bottom worked across entire Curtain width. The center Wave pattern is worked back and forth in 8 individual overlapping "waves," utilizing short rows across half-length of curtain; top "surface foam" is also worked in short rows to mid-Curtain. Finally plastic rings are covered in cotton and attached with slip stitch at top of Curtain.
Chain-3 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet unless otherwise stated.
Chain-4 at beginning of row counts as first double crochet and chain-1 unless otherwise stated.

Join with slip stitch as indicated unless otherwise stated.

## SPECIAL STITCHES

Puff stitch (puff st): [Yo, insert hook from front to back as indicated in instructions, yo, pull Ip through] 3 times, yo, pull through all Ips on hook.

Fan: 8 dc as indicated in instructions.

## CURTAIN

## Bottom Fan Edging

Row 1: Ch 322, puff st (see Special Stitches) in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk next 4 chs, fan (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next 4 chs, puff $s t$ in next ch] across, turn. ( 32 fans)
Row 2: Ch 3 (see Pattern Notes), 3 dc in next ch sp, [sk next 3 dc , puff $s t$ in sp between next 2 dc , ch 1, fan in top of next puff st] across, ending with sk next 3 dc , puff st between next 2 dc , ch $1,4 \mathrm{dc}$ in last ch sp , turn.
Row 3: Ch 1, puff st in next dc, ch 1, [fan in top of next puff st, sk next 3 dc , puff st in sp between next $2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1]$ across, ending with puff st in top of turning ch-3, turn.
Rows 4-8: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with row 2.
Row 9: Ch 1, sc in first st, ch 4, sc in next puff st, [ch 4, sk next 3 dc , sc in sp between next 2 dc, sc in next st, ch 4, sc in next puff $s t$ across, ch 4 , sc in top of turning ch-3, turn. ( 320 sc )

Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

## First Wave

Getting started: Ch-1 at beg of row does not count as first st, but last ch-1 at end of row does count as last st.

Row 1: Ch 4 (see Pattern Notes), sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 39 times, [hdc
in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 38 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, puff st in next, leaving rem sts unworked, turn. (1 puff st, $39 \mathrm{hdc}, 40 \mathrm{dc}$, 78 ch-1 sps)
Row 2: Ch 1 (see Getting Started), sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (161 sts)
Row 3: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 49 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 28 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, puff st in last st, ch 1, sk next st on Bottom Fan Edging, puff st in next st, turn. (2 puffsts, $29 \mathrm{hdc}, 50 \mathrm{dc}$ )
Row 4: Ch $1, \mathrm{sc}$ in each st and in each ch across, turn. (162 sts)
Row 5: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 59 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 18 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] twice, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (3 puff sts, $19 \mathrm{hdc}, 50 \mathrm{dc}$ )
Row 6: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (164 sts)
Row 7: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 69 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 8 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 3 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (4 puff sts, $9 \mathrm{hdc}, 60 \mathrm{dc}$ )
Row 8: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (166 sts)
Row 9: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 74 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 3 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 4 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (4 hdc, 5 puffs sts, 75 dc )
Row 10: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (168 sts)
Transition row: Ch 1 , sc in each st across Wave, ch 1, sk next st, sc in each rem st across, turn. (320 sts)


## 2nd Wave

Row 4: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (155 sts)

Row 16: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (165 sts)
Row 17: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 66 times, dc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 15 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (16 puff sts, 68 dc)
Row 18: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (167 sts)

Row 3: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 33 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 22 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 19 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (20 puff sts, $23 \mathrm{hdc}, 34 \mathrm{dc}$ )
Row 4: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (151 sts)
Row 5: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 38 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 15 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 21 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. ( $16 \mathrm{hdc}, 22$ puff sts, 39 dc )
Row 6: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (153 sts)
Row 7: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 43 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 9 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 23 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. ( $10 \mathrm{hdc}, 24$ puff sts, 44 dc )

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (155 sts)
Row 9: Ch 4, sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 48 times, [hdc in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 3 times, hdc in next st, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 25 times, puff st in next st, ch 1, turn. (4 hdc, 26 puff sts, 49 dc )
Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each st and in each ch across, turn. (157 sts)
Transition row: Ch 1 , sc in each st and in each ch across Wave, ch 1 , sk next st, sc in each rem st across row, turn. ( 320 sts)

