LATE YELLOWS: Here is more (see Nigel Gosling's note of 10th Dec.) evidence of late Clouded Yellows on the South Coast. A close friend of mine - who is good on butterfly identification - saw one Clouded Yellow on the Sand Dunes just west of Littlehampton, Sussex, on 16th October, and then four (of which he is sure three were females, because he followed and watched them for some time) by the coastal dunes at East Head near the sea outlet of Chichester harbour, on 6th November. They must all have been from very late emergences from eggs laid around August. I was not so lucky, and have not seen one of these, my favourite butterflies, this year. I have, however, seen plenty of Holly Blues this year (clearly three generations in my garden) and had three Red Admirals in and around my garden, central Littlehampton, up until 28th October. It's been a poor year for butterflies, but a surprisingly good late autumn! David Humphries.

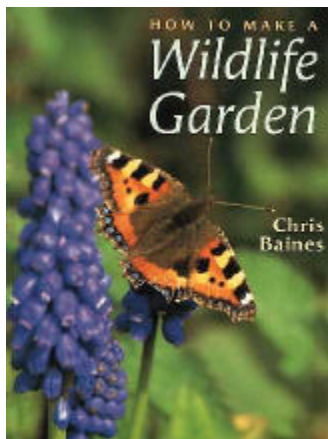

HOW TO MAKE A WILDLIFE GARDEN. A Book Review by Michael Edwards. There's nothing quite like a well-tended garden to lift



the spirit on a warm summer afternoon. Well maintained lawns and colourful borders do look wonderful, but your local wildlife wouldn't necessarily agree with you. The importance of suburban gardens in wildlife conservation should not be underestimated. If all the garden were joined together, they would make an area far larger than any of our nature reserves... and they are just as important, as naturalist, Chris Baines explains in HOW TO MAKE A WILDLIFE GARDEN. There's lots of relevant insect material and photographs and the cover is a close up shot of a Small Tor-

toiseshell resting on grape hyacinth. Chris Baines shows how each of us, no matter how small our garden, can transform them into havens of wildlife. Since its first publication in 1985, this book has established itself as the most authoritative book on wildlife gardening. This completely revised and updated edition, incorporate the changes and developments that have since taken places. With a new format and many new photographs, it is fully in tune with the current and ever increasing interest in preserving the natural environment. There is a saying that goes: 'There is no place like home.' We like to think that our gardens are simply a natural extension to our houses. They are, for many of, just outdoor rooms, airy, bright place in which to flop after a trying day at work or school, but for wildlife they are often the only home they have in an ocean of concrete.

Through personal experience, Chris, a professional environmentalist, shows how we can transform our gardens into rich wildlife havens; whether you are starting from scratch or adapting an established plot, you can follow the advice given in this book and can soon expect welcome visits from birds, butterflies, foxes, hedgehogs, frogs and newts. He describes a variety of natural habitats, such as ponds, meadows and hedgerows, in detail and gives extremely practical and detailed advice on how to recreate them in a garden environment. He gives comprehensive information on supplementing these habitats - with extensive lists of wild plants and flowers, advice on how to avoid the use of chemicals and how to encourages wildlife by providing habitat boosters, such as artificial bee homes, butterfly feeding stations, bird tables and nest boxes.

"When I first wrote this book in 1985, its inspiration came from a range of sources." Chris told me, "I was teaching landscape architecture, and being constantly challenged by students. I had filmed the transformation of my own garden for the BBC, and the resulting programme, Blue tits and Bumblebees, met with great enthusiasm. I had seen many friends, colleagues and clients in the inner city enjoy nature on their doorstep, thanks to the pioneering work of the

Urban Wildlife Group, and I had been horrified by the scale of habitat loss that was taking place in the farming countryside." He says that if we adopt the accepted practices of twentieth century gardening, then we will be planting exotic shrubs and flowers, and generally putting the local wildlife under exactly the same kind of hostile pressure that has done so much harm in the farming countryside. He went on to say that we should try a more sensitive approach. See how many things we can persuade to live in our gardens, instead of notching up more and more things to kill. Even the smallest of town gardens can provide a rich and valuable sanctuary for a whole host of wildlife. "Nobble your neighbours. Persuade them to plant a hedge, use less pesticide, dig a pond or simply stop burning the autumn leaves, and in no time at all you'll notice the increased bird life, the boost in the number of butterflies, and your garden will start to look, smell and sound different." In the new millennium, gardening with nature has become mainstream. The garden centres are now stocked with lots of wildflower seeds, nest boxes and bird feeders, and there is even a wildlife pond in the Prime Minister's garden at 10 Downing Street. The countryside has continued to lose its wildlife habitats, and in many rural landscapes the 'Silent Spring' of Rachel Carson's chillingly prophetic 1962 book is now a reality; but the green spaces in towns and cities are alive and well, and are really helping to conserve our precious native wildlife. Suburbia has the best dawn chorus. Frogs, toads and newts thrive in gnome-fringed garden ponds, and the quiet revolution which the first edition of this book helped to launch is taking root in gardens, parks and school grounds everywhere. There is no doubt that gardening with wildlife makes a positive difference. Certainly, reading this book has given me lots of ideas for my garden. BUG REPORT: Observed and photographed sunning itself on a tree-trunk in Romiley, Stockport on 12th November; a Red Admiral (*Vanessa atalanta*). This represents 1/6 of the total number of Red Admirals seen locally by me this year! It has been virtually a butterfly-free zone here, as regards Red Ads, Painted Ladies, Commas, Tortoiseshells & Peacocks. This is not the latest Red Admiral I have ever seen - I once had one in the garden on November 19th, but what intrigues me was the fact that it was in pristine condition; a fact confirmed by my photograph. The only explanation I can give for this, is that it must have very recently emerged - in mid-November! Less than a week later, ducks were walking on the ice on a nearby lake, so I think that this butterfly's life may have been a short one. [Alan Blears].

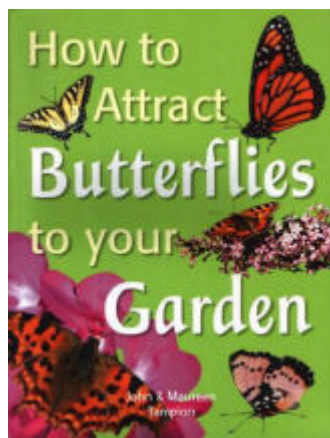
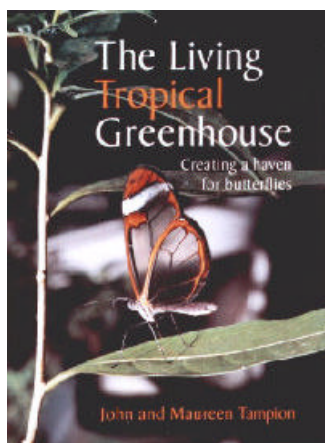