## Surface Foam

Row 1: Ch 1, sc in next 116 sts, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 50 times, sc in rem 103 sts, turn.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next 100 sts, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 52 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 53 times, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 54 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (56 puffs sts)
Row 5: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 57 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn (59 puff sts)
Row 6: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 60 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in next 3 sts, turn. (63 puff sts)
Row 7: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 64 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1 , sk next st, puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. ( 67 puff sts)
Row 8: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 68 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] twice, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (72 puff sts)
Row 9: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 73 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] twice, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (77 puff sts)

Row 10: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 78 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 4 times, puff st in next $s t$, sk next st, sc in each of next 3 sts, turn. (84 puff sts)

Row 11: Ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1 , sk next st] 85 times, puff st in first ch-1 of previous row, ch 1 , sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 4 times, puff st in
next st, sk next st, sc in rem sts to end of row, turn. (61 sc, 91 puff sts)
Row 12: Ch 1, sc in each of next 246 sts, ch 1, sk next st, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next st] 4 times, puff st in next st, sk next st, sc in each rem st across row, turn. ( 320 sts)

## Top Fan Edging

Row 1: Ch 1, [puff st in next st, ch 1, sk next $4 s c$, fan in next $s c$, sk next 4 sc , puff $s t$ in next sc, ch 1] across, turn. (32 fans)

Row 2: Ch 3, 3 dc in next ch, *sk next 3 dc , puff st in sp between next 2 dc , ch $1^{* *}$, fan in top of next puff st, rep from * across, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}, 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in last ch, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, puff st in next dc, ch 1, *fan in top of next puff st, sk next 3 dc , puff $s t$ in $s p$ between next 2 dc , ch 1 , rep from * across next 31 fans, ending with puff $s t$ in top of turning ch-3, ch 1, turn.
Rows 4-8: [Rep rows 2 and 3 alternately] 3 times, ending last rep with row 2.
Row 9: Ch 1, [sc in first st, ch 4, sc in top of next puff st, ch 4 , sk next 3 dc , $s c$ in $s p$ between next 2 dc ] across, ending with sc in last puff st, ch 4, sc in top of turning ch-3. Fasten off. (320 sts)

## Finishing

Block Curtain to measurement. Cover 12 plastic rings with crochet cotton and attach to Curtain as follows:

Cover plastic rings: [Insert hook through ring from front to back, yo and pull through ring (see illustration), ch 1] until ring is completely covered, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg ch-1. Rep to cover all plastic rings.


Single Crochet Around Ring
Attach covered rings to Curtain top: Insert hook in final st of 1 covered ring, insert hook in first sc of row 9 of Top Fan Edging, yo, pull Ip through both sts on hook. Fasten off.
Rep with rem 11 covered rings, evenly spacing across Curtain top, ending with final covered ring in final sc of row.

Rnd 8: Knit in front lp of first st, knit in back Ip of each of next 4 sts, knit in back Ip of last st, changing to angel white.
Rnd 9: With angel white, knit in back Ip of first st, knit in front lp of each of last 5 sts.
Rnd 10: Knit in back Ip of each st around, changing to goldfish in last st. Fasten off angel white.
Rnd 11: With goldfish, purl in back Ip of first st, purl in front Ip of each of last 5 sts.
Rnd 12: Knit in front Ip of each st around, join (see Pattern Notes) in beg st. Leaving long end for sewing, fasten off goldfish. With beg strand, sew rnd 1 closed.

## Assembly

With RS of Front and Back tog, sew Face and Hair sections tog with rust.
Position 1 Arm on each side near top of Shirt, aligning last rnd of Arm with seam. Sew in place using long strand on Arm. Sew Shirt
section of Front and Back tog with matching yarn.
Place Legs between Front and Back at bottom of Skirt, centered $11 / 4$ inches apart, aligning last rnd of each Leg with seam. Sew Legs in place with dusty blue. Sew Skirt section of Front and Back tog with dusty blue, leaving opening big enough to push Pillow Form through. Turn piece RS out, push Pillow Form through opening, sew opening closed.
Place Shoes on Legs and sew Shoes in place. Sew 1 fashion button on outer side of each Shoe to make a mock ankle-strap fastener.
Sew center of 4 rust curls to each top corner of Hair, making 8 curls on each side. Tie ribbon around each set of curls to form pigtails and trim ends as desired. C!

next stitch. This arch will have a slight twist to it, and the more limpets you add by adding additional loops at the onset, the more it will twist and bend.

Any of these untraditional limpets can be tacked down in subsequent rows of work by simply inserting your hook

into the highest point of the limpet while finishing the stitch a row above (Photo 5). At last, yarn over and pull through stitch which is tacking, insert hook into the endmost point of limpet and then yarn over and pull through all loops on hook. By tacking down these stitches, you can

play with color patterns and explore the effects they have in a more stylized method. The difference in the tacking method can be seen in the image (see Photo 6 on page 81); the left side is tacked down, and the right
side is loose. The stitch samples are as follows, from top down: arched limpets, nestled limpets, stacked limpets, traditional limpets.

It is amazing what some extra loops can do to add a fabulous fabric
and design to your favorite pattern. Try adding limpet stitches to handbags, scarves, pillows or anywhere you want a little something extra. C!

## Sizes Medium \& Large Only

Rnds [3-5]: Ch 1, sc in sp formed by joining dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] around, ch 2, join with dc in first sc. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Sizes X-Large, 2X-Large \& 3X-Large Only

Note: Because arm sizes vary, it is best to try on the garment at this point.
Rep rnd 2 until Sleeve is desired length.
Next rnds: Rep rnds 3-5 of sizes medium and large only.
Rep on 2nd armhole.

(see Pattern Notes) in first unused Ip on opposite side of foundation ch, ch 2 (see Pattern Notes), sc in same st, ch 1, [sc in sp formed by next 4 sk chs, ch 1 , sc in next ch, ch 1] 24 times, sc in same ch as last one worked, $[(s c$, ch $1, s c, c h 1)$ in end of every other row (around dc posts)] 10 [11, 12, 13, 14] times, sc in marked ch-5 sp, ch 1 , [sc, ch 1] twice in next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 1, [sc, ch 1] twice in next ch-5 sp, [sc, ch 1] twice in each ch- 5 sp across bottom of fronts and back to $3 \mathrm{ch}-5 \mathrm{sps}$ before marker, [sc, ch 1] twice in next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 1 , [ $s c$, ch 1] twice in next ch- 5 sp , sc in marked ch-5 sp, ch 1 , [(sc, ch 1 , sc, ch 1$)$ in end of every other row (around dc posts)] 10 [11, 12, 13, 14] times, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, turn. (131 [139, 147, 155, 163] sc and (h-1 sps)
Rnds 2-4: Ch 2, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, *sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, working (sc, ch 1, sc, ch 1) in both top corners of fronts, rep from * across, to beg ch-2 sp, ch 1, join in 2nd ch of beg ch-2, turn. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Sleeve Edging

Rnd 1: Join in ch-5 sp that falls under the arm on Sleeve, ch 1, [ $s c$, ch 1] twice in same sp, [sc, ch 1] twice in each rem ch-5 sp around, join in first sc.
Rnds 2-4: Ch 2, sc in next ch-1 sp, *ch 1, sc in next ch-1 sp, rep from * across, to beg ch-2 sp , ch 1 , join in 2 nd ch of beg ch-2. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Assembly

Beg at neck edge, sew fronts tog for 4 inches.

## Cowl

Getting started: Hold Body with neck edge at top. Join with sc in first ch-1 sp to the left of front seam.

Rnd 1: Work [ch 5, sc in ch- 1 sp, evenly sp around neck edge] 33 [ $35,37,39,41$ ] times, ch 2 , join with dc in joining sc, turn.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in sp formed by joining dc, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] around, ch 2, join with dc in first $s c$, turn.
Rnds 3-20: Rep rnd 2. At end of last rnd, fasten off. C!


Note: Arrow indicates direction of knitting.

Next rows: Ch 3, dc in each st across and at same time dec at both armhole edges every
row $0[0,1,2,3,5]$ time(s) and $1 \mathrm{dc} 1[2,2,3$, $5,6]$ time(s). $(92[96,100,104,108,112] d c$ at end of last row)


Next rows: Work even in pattern until piece measures $193 / 4\left[20,201 / 2,22 \frac{1}{2}, 22^{3} 4,231 / 4\right]$ inches from beg.

## First Shoulder

Next row: Work even in pattern across first 28 [30, 31, 33, 34, 36] sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Next row: Beg dec in first 3 sts, work in pattern across. Fasten off.

## 2nd Shoulder

Row 1: Join at armhole edge, ch 3, work in pattern across first $28[30,31,33,34,36]$ sts, leaving rem sts unworked, turn.
Row 2: Beg dec in first 3 sts, work in pattern across. Fasten off.

## 2nd Front

Sk next 5 [7, 7, 9, 9, 11] sts from Back, join in next st and work same as First Front reversing all shaping.

## Bottom Edging

Row 1: Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , join with sc in first ch, [ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next ch] across, turn.

Row 2: Ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), sc in first ch sp, [ch 4, sc in next ch sp] across, turn.
Row 3: Ch 6 (see Pattern Notes), sc in first ch sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch sp] across, turn.
Row 4: Ch 1, (2 sc, picot—seeSpecial Stitches, 2 sc) in each ch $s p$ across. Fasten off.

## Sleeve

Make 2.
Row 1: Ch $72[78,84,88,94,100]$, dc in 4th ch from hook (first 3 chs count as first dc), dc in each ch across, turn. ( $70[76,82,86,92$, 98] dc)
Next rows: Ch 3, dc in each st across and at same time on rows 3, 6 and 9 inc 1 st at each end by working 2 dc in next to last dc on each side. (76 [82, 88, 92, 98, 104] dc at end of last row)
Next rows: Work even for next 0 $[0,2,2,4,4]$ rows, then dec for Sleeve cap on every row in each end 3 dc one, $2 \mathrm{dc} 5[6,8,9,10$, 11] times and 3 dc once. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Sleeve Edging

Row 1: Working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 on Sleeve, join with sc in first ch, [ch 5, sk next 2 chs, scin next ch] across, turn.
Row 2: Ch 1, (2 dc, picot, 2 sc) in each ch sp across. Fasten off. Rep on rem Sleeve.

## Assembly

Sew shoulder seams and Sleeve seams edge to edge to avoid chunky seam. Sew Sleeves in armholes.

## Front Edging

Working up right Front around neck and down left Front, join with sc at lower bottom of right Front, evenly sp [ch 3, sk $1 / 2$ inch, sc in next row] across to bottom edge of left Front.

## Fasten off.

Sew buttons on left Front with top button $1 / 2$ inch from top edge and rem buttons evenly $s p$ down de section. Use ch $s p$ as buttonholes. C!

Row 1: With RS facing and size C hook, join in center neck of Back, work 23 [24, 25, 26, 26, 27] sc evenly sp from center Back to shoulder seam, work 42 [43, 44, 45, 46, 47] sc evenly sp across ends of rows to marked row, work 36 sc evenly sp across to bottom corner, work 31 [37, 40, 46, 52, 55] sc across opposite side of foundation ch, turn. ( 132 [140, 145, 153, 160, 165] sts)

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in each of first 16 [17, 18, 19, 19, 20] sts, sc dec in next 2 sts, sc in each rem st across, turn. (131 [139, 144, 152, 159, 164] sts)

Rows 4-10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn. At end of last row, fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew Borders tog at center neck on Back. Set in sleeves. Sew underarm and side seams.

Sew buttons opposite buttonholes on 3rd row from edge of left Front.


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Row 2: Ch 3, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] across, ending with 2 dc in last st. Fasten off.

## 2nd Shoulder

Row 1: With WS facing, join (see Pattern Notes) in marked st, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp] across to last st, dc in last st, turn.
Row 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp] across, ending with dc in last st. Fasten off.

## Front

Rows 1-4 [1-6, $1 \& 2,1 \& 2,1-4,1-4$, 1-6]: Rep rows $1-4[1-6,1 \& 2,1 \& 2,1-4$, 1-4, 1-6] of Back.
Row 5 [7, 3, 3, 5, 5, 7]: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, [ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st] 3 $[4,5,5,6,7,7]$ times, ch 12 , sk next $7 \mathrm{sts}, 3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next st, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st, [ch 1 , sk next 3 sts, 3 dc in next st] across to last 4 sts, ch 1, sk next 3 sts, 2 dc in last st, turn.
Row 6 [8, 4, 4, 6, 6, 8]: Work in established pattern across to ch-12 sp, ch 6 , sc in next ch12 sp, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in pattern across, turn.

Row 7 [9, 5, 5, 7, 7, 9]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sc in next ch-6 sp, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.
Row 8 [10, 6, 6, 8, 8, 10]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch- 6 sp , sc in each of next 3 sc , sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 5, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.
Row 9 [11, 7, 7, 9, 9, 11]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in each of next 5 sc , sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.
Row 10 [12, 8, 8, 10, 10, 12]: Work in established pattern across to next ch- 5 sp , ch 6 , sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in each of next $7 s c$, $s c$ in next ch-5 sp, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.
Row 11 [13, 9, 9, 11, 11, 13]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 1,3dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6 , sc in each of next 7 sc , ch $6,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-6 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 $s p$, work in established pattern across, turn.

Row 12 [14, 10, 10, 12, 12, 14]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 1,3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in each of next 5 sc , sk next st, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.

Row 13 [15, 11, 11, 13, 13, 15]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 1,3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in each of next 3 sc , sk next st, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.

Row 14 [16, 12, 12, 14, 14, 16]: Work in established pattern across to next ch-6 sp, ch 1,3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next sc, sc in next sc, sk next st, ch 6, 3 dc in next ch-6 sp, ch $1,3 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.

Row 15 [17, 13, 13, 15, 15, 17]: Work in established pattern across to next ch- 6 sp , ch 12 , sk next 2 ch- 6 sps, 3 dc in next ch- 1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.
Next rows: Rep rows 6-15 [8-17, 4-13, 4-13, 6-15, 6-15, 8-17] once.

Next rows: Work $2[2,10,10,8,8,6]$ rows evenly in established pattern.

## Armhole Shaping

Next rows: Work next 17 [17, 19, 19, 21, 21, 23] rows in established pattern and at same time, shape armholes same as for Back.
Next row (RS): Work in established pattern across to first ch-6 sp, ch 6, sk next 2 ch-6 sps, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, work in established pattern across, turn.

## Shoulder Shaping

Shape Shoulders same as for Back counting ch- 6 sp as 2 ch- 1 sps.

## Assembly

With RS tog, beg at neck edge working outward to armhole edge, using invisible seam (see illustration), sew shoulder seams.


Invisible Seam

Beg at armholes and working down side edge, using invisible seam, sew side seams leaving last 2 inches open at bottom for Side Slits.

## Side Slit Edging

With RS facing and working in ends of rows, evenly sp sc across Slit opening.
Rep on rem Slit.

## Sleeve Edging

Rnd 1: Working in ends of rows around Sleeve, join with sc in side seam, evenly sp sc around, join in beg sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. Fasten off.
Rep on rem Sleeve.

## Neck Edging

Working around neck edge, join with sc in shoulder seam, evenly sp sc around, join in beg sc. Fasten off.

## Yoke

Row 1: With RS facing, work row of sc across Back and at same time evenly $s p, \operatorname{dec} 2$ [4, $8,12,12]$ sts ( 33 [39, 43, 47, 51] sts across Back), working across top of 1 Sleeve, hdc in each of next $31(31,33,35,37)$ sts, working across Front, sc across and at same time evenly sp dec $3[5,9,13,13]$ sts ( $32[38,42$, 46,50 ] sts a cross Front), hdc in each of next $31(31,33,35,37)$ sts on rem Sleeve, turn.
Row 2 (WS): Sc in each sc and each hdc around, turn. (127 [139, 151, 163, 175] sts)
Next 5 rows: Work 5 Lace Pattern rows.
Next row: Sc in each sc around.
Next rows: Rep last 6 rows. At end of last row, join (see Pattern Notes) in first sc.
Next 3 rnds: Now working in rnds, do not ch 1 at beg of rnds, sc in each sc around, do not join. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Finishing

Sew Yoke seam in back.
Sew raglan Sleeve to Back and Front.
Sew underarm and side seams to bottom of lower lace border, leaving rem side edges unsewn.

## Lower Body Trim

With WS facing, sc in each of 9 rows along edge, *3 sc in first ch on opposite side of row 1, sc in each ch across with 3 sc in last ch**, 9 sc along 2 sides, rep between * once, 9 sc along next edge, sc in each sc around. Fasten off.
With RS facing beg at lower edge of Back, sl st in each sc around. Fasten off.

## Sleeve Trim

Rnd 1: With WS facing, sc in each starting ch of row 1 around.

Rnd 2: Sc in each st around. Fasten off. Rep on rem Sleeve. C!



Rnds 29-32: Ch 1, sc in each st around, join in first sc.

## Waistband

Fold over top of Skirt to inside. Work as follows: Insert hook in next st, insert hook around dc directly below in rnd 26, yo, pull Ip through all Ips on hook, continue sl st around, to center front of Skirt, sl st across 2 sc, sk 2 dc (forms hole for drawstring) and continue in pattern, at end of rnd, join in first sl st. Fasten off.

## Tie

Weave cotton cord through hole in Waistband in center front of Skirt. Tie ends in bow.

## Lacy Edging

Rnd 1: Working in starting ch on opposite side of rnd 1, join in first ch, ch 5 (see Pattern Notes), [sk next st, dc in next st, ch 2] around, join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.
Rnd 2: Sl st in first ch-2 sp, ch 5, 2 tr in same ch sp as beg ch-5, *ch 5, sk next ch-2 sp**, (sc, ch 5, tr) in next ch-2 sp, rep from * around, ending last rep at ${ }^{* *}$, join in beg sl st.
Rnd 3: Ch 1, [ 5 sc in next ch-5 sp, sc in next tr, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, sc in next tr, ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, 5 sc in next ch-5 sp] around, join in beg sc. Fasten off. C!

Fasten off. (40 sts)

## Bottom

Row 1: With 2 strands raffia held tog, ch 36 , sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. ( 35 sc )
Rows 2-8: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ch 1, turn work to right, evenly sp 9 sc in ends of rows across to next corner, ch 1, turn and working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , evenly $s p$ 35 sc across to next corner,
ch 1, turn work to right, evenly sp 9 sc in ends of rows to next corner, ch 1, join in first sc. Fasten off. ( 88 sc )

## Side

Make 2.
Row 1: With 1 strand raffia, ch 37, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn. (36 sc)
Rows 2-9: Rep row 2 of Bottom.
Row 10: Ch 1, sc in each st across, ch 1, turn work to right, evenly sp 10 sc in ends of rows across to next corner, ch 1, turn work to right and working in starting ch on opposite side of row 1 , sc in each ch across to next corner, ch 1 , turn work to right, evenly sp 10 sc in ends of rows across to next corner, ch 1, join in first sc. Fasten off. (92 sc)

## Handle

Make 2.
Rnd 1: With size G hook, ch 6, sl st to first ch to join, sc in each ch around, do not join. ( 6 sc )
Rnd 2: Sc in each st around, do not join.
Next rnds: Rep rnd 2 until Handle measures 15 inches from beg. Fasten off.

## Assembly

1. Use straight pins to pin Motifs to $61 / 2$ inches square and lightly steam-block using a hand steamer. Pin Sides and Bottom to 4 inches wide x 13 inches long and steam in same manner. Allow pieces to completely dry. Remove pins.
2. Vertical Join of Motifs: With 2 Motifs WS tog and working through both thicknesses, use size K hook to join 1 strand raffia to back Ip (see Stitch Guide) of upper right corner fptr, ch 1, sl st in same st, *ch 1, sl st in next ch, ch 1, [sl st in next dc, ch 1] twice, sl st in next ch, ch 1, [sl st in next sc, ch 1] twice, [sl st in next ch, ch 1$] 3$ times, sl st in next fpsc, ch 1, [sl st in next ch, ch 1] 3 times, [ $s$ st in next sc, ch 1] twice, sl st in next ch, ch 1, [sl st in next dc, ch 1] twice, sl st in next ch, ch 1, sl st in next fptr*. Fasten off.
Repeat to join rem Motifs into 4 sets of 2 joined Motifs.
3. Horizontal Join of Motifs: With 2 sets of joined Motifs WS tog and working through both layers, join 1 strand of raffia to back Ip of upper right corner fptr, rep between * same as in step 2 across First Motif, sl st in next fptr of next Motif, ch 1 , rep between * in step 2 across 2nd Motif to complete 1 Motif panel. Fasten off.
Rep to make 2nd Motif panel.
4. Join Sides to Bottom: With short ends of 1 Side and Bottom WS tog and working through both thicknesses, join 1 strand raffia to back Ip of upper right corner, ch 1 , sl st in same sp, evenly sp (slst, ch 1 ) in back lps across. Fasten off. Rep to add short ends of 2nd Side and rem end of Bottom tog.

## 5. Join Motif panels to Sides and Bot-

tom: Place 1 long edge of Sides WS tog to 1 Motif panel, and using size G hook, join 1 strand of raffia to back Ip of fptr in upper left-hand corner of panel, ch 1 , sl st in same sp, (sl st, ch 1) in every ch-1 and st of panel and where necessary in Sides long edge to Bottom left corner, (sl st, ch 1) twice in fptr of Panel and bottom corner, turn work to right and working along bottom edge of panel and long edge of
Bottom, continue in same manner of (sl st, ch 1) in each ch-1 and slst of Panel bottom edge and where necessary in Bottom long edge to right corner, ( $s \mathrm{sts}, \mathrm{ch} 1$ ) twice in fptr of panel and Bottom right corner, turn work to right and continue to work (sl st, ch 1) in same manner along right side of panel and long edge of Sides to top edge. Fasten off. Rep to add 2nd Motif panel to rem unworked Sides and Bottom edges.

## 6. Satchel inside edge:

Rnd 1: With size $K$ hook and working in back Ips around, join 1 strand raffia to center sc at top edge of 1 side, ch 1 , sc in same sp, sc in each st across to first Motif, sc in each st and ch- 1 of Motif to within $1 \mathrm{ch}-1$ before center fptr of first Motif Square, [ch 3, sk next (ch 1 , fptr, ch 1 ), sc in each st and ch- 1 across to center fptr of next Motif square] 4 times, sc in each st and ch- 1 across to end of rnd, join in first sc.
Rnds 2-6: Ch 1, sc in each st around. At end of last rnd, fasten off.
7. Lining: Fold felt rectangle in half forming a $161 / 2$-inch-wide $x 14$-inch-high rectangle. Use iron to press bottom fold. Sew $1 / 4$-inch
seam on each 14 -inch side of folded rectangle and press seams open. To square off corners of lining for box bottom, beg at 1 corner of lining and align RS of sewn seam onto RS of bottom fold to form a triangle. Use pencil and ruler to draw 134 -inch line from folded triangle sides that is perpendicular to sewn seam and is $13 / 4$ inches in from triangle tip. Sew on this line and press excess triangle to bottom of lining.
8. Attach safety pin to 1 end of felt 1 x 16-inch strip and insert through center of Handle. Slightly stretch Handle to $15 \frac{1}{2}$ inches Iong. Trim away any excess felt. Using needle and double strand of sewing thread, sew both ends of each Handle closed. Insert bottom 2 rows of 1 Handle end through 1 ch- 3 opening at top of Satchel. Sew Handle end to WS of Satchel inside edge. Rep to sew opposite end of Handle to next ch-3 opening on same side of Satchel. Rep step 8 again to add 2nd Handle to opposite side of Satchel.
9. Insert WS of lining inside Satchel, having top edges of lining even with top edges of Satchel. Fold Satchel inside edge over lining and hand-sew bottom edge to lining. Sew sk sts at base of Handle openings to handle to secure.
10. For additional Handle support, thread double strand of raffia through tapestry needle and insert needle from back to front through Handle and under $s \mathrm{st}$, ch 1 of front and insert needle from front to back. Remove needle and knot ends securely.
Rep for rem 3 Handle ends.
Trim as desired. C!

## 3rd Strip

Block 1
Join in first ch of first row of Block 1 of previous Strip, ch 13.

B. insert hook in next ch of adjacent Block of previous Strip, yo, pull through first Ip on hook, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] across until 1 lp rem on hook.
Bind-off row: Rep bind-off row of Block 1 of First Strip.

## Blocks 2 \& 3

Sl st in last ch of adjacent Block, ch 13.
Row 1:
A. [Insert hook in next row end on same Block of previous Strip, yo, pull up Ip] 12 times;
B. insert hook in next ch of adjacent Block of previous Strip, yo, pull through first Ip on hook, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] across until 1 lp rem on hook.

## Rows 2-12:

A. Rep A of rows 2-12 of Block 1 of First Strip;
B. insert hook in next ch of adjacent Block of previous Strip, yo, pull through first Ip on hook, [yo, pull through 2 lps on hook] across until 1 lp rem on hook.
Bind-off row: Rep bind-off row of Block 1 of First Strip.

## Block 4

Work same as for Blocks 2 and 3, joining bind-off row of Block 4 in last ch of adjacent Block. Fasten off.

Rnds 36-48 [38-48, 40-48]: Ch 1, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext $s c$, turn.

## Size Small Only

At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Sizes Medium \& Large Only

Rnd [49]: Ch 1, ext sc in each of first [38, 40] sts, 2 ext sc in next st, ext sc in each of next $[75,80]$ sts, 2 ext sc in next st, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext sc, turn. ([151, 162] extsc)
Rnds [50-53]: Ch 1, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext sc, turn.

## Size Medium Only

At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Size Large Only

Rnds [54-58]: Ch 1, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext sc, turn.
Rnd [59]: Ch 1 , ext sc in each of first 41 sts, 2 ext sc in next st, ext sc in each of next 80 sts, 2 ext sc in next st, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext sc, turn. ([164] ext sc)
Rnds [60-63]: Ch 1, ext sc in each st around, join in beg ext $s c$, turn. At end of last rnd, fasten off.

## Border

Rnd 1: Join rosie in any st, working around entire outer edge, sl st in each st and row end around, working 3 sl sts in each corner.
Rnd 2: Working in back lps, hdc in each st around, working 3 hdc in 2nd st of each corner, join in first st. Fasten off.
Rnd 3: Join lily in front Ip of any st on rnd 1, working in front lps, sc in each st around, working 3 sc in 2nd st of each corner, join in first st.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, sc in first st, sk next 3 sts, * shell (see Special Stitches) in next st, sk next 2 sts,
sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, rep from * around, join in first st. Fasten off.

Rnd 5: Join spearmint in hdc behind any shell on rnd 2, ch 1 , sc in each st around, working 3 sc in 2nd st of each corner, join in first st.
Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sk next 2 sts, *shell in next st, sk next 2 sts, sc in next st, sk next 2 sts, rep from * around, join in first st. Fasten off.

Block Blanket to finished measurements.

## Assembly

Work 11 columns of 10 Motifs (see Assembly Diagram) for total of 110 Motifs.


## Half Motif

Row 1: Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, beg cl, picot, ch 3, cl, picot, ch 3, picot, turn.

Row 2: Joining to corresponding picots on end of column as shown on Assembly Diagram, sl st in picot, ch 4, joining picot, (tr, \{ch 1, tr\} 3 times) in same place as beg ch-4, [joining picot, shell in next picot] twice, joining picot. Fasten off.

Rep to add a Half Motif to top and bottom of oddnumbered columns as shown in Assembly Diagram.

## Edging

With RS facing and Half Motifs at top edge, join with sc in top right corner center tr, working across Half Motifs, ${ }^{*}$ ch 3, (cl, \{ch 2, cl\} twice) in next picot, ch 3, [sc in center tr of next shell, ch 3, cl in Motif, ch 3, cl in Half Motif corner, ch 3, sc in ch $s p$ at base of shell in Half Motif, ch 3, (cl, ch 3, cl) in ch-4 sp of Half Motif, ch 3, sc in ch sp at base of shell in Half Motif, cl in Half Motif, ch 3, cl in Motif corner, ch 3]
across to corner, (cl, \{ch 2, cl\} twice) in picot, ch 3, [sc in center tr of next shell, ch 3, (cl, \{ch 2, cl\} twice) in picot, ch 3, sc in center tr of shell, ch 3, cl in corner of first Motif, ch 3, cl in corner of 2nd Motif, ch 3] across to corner, rep from * once, join in first sc. Fasten off. C!

Projects using basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes and easy shaping and finishing. Simple in-the-round projects, such as coasters, hot mats, flowers, hats, neck warmers and cowls fall within this skill category, as well as the ability to read simple stitch charts and keys.

## (1)23436 intermedate

Projects that incorporate a wide variety of stitch techniques beyond the basics, such as shells, fans, popcorns, clusters, post stitches, basic cables, lace, simple intarsia, shaping and finishing. The crocheter has the ability to read more advanced stitch pattern charts, such as lace and cable charts.

Projects that utilize a wide variety of stitches and techniques such as those noted above, as well as more detailed colorwork, shaping, construction and finishing.

Projects that require a more intuitive understanding of a pattern or chart and that also include advanced stitches and techniques, as well as more intricate methods such as intarsia, cables, lace, stranded colorwork with numerous color changes and advanced shaping and construction techniques.

Reverse single crochet (reverse sc): Ch 1, sk first st, working from left to right, insert hook in next st from front to back, draw up Ip on hook, yo and draw through both lps on hook.


Chain (ch): Yo, pull through lp on hook.


Single crochet (sc): Insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, yo, pull through both lps on hook.


Double crochet (dc):
Yo, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, [yo, pull through 2 lps ] twice.


Double treble
crochet (dtr): Yo 3 times, insert hook in st, yo, pull through st, [yo, pull through 2 lps] 4 times.
